C. Hugh Dohany

January 16, 1920 – December 20, 2002

This book is dedicated to the memory of C. Hugh Dohany, a friend to many and gentleman to all.

Mr. Dohany was instrumental in the formation of one of Oakland County's largest cities, the City of Southfield and served as Council President from 1958 through 1964. As Council President, he was selected to represent his city on the Oakland County Board of Supervisors and did so with distinction. In 1964, Mr. Dohany was elected as the City of Southfield Treasurer and in 1968 was elected to the countywide position of Oakland County Treasurer. Mr. Dohany was the longest serving elected official in Oakland County history and was known as the "Dean" of County Treasurer's. He held this office until his death, for an unprecedented thirty-four (34) years; safeguarding the public's funds with competency, honesty and dignity. C. Hugh Dohany was internationally recognized for his commitment to keeping the Treasurer's Office on the cutting edge of technology and was one of the most respected public officials in Michigan.

C. Hugh Dohany was loved and respected by all who knew him.

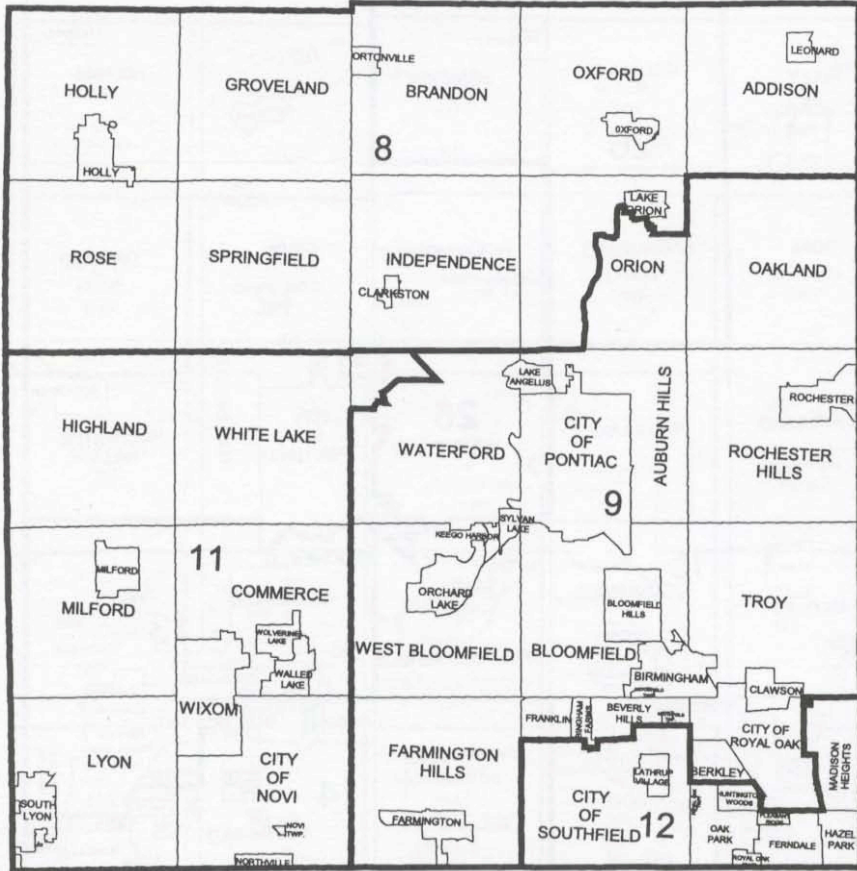
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U.S CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS 2003-2012

Balance of District 8 in Livingston County



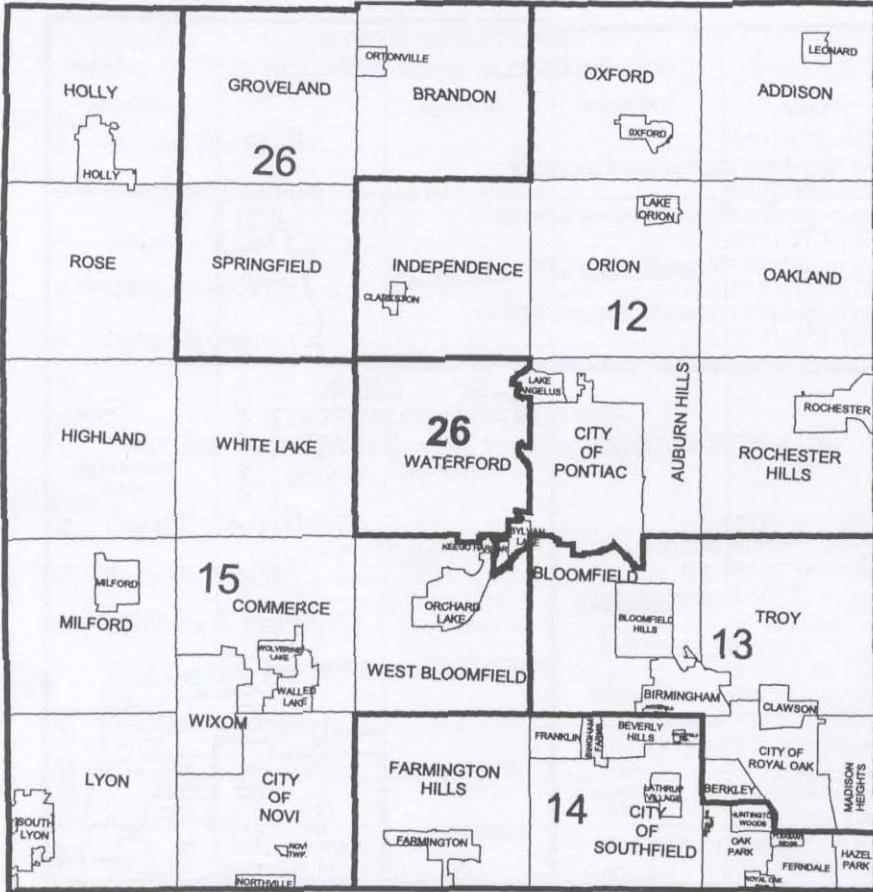
Balance of District 12 in McComb County

Balance of District 11 in Wayne County

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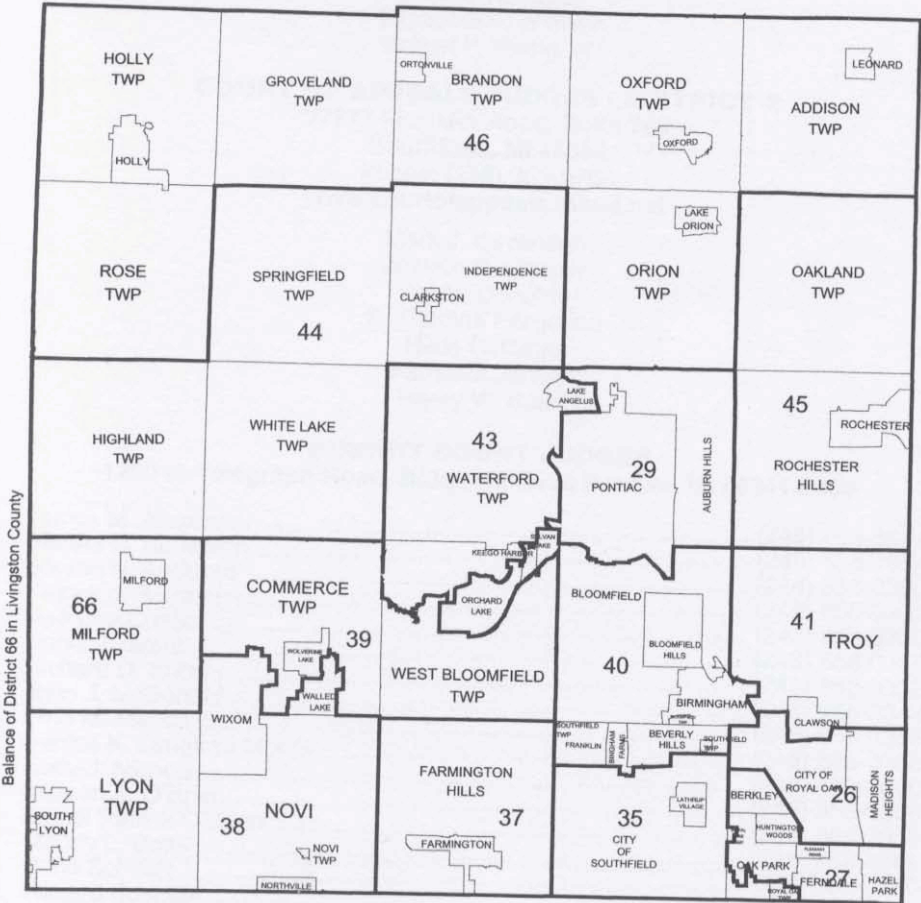
STATE SENATE DISTRICTS 2003-2012

Balance of District 26 in Genesee County



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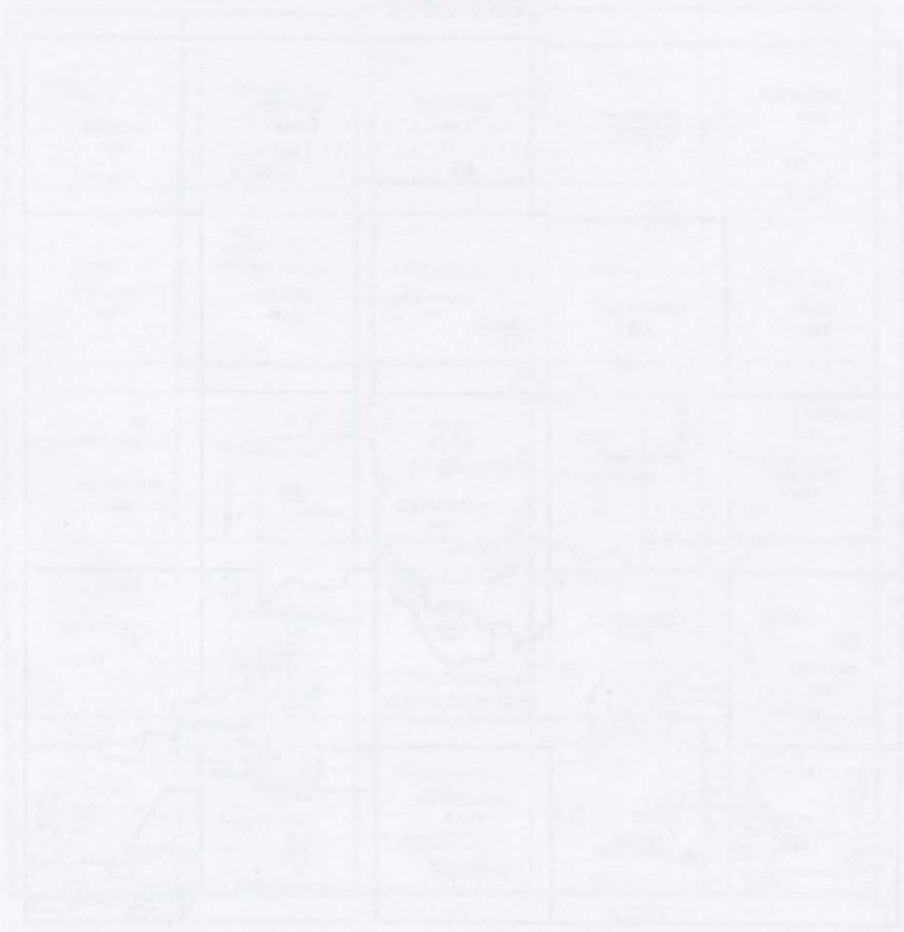

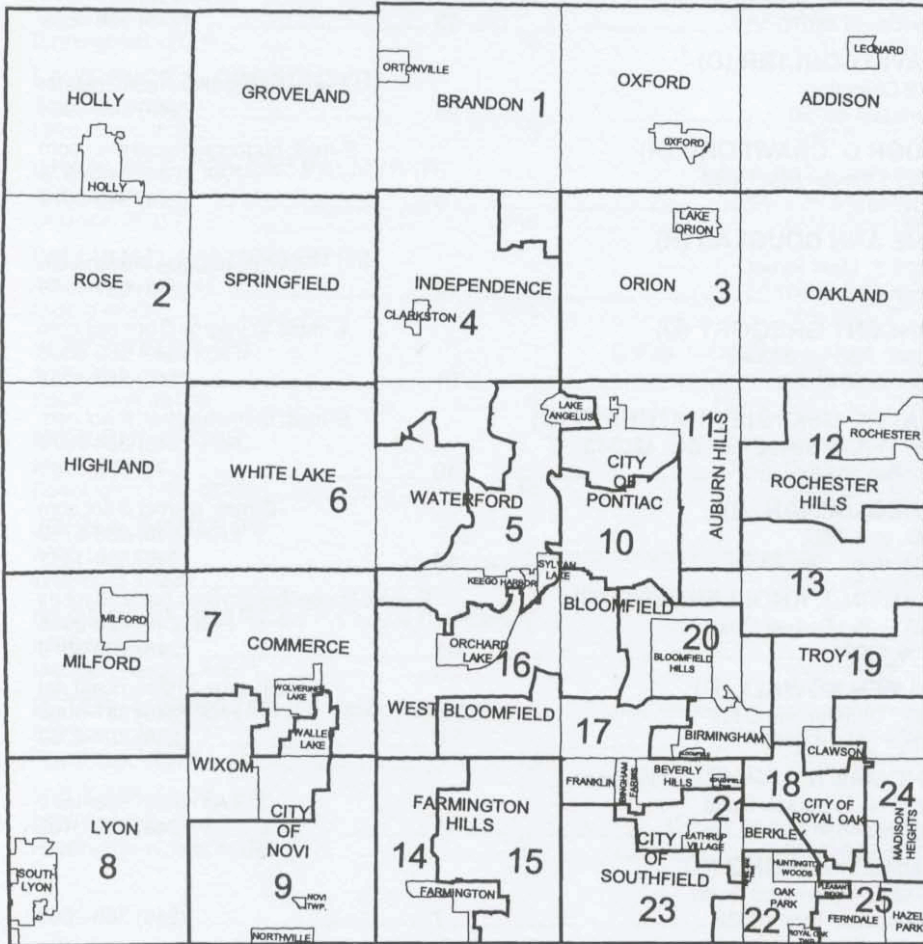

OAKLAND COUNTY GOVERNMENT

In August of 1974, Oakland County citizens voted to create the first unified form of county government in the history of Michigan. Less than 60 such governments exist across the nation.

The government is headed by an elected County Executive, whose responsibilities are similar to those of a governor or the mayor of a large city. The County Executive administers the government on a day to day basis, proposes new programs and revamps existing programs. The executive represents the interests of more than one million residents.

Under this structure, the Board of Commissioners performs a role similar to a state legislature or city council. It acts on proposals submitted by the County Executive and makes proposals of its own. Government policy is set by the Board of Commissioners and implemented by the County Executive. The County Executive may veto acts of the Board and the vetoes can be overridden by two-thirds vote of the Board.

The third branch of government, the judiciary, was not changed by the executive form of government. Similarly, the five other offices headed by officials elected countywide remain unchanged. These are the Prosecutor, the Sheriff, the Clerk/Register of Deeds, the Treasurer, and the Drain Commissioner.

AUTOMATION ALLEY

Member companies invest time, money and staff in the development and promotion of Automation Alley as a first-class technology cluster.

In fact, more than 500 technology companies are members of this global consortium. Today, visionary leaders of Automation Alley technology companies are joining the campaign to nurture the cluster's development – working together to effect the powerful competitive advantage that it offers.

Automation Alley has all the elements to support and grow a world renowned technology cluster. On many quality of life indicators, Automation Alley is on par with or better than those technology clusters considered among the most desirable in the nation – older, more developed technology clusters like California's Silicon Valley and Boston's Route 128.

SERVICE CENTER COMPLEX

The Oakland County Service Center Complex has been developed for over 40 years and functions as the hub of county government. The majority of the County's departments and institutions are presently located on a 538-acre site in Waterford Township and the City of Pontiac, divided by Telegraph Road. The County has developed the complex by systematically constructing facilities as needed and funding permits. It is laid out in a spacious setting according to a master plan, giving direction to an ultimate development, which will be functional, efficient and aesthetically pleasing. One of the principals designed into the Service Center is its "community" concept of a campus development whereby similar or related functions are grouped together.

The campus is serviced by a 9.5 mile long, 13,200 volt primary, underground electrical distribution system with all facilities having dual feeds, 2-1/4 miles of natural gas distribution piping, 4-1/2 mile looped water distribution system, and a 1-1/2 mile steam tunnel system to distribute centrally produced steam to all major facilities.

With full fiber optic connections and a county-owned and operated private telephone business exchange, campus technology infrastructure allows state of the art communications between all government units and the public.

The 415,000 square foot Courthouse houses Circuit, Family and Probate Courts, and offices of the Clerk/Register of Deeds, Treasurer, Prosecutor, and Board of Commissioners. Other major facilities located on campus are the Executive Office Building, Sheriff's Law Enforcement-Jail Complex, Medical Examiner Facility, Public Health Center, Medical Care Facility, Community Mental Health Central Offices, Children's Village and Drain Commissioners Office.

The Oakland County Sheriff's Law Enforcement-Jail Complex serves not only as a location to house many of Oakland County's 1,800 inmates, but contains many key components of the state's largest full-service Sheriff's Office. Its resources are always ready to assist any agency or person in Oakland County.

Resources and services of the Sheriff's Office include a 24 Harley Davidson Motorcycle Unit, K-9 Unit, Aviation Unit, Marine Unit, Dragoon, Traffic and Alcohol Enforcement, Dispatch, Court Services, Forensic Science Lab, Boot Camp and many more reputable specialty units.

The over 1,200 highly trained members of the Sheriff's Office work in five different divisions which include Corrective Services, Satellite Services, Patrol Services, Technical Services and Administrative Services. The mission of the Sheriff's Office is to safeguard and protect the citizens and property within Oakland County and the care and custody of inmates.

Children's Village provides detention, shelter, care and residential treatment services for neglected and delinquent wards of the court and is situated on 50 acres on the

Waterford Township side of the Service Center. The Village affords a home-like atmosphere for *troubled children* coming to the attention of the court and consists of nine (9) separate facilities that provide an opportunity to deal with the individual problems of youths. It is a model complex that evokes significant *favorable reaction* from visitors and judges throughout the state and country.

With the recent addition of 88 undeveloped acres *directly adjacent* to the current campus, Oakland County is well positioned to meet future expansion needs well into the 21st century.

The Oakland County Service Center is a model complex and is the core of county government. Oakland's officials are proud of the complex and its related facilities. County citizens and visitors from other counties, states and nations have found and will continue to find themselves most welcome.

The Oakland County Clerk/Register of Deeds Office

The duties of the County Clerk/Register of Deeds have roots back to the times of the Magna Carta in England.

Historically, by statute, state government has placed the responsibilities of **receiving, storing, retrieving and safeguarding the public records** upon the county's Clerk and Register of Deeds.

These duties consist of maintaining all circuit court legal records, registration of some business entities, recording military DD 214 forms for our veterans, processing license applications to carry concealed pistols, and all records relating to birth, death, and marriage occurring in Oakland County.

In addition, the Clerk also acts as clerk to all official county boards, including the Board of Commissioners and Election Commission.

Some of the millions of documents safeguarded by the Oakland County Clerk/Register of Deeds date back to 1820, the year Oakland County's first clerk, Sidney Dole, was appointed to serve in that capacity by the territorial governor, Lewis Cass.

The offices of County Clerk and County Register of Deeds were combined by action of the Oakland County Board of Supervisors in 1958, as was allowed by law. Oakland County is one of only a few of Michigan's counties to operate such a combined office.

Oakland County Register of Deeds is responsible for the recording and management of over 800,000 real estate documents per year with literally millions of documents stored dating back to the original U.S. government land patent.

Oakland County is also proud to be on the leading edge of real estate recording technology with its e-filing capacity and most recently the ability to conduct electronic mortgage closings in partnership with major banks in the Oakland County area.

Oakland County's current **Clerk/Register of Deeds, G. William Caddell**, has served as Clerk/Register since 1998. Mr. Caddell is assisted by two deputy clerk/register, **Frank H. Millard, Jr.**, assigned to oversee operations in the Clerk's Legal, Vital Records and Election areas with **Lawrence A. Mitchell** assigned to oversee the Register of Deeds portion of the operation. With over 150 combined employees, the Oakland County Clerk/Register of Deeds Office is one of the largest and busiest in the state of Michigan.

OAKLAND COUNTY COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH AUTHORITY (OCCMHA)

With a FY 2003 budget of over \$208 million, OCCMHA has been serving Oakland County's 1.15 million residents since 1964. It has grown to become Michigan's second largest public Community Mental Health Care manager of mental health programs and services to adults with mental illnesses, children with severe emotional disturbances, and people of all ages with developmental disabilities. OCCMHA provides services to over 10,000 children and adults in Oakland County.

OCCMHA is governed by a twelve-member board, consisting of primary and secondary consumers and interested members of the community.

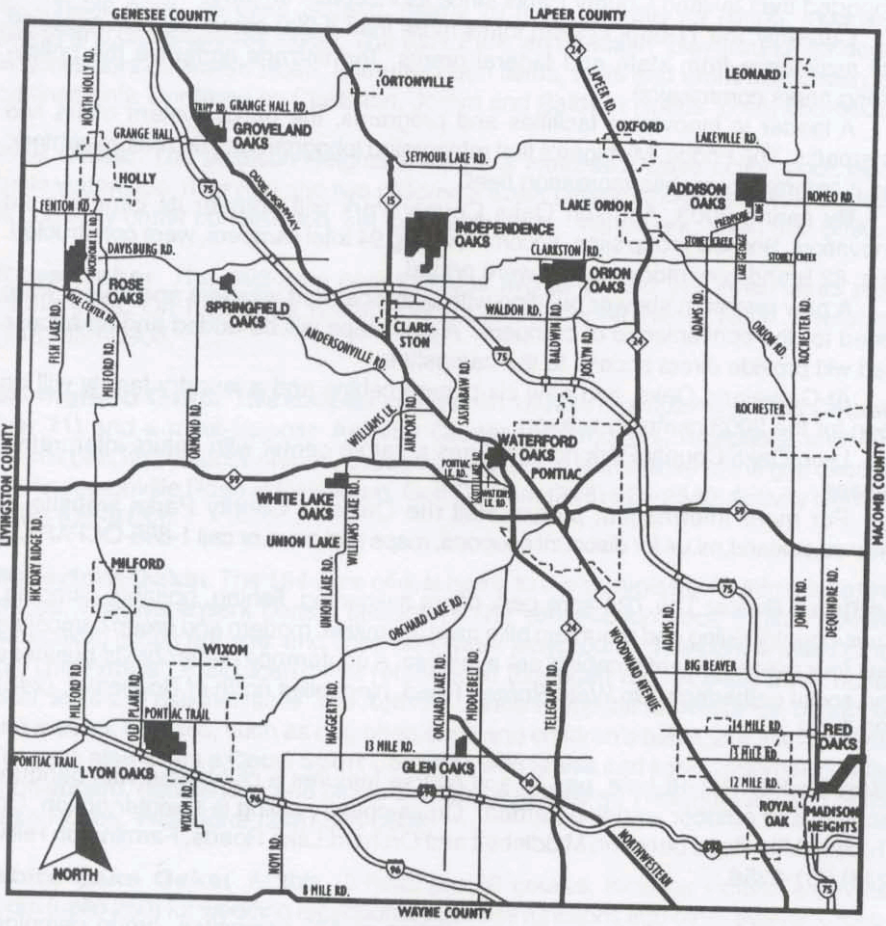
OCCMHA's mission is to support the advancement of social equity and improved quality of life for adults with serious mental illness, children with serious emotional disturbances, and people with developmental disabilities.

OCCMHA receives over 90% of the funding for mental health services from two sources, Medicaid capitation payments and State General Funds. Additionally, the County of Oakland provides about 5% of the funding and the remaining 2% is from various sources. The budget allocates 95% of the funding to contracted services and support.

OCCMHA's provider network consists of five major contracted service providers and several smaller providers who offer a full range of mental health and community-based services. These include evaluation and screening, hospital and residential treatment, respite care, clubhouses and day programs, supported employment, multilingual programs, corrections services, and a dual diagnosis program for individuals with mental illness and substance abuse. OCCMHA works with nine Qualified Health Plans that provide comprehensive medical services to enrolled Medicaid recipients.

OCCMHA is fully certified by the State of Michigan Department of Community Health as required by the state Mental Health Code. Person-Centered Planning which is mandated by the code, provides individuals with disabilities with more choice and control. The goal of this model is improved quality of life for consumers and more integration as fully participating members of the community.

These programs are supported by your tax dollars. OCCMHA is ready to help eligible Oakland County residents who need professional mental health services in any way possible. EXPERIENCE THE OAKLAND COUNTY PARKS

With preservation of open space a priority, Oakland County Parks strives to enhance quality of life for its 1.5 million annual visitors.

Recreational, leisure and learning experiences are made possible through special events, programs and facilities, supported in part, by a one-quarter mill tax.

Homeowners pay an average of \$18.75 (on a \$150,000 home) to improve, maintain and acquire parks and recreation areas in Oakland County. Voters have supported the Oakland County Parks since its inception in 1966.

Currently, the 11-park system totals more than 6,000 acres. Land is acquired with assistance from state and federal grants. Ten citizens comprise the policy-setting parks commission.

A leader in innovative facilities and programs, the parks system offers two waterparks; The Fridge, Michigan's first refrigerated toboggan run; two nature centers; and a community mobile recreation fleet.

By spring 2003, Addison Oaks County Park will premier its campground renovation. Six new group sites, accommodating 94 total campers, were constructed. Plus, 82 brand-new modern sites were added.

A new restroom/shower building with coin-operated washers and dryers were added for the convenience of campers. A playscape will be added and an access road will provide direct access to the campsites.

At Groveland Oaks, two new six-person cabins and a laundry facility will be open for the 2003 camping season.

Lyon Oaks County Park now features a nature center with nature interpretive classes.

Addison Oaks: The 794-acre park offers swimming, fishing, boating, camping, cross-country skiing and mountain bike trails. Primitive, modern and group campsites plus four overnight rental cabins are available. A conference center hosts business and social gatherings. On West Romeo Road, nine miles north of Rochester. (248) 693-2432.

Glen Oaks: The 18-hole, par 70 golf course features a clubhouse with banquet facilities and outdoor wedding garden. Cross-country skiing is a winter option. On Thirteen Mile Road between Middlebelt and Orchard Lake Roads, Farmington Hills. (248) 851-8356.

Groveland Oaks: Campers have a choice of 462 campsites, group camping areas plus six overnight cabins with swimming, a waterslide, fishing, boating and more. Off Dixie Highway at Grange Hall Road, Holly. (248) 634-9811.

Lyon Oaks: This site features an 18-hole golf course, driving range, grill room and banquet facilities for special occasions. Day-use facilities include a nature center, dog park and hiking trails. Bordered by Pontiac Trail, Old Plank and I-96 in Lyon Township. (248) 858-0906.

Orion Oaks: This scenic 927-acre park offers boating and fishing (wheelchair accessible dock) on Lake Sixteen, nearly 10 miles of trails for hiking, mountain biking and cross-country skiing. The Bark Park, an off-leash "playground" for dogs, is accessible off Joslyn Road. Features open fields, trails and swimming beach for canines only. Bordered by Clarkston, Joslyn and Baldwin Roads. Waterford Oaks: The 154-acre park is home to the commission's administrative offices. The park is also home to "The Fridge" - Michigan's first refrigerated toboggan run. A **BMX track** hosts local, state and national races. The **Activity Center** is popular for weddings, banquets and parties. Classes, such as dog obedience and children's ballet, are also offered. The park also offers a **Court Sport Complex** with tennis and sand volleyball courts, shuffleboard, horseshoes and picnic shelters. Facilities on Watkins Lake and Scott Lake Roads, Waterford. White Lake Oaks: At this 18-hole, par 70 course, facilities include a private room (up to 250) for wedding receptions, business functions and other events. Cross-country skiing is a winter option. On South Williams Lake Road off M-59, near Pontiac. (248) 698-2700.

OAKLAND COUNTY ROADS

Almost half of all highways, roads, and streets in Oakland County are on the county system, which is under the jurisdiction of the Board of Oakland County Road Commissioners.

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC) is now in its 90th year of service to the people of Oakland County.

Totaling over 2,600 miles, this system includes all public roads in townships, except state highways, and through-streets in most cities and villages. It is the largest county system in Michigan and is second in size only to the state highway system. Its subdivision streets alone (all in townships) make up more than 900 miles.

About two-thirds of the system is paved. More than half is within the county's urban area, where some roads are four, five and six lanes wide to handle heavy traffic. A single intersection, in Southfield, is the meeting place for 100,000 vehicles daily. More than 1,200 electrical signals and over 90,000 signs are in use on the county road system.

The Road Commission is not able to levy a countywide tax, nor does anyone levy a tax countywide for roads.

The basic source of Road Commission revenue is the state-collected vehicle fuel and registration taxes, which motorists pay at the pump, and to the Secretary of State. The state-collected taxes are the only source of substantial funding for county road maintenance, and snow and ice control.

Federal, county, municipal, township and property-owner contributions are also received, but generally only for specific road projects. Such projects include adding lanes, intersection improvements, paving gravel roads, adding new gravel, resurfacing paved roads, adding passing lanes, and other safety improvement projects.

In 1992, RCOC embarked on a program called FAST-TRAC, which is an Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) effort. The Road Commission has installed "smart" traffic signals operated by computers and video vision at more than 500 intersections across the county. This is the largest adaptive traffic control system in the United States and the largest video imaging system for traffic management in the world. The Road Commission was the first local unit of government to initiate a program of this scope and magnitude.

For paving and resurfacing of subdivision streets, property owners can petition RCOC to create a special assessment district through a process prescribed by state law. The process begins by contacting the Road Commission, then petitioning and participating in public hearings.

Members of the three-person Board of County Road Commissioners are appointed for staggered six-year terms by the elected Oakland County Board of Commissioners, which also sets their salaries. Salaries are funded by state-collected vehicle fuel and registration tax revenues. The Board of Road Commissioners is separate from county general government — establishing policies as authorized by state statutes for management of the countywide road system, administering its own budget, and hiring its own full-time managing director and staff.
