Special Assessment District glides over first hurdle

Developers and property owners were down right cordial Monday as they offered suggestions for public improvements (roads, water mains and storm sewers) in Section 15 — the large parcel of land on the west side of Novi Road opposite Twelve Oaks Mall.

off Novi Road which will cut through the middle of the development — named West Oaks Drive. And a five-lane road off Twelve Mile which will intersect West Oaks Drive. A three-lane road around the perimeter also is planned.

A new concept — building a second east-west road parallel to West Oaks Drive — was introduced Monday. City Manager Ed Kriewald said construction of that road is contingent upon a boulevard being constructed on Twelve Mile. For that reason both the perimeter road and the second east-west route will be shown on the plans for the area, he explained.

Water mains and their connection point as well as plans for a master storm water retention system also were reviewed. Current estimates for the project are \$3.5 million for the road system, \$90,000 for the storm water drainage system and \$664,000 for the water system.

In a public hearing to determine the need of those improvements, only one person registered a strong complaint, while a second objected to parts of the overall plan but agreed to work toward a compromise with the city.

Property owners and developers have previously been hostile to plans for establishment of the special assessment district. But since the last public meeting in September, city administrators have worked diligently at resolving differences with those parties and included as many of their suggestions as possible in the draft of the improvement plans.

Some motorists might not believe it, but the new traffic signal at the Novi Road/Grand River Avenue intersection is operating properly. The Novi Police Department has received several complaints that the signal is not operating properly, but officials with the Oakland County Road Department report that the signal is functioning as designed.

It's just that the new light will take some getting used to. The major difference between the computerized light and other traffic signals is that it directs traffic movement according to the traffic volume. The second big difference is that left-hand turn traffic moves first. In the traffic safety business, it is known as a "leading left turn."

March 1 move expected

County still searching for new social services site

County officials are speculating that Walled Lake's social services offices will be out of the McComb building by March 1 of next year.

County Manager of Property Management and County Development John Madole predicted that bids for renovation and conversion of the building into the Sand District Court's new quarters would be accepted through February 1981 and a contract will be awarded by the end of that month.

"DSS is still looking and has several sites under consideration," he added. Madole said he did not know the location of sites DSS may be considering.

While a temporary move to Pontiac has been discussed, Rosso was opposed in the past to relocating area social services permanently in the county seat.

Construction of a high-density residential development will only make the situation worse, he said.

Additional opposition to the rezoning request was expressed by Daniel Beale who said the issue was one of density.

Robert Suenken, developer of the proposed Walled Lake development, said he did not intend to purchase a lakefront parcel with a \$46,000 price tag.

City auditors told the council last Tuesday that the city has sufficient funds in its budget to proceed with the purchase.

HUD denies subsidized housing proposal in Wixom

An application to develop subsidized housing in Wixom has been rejected by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

The application for HUD funding for subsidized housing in the Golden Gate East apartment complex was originally submitted in July.

Specifically, Rose submitted an application to construct 44 dwelling units in the apartment complex under HUD's Section 8 Housing Assistance program.

The Section 8 designation is designed to assist lower income (80 percent of the area median income or less) families in affording decent housing in the private market.

Habel noted that the application from Rose Realty was one of 46 received by HUD in response to a notice of the availability of funding.

Habel also reported that HUD will be issuing another notice of funding availability within the next two months.

Flames ravaged part of Village Apartments last week

Flames raze Wixom apartment

Flames swept through a building in Wixom's Village Apartments complex early last Wednesday, destroying four units and causing smoke and water damage to eight others.

One resident suffered minor burns in the fire and was treated and released from the Henry Ford Hospital West Bloomfield Center.

Wixom Fire Chief George Spencer reported that the fire broke out shortly before 4 a.m. Wednesday.

The blaze was limited to the northern one-third (12 units) of Building Three in the Village complex.

Spencer reported that the four apartments on the third floor were completely destroyed by the blaze.

The cause of the blaze has been attributed by investigators to a kitchen fire which burned out of control.

Spencer said a resident in one of the units turned on a burner under a pan of grease and then fell asleep on a couch in his living room.

The man awoke at approximately 3:45 a.m. to find flames reaching from the pan to the ceiling.

Spencer reported that the flames were visible from the Pontiac Trail fire station when the alarm came in at 4:01 a.m.

Last week's fire was the third at the Village in the last three and one-half years.

The cause of the 1977 fire was attributed to careless smoking, while the cause of the 1979 fire has been listed as "undetermined" by investigators from the Oakland County Arson Squad.

Novi reviews policy for lighting subdivision streets

Novi officials are considering the installation of a new policy for the installation of street lights as a result of a petition from residents in the Grove subdivision on Walled Lake.

Under the proposed policy, residents seeking the installation of street lights will be responsible for obtaining the signatures of 60 percent of the property owners to be served by the lights.

A public hearing will then be conducted to discuss plans to install lights. A second public hearing will be held after the council has determined there is a need for the installation of street lights.

Under the current policy, the city installs street lights only at the intersections of a subdivision entrance street and a major road.

Special assessment is necessary because of the high cost of lighting an entire city, explained City Manager Edward Kriewald.

Monumental myths mask morbid reality



Rape: Yes, it does happen to people in your neighborhood

Rape is something that happens to other people.

You read about someone being sexually assaulted. You hear about a friend of a friend who was attacked.

But the reality of rape doesn't become clear until it happens to you or someone close to you.

And, yes, it could happen to you.

According to the Michigan State Police Uniform Crime Report there were 1,754 offenses reported in Wayne County and 266 in Oakland County in 1979. And there were more than 4,000 incidences reported throughout the state last year.

But there are many rapes which are never reported.

In fact, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) believes that rape is the most under-reported of all crimes — that the occurrence of sexual assault is enormously larger than it appears on the surface.

Assuming that most rapes or rape attempts are not reported by women due to embarrassment, shame or the feeling that somehow they were at fault, the FBI estimates that the incidence of rape actually is 10 times greater than reported.

If that is true, then rape is the most frequently committed violent crime in America: more rapes than aggravated assaults or even simple robberies.

This would mean it is 30 times more likely a person will be raped than murdered.

Despite the great number of rape incidences, the mythology surrounding the crime continues.

Mythology puts the focus on the sexual nature of the attack, rather than danger to the victim.

In reality, women (and men) are killed before and after a sexual assault. In reality, people are forced to participate in perverse sexual acts against their will and under the threat of further abuse.

The possibilities of becoming pregnant, contracting venereal disease or a parasitic infection are very real.

Also very real to victims is the horror and fear of the possibility of death that they experience.

Studies indicate that 85 percent of rape victims are so afraid of death and injury that they never make any attempt to defend themselves.

Some of the myths on rape and sexual assault include:

FACT — Nice women don't get raped.
 MYTH — The reality of rape doesn't become clear until it happens to you or someone close to you.

FACT — Rape is an act of humiliation, degradation and assault done with an enormous amount of hate. The results of a recent study showed that 90 percent of group rapes were planned in advance and 59 percent of rapes committed by a single man were planned.

MYTH — Rape is an act of sexual passion.
 FACT — Rape is an act of humiliation, degradation and assault done with an enormous amount of hate. The results of a recent study showed that 90 percent of group rapes were planned in advance and 59 percent of rapes committed by a single man were planned.

MYTH — A woman cannot be raped by her husband.
 FACT — Any act of sexual intercourse to which the woman does not consent is rape.

MYTH — The rapist is a sexually unfulfilled man.
 FACT — Doctor William Prendergast of the New Jersey State Prison states that all of the rapists that he has studied had available sexual relationships. Sixty percent of the men in another doctor's study were, in fact, married and led normal lives at home.

MYTH — Most rapes occur in dark alleys or to women who hitchhike.
 FACT — More than one third of the rapes are committed by a man who forces his way into the victim's home, and over half of all rapes committed occur in a residence.

MYTH — The rapist is a stranger to the victim.
 FACT — Forty-eight percent of the rapists in one doctor's study were known to the victim (either casual friends or relatives).

MYTH — Black men rape white women.
 FACT — In 98 percent of all reported rape cases both the man and woman are of the same race. However, white men attack black women more often than black men attack white women.

Unfortunately, the mythology is present in all segments of society. As a result, those who are supposed to be helping a rape victim — friends, hospital personnel, police officers, etc. — may say things that increase the victim's feelings of guilt.
