## Novi welcomes refugee family

It's a long way from Saigon to 626 North Center Street in Northville—approximately 11,900 miles. And for the 13 member Bui Noi family it was a trip that began in September when they fled their home outside of Saigon to escape the Communists.

With the impending arrival of the Communists the father, Bui Noi, sold his thriving bicycle accessory shop which had employed some 30 people. The money was used to buy passage for his family on a boat leaving the country.

For nine days they drifted without food in the Pacific Ocean until they came ashore in Thailand. There the family stayed in a refugee camp until placed by the Sister Lomina O'Sullivan of The Arch Diocese refugee settlement office.

Now Novi residents are doing their best to show their adopted Vietnamese refugee family that they are among friends—even though they are half way around the world.

Novi has welcomed the family which includes Bui Noi, 45, his wife Phan Thi Buoi, ten daughters and two sons. The children are Bui Thi Nga, 21; Bui Thi Thuy, 19; Bui Thi Thuy, 17; Bui Dhy Khim, 15; Bui Kinh Doanh, 13; Bui Thi Hanh, 12; Bui Thi Thu Huong, 10; Bui Thi Huyen Trang, 8; Bui Thi Kim Tuyen, 6; Bui Thuy Phuong Uyen, 4 and Bui Thanh Huyen, 3.

For the past week Novi's adopted Vietnamese

family has been kept busy with physical, dental and optical exams, completing required immigration information and generally getting settled.

The elder members of the family had their first English lesson Monday.

The father and two elder daughters have a temporary job lined up making pins for the Lions Club which will employ them until their English enables them to find permanent positions.

The Bui family arrived at Metro Airport March 7, several weeks before they were expected by their Novi hosts.

"On February 26 we were asked whether we would consider sponsoring the 13 member family. The next day we agreed, confident we had several weeks to get ready," reported Stephanie Amello, who is helping to coordinate the "adoption" process.

But several weeks turned into several days when the sponsors found a home for the family, in Northville on Tuesday, March 4, and learned the family was in flight and would arrive in Detroit on Friday.

"We had to get 13 beds, 13 pillows, 26 blankets, pots, pans, towels, toothbrushes, everything," Amello said. But the residents of Novi came through.

Churches and civic groups donated all the furnishings for the five bedroom home. Faith United Presbyterian Church stocked the home with

groceries. A car has been donated to the family. The Goodfellows with the cooperation of Brader's Department store outfitted the family's 13 pairs of feet.

"It has been a real community effort. People have been working together and it's been beautiful," said Carol Anne Donnelly, a coordinator from Holy Family Catholic Church.

Language has been somewhat of a barrier since none of the family knows English. However, the family's eldest daughter has been living in the Detroit area and her husband has acted as an interpreter during the family's initial introduction to the country.

Amello reported that snow has been a novelty for the family. It also has given them a bit of cabin fever.

"During winter we are used to hibernating inside, but they are used to moving outside year around," Amello said.

The father is somewhat nervous about how the family is going to pay its bills, she reported.

However, Donnelly said the family is very westernized because it comes from Saigon and is adapting as well as can be expected.

"When they got in from San Francisco we thought they would be exhausted, but they told us they were 'too happy to be tired,'" Donnelly said. "They are so appreciative—they just can't believe the generosity of the American people."

## Local church, civic groups lend support

Residents and businesses in Novi have welcomed their adopted family from Saigon with overwhelming generosity.

The family's first meal in its new home was provided by Kim's Gardens.

On last minute notice Jackson Florist created a centerpiece for the home and presented the women with hand bouquets and the men with boutonnières when they arrived at Metro-Airport.

Welcome Wagon is planning to donate all the proceeds from its annual fashion show and luncheon on April 22 to the family.

Holy Family Catholic Church collected clothes from all areas of Novi, reporting they received more than enough clothing to go around. Clothes that were too large for the small-framed Vietnamese will be sent either to the Cass Corridor or an Indian Orphanage in northern Michigan.

Dr. A. Vicenti gave the family medical checkups.

And Dr. Hess examined their teeth.

And members from many of Novi's church and civic groups have lent their support to the family in its first week in the United States of America.

Those groups include Holy Family Catholic Church, Faith Community United Presbyterian Church, Novi United Methodist Church, Freedom Lutheran Church, Novi Rotary, Novi Welcome Wagon, Novi-Northville FISH, Novi American Legion and Novi Goodfellows.

## Novi police arrest three men on drug charges

A tip from a local doctor enabled Novi police to confiscate an estimated \$8,000 in drugs March 12.

Capsules identified as Dilantin and Dilaudid allegedly were found when police arrested three Detroit men on charges of obtaining controlled substances through fraud.

Novi's Special Investigation Unit was called in to handle the case after a doctor from the Providence Hospital Clinic reported that he had received a suspicious telephone call from a person who claimed to be a doctor in California.

The man, who called himself Dr. Vigil, said he was calling to arrange a prescription for a patient who was

visiting Michigan due to an illness in the family.

Ten minutes later the patient identified by the California doctor called to ask for the prescription arranged by "Dr. Vigil," police reported.

The Providence doctor, suspecting the patient and the California doctor to be the same person, asked the man to set up an appointment for an examination before prescribing the drugs and then called the police.

Special Investigation Unit officers contacted a Dr. Vigil in California who reportedly said he had been getting calls from physicians in Michigan, but had never called to arrange prescriptions for patients.

Undercover officers from the Novi Police Department were stationed inside the clinic and in the parking lot on March 12 when the patient who identified himself as Jeff Paladino filled out a medical resume and obtained the prescription.

Police said Paladino left the clinic and got in a car where two other men were waiting. Police blocked the driveway to stop the vehicle, ordered the men out of the car and placed them under arrest on charges of attempting to obtain controlled substances through fraud.

After obtaining a search warrant, police reportedly found 400 capsules of Dilantin and Dilaudid in the vehicle.

Facing charges are Fremont A. Korpela, 26; Michael J. Bingham, 23; and Lee M. Rodriguez, 34; all of Detroit. They were arraigned Thursday before 52nd District Court Judge Martin Boyle on one count each of attempt to obtain narcotics through fraudulent means.

Bonds were set at \$2,500 for Korpela and \$5,000 for Rodriguez. They were lodged in the Oakland County Jail pending posting of bond.

Bingham's bond was set at \$1,000 and he was turned over to the Dearborn police narcotics division in connection with a similar charge.

Examination for all three suspects has been set for March 21.

## Paraphernalia ban stands

Novi's ordinance banning the sale and distribution of "drug-related" paraphernalia in the city has withstood the latest test in federal court, and a decision on an alleged violation of the ordinance is expected soon from district court.

U.S. District Court Judge Patricia Boyle has again upheld the ordinance by refusing a motion for a new trial on the matter.

She dismissed arguments from Tobacco Road, Inc., attorneys that the ordinance is vague and violates the first, fifth, fourteenth and eighth amendments to the U.S. Constitution.

In her decision from the bench, Boyle ruled there was no grounds for reopening the trial, after concluding the ordinance is not in violation of the commerce clause and is not vague.

She dismissed arguments from the Tobacco Road attorneys which cited three recent decisions in which similar paraphernalia ordinances were found to be unconstitutional. She found the courts' rulings in those cases do not apply in this instance.

Boyle ruled the Novi paraphernalia ordinance differed from those in the three ordinances which were ruled unconstitutional in other courts because of the manner in which the local ordinance was drafted.

She found that Novi's ordinance used an objective test to identify paraphernalia, while the invalid ordinances used a subjective test.

Under the local ordinance, implements which are adapted or designed primarily for administration or use with controlled substances are considered "paraphernalia."

Boyle found that it is common knowledge within the tobacco industry which implements have been designed primarily for use as "paraphernalia."

Tobacco Road attorneys have not indicated whether they plan to appeal the ruling. They will have 20 days after Judge Boyle's order has been finalized to appeal the decision.

Meanwhile, a decision on an alleged violation of Novi's paraphernalia ordinance is pending in district court.

Judge Michael Batchik of the 52nd

District Court is scheduled to reach a decision soon regarding charges by Novi police that an employee of Tobacco Road sold a pipe which violated the Novi paraphernalia ordinance.

Batchik heard final arguments on the alleged violation February 29.

Attorneys for Tobacco Road, Inc., reiterated constitutional arguments against the ordinance under which the employee was cited.

City Attorney David Fried argued the judge should consider the case at hand and consider only the facts before the court as they apply to the alleged violation.

To argue beyond that scope is irrelevant, Fried argued.

Batchik indicated recently that he intends to take at least 10 days to issue his opinion so that he has time to review "the voluminous briefs and cases cited by both sides in the case."

"This is an important ordinance, and it will take a lot of effort to review the cases carefully," Batchik said.

Prosecution under the ordinance was sought after undercover officers Herbert Harbin III and Thomas Hesse of the Novi Police Department reportedly entered the Tobacco Road store in the Novi-Ten Plaza July 6 and bought one pipe which they identified as a "hash pipe."

Police reported the pipe was sold to them for \$5.20.

After the alleged transaction was completed, the store clerk was advised she had sold the pipe to Novi police officers and was cited for violation of the city's paraphernalia ordinance, according to police reports.

If convicted she faces a 90 day sentence or a fine of up to \$500—the penalty for anyone convicted of selling drug-related paraphernalia in the city.

The ordinance prohibits selling, displaying or giving away equipment used in conjunction with drugs controlled by the state law.

Specifically, the ordinance prohibits the sale of hypodermic needles, cocaine spoons, marijuana pipes and empty gelatin caps, by citing them as examples of drug-related paraphernalia.

## DNR lifts ban on construction

Sewer construction permits for two developments on Eight Mile—Orchard Hill Place and Country Place Condominiums—have been granted by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

Novi officials announced last week that the DNR has resumed approvals for local sewer construction plans.

In February the DNR made good on a warning that plans for extension of sewer lines would not be approved unless Wayne County demonstrated that an overburdened sewer line between the southern Novi border and Plymouth Township had sufficient capacity to handle additional sewage.

When Wayne County failed to provide satisfactory information, the DNR held up plans for the two local developers. Developments in Northville, Northville Township and parts of Plymouth Township also were affected by the temporary ban.

In subsequent meetings between the DNR, Wayne County and local officials, a timetable for cleaning and improving the sewer line was established, and DNR officials obtained other information which convinced them to resume issuing permits while improvements to the sewer line are taking place.

Wayne County told the DNR recently that it believes there is sufficient data to indicate the sewer line has adequate capacity to accommodate the existing sanitary wastewater load and "any additional sanitary wastewater load that could reasonably be anticipated for the next several years."

It went on to say that there is an identified infiltration problem—where storm water seeps into the sewer line. But that overflows which have occurred could have been avoided if the Novi retention basin operated by Oakland County were functioning properly.

To prevent such occurrences in the future, Oakland County's Department of Public Works apparently has agreed to install a mechanical means of limiting the amount of sewage flowing

out of Oakland County into the interceptor.

"By reducing infiltration and inflow and optimizing the performance of the Novi retention basin, overflows from the Wilcox-Seven Mile Road Interceptor probably can be eliminated until the proposed sewer can be constructed," said Duane Egeland, managing director of the Wayne County DPW.

"If overflows do occur during that period because of unusually severe weather conditions, any overflows from the interceptor will be so diluted that they would pose no more risk than the combined overflows that routinely discharge into the Rouge River at numerous other locations," Egeland added.

Wayne County indicated it could com-

# Commerce man held in party store murder, holdup

A 22-year-old Commerce Township man is being held as a police prisoner in Detroit General Hospital as a suspect in the attempted holdup Saturday night of an Independence Township party store that left a store clerk dead and the store manager critically wounded.

The suspect's name had not been released as of 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon pending the issuance of warrants in the case, according to Richard Thompson, Oakland County's chief assistant prosecuting attorney.

Detroit police arrested the suspect after he went to the hospital early Sunday morning for treatment of a gunshot wound in his mouth. Fragments of the bullet and the bullet casing reportedly disappeared from the hospital emergency room shortly after they were removed from the suspect.

A spokesman for the Oakland County Sheriff's Department said detectives were examining evidence—a bloody, discarded ski mask believed to have been worn by the gunman and several teeth the suspect apparently lost after he was shot by the store manager—

with the prosecutor's office to prepare warrants in the case. Killed in the holdup attempt was 21-year-old Frances D. Ramsey, of Independence Township, a clerk in the Richardson's Farm Dairy located at 4744 Clarkson Road, east of Clarkston. The store manager, Charmaine Klaus, 43, of Waterford, was critically wounded by the gunman, but managed to shoot the assailant. Police aren't releasing details of the shootout.

The suspect apparently was driven to Detroit where he sought treatment at the hospital, saying he had been shot by two men who robbed him near Detroit's Greentown. Ramsey was pronounced dead on arrival at Fontaine Ochs Hospital early Sunday morning. She had been shot in the head, abdomen and arm. Klaus was taken to Pontiac General Hospital where she was reported in critical condition with a gunshot wound in her jaw. She was moved to another hospital Monday for security reasons, according to the sheriff's department. Police officials declined to release information on her condition.

# Library, park millage eyed in township

Commerce Township voters apparently will be asked to consider two special millage proposals—one to provide library services and the other to buy park land—on the August 5 primary election.

The township board last week approved the wording of a ballot question to levy three-tenths of one mill (30 cents for each \$1,000 of state equalized valuation) for library services.

Board members also asked the township parks committee to study the need for a millage proposal to help purchase all or part of some 400 acres of land now owned by the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority (HCMA) to provide recreational facilities in Commerce. A pre-application for a federal grant to cover half of the \$1,151,000 appraised value of the HCMA property was okayed, too, by the board at its March 11 session.

Commerce now contracts for library service with Walled Lake and Milford, but officials in those communities recently asked the township to allocate three tenths of a mill so they could qualify for state aid, according to Township Supervisor Robert H. Long.

The township board can levy up to five mills in local taxes without voter approval since Commerce's incorporation as a charter township in September 1978. However, board members have said they would not raise taxes without voter approval since the charter township move was designed to block annexation attempts.

If voters approve the advisory question, the three-tenths mill will be set aside out of the five-mills charter township limit. Approval of the proposal would generate about \$95,700 in revenues to pay for library services, based on the township's 1979 state equalized valuation (SEV) of \$219 million. The board budgeted \$35,000 for library services in its 1980 spending plan before Walled Lake and Milford requested the higher allocation.

The West Bloomfield Township Library Board, which also used to provide services to Commerce, has indicated an interest in entering into a new agreement with Commerce, if the millage is approved. West Bloomfield dropped its service to the township in 1975 when Commerce officials said they could not afford to earmark three-tenths mill for the contract.

If the millage is okayed, officials from the three libraries would split the funds based on the use of each facility by Commerce residents, Long said. Meanwhile, a proposed contract with Walled Lake and Milford to provide library services through the end of 1980 ran into a problem last week, Long said, due to a misunderstanding.

The Commerce board allocated the \$35,000 for library services for all of 1980—three months under the existing contract with the communities and nine months under a new agreement. Officials at the libraries, though, believed that the \$35,000 was for the nine-month period from April through December, the supervisor added.

Instead of approving a new contract with the libraries last week, the board authorized Long to meet with the Walled Lake and Milford officials in an effort to reach a compromise. He is expected to report back to the board at its April 6 meeting.

Wayne public works officials have no problem with the intent of Commerce's proposed changes, according to Duane R. Egeland, deputy managing director of the board, but those revisions would have to be okayed by the 15 other communities in the super sewer service area and that could be a time-consuming process.

Wayne County officials have offered to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the township to address Commerce's concerns, but, on Charterman's advice, the township board said in February that the memorandum would be unacceptable because it would be unenforceable, the public works officials said.

The township board okayed the super sewer contract March 10 subject to public works board approval of an addendum, setting the stage for yesterday's development.

Egeland said he would recommend against approval of the addendum. He told The News Monday, "If the township is insistent (on the addendum), we'll have to drop Commerce from the project."

A motion to drop Commerce from the system if the township did not approve the contract and memorandum by the time federal grant is offered on the project was being discussed when Long arrived at yesterday's meeting. After the supervisor explained that the township board was reluctant to approve a memorandum its attorney said was unenforceable, the public works officials decided to give Charterman and his attorney a chance to resolve the issue, possibly even after a federal grant is offered.

Chartrand is out of town, and Long said he isn't sure when the attorneys will get together to discuss the problem. He added, however, that Commerce still will be able to stay in the super sewer project.

# Officials will discuss cable TV concerns

Several common concerns of dealing with requests for cable television franchises will be discussed tomorrow at a meeting of area officials hosted by the Commerce Township cable TV study committee.

The March 20 session will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the township hall, 2940 Fisher Avenue, according to Committee Chairman David P. Hohendorf.

Public officials from communities in the Walled Lake Consolidated School District—as well as representatives from a number of other area municipalities, school districts and county agencies—have been invited to the meeting to discuss the common issues that each community faces in reviewing a request for a cable TV franchise, he added.

A number of the officials he has contacted so far seem to agree that some of the issues may be better addressed on an area-wide basis, Hohendorf said.

The Commerce panel chairman said he would propose two or three suggestions at tomorrow's session: formation of a joint committee to study the common concerns; hiring a professional consultant who could help all interested communities; or having each municipality handle franchise requests on its own.

# School board considers cutbacks

Recommendations for additional cutbacks in program and personnel will be presented to the Walled Lake Board of Education at a special study session next Monday.

The meeting will be held in Walled Lake Junior High School at 8 p.m. Superintendent Don Sheldon said Monday that administrators have not yet finalized the cutbacks they recommend to the school board, but added that preliminary figures indicate it will be necessary to chop an additional \$750,000 in expenditures in order to balance the budget.

"Our figures are only tentative at the present time because there are just too many variables," said the superintendent. "We think we have a good grasp of what we can expect in the way of state aid from Lansing, but if somebody pulls a switcheroo at some time down the road, it could throw our figures out of whack."

Sheldon also indicated that the preliminary projection of a \$750,000 deficit includes the "ordinary move-up" costs for school personnel as projected in the current settlement. However, the projected \$750,000 deficit does not include restoration of any of the programs or personnel that were eliminated when the board chopped some \$1.7 million out of the 1979-80 budget.

# M-275 decision prompts review

# Report on sprawl impacts prepared for governor

Governor Milliken's community development cabinet is expected—possibly as early as this week—to come up with recommendations on how to assess the impacts of new highway construction and other development projects on urban sprawl.

The community development cabinet, headed by Lieutenant Governor James H. Brickley, discussed the sprawl issue and the November resumption of the proposed M-275 freeway project at a meeting Friday, according to Craig Ruff, Brickley's executive assistant.

"There was a pretty good discussion," Ruff said, "and I think (the staff has) a pretty good feel for the alternatives."

The cabinet's task is to come up with "a process or strategy so community development impacts will be assessed" by state departments and agencies in their standard review process, Brickley's aide added. He declined comment on what recommendation, if any, the cabinet may make to the governor on M-275.

State Transportation Commission Chairperson Hanes Meyers Jr. recently sent the governor a five-page letter outlining the commission's review of the controversial M-275 project and providing a summary of the commission's comments on the issue.

Meyers said the commission—at its same November 28 meeting at which it approved the modified M-275 proposal—adopted a policy on the impact of new highway construction on fringe development that requires the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) to "coordinate major construction programs with other state agencies... to insure insofar as possible that these programs do not encourage fringe development."

The commission chairperson noted, however, that a draft environmental impact statement (EIS) on M-275, released in early 1978, "preceded the community development cabinet guidelines and (the governor's) special message to the state legislature on urban sprawl."

The MDOT had not "developed the methodology to determine the impact of highway projects on urban sprawl, and, thus, no criteria for the urban impacts for this project was included as a defined section of the M-275 draft environmental impact statement," Meyers wrote Milliken on March 4.

The commission is expected to vote on the highway project again when the department recommends a specific route alignment, he added. Meyers did not indicate what effect the urban sprawl policies may have on the panel, at that time.

year, according to Township Clerk Robert D. McGee.

The purchase of the HCMA park land was first proposed by the township parks committee last fall because an effort appeared to be under way in the state legislature to strip the regional authority of some of its powers, including the right to lease unused land to local communities for recreational facilities.

Long said he was notified March 11 of the HCMA's \$1.15 million appraisal value of the property, but added it is unclear exactly which land the authority included in its estimated cost.

The HCMA owns about 470 acres of land in Commerce. The 30 parcels of property originally were acquired by the authority as right-of-way for the Sidney Waldon parkway that would have connected Mt. Clemens and Ann Arbor.

The parkway was never built, and the HCMA has leased or sold much of the property to local communities. Commerce approved a three-year lease agreement last summer at a cost of \$1 a year.

Thirteen ball fields have been developed or are planned for the HCMA land, Long said. If the township buys the land, he added, the regional authority has indicated it will "dispose of it and then we won't have any fields."

It appears that only about 390 acres may be available for the township to purchase, McGee said, since the HCMA has agreed to sell the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

The township board allocated some \$69,000 in 1980 federal community development act funds to purchase the park land.

In addition to the HCMA land it leases, the township's only other recreational facilities include the 10-acre Bicentennial Park, the 80-acre Richardson Park and undeveloped tracts on Fox Lake.

Out of its five-mills limit, the township board levies 1.41 mills for general fund operations. Commerce's tax rate is one of the lowest in Oakland County.

**Thieves make off with silver from Novi residence**

**In Novi**

The theft of nine silver pieces worth an unknown amount in a breaking and entering in the 4200 block of Parkridge was reported to Novi police last week.

The responsible party apparently entered the residence through the west side door. Only the silver items were taken in the theft.

Silver-plated water pitchers, a sterling silver candy dish, a sterling silver and pepper dish, two sterling silver candlesticks, two silver serving plates, a silver relish dish and two jewelry boxes from the master bedroom were taken.

The suspect subsequently was subdued by two officers, booked and lodged in the Oakland County Jail.

A resident at the Village Apartments did not take an eviction notice lightly last week and called police to investigate the whole affair.

The woman told police she left her apartment in the morning to go to work. When she returned she found a message scrawled on the door in magic marker. It read: "Move Out." It was signed with three initials—KKK.

A home on Pontiac Trail was broken into last week while its owners were on vacation. The incident was discovered by a neighbor charged with checking the home.

Thieves gained entrance to the house by breaking a front window. Police indicate the interior of the house had been thoroughly ransacked in the attempt to uncover valuables. Investigators said every drawer and cupboard had been opened with contents strewn about the rooms.

Several household articles had been broken and entering incident, police said they could find no signs of forced entry to the unit. Value of the tape deck was placed at \$120.

A stereo cassette tape deck appeared to be the only item of value taken from a Golden Gate apartment unit last week even though other stereo equipment was left untouched.

## Man faces loansharking charge

**Man faces loansharking charge**

A 49-year-old Walled Lake man faces trial on one count of criminal usury after a doctor alleged that he borrowed \$13,000 from the defendant at interest rates of nearly 70 percent.

Nick Frank Flowers was ordered to stand trial on the loansharking charge Thursday following preliminary examination before Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Leonard Townsend, according to David Esper, an assistant prosecutor with the Wayne County Organized Crime Task Force.

Flowers told task force officials he lives in Walled Lake, but Esper declined to release a local address on the defendant. He is being held in the Detroit House of Correction as a result of a probationary sentence he received on a 1978 drug-related conviction, the assistant prosecutor added.

A conference was scheduled to be held yesterday to set hearing and trial dates in the case, Esper said.

According to the assistant prosecutor, Flowers was arrested March 4 following a two-year investigation of charges that he ran a loansharking operation while employed as an assistant pathologist at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit.

The charge against him is that he loaned Dr. Waddi Berz, then head of the hospital's emergency care unit, a total of \$13,000 at a high interest rate. Hospital security officers reported the alleged loansharking activities to Detroit police in February 1978, Esper said. He declined comment on whether Flowers is under investigation on possible additional usury charges.

Berz told the court March 13 that he borrowed \$2,000 from the Walled Lake man in February 1977 and was supposed to make four payments of \$1,395 within a year to repay the loan.

After making two payments, though, the doctor testified that he asked Flowers for an additional loan of \$10,000. Berz said he was supposed to pay the defendant \$1,253 a month for 15 months—a total of \$21,585 in less than two years on a \$13,000 loan.

The doctor made three payments at the new rate before Flowers reduced the payments to \$1,000 a month. After making two more payments at that rate, Berz said the defendant told him he only owed an additional total of \$8,000.

The doctor testified that he did not repay the \$6,000. He said he paid back a total of \$8,539 on the loans of \$13,000.

Investigators say Flowers may have reduced Berz's payments because he learned about the probe.

The maximum penalty for usury—lending money at an exorbitant rate of interest—is five years in prison, Esper said.

## Lake study fee unresolved

Wolverine Lake Village President John McCallan said last Wednesday that his meeting with former lake rehabilitation project Consulting Engineer Robert Williams "ended with nothing new" for the purpose of reaching an agreement on the bill for the deposed engineer's services.

McCallan's announcement came at the regular village council meeting. Later, he said that he'd be meeting with council members to get their opinions on what to do about the billing matter.

The Williams billing issue surfaced late last year when the engineer had presented his last recommendations to the village. Williams' plan was the target of some criticism because it did not include aeration.

The current controversy arose when Williams submitted a bill for \$9,975 for his lake work. However, the majority of council members contended that Williams was not authorized to receive more than \$2,000 for his efforts.

No written contract was ever entered into for Williams' services.

The former engineer, whom council elected not to retain February 6, sought legal advice on the billing matter last month. However, he has made it clear that he has no intention of taking legal action against the village.

The township filed suit against Harndon and defendants "John Doe" and "Mary Roe" in 1977, charging that they were creating a nuisance by violating the Commerce zoning ordinance which has separate classifications for single-family residential and mobile home districts.

Harndon moved into the mobile home after a fire destroyed a conventional single-family home on the site four years ago.

The settlement states that the property owner in no way gained a vested right to continue to use the mobile home on the site, and Harndon agreed to abide by zoning regulations.

Both sides also acknowledged that the property has been used as a recreational camping site—and not for permanent residency—for some 50 years.
