Preliminary figures from the federal census now are being reviewed by the city to determine whether a recount is needed in specific areas within the city, Allie said.

Despite the rapid population increase, the figures really held no surprises for the city, Allie said. He said the numbers are consistent with historical trends and city projections. -

"If there were any surprises it was that the average number of persons per household dropped from 3.60 to 2.79. It shows that people who have moved here In the 70s don't have as many children. But that is just a reflection of national trends," Allie said.

Federal census bureau figures show

least 21,567 residents, there are 657 vacant homes in the city. Assuming that those new homes will be occupied this year and each will have 2.79 residents, there should be 23,500 residents in Novi by April 1981, Allie projected.

Beyond next year the city probably can expect even greater annual population growth, he predicted.

"The city's growth has been fairly consistent since 1975. If the economy turns and housing rebounds we can expect, based upon the 2,500 plats for realdential homes on the books, to experience even higher growth years in the future." Allie said.

He added that dramatic increases a municipality is entitled. should be seen if the city population growth follows the same pattern it did after the 1976 recession.

"After the economy furned in 1976 could be light at the beginning of 1981, but after that we should start seeing growth in the subdivisions that are now in various stages of development," Allie said.



For example, Act 51 monies (state funds collected through gasoline taxes which revert to the local municipality based on the number of miles of major and 1977 our growth doubled. Activity and local roads and the community's population) could be expected to increase as much as 124 percent.

The gasoline taxes which revert to the city are based on a formula which considers only the population counted in the 10 year census. Funds the city now is receiving under Act 61 are based upon the 1970 count of 9,600 residents.

financing. In essence, approval of the inducement resolution signifies that the EDC is interested in the project and "induces" the applicant to proceed through the necessary steps,

As a unit of municipal government, an EDC can lesue tax-free revenue bonds to assist with the construction of commercial and industrial projects. Since lending institutions do not have to pay taxes on interest earned from the toan, they typically offer the lender an interest rate that is two to three points lower than is available under conventional mortgages.

The EDC retains ownership of the completed facility until the loan has been retired through payments from the company. Public funds cannot be used to retire EDC loans and the city's credit rating is not affected.

While Abel is attempting to secure final site pian approval and EDC financing for the hotel, there is no new word on his application for one of the city's two remaining Class B (Hotel) liquor

Novi's City Council last year adopted guidelines for awarding liquor ticenses which give top priority to hotels and convention facilities which contain more than 250 units.

Since the hotel proposed by Abel contains less than the 250-units designated in the guidelines, the city is considering whether the standard should be walved.







# \$1 million

#### Bids come in despite price tag

One million bucks for a gas station? You heard it right. That's the price tag that has been placed on the Standard station on the northeast corner of the Novi Road/Grand River Avenue intersection.

To be completely honest about it, there's more involved than just the gas station. Anyone who comes up with the \$1 million price tag gets the gas station plus 21/2 additional acres

with frontage on Grand River Avenue. Still, \$1 million for three acres would appear to be a helty price tag until you stop to consider the location of the parcel. "That's the best piece of property in Novi,"

claims Lee Harrawood of Farmington who acquired the gas station in 1949 and purchased the other 21/2 acres in 1953. "Heck, that's the number one corner in the city," he added. "That corner is Novi."

Harrawood, for the 'newcomers' in town, has been one of Novi's most prominent citizens for the better part of three decades even though he presently resides in Farmington.

His fame and accomplisments stretch far beyond the city limits, however. He presently is the Ilustrious Potentate for the Moslem Shrine Temple in Detroit and was recently Installed as District 638 Governor of Rotary International, a position which makes him the head of 50 Rotary clubs throughout

southeast Michigan and Canada.
"I hold both jobs and don't get a cent for doing it," said Harrawood, a large, jovial man who tackles everything he does with enthusiasm. "I do it because I enjoy working for crippled children (the primary beneficiaries of the

Shriners' efforts). They're both fine jobs. But back to that \$1 million gas station. "It's worth every penny," claims Harrawood. "We've only had that piece of property on the market for a little over a month, but we've already

COMMITTEEIZE - (see also buck-; passify). To avoidify and to render undecisionable all controvertialaceous matters. Also to channelize.

Despite Wright's concern, I feel some; atrocities, however despicable, do seem especially appropriate. Consider, for examole, the following and then try developing: some of your own:

**SPORTSIFY** — To actionize immobile: verbations; to adjectify or nounifize otherwise good words for unimportant subjects. (See also putrify, crucifixion).


INTAXICATE - To induce pain or pursitis, especially with prolonged extractions; to enragify or robbify taxpayers.



# Hip 'shaving' aids victims of chronic arthritic pain

"If my life ended today I would know there are some people out there who are better off because of me. That is the biggest satisfaction of my job."

An orthopedic surgeon at Botsford General Hospital in Farmington, Doctor John Swienckowski is one of a few surgeons in the country who performs a relatively new hip operation which eliminates the pain caused by chronic arthritis, hip disease or is the result of bone problems due to auto accidents. The new procedure, developed by four

European surgeons independently around 1974, involves a resurfacing of the hip joint as opposed to joint replacement — done in the more common total hip replacement surgery. The head of the hip bone is shaved, a metal cup is cemented to it and a semi-

'The head is saved' circular cover - made of high density

serves as the hip socket. The result is a joint which allows freedom of movement without pain, with only a miniscule amount of bone being removed. The Northville Township surgeon points out that this procedure cannot be used in every

case, however. "This method is basically for people who still have the head (of the thigh bone) but it may be worn, "he said. "The friction on the worn spot causes the acute pain.

"Instead of removing some two inches of bone, we scrape maybe eight or 10 millimeters of bone from the head." One major advantage of this procedure, Swienckowski said, is the greater number of

alternatives a patient has. "In a standard total hip you are locked " he explained. "If in a few years it loosens or there are other problems the only

thing you can do is put in another one. "If a resurfacing has been done, you still

have the bone intact and can do a second resurfacing or a total hip replacement, if necessary, "he stated.

But the 25 resurfacing operations Swienchowski has done at Botsford during the last three years have proven highly successful. None of the patients — who ranged from 21 to 66 years of age - has had any major problems. Because of his success, the 35-yearold surgeon is very confident that within five years resurfacing will replace total hip

surgery as the standard procedure. "In five years a 10-year study being conducted in Europe will be completed and I truly believe the failure rate for resurfacing will be less than for total replacement, " he

A recent study conducted at the Mayo Clinic in Minnesota revealed that one of four total hip replacements performed between 1972 and 1977 was unsuccessful, Swien-

In addition to the greater number of alternatives offered to the patient with resurfacing, the chances of infection, always a

danger, are reduced significantly. The space between the polyethylene cup and the hip socket is greatly reduced and the space which develops in the bone surrounding the pin - used in total hip replacement - ob-

viously, is non-existent, he said. Thus, the area where the infection could set in is greatly reduced.

Though Heinz Wagner of Germany and M.A.R. Freeman of England generally are credited with developing the resurfacing procedure, which also has proven very successful for them. Swienckowski says a lot of credit should go to a Michigan resident who some 20 years ago developed a variation of the method.
