Woman dies in *traffic collision

A Novi woman was killed and her two grandchildren were injured when their car was struck broadside as it was traveling north on Novi Road near the Goat Farm Tavern July 27.

Barbara June Brown, 45, of 41812 Quince, died after being transported to Botsford Hospital.

Brown's grandchild, Sean Farrell, 4, was released from Botsford Hospital Thursday. The second passenger, Jamie Farrell, 6, is in fair condition at Children's Hospital in Detroit.

Hospital officials said fair condition is a favorable prognosis, meaning the child s conscious and in stable condition, but may be either uncomfortable or have minor complications.

Brown's car was struck by an automobile driven by Ralph J. Auten, Jr., of 23615 Ripple Creek, according to police. Auten was treated for injuries and released from Botsford Hospital the day of the accident.

Auten allegedly failed to yield the right of way as he turned onto Novi Road, Before striking Brown's car, Auten drove his 1978 Oldsmobile more than 200 feet

across the grass in front of the Goat Farm Tavern parking lot and the southbound The impact of the collision forced both automobiles off the road, police reported.

There was extensive damage to the front of Auten's vehicle. Brown's 1981 Plymouth received extensive damage to the left front side.

Police said they could not determine the speed of either car or whether alcohol was involved in the incident. A routine blood test was conducted on the man, but results are not yet in.

City rewrites rules challenged in suit

With a court date with Bob Evans Farms, Inc. looming before them, Novi City Council members have amended the ordinance originally used to keep the restaurant from locating near the front of the West Oaks Shopping Center. City Attorney David Fried introduced the ordinance changes, which he says

clears up any alleged amibiguity.' Fried noted the ordinance revisions were proposed after the city received a request for site plan approval from Bob Evans Restaurant.

After several meetings with representatives of the restaurant chain, council members voted 5-2 to reject the plans on the grounds they would hinder "harmonious land uses" in the area. The council also refused to reconsider the action after meeting repeatedly with representatives of the company and learning they wanted to maintain the red building which is consider the

Bob Evans logo. Bob Evans has filed suit in Oakland County Court asking that the ordinance plans be struck down. The matter is said. scheduled to be heard Friday, but has already been adjourned several times.

"During the course of the discussion with the applicant questions were raised by the developer, including whether the ordinance allowed the city control over architecture and design standards within a planned development," Fried said. "It was the developers' position that the ordinance was ambiguous and didn't give the council the authority to make decisions on those grounds.

"To resolve any alleged ambiguities in the original ordinance this ordinance spells out in more detail the criteria that was not detailed, but which was encompassed within the original ordinance," Fried explained.

The revised oridinance can have immediate effect on Bob Evans, Fried told the council.

Fried said after the meeting that he believes the Bob Evans plans can be reconsidered under the terms of the amended ordinance.

"One of the issues we've presented to the court is that they can return to the council under the new ordinance, because they have no vested right in the current ordinance. They have done used as the basis for rejecting the site nothing with their property," Fried

If you ask Russ Button, he'll tell you he owns the best spot in Novi for a hotel. "You can see it one mile either way on the expressway," says Button of his 8.5 acres on the east side of Novi Road. But his plans for the property have been thwarted by both the Novi Schools and the City of Novi, according to But-

He's owned a portion of the property since 1959 when he paid \$16,000 for two acres of land and a house.

Later he acquired two additional parcels, both 66 feet wide, one being 660-feet long and a second 1,320-feet

His plan was to develop it as a mobile home park, providing tax dollars to the city. But he always thought eventually he would sell the property to a hotel

When he proposed the mobile home park to city officials, however, they turned him down. "I had plans, engineering and state ter.

Button says he once received a \$750,000 written offer for the land — and that was before the Novi Road bridge over I-96 was constructed.

Now he figures the land would be worth \$1 million, if anybody could get to

Button's property is land-locked. Once the property had frontage on Novi Road, but it was cut off when the state money they could have made in interest purchased easements for highway ac-

The state offered to buy Button's 8.5 acres for \$39,500. Needless to say he rejected their offer.

"If all those little pieces could have been bought up under one ownership, the city could have forced the state to provide access. What happened was they just land-locked it and went home Without access, the residents on the

property were moved out by the state and their homes have stood empty since that time, according to Button. Button is not particularly encouraged

by the recent talk of a ring-road around the Grand River/Novi Road intersection. Plans call for a road off the ringroad to connect to Button's property.

"There was a ring-road proposed 20 years ago and nothing ever happened with it. It will probably come about some day, but I'd hate to predict

In fact Button says he doesn't expect the property to be developed in his lifetime. "I'll just sit on it and let my kids worry about it."

Button contends the school board holds the key to development of that area. He chastises the board for not selling Novi Elementary School.

"They had an offer five years ago, but someone said they needed to have a little more (money). Think of the by this time," Button says. "I don't think anything will open until the school board makes a move. But they'll wait until they get an offer that sounds like good politics to the rest of the housewives on the board."

(The school board received an offer for the school and the 11.3 acres it sits on, but school board members believed the terms of the sale were not favorable to the district. Superintendent Robert Pikwo reports: "If we received an offer that was fair and equitable we would be willing to sell it, but we're not going to just give it away.

(Although the district has said in the past it would try to sell the property for the cost of replacing the elementary building, Piwko said the current state of the construction business "would make that price difficult to determine." He added: "The population is such that

Lakeshore beach to be lengthened

The City of Novi has purchased property at a cost of \$20,000 from Fraser Staman which will add approximately 100 feet to the existing beach. The \$20,000 will come from federal Housing and Community Development Block Grant funds. City Manager Edward Kriewall said purchase of the property adds width to the Lakeshore beach, "enhancing it and making it more attractive for the residents." The land is on the north side of South Lake Drive, just east of the ex-

It is probable the existing timber wall will be extended to the new portion of the beach, along the contour of the beach as necessary, O'Branovic said. It will

Have you ever noticed how many reporters these days start their stories with a quote, set off in italics just like this, hoping to catch the essence of their story with someone else's

Having used this column to poke fun at the way everyone rom the city attorney to the superintendent of schools talks, it has been brought to my attention that it is only fair journalists' foibles receive equal recognition.

Unfortunatedly, when it comes to writing and speaking, reporters can be as trendy as the next people, as anyone who has counted the number of stories that start with quotes

And, yes, we have our own trade jargon so we can talk to each other and the uninitiated will think we understand one A "lead" can be either the beginning of a story or the top

story on the front page. Once you get past that journalism trade talk gets violent. A reporter covers a "beat."

Dots that set off clauses following a colon are "bullets." A story that is not used in any given newspaper is "killed." Part of a story that is not needed is "cut." A short, little headline on top of a bigger headline is a

A "slug" is a short name used to identify a story.

And cub reporters who get "scooped" by the competition never get to star in candy bar commercials. Now that hurts. Journalistic jargon is as highly contageous as municipalese (the language of public servants — those people who say utilize when use will do). Journalists learn jargon in

JRN 101, from the people we read each day and from the people we work with. For example, you might have wondered why some

reporters use the word "however" so much. Back in journalism school they called it a transition; a little bridge to get you from one paragraph to another. Putting the word "however" at the beginning of a paragraph made my journalism professors happy. They thought I had learned how to write transitions. They put little red circles around the word "however." They made notes on the side of the paper exclaiming what a good transition it was. I filled my stories with "howevers." Still do. Besides their dissemination through academia, journalistic

jargon and municipalese have another thing in common they are cyclical.

One week all five the newspapers in our group had front page stories starting with the two words: "It's official." Another journalistic trick. Start a story with a statement, followed by a paragraph with the appropriate attribution. For

"The wobble of the earth will someday cause the planet to tip on its axis, initiating the second Ice Age." "That, at any rate, was the conclusion of a leading astronomer who calls himself the Ice Man."

Discerning newspaper readers can identify "That, at any rate" and "was the conclusion" as the too-often-used offending phrases here. Leading experts are good in attribution paragraphs, but city officials will do.

Regular newspaper readers will also recognize the pushy "If Archibald Rosencrantz has his way ..."

A variation is the "If everything goes according to plan..." Every reporter has used these beginning paragraphs

though they may admit it only under torture. Once a reporter struggles through the lead, he or she may become bogged down in the middle of the copy. (Pay attention to these trade words and you too can talk like Billie Newman.) A list of frequently-used reporter catch-phrases, for sticking in the middle of copy, and their definitions to help you decode them as you peruse your paper has been compiled

"Controversial" — an adjective added in an attempt to spark interest in a story the reporter's own mother wouldn't

'Approximately' — a word taught in journalism schools to proceed all numbers. Journalism professers teach reporters to round off all numbers because they say people can't comprehend a number with more than three figures. "Earlier" — the reporter can't remember exactly when.

"Recently" — the story didn't get in the paper the week the "recent" event happened, there is no guaranteeing it will get in this week. To keep it from looking three weeks old "recently" is inserted where the date was. "Additionally." "also." "specifically" and "on the other

hand" — you are crossing the bridge between paragraphs. "Apparently" - we're not sure, but someone told us this







One of our long-standing disagreements involves the Michigan Education Assessment Program (MEAP) conducted every fall by the State Department of Education. It's the test administered to all fourth, seventh and tenth graders which measures performance on selected math and reading objectives.

Mrs. Brown doesn't like the fact that MEAP results are published in newspapers so the general public can use them to make comparisons between school districts.

Similarly. Stowe isn't sure how long a typical set will stand up under the strain of soap opera-style living. "I don't know what kind of abuse the sets will take," Stowe says. "There's a lot of door-slamming, people throwing things. You know, you've got to have sex, violence and drug addiction (to sell a soap), I guess you'd say." Aside from the mechanical dilemmas
