

A citizens' request to transfer property from the Northville to the Novi School District should be denied, a state board of education hearing officer has recommended.

Citizens' concerns which prompted the transfer request "are not sufficiently compelling to warrant a transfer of the area," hearing officer Raymond Godmer concluded in a report to State Board of Education Superintendent Phillip Runkel.

His remarks support a joint decision by the Wayne and Oakland Intermediate Schools districts denying the transfer.

Although the Novi school board did not take a formal position on the transfer request, it gave unofficial support to the boundary shift when petitions were presented last January.

The Northville school board, however, voted unanimously to oppose the request at its January 25 meeting out of concerns that it would lose approximately \$130,000 in revenues next year and face future transfer requests which could dismantle the district in the future.

The Wayne and Oakland Intermediate school boards, acting jointly, denied the request on the basis that such a transfer would not be a sufficient educational benefit to the students of the district and would have no impact on the racial make-up of the district.

Residents appealed the denial, citing a need for more logical school district boundaries, safer student transportation conditions and a more cohesive identity between school and community before the State Board of Education hearing officer April 27.

The homeowners requesting the transfer have decided not to appeal the decision to the state circuit court, according to Millie Parker, who spearheaded the transfer petition drive along with her husband Gordon Parker.

"We're very disappointed," Parker said Tuesday. "We feel little Mr. Average Citizen doesn't have much chance when he's up against the system."

"We could appeal the decision but it would take a couple of years," she said. "We still feel all the points in our case

are valid, but they shot them all down. We got the feeling this was pretty cut and dry from the start."

The Parkers were among 79 percent of the homeowners just south of the Novi School District border in the Dumbarton Pines and Brookland Farms subdivisions, who signed petitions last August requesting a shift in school district boundaries.

They proposed the transfer of property bounded by Nine Mile, 9½ Mile, Novi and Taft Roads, which is within the Novi City limits, but in the Northville School District. Approximately 60 students would have gone into the Novi Schools beginning in the 1982-83 school year if the transfer had been approved.

The intermediate school boards denied the residents' request by a 5-4 vote February 18.

After hearing their appeal, Godmer said the residents should have attempted to resolve their concerns at the local level. He added that some of the residents' concerns are beyond the "control or correction" of the schools.

"The local board should be given the opportunity to review the situation and officially resolve any problems," Godmer stated. "The length of time spent on the bus was disputed...time spent on the bus is not considered to be

## Quail on watch may quell EEE

A small army of sentinels will be placed on duty soon in the Novi-Walled Lake area to help the Oakland County Health Department guard against outbreaks of Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE).

Who are the members of the elite corp that may help protect the people and horses of Oakland County from the potentially deadly mosquito-borne disease?

Birds. Bobwhite (quail) to be exact.

According to Richard Parker of the health department, EEE is primarily a disease of birds, such as quail and sparrows, and there will be evidence of the disease in the quail several weeks before it will show up in horses or humans. This gives the health department time to take precautions to protect the equine and human populations of an area.

Parker said that under this year's "encephalitis surveillance" program, four or five cages of quail will be distributed among strategic rural areas in the county, especially two areas

where equine outbreaks have occurred in the past, the Novi area and Rose Township.

Two horses were killed by the virus in Novi last year.

The disease has never been detected in urban areas, Parker said, so testing and monitoring is confined to the rural areas of the county.

The caged quail will be given blood tests periodically to determine whether or not they have been exposed to the EEE virus, Parker said.

"The belief is that it (the virus) should show up in the sentinels many weeks prior to any humans being involved... that gives us a lead time in formulating a plan of attack against people getting the disease," Parker explained.

According to Parker, most birds, horses and humans who come into contact with the virus do not contract EEE — their systems are able to successfully repel the virus. When this happens, antibodies against the virus are formed and remain in the body for life.

Since, Parker says, antibodies against different viruses are identifiable as such, the quail's blood tests will determine if they have EEE antibodies in their systems, indicating whether or not the virus is present in the area.

"(EEE) is primarily a disease of wild birds," Parker said. "Some years the birds are more heavily affected, but it's not a detectable pattern... sometimes the birds get it and you don't have people and horses getting sick."

According to Parker, the health department is now contacting people in the local area who may be interested in caring for a cage of sentinel quail, which will be placed in the area in early July. That, said Parker, is plenty of time to catch the spread of the virus, if it occurs this year.

"We're at the far northern range (in the country) for this disease," said Parker. "In practical terms we don't start (placing sentinels) before July... an outbreak (affecting humans or

## Alternative traffic routes urged

Decker Road should be extended directly south from Thirteen Mile to Twelve Mile instead of curved west to meet Novi Road.

That was the recommendation from a professional traffic consultant to Novi's City Council which is considering a road program for the northern part of the city.

In making his recommendations on road improvement projects, Traffic Consultant Rolf Kilian said the amount of traffic in the northern part of the city requires another north-south artery in addition to Novi Road.

"You must build as much flexibility into a road system as you can," Kilian said. "If you concentrate your efforts on Novi Road, you are dumping all your apples in one basket.... You need to find alternate ways to distribute traffic and get the mall traffic off Novi Road by moving it to Decker Road."

Kilian also said it may not be necessary to improve Novi Road based on the city's current land-use plans. "You want to maintain the current traffic loads on Novi Road and let growth occur on other routes," he said.

He also indicated priority construction projects, respectively, are:

- re-construct the Thirteen Mile-Novi Road intersection;
- extend Decker Road to Twelve Mile;
- develop a road system through West Oaks shopping center and the rest of Section 15;
- extend Taft Road north of Twelve Mile to connect to West Road;
- re-route South Lake Drive to connect to the new leg of Taft Road;
- upgrade Thirteen Mile from Meadowbrook to Haggerty; and,

• develop a ring-road around the Novi Road/Grand River intersection.

Kilian said it is important to improve the Thirteen Mile/Novi Road intersection so a traffic signal can be installed due to the traffic increase caused by the extension of Decker Road from Fourteen and Thirteen Mile.

"Traffic turning left (from Thirteen Mile) onto Novi Road has to find gaps," he said. "With the speeds and traffic loads on Novi Road, the gaps are becoming less and less acceptable."

Kilian also said that traffic studies show most traffic in northern Novi is moving toward the I-96 interchange.

"New traffic counts early spring showed traffic volumes increased 21 percent," Kilian said. "This seems to indicate a decrease on Haggerty by drivers who wish to be closer to the interchange."

The next logical improvement, he said, is to extend Decker to Twelve Mile in order to relieve Thirteen Mile and Novi Road which now carry traffic to Twelve Oaks.

Regarding the ring-road, Kilian said plans depend on the city's intentions for development. He recommended the northeast quadrant be constructed first. "It will be the most important because of the demand of traffic wanting to move in that direction. The southeast quadrant should go in as development dictates."

Kilian's recommendation to extend Decker to Twelve Mile was opposed by some council members.

Mayor Robert Schmid told the traffic consultant that he has "consistently opposed extending Decker Road" because of the impact on both the bordering

Meyer Farm property and Twelve Mile.

"Twelve Mile takes a tremendous amount of traffic presently and to bring in more cars will generate more problems," Schmid said. During peak periods you're going to have major traffic jams."

Schmid said he favored routing traffic west on Thirteen Mile to Novi Road and asked if widening Novi Road was considered.

Kilian responded that if Decker Road were built there would be no need to upgrade Meadowbrook between Twelve and Thirteen Mile, a road that is closer to the Meyer farmhouse than the Decker Road extension.

He urged the council to pursue M-275, but said it would be at least 10 years away and "you will need Decker extended a long time before 10 years from now."

Trustees Joan Daley, Norman Miller and Robert Schmid were absent for the routine budget adoption.

Before acting on the budget Trustee Ron Milam criticized new state budgetary requirements.

"I have never been more confused about the process, though I have been to more meetings this year than ever before," Milam said. "It seems like we've looked at this budget for seven meetings in a row. There has been more written about it in the paper and more money spent on advertising, but it's still confusing. That's (state) legislation I guess."

Board members subsequently adopted the budget and millage levy.

The budget projects \$9.9 million in revenues — \$9.7

million in local property taxes, \$99,000 in federal funds, \$66,000 in county revenues and \$20,000 from Oakland County.

Expenditures are expected to total \$9.89 million. They include \$5.6 million for instruction and \$4.1 million in support services. Community services will cost \$91,500.

The schools are expected to have a \$362,000 fund balance at the end of the 1982-83 fiscal year.

Novi Community Schools will levy nearly 27.9 mills to operate the district and 7 mills to repay debts incurred for projects such as the construction of school buildings.

The new millage levy represents a .8 mill rollback from last year's 28.8 mill levy. The rollback means for every \$1,000 of assessed property value taxpayers in the Novi Schools will pay 80 cents less than they paid during the 1981-82 fiscal year.

The board originally considered a 28.2 mill levy, but decided to drop the millage rate to offset six percent residential assessment increases imposed on Oakland County by the Michigan Tax Commission.

## School board dumps raise request

Top administrators in the Walled Lake School District apparently have agreed to a pay freeze for the 1982-83 school year.

And now it appears that the eight non-union administrators also may not receive a pay increase for 1981-82 as a result of action Monday by the Walled Lake Board of Education.

Specifically, the school board failed to approve a recommendation from Superintendent Donald Sheldon to give non-union administrators a retroactive eight percent increase for 1981-82 and a pay freeze for 1982-83.

All non-administrative school district

employees received raises of approximately 9 percent in 1981-82 and are slated to receive an additional 9 percent in 1982-83.

Also in the group are Assistant Superintendent Bill Hart, Human Resources Assistant Superintendent for Personnel Barry Roseborough, Elementary Education Director Hugh Davies, Secondary Education Director Donald Chalker, Auxiliary Services Director Nelson O'Shaughnessy, Transportation Supervisor Betty Scherby, Food Services Supervisor Kathy Yesh and Purchasing Agent Paul Martin.

## Lake level receives more study

When it comes to talking about the lake they share, officials in Walled Lake and Novi can agree on at least two things:

• Two-thirds of Walled Lake is in Novi,

• One-third of the lake is in Walled Lake.

But when it comes to discussing a proposed project to regulate the water level of Walled Lake, there is very little the two cities currently see eye-to-eye.

That may change after Tuesday (June 29), the date representatives of

both cities will meet with Novi's citizen drain committee in a joint session to discuss the project, and Walled Lake's involvement in it.

At issue is a \$200,000 engineering study and project that would maintain the level of Walled Lake and control drainage throughout Novi. The project would probably entail building a dam

and installing a water control gate at the south end of Walled Lake.

In restricting water flow, the dam would serve a dual purpose: allowing water to be held back in the Walled Lake basin in the spring and fall when runoff from heavy rainstorms and ice thaws threaten to flood southern Novi; and maintaining a high water level in the lake during the summer, when it traditionally drops away from the shoreline by several feet.

## Spencer seeks new post office

Wixom Mayor Lillian Spencer hopes a small but strategic increase in mail volume will help get Wixom the post office it deserves.

The volume increase consists of letters sent to Spencer by Senator Carl Levin in Washington, asking him for help in getting a replacement for the present post office or, at the very least, mail pickup from a city hall.

But so far the return mail has brought only disappointment.

One of her letters to Senator Levin, Spencer asks for "better facilities" for Wixom. "Better facilities," she says, would include a larger post office with adequate parking, or, if that's impossible, a postal drop box at city hall.

"I want a facility that will give adequate parking," Spencer says. "That facility will not. Wixom deserves better than this." The situation is getting impossible.

Spencer explained that the post office parking situation is dangerous because autos must back up onto Wixom Road to

manager James E. Miller in Royal Oak. The ultimate reply? "Nobody can do anything for Wixom right now."

"We regret we are unable to provide the type of service you request," said Miller's letter to Spencer, explaining that post offices do not prohibit carriers from picking up and delivering to rural route customers — like city hall.

Spencer has lost a round but she is not giving up the fight. A second letter to Levin calls for action.

"I feel that as usual, the post office is passing the buck," she says in the June letter, which is currently awaiting a reply. "I am very unhappy because they have decided not to do anything for Wixom when other cities are able to have better facilities."

Now, she points out, has two post offices, while Walled Lake, a smaller community, has a better one than Wixom.

"I really and truly think the post office has neglected Wixom," she said.

Get rich slick? Wixom oil field a pipe dream

Have you ever wondered if there's a fortune in oil waiting to be discovered somewhere in your back yard?

According to Tom Sharp, a spokesman for the Traverse Oil Company of Traverse City, a test well drilled by the company near Wixom has come up dry, indicating that there are probably no oil or gas deposits in the area.

The well, Sharp explained, was Traverse Oil's first attempt at drilling in Oakland County. It was a test for oil and gas borne by the "Niagara" formation. However, the well didn't hit the formation, oil or gas.

"The well was a dry hole," said Sharp. "It has been abandoned."

The company "intended operations" on the well February 15, but apparently at that well site was to "retrace the location" of the original state.

According to Sharp, only two or three wells out of every 10 wells drilled in Michigan come up with oil or gas. Traverse Oil, he said, was at the average last year, with a success rate "upwards of" 20 percent.

Sharp said that Traverse Oil drilled about 20 test wells in Michigan earlier this year in Ingham County counts as a "discovery."

The company has no plans for future drilling in Oakland County.

## Funding problems stand in way of super sewer

After 10 years of planning, the fate of a regional sewer system to serve 19 communities now depends on the willingness of those communities to finance 25 percent of construction costs.

Mayors, supervisors and managers of the communities to be served by the super sewer project were told by Wayne County Board of Public Works officials June 16 that plans are complete — the only remaining question is the "implementability" of the project.

"Implementability" is in essence a question of whether or not communities will agree to pay for construction of the project.

The development of this area is inevitable; the quality of that growth depends on whether sewage treatment is available," said Duane R. Egeland of the Wayne County Board of Public Works. "This is the most cost-effective way to provide it."

Egeland said studies show the regional sewer is the most cost effective and environmentally sound method of treating sewage in the area. "Now

the determination is whether it is sociologically acceptable; whether the communities will accept it."

Officials also were urged to approve the project on the grounds that three years of construction is expected to generate 2,000 jobs directly and nearly 5,000 spin-off jobs for suppliers and related employers.

"What jobs depend on what the communities are willing to accept and if they agree with our findings," said James Scott, consulting engineer of Black and Veatch. "Now some pro-

gram must go ahead; no single community will be able to bring the whole thing apart," he said.

The findings of planning studies call for a regional system to treat 300 million gallons of sewage per day.

Ultimately the line would reach from a treatment plant in Brownstown Township north to Commerce Township, providing service to Commerce Township, Walled Lake, Novi, Northville and Northville Township.

Routes for the sewer have been submitted to the respective road and drain

commissions in Wayne and Oakland counties and easements are being acquired.

Sewage will be routed to a plant designed to ultimately treat 24 million gallons of sewage per day.

Officials originally anticipated that the system could be constructed by selling the bonds. But due to federal budget cuts for sewer construction, it will be necessary to build the sewer in phases, as grant money becomes available.

If the measure is vetoed it will take place, Egeland said.

Should that action fail it is probable the construction program appropriation would be attached to a bill to increase the federal debt limit. "If that happens, it is assured it will pass," Kirk said.

Novi officials feel those results are of sufficient benefit to the City of Walled Lake to offset the approximately \$40,000 they would like their upstream neighbors to contribute to the project. Novi wants Walled Lake to contribute an estimated 20 percent for the cost of both the engineering study and the project itself.

So far, however, Novi has informally requested only that Walled Lake include \$3,000 in its fiscal 1982-83 budget — a proposition that Walled Lake council members emphatically rejected at a May budget session.

While Walled Lake City Manager J. Michael Dornan pointed out at the time the figure had been included in the budget of "consideration for the City of Novi" and that approving it did not constitute a commitment to participate in either the project or the study, council members balked at leaving the figure in the budget.

Subsequently, a joint session between the two councils and Novi's Storm Water Management/Flood Control Committee was arranged for 7 p.m. Tuesday at Novi City Hall to explain the project to Walled Lake officials.

The project has a long history of conflicting opinions between the two cities. Historically, Novi has maintained that Walled Lake should contribute to the project financially since it contributes to Novi's drainage system, primarily via Walled Lake. Walled Lake officials have suggested Novi stands to benefit from the project for more than Walled Lake residents and that city should not be forced to participate.

With the exception of Mayor Gaspare LaMara and Council Member Dorothy Dingman, who supported allocating \$3,000 to the project, the current slate of council members appears at this point to have aligned itself on the side of the old argument.

Council Member William Roberts, for example, commented, "(The project) is an advantage to the City of Novi, not the people of Walled Lake. We don't have

it. If you're going to conduct a study, you have to deal with everyone on the lake. It's not fair to take it into consideration," Cousineau said. "An engineering study can't be performed by just studying Novi's part of the lake. We can't study only Novi; there's just no way it can be done."

Furthermore, he said, "Anytime you establish a legal lake elevation and control the elevation, you eliminate the fluctuation in the lake, which improves water quality and drainage."

Novi City Manager Donald Kriewall agrees. Said he: "Now, the lake has as much as a two-foot variance which occurs yearly, depending on rain and snowfall. Establishing lake level will provide a more constant control of the level of the lake."

For Novi, Novi officials feel not only would Walled Lake benefit from the project, but that the upstream cities have an obligation to participate.

"Their new development drains into the lake and compounds the problem of the lake — it affects the lake level," Kriewall said. "Walled Lake is their detention basin and their depository for drainage. They are responsible for the transportation of water in a proper manner from the lake."

"We have a threatening situation on our side of the lake. You can ride around the lake in the spring and see flooding our residents."

Cousineau says establishment of lake levels and construction of controlling dikes are the first steps in developing a drainage system for both Novi and Walled Lake. Whereas relatively undeveloped areas don't require such control, because development occurs, more restraint is needed.

"A legal lake level control is normally required, or a need is shown, as areas develop," he explains. "More rural areas don't require lake level controls, because the lake controls itself naturally."

"Major construction and building changes drainage patterns. Then it is time to come in and take control of the lake level. It is needed as development occurs, as man comes in and disrupts nature; then it is time to exercise controls. That is the beginning step in the basing of a lake."

### Get public's input on election issue

Novi City Council members have put their discussion of proposed charter changes regarding municipal elections back on track with a decision to involve more citizens in the process.

A council committee, formed to look into the possibility of eliminating the primary, returned recently with a recommendation that met general disfavor among council members.

The committee proposed some general elections could be eliminated with an election process that called for a candidate to be elected if he or she received a majority of all votes cast for candidates of that office during the primary. The process would eliminate the need for a general election in some races.

The process also would change the complexion of elections in Novi, since primary elections currently are marked by poor turnout.

Concerned that candidates could almost "sneak into office" by running and winning the primary, council members asked the committee to review its proposal regarding the primary to come up with another alternative.

And when the issue was raised again before the council, decided citizen input was lacking.

We agree.

As Council Member Martha Hoyer previously noted the council is dealing with election issues and "we're seven candidates sitting here."

If the city election process is to be changed it should only be done after careful deliberation to keep it from appearing that it is solely for the expediency of the candidates.

"We're not looking for special treatment," he added. "We're only looking for fair and equitable treatment."

Voss made his comments after the board had failed to take action on Superintendent Don Sheldon's recommendation to give top administrators a retroactive pay increase of 8 percent for 1981-82 and a 10 percent increase for 1982-83. All union employees in the district received pay hikes of roughly 9 percent last year and are slated to receive another 9 percent next year.

As a result, top administrators in the school district appear headed for two consecutive years of no pay hikes whatsoever.

Voss' comments provide valuable insight into the attitudes of middle and upper level management in the Walled Lake schools.

One of the themes we've attempted to emphasize in recent weeks is the need for an atmosphere which will allow teachers to teach, administrators to administrate.

Voss told the board that it should look first at itself as being the reason behind the high percentage of reassignment requests from elementary school principals.

The reasons behind the reassignment requests are difficult to determine. The principals who have been reassigned aren't saying much.

Still, a short commentary by Maple Elementary Principal Robert Voss at Monday's school board meeting may provide some insight. Voss, incidentally, has not requested reassignment.

Voss also addressed that stand in his commentary. "You hire administrators to lead," he told the board. "I would hope you would allow them to lead."

Call it regionalism or whatever you like, but I really didn't know. As an active member of my own small community, I had no reason to visit or be concerned with anyone else's. "Well," I would tell them, trying to rationalize as I wondered inwardly what I had gotten myself into, "any job is better than no job, and a journalism job is better than any job. I guess I'll just go see what it's like."

Here's what I found out: If I crane my neck I can see the Downs from the office window. It is a long way to drive, 36 miles each way. The office is just a couple of

I've attended meetings, conducted interviews and made telephone calls to people all over this area, and even found myself participating in the "Almost Anything Goes" contest at the Novi Jaycees' Galas Days against representatives from these communities.

Every day I talk to new people, every day a little bit more about something or someone in this area. And every day I come to appreciate more fully the number and quality of people it takes to make a community what it is. Call me to the church on time. Those of us in the newspaper biz couldn't along without them, and I have no major complaint against Ma Bell.

But there are times when visual communication can be a whole lot preferable. Take last week for instance. It was getting late to our advertising deadline when a call came in from our Howell office about an ad from a company in Lansing.

The person who's responsible for scheduling ads for our different papers wrote down the name of the ad exactly as she heard it. "It's a 'Billy Graham ad,'" she said, and proceeded to schedule it for the church page.

Good choice. A Billy Graham ad properly belongs on the church page.

The only problem was that either she heard it wrong or the person who phoned in the advertisement didn't pronounce the name quite clearly enough.

It wasn't a "Billy Graham" ad; it was an ad for one of those personal message services which for a fee will have your "telegram" delivered by a belly dancer — a "Belly Gram."

Fortunately, there are several points in our system of putting together a newspaper at which such misunderstandings can be caught and corrected before they come out in print. But they don't always work, and ultimately, the editor bears the blame for not catching the mix-up in time.

The always-proper Jean Day, editor of the Northville paper, caught the verbal misunderstanding in time and had the Billy Graham/Belly Gram ad moved from the church page to a more appropriate section of the paper. The editor of the South Lyon paper wasn't so lucky, however, and readers of his paper found an ad for Belly Grams on the same page with the rest of the church news.

As for the Novi-Walled Lake paper, well, it didn't have a problem. The Billy Graham/Belly Gram ad appeared on the same page as a feature about unique gift ideas for Father's Day.

I guess that's what you call good planning.

According to reports, the man entered the station, ordered a soft drink and then pulled a revolver when the attendant walked behind the counter.


