



Citizens' concerns which prompted ly compelling to warrant a transfer of the area," hearing officer Raymond Godmer concluded in a report to State Board of Education Superintendent Phillip Runkel.

His remarks support a joint decision by the Wayne and Oakland Intermediate Schools districts denying the transfer.

Although the Novi school board did not take a formal position on the transfer request, it gave unofficial support to the boundary shift when petitions were presented last January.

The Northville school board, however, voted unanimously to oppose the request at its January 25 meeting out of concerns that it would lose approximately \$130,000 in revenues next year and face future transfer requests which could dismantle the district in the future.

The Wayne and Oakland intermediate school boards, acting jointly, denied the request on the basis that such a transfer would not be a sufficient educational benefit to the students of the district and would have no impact on the racial make-up of the district.

Quail on watch may quell EEE

A small army of sentinels will be placed on duty soon in the Novi-Walled Lake area to help the Oakland County Health Department guard against outbreaks of Eastern Equine Encephalitis

Who are the members of the elite corp that may help protect the people and horses of Oakland County from the potentially deadly mosquito-borne disease?

Birds. Bobwhite (quail) to be exact. According to Richard Parker of the health department, EEE is primarily a disease of birds, such as quail and sparrows, and there will be evidence of the disease in the quail several weeks before it will show up in horses or humans. This gives the health department time to take precautions to protect the equine and human populations

of an area. Parker said that under this year's 'encephalitis surveillance" program, four or five cages of quail will be distributed among stragetic rural areas in the county, especially two areas

where equine outbreaks have occurred in the past, the Novi area and Rose Township.

Two horses were killed by the virus in Novi last year.

The disease has never been detected in urban areas, Parker said, so testing and monitoring is confined to the rural areas of the county.

The caged quail will be given blood tests periodically to determine whether or not they have been exposed to the EEE virus, Parker said. "The belief is that it (the virus)

should show up in the sentinels many weeks prior to any humans being involved ... that gives us a lead time in formulating a plan of attack against people getting the disease," Parker ex-

According to Parker, most birds, horses and humans who come into contact with the virus do not contract EEE their systems are able to successfully repel the virus. When this happens, antibodies against that virus are formed and remain in the body for life.

Since, Parker says, antibodies against different viruses are identifiable as such, the quail's blood tests will determine if they have EEE antibodies in their systems, indicating whether or not the virus is present in the area.

"(EEE) is primarily a disease of wild birds," Parker said. "Some years the birds are more heavily affected, but it's not a detectable pattern ... sometimes the birds get it and you don't have people and horses getting sick."

According to Parker, the health department is now contacting people in the local area who may be interested in caring for a cage of sentinel quail, which will be placed in the area in early July. That, said Parker, is plenty of time to catch the spread of the virus, if it occurs this year.

"We're at the far northern range (in the country) for this disease." said Parker. "In practical terms we don't start (placing sentinels) before July ... an outbreak (affecting humans or

Alternative traffic routes urged

Decker Road should be extended directly south from Thirteen Mile to Twelve Mile instead of curved west to meet Novi Road.

That was the recommendation from a professional traffic consultant to Novi's City Council which is considering a road program for the northern part of

In making his recommendations on road improvement projects, Traffic Consultant Rolf Kilian said the amount of traffic in the northern part of the city requires another north-south artery in addition to Novi Road

"You must build as much flexibility into a road system as you can," Kilian said. "If you concentrate your efforts on Novi Road, you are dumping all your apples in one basket You need to find alternate ways to distribute traffic and get the mall traffic off Novi Road by moving it to Decker Road."

Kilian also said it may not be necesary to improve Novi Road based on the city's current land-use plans. "You want to maintain the current traffic loads on Novi Road and let growth occur on other routes," he said. He also indicated priority construc-

tion projects, respectively, are: · re-construct the Thirteen Mile/-Novi Road intersection;

• extend Decker Road to Twelve · develop a road system through West Oaks shopping center and the rest

Kilian said it is important to improve the Thirteen Mile/Novi Road intersection so a traffic signal can be installed due to the traffic increase caused by the extension of Decker Road from Fourteen and Thirteen Mile.

show most traffic in northern Novi is moving toward the I-96 interchange.

"New traffic counts in early spring showed traffic volumes inceased 21 percent," Kilian said. "This seems to indicate a decrease on Haggerty by drivers who wish to be closer to the interchange."

The next logical improvement, he said, is to extend Decker to Twelve Mile in order to relieve Thirteen Mile and Novi Road which now carry traffic to Twelve Oaks.

Regarding the ring-road, Kilian said plans depend on the city's intentions for development. He recommended the northeast quadrant be constructed first. "It will be the most important because of the demand of traffic wanting to move in that direction. The southeast quadrant should go in as development dictates.'

Kilian's recommendation to extend Decker to Twelve Mile was opposed by some council members.

Mayor Robert Schmid told the traffic consultant that he has "consistently opposed extending Decker Road" because of the impact on both the bordering

"Twelve Mile takes a tremendous amount of traffic presently and to bring in more cars will generate more problems," Schmid said. During peak periods you're going to have major traffic jams.

Schmid said he favored routing traffic west on Thirteen Mile to Novi Road and asked if widening Novi Road was considered.

Kilian responded that if Decker Road were built there would be no need to upgrade Meadowbrook between Twelve and Thirteen Mile, a road that is closer to the Meyer farmhouse than the Decker Road extension.

"If you extend Decker Road, it wi... eliminate the need to widen Novi Road," Kilian added. "When you consider the commercial demand on Twelve Mile, logically there will be more demand to develop Twelve Mile than Novi Road.

Kilian also said that shopping center

traffic will not interfere with other traffic on Twelve Mile because it will create a demand for a light at the shopping center entrance. He urged the council to pursue M-275,

Novi schools adopt budget

A \$9.89 million budget and a 35.7 mill tax levy for 1982-83 has been approved by the Novi Board of Education.

After reviewing the budget in one work session and a 15 minute public hearing, board members voted 4-0 to approve the budget Thursday.

Trustees Joan Daley, Norman Miller and Robert Schram were absent for the routine budget adoption. Before acting on the budget Trustee Ron Milam criticized new state budgetary requirements.

"I have never been more confused about the process, though I have been to more meetings this year than ever before," Milam said. "It seems like we've looked at this budget for seven meetings in a row. There has been more written about it in the paper and more money spent on advertising, but it's still confusing. That's (state) legisla-

Board members subsequently adopted the budget and millage levy. The budget projects \$9.9 million in revenues - \$9.7 million in local property taxes, \$99,000 in federal funds, \$66,000 in county revenues and \$20,000 from Oakland Coun-

Expenditures are expected to total \$9.89 million. They include \$5.6 million for instruction and \$4.1 million in support services. Community services will cost \$91,500. The schools are expected to have a \$362,000 fund balance at the end of the 1982-83 fiscal year.

Novi Community Schools will levy nearly 27.9 mills to operate the district and 7 mills to repay debts incurred for projects such as the construction of school buildings. The new millage levy represents a .8 mill rollback from

last year's 28.8 mill levy. The rollback means for every \$1,000 of assessed property value taxpayers in the Novi Schools will pay 80 cents less than they paid during the 1981-82 fiscal year.

The board originally considered a 28.2 mill levy, but decided to drop the millage rate to offset six percent residential assessment increases imposed on Oakland County by the Michigan Tax Commission.

Novi schools consider revised legal retainer

Legal counsel for the Novi Schools may be paid an hourly rate instead of a retainer if school board members approve a proposed modification in the current

The district currently retains Knauer's services for \$800 per month. Litigation.

arbitration, teacher tenure disputes, formal grievances and research and preparation for those matters aren't included in the retainer. Under the proposed fee schedule, the district will contract for 10 hours of legal services each month at \$80 per hour for an estimated \$9,600 total. Litigation, arbitration, grievances, answers to legal questions requiring research and attendance at open and closed board meetings as requested will be included in the

If required services exceed the 10-hour monthly limit, the district will be billed 80 per hour. If the district uses less than 10 hours, it will still pay the \$800 retainer. Knauer will no longer attend all board meetings as he does presently. Knauer told the board: "I think I still need to be in touch. This may be a dif-

ference in philophy. You will still see me around." Board president Joel Colliau said the board received a number of different proposals and reviewed a number of alternatives and approaches for obtaining legal

"Without casting any aspersions on Mr. Knauer or his firm, this is a different ap proach than we have had in the past," Colliau said. "One of my problems has been under the current agreement we had a retainer, plus, and it was not clear what was covered and what wasn't. There were a lot of grey areas. This clarrifies it. I'd like

to try it and see what happens.' Board member-elect Gilbert Henderson asked the board whether it gets advice from its attorney or its superintendent.

Colliau indicated the board asks the superintendent to contact the attorney for legal information. "We rely on the administration to keep us informed." "By reading this memo I see this intuitively as a change in thrust," Henderson replied. "That's okay if following this doesn't result in the district getting involved in more legal action because we haven't sought legal advice in a timely fashion. If

this leads to that you will hear from me." Trustee Ron Milam suggested the new policy would cut down on the number of "unfair" questions posed to the attorney. "On many occassions a legal issue comes up and we will turn to counsel and he can't provide a legal opinion that night. What we may expect is unfair. But sometimes I think it helps him to hear the debate." Colliau agreed the new retainer may "stop informal questions — questions in the

hallway that I think are terribly inappropriate."

Milam added that the board "holds the superintendent accountable for knowing when to seek legal counsel" as part of his administrative responsibilities." Trustee Ruth Waldenmayer said the board has benefitted in the past from Knauer's presence at meetings. "I know there have been times with the open meetings act when (Knauer) kept us out of trouble. The thing is you never know

when he will be needed." The board will take action on the proposal at its July 1 meeting.

A connection committee, formed to look into the into the possibility of eliminating the primary, returned recently with a recommendation that met general disfavor among council members.

The committee proposed some general elections could be eliminated with an election process that called for a candidate to be elected if he or she received a majority of all votes cast for candidates of that office during the primary. The process would eliminate the need for a general election in some races.

The process also would change the complexion of elections in Novi, since primary elections currently are marked by poor turnout.

Concerned that candidates could almost "sneak into office" by running and winning the primary, council members asked the committee to review its proposal regarding the primary to come up with another alter-

Novi, to me, meant Twelve Oaks Mall; Walled Lake was an expressway exit on the way to Twelve Oaks; and Wixom was "the Ford plant on 96." I had never even heard of Wolverine Lake or Commerce Township.

Then I got this internship. When I gleefully began telling people in Pinckney that I had landed a summer job at the last minute that was related to my field of study, they would congratulate me (I appreciated it), ask me how much I was going to earn (enough to pay my bills, I hope) and finally ask "where?"

"Well," I would say, "The Novi-Walled Lake News and the Northville Record share offices in Northville. That's where I'll be working most of the time."

Smiles would be replaced by blank faces or frowns "That's such a long way to drive." "Is your office near Northville Downs?" "Where's Twelve Oaks from there?" "That's not far from Detroit...is it?" "What's in Walled Lake (besides a lake), Novi (besides the mall), Wixom (besides the Ford plant)?"

Call it regionalism or whatever you like, but I really didn't know. As an active member of my own small community, I had no reason to visit or be concerned with anyone else's. "Well," I would tell them, trying to rationalize as I wondered inwardly what I had gotten myself into, "any job is better than no job, and a journalism job is better than any job. I guess I'll just go see

Here's what I found out: If I crane my neck I can see the Downs from the office window. It is a long way to drive, 36 miles each way. The office is just a couple of

miles from Twelve Oaks. And, when you compare it to the drive from Pinckney to Detroit...Walled Lake, Wixom, Novi and Northville aren't far from the city.

So what's in Walled Lake (besides a lake)? What's in Novi (besides the mall)? What's in Wixom (besides the Ford plant)?

Enter reality. Besides the obvious landmarks and the businesses, homes and city offices that have a place everywhere, there are people, doing the best they can with what they have, not much different from their counterparts 36 miles away in Pinckney or, I suspect,

In the past five weeks, I've talked to a diverse group of these people that includes high school scholars, numerous local officials, Novi Library's family of the year, a female basketball referee, five brothers and sisters who run a restaurant and my share of politicians. I've attended meetings, conducted interviews and made telephone calls to people all over this area, and even found myself participating in the "Almost Anything Goes" contest at the Novi Jaycees' Gala Days against representatives from these communities.

Every day I talk to new people, every day I learn a little bit more about something or someone in this area. And every day I come to appreciate more fully the number and quality of people it takes to make a community what it is. "Walled Lake is Beautiful" and "Ride the Novi Special" T-shirts show that people have pride in their cities, and I haven't come across anybody who has told me they don't like where they're living.

I like to think that reading about themselves in the newspaper has something to do with the positive way people feel about their communities, and I like knowing that I'm part of it. So far, it's been a lot of fun for me discovering reality through the people I meet and the things that go on around here, and I think I'm going to enjoy spending the rest of the summer writing about it.

CITY OF WIXOM **ORDINANCE NO. 118**

THE CITY OF WIXOM ORDAINS: SECTION 1 — Permission is hereby granted to THE DETROIT EDISON COMPANY, a corporation organized and existing concurrently under the laws of the States of Michigan and New York, its successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate in the public streets, highways, alleys, and other public places in the City of Wixom, Oakland County, Michigan, all needful and proper poles, towers, mains, wires, pipes, conduits and all such lines and other apparatus requisite for the transmission, transforming and distribution of electricity for public and private use, and to transact a local electric business within said City subject, however, to all conditions and restrictions hereinafter contained.

SECTION 2 — the conditions of the foregoing grant are as follows: A. The grantee shall do no injury to any street, highway, alley or other public place, or to any shade trees, or in any manner disturb or interfere with any water or gas pipes, or with any public or private sewer, now or hereafter laid or constructed by any authorized person

B. The City may, in its discretion, grant permission for the trimming of trees when necessary to make the lines safe and accessible,

such trimming to be done under its supervision. C. The construction of the said lines shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Michigan Public Service Commission or its successor.

D. The said grantee, before entering upon any street, highway, alley or other public place for the purpose of erecting and constructing any poles, mains, wires, pipes, conduits or other apparatus, shall in writing notify the City or its representatives of the proposed construction, and shall, if the City so requires, file with them a sufficient plan and specification, showing the nature and extent of the proposed erection and construction.

E. No street, highway, alley or public place shall be allowed to remain open or encumbered by the construction work of the said grantee for a longer period of time than shall be necessary to execute: the said work, and the grantee shall at all times conform to all ordinances of the City, now or hereafter in force, relative to the fencing and lighting of obstructions and excavations.

F. The grantee shall save the City harmless from any judgemen

that may be recovered against the City by reason of the wrongdoing or negligence of the said grantee of the erection and maintenance o said poles, mains, wires and other apparatus or construction. G. Said grantee shall make due provisions upon five days notice in writing by raising its wires or otherwise, for the passage of any barn, building or other structure on or over any street, highway, o public place occupied by the mains, wires, poles, and apparatus of

said grantee.
SECTION 3 — In consideration of the granting of this franchise, grantee agrees that its rates and charges for electric service in the Ciy of Wixom shall not exceed its rates and charges for like service elsewhere in its service area, as evidenced by its uniform rate schedules at the time on file with and approved by the Michigan Public Service Commission. It is understood that the grantee is subject to regulation by the Michigan Public Service Commission and that any order, rule, or regulation by that Commission, or its successor, will prevail over any regulation herein contained or provided for in case of

SECTION 4 — This grant shall take effect if said grantee shall within fifteen days from the date of the passage of this ordinace, file with the City Clerk its written acceptance of the terms of the same; and upon the confirmation of this grant, by the affirmative vote of the three-fifths majority of the electors of said City, voting thereon at a Regular State Primary election to be held on Tuesday, the 10th day of August, 1982, as provided for by the Statutes and the State Constitution. If not confirmed by the electors voting at said election, this or-

dinance shall be null and void.

SECTION 5 — This Franchise and Ordinance shall be and remain in force for thirty (30) years from and after the date of its confirmation by the electors of the City of Wixom, Oakland County, Michigan. SECTION 6 — Nothing in this grant shall be construed to alienate the title of the public in and to any street, highway, alley or public place or any portion thereof, neither shall anything herein be con-

strued in any manner as a surrender by the City of Wixom of its legislative power with respect to the subject matter hereof, or with respect to any other matter whatsoever; nor as in any manner limiting the right of the said City of Wixom to lawfully regulate the use of any street, avenue, highway or public place within its jurisdiction.

Made and passed by the City Council of the City of Wixom on the 15th day of June, 1982.

Plenty of work ahead for gardeners in June

Last year my hybrid roses began blooming in June. This year the plants are growing long, gangly canes with huge thorns and, so far, no sign of flower buds. The leaves look different this year, too - coarser, somehow. What's

It sounds as if the hybrid tea scions were winter killed, leaving the rootstock to which they were grafted to send up shoots. Dig and replace them and give some thought to improving your method of winter protection

Got a gardening problem?

Just ask the plant doctor

I am thinking about starting a compost pile in my suburban back yard. Is it likely to produce a disagreeable odor that will bother my neighbors?

A well-managed compost pile does not stink. Keep it moist and wellaerated by frequent turning so materials decompose quickly. Adding some nitrogen fertilizer to the soil and organic matter in the pile also will make it work faster.

I have been wondering about introducing some praying mantises into my garden for biological pest control. Is this a good idea?

It won't hurt anything, but you probably shouldn't count on praying mantises to solve all your pest problems for you. True, they are voracious predators, but they also are territorial — each one establishes a territory about a yard square and defends it against other mantises. Those you introduce may spend as much time killing each other as destroying pests. They also prey on beneficial insects and may kill as many or more of these as the pests you would like to control.

The cabbage plants I transplanted into my garden looked fine for a while. Now they're wilting, even though they are getting plenty of water. Is it a

It could be cabbage root maggots, the larvae of small flies which feed on the roots of cabbage and related plants. The best treatment is prevention by treating the soil with diazinon at planting time. Post-planting treatments with diazinon are generally ineffective. Crop rotation is important.

Are taste repellents effective against rabbits in the vegetable garden? Hinder, a special formulation of ammonium hydroxide, is safe and effective if applied to all vulnerable plants and other vegetation immediately ad-

In addition, it must be reapplied after any rain or overhead irrigation and must be applied to all new growth as it appears. Inspect the garden weekly and reapply Hinder at the first sign of rabbit damage.

My neighbor says I can use a piece of garden hose to scare birds out of my strawberry patch. The trouble is, he didn't explain how.

Cut a piece of garden hose to about three to four feet in length and pose it snake-like where birds venturing into your garden can see it. Move it daily so birds don't have a chance to get used to it and discover that it's not really a snake and can't hurt them. Place it in plain sight one day; partially conceal it the next. As added insurance, remove the hose occasionally and replace if for one

day with aluminum pie pans dangling from stakes. Remember, any frightening device becomes ineffective if not altered daily.
