

City housing starts could hit five year low

The recession of 1980 could mean the slowest residential building year for Novi in the past five years.

Figures for the first six months of the year show the city issued just 53 residential permits by June 30. That compares with 183 issued in the same period one year ago.

If builders double that figure and pull 106 permits this year, residential building starts would still be 70 fewer than in 1977, which previously was the worst building year for the city over the past five years. Some 178 residential building permits were issued in 1977.

During the past five years housing starts otherwise have hovered around

250 annually. In 1975 the city issued 232 permits. Some 245 permits were issued in 1976. In 1978 the city granted 279 permits and 256 were issued in 1979.

But it appears unlikely that the number of permits issued this year will hit those levels as a result of an all but virtual halt in residential building starts locally.

This year's lack of residential building activity appears to be the continuation of a trend which began when building began to slow down in the middle of the 1979 construction season. The slow down became evident with a mid-year decrease in building department revenues which occurred between June

and July of 1979. At the end of the year the city had issued approximately one half the number of permits originally anticipated.

Figures show 1980 started out slow and so far has not shown much sign of rallying.

Building usually takes off in the spring months. For example, one year ago between February and March the total building permits issued went from 15 to 69. From March to April the number of permits jumped from 69 to 118 and the figures continued to increase until the decline set in during June.

This year the spring rush didn't occur.

In January, normally a slow building month regardless, there were no residential permits issued. Four permits were pulled in February, 28 were issued in March, 10 were issued in April, four in May and seven in June — for a total of 53.

Despite the length and depth of the building slump, Building Official Earl Bailey reports that the figure is "just about what we expected."

He says the low number of housing starts is simply a reflection of the state of the economy.

"We have plenty of lots that are ready to go, but people just can't afford them any more. With so many people out of work and the economy the way it is, they're just not building houses."

Economic uncertainties make predictions difficult, but Bailey indicated that the signs are pointing to an improvement in the next six months.

"We are seeing a change now — it

looks like things could be getting better," Bailey said.

Novi's chief building official was unwilling to estimate just how much better, and whether the anticipated turn around will be sufficient to push the figures over the 1977 levels.

Bailey's comments are borne out by figures released by the Western Wayne Oakland County Board of Realtors which show that sales were down 28.4 percent from last year during the first quarter of the year. The biggest drop — 47.7 percent — occurred during March.

Figures from the board of Realtors also shared Bailey's optimism for the future.

Although the number of sales in June was 23 percent below the number sold a year ago, the number sold was an improvement over the 50 percent decline which was recorded through March, April and May, the Realtors noted.

Locally, 30 homes have been sold in

the past six months, compared to 48 which were sold in the first six months of 1979. Of the 30 homes sold this year 13 were financed through conventional mortgages, the Realtors report.

The board of Realtor figures show that average home prices in June are up only 3.76 percent from a year ago. Last year at this time prices were rising by 5.2 percent.

The average sale price of homes in Novi now is pegged at \$92,183, they report.

Meanwhile, building officials are keeping up with inspections of developments which got underway before the recession set in, Bailey said.

"Commercial and industrial developments haven't been hit as hard as residential building. We're keeping busy with projects which have been on the books and site plan reviews. Commercial development is keeping us going," said the building official.



Novi population update means increased revenues

More people will mean more money for the City of Novi.

State and federal programs which use population as a part of the formula for determining the amount of money a community will receive will be affected by the census figures.

In fact if the new census figures could have been applied this year the city would have realized a 23 percent increase in state revenue sharing monies, according to Assistant City Manager Alex Allie.

Allie added, however, that the new census figures will not affect the city's budget this year. The latest numbers could be calculated into state formulas effective April 1, 1980, but a movement is afoot in Lansing to delay the effective date six months in order to give communities with declining populations time to adjust to a corresponding loss of revenues. Either way, increased funding will not be seen by the city until fiscal 1981-82.

Funding increases can be expected since Novi's population has increased by more than 123 percent from the 1970 census.

Updated census figures which have been approved by the regional office of the census bureau show there are 22,258 residents in the city.

By the time the district office in Indianapolis approves the figures, an additional 100-200 township residents are expected to have been added to the city's official population count.

While the population increases won't generate a windfall, it will mean increases in the amount of revenue the city receives from state income tax, single business tax, relative tax effort, relative tax burden, sales tax and gas and weight tax returns.

Each of those state programs uses population figures in determining the amount of money each community should receive.

Census figures from 1975 which showed 14,368 residents in Novi currently are being plugged into four of those formulas. The gas and weight tax formula does not allow special census figures to be used.

Any projections of how much money could be realized by the city as a result of the census update are strictly hypothetical at this point.

But hypothetically speaking if the new census figures had been used in formulas during the 1979-80 fiscal year, the city's general fund might be \$170,000 richer, according to Allie.

He explained that the city really cannot count on receiving those funds because the latest population figures won't be calculated into the state formula until next year and at this time it is uncertain how much money the state will have available to divide among municipalities.

"We don't know how much money will be available because of our recessionary economy," commented Allie. "Revenues from all the programs

which use population in the formula are based upon business activity in the state. We can't be sure how much of a pie there will be to divide.

"There are other factors — such as the Tisch amendment — which could affect the amount of revenues available."

Federal funds will not rise at the same clip that state revenues are expected to increase, Allie said. Federal revenue sharing formulas use data from the Internal Revenue Service, which is fairly up to date, Allie explained.

Novi receives a percentage of the federal taxes that residents of the city have paid to the federal government.

Where the census will have an effect is in verifying the city's position that it is not receiving its fair share of federal funds because of mailing addresses that differ from municipal boundary lines.

"We've argued that Northville is getting our money," Allie said. "We believe a significant number of residents fall out their income tax forms improperly and the census figures could bear that out."

It is likely that Housing and Community Development (HCD) Block Grant Funds will not be affected by the results of the census, Allie said.

Under the HCD program eligibility for funds depends in part upon total population and poverty level popula-

Tobacco store ends appeal, paraphernalia ban stands

There will be no further legal challenge of Novi's paraphernalia ordinance from Tobacco Road.

The tobaccoist forfeited its challenge last week in 52nd District Court when it pled "no contest" to charges of committing a violation of the local paraphernalia ban.

In response to the "no contest" plea, Judge Michael Batchik delayed sentencing for six months.

If any further violations are issued against the store in the next six months, the judge could impose a jail sentence. The case will be dismissed if no further violations occur.

Charges against Tobacco Road Clerk Susan L. Burns were dropped by the city so that she would not have a police record, according to City Attorney David Fried. Tobacco Road, instead of the clerk, was then charged with violating the paraphernalia ordinance.

The charges stemmed from a July 1979 incident in which the sales clerk was charged with selling a "hash pipe" to undercover Novi police officers.

Batchik had earlier ruled that the case should go to trial to determine whether a violation of the paraphernalia ordinance had been committed.

In that decision he upheld the constitutionality of the ordinance after dismissing arguments from the store's attorneys that the violation should be thrown out because of the ordinance's vagueness.

Selling and distributing "drug related" paraphernalia is prohibited by the local ordinance. Specifically, the ordinance bans the sale or display of hypodermic needles, cocaine spoons,

marijuana pipes, and empty gelatin capsules, which are cited as examples of paraphernalia. Conviction of selling, displaying or giving away such equipment can result in a 90 day jail sentence or a fine of up to \$500.

In June legal counsel for Tobacco Road indicated a federal court appeal through the U.S. Circuit court had been dropped, but an appeal of Batchik's decision and the constitutionality of the ordinance through the state court was planned.

But Michael Steffani, legal counsel for Tobacco Road, said his client no longer is interested in testing the ordinance.

He said that the fact Tobacco Road was no longer in business in Novi prompted the decision to drop the case.

The expense of litigation and the fact that the constitutionality of ordinances patterned after the Novi ordinance and adopted by other communities are being contested in U.S. District Court also led to the decision to cease further appeals, he said. A paraphernalia ban in Livonia currently is being challenged.

"The citizens of Novi are left with an unfair, unconstitutional ordinance on their books, until someone else challenges this. But the citizens can rest assured that until that challenge is made my clients will not push pipes in their community," Steffani said satirically.

He went on to say he believed the unconstitutionality of the ordinance was demonstrated by U.S. District Court Judge Anna Diggs Taylor's decision against an identical ordinance in Ferndale.

Steffani also praised City Attorney David Fried. "Had it not been for his

excellent arguments, the ordinance would have been thrown out," Steffani claimed. Additionally, the legal counsel for the tobacco store said that the case was tried improperly when heard in U.S. District Court, but that another attorney was handling the case at that time.

Action in 52nd District Court last week ends a year-long battle against the paraphernalia ban which began almost as soon as the ordinance was enacted in February of 1979.

Court proceedings surrounding the ordinance ensued as follows:

• April 1979: After being in business in the Novi-Ten Plaza for one week, Tobacco Road filed suit in U.S. District Court challenging the constitutionality of the ordinance. The company argued the ordinance violated the first, fifth, fourteenth, and eighth amendments to

Novi school board elects officers in annual organizational meeting

Sharon Pelchat was elected president of the Novi Board of Education for the 1980-81 school year on a 4-3 vote at the board's annual organizational meeting Thursday.

She replaces Ron Milam who served as president for the past year. Milam indicated before the meeting he did not wish to serve a second term.

Board members split their votes for president between Pelchat and Ruth Waldenmayer. Both previously have served as school board president.

However, following the vote Trustee Ron Milam told the group that he believed the 4-3 vote should not be perceived by the board or the community as "choosing up sides."

"We had two people willing to assume the awesome responsibility of this position, and board members had a difficult decision: choosing one way or another," commented Milam. "But this should not be read as a division of the board or viewed any differently than any other

issue," he added. Pelchat served as vice-president of the board during the 1979-80 school year. Traditionally, the person in that position is elected to the president's seat in the following year.

She had also served as president in the 1976-77 school year. She held the office of vice president during the 1975-76 and 1979-80 school years, served as secretary in 1977-78 and was elected treasurer in 1971-72, 1973-74 and 1974-75.

Pelchat was first elected to the school board in 1971. She was re-elected in 1973 and 1977. She will be completing the last of a four year term in June 1981.

Waldenmayer was president during the 1978-79 school year. She served as vice president in 1977 and secretary during the 1979-80 school year.

Waldenmayer thanked Milam for his service as board president during the past year which she described as a "difficult year." She also said she ap-

preciated the fact he was able to keep members of the school board informed of issues as they arose during his presidency.

When the ballots were cast Trustees Joel Colliau, Milam, Robert Schram, and Pelchat voted for Pelchat as board president. Trustees Joan Daley, Norman Miller and Waldenmayer supported Waldenmayer's candidacy.

All other officers were elected on a unanimous ballot.

Robert Schram was elected vice-president. He was first elected to the school board in 1978.

Joan Daley will serve as secretary and Waldenmayer was elected treasurer.

Swearing-in ceremonies for Norman Miller and Milam also were conducted Thursday. Milam and Miller assumed their seats on the board after successfully campaigning in the June

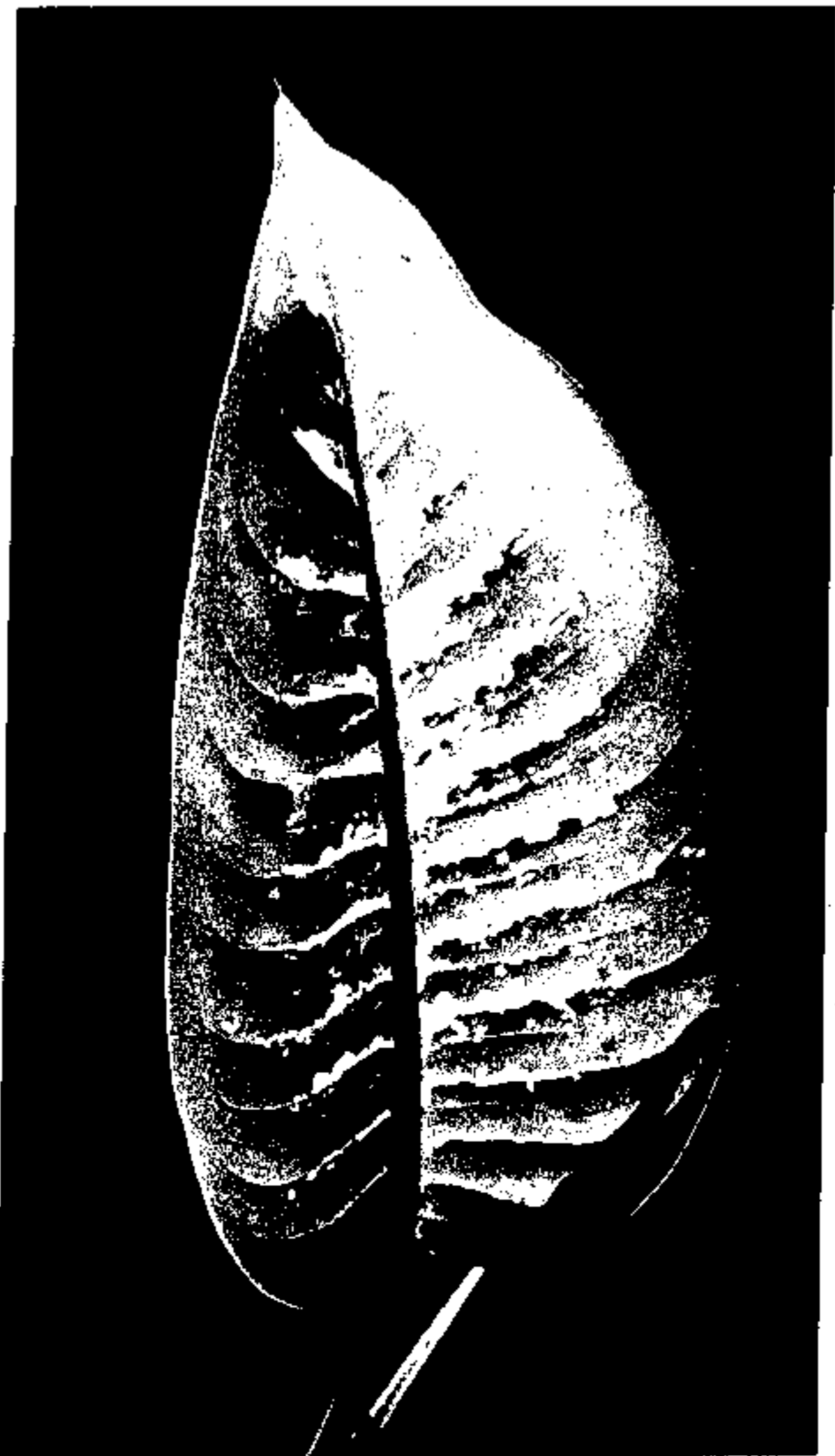

Police report booming business in bicycle thefts

In Wixom

It was a bad week for bicycle owners in Wixom last week as police logged five different reports of bicycle thefts. Total value of the four stolen bicycles was estimated at approximately \$550.

A Euna Street resident reported the theft of a 26-inch Ross professional sports bicycle on Sunday. The complainant told police that the responsible parties stole the bike, which was valued at \$350, from the garage attached to his residence.

The bicycle was later recovered in a field off Loom Lake Road near the Finnish Summer Camp.

A Hopkins Street resident reported the theft of a 10-speed Raleigh boys' bicycle last Wednesday. Value of the stolen bicycle was pegged at \$200.

The complainant told police the bicycle was stolen from the garage sometime between 1:30 and 5:30 p.m.

In a third report, a Teaneck Circle resident reported the theft of a new Rosemount Motor-cycle valued at \$107 from the garage behind his home. The bike was removed from the garage sometime between 9:30 and 10:30 p.m., according to police reports.

And in yet another report, a Detroit man reported that a 22-inch Thomson bicycle had been stolen from a residence in the Finn Camp. The complainant told police that the bicycle had been left next to the cottage. Value of the stolen property was pegged at \$130.

The theft of an estimated \$28 worth of empty cans and bottles was reported by the owner of the Wixom Food Market and a Pepsi-Cola delivery man last Friday.

The complainants told police they had observed a white male in his late teens and dressed only in blue jeans take two clear plastic bags containing the empty cans and bottles from the back of a trailer.

The suspect then escaped with the merchandise through a field toward Wainstock Street, according to reports.

No arrests have yet been made in the case, although police indicated that they have a suspect in the case. Investigation of the alleged larceny is continuing.

A South Lyon man reported the theft of a 1976 Pontiac Trans-Am from the parking lot of the Continental Bar on

Grand River Avenue on Friday. The complainant told police he parked the vehicle on the west side of the building at approximately 10:30 p.m. He discovered the theft when he left the bar shortly after midnight, according to reports.

Value of the stolen property was not listed.

In Novi

A Novi man has been arraigned on charges of receiving and concealing a stolen 1974 motorcycle, police report.

Allan Smith was arrested July 7 after police, acting on a tip, allegedly caught him driving a stolen motorcycle.

Police said the arrest came after a chase through Echo Valley subdivision and attempts to flee police on foot.

Police reported Smith was first seen by police as he was pulling out of his driveway on the motorcycle. A patrol car followed the cyclist until he noticed the police behind him and fled, according to reports.

He abandoned the cycle in a field and then fled on foot. Police officers Herb Harbin and Corporal David Butler chased him through a field.

He was later arrested on Ten Mile after witnesses of the chase told police he had entered a house. Police watched the house and when he attempted to leave, as a passenger in an automobile, the vehicle was stopped by police.

In the search of the field where the bike was abandoned, police found that heavy rains made it possible to obtain a plaster cast of a shoe print. Smith's shoes were confiscated as evidence.

Police also found the motorcycle approximately 35 yards from where the man was seen fleeing on foot.

Police apparently were told the cycle originally was blue, but had been repainted black. A "sissy" bar also had been removed from the bike. Police reported the cycle had the same plates it wore when it was reported stolen July 2.

Smith was arrested and held by police on a \$100 bond. He was arraigned Friday before Judge Martin Boyle. He was charged with receiving and concealing property worth more than \$100. The felony charge carries a maximum penalty of five years imprisonment. Smith was released on a \$1,000 personal bond. His examination is set for August 15.

Police have arrested a 36-year-old man in connection with a break in at Novi Hardware on Grand River which occurred last week.

Gordon R. Barber, address unknown, was found by police near In Store. When police went to investigate the reason the man was bending over some bushes, they found a number of tools which still had original price stickers on them, according to reports.

Police recovered a \$19.95 hammer, \$15 hammer, \$10.19 sledge hammer, \$11.88 wrench, \$9 hammer and a \$2 fence guide.

The man also was carrying \$19.55 in change, police reports stated. Police found after contacting Novi Hardware that the check-out-tape on the cash register showed that \$19.55 in change had been left in the register which had been left open.

Police are investigating the possibility

that the suspect may have been involved in similar incidents in Farmington.

Barber was arraigned Friday on charges of breaking and entering before 52nd District Court Judge Michael Batchick. The charge is a felony which carries a maximum penalty of 10 years imprisonment. Bond was set at \$5,000 cash or surety and examination set for July 21. He was turned over to Oakland County Jail to await examination.

For budding pilot - sky's the limit

I saw a fleet of fishing boats...I flew down almost touching the craft and yelled at them, asking if I was on the right road to Ireland. They just stared. Maybe they didn't hear me. Maybe I didn't hear them or maybe they thought I was just a crazy fool. An hour later I saw land.

As the plane slowly moves down the runway, the pilot glances at the instrument panel. Everything appears to be in order—airspeed indicator, altimeter, and radio all are working fine. Rolling down the runway, the pilot looks down the runway and shouts, "Clear!"

With no one in its path, the small, one engine plane begins to pick up speed. The only sounds heard are those of the spinning propeller and humming engine as the plane lifts off the ground. And within only a few minutes, "the great flying machine" is soaring through the blue sky.

"It's crazy, but I love it," exclaims Steve Antuna. "I've been hooked on flying for years."

Antuna, 18, from Northville is one of thousands of people whose fascination with the world of aviation has led them to brave the unknown.

"The first time I went flying was in a helicopter. I started off wanting to be an astronaut, but saw an army helicopter at a camper show and that was it," he says.

More than a year ago, Antuna's enthusiasm about flying directed him toward Salem Airport located on Six Mile right in the heart of Salem Township. He has been there ever since, working as a "line boy" and taking flying lessons.

As a "line boy," Antuna works between 50 and 60 hours a week, filling planes with fuel, cleaning, working at the desk and doing other odd jobs.

In between his work schedule, he takes flying lessons and hopes to get his pilot's license sometime in the near future.

Approximately 50-60 hours of flying time are necessary to earn a pilot's license. With about 32 hours under his belt, Antuna said he hopes to earn his license before the year is out.

However, flying lessons do not come cheap. At Salem Airport, a one-hour lesson is

\$40—which includes \$12 for the instructor and \$28 for the plane.

"It's expensive, but like anything else you learn, it stays with you for a lifetime," says Antuna.

Antuna says his interest in aviation stems from his father. "My dad was always interested in aviation. Ever since I can remember, we've been building model planes together. When I got my license, he'll be my first passenger."

Antuna explains the 50 some hours of flying time are only one requirement needed toward getting a license. Some of the other requirements include a written examination issued by the Federal Aviation Association, about 10 hours of solo flying and a certain amount of cross-country flying—which entails flying to other specified airports.

Antuna says licenses differ according to the different types of planes. Air traffic pilots, those in charge of commercial planes have separate, more stringent requirements than a small plane pilot.

Antuna recalls that his first solo flight, on May 28, was exactly one year after he started working at Salem. In recognition of the flight, a T-shirt hangs on the wall at the airport, with his name and "5-28-80" on the back.

Though Antuna admits to being afraid at first, he says planes are essentially safe and his initial jitters have faded.

"It's safer up there than it is going down Main Street."

Some of the dangers in flying are bad weather and mid-air collisions, he says.

I was introduced to bad weather a couple of days ago," he relates. "I had moved into an area where the clouds were dark and then right in front of me was a lightning bolt. I turned right around and came back to Salem."

Antuna says he would like eventually to earn his rotary craft license—which would entitle him to pilot helicopters. Yet, he knows the expense will most likely keep him from doing it for some time. The approximate cost for rotary craft lessons is about \$5,000 to \$6,000, he says.

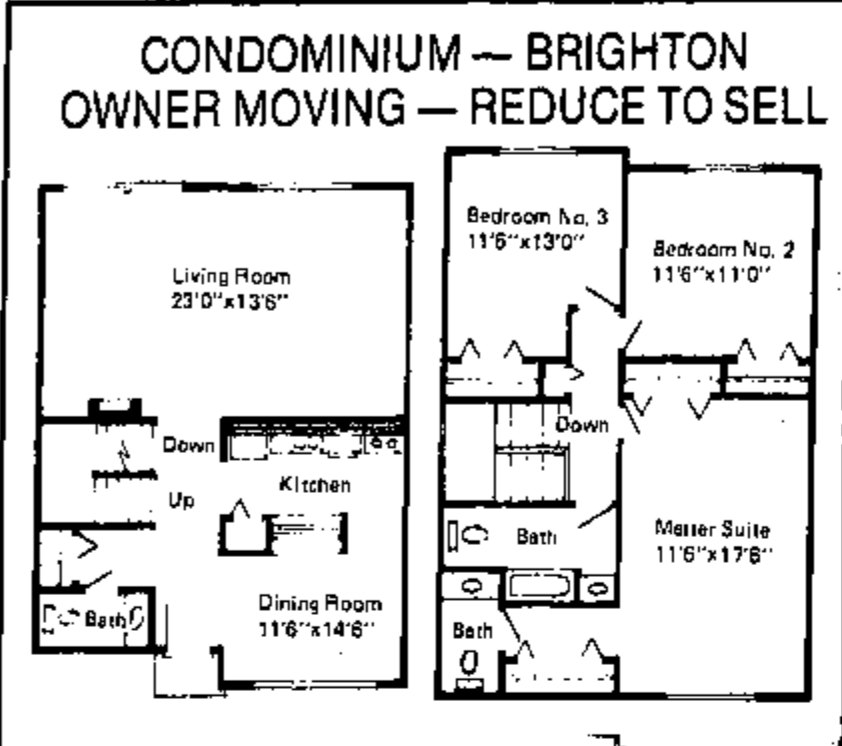

(First of two part series) Do you frequently find yourself in "stressful" situations? Do you wonder how you can make life a little easier? Do tiredness, sleeplessness, tenseness and constipation creep into your life too often? Do you wish you could live a completely stress-free existence?

negative force in their lives. That is not valid, he says, and actually quite untrue. Scientifically, stress is defined as a non-specific response of the body to any demand placed on it. There is physical, mental, psychological stress. Any type of stress can be positive or negative. What most of us refer to as "stress" is really distress. In early man, stress was as much a part of his life as it is part of ours. He had to live with food shortages, saber tooth tigers, drought, fire, floods. The stress produced by these situations made him able to react quickly. When danger approached him, his heart raced. He began breathing harder, his blood pressure and blood sugar rose, readying him for fighting. His muscles tensed, his stomach stop-

ped digesting its food temporarily. All of his body's forces could go into defending himself. Physically, we haven't changed much. But, our enemies have become more dangerous. Instead of saber-toothed tigers and floods, our enemies have turned into too many obligations, traffic jams, grocery store lines, sitting all day frustrating jobs. There is no physical danger immediately attached to any of our enemies. We cannot even see most of them. Our bodies respond to them as they did to the physical perils of years gone by. When you are in a traffic jam, your blood pressure probably does rise. Pay attention when the grocery store line is too long. Feel any muscles tensing? If you have "an acid stomach" or ulcers, chances are your stomach is churning more often than it should. Everytime you feel like stomping out of a meeting, pounding on your desk, shaking your co-worker or firing your boss, your body responds physically like the caveman's. It responds similarly when you walk out on a family argument or wish your kids would evaporate. The only problem is that, socially, you can't react like the caveman did. If you pound, stomp or scream, the consequences are pretty bad. Thus, we sit quietly and do a "snow burn."

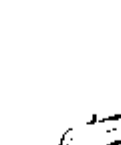

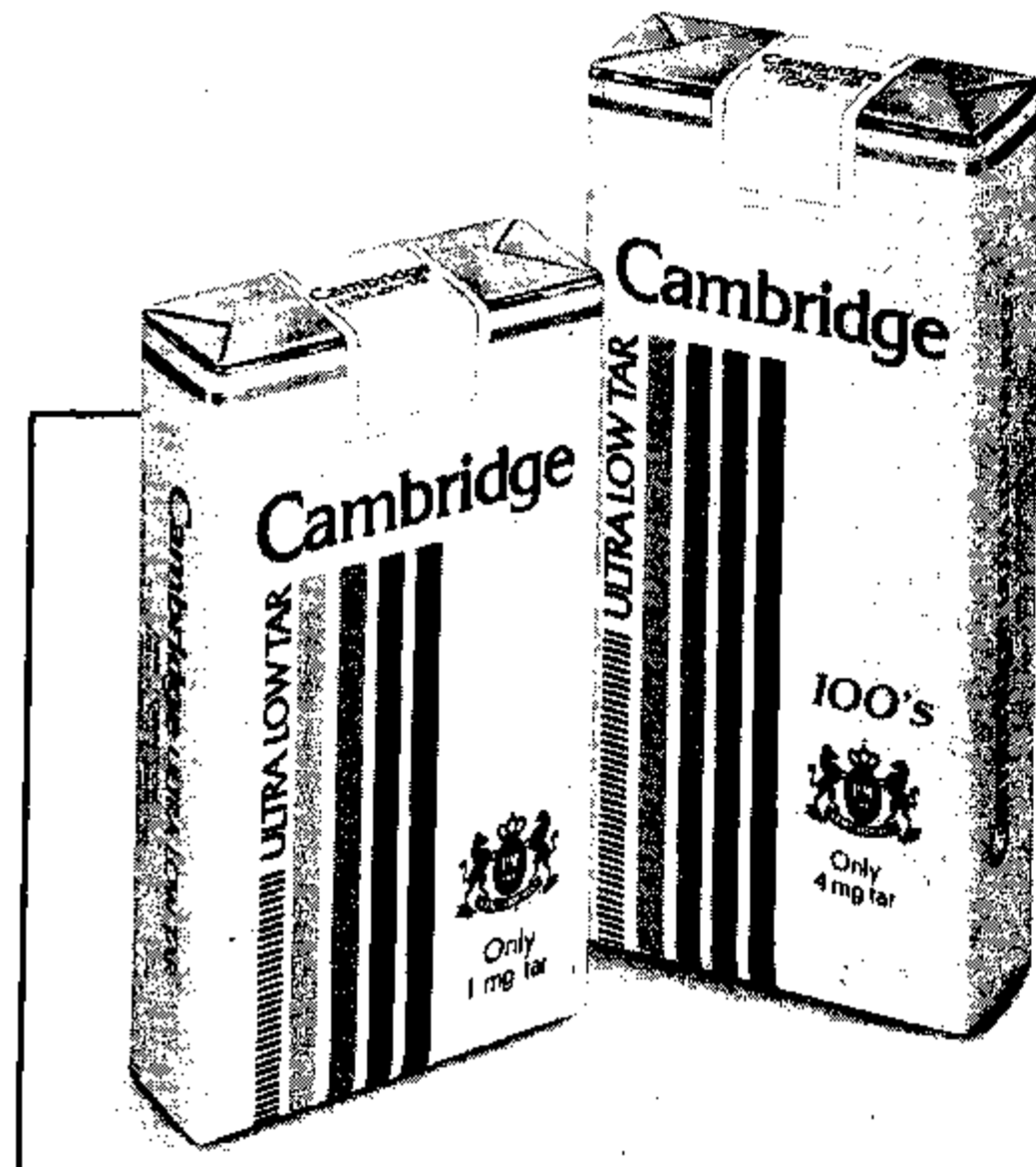
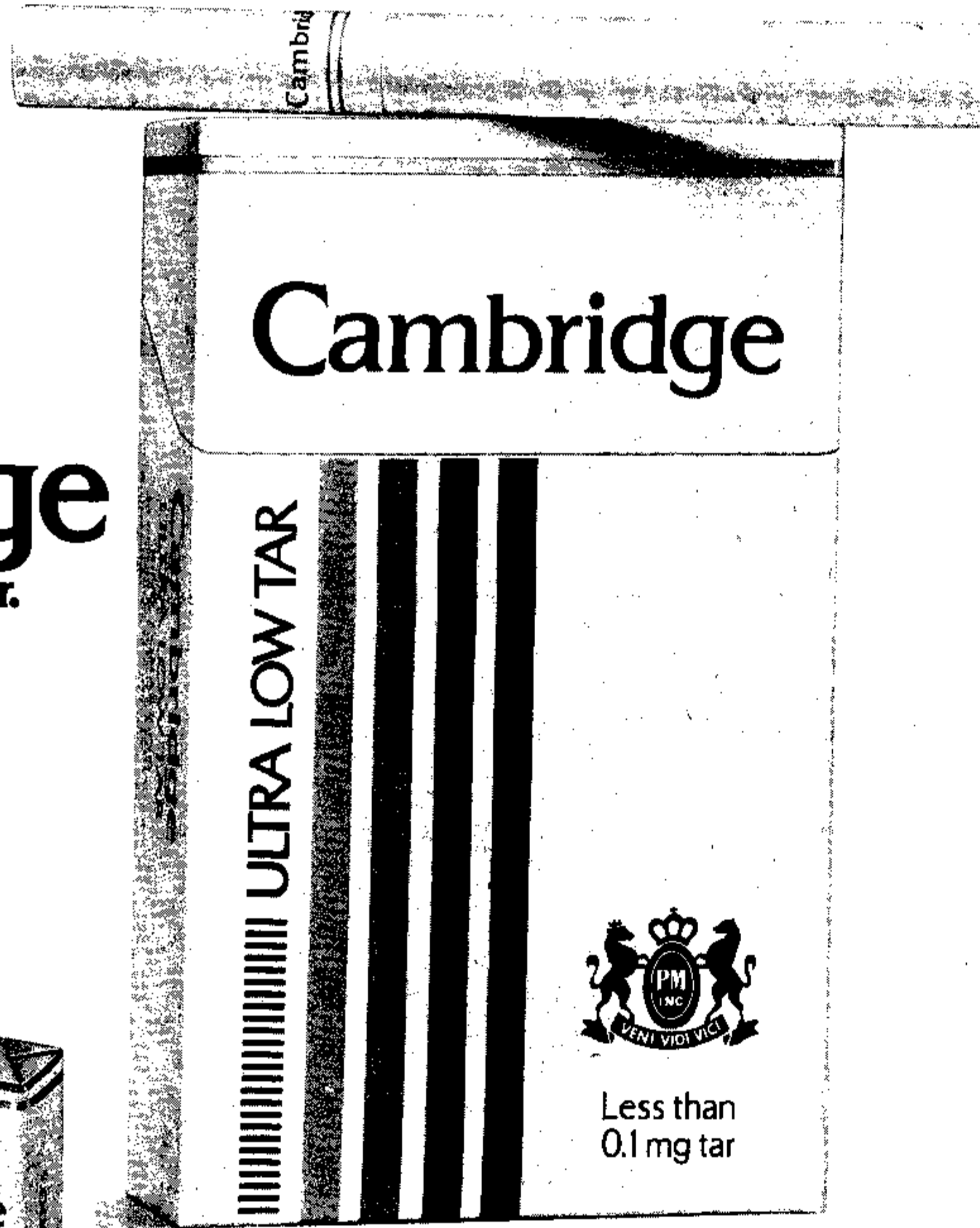

Former prep stars excel for Kane's

Jack Grubb's got nothing on Tom Kane. Grubb, the manager of the local Inter-Lakes Pigtail league entry Cooper, Shifman and Gabe, has assembled some of the best area women's softball talent in recent years. But Kane hasn't done too badly himself.

The manager of Kane's Truck Parts, the first-year bench boss has the following Novit and Walled Lake standouts on his roster: former Wildcat pitching whiz Tracy Sobkow and batterymate Cheryl Sharkey; sluggers Kathy Nar-ducci and Corky Kitzman of Walled Lake Central; and familiar Walled Lake Western names like Brigitte Arens, Cathy Babon, Joann Dinkins and Sue Hoelt.

Unlike Grubb's team, however, Kane's club currently plays in two leagues. And it plays last-pitch ball. "We picked up what Jack (Grubb) didn't have," the enthusiastic pilot said Thursday. "The girls never had a chance to play last-pitch ball in Walled Lake, because nothing had been offered before."

Enter Kane and Assistant Coach Mike Casey. Three years ago, after scouting area high school softball players, they decided to fill the local fast-pitch void. Now they have 16 players — 15 of whom are from the Novit-Walled Lake locale — who are performing well in two leagues.

At this writing, Kane's talented all-star-like ensemble is in first place in a Waterford 18-and-under girls' league. However, more interesting is its performance so far in a highly-competitive Livonia women's circuit.

"We're only 1-3," the rookie mentor noted, "but some of the teams and players in that league. To give you an idea of what we're up against," Kane continued, "I knew of a Plymouth high school softball team that was in the Livonia league and didn't win its first game until it had been playing three years. So when you consider that it took us just three games to win one, that really says something positive about this bunch."

As one might expect, Kane has a few positive things to say about his "bunch" as well. And he says his pitching is tops on the list.

"I'll be honest with you," the manager says unabashedly, "our pitching is fantastic...it's second to none. Anytime you've got Sobkow and (16-year-old sensation) Pam Czach, you're going to make things awfully tough on your opponents. Right now each of them is averaging 10-12 strikeouts a game, and that's in both leagues."

Besides, Kane adds, Sobkow is presently gathering more mound ammunition, according to the manager, the just-graduated Wildcat is starting to add other pitches to complement her fantastic fastball. Czach has done that already, he says.

Kane also claims that his club has arrived defensively. "We've been going through a stretch lately where we've played really strong in the field," he reports. "That just doesn't happen by accident."

In addition to having fun, some of the girls are playing summer ball for other reasons. The manager says that, while players like Sobkow and Sharkey pull over scholarship offers, others — like Czach and his daughter, Renee — "have it in the back of their heads. There's no question that playing softball can open a lot of doors for these and other girls," Kane says. "But for that to happen, you've almost got to live and eat the sport like these girls do. I'd imagine that some of these girls even go to bed with their gloves on." Kane said with a chuckle. "And you can't ask for much more dedication than that."

Sobkow, Czach shine on

Here's what Kane's Truck Parts has been doing recently:

- July 8 — won in Waterford league, 7-0 over Tril and Carmen's. Winning pitcher Tracy Sobkow tossed a three-hitter, striking out 11. Betty Kern powered her way to a four-for-four day for the winners, slugging two home runs and driving in four teammates as Kane's scored three times in the fourth inning, twice in the fifth and added solo tallies in the second and seventh. Corky Kitzman went two-for-four for the homeowners.
- July 10 — lost to the Flyers, 6-4 to fall into second place in the Waterford league. Sobkow started and lost that one, being relieved in the fourth inning while down 6-1. The locals rallied in the

sixth inning when Lori Giorgio led off with a triple, but when Annie Walkers safely laid down a bunt, she tried to score and was thrown out at home. Walkers was then caught off first base. Corky Kitzman was two-for-four with two RBIs for Kane's, while Pam Czach finished with two shutout innings of relief work and registered three strikeouts.

• July 11 — played in Livonia league and was overmatched by the Oaks, 10-0. Czach had nine strikeouts in that one, but the locals garnered only four hits and were never in the game. Kane is currently preparing for an American Softball Association (ASA) tourney this weekend at Bishop Foley High School in Madison Heights.
