## Who's hunting who?

Hunting season is upon us — and with it comes the first reported accidental shooting of the season.

This is the story of two hunters — one from South Lyon and one from Stockbridge — and a woodchuck.

Out hunting recently in a field on the south-east corner of Ten Mile and Napier, the hunters were just minding their own business when they encountered big game in the brush: a ferocious woodchuck.

Apparently the appearance of the hunters startled the woodchuck because it ran up and took a bite out of the Stockbridge man's foot.

To fend off the vicious animal, he

began kicking at it. His efforts, however, proved to be in vain. The woodchuck would not let go of its prey.

Rushing to the rescue of his friend, the man from South Lyon aimed his gun at the woodchuck, which was still clinging to the leg of the man under attack.

But in the midst of all that biting, kicking and flying fur, the poor guy's foot came into the line of fire.

The man lost two toes as a result of the accidental shooting. He was taken to a neighboring hospital for treatment.

There was no word on the condition of the woodchuck, Novi police report.

## Police take suspects in bogus check ring

The suspected ring leader and another member of a fraudulent traveler's check ring, which was cracked by Novi police in cooperation with police departments across the country, have been taken into custody.

Robert Lipscomb, 59, and Walter Lee Jones, 35, both of Detroit were arrested by a Washtenaw County Sheriff's deputy after passing an allegedly phony traveler's check at a gas station on I-94 just west of Ann Arbor.

A gas station attendant became suspicious of the United American Traveler's check and called the police. The attendant's description of the two men who had passed the check enabled Washtenaw County to intercept them.

Reportedly, a briefcase containing \$250,000 worth of traveler's checks were found in the car.

Novi Detective Jack Grubb reported Monday that police were obtaining warrants for Lipscomb's arrest for parole violation when he was apprehended in Washtenaw County last week.

Police suspect Lipscomb originated the traveler's check scam.

Although the men allegedly gave police aliases when arrested, they eventually were traced to an address in Ecorse where police found a printing press and an estimated \$5 million in traveler's checks.

Police also recovered 67 printing blocks used to turn out the bogus checks.

Warrants are currently being sought for the search of a second location.

Both men were arraigned Friday in Washtenaw County District Court. Lipscomb was charged with one count of uttering and publishing and possession of counterfeit notes. Bond was set at \$500,000.

Charges for uttering and publishing were leveled against Jones and his bond was placed at \$100,000.

Both are scheduled to face preliminary examination Tuesday before District Court Judge Kenneth Bronson.

It is believed the men are connected with a ring which has passed the bogus checks in at least 13 states, according to Grubb.

Checks have turned up in Alabama, Colorado, Florida, Hawaii, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas.

As a result of the investigation headed by Grubb, Novi police believe they were the first police department to obtain information which could prove the yellow America Express Company issued by the Belize-Zurich Exchange checks are fraudulent.

Careful examination of the checks uncovered a number of irregularities, including seven-digit account number instead of the legitimate nine digits. Conflicting data regarding reimbursement of the checks on their face was also evident.

Previously, Grubb described the workings of the fraudulent check ring.

Down-and-outers, such as alcoholics or welfare recipients, were recruited to

pass the checks, Grubb explained. They were promised the scam was "foolproof" and shown newspaper clippings and other documentation that charges against them would be dropped if caught by police.

Grubb said the volunteers were given out-of-state identification and taken to another state where they passed the bogus traveler's checks.

They were allowed to keep 30 percent of the change received after cashing a check and 30 percent of the merchandise purchased.

A recruiter received 20 percent of the profits, while two ring leaders received the remaining 50 percent.

In Michigan the ring first struck Briarwood Mall in Ann Arbor. Novi police became involved in the case after 18 of the checks were passed in Twelve Oaks Mall in May.

Members of the ring allegedly have passed three variations of the checks, including those bearing the name America Express Company, United American Express of Vancouver and United America Express.

Grubb was able to obtain a letter from George Fitch, Central American Counsel for Commercial Affairs which stated the country had no record of the Belize Zurich Exchange Company which was supposed to be redeem the yellow America Express Company traveler's checks.

Based upon earlier information police were able to obtain 15 felony warrants against various members of the ring earlier this year.

## Novi Schools experience slight enrollment increase

Despite gloomy indications during the first week of school, enrollment in the Novi Schools has increased — making the district once again the only one in Oakland County to show a growth in enrollment.

Tentative figures from the official Fourth Friday counts place the school district's enrollment at 3,187, representing a 1.4 percent increase over counts taken at the same time last year.

The 1980-81 school year enrollment figure is up by 44 students over the enrollment one year ago and is 12 more students than were enrolled at the end of last year.

Increases bringing the count up over figures from the first week of school and last year's enrollment were recorded at Novi High School and both middle schools.

"We're satisfied with the figures in terms of the fact our projections were within close proximity and from the standpoint of staffing," Superintendent Robert Piwko said.

He noted that the district's staffing needs are based on projected student

population so the administration tries to be as accurate as possible in making enrollment projections.

Since the figures were close to the projections of 3,200 students, it appears there will be a minimum of staff adjustments necessary, Piwko said.

At this time on the only staff adjustment which will be requested is a half-time music instructor for the middle school who is needed to reduce class sizes and keep them within the contract range, Piwko said.

Early indications, based upon enrollment counts taken the first week of school, showed that for the first time in 10 years, enrollment could have been down from where it was at the end of the last school year.

But Piwko explained that as schedules in the secondary schools are adjusted, students return from vacation and students move into the district, the enrollment shot back up.

The Fourth Friday count is not as critical for Novi Schools as it is for some school districts where enrollment translates into state aid. Novi Schools receive some state aid for specific programs, but more than 90 percent of

the district's revenues come from local property taxes. Because of the district's enrollment and tax base, Novi Schools are not eligible for state aid on a per pupil basis — a situation school officials describe as "out of formula."

Since the Fourth Friday count indicates growth and is necessary for determining staffing, however, the student enrollment is closely monitored, Piwko said.

He indicated that overall the district is pleased with this year's figures.

School-by-school enrollment breaks down as follows:

- Novi Woods Elementary, 361;
- Village Oaks, 348;
- Orchard Hills, 387;
- Middle School North, 582;
- Middle School South, 527; and
- Novi High School, 977.

Additionally, the district may pick-up students throughout the school year. Usually, enrollment has increased as the year progresses. For example, in the last school year 3,144 students began school year, while 3,175 were enrolled at the final count taken in April.

## The Shoe Tree: Residents report shoes of all kinds hang in its branches

There are shoe trees where one puts one's shoes before retiring for the evening — and then there is the shoe tree on Nine Mile in Novi.

Nearly 20 pairs of tennis shoes dangle by shoe strings from various branches of the tree.

There are big and little shoes, old and new shoes, but nobody seems to know whose shoes.

Residents along Nine Mile are mystified by the unexpected appearances and disappearances of the shoes.

No one can tell where the shoes come from, when they are tied to the tree or how they are hung from the branches. Not even the investigative efforts of Police Chief Lee BeGole could uncover the secret of the shoes' origins.

Charmaigne Gladden of 50883 Nine Mile says residents first noticed the shoes in the tree nearly three years ago.

"It's a mystery to everyone on Nine Mile. We've never seen anyone put the shoes up or take them down. We don't know who or when — except that it happens sometime in the night," Gladden says.

Apparently, the shoe-hangers wait until it is dark before going about their

work.

"We've considered waiting out there to catch them some night, but you never know which night they're going to be at work," Gladden says.

She reports that the shoes come in all sizes and styles, but mostly tennis shoes hang from the tree.

The number of shoes tied to the tree also varies from time to time.

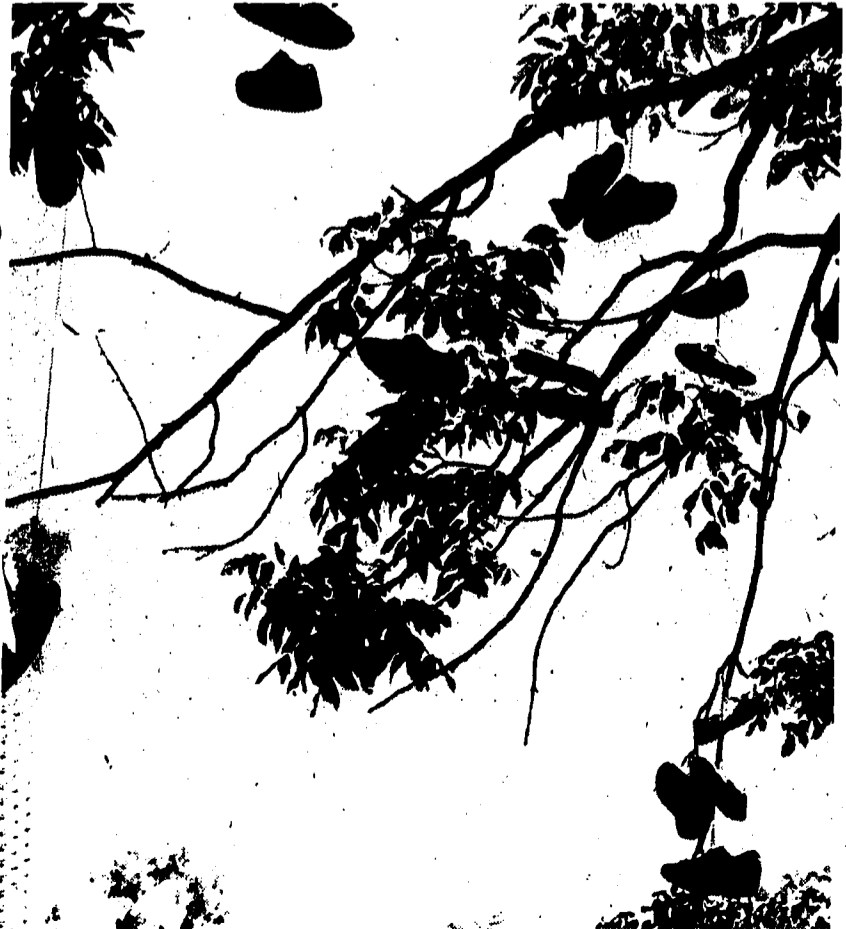
"One time you'll go past there and a whole lot will be up there and another time there will be only a few pairs. I think people trade their shoes sometimes," Gladden says.

Probably the most unusual mystery involving the shoe tree happened this summer. Someone removed all the shoes and left them scattered on the ground.

Residents are not sure exactly how the shoe-hangers are able to reach the branches either.

"They must put a ladder up against the tree. But the branches are wispy, not heavy branches. They don't look strong enough to hold a ladder. Maybe they put a ladder in a pick-up," Gladden speculates.

"It's a lot of fun for everyone in the neighborhood," Gladden says. "Whoever they are, they're doing a fun thing — very secretively."

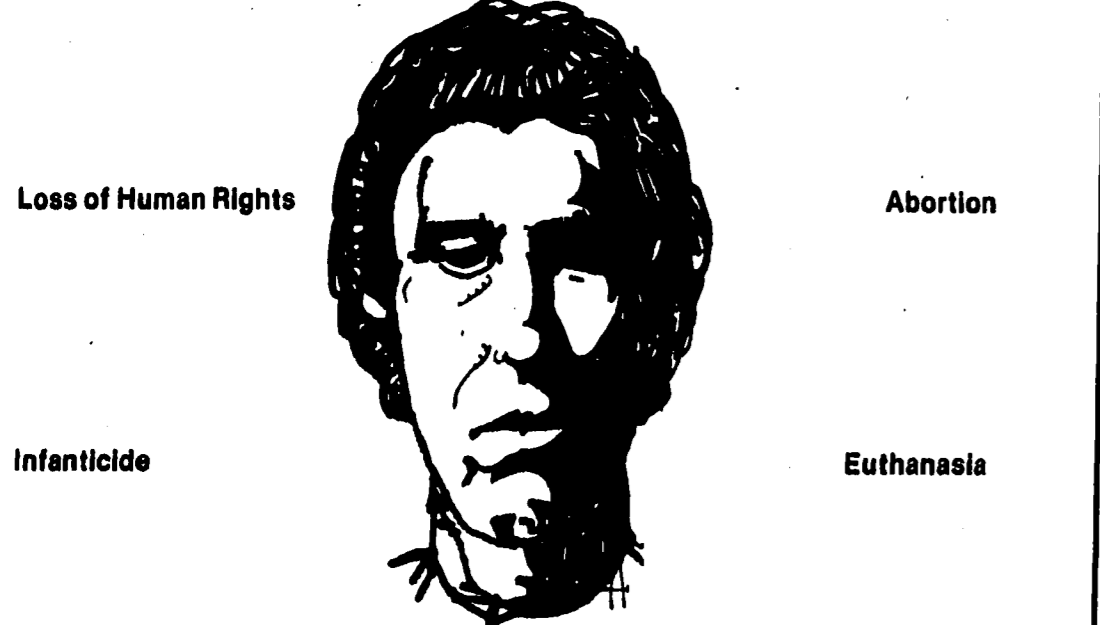

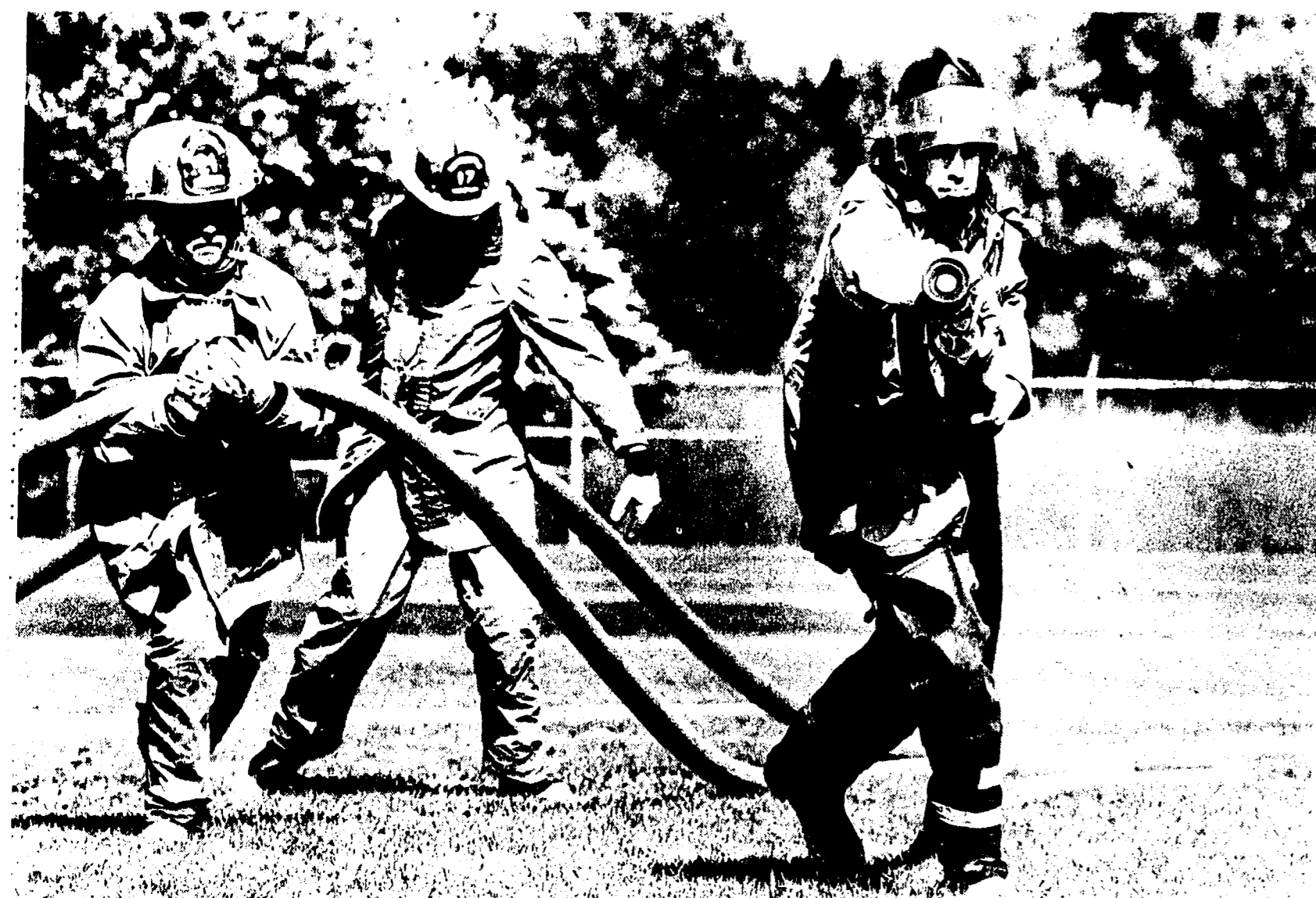

When added to the 870 memberships anticipated in the adult education program, the Walled Lake Schools are anticipating an official Fourth Friday enrollment count of 10,546.

Walled Lake gets CETA aid for fall

Employees hired by Walled Lake for CETA (Comprehensive Employment Act) programs will be at the city's own financial risk following a deadline expiring last night.

According to Oakland County Coordinator of Public Service Employment Gary Danielson, CETA's fiscal year begins October 1, but approval of program monies had not yet cleared congressional levels. It appeared unlikely to gain approval until November or December, Danielson said.

Municipalities had been sent letters advising them that individuals employed prior to the October 1 deadline would be guaranteed as covered by CETA funds. Danielson added that CETA would request a loan for any employees prior to that date and cover them through the congressional deadline.

Novi agrees to continue fire protection for township

Novi will extend fire protection to Brookland Farms the one subdivision that comprises Novi Township — for \$4,800 under terms of a contract recently approved by the city council.

The \$4,800 fee was determined by multiplying the township's most current State Equalized Valuation by the figure of two mills.

City Manager Ed Kriewall recommended that after discussing the contract with Township Supervisor Leo Kalotta, he determined it was "not unreasonable" to continue protection of the township for approximately two mills.

considered some administrative costs in arriving at the two mill fee. He noted that according to administrative figures, 1.28 mills would be adequate to cover the costs directly related to providing fire protection.

"My analysis of the figures tells me that is not enough," Watson responded. Council Member Martha Hoyer pointed out that since the township now consists of only one subdivision it is likely the city would have just two or three calls annually there.

Novi charter changes approved

Proposed amendments to the Novi City Charter should get on the ballot without a hitch, following action by the Michigan Attorney General's office last week.

City officials have received notice that, after reviewing the proposed amendments, the Attorney General's office has ruled the amendments conform with state law regulating the authorities of home rule cities.

The opinion is to be forwarded to the governor's office, which will issue a statement much to the same effect, according to City Clerk Geraldine Slipp.

Had the attorney general's office ruled the amendments did not conform with state laws, the amendments still would have gone on the ballot; however, the review allows communities to warn voters if they are being asked to enact unconstitutional legislation into a charter.

If approved, the proposed amendments to the Novi City Charter would remove the city council's authority to establish special assessment districts to fund improvements on major and residential roads.

Specifically, voters will be asked to consider the following language: "Those roads, maintained by the city, which have heretofore been designated as county thoroughfares...shall be improved without specially assessing any costs thereof to the residential property owner thereof," which applies to major roads, such as mile roads, maintained by the city.

Novi receives Act 51 monies — which are state funds collected through gasoline taxes and revert to the local municipality based upon the community's population and the number of miles of major and local roads.

Former council member Donald Young, Jr., 4075 Nine Mile, has promoted the charter amendments in an attempt to reverse the city's practice of levying special assessments for mile road and subdivisions street assessments against abutting property owners.

According to current policies, property owners adjacent to road improvement projects pay a percentage of the construction costs, while a tax against the city at large pays the remainder.

Young maintains abutting property owners bear the burden for projects that benefit the community in general as a result of the city's policy. He also believes the city is not properly planning the expenditure of monies it receives for road maintenance and improvements.

Novi News Briefs

New landscaping for Novi High School, costing approximately \$6,600, has been approved by the board of education.

There will be 1,500 juniper bushes planted in the landscaped areas in front of the school. After Trustee Joel Colliau repeatedly objected to the appearance of the high school entrance, the board decided to remove the witch which had become overgrown with weeds from the entrance and replace it with the bushes.

The schools will spend \$4,450 for the low bid on the bushes, from K mart of Troy and \$2,150 for wood chips to place under the bushes from the F.A. Blake Company.

Board members questioned purchasing the bushes from K mart since it is not known as a nursery, but they were told the bushes are guaranteed until the spring of 1982.

Tuition rates for the 1980-81 school year have been set at a maximum of \$1,009 for elementary students and \$1,002 for secondary students.

School board members unanimously approved the new rates, which are established by a formula set by the Michigan Department of Education.

Students who expect to be residents of the school district within the coming school year are allowed by the school board to attend on a tuition basis.

This year there are five tuition students enrolled. Tuition rates are proposed on a daily basis until the family moves into the school district.

Two new representatives to the Novi Parks and Recreation Commission have been appointed by the city council.

A proposal has been made that 19 lights be installed in the neighborhood. With 125 homes in the area the preliminary cost figures break down to \$14.14 annually.

Property owners that who are served by a water main which would traverse Grand River from the proposed city fire station east to H & G to R. & A. & G. & W. in Meadowbrook north of Ten Mile has indicated support for establishment of a special assessment district to fund construction of the water line.

City Manager Edward Kriewall recently told the council that 85 percent of the affected property owners have endorsed the project.

Estimated cost of the 16-inch water main has been pegged at \$450,000 — for a \$28 per front foot cost to the property owners. City officials noted, however, that cost estimates are only preliminary at this point.

Design for the project could be completed by November or early December. It could go out to bid by early January and be built during the winter months.

Service could be available by March or April of 1981, according to Kriewall.

A public hearing will be scheduled soon to determine whether residents in northern Novi are interested in paying a special assessment to finance installation of street lights in their neighborhood.

Currently, it is against city policy to light subdivisions. The present policy allows the lights to be installed at points where subdivision streets intersect with mile roads or major thoroughfares.

As a result, the city administration has recommended that the neighborhood known as "The Grove" be lighted only if residents are willing to pay a special assessment.

## Supervisors ask for salary talks

Walled Lake supervisory police officers may be requesting approval to form an association in dealing with the city.

According to Corporal Roger Cote, one of three supervisors in the department, talks are ongoing between the three and Mayor Gaspare LaMarca.

The three men will probably request that the city recognize them as a bargaining unit, said Cote.

Approval by the city council will be a key factor in their plan to unionize, he added.

### Out of work

*Ford Wixom workers' layoffs follow decline of luxury car—they're indefinite*

It happened March 17. Ford Motor Company's Wixom Assembly plant, a manufacturing giant on the landscape of Western Oakland County off I-96 between Novi and Milford, became a symbol of the economic times and the dramatic decline of U.S.-made automobiles.

Indefinite layoff notices went to 3,100 workers at the plant, and an assembly operation which often offered workers as much overtime as they could manage was cut in half.

Workers with less than 14 years seniority have not been back to work at the plant since March 7 when they received temporary layoff notices, and those workers have been without employment and without much of a prospect of employment since March 17 when the indefinite pink slips began arriving in the mail.

The Wixom plant assembles Ford's Lincoln Continentals and Mark IVs—large luxury autos which have nosedived in sales since the price of gasoline jumped almost 30 cents per gallon this year alone.

And, according to Orville Spencer, president of United Auto Worker Local 36 in Wixom, it's not likely that the massive assembly plant, whose puffing stacks and full parking lot was a sign of good times, will have two shifts until late 1981 or early 1982.

"Personally, I don't think we'll go back to two shifts until Ford comes out with the Mark which will get 35 miles

per gallon on the highway and 24 in city driving. It will still be the largest luxury car on the market, but it will be very competitive from a gas standpoint with the foreign models.

Spencer, who was elected president of UAW Local 36 two and a half years ago, calls the situation one of the toughest times ever for a union official.

Local 36 offices receive anywhere from 50 to 100 phone calls per day from laid off auto workers who are worried about the expiration of company-paid insurance policies, are mad about mix-ups in paperwork, are wondering about the future of the Wixom plant's workforce, and are attempting to make plans when economic times are so bad.

The Michigan Employment Security Commission says that Michigan's unemployment is around 12.5 percent, the highest unemployment rate in the nation. The second highest rate is Ohio's nine percent unemployment.

In the month of July, Michigan's unemployment was a staggering 14.1 percent, meaning that 617,000 were out of work, almost double the number of unemployed a year ago.

"Right now, we're working to build up the stock in the showrooms...then we're going to cross our fingers and hope that the cars begin selling and we will have two shifts again," Spencer said.

Experts say that the sales of U.S.-made cars have fallen nine million in 1979 to an estimated seven million so far this year.

And the prospects of recapturing the car market from the clutches of the Japanese is not certainty, high-ranking auto company officials have publicly stated.

These facts are not lost on the men who used to work at the Wixom Assembly Plant. Many are not certain they will ever work in the auto industry again.

Here's what the lives of four unemployed auto workers have been like since March 7, their last day of work.

**TOM LIEN, 39, MARRIED, THREE CHILDREN, 12 YEARS SENIORITY:** In July this year, Tom and many fellow UAW members pitched tents on the lawn in front of UAW Local 36. The called their new homes, "Carter's Soup Kitchen City."

"We lived in the tents for about two weeks to show the government that unless some restrictions were put on foreign imports and unless something is done to relieve some of the requirements for emissions that have been placed on the auto companies, we'd all be living in tents pretty soon," said Lien.

Lien was hired in 1968, and was never laid off, except for model changeovers, until March 7 when the sever cutbacks started.

He is receiving unemployment, 60 percent of his sub pay and recently received retroactive Trade Readjustment Act money from the federal government.

But he has to make house payments and must make sure his three daughters are properly clothed for winter, and he says there is little money left for frills.

"Boredom and the uncertainty are the most difficult things to cope with. I go bow hunting, and I spend some time fishing with a couple of friends of mine who are also unemployed from Wixom...we talk about our problems, and we have a lot of fun together...it gets us out of the house and gets us doing things together."

"I go to my mother's home in Novi...it's almost like a farm there. I chop some firewood for her or I fix something that needs to be fixed—it's something that keeps you busy, and it feels good to be doing something," Lien said.

For the Lien family, the layoff has caused difficulties, mostly related to the lack of information about what the future will bring.

"That's one of things that makes me mad. You don't get any information so that you can plan for the future. It's all because the management in the Glass House in Dearborn won't tell the plant."

"The rumor mill can really play on your mind sometimes...first you hear that you might go back to work sometime in October, then you hear it will be January or February of next year, and then you hear some other date."

"Whenever you call the union office, you hear things like 'might' and 'I really can't say for sure', they are all afraid of getting your hopes up that you will be getting back to work."

Lien believes he is more fortunate than most men from Wixom who only had five, six or seven years seniority. Their sub pay has expired, and there isn't much of a chance they will ever be called back to the plant.

Lien says he is a man with too much time and too little money. "It hasn't really brought us together. Sometimes it has just the opposite effect. You have to sit around the house, and you and your wife tend to focus on each other,

and you nitpick about things...and I really can't spend a whole lot more time with my daughters...like taking them out somewhere because there just isn't enough money."

"This year my oldest daughter didn't even think about going out for track because I couldn't afford the cost of special shoes and clothes for her," Lien said.

The only thing you can do is think, and Lien has reflected on what he believes contributed to the American consumer's apparent rejection with cars made at the Wixom plant.

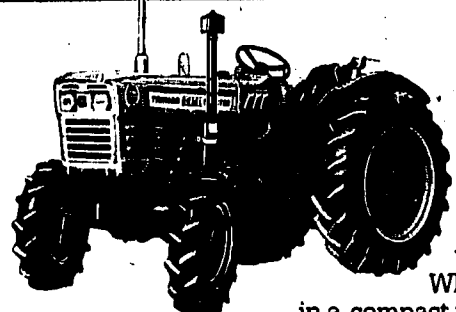
"It wasn't really the guys on the line...it was the supervisory people. I worked as a repairman for a long time, and I know that many times workers wanted to take their time and make things right, but sometimes when things weren't right, they'd tell you to stamp it as okay anyway, and if you didn't do it, they did."

"Then if the quality control people came down too hard, the supervisors would call the supervisors of the quality control people."
