





Cheryl read her speech to the Commerce board last week, outlining the history of the quadrennial athletic competition. "The purpose of the Olympics is for the people of the nations to learn to get along with each other," she said. "It is to help unite in peace the different

nations of the world through competition. But it isn't the competition that counts. It is the fact that the people are getting to know each other." She said she thinks the tax checkoff system would be a good idea because "our country contributes no money to the Olympics." Cheryl added that the plan would help raise the large sums of money needed to train and field an Olympic team because people wouldn't have to "go out of their way

to mail the money in." Collom presented a resolution to the township board, requesting the Congress to approve the tax checkoff system because the U.S. Olympic Team has "suffered from inadequate financing (due to the lack of a) practical vehicle whereby citizens may easily contribute to the United States Olympic

Well, some of us made it. And some of ui actually survived the tumuttuous 70's Watergate, the energy crisis, inflation and


