Originally, members of the Fire Department Planning Committee had anticipated the building would be funded by a millage instead of a bond sale. Working upon that assumption, they planned a building which is a replica of Fire Station III on Nine Mile.

But as the committee continued to investigate the city's fire needs, it was decided it would be more equitable to residents to issue bonds instead of financing the construction through a millage issue. Interest generated by the

bonds also was expected to allow for the enhance the operation of the station by increased size of the station.

Further plans that Fire Station I would serve as headquarters for the fire department dictated that it be planning committee.

Additionally, the city has obtained a large parcel of property on Grand River (near the Novi Road intersection) which has allowed the station to be relocated and expanded.

The fact that the Grand River site for the fire station was donated to the city also will help keep the project within budget. Kriewall informed the council in his report. He said the city should be able to sell the Novi Road site to help offset construction costs.

As a result of concerns expressed by the council Monday, some 200 square feet have been eliminated from from the plans for Fire Station I. The reduction brings the size of the fire station to 7,700 square feet or approximately 2,500 square feet more than originally anticipated when the question went to the voters on the November ballot.

Fire Chief Arthur Lenaghan said that removing the 200 square feet would

Family planning instruction vetoed

Citing a lack of community interest, materials and instructional methods Novi school board members have decided not to proceed with development of instruction in birth control at

this time. In a survey conducted last fall, esidents of the school district were asked to advise the school board as to whether it should proceed with development of instruction in reproductive health as well as recognition and prevention of venereal disease.

Some 8,000 copies of the survey were distributed with the school newsletter, but Superintendent Gerald Kratz reported last week that the district had received just 23 responses to the poll.

Specifically, the survey asked arents to indicate whether they agreed that the Novi Schools should establish an advisory board to review materials and methods of instruction in order to

provide a class in reproductive health. Parents also were asked to indicate whether the school should provide an elective class for instruction in sex education including family planning and human sexuality at the high school

In response to the questionnaire, 21 stablish an advisory board to review for a reproductive health class, while two persons opposed that action.

The same 21 respondents also supported the concept of providing a high school elective class for instruction in sex education which would include family planning. Two persons opposed such a class.

Residents also commented on the program, saying: "This program should begin at least by the middle school years! High school may be too late!" and "How about a follow up to the fifth grade program each year? 'Reproductive Health' should be introduced in early middle school."

A third comment was: "I reserve the right and privilege to teach my own children, thank you!"

The survey was prompted by recently enacted legislation which leaves the decision of whether to include family planning information in sex education classes up to the individual school district.

That state regulation — Public Act 226 of 1977 — also authorizes school districts to offer classes in "reproductive health" which includes an inpersons said the schools should dividual's well being and involves study of the reproductive system and its physiological and endocrinological Novi Schools. functions.

Material which may be covered in the class includes sex education, family planning, human sexuality and the emotional, physical, psychological, hygenic, economic and social aspects of

'Family planning is defined by the state guidelines as "the range of methods of fertility regulation designed to help individuals or couples avoid unwanted pregnancies, bring about wanted births, regulate the intervals between pregnancies and plan the time at which births occur."

Clinical abortion is not considered a method of family planning and cannot be taught as a method of reproductive

Under the state guidelines, reproductive health classes are to be elective and not a requirement for graduation. Upon written request of a pupil, parents or guardians, the student may be excused from taking the class.

The time is rapidly approaching when the Novi City Council and Planning Board should give serious attention to the possibility of extending the Planned Development (PD) Options, perhaps as far south as Grand River Avenue.

In fact, now is the ideal time to consider the possibility of extending the PD Options while the city is in the process of revising and updating its master plan for land use development.

The PD Options were adopted by the city council several years ago in response to a perceived need to provide flexibility of development in specific areas of

In essence, the PD Options permit developers to construct buildings up to five stories in height. The height limitation in all other classifications of the zoning ordinance is two stories.

However, the city gains certain advantages by permitting developers to utilize the PD Options. First, the review process for development under the PD Options is much more stringent because the council wants to make certain that structures in xcess of two stories are an asset — not a liability — to the aesthetics of the city.

Secondly, developers who utilize the PD Options must agree to meet higher setback and landscaping standards.

Basically, the PD Options are well-designed additions to the city's zoning ordinance. Further, they represent an important tool for implementing the philosophy of maximizing the tax yield from certain non-residential properties so that the city can literally afford to retain its philosophy of large-lot residential areas.

At the time the PD Options were adopted, they were limited to specific areas of the city, basically in the so-called regional center area around the Twelve Oaks Mall. They were adopted with the implicit understanding, however, that they could be extended to other areas if deemed appropriate at some time in the

The purpose of this commentary is to suggest that the time has arrived to extend the availability of the PD Options to include at least a portion of the corridor that lies between I-96 and Grand River Avenue.

Specifically, we see merit to extending the PD Options to a strip of land that would incorporate both sides of Novi Road down to the Novi Road/Grand River Avenue intersection.

> Additionally, extending the options would increase the city's controls of the area along the Novi Road strip down to Grand River and could well lead to the type of development with increassetbacks and landscaping which would be advantageous to







Novi to service

Construction of the new police headquarters building on Ten Mile in Novi may result in cost-

City Manager Edward Kriewall has announced plans to re-direct the city's vehicle maintenance program to the new police facility in order "to extract the maximum from present employees and optimize the availability of the repair facility now in operation in the new police headquarters."

"Due to our investment in the police facility (bays, hoist, compressor) and in training personnel (police utility workers), it is apparent that we should attempt to optimize our investment and track the operation of a second repair facility," Kriewall said during a recent report to the city

Presently, the city performs some vehicle maintenance in the DPW garage. But Kriewall noted that the DPW garage is a minimal facility and is strained in terms of handling increased

The bulk of the city's vehicle maintenance work is done by shipping the vehicles to private automobile dealerships. Kriewall told the council, however, that re-directing vehicle maintenance work to the police facility will "cut down on having cars dispatched all over the place in Northville, Farmington Hills, Walled Lake, etc. The city manager said that all vehicle

maintenance work except DPW and fire apparatus will be re-directed to the police headquarters July Additionally, he reported that repairs that repre-

mechanics will still have to be performed by other agencies and that "some scattering will still be evident due to the fact that dealer repairs will necessitate several dealers.' Kriewall added that the city plans to monitor the


program closely. Daily production forms have been prepared to allow the city to track the per unit cost of work and enable the Finance Department to develop sufficient data to record man-hour costs,

"This information can then be weighed against our budget experience of fiscal 1979-80," Kriewall said in his report to the council. "We should be able to weigh results of this program at least quarterly and devise some meaningful analysis from our
