City housing starts could hit five year low

Novi in the past five years.

Figures for the first six months of the year show the city issued just 53 residential permits by June 30. That period one year ago.

If builders double that figure and pull 106 permits this year, residential uilding starts would still be 70 fewer than in 1977, which previously was the worst building year for the city over the past five years. Some 178 residential building permits were issued in 1977.

During the past five years housing starts otherwise have hovered around

The recession of 1960 could mean the 250 annually. In 1975 the city issued 232 and July of 1979. At the end of the year slowest residential building year for permits. Some 245 permits were issued in 1976. In 1978 the city granted 279 permits and 256 were issued in 1979.

But it appears unlikely that the number of permits issued this year will compares with 183 issued in the same hit those levels as a result of an all but virtual halt in residential building starts locally.

This year's lack of residential building activity appears to be the continuation of a trend which began when building began to slow down in the middie of the 1979 construction season. The slow down became evident with a midyear decrease in building department revenues which occured between June cur.

Figures show 1980 started out slow and so far has not shown much sign of

Building usually takes off in the spring months. For example, one year ago between February and March the total building permits issued went from 15 to 69. From March to April the number of permits jumped from 69 to 118 and the figures continued to increase until the decline set in during June.

This year the spring rush didn't oc-

the city had issued approximately one month regardless, there were no residential permits issued. Four permits were pulled in February, 28 were issued in March, 10 were issued in April, four in May and seven in June -for a total of 53.

> Despite the length and depth of the building slump, Buiding Official Earl Bailey reports that the figure is "just about what we expected.

He says the low number of housing starts is simply a reflection of the state of the economy. "We have plenty of lots that are

ready to go, but people just can't afford them any more. With so many people out of work and the economy the way it is, they're just not building houses." Economic uncertantles make predic-

tions difficult, but Balley Indicated that the signs are pointing to an improvement in the next six months.

"We are seeing a change now - It

In January, normally a slow building looks like things could be getting better," Balley said.

Novi's chief building official was unwilling to estimate just how much better, and whether the anticipated turn around will be sufficient to push the figures over the 1977 levels.

Bailey's comments are borne out by figures released by the Western Wayne Oakland County Board of Realtors which show that sales were down 28.4 percent from last year during the first quarter of the year. The biggest drop -47.7 percent — occurred during March.

Figures from the board of Realters also shared Bailey's optimism for the

Although the number of sales in June was 23 pecent below the number sold a year ago, the number sold was an improvement over the 50 percent decline which was recorded through March, April and May, the Realtors noted.

Locally, 30 homes have been sold in

the past six months, compared to 48 which were sold in the first six months of 1979. Of the 30 homes sold this year 13 were financed through conventional mortgages, the Realtors report.

The board of Realtor figures show that average home prices in June are up only 3.76 percent from a year ago. Last year at this time prices were rising by 5.2 percent.

The average sale price of homes in Novi now is pegged at \$62,193, they report.

Meanwhile, building officials are keeping up with inspections of developments which got underway before the recession set in. Bailey said.

"Commercial and industrial developments haven't been hit as hard as residential building. We're keeping busy with projects which have been on the books and site plan reviews. Commercial development is keeping us going," said the building official.

Novi population update means increased revenues

More people will mean more money for the City of Novi.

State and federal programs which use population as a part of the formula for determining the amount of money a community will receive will be affected by the census figures.

In fact if the new census figures could have been applied this year the city would have realized a 23 percent increase in state revenue sharing monies, according to Assistant City Manager Alex Allie.

Allie added, however, that the new census figures will not affect the city's budget this year. The latest numbers could be calculated into state formulas be used. effective April 1, 1980, but a movement is afoot in Lansing to delay the effective date six months in order to give communities with declining populations time to adjust to a corresponding loss of revenues. Either way, increased funding will not be seen by the city until

fiscal 1981-82. Funding increases can be expected since Novi's population has increased by more than 123 percent from the 1970

Updated census figures which have been approved by the regional office of the census bureau show there are 22,258 residents in the city.

By the time the district office in Indianapolis approves the figures, an additional 100-200 township residents are expected to have been added to the city's official population count.

generate a windfall, it will mean increases in the amount of revenue the clty receives from state income tax, single business tax, relative tax effort, relative tax burden, sales tax and gas and weight tax returns.

Each of those state programs uses population figures in determining the amount of money each community should receive. Census figures from 1975 which show-

ed 14,385 residents in Novi currently are being plugged into four of those formulas. The gas and weight tax formula does not allow special census figures to

Any projections of how much money could be realized by the city as a result of the census update are strictly hypothetical at this point.

But hypothetically speaking if the new census figures had been used in formulas during the 1979-80 fiscal year, the city's general fund might be \$170,000 richer, according to Allie.

He explained that the city really cannot count on receiving those funds because the latest population figures won't be calculated into the state formula until next year and at this time it is uncertain how much money the state will have available to divide among municipalities.

"We don't know how much money will be available because of our recessionary economy," commented Allie. "Revenues from all the programs

While the population increases won't which use population in the formula are based upon business activity in the state. We can't be sure how much of a ple there will be to divide.

"There are other factors - such as the Tisch amendment - which could atfect the amount of revenues available."

Federal funds will not rise at the same clip that state revenues are expected to increase, Allie said. Federal revenue sharing formulas use data from the Internal Revenue Service. which is fairly up to date, Alile explain-

Novi receives a percentage of the federal taxes that residents of the city have paid to the federal government.

Where the course will have an affect is in verifying the city's position that it is not receiving its fair share of federal funds because of mailing addresses that differ from municipal boundary

"We've argued that Northville is getting our money," Allie said. "We believe a significant number of residents fill out their income tax forms improperly and the census (igures could bear that out.

It is likely that Housing and Cornmunity Development (HCD) Block Grant Funds will not be affected by the

results of the census, Allie said. Under the HCD program eligibility for funds depends in part upon total

Tobacco store ends appeal, paraphernalia ban stands

There will be no further legal time-tested methods of beating the heat durchallenge of Novi's paraphernalia oring the 90-plus degree weather which has dinance from Tobacco Road.

The tobacconist forfeited Its challenge last week in 52nd District Court when it pled "no contest" to charges of committing a violation of the local paraphernalia ban.

In response to the "no contest" plea, Judge Michael Batchik delayed sentencing for six months. If any further violations are issued

against the store in the next six months, the judge could impose a jail sentence. The case will be dismissed if no further violations occur.

Charges against Tobacco Road Clerk Susan L. Burns were dropped by the city so that she would not have a police record, according to City Attorney David Fried. Tobacco Road, instead of the clerk, was then charged with violating the paraphernalia ordinance. The charges stemmed from a July 1979 incident in which the sales clerk was 'charged with selling a "hash pipe" to undercover Novi police officers.

Batchick had earlier ruled that the case should go to trial to determine whether a violation of the paraphernalla ordinance had been committed.

In that decision he upheld the constitutionality of the ordinance after dimissing arguments from the store's attorneys that the violation should be thrown out because of the ordinance's

vagueness. Selling and distributing "drug related" paraphernalia is prohibited by the local ordinance. Specifically, the ordinance bans the sale or display of hypodermic needles, cocaine spoons.

capsules, which are cited as examples of paraphernalia. Conviction of selling, displaying or giving away such equipment can result in a 90 day jail sentence or a fine of up to \$500.

In June legal counsel for Tobacco Road indicated a federal court appeal through the U.S. Circuit court had been dropped, but an appeal of Batchik's decision and the constitutionality of the ordinance through the state court was planned.

But Michael Stellani, legal counsel for Tobacco Road, said his client no longer is interested in testing the ordinance.

He said that the fact Tobacco Road was no longer in business in Novi prompted the decision to drop the case. The expense of litigation and the fact

that the constitutionality of ordinances , patterned after the Novi ordinance and adopted by other communities are being contested in U.S. District Courtaiso led to the decision to cease further appeals, he said. A paraphernalia ban in Livonia currently is being challenged.

"The citizens of Novi are left with an unfair, unconstitutional ordinance on their books, until someone else challenges this. But the citizens can rest assured that until that challenge is made my clients will not push pipes in their community," Steffani said satirically.

He went on to say he believed the unconstitutionality of the ordinance was demonstrated by U.S. District Court Judge Anna Diggs Taylor's decision against an identical ordinance in Fern-

Steffani also praised City Attorney David Fried. "Had it not been for his

excellent arguments, the ordinance would have been thrown out," Steffani claimed. Additionally, the legal counsel for the tobacco store said that the case was tried improperly when heard in U.S. District Court, but that another attorney was handling the case at that

Action In 52nd District Court last week ends a year-long battle against the paraphernalia ban which began almost as soon as the ordinance was enacted in February of 1979,

Court proceedings surrounding the ordinance ensued as follows:

 April 1979: After being in business in the Novi-Ten Plaza for one week, Tobacco Road filed suit in U.S. District Court challenging the constitutionality of the ordinance. The company argued the ordinance violated the first, fifth, fourteenth, and eighth amendments to

A merit plan designed to build a system of accountability for administrative officers and department heads within Novi's city administration has been presented to the city council.

Assistant City Manager Alex Allie told the council that the plan, when it has been completed, should "enable personnel to get in front of a problem instead of reacting to problems and fighting

Eventually, the merit system will include a

benefit package, job descriptions, departmental goals and objectives, minimum qualifications for positions and a salary schedule, he indicated. Adoption of a merit system will make official the city's current system of setting salaries, benefits and conditions of employment. Actually the merit system is a formalization of current procedures, Allie explained.

The system is designed to refine the organization, define the responsibilities for administrators and establish job descriptions.

When the plan has been completed it will provide, through city ordinance, a system for dealing with non-union personnel. The system calls for salaries to be determined by the city manager with approval of the council, institution of the plan is

Positions also are to be filled through competitive examination whenever possible.

The evaluation of departmental and administrative operations may include an examinaton of past budgets and spending plans. Ad_ ministrators also will be judged on the delivery of new or improved services to the public, cost reductions based on reorganization and realignment of services, maintenance of departmental capital and response to service requests and problems of the



The Southfield-based company, which was incorporated in February of this year, has a purchase agreement to acquire the property from the C&O Rallway Company, ac-

cording to Turner. U.S. Ethanol Vice President Clifford Stimson told the Wixom City Council April 8 that Wixom is the company's first choice for an ethanol refinery for several reasons, although he added that alternate sites are under consideration. Stimson said the Wixom site already is zoned for industrial use and its accessibility to rathroad lines is a critical factor in terms of obtaining raw materials and shipping the finished pro-duct to major refinerles in the downriver area.

Residential zoning retained at 14-Haggerty voting 4-3 on March 24 to place a multiple— it was not in compliance with the township's

Mile/Haggerty Road Intersection will retain a single family residential orientation — at least for the time being.

The West Bloomfield Township board last week turned down a request from Robert and Richard Rosin to rezone the northeast quadrant of the intersection to permit construction of a 13-acre convenience shopping center and another 42 acres of multiplefamily bousing.

The Fourteen Mile/Haggerty Road intersection is somewhat unique in that it is the boundary between four different communitles: Novi, Commerce Township, West

Bloomfield Township and Farmington Hills. A large comparison shopping center -Commerce Central - has been proposed for construction on the Commerce Township (northwest) quadrant of the intersection. Novi officials struggled with the question of what zoning designation to place on the southwest quadrant of the intersection before (amily residential designation on the majority of the corner parcel.

Novi officials also decided to place a B-3 (commercial) designation immediately on the corner to accommodate an existing gas station. Additionally, they decided to establish an "office" zoning designation around the existing gas station to discourage the possibility of expansion of the commercial district and provide a buffer between the gas station and the multiples.

The request from Robert and Richard Rosin had been recommended for approval by the West Bloomfield planning commission against the advice of its consultants from

The Vilican-Leman firm also serves as planning consultants to the City of Novi. Support for the rezoning request in West Bloomfield was expressed by Trustees Weldon Yeager and Raymond Holland. Clerk Betty Sue Dupree voted against the rezoning request, however, commenting that

board that it was "giving away tax base to another community. Zoning is to determine land use," said the trustee. "You're saying you want to leave it vacant." Trustee Dennis Vatsis suggested that office zoning would be more suitable on the West Bloomfield corner, adding that another commercial area would hurt existing township shopping facilities.

The public hearing is slated for 7:30 p.m. in the Novi Public Library. The impetus for considering the rezoning of the property to a single family designation was provided by Gary Phillips at a recent city council meeting. Phillips told the council in June that he

has purchased an existing single family residence on Walled Lake and is concerned that an adjacent parcel may be sold and developed with multiples. City Planning Consultant Charles Cairris has confirmed that the 3.5 acre parcel has been sold and the new owners are presently preparing a site plan for a condominium project. The 3.5 acre parcel could generate a total of 28

condominiums, according to the planning consultant. The same parcel would generate a total of approximately 4-6 single family residences. The 3.5 acre parcel is included in the 57 acres to be considered for rezoning to a single family

At this point, there seems to be at least some support among planning board members to retain the multiple-family designation on the property. Planner Paul Mastrangel said at the June 18 planning board meeting that many of the "apprehended" fears about multiple family develop-

ment are no longer valid. He argued that many people in contemporary society prefer to live in multiples instead of single family residences because of changing lifestyles. Mastrangel also maintained that new planning concepts have led to development of multiple complexes which are just as nice, if not nicer, than single family residences.



Progress is slow on regional board

Last week the chief U.S. District Court judge proposed that the suburbs be allowed at least to nominate members of the Detroit Water Board.

As presiding judge in the case of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency vs. Detroit, · Feikins has moved over the years to force the city — whose system serves 100 communities (including Novi) with water and 70 with sewage treatment -- to clean up its sewer plant.

At first, it seemed to the judge to be a case of upgrading the equipment and operating things better. He was unable to put his finger on the real sore spot - that Detroit alone lacks the management and labor skills to set things right; and that a regional service requires a regional governing board and regional labor force.

Feikins's first step was to appoint Detroit Mayor Coleman Young as a special administrator with wide powers to straighten out the operation. It was, as many observers have wryly noted, like appointing the fox to guard the chicken coop.

The Detroit Water Board consists of seven members, all appointed by the mayor. Unlike members of your local planning commission, water board members lack a fixed guaranteed term of office. They may be removed by the mayor at will.

such as Wixom, would be hard-pressed to maintain current 🥷



Novi board reviews investment policy

It soon may be possible for the Novi Schools to invest 100 percent of its general fund in commercial paper providing the school board approves the action. A plan which would enable the schools to

invest in the short term negotlable notes Acting Superintendent William Barr told

the board that the current policy of the district caps investment of the general fund in commercial paper at \$500,000. He explained the investment of general funds is allowable under state legislation. Schools are permitted to invest debt retiretificates of deposits, and commercial paper which has a prime rating at the time of purchase and matures not more than 270 days after purchase. Barr described the proposed policy as a

way to increase investment flexibility. But some board members expressed "Is it wise to invest the general fund to that extent in commercial paper?" asked

Trustee Ruth Waldenmayer. "Commercial paper has good interest rates, but they're all shaky," agreed Trustee Robert Schram.

"There is no question that commercial paper is more volatile than certificates of deposit, but we invest only in prime





I saw a fleet of fishing boats... I flew down almost touching the craft and yelled at them, asking if I was on the right road to Ireland.

They just stared. Maybe they didn't hear me. Maybe I didn't hear them or maybe they thought I was just a crazy fool. An hour later I saw land.

As the plane slowly moves down the runway, the pilot glances at the instrument panel. Everything appears to be in order -airspeed indicator, altimeter, and radio all are working fine. Rolling down the window, the pilot looks down the runway and shouts,

With no one in its path, the small, one engine plane begins to pick up speed. The only sounds heard are those of the spinning prooeller and humming engine as the plane lifts off the ground. And within only a few minutes, "the great flying machine" is souring through the blue sky.
