Novi schools Administrative Assistant Helen Ditzhazy has accepted a position with the Jackson school district as assistant superintendent.

Ditzhazy, who was hired by the Novi school district as high school principal in July, 1973, notified Jackson school personnel of her acceptance Monday, June 20, Jackson Superintendent William Pearson said.

Piwko said he was not certain how the resignaton in December of special Ditzhazy's move might affect ad- education director Dr. Kathleen Pistono, and a decision of the school board to postpone filling her position for budgetary reasons.

The board's position aroused immediate opposition from parents of special education students who said, although Ditzhazy was an able administrator, she did not possess the qualifications for a special education

Throughout 1983-84 budget discussions, board members maintained their position, and funds for a special education director were not included in the final school budget proposal for next year. Ditzhazy's anticipated resignation will likely result in further discussion of the special education director position.

In Jackson, Ditzhazy replaces Assistant Superintendent Dwight Smith, who is retiring after 10 years with Jackson schools. Pearson said Ditzhazy's salary has not been finalized, although he expects it will fall "in the low \$40,000's."

AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 34

THE CITY OF WIXOM ORDAINS: Article XA-IRO Industrial Research Office District SECTION 1050-A Intent:

The IRO industrial Research Office Districts are designed to provide for uses which are office or research type or industrial uses which have limited impact outside of the industrial building. The district is designed to be used in areas which are not adjacent to lands indicated as single-family residential on the City's Master Plan. The district is intended to encourage uses which have a high value per acre of land that will supplement the City's tax base. Certain businesses are permitted within office buildings as secondary uses. 6. Any of the following industrial uses when conducted wholly within a completely enclosed building.

a. The manufacture, compounding, processing, packaging or treatment of such products as: baked goods, candy, cosmetics, pharmaceuticals, tolletries, food products, hardware and cutlery; tool, die,

gauge and machine shops. b. The manufacture, compounding, assembling or treatment of articles or merchandise from the following previously prepared materials: bone, canvas, cellophane, cloth, cork, feathers, felt, fiber, fur, glass, hair, horn, leather, paper, plastics, precious or semiprecious metals or stones, sheet metal (excluding large stamping such as: automobile fenders or bodies), shell textiles, tobacco, wax,

d. Manufacture of musical instruments, toys, novelties, and meta or rubber stamps, or other small molded rubber products. e. Manufacture or assembly of electrical appliances, electronic nstruments, and devices, radios and phonographs.

Revise the charter to provide manager

In November, Wixom voters will consider authorizing a city charter revision establishing a city manager position. A restructuring of the city administration is needed

As Councilman Gunnar Mettala introduced the resolution at a recent council meeting, he recounted the 25 years of growth that have occurred since Wixom incorporated. Mettala's points are

Wixom currently has over 6,000 residents and a state equalized value of \$140 million. The city has a fulltime police chief, fire chief and public works director. Clearly a city manager is needed to oversee the increasingly complex city operations. Currently, the mayor's assistant provides professional administration but lacks the authority of a city manager.

A part-time mayor is not an adequate administrator for a community of Wixom's size. Wixom has been fortunate to have Lillian Spencer serve as a fulltime mayor for the past six years. Spencer's availability to work on city business is an exception, rather than the rule.

Time must realistically be a consideration when looking at the professional

or dedication a mayor may hold for the post, that individual will most likely have family and job com-

The city appears to have been moving towards the city manager form of government since the mayor's assistant post was created while Val Vangieson, Spencer's predecessor, served as mayor.

Some might argue that larger cities such as Detroit or Pontiac utilize strong mayor systems. In those communities, however, large staffs are provided to do administrative work.

Establishing a city manager's office would cause less immediate change in the city than expected. Creating the position would establish a benefit for the future of the city by anticipating needs rather than reacting to problems.

The mayor and city council would still remain the policymaking body for city. The mayor's assistant answers directly to the mayor. A city manager would be appointed by the council and be responsible to that body.

Survival tactics

By KEN VOYLES

I am an intern in your community, a community of real American survivors. And like the new reporter on the city desk who has to learn the subtle ins and outs of his new newspaper, I, too, have been getting a lesson in surviving from you, the members of this community.

In the past three weeks you have let me into your homes, you have revealed yourselves to me and you have told me of your community, the background fabric which holds up your view of the world and gives you a place in which survival isn't a nightmare but a pleasent dream of

As a student of journalism (I started at 17, fresh out of high school) and a member of the profession, I have seen various tactics for living among the people I've been blessed to meet. Your community is exactly like all the other communities and at the same time, it is different in every way. For some this is a paradox of community journalism and leaving one community newspaper for another can be as frustrating at first as learning to drive a stickshift in a Ford after experiencing one in a German-made Opel.

So in all truth you are my teachers, and I have much to learn. You are unpaid and unrecognized but your influence and knowledge will not be forgotten. In you I see survival, a concept that seems to haunt every story I have written, not excluding sports stories, and in you I have an example to follow.

One family I came into contact with recently, the Sharps, seem destined to hardship in bringing up their son and yet they submit to their karma and in doing so gain strength from it. The Sharps are lucky to have a church and a community that relates to their needs. They are survivors, even if the word means little in comparison to their struggle.

Long before my interview with the family was over I had come to realize that survival is not some vague concept that dogs man's exsistence, but is individually mainfested and universally experienced. That simple fact helped me to relate to the family and put their story down in words.

Like most professionals we, too, have our own tactics. One of them is listening, an idea taken very much for granted today. I like to tell my friends that I am a trained listener with degrees in formal and informal listening, who never shuts up when not at work. In listening we close the gap. Student and teacher are able to see each other as they are, human beings that don't "have" experiences, but are experiences.

As a beginner in your community, I am at a disadvantage. I am ignorant of your ways and may fail to step lightly when I should. If so, I need to know, so that my learning with Sliger newspapers will carry more than


As far as this writer is concerned. America's education system is the best in the world. Where else can one learn from an entire community? Where else can a writer meet so many day- to-day survivors, all different and yet all the same?

Seven years in the business is not enough. I crave contact with survivors, winners and losers, and tactically speaking, it can only help.

So here's to the survivors, be they struggling just to make ends meet or be they caught in just another one of nature's unexplainable snares.







In addition, we turn off the fan that vents the warm air into the home."
