OAKLAND COUNTY ROADS

More than half of all highways, roads, and streets in Oakland County are on the county system - under jurisdiction of the Board of Oakland County Road Commissioners.

Totalling more than 2,500 miles, this system includes all public roads in townships and through streets in most cities and villages. It is the longest county system in Michigan. Its subdivision streets alone (all in townships) make up more than 1,000 miles - or the equivalent of a trip from Pontiac to Florida.

Many miles of the system remain unpaved and virtually unchanged in 67 years as they wind through countryside and past the county's many lakes. A baker's dozen miles have been officially designated as "Natural Beauty Roads" because of unusual scenic vistas and roadside vegetation. About half of the system is paved. More than half is within the county's urban area, where some roads are four and five lanes wide to handle heavy traffic. A single intersection, in Southfield, is the meeting place for 100,000 vehicles daily. Over 750 traffic signals help sort out and keep safe the many intersection movements.

This year the Road Commission is undertaking its largest single construction project ever, widening of Orchard Lake Road to five lanes from north of 12 Mile Road in Farmington Hills to 15 Mile Road in West Bloomfield Township. About 30,000 vehicles daily use the existing two-lane pavement although it was never intended to handle more than 17,000. Frequent turning movements due to dense commercial development add even more pressure and safety hazards that must be overcome.

About \$12 million worth of other construction projects are programmed for 1980. These will add lanes, pave roads, resurface roads, and improve intersections.

The emphasis in all construction projects is on hazard countermeasures, in keeping with the Road Commission's policy that "Safety Is Our Number One Priority." An organization-wide program of "Highway Risk Management" innovatively identifies safety risks and systematically attempts to implement countermeasures. More than \$500,000 was devoted to specific countermeasures in 1979.

The Road Commission employs 547 persons, more than half of whom are hourly rated and perform maintenance functions - such as pothole and edge rut repairs, winter snow and ice control, sign and signal maintenance and care of the 392-vehicle fleet. This work force requires a payroll of nearly \$12 million and fringe benefits costing \$3.4 million. Asphalt used for pothole and edge rut repairs annually could pave about 15 miles of two-lane roadway. A normal winter requires about 48,000 tons of de-icing salt. In 1979, the Road Commission increased its salt storage capacity from one-fifth of this annual need to two-thirds.

Such road services are provided by the tax payers to the tune of \$35 million in 1980. However, the Road Commission does **not** levy a countywide tax, nor does any other unit of the county government. The basic source of Road Commission revenues is state-collected taxes. Motorists pay these at the pump for gasoline and diesel fuel and to the Secretary of State for vehicle registrations. Since 1973, collections of these taxes have failed to keep pace with inflation. The Road Commission's share is up less than three percent this year, although costs are up about 13 percent due to inflation. In fact, overall Road Commission revenues are down seven percent from 1979.

Higher pump prices for gasoline and diesel fuel have **not** meant equally higher revenues for transportation services. The tax rate is based on the number of gallons sold - **not** on the price per gallon.

Construction improvements on about 61 percent of the county system depend on at least 50 percent of the funding coming from sources other than the state-collected gas and weight tax - by state law. Two townships - Commerce and Highland - levy a special tax for this purpose. The long-standing Commerce Township road levy has resulted in 75 percent of its roads being paved, which compares to 48 percent in townships county wide. Highland's relatively new road tax is making possible a contract with the Road Commission for specific construction projects. Bloomfield Township and Avon Township also have road levies, but devote them to higher levels of road maintenance. Other townships contribute to road improvements from time to time out of general fund revenues.

For paving or resurfacing of subdivision streets, the Road Commission has limited its contribution of gas and weight tax funding to 10 percent of the project cost. A special procedure of property owners' petitions and public hearings is conducted to make possible special assessment of benefitting property owners for the major share of the cost of such projects on subdivision streets.

Since 1973, the Road Commission has provided a special ombudsman office to handle citizen complaints and requests for information. That office may be reached between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. by dialing 858-4804.

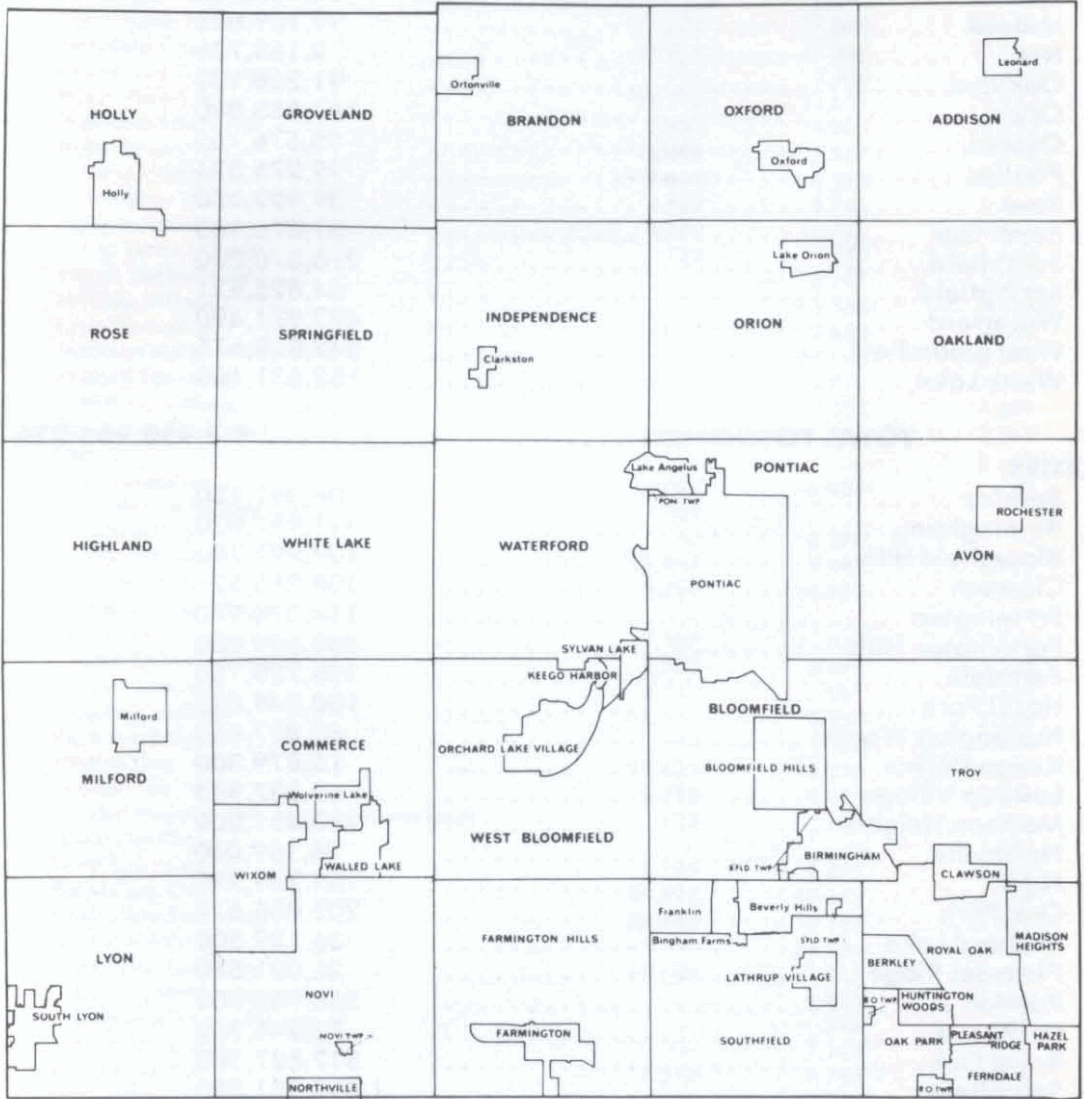

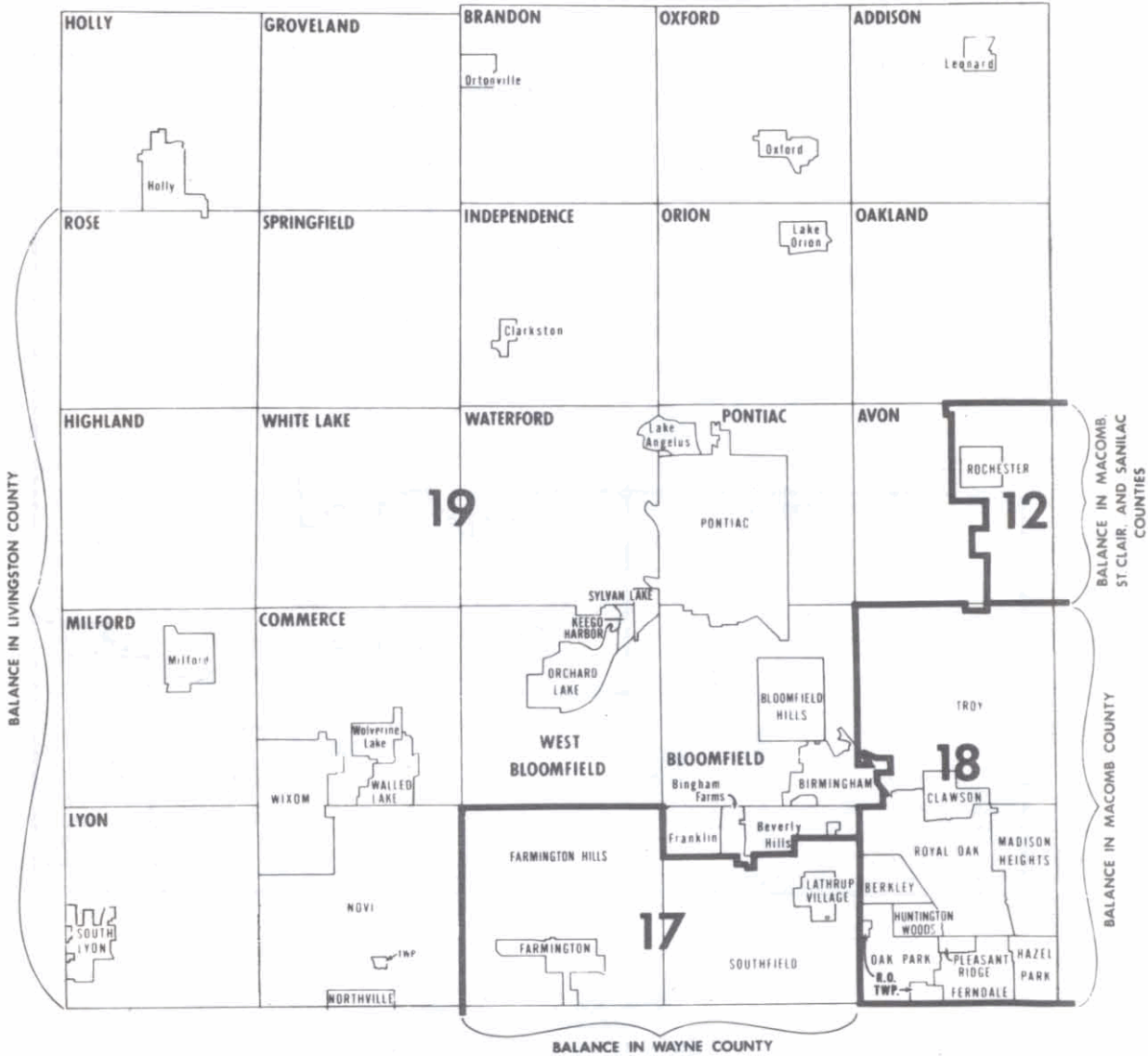

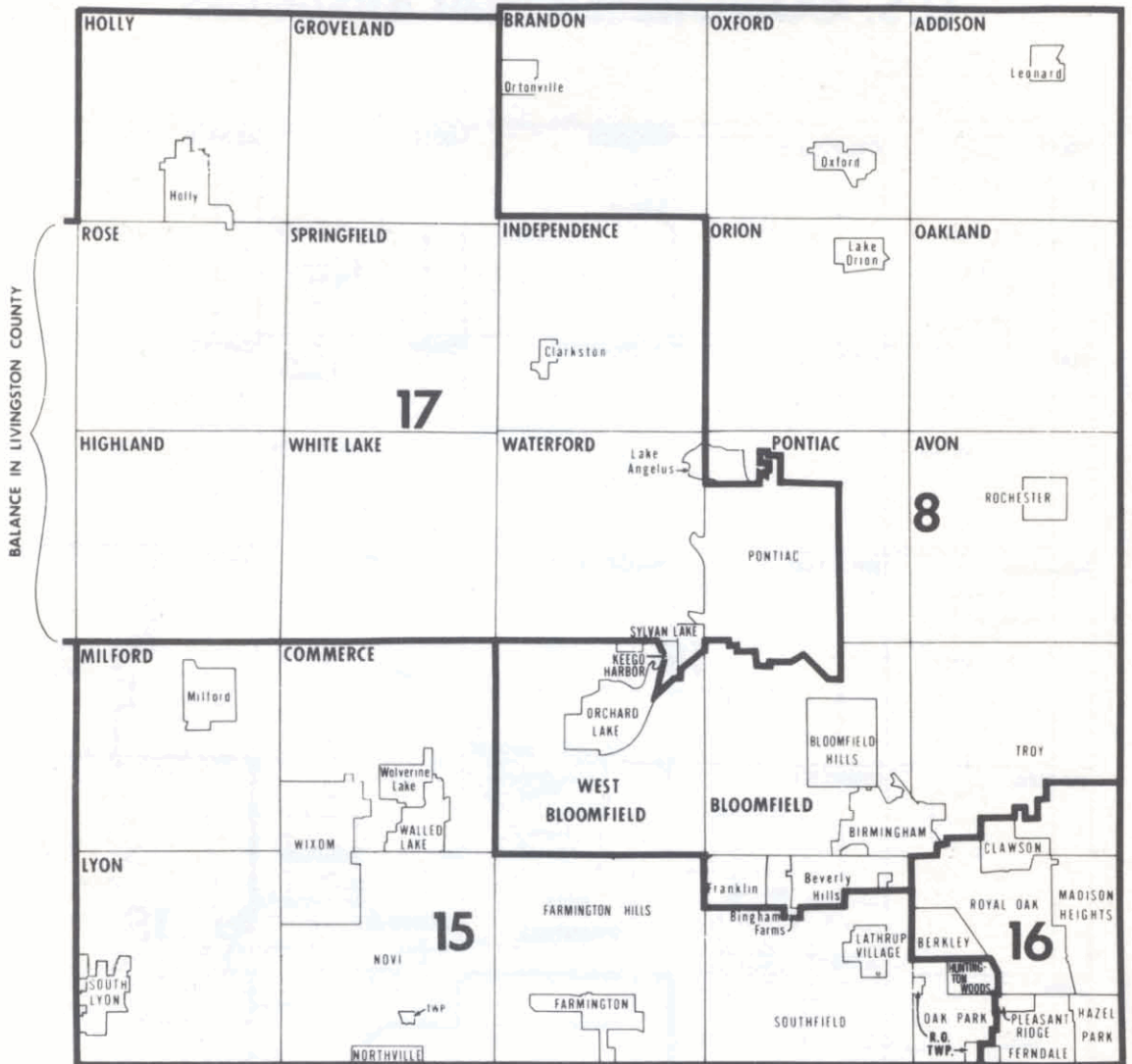
U.S. CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS

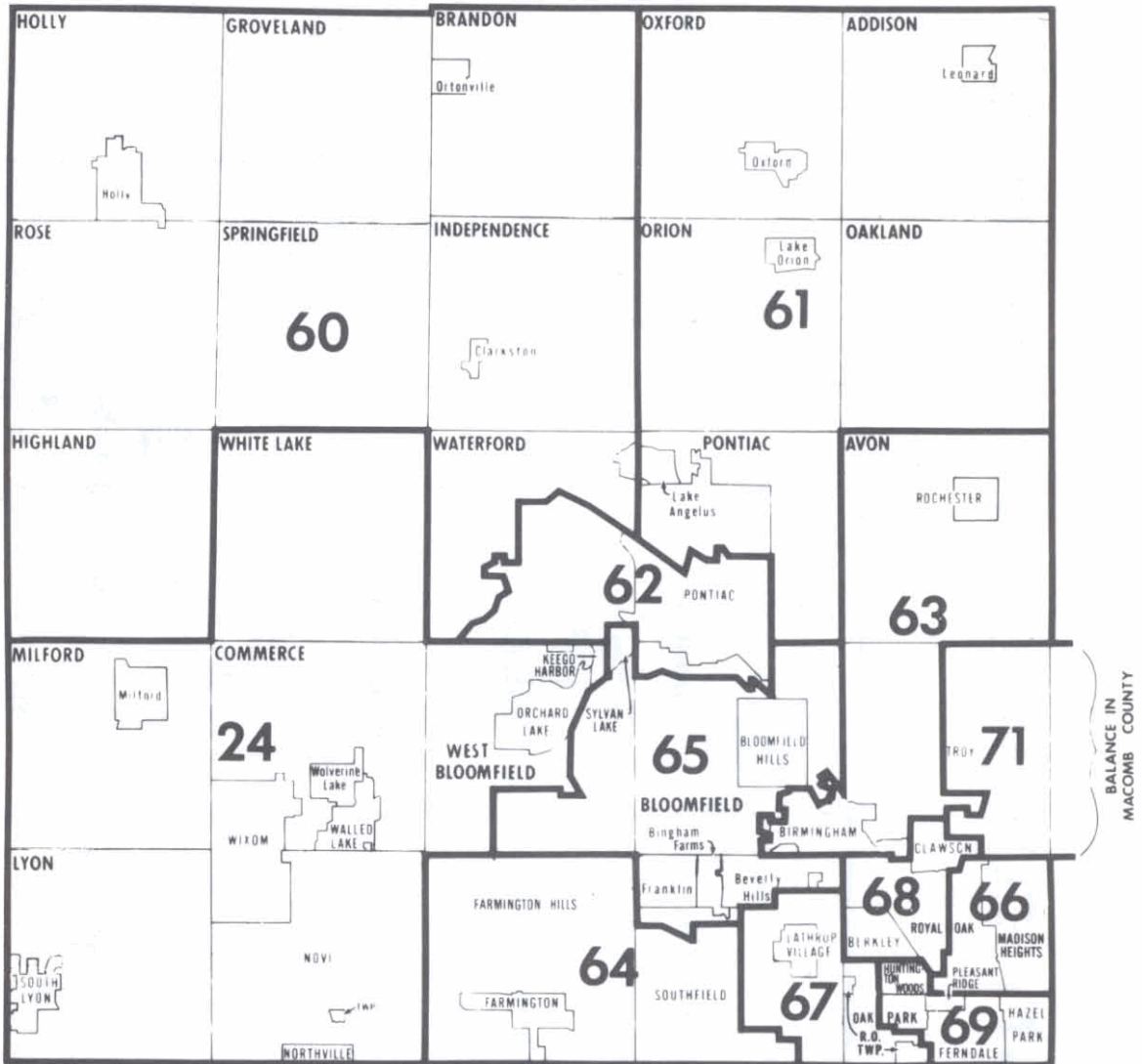

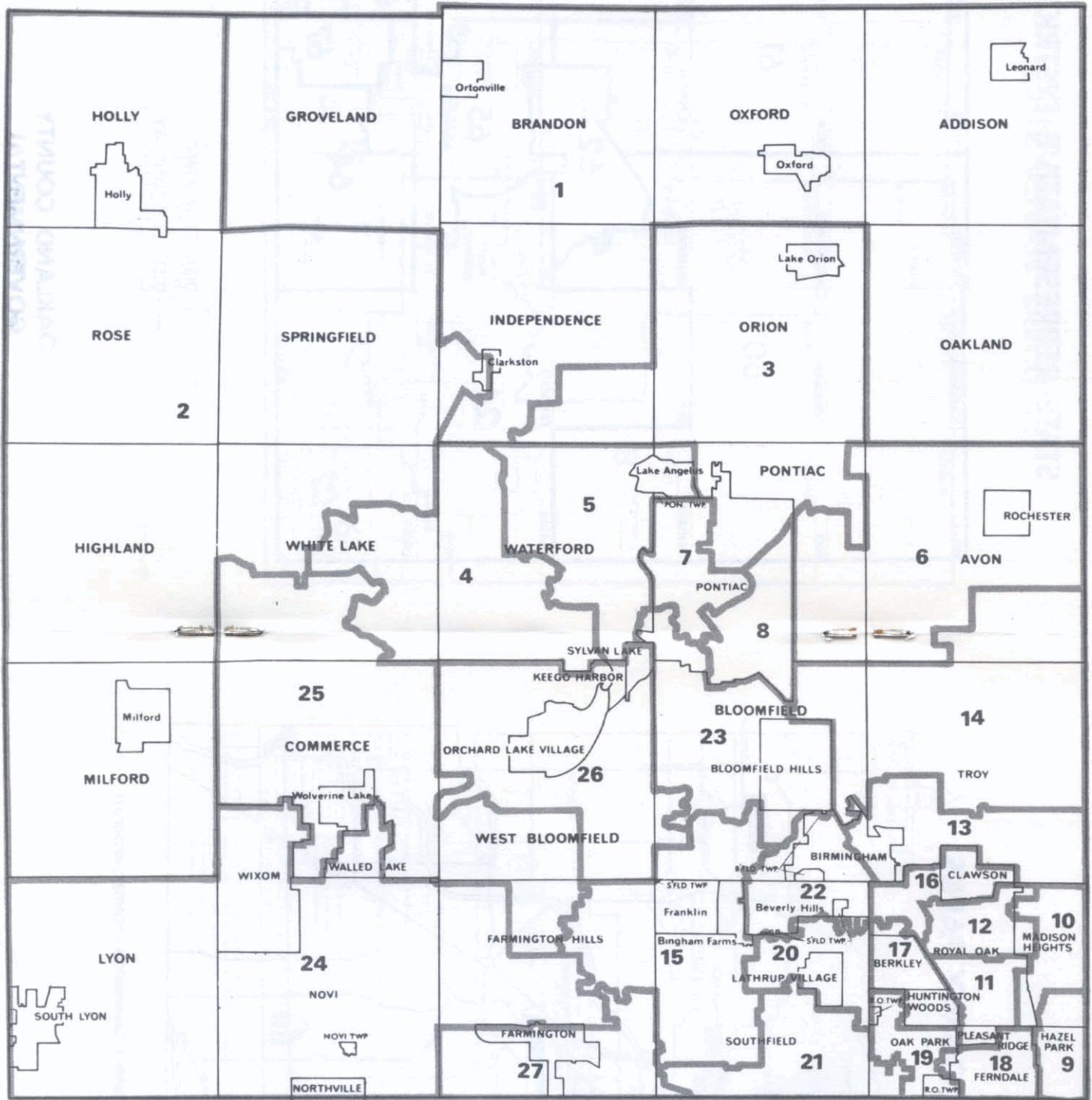

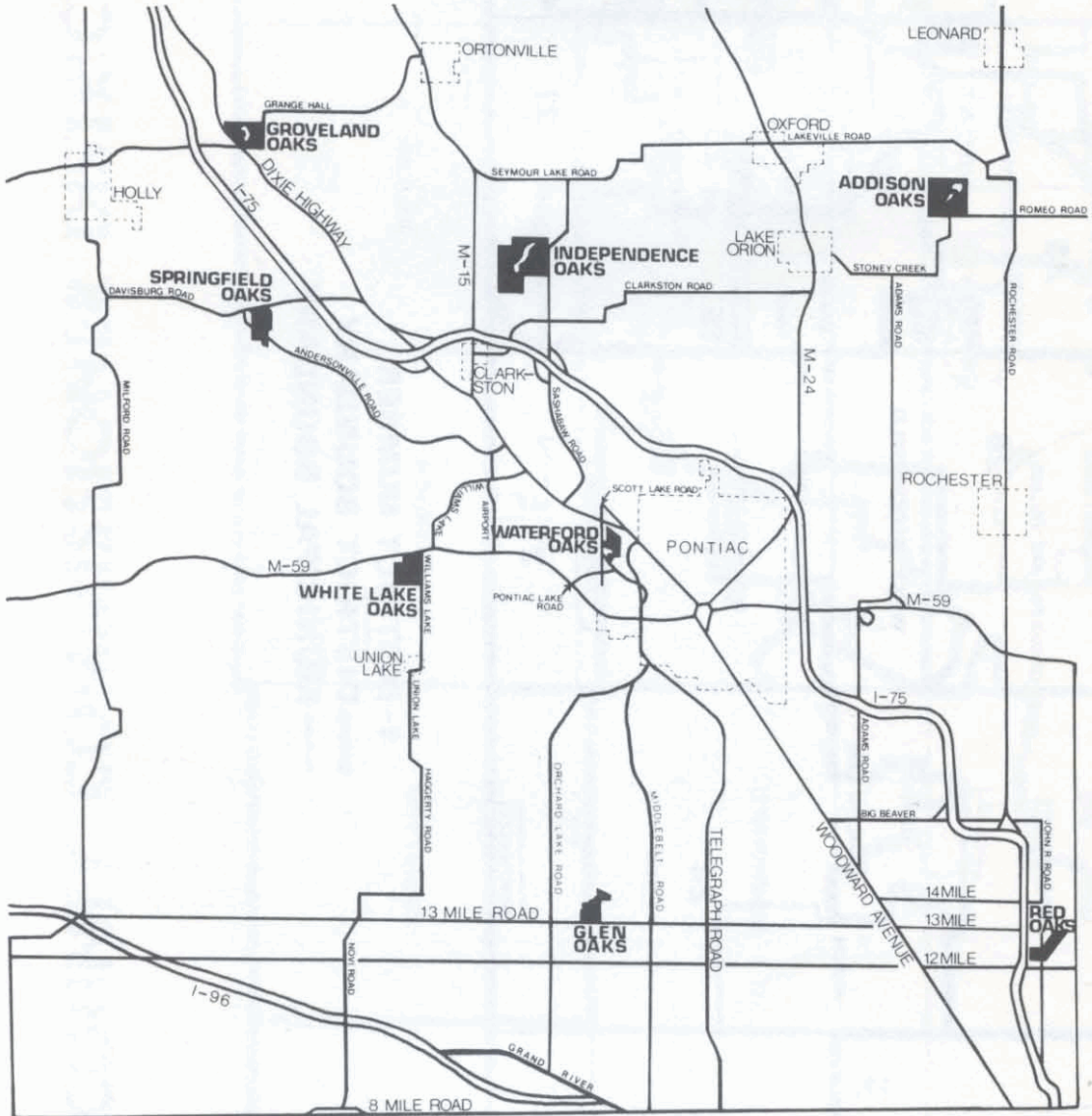

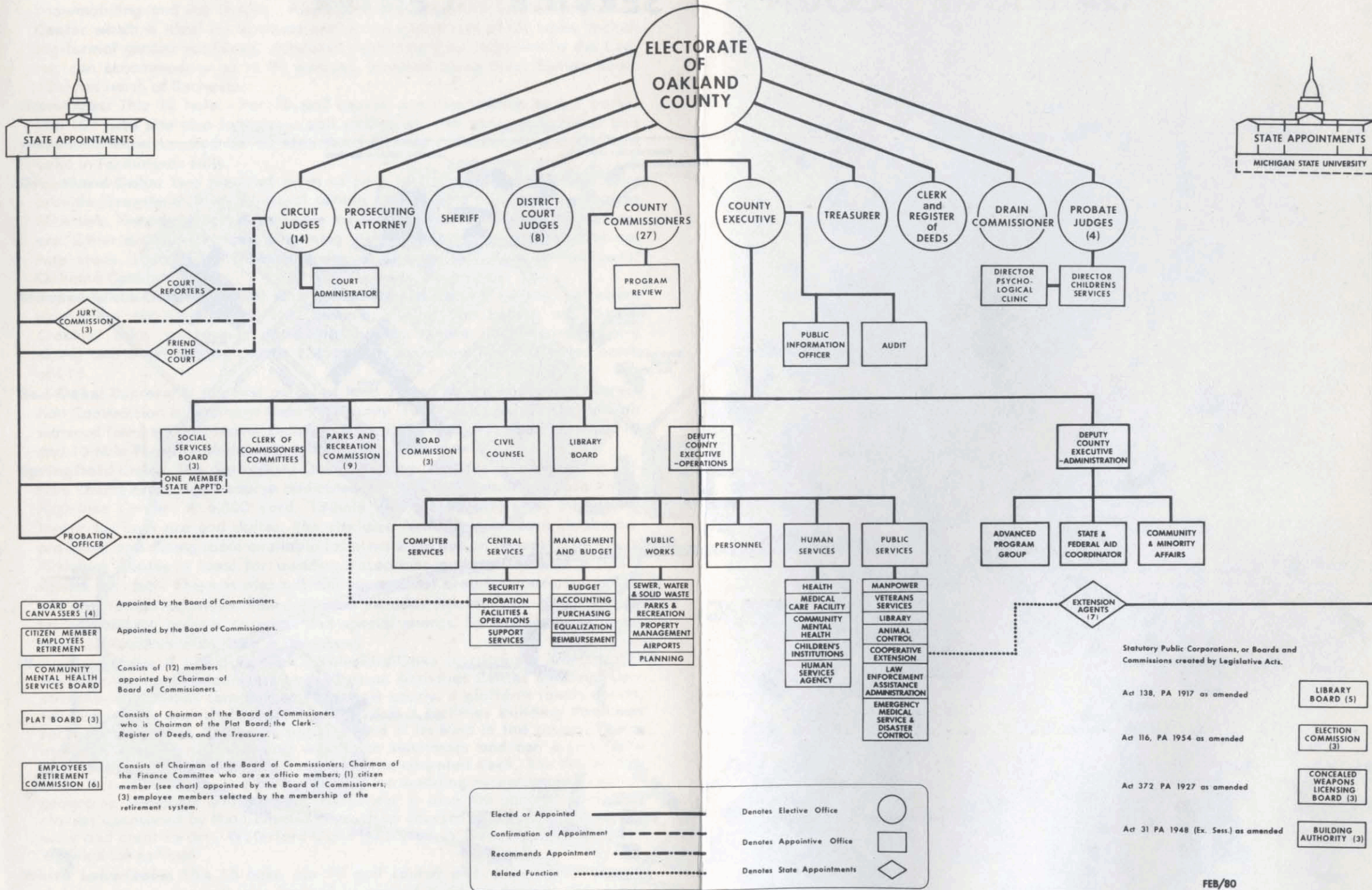

OAKLAND COUNTY GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION CHART

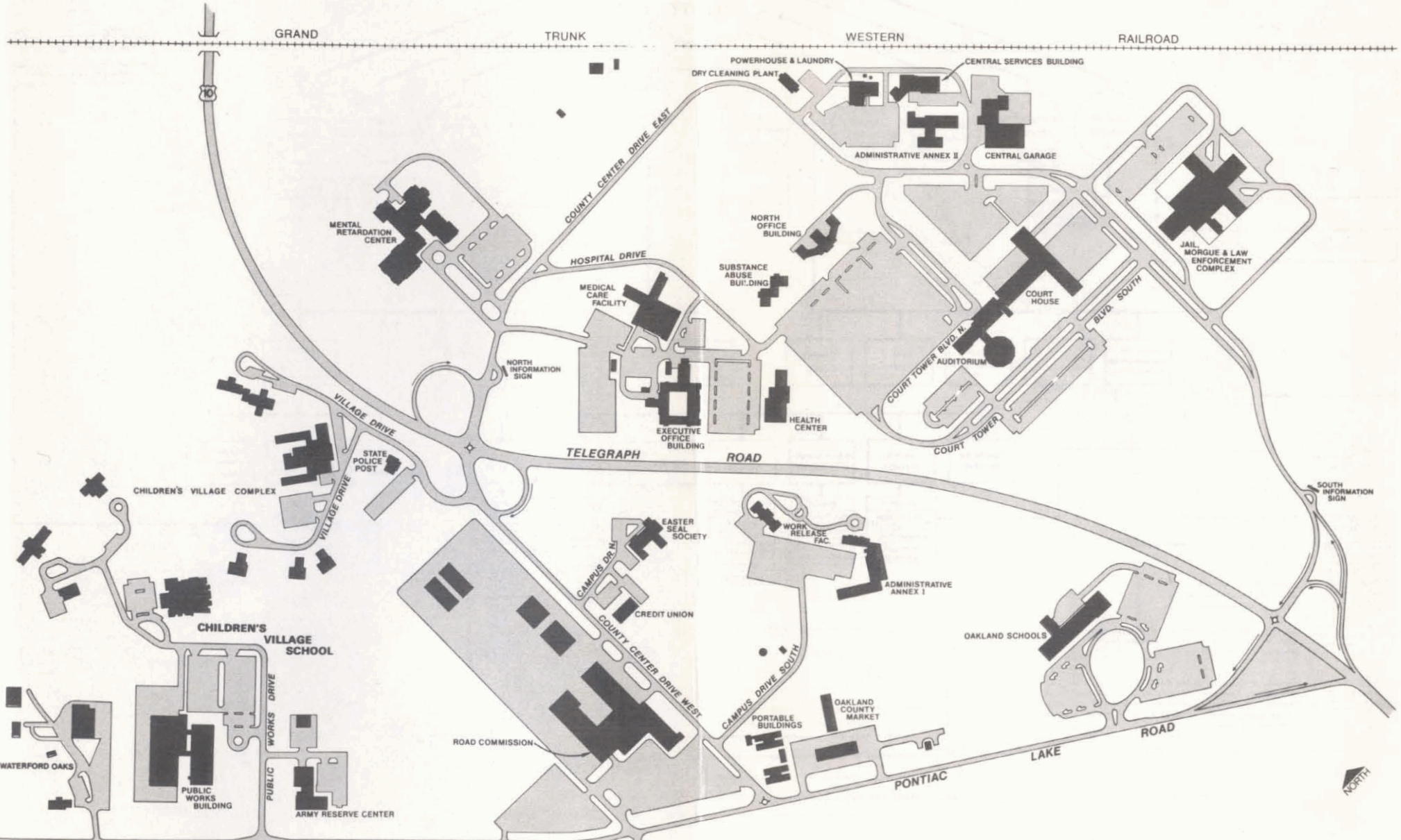

OAKLAND COUNTY SERVICE CENTER



Today, there are eight Oakland County parks offering a wide variety of year-round recreation and an extensive mobile recreation program.

The Oakland County Parks and Recreation system includes:

- Addison-Oaks:** Located on 720 acres of wooded land surrounding three, spring-fed ponds. Activities include swimming, fishing, boating, camping, picnicking, snowmobiling and ice skating. Also located at the park is the Conference Center which is ideal for business and social gatherings of all types, including formal garden weddings. A heated swimming pool, adjacent to the Center, can accommodate up to 90 persons. Situated along West Romeo Road, 12 miles north of Rochester.
- Glen-Oaks:** This 18 hole - Par 70 golf course is a new edition to our parks. The 137 acre site also features a golf clubhouse with banquet facilities and separate bars. Located on 13 Mile Road between Middlebelt and Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills.
- Groveland-Oaks:** Two hundred acres of park land surrounding Stewart Lake provide Groveland-Oaks a natural setting for camping and other recreation activities. The park features 600 sites for recreational vehicles and tent campers. Other activities include swimming, fishing, boating, picnicking, and nature study. Located off Dixie Highway at Grange Hall Road in northwest Oakland County.
- Independence-Oaks:** This 800 acre site retains its natural setting, yet offers year-round recreation. Activities include boating and fishing on 68-acre Crooked Lake, swimming, picnicking, hiking, nature study, cross-country skiing and other winter sports. Located on Sashabaw Road, 2 miles north of I-75.
- Red-Oaks:** Represents the first parcel of land owned by the Parks and Recreation Commission in Southern Oakland County. The 9 hole, par 35 course with watered fairways and starter building, is located on John R. Road between 12 and 13 Mile Roads in Madison Heights.
- Springfield-Oaks:** The Springfield-Oaks complex includes a challenging 18-hole championship golf course dedicated in 1976 and a multi-purpose Youth Activities Center. A 6,300 yard, 18-hole golf course offers an interesting layout for both pro and duffer. The site also features a modern clubhouse, pro shop, and dining room available for private parties on request. The Youth Activities Center is ideal for wedding receptions and parties with a 3,000 square foot hall. There is also a 8,400 square foot area for concerts, shows, 4-H and similar activities. The park also includes two outdoor horse arenas for exhibitions, rodeos, circuses, and special events. Springfield-Oaks is located on Andersonville Road in Davisburg.
- Waterford-Oaks:** A 112 acre park, Waterford-Oaks is currently the site for the Commission headquarters as well as an Activities Center Building. Construction of a tennis complex with 8 tennis courts, 4 platform tennis courts, horseshoe pits and shuffleboard courts, and a facilities building has been recently completed. The wave pool, second of its kind in the country, automatically creates gently rolling waves for swimmers and can accommodate 600 people in the pool and 600 more on the carpeted deck. The Waterford-Oaks Activities Center is a perfect facility for wedding receptions, recreation programs, banquets and parties. The Center is also the site for numerous classes sponsored by the Commission such as courses in dancing, dog obedience and creative arts. Waterford-Oaks is located in Waterford Township on Watkins Lakes Road.
- White Lake-Oaks:** This 18 hole, par 70 golf course with its watered greens and fairways is conveniently located in central Oakland County. The facilities include a clubhouse with locker rooms, a pro shop, pull and electric golf cart rental and a restaurant. A private room that can accommodate up to 250 persons is available for private parties on request. Special greens fees are granted to senior citizens and annual memberships are available and interchangeable with Springfield-Oaks Golf Course. White Lake-Oaks is located on Williams Lake Road off M-59.

OAKLAND COUNTY

BEGINNINGS

The year 1970 marked the sesquicentennial of the official beginning of the County of Oakland. It was 150 years ago that Governor Lewis Cass issued a proclamation which created a new county to be called Oakland out of the Northwest Territory.

Up until just a few years prior, this area north of Detroit and accessible only by the Indian's Saginaw Trail, was thought to be an impenetrable swamp not suited for development. This image was shattered in 1817 and 1818 when Government land surveyors and some prominent Detroit citizens began venturing into the Oakland County area. Instead of swamps and marsh, they found desirable land which abounded with natural resources. These resources included over 400 lakes, hills and forests which were recognized as attracters of residents and tourists then as they are today.

In 1820 Governor Cass set the County Seat in Pontiac — a central location no more than a day's journey from any point in the County. Oakland's first term of court was held this same year in an old log building; reportedly, Oakland's first court house was without door, floor, or chimney.

Improvement to this was made four years later in 1824 with the construction of a new Court House and Jail combined. This facility had two stories and was constructed out of squared logs.

Following a thirty-two year period, characterized by indictments of the structure as being unfit for use and constituting a public nuisance on one hand, the lack of sufficient funds to construct a new court house, a court house to replace the wooden facility was approved for construction in 1856. This facility was constructed of brick and cost \$12,284 plus some County land valued at \$2,500.

The brick structure lasted until 1904 when after another lengthy period of debate and much publicity, the voters approved a new Court House. The 1856 Court House was abandoned, torn down, and replaced by the first twentieth century version in 1904 at a cost of \$100,000.

PRESENT COURT HOUSE

Oakland's fifth Court House, the facility which houses today's government, was constructed in 1960. Unlike previous Court Houses, however, the 1960 version was designed and programmed to maintain pace with the growing County by allowing planned additions. Thus, while the Court Tower was constructed in 1960, subsequent additions have been made in the form of an auditorium for meetings by the County Board of Commissioners and community groups, and two administrative wings. The second wing brings the total County Court Complex to a floor area in excess of a quarter of a million square feet.

Housed in the Court House Complex are about 2,800 of the County's 3,453 employees (exclusive of the Road Commission) comprising the central judiciary, legislative, and administrative functions.

For the convenience of Oakland's citizens and visitors, the complex includes ample free parking and a modern, spacious cafeteria.

NEW GOVERNMENT

In August of 1974, Oakland's citizens voted to create the first unified form of county government in the history of Michigan. Less than 60 such governments exist across the nation.

The new government is headed by an elected County Executive, whose responsibilities are similar to those of a governor or the mayor of a large city. The County Executive administers the government on a day to day basis, proposes new programs and policies, and represents the interests of Oakland's nearly one million citizens.

Under the new government structure, the Board of Commissioners performs a role similar to a state legislature or city council. It acts on proposals submitted by the County Executive and makes proposals of its own. Government policy is set by the Board of Commissioners and implemented by the County Executive. The County Executive may veto acts of the Commission, and the vetoes can be overridden by two-thirds vote of the Commission.

The third branch of government, the judiciary, was not changed by the new government structure. Similarly, the five other offices headed by officials elected county-wide remain unchanged. These are the Prosecutor, the Sheriff, the Clerk/Register of Deeds, the Treasurer, and the Drain Commissioner.

BROAD SERVICES

One can see that the County's Court House Complex has come a long way from the old 1820 log building, but so has the County. The 1820 Court House served 320 persons. Today's Court House serves a population which is in excess of 900,000 people. This large scale population expects its County to provide service in an effective and efficient manner. To this end, data processing, microfilming, modern accounting procedures, capital budgeting, a personnel merit system, and other administrative machinery has been put into operation.

Oakland's people also look increasingly to the County to carry out functions as an instrument of self government in response to needs expressed by its citizenry and representatives. In this sense, planning and the development of streets, highways, airports, sewer and drainage facilities, parks and recreation programs, mental health and traditional health programs, social welfare programs, and programs for neglected, dependent and delinquent children are carried out. By their nature, some of the County's facilities and programs, such as airports and parks, have different locational requirements than other functions. Many parts of the County's large organization, however, have needed to be in proximity of each other in the interest of efficiency and convenient service to its citizenry. This points to geographical centralization in a service center complex.

SERVICE CENTER COMPLEX

Such a center has been developed in Oakland and the Court House serves as its focal point. The Service Center Complex is located on a 450 acre site and serves as the hub of County Government. The County has been working towards the development of this complex by systematically constructing facilities as needed and funds permit. The complex is laid out in a spacious setting according to a master plan — thus giving direction to an ultimate development which will be functional as well as aesthetically pleasing. Most of the County's departments and institutions presently are housed here. One of the principles designed into the Service Center is the "Community" concept of campus development whereby similar or related functions are grouped together.

At the Service Center is the Law Enforcement-Jail Complex. In designing the Complex, the County has looked to the future in anticipating an expanded role for the Sheriff's Department in law enforcement. Nationwide research as to how a jail and its related facilities might be designed to be functional and operationally efficient has resulted in a plant, which, might serve as a model for other local agencies who deal in law enforcement. The Sheriff's Department, County Morgue, and an Operating Center for Disaster Control Operations are under the same roof. A closed circuit television system for surveillance and security, a crime laboratory to provide technical assistance on a local basis for crime solving, and a communication control center for law enforcement for the entire County are in the building.

A second complex has been built on the Service Center grounds. The \$2.4 million Mental Retardation Center is operated by the county Community Mental Health Services Board. The Center consolidates a number of programs for the retarded. Diagnostic and testing rooms, a day care center, and educational, occupational and recreational training areas — as well as administrative offices — make up the new building, which was constructed with 60% county money and 40% Federal grant funds. The Center houses Mental Health Board and Oakland Schools programs for more than 350 retarded individuals; in addition, the Counseling and Evaluation Service will see about 700 persons a year. It is unique in Michigan in having been funded well over half by county government.

The Children's Village is a recent and important addition to the Service Center complex. Completed after years of planning, it represents a new concept for providing shelter care and treatment services for neglected and delinquent wards of the Court. Situated on fifty acres in the Service Center, it consists of small units which provides an opportunity to deal with individual problems of youth. The Village affords a home-like atmosphere to the troubled children coming to the attention of the Court. It is a model which evokes considerable favorable reaction from visitors and Judges from throughout the State and other areas of the country.

Oakland's leaders believe that local government ought to be as close and convenient to its citizenry as possible. In Oakland, this implies need for geographical decentralization of certain functions. The County's long range planning calls for this to take the form of development of a series of satellite Service Centers. Located in these centers will be departmental branch offices. Like the parent Service Center, they will be arranged in a campus type development.

Oakland's officials are proud of the County Court House Complex and its related facilities. Visitors from other counties, states and nations have found and will continue to find themselves most welcome.
