

Bob Evans again seeks hearing before planners

Plans for a Bob Evans Restaurant that were killed by the Novi City Council earlier this year will be resurrected at a hearing before the planning board October 27.

Rejection of the site plans prompted the restaurant corporation to file a law suit asking that the ordinance used as grounds for rejecting the plans be struck down.

Since then it has been determined the city council had no power to approve or reject the preliminary site plan.

In proceedings before Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Fred Mester, the city argued the lawsuit is unfounded because the plans that were dismissed were preliminary site plans. Final site plans had not been submitted to the city and the lawsuit would not be valid until final plans were submitted for council consideration.

Bob Evans has now submitted a final site plan which must be reviewed by the planning board, which will make a recommendation to the city council.

However, the submitted plans are "essentially the same" as those already rejected by the city, according to Bob Evans' attorney Norman Hyman.

"I haven't gone over the plans that closely, so I wouldn't want to say they are exactly the same as those already submitted, but I believe they are close to being the same," Hyman said.

Hyman noted the final site plans had been submitted "in hopes they will be approved and in the hope it may clarify the issues now pending. We thought this would clear things up and make for a more orderly presentation of the lawsuit."

Another twist to the case is that the city has revised the ordinance used to keep Bob Evans from locating near the front of West Oaks Shopping Center since the time the restaurant corporation submitted the original site plans.

Whether the original ordinance or the amended ordinance will be used to judge the final site plan has not been determined. City Attorney David Fried contends the site plan submitted

for final approval must comply with the newly-enacted amendment to the restrictions regulating development under the planned development option — an option available to developers in the regional center area around Twelve Oaks Mall.

When asked which set of standards he expects to be applied to the final site plan review, Hyman said: "I expect we'll be given a hearing on our site plan application, other than that I don't want to speculate."

The court has made no determination whether the amended ordinance will become a part of the lawsuit.

"Until the court decides that question we're taking no position on whether the (amended) ordinance applies to our plan or is valid," Hyman said. "That is the next step."

But Hyman already has asked the court to reject the city's attempts to introduce the amended ordinance into the suit, because the amendment was enacted after Bob Evans filed its suit.

Red Lobster restaurant welcomed to mall area

For the sea food lover in you, Novi City Council members have welcomed a Red Lobster restaurant to the community, but not without a minor struggle.

Red Lobster representatives received half of what they asked for when they appeared before the city council Monday to seek a liquor license and site plan approval for the restaurant to be located near the entrance of Twelve Oaks Mall.

Council members rejected the liquor license request, saying the city would hold its one remaining license for a "more intense use," such as a convention center.

But after much debate the council approved the site plans for the sea food restaurant.

Council members struggled over the decision due to a city requirement that restaurants developed under a planned development option be located at least 1,000 feet apart, a stipulation designed

to prevent the proliferation of fast food restaurants. They also indicated they would not be receptive to requests from the Taubman Company for a third restaurant along Novi Road in the future.

Concerns with traffic generated by the restaurant at the already-congested mall entrance also caused council members to hesitate over their decision to approve Red Lobster's plans.

Dan Crowin, a Taubman Company representative speaking on behalf of Red Lobster, asked the council to waive the 1,000 foot requirement because other pieces of property around the mall were unsuitable due to topographical considerations. Problems in finding a suitably sized location for the restaurant also have been created by the city's lot split ordinance.

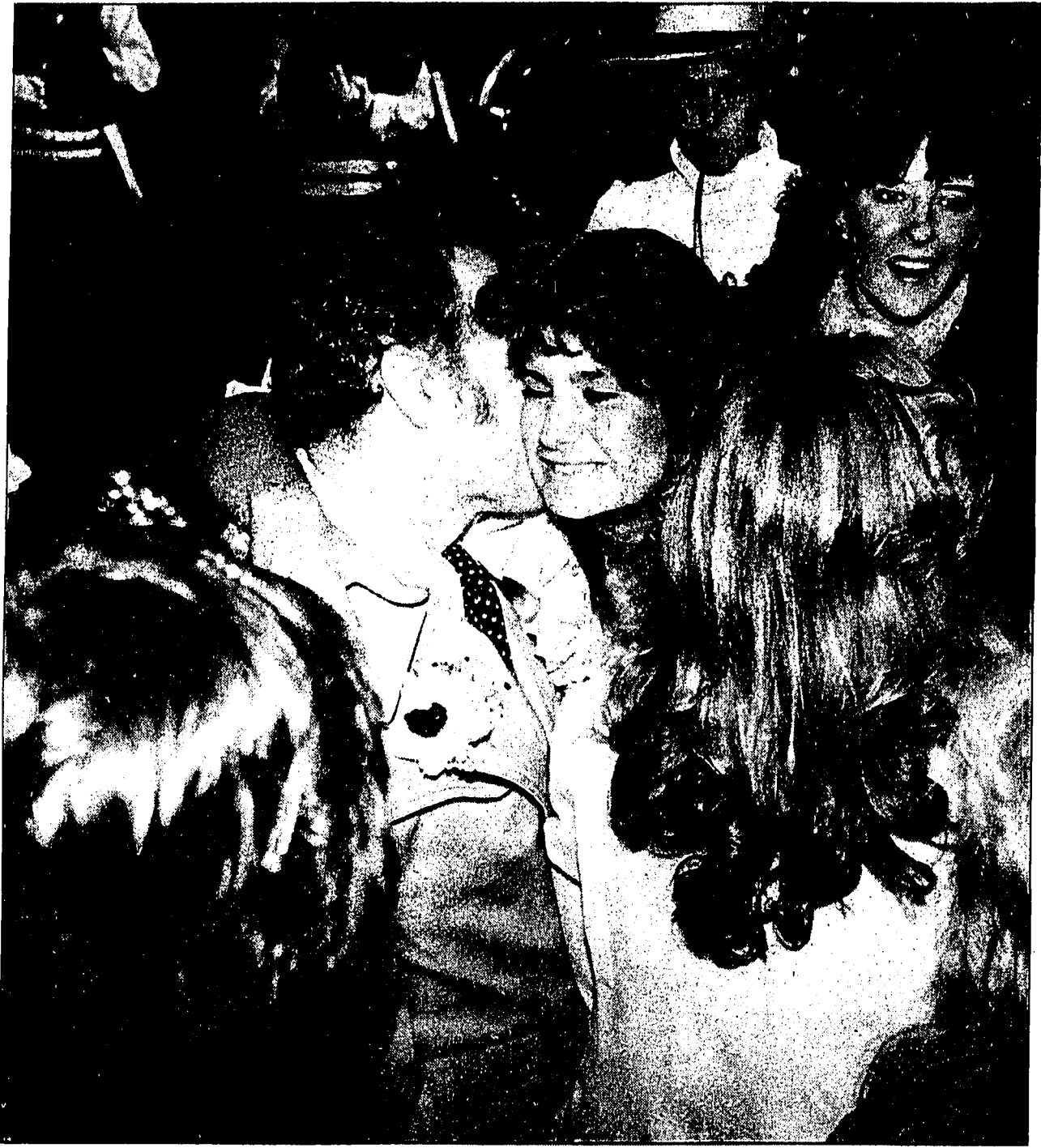
In order to conform to city requirements two lots were joined, putting the Red Lobster on a piece of property which is substantially larger than required by the zoning ordinance, Crowin said.

He also asked the council to consider the restaurant company's "display of cooperation." He noted the size of the lot, quality of architecture which includes brick and deviates from other Red Lobster restaurants, and landscaping which exceeds city requirements.

"This is one of Red Lobster's most unique buildings," Crowin said.

City Planner Charles Cairns recommended approval of the site plans, say-

Enrollment down by 70 students

Enrollment in Novi schools dipped slightly for the second year, with 70 fewer students attending classes this year than last.

A count of students released at the October 7 meeting of the Novi Board of Education showed 3,094 students enrolled in Novi's six schools, a decrease of about two percent from the 1981 Fourth Friday count of 3,164 students.

Last year's decline was the first time since 1970 the school district lost students. Enrollment dropped by 22 students from 1980 to 1981.

However, Superintendent Dr. Robert Piwko said the decrease fell within the district's enrollment projections for this year. He said school officials had expected enrollment to remain close to last year's level or show a slight decline. No increase was expected, he said.

Novi Middle School North recorded the largest drop in student population, with 83 fewer students enrolled this year. The population fell from 565 fifth and sixth grade students in 1981 to 482 this year.

The student population at Village Oaks Elementary also showed a drop. Only 296 students are enrolled at the school this year, in contrast to last year's 338 students — a decrease of 42 children.

However, both Novi Middle School South and Novi High School showed increases this year. There are 578 seventh

port staff will remain the same.

Trustee Robert Schram expressed concern that the district was hiring replacements for five teachers for the coming school year in light of declining enrollment.

But Piwko responded that although a reduction in the teaching staff had been considered, "the way the numbers fall, it just doesn't work."

Piwko said if the district had decided to reduce its teaching staff, "what we would have ended up creating at the elementary level would be a lot of turmoil and turnover and the same with the other schools."

Spirits distributor to operate in Novi

A major importer and distributor of liquor and spirits is moving its world headquarters to Novi.

The Mohawk Liquor Company, a division of Foremost-McKesson, Inc., has already started to move into the former Adell Industries building at I-96 and Novi Road.

Ray Hyde, a Foremost-McKesson official based in the New York office, confirmed last week that Mohawk Liquors already has started moving from its existing facility in Detroit to the new headquarters in Novi.

"We simply outgrew our existing facilities," said Hyde. "We started searching for an outside warehouse facility about a year ago, but it quickly became apparent that more storage capacity was not going to be the answer.

"Due to the present size of Mohawk

and our projected growth, we decided we needed a larger facility for increased production as well as warehousing."

Hyde said Mohawk was "very excited" about moving to Novi and said the Adell Industries building was ideal for its operations.

"We need very high fire standards because we're dealing with high levels of alcoholic content," he explained. "When spirits are imported from abroad, they're often shipped over at 180 proof and then refined down to appropriate levels.

"This building answers all our needs," he added. "It's the safest building I've ever seen in terms of fire protection. Adell used to manufacture windshield solvent here so the fire standards are extremely high. It has an

Former mayor to get involved ... in Washington

What do the City of Novi, Washington D.C., and a tiny school for the handicapped in the African state of Namibia have in common?

Romaine Roethel, Novi's first woman mayor and her husband, John, both active in local politics since they moved to Novi from Detroit in 1971, will soon make another move.

This time it will be to Washington D.C. where John, retired from Ford Motor Company, will work as a patent attorney and Romaine, mother of four grown children, will do what she does best — get involved, probably in politics.

Politics are nothing new to the Roethels.

Monday, October 25 has been named Roethel Day. John and Romaine Roethel will be honored for their past service to the community at a gathering at 7 p.m.

She and her husband entered Novi politics shortly after their arrival in the city, when he received an appointment to the planning board. She began attending city council meetings to "express some opinions" about development in

her subdivision, and soon found herself hooked.

"I discovered there was going to be a vacancy on the council and I really lobbied for the appointment," said Roethel. She got it in April 1973. The following November she ran for a four-year term — and got the highest number of votes in the race.

"Campaigns have never been the same in this city since," she says, laughing. "I put up posters, passed out literature, rang a lot of doorbells and nobody had done that before ... they called my campaign workers 'Roethel's Raiders'."

In 1977, Roethel quit the council, not to get out of politics but to get in even deeper. She ran for mayor and won.

Police dispatching may be combined

By KAREN RICE Police dispatching services for Walled Lake and Wolverine Lake may be consolidated within the next few months. The Wolverine Lake Village Council authorized Administrator Bill O'Brien to investigate that possibility October 13 after O'Brien revealed the City of Walled Lake had suggested the two share dispatching services. O'Brien said he had few details because the proposal "just came up," only a few hours before the council meeting at which members accepted a request for retirement from Betty Bruder, one of Wolverine Lake's two full-time dispatchers.

Walled Lake City Manager J. Michael Dornan confirmed the city had suggested Wolverine Lake consider sharing dispatching with them and said it was something Walled Lake has been considering for some time. He said the city "could accommodate" a pair of trained dispatchers from Wolverine Lake. Dornan said the city also has long supported the concept of shared services between municipalities and suggested this might be the most

Search underway for village manager

By KAREN RICE The Wolverine Lake Village Council has begun its search for a new administrator after accepting the request for retirement from Bill O'Brien at the October 13 meeting. O'Brien, the village's top appointed official for the past 10 years, will retire February 28, 1983. He has also asked to

take about six weeks of vacation prior to that date and is planning to leave in mid-January. The council authorized O'Brien and clerk Donna Thorsberg to begin advertising in local newspapers and trade journals for a new administrator. After discussing whether to set up a committee to screen applicants for the administrator's job, the village council decided that all members should be in on the selection process. All will receive copies of resumes and letters of inquiry, individually narrowing the field down to their top choices. The full council will then convene to determine finalists and will interview those candidates in public meetings. However, several council members expressed concern at the prospect of operating the village without an administrator for several weeks or months. Council Member Tom Gerhard said he was not happy with being left "a little high and dry" between administrators and questioned whether O'Brien could alter his vacation plans, dividing his time off into two blocks. He also suggested it might be wise to hire an administrator before O'Brien leaves and name him acting administrator.

Trustees will study finances

Walled Lake's Board of Education will hold a special meeting next Monday to examine the official audit from the 1981-82 school year. The meeting will be held in the Administration Building in Walled Lake at 7:30 p.m. The board set the special meeting to discuss the district's financial condition in greater detail after receiving the official audit at its October 4 meeting. Lyle Algate of the accounting firm of Plante & Moran reported that the Walled Lake Consolidated Schools finished the 1981-82 school year with a Fund Equity (savings account) of \$790,400. Algate reported that the district spent approximately \$379,000 more than it took in last year. Total revenues for 1981-82 year were roughly \$23.8 million, while expenditures totaled \$24.26 million.

Dick's fund gets assist from events

There will be lots of activity for the next two weeks among businesses and service groups who are backing the drive to buy a van for Dick Edgington, 16, of Wolverine Lake. Dick is a victim of cerebral palsy who lives with his foster mother, Carol Pitcher, a special education teacher in Waterford. Thanks to community fund-raisers organized by family friend Jackie Somerville and sponsored by the Walled Lake Jaycees, Dick is moving ever closer to what seemed like a dream for him just weeks ago. More than \$2,500 has been raised to purchase a van for Dick and a wheelchair lift has been contributed to the effort. During the next two weeks, that sum is expected to grow considerably — with four special fund-raisers slated. Beginning tomorrow (Thursday), the Walled Lake Jaycees will begin operating their haunted house at 421 Pontiac Trail. A portion of the proceeds will go to help Dick. In addition, friends will sell pumpkins at the haunted house. Thanks to Jaycee Dave Roddy, the pumpkins were donated to the cause and all funds from their sale will be added. On Saturday (October 23), the Walled Lake Big Boy Restaurant will give half the money raised during breakfast, from 6-11 a.m., according to owner Georgine Hayes. And on Sunday (October 24) from 8-11 a.m., the Walled Lake Big Boy will do the same thing, owner Tom Borin says. Workers at both restaurants have agreed to volunteer their time to assist in the fund-raisers. And Now Printing on Pontiac Trail has printed up 1,500 flyers to advertise the fund-raisers, at no cost to the project. They will be distributed at both restaurants, the haunted house and churches this weekend. Topping off the trio of events, the Walled Lake United Methodist Church's teen club is completing plans for a rock-athon October 30 at the church. Sylvia Whitmer concentrates on learning

EDITOR'S NOTE: There are five new elementary school principals in the Walled Lake School District this year. This is the last in a series of articles introducing them. By PHILIP JEROME

What elementary school principal in the Walled Lake School District is also a school board member? The answer is Sylvia Whitmer, the new principal at Oakley Park Elementary School. She's not a member of the Walled Lake school board, of course, but she is a member of the school board in Birmingham. And, she says, her dual roles as principal and board member are totally consistent with her personality and interests.

"I've been fascinated all my life with how people learn," she said. "Learning theory and the psychology of learning have always been special interests, and I've explored them from every angle from classroom teacher to principal and school board member." Born in Winnipeg, she moved with her family to Michigan and attended elementary school in Richmond until seventh grade when the family moved again to Detroit. "Richmond was a small town and I attended a small-town country school," she said. "It's somewhat ironic to be a principal now in Walled Lake because the big field trip of the year back in Richmond was to travel by bus out to the Walled Lake Amusement Park."

Wixom considers noise regulations

Wixom officials are considering an amendment to the city's go-cart ordinance as a means of dealing with noise created by ultralight aircraft stationed at Spencer Memorial Airport.

The problem was brought to light when Larry Rourke, records clerk for the Wixom Police Department, complained about the "noise pollution" created by the aircraft at the September 28 council meeting.

Describing them as "hang-gliders with motors," Rourke said the noise is a problem because the one-man aircraft, which are not regulated by the Federal Aviation Administration, fly low to the ground at a very low rate of speed.

Additional complaints about the ultralight aircraft were expressed last week by Council Members William Wylie and Wayne Glessner.

Wylie said the ultralights are "noisy and take a long time to fly overhead" and Glessner expressed concerns about the height at which the aircraft are flown.

"They fly those things within 50-75 feet of high tension wires and they're very low over the lake," said Glessner.

City Attorney Thomas Connelly, who was directed by the council September 28 to investigate solutions, said last week that the city's existing go-cart ordinance would seem to answer all concerns.

"The go-cart ordinance requires local licensing and restricts decibel levels," said the city attorney. "The wording is perfect except that it applies only to go-carts."

It would be a very simple matter to amend the ordinance so that it applies to these ultralight aircraft as well.

The council subsequently directed Connelly to pursue an amendment to the go-cart ordinance, but no date was established for the proposed amendment to be presented for council approval.

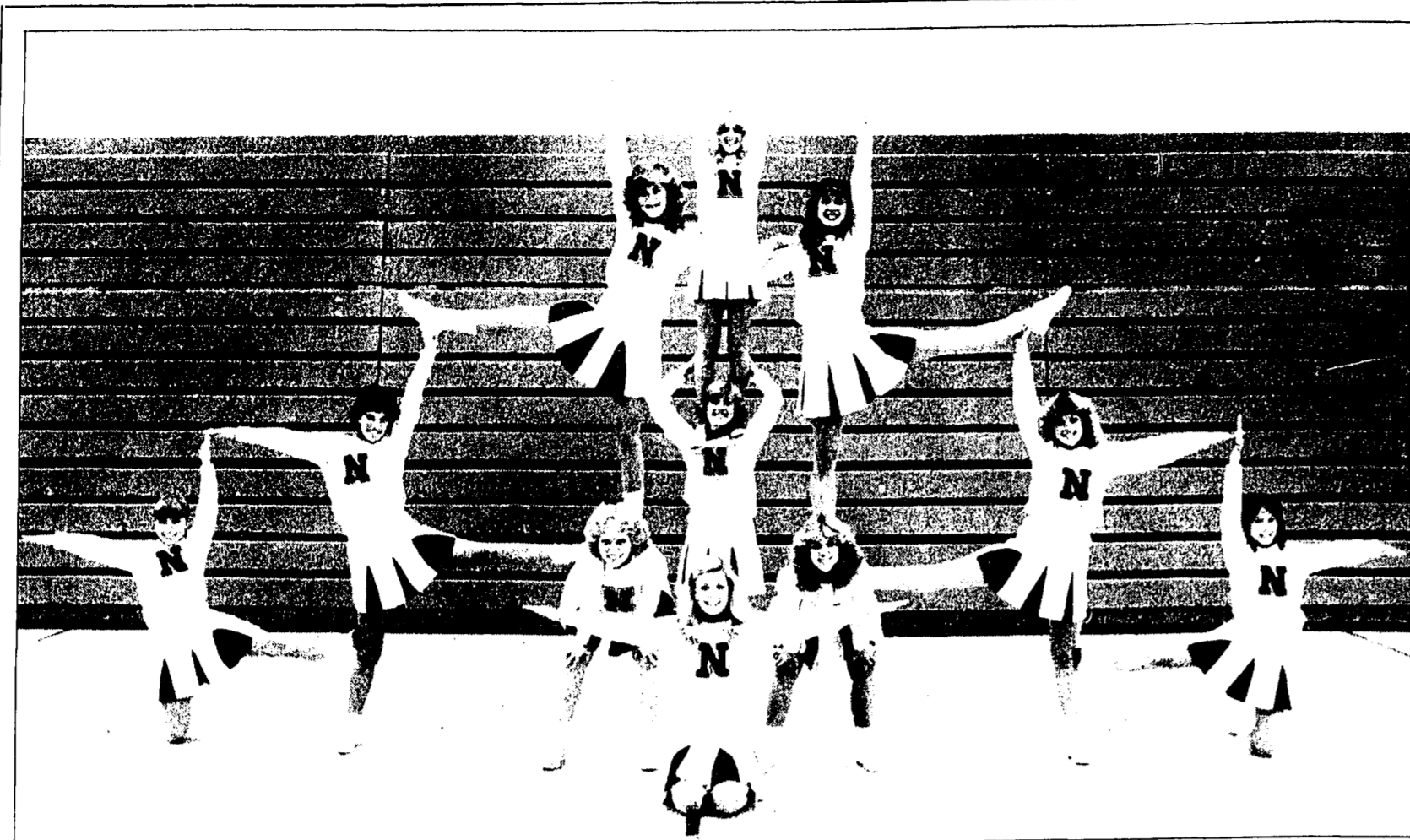

economical and efficient solution for both communities.

Walled Lake dispatchers already handle all calls between midnight and 4 a.m., a service for which Wolverine Lake pays \$1,200 annually.

The Wolverine Lake switchboard operates on two eight-hour shifts, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and 4 p.m. to midnight, seven days weekly.

O'Brien told council members he had no details of Walled Lake's plan to consolidate dispatching, but said he thought the city was interested in adding two dispatchers to its staff and having Wolverine Lake continue to pay their salaries. The consolidation would eliminate part-time help, O'Brien said.

O'Neill opposed the concept, saying he thought Wolverine Lake should retain its autonomy and keep its dispatchers. He said village residents would be back him in attempting to keep dispatching services within their local police department and suggested the council

"I think about it" before consolidating services.

But Council Member Geri Matkowski said the option was one that must be considered. She pointed out state and federal funds are being slashed frequently and that if the village council does not make some painful cuts in its budget, the only alternative could be raising millage—which she said would cost more people than seeing dispatching go to Walled Lake.

"It's just getting to a point of dollars," she said. "Somewhere along the line we have to do something to consider the future and what's going to happen."

Before Walled Lake's proposal was considered, however, council members discussed whether to replace Bruder with a full-time or part-time help.

Council Member Tom Gerhard questioned why the village couldn't get by with one full-time and four or five part-time dispatchers. He said that would save money, both in benefits and

When Gerhard asked O'Neill to explain the difference between a full-time dispatcher and a chief dispatcher, O'Neill said "they're the same thing really, but Betty's in charge of the other dispatchers." He said as chief dispatcher, Bruder helps with scheduling the part-time workers, makes recommendations to him and works the day shift.

"Why doesn't this all come under your jurisdiction?" Matkowski asked.

"It does," O'Neill said, "and I would recommend the same thing as Betty: that Bobbi Martin become chief dispatcher."

Matkowski suggested it would be more economical for O'Neill to take back the responsibilities delegated to chief dispatcher following Bruder's retirement. Matkowski, a former dispatcher for the Novi Police Department, said the village needed to look hard at where it can make cuts in operating costs, proposing dispatching as a good place to start its considerations.

O'Brien retires, search begins for chief

allowing for more transition between O'Brien and his replacement.

"We're looking at at least six weeks without an administrator," Gerhard said. "I just wonder if that's prudent for the administration of the village."

O'Brien was reluctant to change his vacation, contending it would not affect the operation of the village.

"If I take it now—which I'll do—we still won't have anybody while I'm gone," he said.

"We were without an administrator for a year before they hired me," he added.

Council President Tim Kozub said O'Brien's request for six weeks of this winter was not out of line with his previous vacations.

"Generally there's been a three-to-four-week period he's taken off in the past," Kozub said.

Last winter O'Brien took five weeks of in January and February with council approval. He also was off for two weeks in June.

But Kozub agreed with Gerhard that it might be a good idea to hire an administrator before O'Brien leaves.

Village Attorney Thomas Connelly, who recently helped select a new administrator for the Village of Milford, said that could be difficult. He said Milford's selection process took almost three months and noted it would be extremely difficult to adequate advertising, screening, interviewing and hiring of one applicant by December 1, a proposed deadline.

Gene Matkowski, a member of the audience and husband of Council Member Geri Matkowski, suggested imposing a deadline could eliminate some good candidates and might encourage the council to rush naming a new administrator.

"As Mr. O'Brien suggested, we were without a village administrator for a year and a half before he came," Matkowski said. "Why are we concerned with deadlines? I think you should take the time now."

Connelly said Milford had followed the same selection procedure proposed by the village; in other words, choosing to have individual council members participate in all phases of the selection

process rather than set up a committee. Several members spoke in favor of setting up a committee, pointing out that it would be impossible to grant confidentiality if the applicant requested it should the full council be involved. Under the Open Meetings Act, the council would have to disclose that information in a public meeting.

But Council Member Geri Matkowski favored screenings by the full council.

"We will all have to work with this administrator," she said. "This is a very important decision. We should all become involved."

She said even if a council member was unable to make a meeting on choosing the new administrator, at least the information would be available.

In discussing qualifications for the

post, the council noted proposed salary should be somewhat less than the approximately \$29,000 O'Brien is paid. Gerhard pointed out that it took O'Brien 10 years to work up to that figure and his replacement should be hired for less, if possible.

The council decided to leave salary a negotiable figure. One of the requirements for the job is village residency within 120 days. Municipal management experience will not be required, but is preferred.

O'Brien had planned to announce his retirement in August, but delayed the announcement because of the resignation of former Council President John McEllan. O'Brien said at that time he would stay on longer to help with the transition between council presidents.

So you like movies? But you never have time? You missed the ones you really wanted to see? Well, in this place you could go crazy.

"Golden Pond," "Quest for Fire," "Star Wars" — they are all there, just waiting for you.

For five dollars you rent a film; for another five you get the VHS (Video Home System) player for a night.

At home, you hook the VHS to your own TV antenna lead, slide the film cassette into the VHS — and that's it. No driving, no babysitter, your favorite chair and maybe even your own popcorn — all of this comes with your home movie rental.

Just think of the possibilities: you can arrange your own "Laurel and Hardy" festival, see "Harold and Maude" for the 17th time, revisit Tara in "Gone with the Wind," relive your first romance with whatever title fills that bill.

"Wizard of Oz" without commercials, "Sound of Music" hooked up to your own stereo for an added dimension in sound — it's all there waiting. Bill Wilson says he opened his movie rental business almost by accident. Also, he admits he is addicted to movies — all kinds of movies.

Barely two years ago, Wilson was working long hours in his TV and stereo repair shop. "I could rarely watch television. One Tuesday night I was into 'Midway,' a great war movie. And then at 11 o'clock, they said it would be continued the following night!" Frustrated, he told his wife he was going to buy a video recorder. That way, he reasoned, "I could watch what I wanted, when I wanted, as many times as I wanted."

Soon Wilson had picked up a number of film cassettes and decided to run an ad in the local paper on rentals. "I totally underestimated the market. I was amazed how many people had their own equipment," Wilson remembers. This fall, with two film rental stores and a third one planned, he has discovered the market is even bigger than he imagined. No more TV and stereo repair. In less

- no club or membership fees,
- film rental at \$5 for two days,
- VHS machine rental at \$5 per day.

There are deposits, of course, because films and equipment are

valuable. But with a Master Card or Visa, even that is not a problem.

In Milford, store manager "Dennis B." says his customers are not any certain group or type. "Just anybody who enjoys movies for their own personal viewing."

As many as 1,500 films are available through the system, including the original first three episodes of the "Lone Ranger."





ASK THE LAWYER

Questions? Write to Attorney Larry Korn, care of Sliger-Livingston Publications, Post Office Box 160, Northville, Michigan 48167. Questions will be answered on a space-available basis. Answers in this column are directed at specific facts and may not apply in all situations.

Q. My boyfriend and I lived together for over five years. We bought a house and the title of the house shows that we own the property as husband and wife. My boyfriend died. We both intended that if he died I would get the house and if I died, he would get the house. Will I get the house if the deed shows that I am his wife even though we were not married?

A. Although you and your boyfriend lived together for five years, you are not husband and wife. Michigan is not a common law marriage state. In Michigan, in order to be married, you must have a marriage license and a civil ceremony.

If the deed to the house showed that you got title to the house as joint tenant with full rights of survivorship, survivor take all, and not as tenants in common, you would have been entitled to receive the title to the house as the survivor with joint tenancy.

However, I doubt that any right of survivorship would exist in a tenancy by the entirety where you were not married and no words otherwise expressed the right of survivorship.

Q. I have loaned some money to my granddaughter and her husband. Her husband now wants a divorce. His name is on the paper that he signed when we collect my loan as I am a retiree and could really use the money that my granddaughter and her husband owe me.

The judge will give you a judgment for the money that is owed to you and you will undoubtedly have to garnish their paycheck or execute their assets if they do not pay you.

A. If your granddaughter and her husband owe you \$600 or less, you should file suit in the district court in the city where your granddaughter and her husband reside. Sue both your granddaughter and her husband. If they owe you over \$600, I would suggest you retain an attorney and start suit in district court for a money judgment as quickly as possible.

Wildcats stunned by late Lakeland bomb

Novi was regarded as the passing game, but somebody mixed up the flight plans Friday as Air Osborne was grounded by some heavy turbulence from the Lakeland defense and the Eagles used the pass to take a 7-0 victory in the KVC battle of unbeaten.

Doug Woods made a sensational grab back Eric Deline completed just five of

15 attempts. "They have a great defense," said Wildcat coach John Osborne. "They caused numerous turnovers and made big plays."

The biggest play came late in the game. On third and seven from the Eagle 47, St. John rolled left and fired downfield to Woods.

Deline got a hand on the ball, but Woods was able to make a brilliant, juggling catch and then raced into the end zone for the game's only touchdown and a 7-0 Lakeland victory.

Meanwhile, Novi was being held without a first down through the third quarter. The Cats finally got moving midway through the fourth quarter when a personal foul brought them near midfield and Deline hit Dave Williams for 24 yards to the Lakeland 29.

A Rich Sinda dive gained four more, but Novi fumbled on the next play and the Eagles recovered to thwart the threat.

Neither team threatened in the first half. Lakeland stuck to the ground, but had little success against the Wildcat defense which dropped Eagle runners for losses eight times.

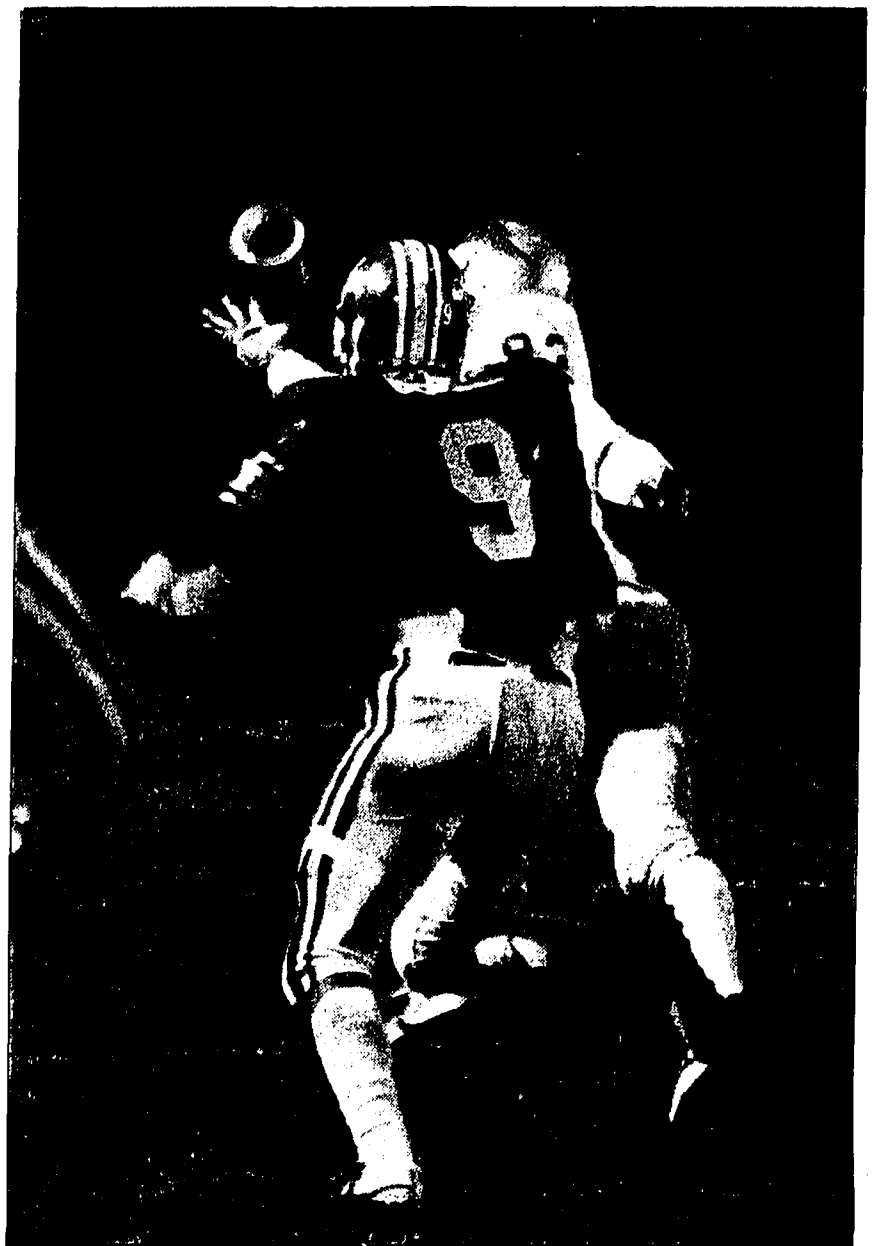
Novi had even less success, suffering three pass interceptions on its first four possessions as Lakeland gained field advantage. Fortunately, Deline's punts, including a 46-yard boomer to the Lakeland 1, kept the Eagles out of Novi territory.

Lakeland unveiled its passing game in the second half. Novi fumbled the opening kickoff and the Eagles recovered on the Wildcat 31.

St. John hit Woods for 24 yards to the Novi 4, but the Wildcat defense held fast and a 23-yard field goal attempt sailed wide.

Lakeland threatened again on its next possession, again moving to the four before Novi stiffened and another field goal attempt missed the target.

Lakeland also has a 4-1 record in the KVC this fall.

Canton's aerials thwart Western

"They played their best game of the season and we played our poorest." That's how Head Coach Chuck Apap summed up Walled Lake Western's 27-3 loss to Plymouth Canton last week.

After giving up just 26 points in the first four games of the season, the usually stalwart Warrior defense was riddled by an aerial attack led by the Chief's Pat Murphy who hit 11 of 16 attempts for 176 yards and three touchdowns. Canton also scored its fourth touchdown through the air.

The Warriors scored their only points when Paul Imms booted a 34-yard field goal in the third quarter.

"It was just one of those things," commented an obviously-depressed Apap after the game. "Canton played its best game of the season and we played our poorest. They just didn't make any mistakes."

"Their quarterback had a fantastic day. He completed almost everything he threw; he just couldn't miss."

Apap said two events in the first half were critical to the outcome of the game. Canton opened the scoring when Murphy hit Bob Waszczenki from 19 yards out in the first quarter to take a 7-0 lead.

Western then marched down to the Chief 20 and apparently had picked up a first down on a Dave Meyer to Aldo Buttazzoni pass that carried to the two, only to have the play nullified by a clipping penalty. A subsequent field goal attempt was missed.

Canton upped the score to 14-0 at the half by marching 62 yards in the last 90 seconds, scoring on a two-yard pass from Murphy to Ron Rienas as time ran out.

"Those two things — the penalty and the last-second touchdown — really hurt us," observed Apap. "It would have been a totally different ball game if we had scored that touchdown, and there's no way they should be able to go 62 yards with just 50 seconds left in the half."

Western had one more chance to get back in the game in the third quarter. Frank Garbick intercepted a Murphy pass on the Chief 23, and Paul Imms then carried five straight times down to the two. But quarterback Rick Hunter was sacked for a 15 yard loss on a key third down play and Western had to settle for a field goal.

Canton upped its lead to 20-3 shortly thereafter as Murphy completed a 49-yard bomb to Waszczenki. The Chiefs made the final score 27-3 by scoring on another 19-yard pass late in the fourth quarter.

Both Canton and Western finished the game with nine first downs, but the Chiefs picked up 279 total yards in comparison with 164 for the Warriors. Western gained 164 yards on the ground while limiting the Chiefs to 103 rushing yards, but the big difference came in the air as Canton hit 11 of 16 passes for 176 yards while Western failed to complete any of its six passing attempts.

Imms again sparked the Warrior offense, gaining 103 yards on 20 carries. Apap also praised the offensive contributions of tight end Aldo Buttazzoni and tackle Ron Wendland. Defensively, the Warrior coach singled out linebacker Todd Coulter, safety Mickey Folsom and noseguards Matt King and Mark Johnson for praise.

"It was an awfully disappointing game to lose, but I discovered one thing," said Apap, "the sun came up again Saturday morning."
