Rapes on increase while other crimes dip

There were approximately 12 percent fewer major crimes in Novi during 1981 than the previous year. However, contrary to that trend, an increase in rapes and sexual offenses were reported, according to figures released by the Novi police.

Nine rapes were reported in 1981 compared to three the preceding year - a 300 percent increase. Except for rapes, Novi police reported decreases in each of the areas considered major crimes.

Police consider murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burlary, larceny and auto thefts as major crimes, or felonies.

As a whole the total complaints were up one percent, but increases came in the area of petty crimes - up seven percent from the preceding year.

A total of 9.854 crimes were committed in 1981 compared to 9,764 in 1980. Police said there were 1,374 major crimes, 1,861 class two crimes and 6,617 petty crimes.

During the past year there were 906 larcenies, 102 auto thefts, 37 aggravated assaults and no murders.

Burglaries, which include breaking and enterings, also showed a slight decline with 311 burglaries in 1981 compared to 331 in 1980, approximately a six percent decrease

Of 1.374 major crimes some 346 were committed at

Twelve Oaks Mall. Approximately 309 were larceny or shoplifting cases.

There were two rapes, one robbery, five assaults and one burglary at the mall. Police handled a total of 890 complaints at the mall. Cases initiated by mall security personnel are turned over to Novi police for booking, arraignment and prosecution.

Most lesser crimes showed a decrease. Arson was down 57 percent, forgery cases dropped 53 percent and narcotics crimes decreased 46 percent.

There was seven percent less vandalism in 1981 than in the preceding year.

There also was a 5.6 percent increase in the number of sex offenses. Police said there were 38 sex offenses, compared to 36 the preceding year.

When asked for an explanation of the increase in rape cases, Police Chief Lee BeGole had no immediate analysis. However, he indicated he would review the cases.

Regarding the decrease in other crimes, Captain Richard Faulkner said crime is decreasing as a result of the work being done by the department.

"When police officers are out there working hard, stopping traffic and writing tickets, it deters crime," Faulkner said. "If a community is known to have police officers, the possibility exists that when they (law breakers) have a car full of stolen property they will think twice before they mess around in Novi."

Committee Chairperson Joseph Toth told the council that the committee believes "the city must develop a sound, comprehensive plan that takes into consideration maintenance, development and also meets the needs of the city in the future." Final plans from the engineers are Kriewall.

Local floods recur

Officials are carefully monitoring drainage courses throughout Novi as early spring rains fill drains and streams already swollen with melted snow from the weekend's quick thaw, according to City Manager Edward

Drainage problems, routinely encountered in the dast, develop Saturday. By Saturday afternoon the Meadowbrook Lake subdivision park was deluged and water spilled across Nine Mile. Storm water run off from 70 percent of the city drains into Meadowbrook Lake, causing it to regularly overflow its banks. 'We had the usual problem at Nine Mile and Ennishore." Kriewall said. "Eleven Mile and Lanny's Road is under water, and we had to thaw culverts along East Lake, Meadowbrook Road and various other places." Kriewall reported Tuesday he does not anticipate extensive flooding problems "unless it rains all day." "It all depends on the amount of rain we get. So far things have been holding steady." Kriewall said. He indicated that it appears Walled Lake can continue to store water. Kriewall explained a pipe with markings on the lake measures the lake's level.

Novi City Council members have to homes where licensure is under ap- ed the city's action would "give an inauthorized the city attorney to seek a court order which, if granted, would prohibit the licensing of an adult foster care home for six emotionally disturbed and developmentally disturbed adults.

Concerned that an administrative complaint registered by the city with the state might be denied and the license issued before an appeal is filed. the council agreed Saturday to seek a restraining order to halt licensing of the home.

"We run the risk that a license could be issued the day we receive a determination letter (regarding the city's complaint) from the state," explained Assistant City Attorney Michael Lewis. "We could go to court then, but the judge would consider whether issuance of a license and occupation of the home

will harm the city, rather than whether or not the home should be licensed." Lewis told the council there is an ad-

ministrative process the city is following in its appeal of the state's latest decision to proceed with licensing the home.

First a complaint is filed. If the complaint is denied the city can appeal the decision. If the appeal is again denied, the city can take the matter to circuit court.

Lewis reported state officials have told him licenses have not been issued

"I was told they have not issued a license during an appeal, but they have the authority to do so," Lewis said. "I requested assurance that a license would not be issued; they could not give me those assurances.'

He said he also discussed the matter with the department of social services employee reviewing the home and currently reside in Clinton Valley. learned she is proceeding with the ground work for licensing the home.

There is no legal precedent for the court action the city is about to undertake. Lewis said. because few community placement homes for mentally ill persons have been proposed.

"We believe the statute (regulating adult foster care homes) does not allow the placement of mentally ill, and this case would be argued on that basis,' Lewis said.

Council members supported the attornev's recommendation to seek a restraining order.

"I think this is extremely important." Council Member Patricia Karevich said. "This must be fought. I am totally opposed to a home for the mentally ill.

Council Member Martha Hoyer noted the council's opposition was limited to homes for the mentally ill. And Council Member John Chambers said he believ-

The city has objected to the licensing of an adult foster care group home proposed at 41386 Llewevin in the Meadowbrook Manor subdivision. Proposed residents of the home

Objections have been made on the grounds that:

• there is an existing foster care facility within 1,500 feet of the proposed home and to license another home would result in an over-concentration of facilities within the city: and.

• mentally ill persons would be placed in the home and the state does not permit placement of mentally ill persons in a residential area.

"Sit right down and take the soft chair." Board of Review Member James McLennan invited one of the 500 petitioners who appealed their property tax assessments last week. Both of the chairs are hard-backed.

The petitioner proceeded to tell about her home's moisture problem which is so bad it sometimes causes the furniture to mold. She thinks the dampness makes her home worth about \$2.000 less han the city assessor does.

McLennan listened politely, asked appropriate questions, then informed the woman she would learn the board's decision within three weeks.

Not all the cases that come before the three Board of Review members are that easy.

In his eight years of service on the board, McLennan said, he has never seen the volume of hardship cases that appeared this year.

'We've seen people who's unemployment has run out or is about to run out; that's the big difference between this year and other years. There have been more hardship cases this year than we've ever had," McLennan said.

Individuals who have produced documentation of their financial difficulties have been assisted by the board if possible, but city assessor John Merrifield reports many hardship cases had to be denied.

There have been relatively few occasions during the past three years when we have found cause to concur with the opinions expressed by Walled Lake school board member Janet Callahan.

In fact, we usually have been critical of her performance. But on the issue of wage concessions from school employee unions we find ourselves in agreement with Callahan's position.

Callahan has maintained from the start that the most effective means of dealing with the projected \$2.9 million deficit in the Walled Lake school district's 1982-83 budget is to impose a wage freeze on employees. Board members labored over the question of whether students should be required to take four full years of English or eight semesters of English and the sequence in which those classes should be taken.

This allows students who wish to graduate in January to continue to do so. It also ensures that they have an adequate exposure to English.

The 46-year old Woods recently wrote Governor William Milliken to explain why he was expanding his Michigan operation. The letter so impressed state officials that it was reprinted last week in promotional ads that appeared in both the Detroit Free Press and Wall Street Journal.
