#### Who's hunting who?

Hunting season is upon us - and with it comes the first reported accidental shooting of the season. This is the story of two hunters — one

from South Lyon and one from Stockbridge — and a woodchuck.

Out hunting recently in a field on the south-east corner of Ten Mile and Napier, the hunters were just minding their own business when they encountered big game in the brush: a ferocious woodchuck.

Apparently the appearance of the hunters startled the woodchuck because it ran up and took a bite out of the Stockbridge man's foot.

To fend off the vicious animal, he

began kicking at it. His efforts, however, proved to be in vain. The woodchuck would not let go of its prey.

Rushing to the rescue of his friend, the man from South Lyon aimed his gun at the woodchuck, which was still clinging to the leg of the man under

But in the midst of all that biting, kicking and flying fur, the poor guy's foot came into the line of fire,

The man lost two toes as a result of the accidental shooting. He was taken to a neighboring hospital for treatment.

There was no word on the condition of the woodchuck, Novi police report.

## Police take suspects in bogus check ring

The suspected ring leader and another member of a fraudulent traveler's check ring, which was cracked by Novi police in cooperation with police departments across the

country, have been taken into custody. Robert Lipscomb, 59, and Walter Lee Jones, 35, both of Detroit were arrested by a Washtenaw County Sheriff's deputy after passing an allegedly phony traveler's check at a gas station on I-94 just west of Ann Arbor.

A gas station attendant became suspicious of the United American Traveler's check and called the police. The attendant's description of the two men who had passed the check enabled Washtenaw County to intercept them.

Reportedly, a briefcase containing \$250,000 worth of traveler's checks were found in the car.

Novi Detective Jack Grubb reported Monday that police were obtaining warrants for Lipscomb's arrest for parole violation when he was apprehended in Washtenaw County last

Police suspect Lipscomb originated the traveler's check scam.

Although the men allegedly gave police aliases when arrested, they eventually were traced to an address in Ecorse where police found a printing press and an estimated \$5 million in traveler's checks.

Police also recovered 67 printing blocks used to turn out the bogus

Warrants are currently being sought for the search of a second location.

Both men were arraigned Friday in Washtenaw County District Court. Lipscomb was charged with one count of uttering and publishing and possession of counterfeit notes. Bond was set at \$500,000.

Charges for uttering and publishing were leveled against Jones and his bond

was placed at \$100,000. Both are scheduled to face preliminary examination Tuesday before District Court Judge Kenneth

It is believed the men are connected with a ring which has passed the bogus checks in at least 13 states, according to

Checks have turned up in Alabama, Colorado, Florida, Hawaii, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan. Mississippi, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas.

As a result of the investigation headed by Grubb, Novi police believe they were the first police department to obtain information which could prove the yellow America Expess Company issued by the Belize-Zurich Exchange checks are fraudulent.

Careful examination of the checks uncovered a number of irregularities, including seven-digit account number instead of the legitimate nine digits. Conflicting data regarding reimbursement of the checks on their face was also evident.

Previously, Grubb described the workings of the fraudulent check ring. Down-and-outers, such as alcoholics pass the checks, Grubb explained. They were promised the scam was "foolproof" and shown newspaper clippings and other documentation that charges against them would be dropped if caught by police.

Grubb said the volunteers were given out-of-state identificatin and taken to another state where they passed the

bogus traveler's checks. They were allowed to keep 30 percent of the change received after cashing a check and 30 percent of the

merchandise purchased. A recruiter received 20 percent of the profits, while two ring leaders received-

the remaining 50 percent. In Michigan the ring first struck. Briarwood Mall in Ann Arbor. Novi' police became involved in the case

## Novi Schools experience slight enrollment increase

the Novi Schools has increased making the district once again the only one in Oakland County to show a growth in enrollment.

Tentative figures from the official Fourth Friday counts place the school district's enrollment at 3.187. representing a 1.4 percent increase over counts taken at the same time last

The 1980-81 school year enrollment figure is up by 44 students over the enrollment one year ago and is 12 more students than were enrolled at the end of last year.

Increases bringing the count up over figures from the first week of school and last year's enrollment were recorded at Novi High School and both

middle schools. "We're satisfied with the figures in terms of the fact our projections were within close proximity and from the standpoint of staffing," Superintendent Robert Piwko said.

He noted that the district's staffing needs are based on projected student enrollment projections.

Since the figures were close to the projections of 3,200 students, it appears there will be a minimum of staff adjustments necessary, Piwko said.

At this time on the only staff adjustment which will be requested is a half-time music instructor for the middle school who is needed to reduce class sizes and keep them within the contract range, Piwko said.

Early indications, based upon enrollment counts taken the first week of school, showed that for the first time in 10 years, enrollment could have been down from where it was at the end of the last school year.

But Piwko explained that as schedules in the secondary schools are adjusted, students return from vacation and students move into the district, the enrollment shot back up.

The Fourth Friday count is not as critical for Novi Schools as it is for some school districts where enrollment translates into state aid. Novi Schools receive some state aid for specific programs, but more than 90 percent of

Despite gloomy indications during the first week of school, enrollment in be as accurate as posible in making property taxes. Because of the property taxes. Because of the district's enrollment and tax base, Novi Schools are not eligible for state aid on a per pupil basis — a situation school officials describe as "out of formula."

> Since the Fourth Friday count indicates growth and is necessary for determing staffing, however, the student enrollment is closely monitored. Piwko said.

He indicated that overall the district is pleased with this year's figures.

School-by-school enrollment breaks down as follows: Novi Woods Elementary, 361;

Village Oaks, 348;

• Middle School South, 527; and Novi High School, 977. Additionally, the district may pick-up

students throughout the school year. Usually, enrollment has increased as the year progresses. For example, in the last school year 3,144 students began school year, while 3,175 were enrolled at the final count taken in

#### Novi charter changes approved

Proposed amendments to the Novi City Charter should get on the ballot without a hitch, following action by the Michigan Attorney General's office

City officials have received notice that, after reviewing the proposed amendments, the Attorney General's office has ruled the amendments conform with state law regulating the authorities of home rule cities.

The opinion is to be forwarded to the governor's office, which will issue a statement much to the same effect, according to City Clerk Geraldine

Review of the amendment is required by state

law and is routine. Had the attorney general's office ruled the amendments did not conform with state laws, the amendments still would have gone on the ballot: however, the review allows communities to warn voters if they are being asked to enact unconstitutional legislation into a charter.

If approved, the proposed amendments to the Novi City Charter would remove the city council's authority to establish special assessment districts to fund improvements on major and residential

Under the current charter, council members are allowed to determine whether residents living next to a road improvement project - such as paving or resurfacing - will get a special benefit from completion of that project. Those deemed to be receiving special benefits

are required to pay a special assessment. New language prohibiting such action would be added to the charter if the proposed amendments are accepted by the voters. Specifically, voters will be asked to consider the

following language:
"Those roads, maintained by the city, which have heretofore been designated as...county thorofares...shall be improved without specially assessing any costs thereof to the residential property owner thereto;" which applies to major roads, such as mile roads, maintained by the city;

"Those paved roads which have been accepted by the city and are maintained by the city and and have been reported to and approved by the Michigan Department of State Highway for the purpose of Act 51 as amended, shall be maintained. repaired and improved without special assessing any cost thereof to the residential property adjacent thereto," which applies to maintenance of

Novi receives Act 51 monies — which are state funds collected through gasoline taxes and revert to the local municipality based upon the community's population and the number of miles of major and local roads.

Former council member Donald Young, Jr., 43775 Nine Mile, has promoted the charter amendments in an attempt to reverse the city's practice of levying special assessments for mile road and subdivisions street assessments against abutting property owners. According to current policies, property owners

adjacent to road improvement projects pay a

percentage of the construction costs, while a tax against the city at large pays the remainder. Young maintains abutting property owners bear the burden for projects that benefit the community in general as a result of the city's policy. He also believes the city is not properly planning the expenditure of monies it receives for road maintenance and improvements.



Council unanimously approved a nine percent plus \$100 hike for the officers at the September 16 meeting. Supervisory officers were granted the increase because they were omitted from the recently ratified AFSCME Local 3075 contract. Police and firefighters received a nine percent hike in that agreement.

It was originally proposed that the officers receive 9.5 percent increases, but council members protested that such an increase would bring the salaries close to department supervisor level. The department supervisor, Police Chief Wilford Hook, reportedly received a 10 percent jump for the year. But LaMarca argued that the salary differential between officers and department supervisors was

too great to keep salaries close. The mayor told council that since officers make only \$19,000, as compared to the department heads' \$29,000, the percentage increase would still not put them in a close range to each other. Cote said he expected few problems in arriving at an agreement between the two sides.

## It doesn't pay to fight city hall

It had all the appearance of a big government stomping the little citizen, when Walled Lake forged ahead on its Sims Park

A small town resident asking the city officials to give him a little peace and quiet — consider the constituents. The city listening, relenting and then deciding to go ahead anyway despite legal threats. All the elements were present.

How could Walled Lake act without appearing as the villain in an old west showdown?

The steps were taken by the council on eggshell roads that led to constituent concern over denial of what appeared to be a citizen's reasonable request. But was it?

All Joseph Zaborowski was asking City Council to do was move the project back an extra hundred feet or so. But somewhere along the way Zaborowski stopped saying please and started saying do it or I'll see you in court.

Council refused to bend this time and rightfully so. Precedent was key in its decision not to side with Zaborowski, thus pursuing the project rather than spend thousands of dollars.

It had finally come down to me taxpayers' money, which had been wisely planned for use versus a single taxpayer's 11th hour involvement. Council retained an important

court ruling, acting at its own impetus, could have endangered future problems and left a blanket of uncertainty over citizen spending. Surely, a precedent supporting a single citizen's action, disavowing his previous inaction of following determined steps, would have left council in an uncomfortable situation on future funding

Still, council has not acted without sensitivity. Council was willing to give a little. Numerous sound buffers were suggested as solution to the problem. But in the end, the court decided attorneys for both sides should talk and construction could continue certainly, a positive vote in the city's favor.

This does not mean that council will always be right standing up against its citizens. And this incident cannot be considered indicative of an overall regard for citizens that council has.

But it does leave an interesting afterthought to the old adage: You can't fight city hall.

That is — You can't fight city hall without fighting thousands of others paying taxes just like you.



"If they hire people before the fiscal year, if they hire prior to October 1, we'll guarantee to cover those costs," he continued. "If they hire after October 1, we'll only cover costs of money that comes in. That will be retroactive if enough comes n; otherwise they're gambling on their own. "It's a difficult time because we don't have a real

Mayor Gaspare LaMarca verified the city had been promised two months of funding for police dispatchers hired prior to today. And Corporal Roger Cote, the city's contact person with CETA, said Walled Lake would "be in good shape" if it could acquire people to fill

Cote said, the additional number of dispatchers eligible. CETA now has a mandatory four-week workshop, which applicants for dispatch positions

dispatching positions prior to October 1.

Walled Lake City Council approved a temporary transfer of funds to cover expected CETA fund losses. About \$35,000 was to be removed from the major road construction fund financed by citizens' taxes, to cover expenses for three civilian dispatchers. The city's emergency radio office had been operated by three CETA dispatchers with firefighters covering the remaining shifts. Funds were to be replaced in the road construction account following receipt of an expected federal road grant. LaMarca told council

he expected that grant money in either October or That grant has not yet gone through all channels

But LaMarca said, he anticipated the city would come to a more fully-manned dispatch operation by the city's hiring the civilian radio operators and gaining additional CETA dispatchers. The receipt of the CETA funds will probably not be greeted without a battle for return of major road funds to the city coffers and retention of Walled Lake's previous level of dispatchers. Council Member Heather Hill, who reluctantly

supported the funds transfer, said, "I will guarantee I will be questioning it." Hill added that the only reason she approved the action was because of the possibility of Walled Lake existing without dispatchers had the CETA

funding been lost as anticipated. The current level of dispatchers was satisfactory, Hill said, adding that Walled Lake is not yet large enough to require seven radio

Another dispute involving dispatchers has arisen because no one is sure which union they should Police Chief Wilford Hook said, he thought the

dispatchers did not belong in the police union. LaMarca has said that placement in the city's clerical union might be more appropriate. Hook added the decision would remain with those

Past dispatchers have become members of the American Federation of State County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) Local 3075, supposedly to receive benefits. But Hook said they would receive those benefits regardless because of the CETA regulations.

## Western QB Generous • leads win over Canton

Chuck Apap must have thought he was on The Head Football Coach at Walled Lake Western watched his club excel both offensively and defensively Friday night as the Warriors made it 2-0 in Western Six Conference play with a 28-22 victory over Plymouth Canton. And it really wasn't

The Warriors utilized the halftime break to make the proper defensive adjustments, according to Apap, and they must have worked. Led by linebacker Randy Shell (six first hits and five assists for the evening) and defensive safety Frank Tozzi, the hometowners stymied Canton while putting the contest out of reach.

The statistics confirm Western's dominance. The Warriors' 229-yard ground total easily outdistanced the 150 Canton figure (based on 30 tries), and the Warriors came up with 11 first downs to seven for the visitors. Canton did outgain Western in aerial yards by a

61-47 count, but the Warriors hit on four of seven passes. The Chiefs connected on three of six. Perhaps as important as any stat, though, was the fact that while Canton fumbled three times (getting two back), Western committed just one bobble. The Warriors made more turnovers than Pepperidge Farms early in the season, literally kicking away a game to Waterford Township in the

Also encouraging is the fact that Western's injury situation, while still a matter of concern, is improving.
