## Council rejects Bob Evans restaurant plan

By KATHY JENNINGS

To the surprise of no one, Novi's City Council has rejected the final site plan for Bob Evans restaurant on the grounds it provides insufficient parking and is out of character with the surrounding area.

The council voted 6-0 to deny site plan approval Monday. Council Member Guy Smith was absent.

Monday's 31/2-hour meeting was a continuation of deliberations which began January 10. The council at that time heard Bob Evans witnesses testify that the building will compliment the

surrounding area and not adversely effect property values.

Representatives for the city said Monday that the building "did not fit" in the West Oaks Shopping Center area and the center was unable to meet local parking requirements. Witnesses were questioned and council members subsequently stated their reasons for rejecting the site plan.

Prior to the proceedings, one Novi resident chastised the council's opposition to the restaurant, saying its actions represented its own preferences and

## .Appeals upheld in first hearing

A recent decision by a Michigan Tax Tribunal hearing officer has dealt the City of Novi a setback in its attempts to tax Section 15 property owners for conestruction of streets, water mains and

It is too early to say the proposed judgement by the hearing officer will jeopardize the \$5 million public improvement project, according to City Attorney David Fried. But the preliminary opinion issued last week is 'one step back," Fried said.

Hearing officer Claris Owirko found in favor of the property owners and the matter now moves on to the full tribunal where it will be heard by one or more of the tribunal members.

Eight of 21 property owners in the 160acre piece of property across from Twelve Oaks Mall known as Section 15 have objected to being billed for conprovements and taken their appeal to the Michigan Tax Tribunal.

The opinion by hearing officer Owirko deals with the first of those appeals made by the Dixon Road Group and Novi 12 Associates.

The hearing officer has recommended the special assessment be overturned "for the reason that the special assessments against the subject properties are both unreasonable and out of proportion to the benefits confer-

Increases in property value which will result as improvements are constructed are "insufficient to be considered a special benefit and do not support the special assessment," Owirko

According to her calculations, Owirko determined the property owners' share of the total cost of the said. public improvement project amounts to 'approximately 2.6 times the increase in value that the improvements will confer on those parcels."

Fried, commenting on the proposed opinion, said the issue is not a question of whether the improvement is equal to the increased value of the property, but whether there is a benefit to the proper-

Owirko also found special

assessments can be upheld if they relieve property owners of an "existing burden." However, there is no evidence of an existing burden in this instance, since all the subject properties have access to Twelve Mile Road, she said.

Current zoning of the property, for use as small farms, also was addressed by Owirko. She indicated neither party in the appeal addressed the value of the property as it is currently zoned and she calculated the true cash value of the property. She said further that if the property were not rezoned it would receive no special benefit by the construction of the improvements. Should

## Decision gives city

With the first step in an appeal of special assessments in Section 15 going against the City of Novi, questions as to what could happen if the district is rejected are raised.

If special assessments to fund utilities in Section 15 are overturned by the Michigan Tax Tribunal as a hearing officer has recommended Novi will have two alternatives, according to City Manager Edward Kriewall.

Novi could abandon the project, selling interests in the plans to recover engineering costs, or the city create a downtown development authority to provide financing for the \$5 million public improvement project, Kriewall

'The city could abandon the project altogether," Kriewall said. "We would still provide make the plan available and sell interests in the plans. Everyone would have to build their share of the project on their property themselves.

"There will be inadequacies in the course of development caused by what goes in first," Kriewall continued.



Council members decided to direct the city attorney to determine what can be done to repair the wall after visiting the property and determining that the wall is a potential safety hazard.

City Attorney David Fried initially indicated the city should not get involved in what he considers a private matter. Since the wall is privately owned, it is a private hazard and the city should not use public funds to repair it, he said.

Fried added, however, that the city could sue both Village Oaks (which includes Fairfield Farms) and Stonehenge, asking the court to have the problem abated. "The court could say: 'Go ahead City of Novi and abate the hazard' and then litigate whose responsibility it is to pay for the

repairs," said Fried. In that case the city would repair the wall or contract to have it repaired and then be repaid for construction costs

when the case is settled. Fried cautioned that determining responsibility for payment "may take a considerable length of time."

The issue came to the council's attention last fall when Stonehenge residents requested that the city not release to the developer a \$10,000 letter of credit it is holding for greenbelting. Residents

## Residents upset about appearance of church

'I have the Meadowbrook Christian Church in my backyard and it's a disgrace," said Carolyn Katz of Marks Drive in Novi.



## Definition needed in benefit package

Council recently approved — sort of — the expenditure of more than \$5,000 in vacation, sick and personal pay to retiring Administrator

The council approved the payout not in a separate motion, but as a part of the treasurer's report even though the information was added to the agenda at the request of a council member.

During the same meeting, the village council appointed one of its members to serve as acting administrator while O'Brien is on ayacation and until a new administrator is hired to replace him.

Unfortunately, very little discussion accompanied those two decisions. In fact, after requesting O'Brien's pay-out be added to the Lagenda, council members did nothing more than silently read the Freasurer's report and move on to the next item.

A few comments, however, are in order. First, we do not dispute Brien's claim to 33½ vacation days, six personal days and 24some sick days. O'Brien may well be entitled to that time off.

But the manner in which the village council addressed the situa-Sion is distressing. To begin with, D'Brien announced in October his an to retire and said he would ake off the six weeks prior to his

retirement date. Only the council's newest member, Tom Gerhard, questioned the length of time D'Brien planned to take at once. Gerhard asked why O'Brien couldn't break his vacation into two separate chunks, which would not leave the village office without its administrator for a substantial Speriod of time.

Other council members assured Gerhard that O'Brien had taken extended vacations in the spast, as he did last year, for example. O'Brien himself suggested the time-off would not harm village Coperations, pointing out Wolverine Lake lacked an administrator for a full year before he was hired.

But the fact of the matter, as council members have since learn-Led, is that such an extended vacation (which later grew, unquestioned by council, into two months) by

The Wolverine Lake Village its top administrator is no small

In fact, the village council recently named Pat Howarth acting administrator to help handle situations O'Brien would have. And the village president, Tim Kozub. spends a substantial amount of time doing administrative tasks in O'Brien's absence.

The situation is not all bad: It is instructing council members about the importance of having a strong, competent administrator at the perfect time — just as they are preparing to select O'Brien's successor. But it is a hard way to learn

We understand O'Brien's desire to take eight weeks' vacation at once — who wouldn't want to do the same? But O'Brien isn't really on vacation; he is effectively retired. The village has appointed someone else to handle his work while he is on "vacation."

With O'Brien's career in the village so close to an end, it is hardly surprising the council chose to let him leave quietly, rather than force the issue and require him to split his vacation.

Still, municipal employees should be accountable. It is not the employees' fault if the elected officials of residents who pay their salaries do not keep track of what

The village council should have examined this more carefully. Furthermore, it should take care to spell out its new administrator's benefits so this situation does not arise again. Also, it is not a bad idea for employees to establish early on each year when they will take their vacations; that would allow time to better plan how their responsibilities should be handled. It is a hardship when vital employees - particularly administrators and managers — take extended vacations.

Wolverine Lake is in a position to start fresh with its new administrator. We hope the village council will take advantage of this situation by clearly determining what is expected of village employees and making sure both parties are aware of those expecta-

## Stick to planning

As a member of the Novi Planning Board, William Briggs speaks softly and makes a lot of sense.

Briggs' comments during a recent public hearing to consider the rezoning of property on the west side of Novi Road between the C&O railroad tracks and Ten Mile were particularly appropriate - not only to that particular rezoning action but to rezoning actions in general.

After listening to property owners talk about what zoning designation would enable them to realize the greatest profit from their parcels, Briggs appropriately reminded his colleagues that they sit on a planning board, not a "real estate values" board.

The purpose of a planning board, he said, is to apply sound planning principles to the city as a whole "without regard to who owns what, how long they've owned it or what their ultimate profit picture

Similar sentiments were ex-

pressed by Joseph Brett, another planning board member. Decisions made by the planning board, stated Brett, will affect the city for many years to come. While the board must be sensitive to individuals, it must never lose sight of the fact it's planning for the future.

Planning board members, like members of other volunteer boards and commissions, have difficult jobs. They often face the wrath of angry residents while receiving little or no compensation for their willingness to serve.

It's obviously much easier to give in to the wishes of the angry property owner. But even though listening to all complaints is an important part of the process, acceding to those complaints does not necessarily comprise good plann-

I always thought I knew what the essentials were when apartment hunting.

A large kitchen with lots of cupboard space, a bedroom with windows, access to a yard and a place to park my car. You know, the basics. I wasn't asking for jacuzzis or skylights, although I figured if I was really lucky, I might get a fireplace. But after living in some strangely different — but very strange — apartments, I have to admit my priorities have changed. Now my ideal apartment only needs to have heat. a

shower and a lock on the door. That's not asking for much, but it's amazing how difficult it can be to find apartments with those assets. In fact, I think I've gone through more than any person deserves lately trying to find just that.

My mother always told me some people can learn from instructions and some people have to learn their lessons the hard way. When it comes to finding apartments, I definitely fall in

My first apartment was in the tropics zone of Ann Arbor. No matter the temperature outside, my kitchen and living room were always a steady 92 degrees. My bedroom, a former sleeping porch that had been enclosed but not insulated. stayed cozy at 58.

The apartment had cockroaches, but only three. Well okay: three were all I ever saw but I smashed each one with an empty wine bottle after desperately wishing I had a roommate to do the dirty work.

Between that place and a house a friend of mine rented, I learned one of the first lessons of shopping for apartments: Look for closets. My friend found a nice house and moved in with his roommate before either one discovered there was not a single closet in the house. But that was a strange place to begin with: The shower was a pipe that stuck out of the basement wall and the water ran onto the cement floor and into a drain. The house had never seen insulation and seemed to be built of cardboard. I had never been anyplace colder than that house ... until I moved to South Lyon.

The first winter I was there, my apartment featured an old brown kerosene space heater furnace-system I thought was a wood-burning stove. That's not as odd as it sounds. I had never seen a wood-burning stove before and anyway I was quite sure pen to be single men. Ahhh, at last success.

All went well until the day I ran out of fuel — three weeks after I moved in. As the temperature inside got gradually colder, I realized something was wrong with the furnace. My landlord suggested I might be out of fuel. So, out I went to buy some. Fifty gallons cost me a whopping \$87, higher than the cost of gasoline. In shock, I signed over my check and swore I wouldn't purchase another drop. Three weeks later, I was out of fuel again.

By that time it was only March but I managed to stick out. the winter with no heat. No one was happier to see spring ar-

However, I was forced to move in December after my landlord decided not to provide a heat source for my nice new furnace, which he put in last year after I threatened to move. Instead of hooking up the gas, he went bankrupt.

So, I relocated to what I thought was a dream apartment. It had a bay window, plush carpeting, 12-foot ceilings, exposed brick walls and lots of heat. The catch was I'd have to share the bathroom with the landlord's son. No problem, I thought. Unfortunately, I quickly discovered we also would be sharing my kitchen. The dream apartment suddenly wasn't so dreamy with no privacy — no matter how much heat it had.

Off again I went on an apartment hunt, this time determined to find a decent place with heat and a lock on the door. Some of the places out there, honestly, people shouldn't be allowed to I looked at one with a view of a parking lot that required

you to climb three flights of exposed stairs and walk across a

roof to get inside. The kitchen appliances could have come from Greenfield Village. There was no bedroom. There was no shower. There was nothing nice about it. Next: An apartment not even a mother could love. Especially my mother. A hundred gallons of paint wouldn't have brightened the walls. The windows rose waist-high and

overlooked a factory, a gas station and a plumber's shop. Never fear, I found a new place last week. It has a private entrance and heat's included in the rent. I won't have to share anything with anybody if I don't want to.

And best of all, it has two things I didn't even have on my list of requirements: two nice apartment managers, who hap-
