

## Novi schools set millage renewal election

Voters in the Novi School district will be asked to go to the polls March 31 to approve the renewal of 10.5 mills to be levied for the next three years.

Members of the Novi school board voted 5-0 Thursday to set the special election date for the fifth Tuesday in March. When all seven members can be present at the February 19 session, it is expected they will take formal action to put the 10.5 mill request on the ballot.

The 10.5 mills, or approximately one-third of the levy for operations, have expired and cannot be levied again unless approved by the voters.

Novi Schools currently levy a total of 34.94 mills. Of that 27.94 mills are levied for operations — the cost of running the schools. The district also levies seven mills for debt retirement to pay off construction of facilities such as Novi High School and Novi Woods Elementary.

The history of the 10.5 mill levy that expires with the collection of the December taxes, is that voters approved a 9.5 mill levy in April 1976 and a one mill levy in 1978.

While the Millage Requirement Committee has told the board that the district should seek 10.5 mills, some members have also recommended that in the next three years the school district levy only the amount of millage necessary to continue existing programs.

The committee found that in future years the provisions of the Headlee Amendment would require a millage rollback that would leave the schools without enough revenues if the voters were not asked to approve at least 10.5 mills at this time.

It was explained that approval of 10.5 mills would increase the school board's options in determining the number of mills to be levied.

Trustee Joel Colliau, who served on the committee, explained the recom-

mendation for a 10.5 mill renewal has "no money built in."

Instead, approval of 10.5 mills would help insure the district is not left short when the millage levy must be rolled back.

Members of the Millage Requirement Committee told the school board they had hoped to be able to recommend that the district seek less than the 10.5 mills that have expired.

Committee Member Gretchen Pugsly said, "we went into one session hoping to ask for seven mills and by the time we got done discussing it we were considering recommending that the voters be asked to approve 11 mills."

Trustee Robert Schram, who also served on the millage committee said: "We found the Headlee rollback might not affect us this year, but in the second year if we asked for less than 10.5 mills we stood to lose \$350,000 through the rollback."

Members of the Millage Requirement Committee based their recommendation on a study of the school district's needs over the next three years.

After talking with city and school administrators and comparing that information with their own research the committee arrived at projected enrollment figures, budget figures, and the community's future state equalized value.

They reported that they expect 43 new enrollees in the 1981-82 school year, 45 additional students in 1982-83 and 48 new students in the 1983-84 school year.

They also projected an increase of three staff members by 1983-84.

The committee said they expect the community's total state equalized valuation to jump to \$350 million for a 14.9 percent increase in 1981-82 and then to \$410 million a 17 percent increase in 1982-83.

Committee members were asked to determine an approximated state equalized valuation, since the school

district can roughly estimate its local property tax revenues by multiplying the millage levy and the total state equalized valuation of the community.

The percentages of the increase in the equalized valuation show what kind of millage rollbacks the school district can expect. In years where the state equalized valuation exceeds the cost of living, the millage levy must be rolled back.

The increasing value of property in the community also will allow the schools to generate more revenues without increasing the millage levy.

Committee members cautioned that such figures are very tentative since they are all based on "figures which are strictly unofficial."

For example, the committee expects both revenues and expenditures to increase approximately \$1 million per

year for the next three years, while the millage levy does not increase.

Committee members said they did not try to guess what types of property tax cuts the legislature or governor might ask voters to approve in coming months, although those cuts could be expected to throw a monkey wrench into the committee's budget projections.

Assistant Superintendent William Barr said he knows of five plans which already have been proposed. "I expect

there'll be as many plans as legislators before this is through," Barr added.

"We talked about what could happen if this plan or that plan passes, but finally we said we can't address what may or may not be on the ballot," Colliau said. "We had to ignore those plans and develop a recommendation based on the current financial structure of the school district and our best estimate of what will be needed."



## Alternative routes sought for roads

In the interests of not increasing traffic congestion on Twelve Mile and preserving Tollgate Farm, Novi city council members have asked the administration to seek alternative routes for the extension of both Decker and Meadowbrook roads.

City Manager Edward Kriewall has recommended that engineering studies be made during 1981 for the extension of Decker and Meadowbrook between Thirteen and Twelve Mile. A decision to pave either road would depend on the results of the engineer's study, Kriewall said.

But council members told Kriewall Monday they would like to see information on alternative routes before approving a route extending those roads to Twelve Mile.

Suggestions offered by the council included paving Thirteen Mile to allow traffic coming from the north to get to Haggerty Road and curving the Decker Road extension so that it enters Novi Road north of 12 1/2 Mile.

Council members' comments supported the position taken by representatives of the Americana Foundation who are working in conjunction with Oakland Community College to preserve the 130-year-old Tollgate Farm at the corner of Twelve Mile and Meadowbrook.

"When we last appeared before this

body we discussed the fact that the Americana Foundation and Oakland Community College have extensive plans for the future use of the Tollgate Farm. Since that time, some \$60,000 has gone toward plans for the public use of the facility," Americana Foundation Attorney Gary Rentrop told the council.

"Decker Road which abuts the west boundary of the farm and Meadowbrook on the east could significantly impact the use of the parcel; particularly Meadowbrook which lies near the farmhouse.

"When we came to the council last fall it was our intent to work together in the planning, but it seems Novi is going very fast in its plans. Don't throw our plans up in the air after we have expended \$60,000 on them. We think we can work closely to resolve your thoroughfare problems without jeopardizing our plans to retain the property."

Rentrop offered no specific alternatives to the city's plan to pave Decker and Meadowbrook roads between Thirteen and Twelve Mile, but he asked that his group be closely involved in future plans to pave the roads.

City Engineer Harry Mosher tried to reassure those working to preserve the farm by noting that unique road design characteristics have been employed throughout the Novi Road Program in order to retain as much of the rural nature of the community as possible.

"We've done a lot of innovative things to preserve Novi's rural atmosphere. In fact, we've been forced to make design compromises that as engineers make us uneasy. I think Meadowbrook would be left as a lesser road than Decker, but it must be improved because it's a legal liability to the city," Mosher said.

He went on to say that designing the road so that it continues to be a "pastoral, scenic type road" will be a challenge.

However, Council Member Patricia Karevich echoed the concerns expressed by the foundation representative. "Maybe I'm being short-sighted, but extending these roads seems to me to be damaging the integrity of both the farm and the cemetery (at Novi Road and Twelve Mile). Wouldn't it be possible to bring Decker in to Novi Road north of 12 1/2 Mile?" she asked.

Mosher said such an intersection would be "almost completely impractical" because of swampy soil conditions in the area. He added that it would be necessary to improve Novi Road if Decker were to connect to it and the Oakland County Road Commission could not afford it.

## City-School facility to be studied

It's only in the early idea stage, but very informal discussions have taken place between school and city officials regarding the construction of a community center that would house city employees and school administrators.

In a discussion of ballot proposals which might face Novi voters in the next six years, City Manager Edward Kriewall told Novi City Council members Monday about certain factors which could change the forecast he presented last year.

One of those factors would be an agreement to study the feasibility of a city-school administration building.

As discussed informally, the facility also would replace the existing community center on Novi Road.

Kriewall has projected the city would ask voters in November 1981 to approve funding to construct a community center and request approval for a separate city hall in 1986.

But Monday he advised the council that those target dates should be revised until the proposal for a city-school administrative facility/community center has been studied.

"With the economy in its current shape we're not sure whether we want to put anything on the ballot this year. Another aspect of the community center proposal is that a past member of a citizens study committee has suggested there might be some merit in considering a community center as part of a joint city hall and school administration facility," Kriewall said.

He went on to say that the original master plan for the municipal complex on Ten Mile calls for three buildings to be constructed between the police department and the library.

"To do a better job of planning we may want to explore the possibility of a community building with three functions. This would set the ballot issue (for a new community center) back while the joint facility is being considered."

"We think the proposal has merit and should be discussed. It will require meetings with the schools," he noted.

Kriewall also explained that while it originally was expected the city could continue to use its quarters in the library until the late 1980s, it now ap-

pears the library may need to expand into what is now city hall before the city outgrows those quarters.

Mayor Romaine Roethel noted that the proposal was merely a "concept" at this point. She also commented that until the city is assured of the direction that federal and state government will take regarding the tax structure she could not foresee placing any bonding proposals on the ballot.

Council Member Martha Hoyer urged Kriewall to pursue the joint city-school administrative building and suggested a citizens advisory committee be formed to look into the issue.

Superintendent Robert Piwko was in Lansing Tuesday and could not be reached for comment.

## Patnales proposal put off for one year

Economic conditions and tax cut plans proposed for the November ballot would all but eliminate that election from consideration as a time to ask Novi voters to approve the building of the Patnales Drain, according to City Manager Edward Kriewall.

Kriewall said in a discussion of potential ballot issues Monday that although he originally thought the question could come before the voters in November of this year, he now feels that would not be recommended.

Voters narrowly defeated a \$3.5 million bond issue to construct the Patnales Drain in November 1979. Council members voted last year against seeking voter approval to construct the drain and, unless major flooding occurs

in the area, it appears as if it will not be on the ballot this year.

"I hate to say this, but we may have to wait until we experience a severe situation before we go back to the voters with this," Kriewall said.

He noted that improvements to Nine Mile for the time being appear to have reduced flooding problems in the area.

Council Member John Chambers agreed the manager's point was "valid" and suggested that the retention-detention pond standards recently adopted by the council might help with the drainage problems in the Nine Mile area.

"I know a lot of people were concerning that it wouldn't do any good to approve a drain without improvements

upstream. Now we have the restrictions we need to improve the conditions upstream," Chambers said.

He also asked what would happen if the dam at Meadowbrook Lake broke.

"Then we would have a health, safety and welfare situation which would have to be taken care of," Mayor Romaine Roethel responded.

When voters were asked in November 1979 to approve construction of the Patnales Drain it was pointed out that the drainage problems in the Meadowbrook Lake-Nine Mile area are rapidly deteriorating the dam at Meadowbrook Lake.

Approximately two-thirds of the city drains into the Patnales. Currently, it is largely an unimproved drain, causing

flooding and related drainage problems.

Kriewall said after the meeting that if the dam breaks it would create an emergency situation which would justify putting the question on the ballot as soon as possible.

Novi has recognized that the Patnales has needed to be constructed since 1969. In fact, it was slated for construction in 1980. But passage of the Headlee amendment mandated that funding of its construction go before the voters.

Council members agreed with the manager that the current economic uncertainties and tax plan proposals made it a poor time to seek approval for

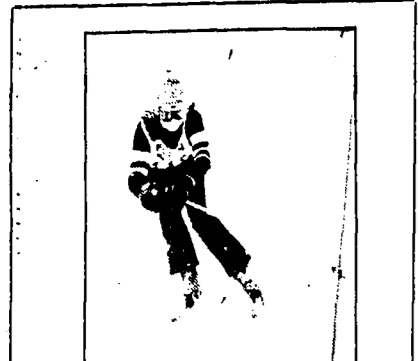

## School board vote censures Trustee Callahan

Walled Lake's Board of Education voted Monday to publicly censure Trustee Janet Callahan.

"Because I feel so strongly that Mrs. Callahan's behavior as a school board member is reprehensible and cannot go unchallenged, I call for the board to publicly censure Mrs. Callahan," said Board President Stephen Lasher at the start of Monday's meeting.

"While I recognize that such action carries with it no punitive measures, I believe that it is time for the board to publicly express its displeasure with the irrational behavior exhibited by Mrs. Callahan," he added.

The board on a roll call vote subsequently voted 6-1 to censure Callahan.

The lone dissenting ballot was cast by Callahan, who told other board members she thought they were making fools of themselves.

"There's such a thing as freedom of speech and I intend to continue to exercise that right," she said in response to the public censure.

"My job is to represent the public, not

the administration and other board members."

Later in the meeting she charged that board members have used "various tactics to keep me from talking ever since I was elected to the board."

"I'm trying to change things for the better in this district, not sweep them under the rug," she continued, adding that she has community support for her efforts.

"The motion to publicly censure Callahan came after Lasher submitted a strongly-worded statement at the start of Monday's meeting."

valid), her irrational behavior, her total inability to reason, to compromise or even to listen, has caused irreparable harm to the board of education and the school district.

"No longer can the board concern itself primarily with the matter of educating children. Instead, we must be subjected to the unending twaddle dispensed by Mrs. Callahan. Our time must now be spent dealing with the senseless personal attacks by Mrs. Callahan on any and all individuals who exhibit such irreverent behavior as to disagree with her."

Lasher went to say that he recognizes the Walled Lake School District is not perfect. "We have our problems, but these problems must be resolved in a logical, reasonable, rational manner—which, I submit, is currently being accomplished by six of the seven board members."

"By her actions, I am convinced that Mrs. Callahan is determined to destroy the potential effectiveness of the board of education," he continued.

"In the past two months, Mrs. Callahan has obliterated all recognized standards of common sense, decency, good taste and intelligence. In addition to the steady stream of unsubstantiated drive to which we have become so accustomed, we now have been subjected to three incidents which force me to conclude that Mrs. Callahan is unfit to serve in a public capacity."

The first of the three incidents cited by Lasher involved Callahan's call for the dismissal of Deputy Superintendent Roland Langerman. The board president continued on 8-A.

## Township set to lose three patrol officers

It took over three months, but the effects of an unsuccessful attempt to gain additional millage for police protection may be creeping up on Commerce Township.

Oakland County's Sheriff's Department has "re-designated three patrol officers as service support" for the West Oakland area, according to Detective Mark Goodrich. The new assignment for those deputies not financed by Commerce means they will no longer be stationed in the township.

The move will reduce patrol officer numbers to six for Commerce. Goodrich and another supervisory officer will also remain in the sub-station.

The decision to slash the number of patrol officers was made by the department "downtown," the sub-station supervisor noted.

"I don't know when they'll be moved from the station," Goodrich said. "I'm trying to stop that from happening."

The sheriff's department thinks Commerce ought to take more economic responsibility for retaining law enforcement personnel. That, according to Goodrich, was the message he was scheduled to deliver to the township's Board of Trustees during its meeting last night, after our press time.

The relocation of the officers is seemingly an ultimatum designed to apply pressure on the township for more financial support of law enforcement personnel.

## Council objects to plan's price

"Don't give us a Thunderbird when we want a Pinto."

That analogy received considerable attention last Tuesday night as Walled Lake's City Council tried to determine a feasible price tag for preparation of a master plan.

The predominant opinion among city officials reflected a desire to take the proposed \$10,200 cost and "whittle it down to the bare essentials."

"It seems like you're coming in with a Thunderbird and we have to take things off," Council Member Thomas Brookover told the city's Plan Commission. "I don't think the issue should be the cost," Honeymay observed. "He (Kilroy) is talking about a totally comprehensive plan of the city. I would agree maybe we can cut some of the cost, but I want to look at the content."

Council Member William Roberts took a somewhat different perspective. Roberts zeroed in on the 1966 master plan, developed at a \$27,000 cost but

never adopted.

"I know the amount of use or lack of use the '66 study got. My major concern is the amount of use this study might get," Roberts said. Kilroy assured council that it was empowered to determine the plan's adoption.

developed in coordination with Walled Lake's needs.

"The city, itself, did not follow any of its plans," he explains. "City hall, itself, should not be here."

"It (the '66 plan) was never adopted. And it was never followed," Tucker adds.

Mayor Gaspare LaMarca, a current member of city council and past member of the plan commission, said operating without a master plan forced the city planning board to rely heavily on the plan consultant.

"We were going by the consultant's advice," LaMarca explained the commission's method of an operation without a master plan. "There were nothing but delays. Even attorneys were involved in it."

But the \$27,000 outlay for the 1966 master plan has not been the city's sole expenditure in an attempt to gain a more adequately planned city.

LaMarca claimed an additional \$4,000 was paid to the city's plan consultant in 1973 to develop another master plan. The money was spent. No study ever surfaced.

"The plan consultant at that time recommended a new master plan and got the plan commission to agree on building would take place in Walled Lake for three to six months," the mayor recalled. "If I'm not mistaken, the city paid that consultant \$4,000."

During the development moratorium, site plans were received but action was reportedly delayed.

LaMarca confessed he was opposed to the building delay because of the expenses and taxes that builders were incurring and contributed to the discontinuance of it.

"At the time, I couldn't see a delay with all the taxes developers were paying," he noted. "Both when we didn't have a consultant and when (the city's current consultant) Tod Kilroy took over."

"We were going by the consultant's

## Oakland Schools to seek special education millage

Oakland County voters will be asked to approve a two mill tax increase for special education when they go to the polls in the general school election June 8.

The millage proposal, which was unanimously approved by the Board of Education of Oakland Schools last week, will be on the ballot in each of the 28 Oakland County school districts.

The board will name a steering committee to represent parents, local school board members, the intermediate board, local superintendents, special education directors, agencies working on behalf of handicapped citizens and Oakland Schools staff to coordinate information distribution throughout the county.

"The issue of the growing shortfall between the costs of special education programs and services and the funds to pay for them has been studied for more than two years," said Intermediate Superintendent William G. Keane.

"Recent reductions in categorical funding with the promise of continuing financial problems for Michigan state government focuses on the need for additional charter millage for special education in Oakland County."

## Foster care home set to open in Commerce Township sub

A proposed adult foster care home in Commerce Township may swing open its doors to residents within the next week, according to Development Specialist for the Macomb-Oakland Regional Center (MORC) Jean West.

Contacted Monday, West said the opening of the site, located at 2008 Alsip in the Huron Woods subdivision, would hinge on how quickly the final inspection report could be typed and reviewed by "supervisors and Lansing." She added, "It's typed today it could open by the end of the week."

The Alsip site is ready to open pending confirmation of the final approval. West noted that furnishings and other necessities are already in place.

"Everything is set up. It had to be ready to open the day they conducted the final inspection," she said.

Even the four residents expected to live in the Alsip site are being readied in the wings. West confirmed that four people from the Oakland facility in Lapeer have "tentatively" selected but will need parental approval" before moving into the foster care home.

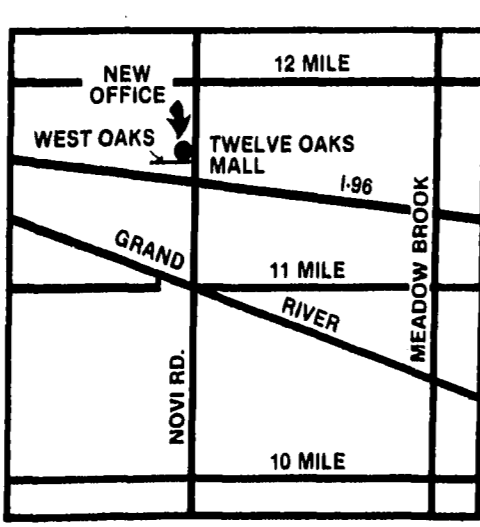

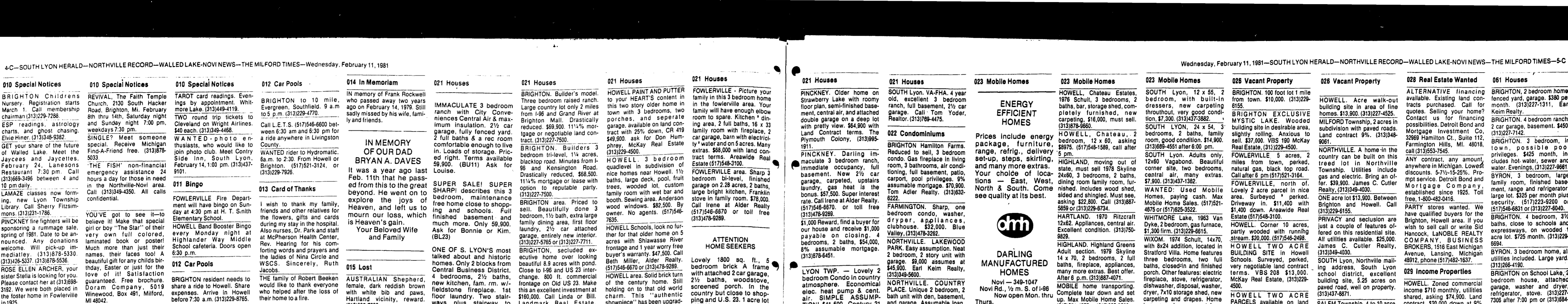

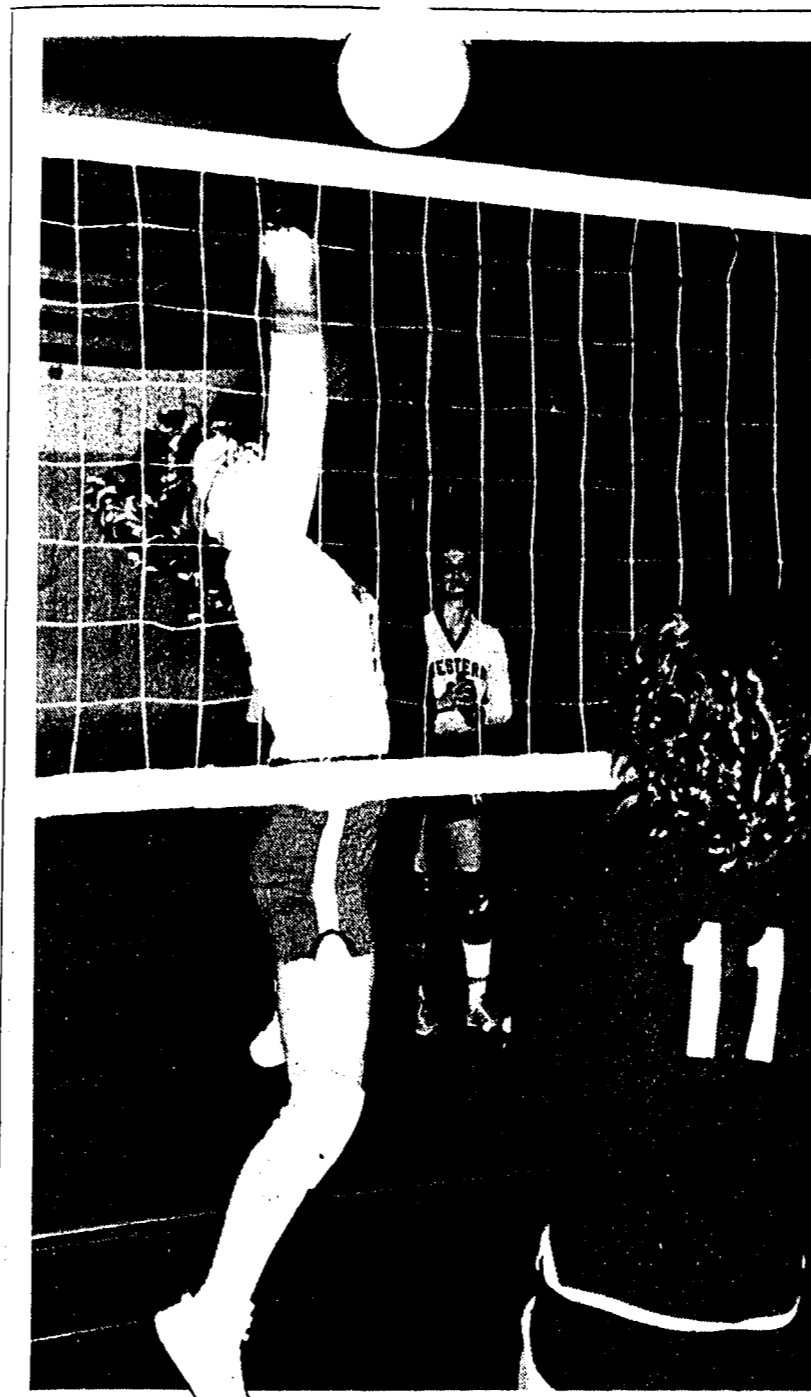

## Fuson's time-out cures worried Western sextet

In sports — as well as in anything else — the ability to handle adversity is what separates the potential champions from the also-rans. Based on that premise, the Walled Lake Western volleyball team showed its true stripes last week.

Following a disastrous showing the previous weekend at the Plymouth Invitational Tournament, the Warriors found themselves on the short end of a 5-0 score at Novi last Tuesday. That's when Western Coach Ron Fuson decided that a little calming-down session was in order.

"They were still nervous after playing badly during the weekend," the first-year coach explained after the match. "I just told them to forget about the past and to concentrate on Novi, and I guess it must have had some effect."

Judging by the way the Warriors played from that point on, Fuson's assessment could rate as the understatement of the year. Western collected 15 of the next 17 points to win game one in a rout, then did the same in game two for their sixth win in seven matches this season.

The Warriors, who were able to win only one game against four different opponents in Plymouth, were led by Sue Hoelt in the comeback win. "She was just tremendous," Fuson later raved. "Her dinks and hits were just great, and at one point she slammed down four straight non-returnable spikes."

Following that lopsided win, the locals seemed ready to take on Northville a couple of days later. But it didn't work out that way in the 16-14 and 15-7 affairs that went to the energy.

"We couldn't get our offense going," Fuson noted of the loss that left Western 4-2 in the Western Six Conference. "Northville played good ball control; we didn't. We just played ourselves out of a chance to win."

Hoelt and Julie Tilman performed well in defeat for Western, which hosts Waterford Matt and Walled Lake Central Thursday and Friday. The Warriors then head to Waterford Township three days later.

## Eagles swoop into first

It wasn't exactly the best time to face the conference's first-place team. The last thing that an ailing Novi Christian basketball team needed Friday was to face Taylor Center Baptist, which entered the clash undefeated in conference play. And one of those was came over the Novi boys earlier this season.

Therefore, Dick Burgess's team — despite the fact that third-leading scorer Dave Amerden was home with the flu, despite the fact that forward Dan Yoder started even though he was running a temperature, and despite the fact that leading scorer Tom Hardesty was on the bench at the opening tip because of the flu — somehow managed to escape with a 34-26 victory.

Ironically, when the game opened up a little in the third quarter, it was the locals who benefitted. The Eagles built up an eight-point lead during the next 10 minutes, then proceeded to stall the rest of the time away to earn a first-place tie in the Southeastern Christian Conference at 1-1.

Perhaps even more ironic was the fact that the ailing winners — led by Bob Wilson (14), Mike Quinton (13) and Tom Plaouts (12) — enjoyed a whopping 47-10 rebounding advantage. Quinton's 10 points led the locals, who shot 50 percent from the floor (17-34) contrasted to 20 percent for the losers.
