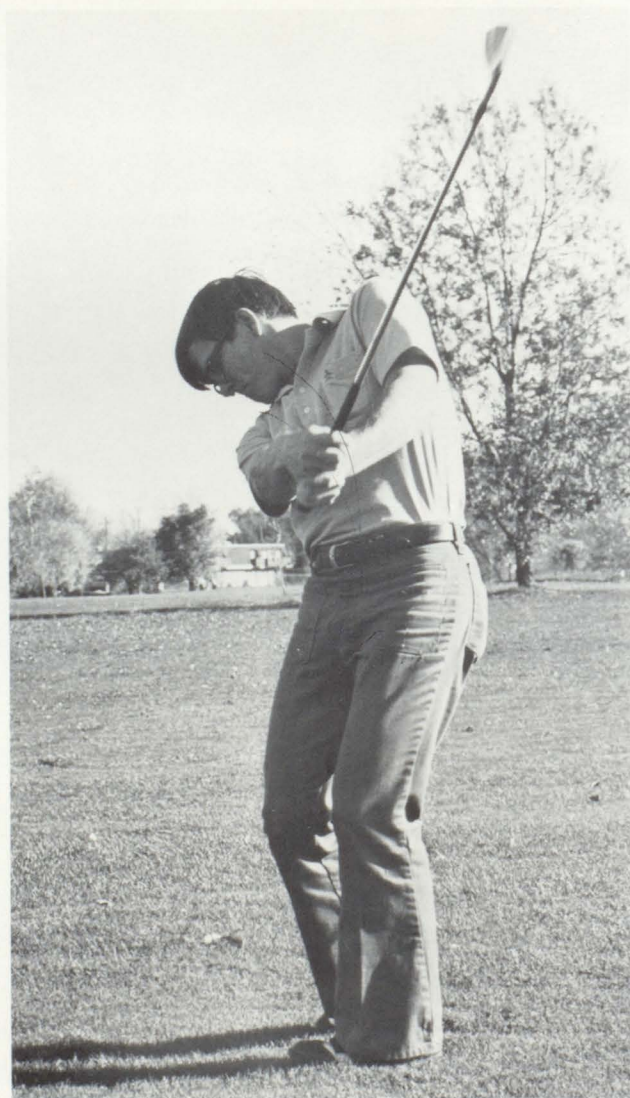


Linksmen Win Title At Regional Contest

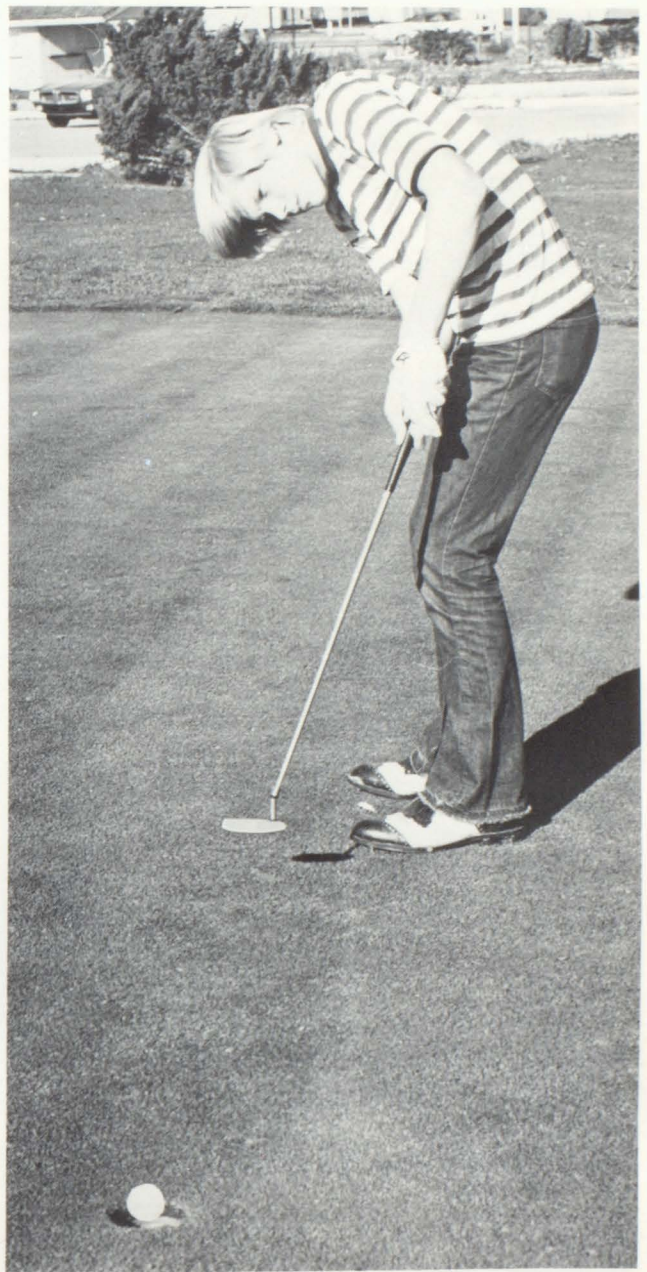

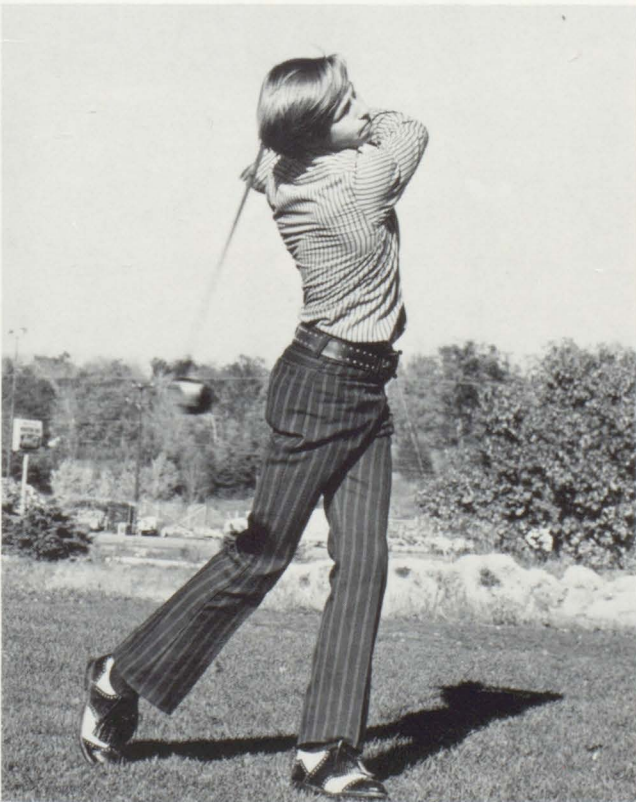

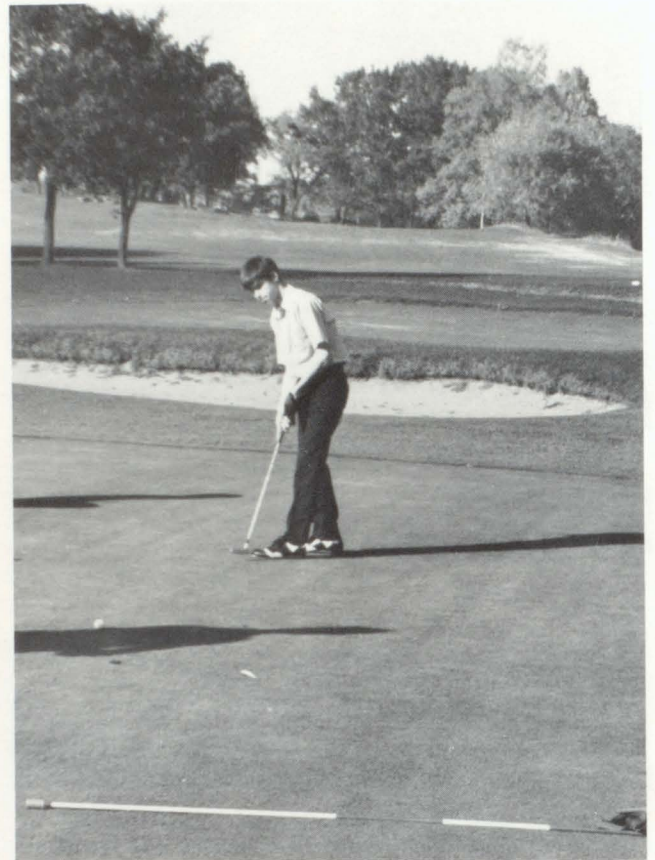


Above: Lee Booker rams in a testy four foot putt on the finishing hole for a birdie. Below: The six man golf squad poses with their coach, Doug Pierson.

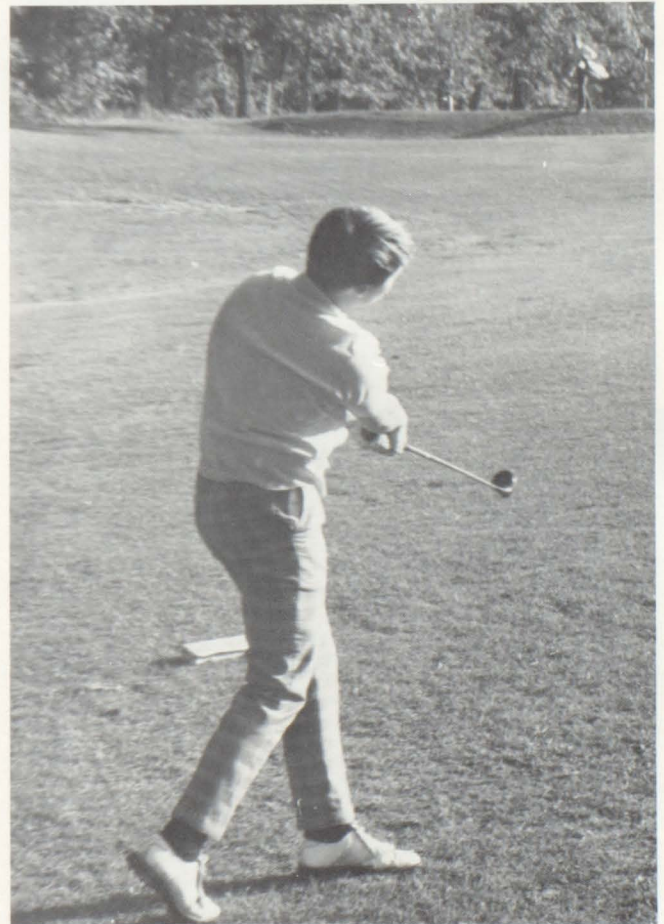
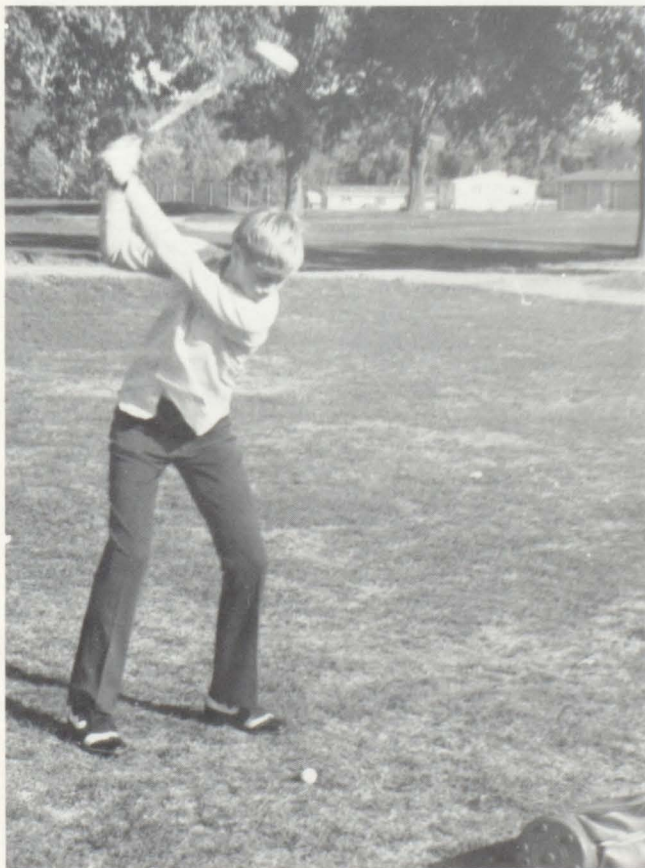

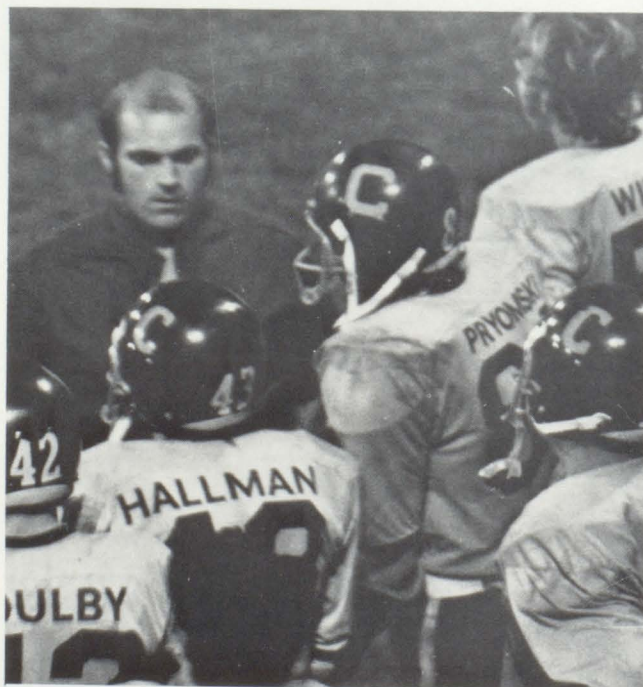

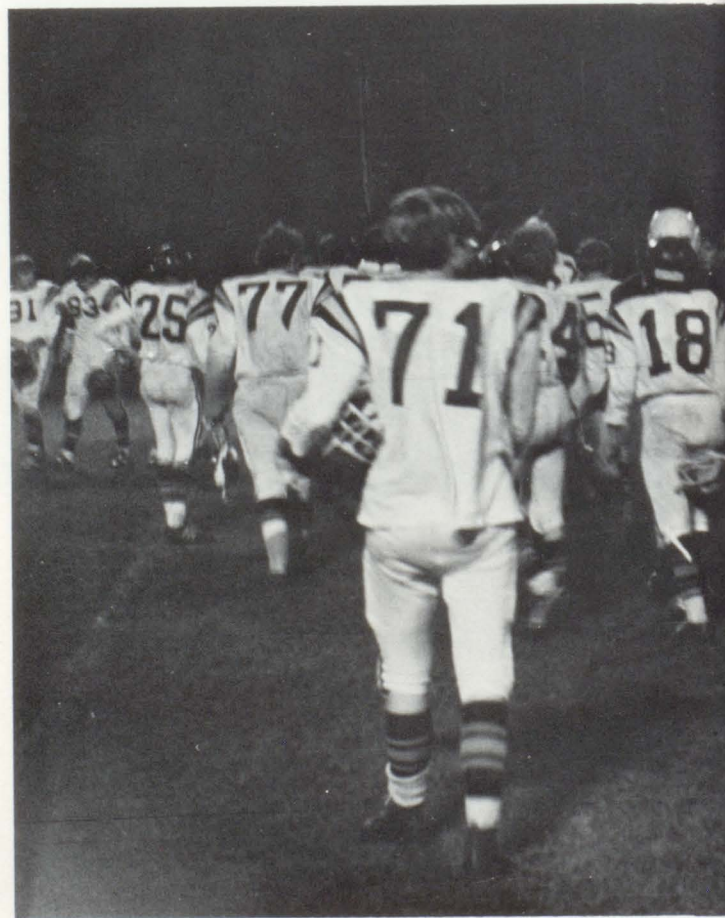
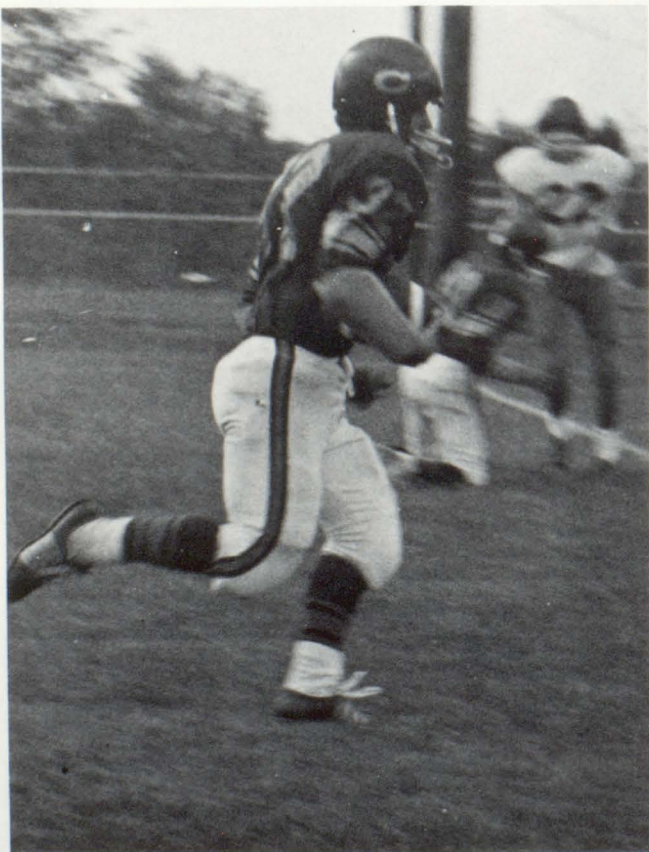

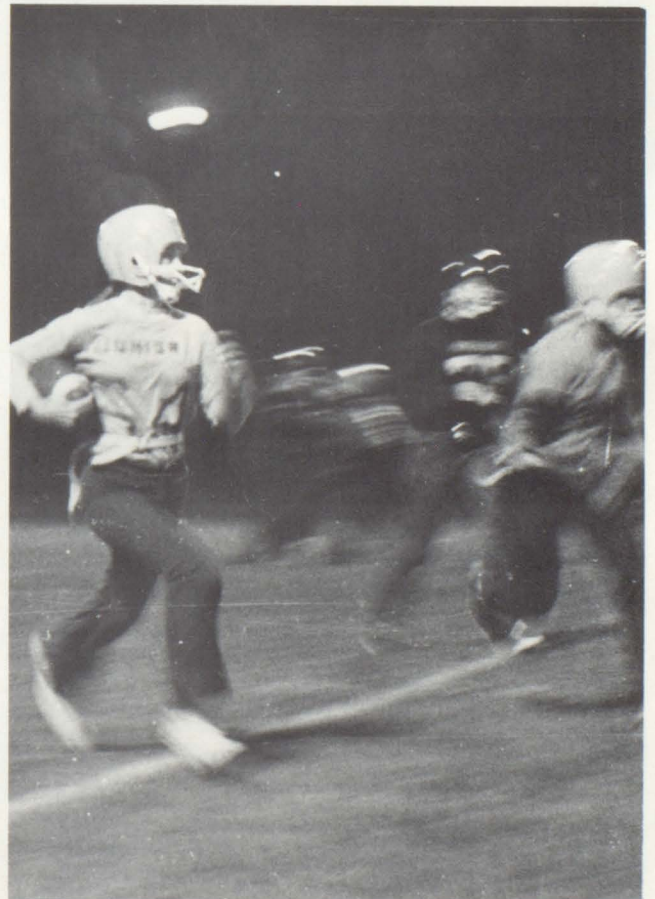

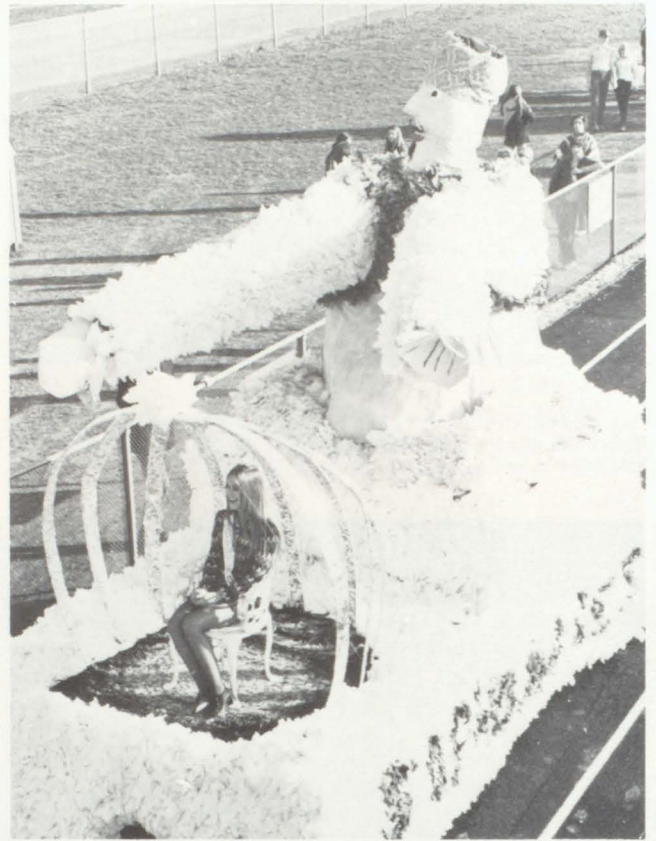

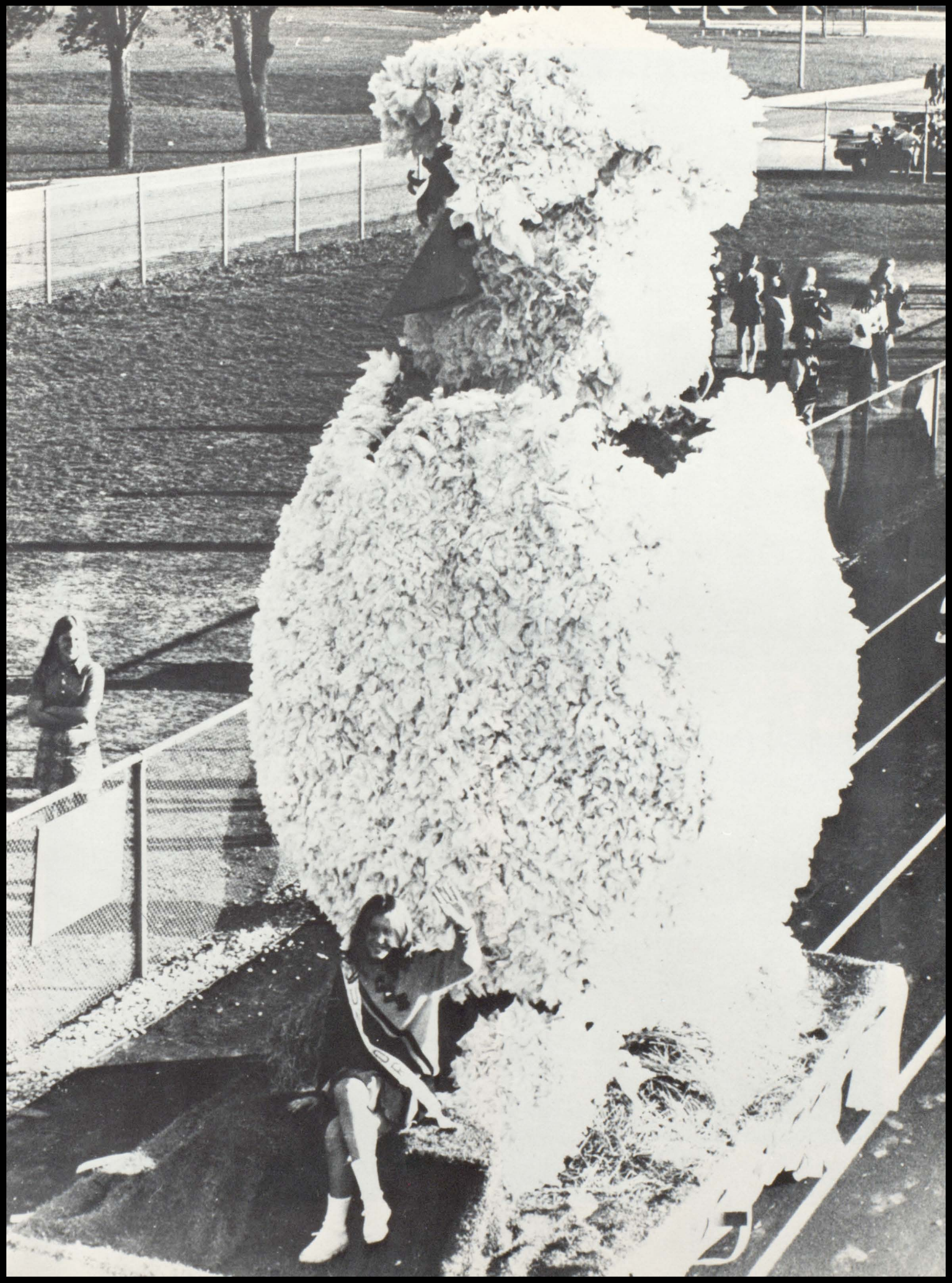

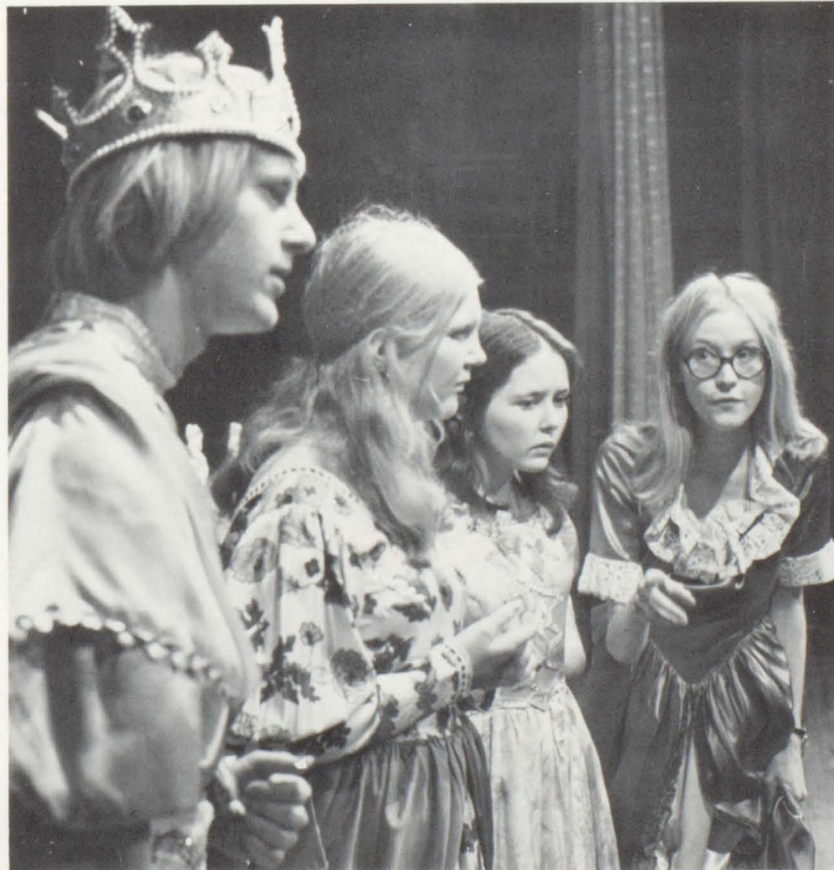

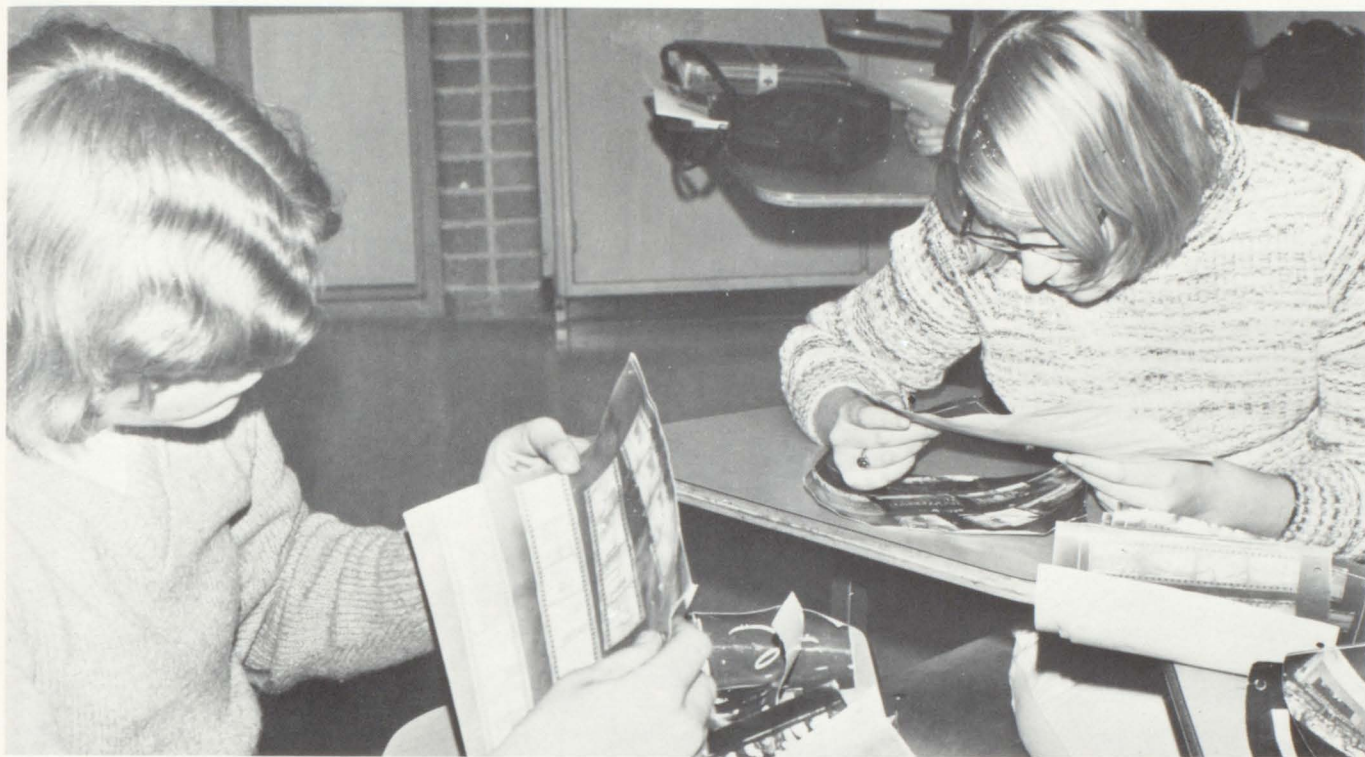

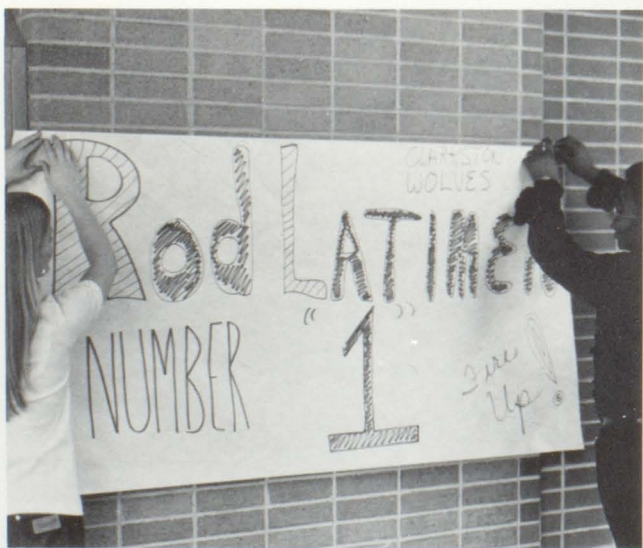
Signs & Assemblies Ignite School Spirit

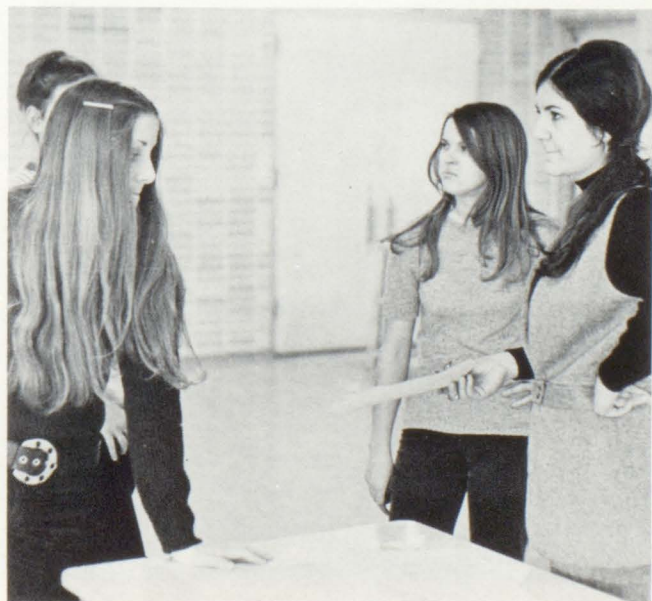

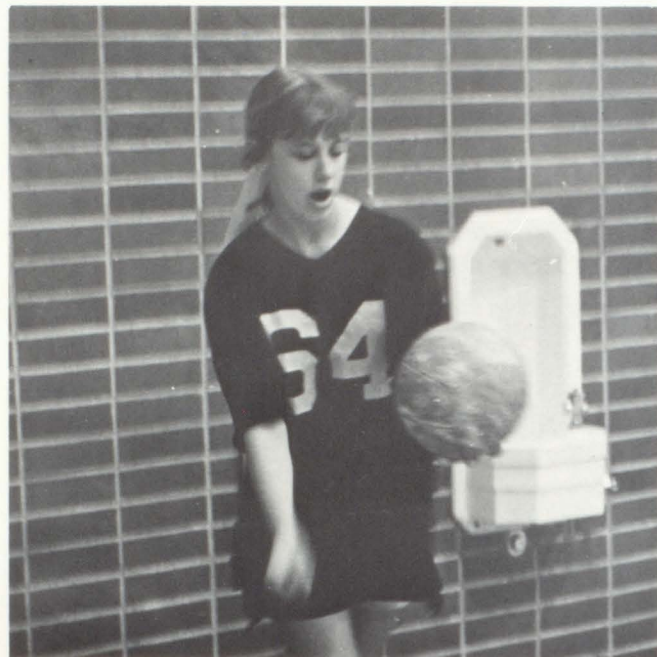


G.A.A. Provides Female Recreation

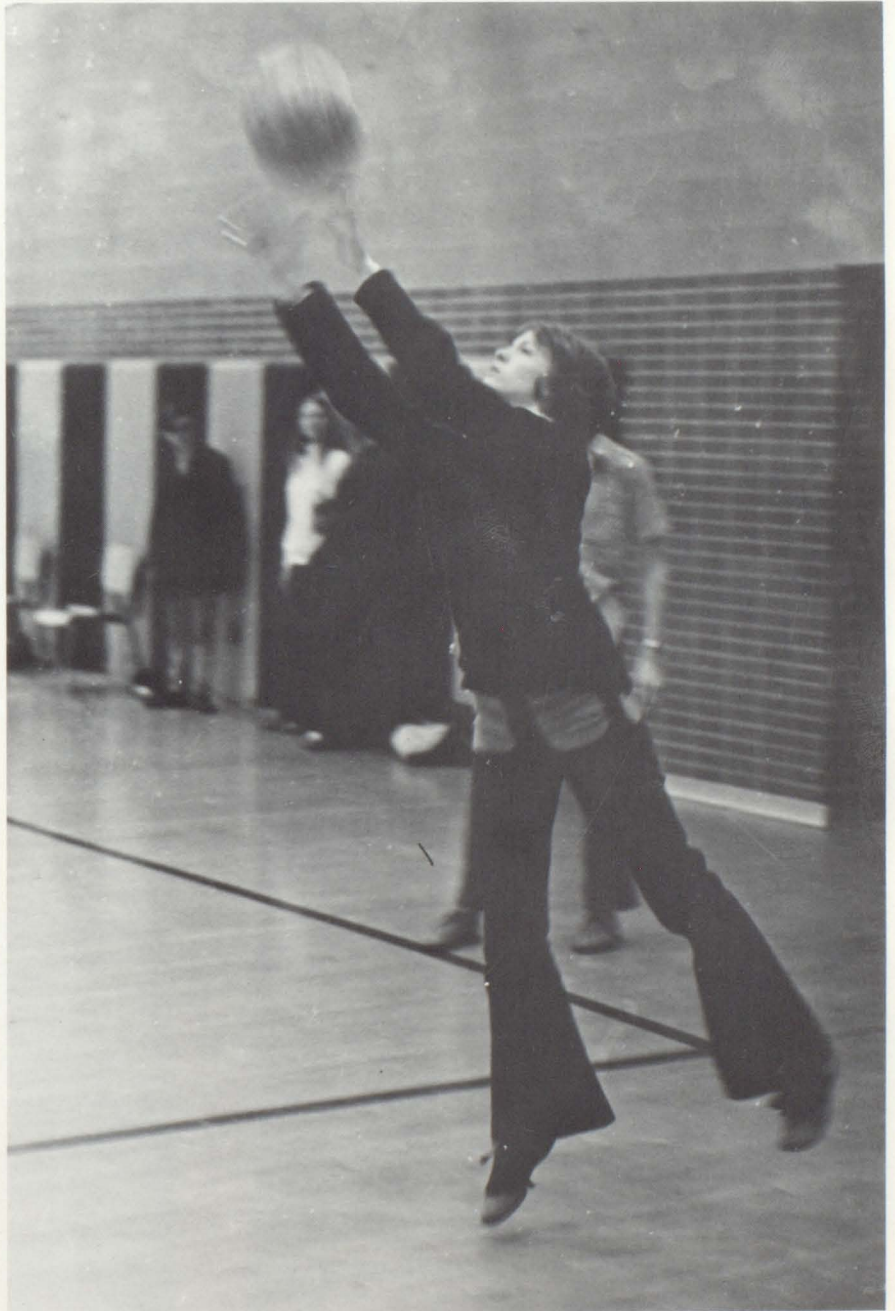

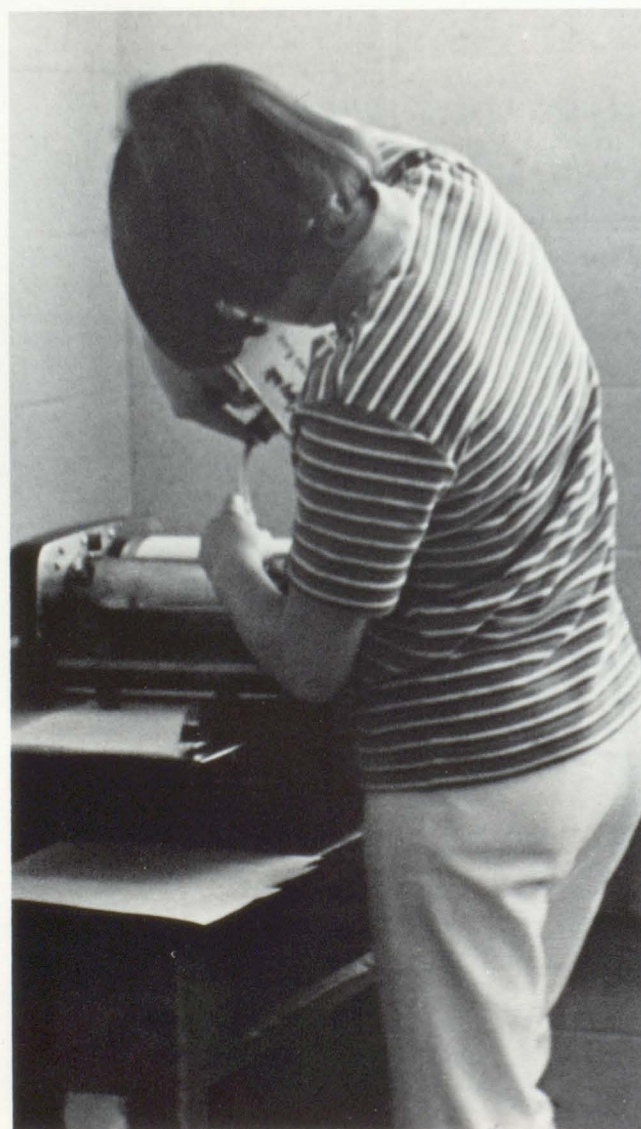
This class is designed to give people who desire to get into secretarial work experience and a general background in the field. The class is under the guidance of Mrs. Becker.

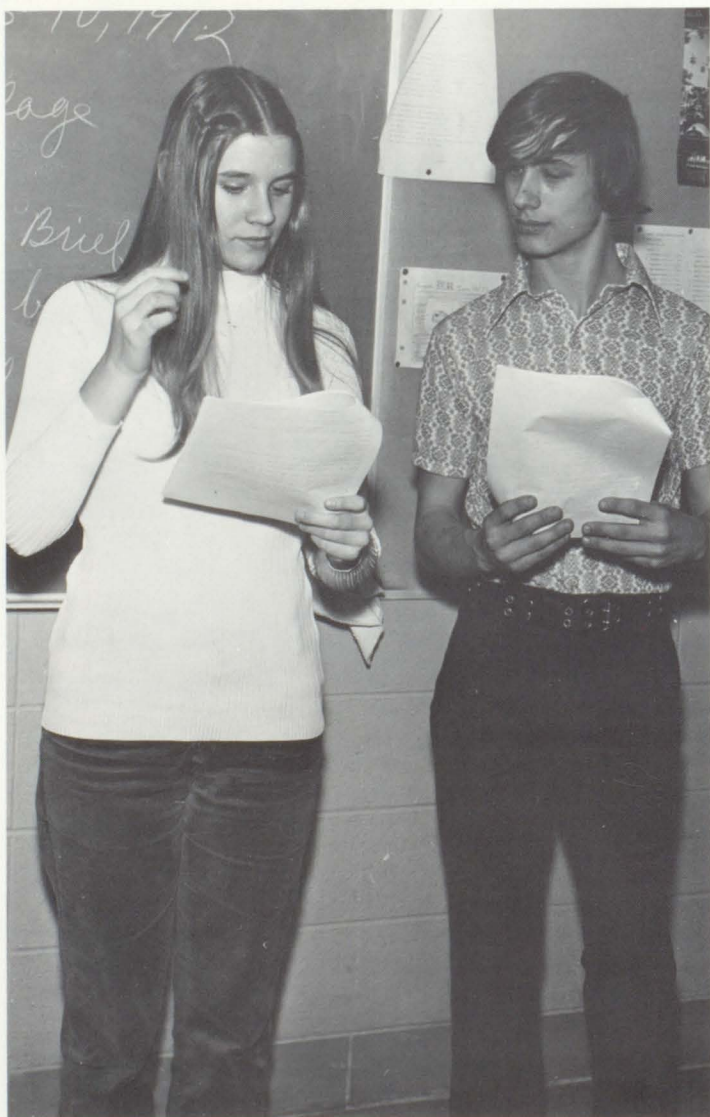
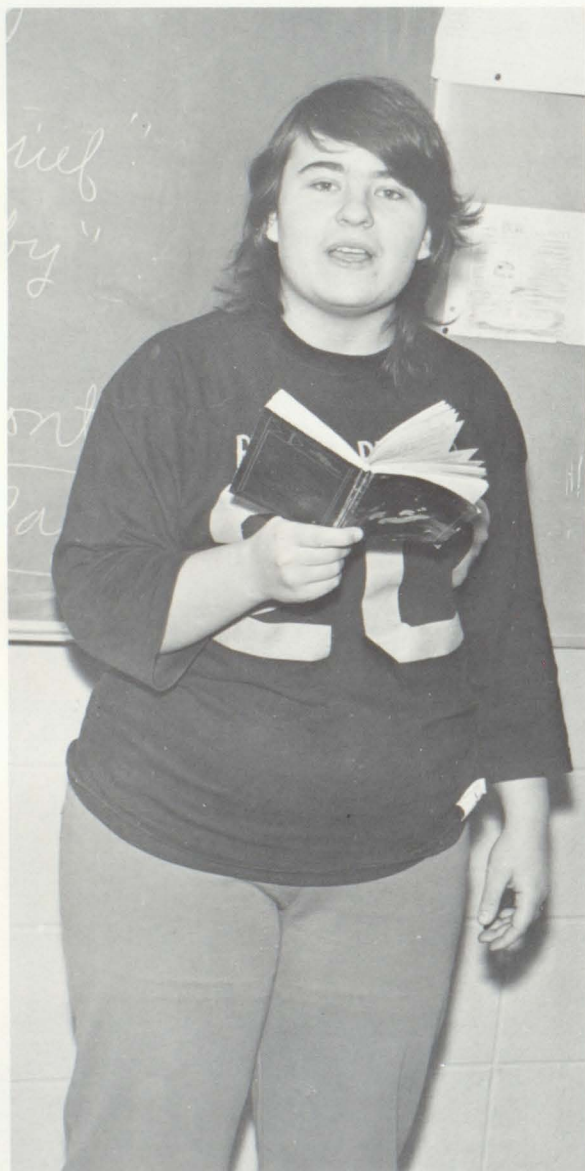
Events Recalled by Debate & Forensics

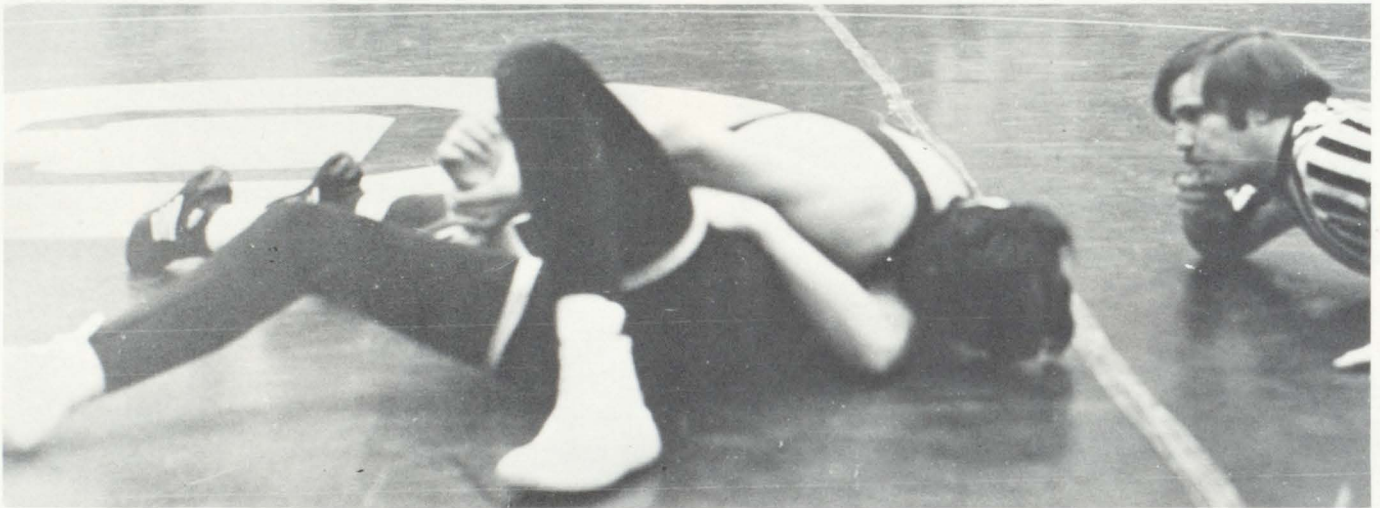

J.V. Grapplers Gain Varsity Experience

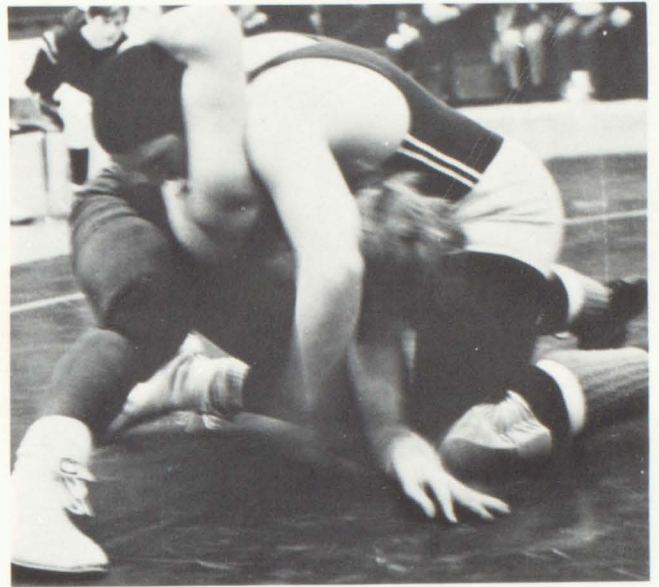
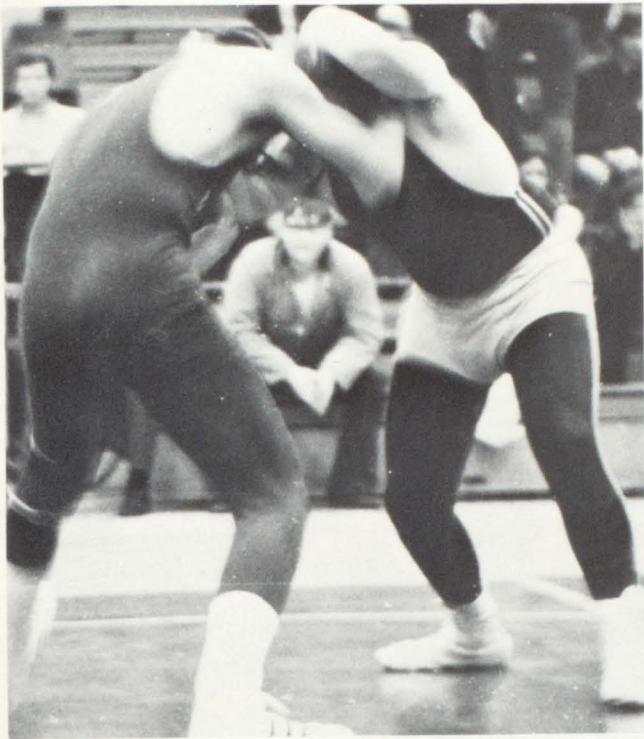

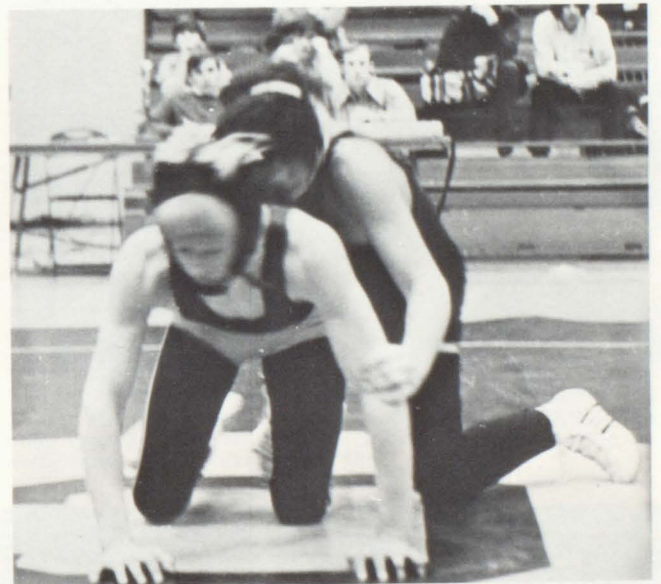
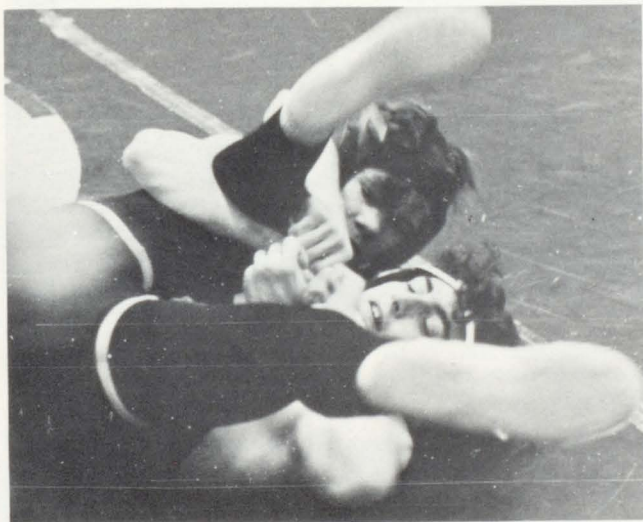
Above: Dan Millward uses a pin combination to subdue his opponent and add another match toward a junior varsity victory.

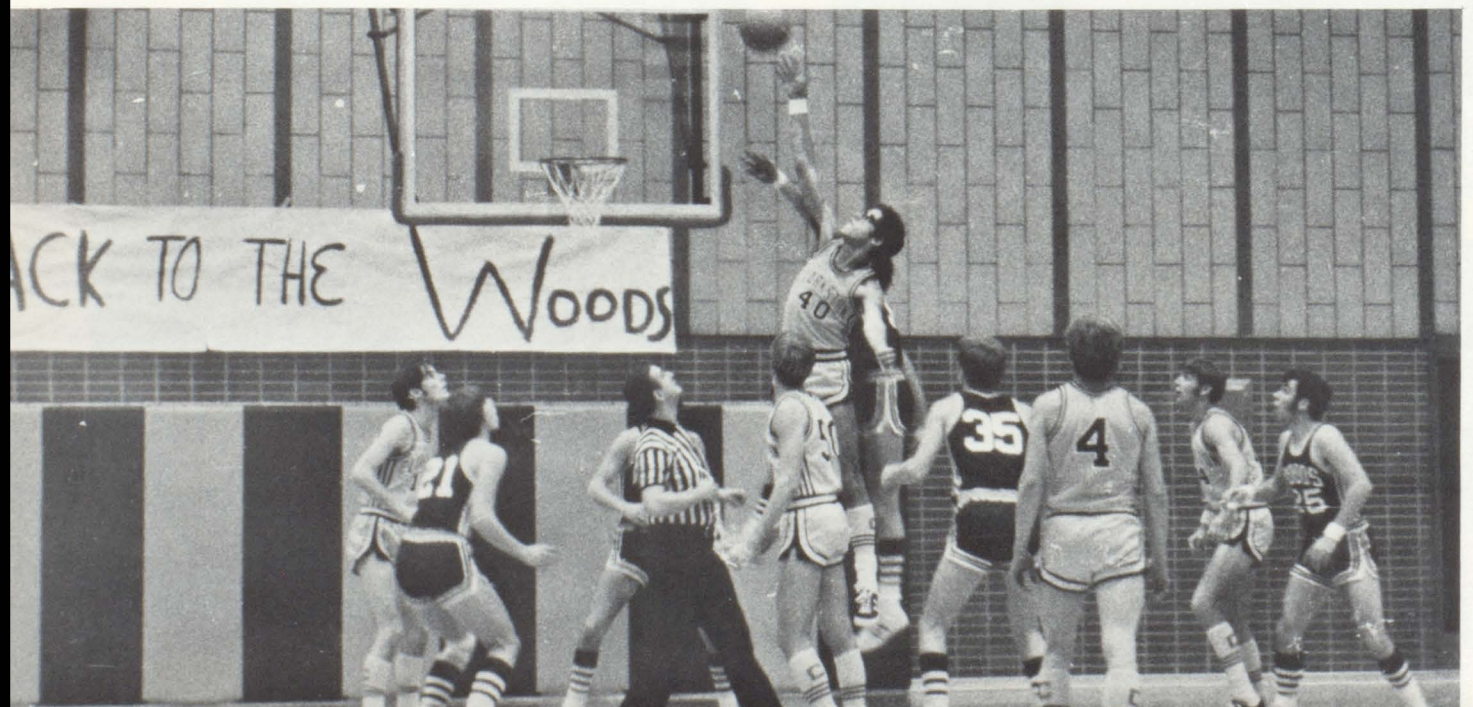
League Title Taken By Hungry Wolves

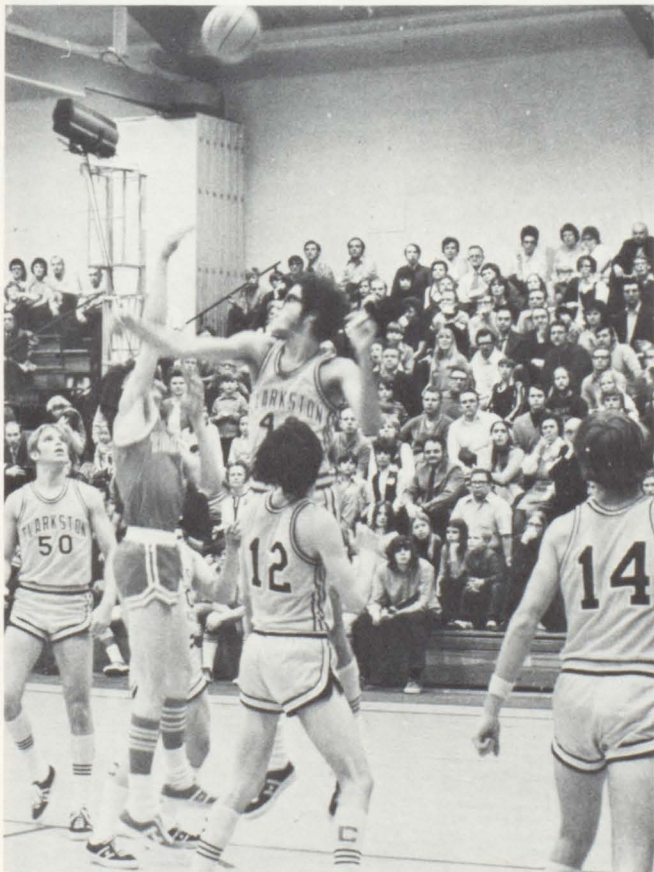

Winning Season Welcomes Coach Bihl

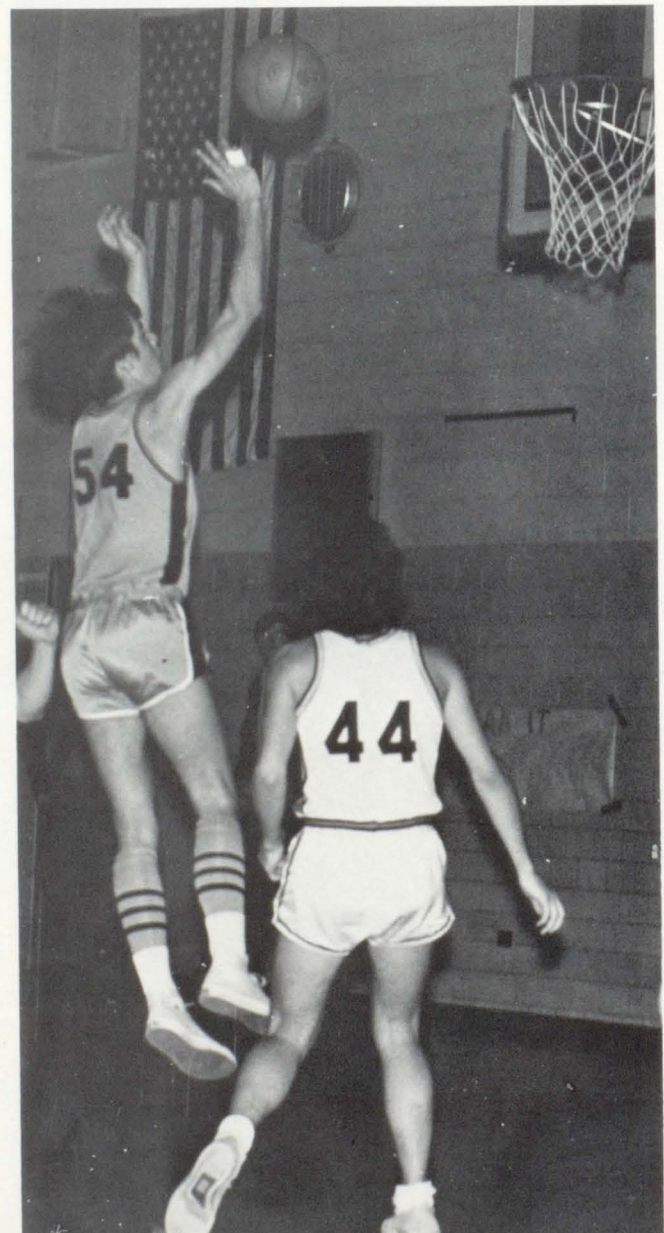

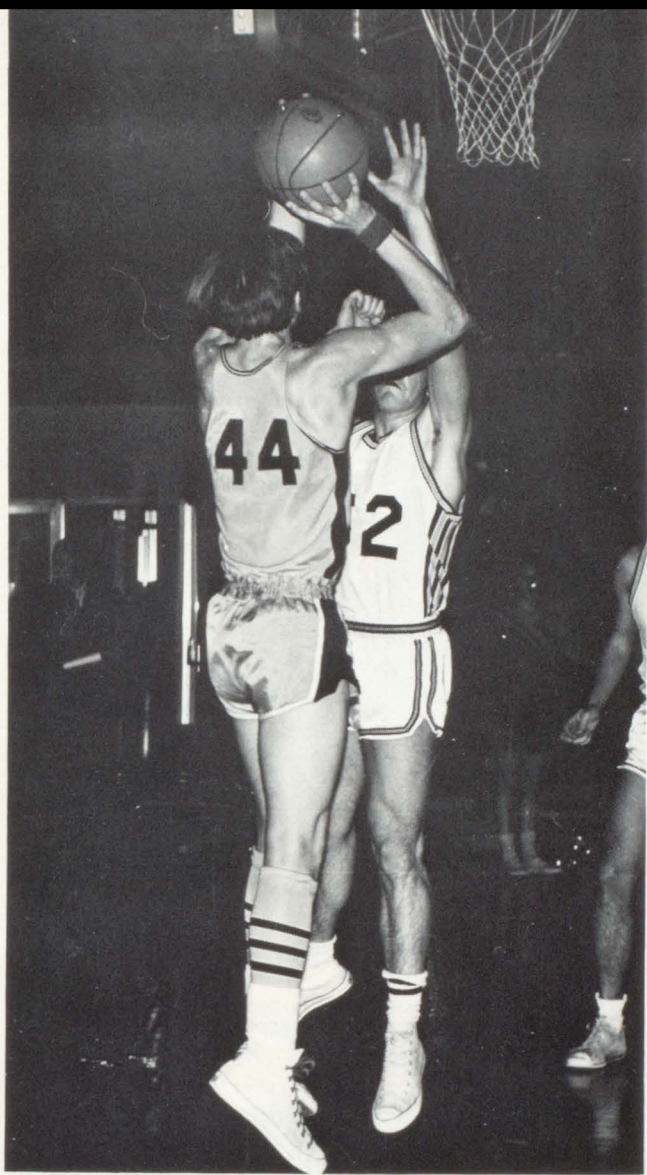


Above: Louis Pope jumps to regain the ball for Clarkston. Below: Dave Whitehead takes a bad fall while trying to capture the ball.

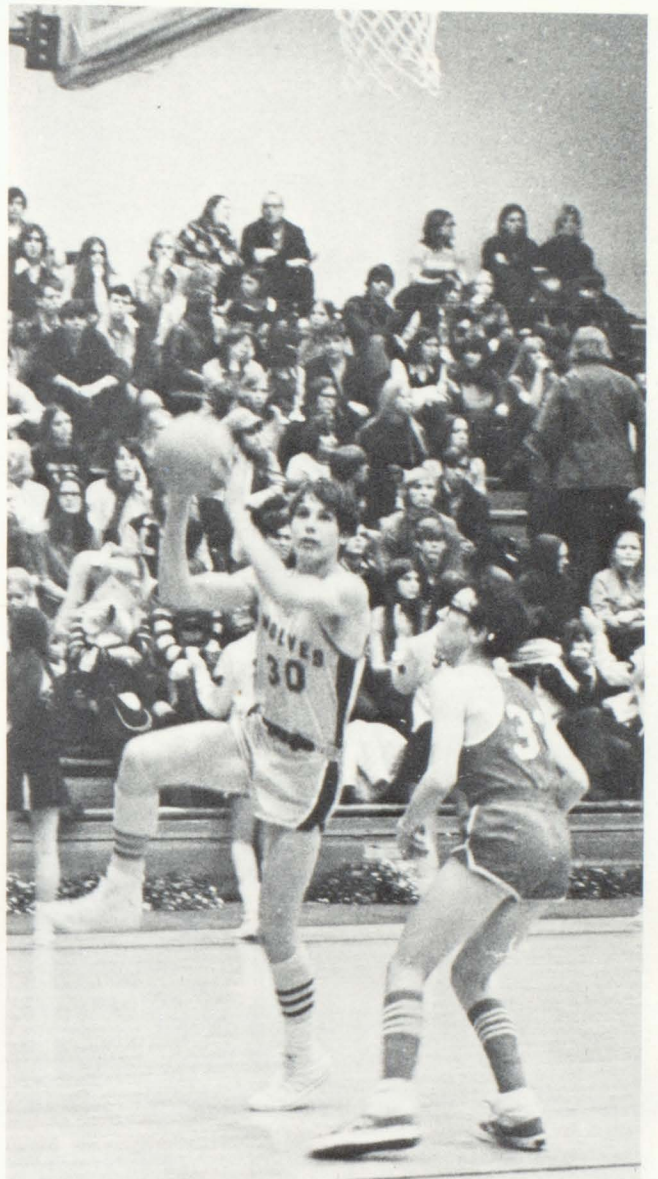


Above: Everyone waits to see if the ball will go in and score two more JV points. Below: Steve Philpott jumps high to score again.



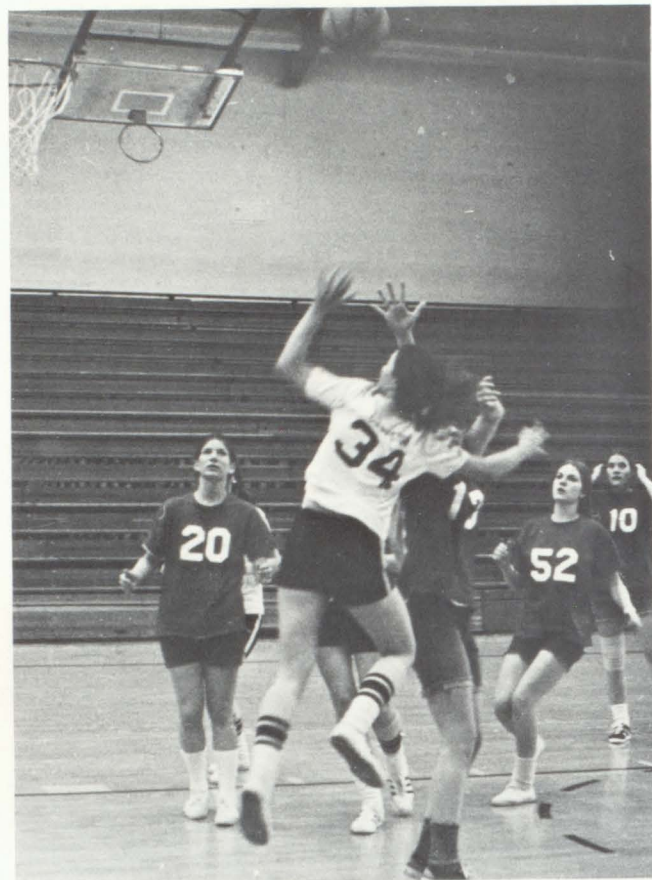

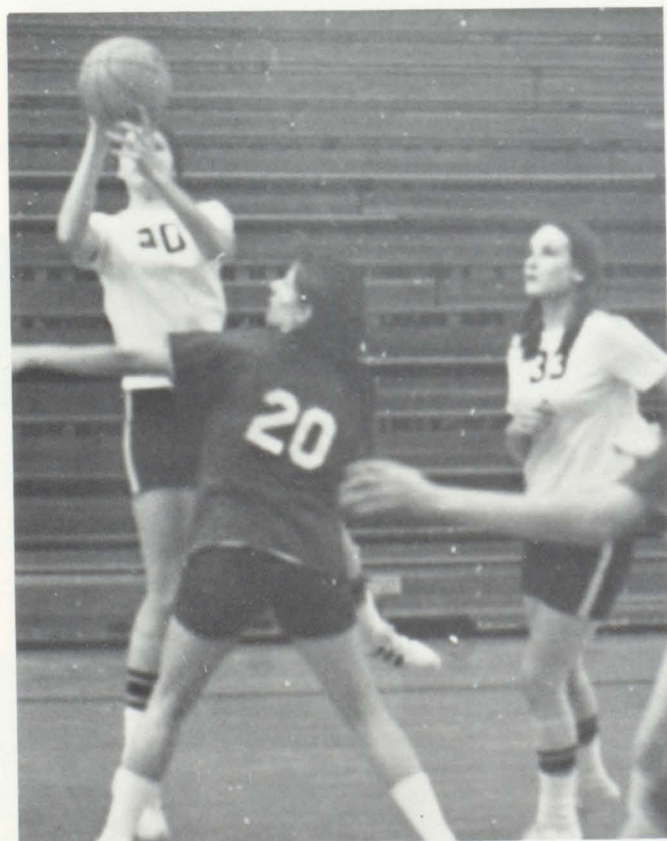

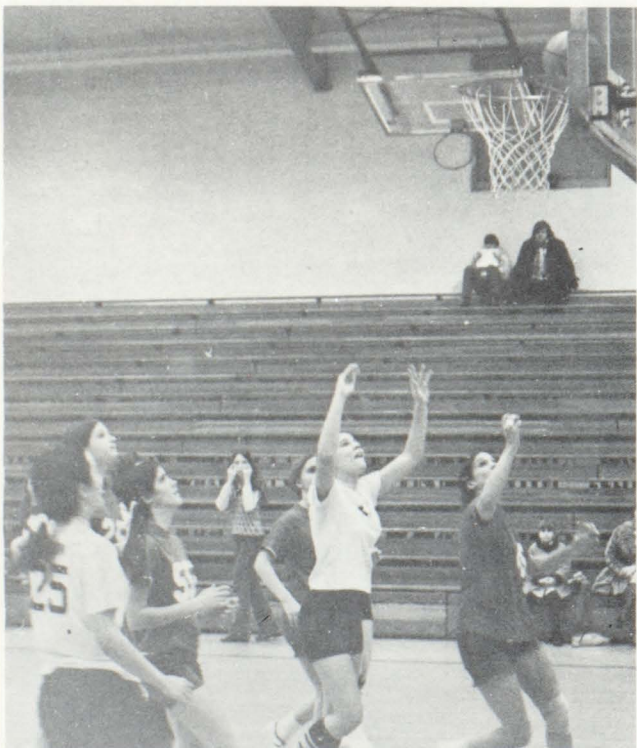


Miss DeArmond's Girls Again Victorious

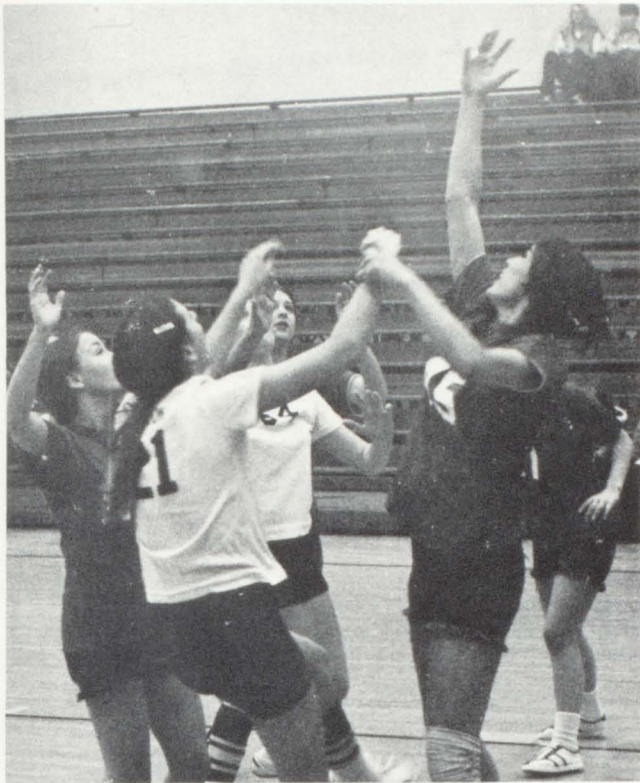

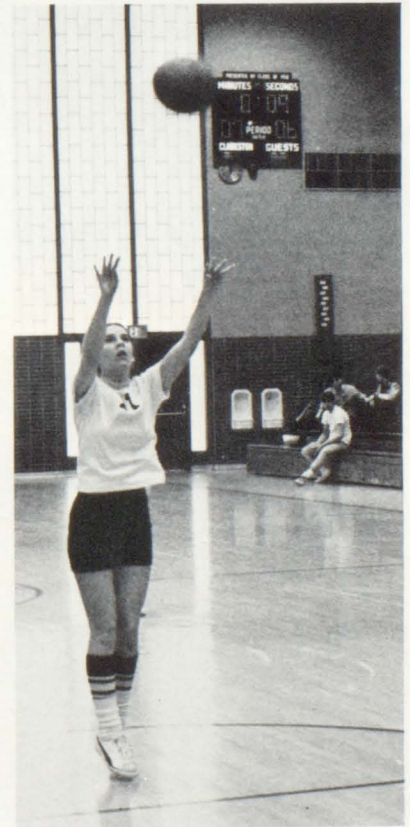

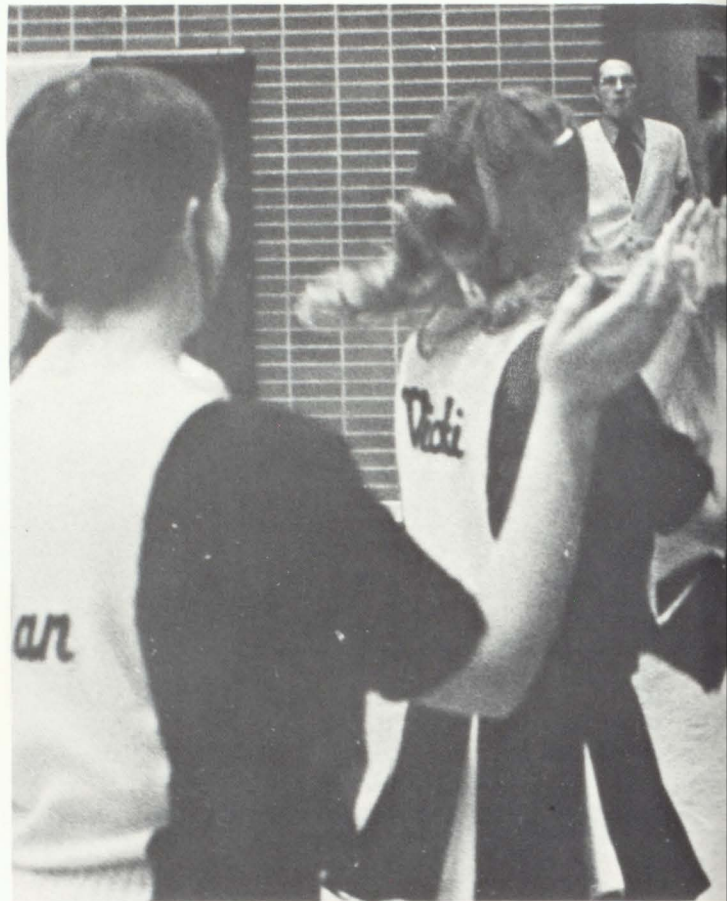
