OAKLAND COUNTY FACTS AND FIGURES

No section of the entire United States has a more interesting history or present day setup than Oakland County.

It runs the entire gamut from the days of the French Canadian trapper and the rule of Chief Pontiac to one of the greatest industrial areas in the world.

Its first permanent settlement was in 1817, but it had been visited by white men for more than half a century before that.

They started from Detroit and came up the river from Lake St. Clair, as far as the present site of Pontiac, to set their traps and barter with the Indians. The river was then known as the Huron.

Soon after the Revolutionary war was won, the federal government ordered a survey of the Michigan territory northwest of Detroit. The surveyors bogged down in the swamps in the vicinity of the present Wayne and Oakland County line.

After spending several weeks there, they returned a false report to the effect that they had gone far into the interior of the territory and found the present Oakland County area to be a hopeless morass, and wholly unfit for human habitation.

This caused the federal government to divert western colonization from Michigan into Ohio, Indiana and Illinois and it was not until Territorial Governor Lewis Cass ordered a new survey that the error was rectified. The false report delayed the settlement of this section from ten to twenty years.

But after the first permanent location of white men at Rochester in 1817 and at Pontiac one year later, the land was quickly taken up and the county has enjoyed a steady growth most of the time since.

The opening of the Erie Canal from the Hudson river to Lake Erie in 1828 was the greatest stimulant to the early growth of Oakland County. It afforded an all water route from the Atlantic seaboard to within eight miles of this county's south border.

The canal had been built under the direction of Governor Clinton of New York, and the name of the river connecting Pontiac and Lake St. Clair was changed to Clinton in his honor. The name Huron was then applied to another Oakland County river, unknown in the early settlement days.

The better part of a century, Oakland County was essentially an agricultural area but industry gained an early foothold. The many rivers and creeks furnished water power to turn the wheels of the saw, grist, flour and other mills, even before steam came into general use.

In Pontiac and elsewhere in the county, the manufacture of vehicles started over one hundred years ago and has since been the primary industry. In the making of wagons, buggies and sleighs Pontiac attained a high national reputation which it now holds in the manufacture of automotive products.

Despite its high industrial development, the county still maintains a leading position in agriculture. This is brought about by modern methods, more intensive farming, soil conservation, crop rotation, intelligent fertilization and the development of dairying.

The county's four hundred lakes, early considered to be a liability as they occupied space that might have been farming acreage, are now one of its biggest assets. Most of them have been surrounded by year round homes while others form the basis for the development of some of the greatest recreational projects in the entire nation.

With its factories now at a top employment peak and with an assured demand from a world-wide market, the industrial growth of Oakland County will continue to be a healthy and permanent one.

In its fourteen cities, ten villages and twenty-five townships the county now has a population of over one-third of a million people. The special census of 1947 showed a big growth, especially in some of the rural sections, now largely populated by factory workers.

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ORDER OF BUSINESS

- 1st. Reading of Minutes
- 2nd. Special Order of Business
- 3rd. Report of Standing Committees

RULE I. The Chairman shall take the chair at the time the Board stands adjourned, and the Board shall be called to order and the Roll of members called.

RULE II. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the Journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board.

RULE III. The Board shall appoint a Chairman pro tempore, who shall perform the duties of the chair in the absence of the Chairman.

RULE IV. The Chairman shall preserve order and shall decide questions of order subject to an appeal to the Board.

RULE V. Every member, when he speaks, shall address the Chair standing in his place. No member shall speak more than twice in any one debate on the same day without leave of the Board.

RULE VI. When two or more members rise at once the Chairman shall name the member who is first to speak.

RULE VII. No motion shall be debated until the same is seconded and it shall be reduced in writing if desired by the Chairman or any member, delivered at the desk and read by the Chairman or Clerk, before the same shall be debated, but it may be withdrawn any time before decision or amendment.

RULE VIII. When a question is under debate, no motions shall be received but to adjourn, for the previous question, to lay on the table, to postpone indefinitely, to postpone to a certain day, or to amend: which several motions shall have precedence in the order in which they stand arranged.

RULE IX. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order. That and the motion to lay on the table shall be decided without debate.

RULE X. The previous question shall be in the form: "Shall the main question now be put?" It shall only be admitted when demanded by a majority of the members present, and its effect shall be to put an end to all debate and bring the Board to vote upon pending amendments and then upon the main question.

RULE XI. When a member shall be called to order, he shall sit down immediately, until the Chairman shall have determined whether he is in order or not; and any questions of order shall be decided by the Chairman, subject to an appeal.

RULE XII. A motion to convene as a committee of the whole shall be in order when there is no privileged motion before the house, and when carried by a majority of the members voting the house shall convene, but any action taken in committee-of-the-whole must be confirmed in the regular session of the Board.

RULE XIII. No member shall absent himself from the Board without leave first being obtained, and no member shall draw compensation unless he shall have answered roll call at least once each day or has himself recorded present during said session.

RULE XIV. Ayes and Nays shall be ordered when demanded by any member of the Board, provided said member shall demand same before the vote is ordered.

RULE XV. Each member shall be required to vote on every question unless excused by the Chairman.

RULE XVI. When a question has been once put and decided by ayes and nays, it shall be in order for any member (voting in the majority) to move a reconsideration thereof. On all other questions, any member may move a reconsideration. But no motion for a reconsideration shall be in order unless made on the same day, or succeeding day, on which the vote was taken, nor shall any question be considered more than once without unanimous consent.

RULE XVII. After the ayes and nays are called upon any question, and after the question is stated from the Chair, and the Clerk directed to call the roll, no member shall be entitled to speak on the question.

RULE XVIII. Select committees to whom references shall be made shall, in all cases, report a state of facts, and their opinion thereon, to the Board.

RULE XIX. When the Board adjourns, the members shall keep their seats until the Chairman announces adjournment.

RULE XX. Section 1. The following standing committees shall be appointed by the Chairman during the first session of the Board and shall be composed as follows:

The Board of Supervisors may by resolution create Special Committees with a definite assignment, and when so created such committees shall hold over until their assigned project is completed unless sooner discharged by a majority vote of the Board of Supervisors but the Chairman shall have the same power of appointment of such special committees as he has in the case of standing committees.

Section 3. The Chairman of the Board shall be empowered to fill all vacancies on Committees caused by resignation or otherwise.

RULE XXI. Section 1. All requests, communications, petitions or questions brought before the Board by any County Officer or County Board, or any other party or organization shall be submitted to a written or printed form, and unless otherwise ordered by the Board, referred by the Chairman to the proper Committee for consideration.

Section 2. A copy of all requests, communications, petitions or questions brought to the attention of the Board of Supervisors by either the Clerk or the Chairman or any member thereof and referred by the Board to a Committee or Committees, shall within 48 hours thereafter be forwarded to the Chairman of such Committee by the clerk with a copy of the referring resolution attached, and said clerk shall within the same time, also forward a copy of the same to the Board of Auditors.

RULE XXII. No standing rule of the Board shall be rescinded, changed or added to, except by the consent of a majority of the members-elect of the Board and with one day's notice of the motion thereof.

RULE XXIII. The rules of parliamentary practice as comprised in "Roberts Rules" shall govern in all cases in which they are not inconsistent with the standing rules and orders of the Board or the Constitution or the laws of the State of Michigan.

PRIVILEGED QUESTIONS

RULE XXIV. Privileged questions are questions that may be considered when other questions are pending. They are:

- 1st. To adjourn.
- 2nd. To adjourn to a certain time.
- 3rd. The previous question.
- 4th. To lay on the table.
- 5th. To postpone indefinitely.
- 6th. To postpone to a certain length of time.
- 7th. To commit or to amend.

The first, when made and seconded, is always in order. The first, third and fourth must be decided without debate.

PREVIOUS QUESTIONS

RULE XXV. The previous question when moved and seconded, is a motion to determine all amendments to the question pending and the pending question itself, without further amendments or debate, or before any motion is in order, except to adjourn. It shall be stated in the form, "Shall the main question now be put?"

RECONSIDERATIONS

RULE XXVI. A motion for reconsideration may be made by any member of the prevailing side within one day after the question was determined, but if such motion be laid on the table it shall there remain.

MOTIONS

RULE XXVII. When a member desires to make a motion he shall arise and address the Chair, and when recognized by the Chair, he has the floor to make his motion, and if the motion is seconded, it shall be stated by the Chair after which it may be debated.

RULE XXVIII. A motion to adjourn to the call of the Chair may be made whenever an adjournment as contrasted with a dissolution of the assembly is desired, and such motion shall have the effect and be construed to mean an adjournment to a day certain, the day certain being fixed by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, provided, however, notice of the reconvening of the Board by the Chairman shall be given to each member thereof by the posting of such notice in the United States mails sufficiently stamped, properly sealed and plainly addressed to each member at his last known address ten days preceding the reconvening of the session; provided further, that such notice will be considered waived by attendance and answer to the roll call at the reconvening meeting and, provided further, that no such adjournment shall be considered as a dissolution of the assembly and always a continuance of the session in which it is made.

RULE XXIX. All committee reports involved in making up the budget shall be filed in the office of the Board of Auditors on or before the 5th day of October of each year, copies thereof forwarded to each member of the Board of Supervisors on or before the 15th day of October and no changes or amendments shall be made therein without concurrence by a majority of the members of the committee submitting the report unless said changes or amendments are made by the Board of Supervisors in adopting the budget.

RULE XXX. All Annual Reports such as those of Welfare Board, Auditor General, Drain Commissioner, Road Commission, Tuberculosis Sanatorium or any others, shall be filed in the office of the Board of Auditors in triplicate and one copy thereof forwarded to each member of the Board of Supervisors on or before the 5th day of October of each year.

RULE XXXI. No request, resolution or motion that will directly at the time of being made or later under its provision cause the expenditure of money, can receive final action or passage until it has been referred to the appropriate committee or committees, and reported for consideration on the recommendation of the committee at a subsequent meeting of the Board.

MEETINGS OF BOARD

RULE XXXII. In addition to the statutory meetings of this board: (a) There shall be a regular meeting of this Board at ten o'clock A.M. on the Friday preceding the second Monday in May at which time the Board of Supervisors shall submit a "Tentative Budget for Allocation Purposes", and refer same to a joint meeting of the Salaries, Appropriations and Ways and Means Committees, which Committees shall meet preceding the meeting of the Board of Supervisors provided for in Section (b) below;

(b) There shall be a regular meeting of this Board at ten o'clock A.M. on the Friday preceding the first Monday in June at which time the Board of Supervisors shall approve a "Final Budget for Allocation Purposes", which budget shall be submitted by the joint Committees mentioned in Section (a) above. The Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee shall act as Chairman of the joint Committees; however, if a majority of the personnel of any of the three committees does not concur with the joint committee report, the Chairman of that Committee shall present to the Board of Supervisors a minority "joint Committee report" pointing out the reasons for nonconcurrence and the Board of Supervisors shall thereafter dispose of the matter according to its judgment.
