Lakeshore Park draws crowds

Just two years ago, Novi officials were calling Lakeshore Park on the south shore of Walled Lake "one of the area's best kept secrets." But Lakeshore Park has been discovered.

"Novi residents have found Lakeshore Park," confirmed Parks and Recreation Director Tom O'Branovic. Both the beach and the park have

reported record turnouts in recent weeks.

"I was out there two weeks ago and there must have been 1,000 people," O'Branovic said. And the crowds have been consistent throughout the summer, he continued. O'Branovic said on any given weekend there could be 300-400 people on the beach and 500 using the park. During the week there frequently are at least 100 using the park, he added.

"Attendance has been gradually increasing over the past few years, but this year it's been phenomenal," O'Branovic said.

Families and group picnics have been filling the park each weekend this summer, O'Branovic said. Every weekend there have been at least three large groups using the park for picnicking. Because the picnic area is used on a first-come/first-serve basis, the Parks and Recreation Department asks that groups of more than 50 persons call and inform them of picnic plans.

"That way we can let them know if a lot of other groups are planning to be at the park that day and suggest changing the date if picnic tables won't be available," O'Branovic explained.

"Come early if you want a table. We've had people lining up outside the park to get a table and outside the beach," O'Branovic cautioned.

O'Branovic believes the park is getting more use largely as a result of the work the city has done to improve it.

Over the past five years the city has spent approximately \$200,000 in federal funds to pay for improvements to what was once an unkempt, overgrown park.

The parks and recreation department has worked to clean and manure the park to the point where approximately 11 acres of the 26-acre park are now usable.

The number of picnic tables in the park has grown from 10 to between 35 and 40.

This year 120 feet were added to the beach area, bringing total beach frontage to nearly 550 feet. On the beach a grassy area was added for those who prefer to sand.

Novi acquires additional lake frontage

With the purchase of two parcels of lake front property in recent months, Novi now has obtained approximately 900 feet of frontage along Walled Lake.

In the latest purchase, approved last week, the city paid \$156,000 for 3.5 acres of property and accepted additional property as a gift.

The purchase will be made with a \$90,000 appropriation from the city's fund balance and \$66,000 budgeted for capital outlays in the general administration fund. The land was purchased from D.W. and Ruby Hecker and M.V. and Ruth Probst.

In March Novi purchased the 8.5 acre site of the former Walled Lake Flea Market for \$275,000. That purchase was possible with a \$200,000 loan.

"We've negotiated what we feel is an attractive purchase price in two

separate agreements," City Manager Edward Kriewall told the city council.

He said the additional property purchased "makes the total site acquisition one of the most valuable lake frontage sites in western Oakland County. Walled Lake may be the largest lake located toward the heart of the Metropolitan area. And recent water testing shows its water quality is one of the best in the state."

The city has purchased the property primarily for use as road right-of-way when it relocates East Lake Drive. Longstanding plans for the area have called for the relocation of East Lake Drive in an attempt to reroute heavy traffic to Decker Road, which would allow East Lake to return to a local street.

While the property was still privately owned the exact location for the new East Lake Drive was up in the air, Kriewall said. Now that the city owns

the property plans can proceed for relocating the road, he added.

Kriewall indicated the city's next step will be to meet with lake area homeowners to inform them of the property acquisition, discuss relocation of the road, and "how we intend to attack this."

Kriewall added that after talking to residents the city will proceed with development of a plan for the 12-acre site.

"We'll look into the cost of a planner to plan a specific site," Kriewall said. "We'll get professional help to work through all alternatives to development for the site."

"There are so many potentials we want to make sure this is done right," Kriewall said.

He said further that planning will take some modifications in the recently adopted city budget.

"We didn't budget planning for the site because we didn't know the timing of the additional acquisition."

Kriewall said the city's goal is to have a plan for the area underway by this fall.

Water conservation encouraged

Novi residents are being reminded that water use must be limited during peak periods to keep water rates from increasing next year.

Residents are asked to voluntarily lower maximum day and peak hour flow rates by controlling summer lawn sprinkling.

Water customers with even-numbered addresses should sprinkle on even-numbered days, while residents with odd-numbered addresses should sprinkle on odd-numbered days.

All water customers with automatic sprinkling systems

should set their time clocks for sprinkling between midnight and 6 a.m.

Novi officials had hoped voluntary water conservation would help keep water usage down, but are concerned the season's dry weather will work against them.

"If we keep the peak flows down we may be able to get the rates down," explained engineering consultant Patrick Keast. "But with this weather it's going to be tough."

The amount of water used during peak periods is one factor in a formula used by Detroit to determine water rates charged to suburban water customers.

Two enter race in Novi elect.

Two more candidates apparently have decided to run for office in the upcoming Novi city elections.

Arlen Schroeder of 21390 East Glen Haven has announced intentions to run for office and took out nominating petitions Monday.

Additionally, an unidentified candidate has taken out petitions to run for mayor. City Clerk Geraldine Stipp explained the candidate asked for petitions, but did not leave his name.

Schroeder indicated his decision to run was, in part, prompted by Council Member James Shaw's announcement that he will not seek re-election.

"I've supported (Shaw) in the past and done what I could to help him. I'd prefer if he ran, but since he's not I decided to get involved," Schroeder said. He indicated he is interested in working with the council to implement the master land use plan and rezoning the city to conform with it.

Schroeder is a past president of Country Place Condominium Association and one of the original members of the Novi Economic Development Corporation.

Previously to his involvement in Novi he was president of the Saginaw Township Education Association, Chairman of the Board of Ministry of the Antioch Lutheran church in Farmington and a member of the board of Family Services Agency in Midland County.

Professionally, Schroeder is a professor at Oakland Community College, teaching physical science and accounting. He also has been an elementary, junior high and high school principal.

"I believe in the idea that commercial development should be in the area of the mall and the inner section of Novi Road and Grand River," Schroeder ex-

plained. "I feel strongly that the commercial development should be encouraged and focused there. I oppose development out into neighborhoods in any manner."

Schroeder was among those who originally opposed location of convenience centers in neighborhoods during master plan deliberations.

"I feel the city is doing an excellent job - I'm not running against anyone on the council. But I feel much of Novi's growth is still ahead of us and I'd like to be part of trying to channel that growth," Schroeder said.

Meanwhile, Nancy Covert denied rumors that she is running for office. Covert, president of the citizen's group P.L.A.N. which successfully proposed legislation to control housing compatibility, said Monday that she is not aware of anyone from the organization seeking election.

Covert acknowledged that Shaw's decision to leave the council adds a new dimension to the race, but indicated neither she nor anyone from her organization is running for office.

"No one that I know of is running at this point - not that I've been informed of," Covert said. But she went on to say that others may have intentions of which she is not aware. "People are independent."

Those already in the race include incumbents John Chambers and Martha Hoyer. Mayor Robert Schmid also is seeking re-election.

Nominating petitions now are available at Novi City Hall. The filing deadline is July 15.

To be nominated a candidate needs 100 signatures of registered voters. The primary election is scheduled for September 13 and the general election is November 8.

Budget approved for school system

The adoption of Novi School's \$10.3 million 1983-84 budget and 29.990 millage rate to fund that budget was a simple five minute affair last week.

But the document adopted by the school board June 23 was one of the most deliberated budgets in the district's recent history.

Both the budget and the millage levy were adopted in 5-0 votes. Trustees Robert Schram and Norman Miller were absent.

The board wrestled with six different budget proposals at five public meetings before settling on the one which met both the educational and fiscal demands of board members.

The document adopted last week cuts \$8,500 from the athletic program, half the school field trips and some extracurricular clubs at the discretion of building principals. The middle school camp was reduced from a five to a three-day program.

These reductions represent an effort to spread cuts "across the board" without crippling any one extracurricular group.

Staffing was forwarded at the 1982-83 level with the exception of two administrative positions, director of special education and maintenance foreman, which were not budgeted.

However, the administration recently learned that Administrative Assistant

Helen Ditzhazy, who assumed the responsibilities of special education director in March, has accepted a position in the Jackson School District. Superintendent Robert Plwko said Ditzhazy's departure "could" have an impact on the budget.

There were no cuts in teaching staff, except those necessary due to declining enrollment.

The board also approved borrowing \$17,000 from the district's \$473,419 fund balance. The fund primarily represents the value of buses and inventory, but also includes money left over in the budget from year to year.

The 29.990 tax levy is a 2.074-mill increase over last year's millage. One mill is equal to \$1 on every \$1,000 of assessed valuation.) But because district residents had a six percent decrease in their assessed valuations, the two additional mills will not increase the tax bill for the "average" residential homeowner.

The budget includes about \$4.4 million for teachers' salaries and over \$800,000 in teacher fringe benefits, \$700,000 for administration and \$1.2 million for special programs.

Special programs include about \$58,700 for special education, \$171,550 for extracurricular (primarily athletic) salaries, \$5.2 million for library and auto-visual

School board fires Trudeau

Novi High School teacher Richard Trudeau was discharged from his position with the school system last week by a unanimous decision of the Novi School Board.

Trudeau, 38, who awaits trial in Oakland County Circuit Court on charges stemming from the December '83 break-in and attempted arson of the Novi schools administration building, may appeal the board's decision to a state tenure commission.

Trudeau was unavailable for comment this week on whether he will appeal the decision.

The board made its decision to fire Trudeau based on information presented at six closed tenure hearings held April 26, May 17, 23, 31, and June 1 and 8. He has been suspended from teaching since tenure charges were filed by Superintendent Robert Plwko and Assistant Superintendent William Barr March 17.

Trudeau voluntarily contacted Novi police on February 3 after being informed of the warrant for his arrest on charges of breaking and entering with

the intent to commit arson and with the burning of real property. Both charges carry maximum 10-year prison sentences.

Another Novi High School teacher, Russell Gardner, was found guilty of the same two charges in March and sentenced in Oakland County Circuit Court to two years probation and ordered to pay \$5,770 for damages to the administration building.

Gardner was arrested December 23 after being apprehended by Novi police answering an alarm at the school administration building. Upon arrival, police found a door had been forced open, and three fires - in the administrator's office, the computer room and the payroll office - were discovered.

An investigation by Novi police in the weeks after the fires implicated Trudeau in the incident. A gasoline station owner said at Trudeau's district court pre-trial hearing that Trudeau purchased a can of gasoline the night of the alleged arson at the administration building.

Budget approval met with skepticism

A "balanced" 1983-84 school budget, predicated on the assumption of over \$1.1 million in budgeted expenses for instruction - teachers' salaries.
The school board is presently bargaining with all 10 of the district's employee groups, including the 450-member Walled Lake Education Association (WLEA).
Spokesperson for the WLEA, Karen Filar, had no comment on the budget adoption Tuesday morning, June 28. "The board has taken an honorable stand," said Trustee Patricia Jackman following the 5-1 approval of the 1983-84 budget as presented by Sheldon.
But the lone dissenter in the vote, Trustee Betty Campion, disagreed. "I'm opposed to this budget," she said. "It is predicated on an assumption that cannot agree with that." The budget as presented leaves no alternatives open should the "assumption" that teachers will concede over \$1 million in salary cuts prove invalid, she said.
In addition to Jackman, Trustees Bonnie Venze, Merlin Reeds, Mario Tozzi and Robert Cooper voted in favor of the budget adoption. Board Member Janet Callahan was absent.
The board recently approved retraction of lay-off notices for 19 Walled Lake teachers. Only 8 1/2 teaching positions were cut from the 1983-84 budget. Reductions in teaching positions were due to declining enrollment.
The \$26.6 million budget will be funded by a 33.54 mill tax levy, the same rate as last year, Sheldon noted. The debt retirement millage of 1.091 is up slightly from last year, he added.
General fund expenses in the 1983-84 budget include \$11.4 million for teaching salaries, compared to \$12.7 million last year.
Other expenses include \$166,540 for the school board and superintendent; \$1.1 million for principals and school secretaries; \$5.6 million for the business office, bus drivers, custodian and maintenance personnel; \$875,540 for counselors, social workers, playground and other student aides.

Berchtold settles in Village

When the Village of Wolverine Lake finished work on its budget this year, new Administrator John Berchtold breathed a sigh of relief and found time to reflect on his three months as the village's chief manager.
Berchtold, 29, is still settling into his new post, but with the budget complete the slower pace of summer should give him more time to adjust to his new home.
The administrator was hired by the village council in March and, although a rookie in Wolverine Lake, Berchtold's government background stretches over four communities, including three in his home state of Pennsylvania.
"I was attracted to the community because of the lake and the people," said Berchtold. Wolverine Lake, however, was just one of over 40 places where he applied for an administrative position. "Wolverine Lake was the only one in Michigan," he said.
Berchtold gave up his position in Harbor Beach along Lake Huron for the Wolverine Lake job. "Harbor Beach is a similar community to Wolverine Lake," he said. "I was very pleased and excited to get the job."
Born in Yeadon, Pennsylvania, just outside Philadelphia, Berchtold got his first government job while attending Temple University. He worked as a summer bookkeeper in Yeadon.
"At that time my hometown hired its first city manager, Bill Tallman, and he was my first mentor," Berchtold said. "I really enjoyed it. Bill Tallman opened my eyes to city management and he sponsored my first application into the International City Managers Association."
Besides Tallman, Berchtold credits his mother Elizabeth with sparking his interest in government. "She was a community reporter when I was young and I remember hearing stories and listening to her on the phone because she worked at home. I never dreamed at that age I would be involved in government," he said.
Berchtold originally wanted to be a priest, but turned away from that profession after attending a seminar. "I was kind of young at the time and not thinking about a family. I really don't know why I gave up the idea," he said.
After graduating from Temple, Berchtold picked up his government career. By March of 1980, he was in Michigan as Harbor Beach city manager.
After three months on the job in Wolverine Lake, Berchtold said he is still excited by the task of running the village. "It's fun to come to work - that's always important - and the meetings are fun," he said.
"I am really impressed with the village staff and the council," he added. "They are very supportive and always open to ideas."
Berchtold runs the day-to-day operations of the village, a job he describes as similar to managing a \$1 million business.
"I'm involved in just about every aspect of the village from personnel to residents' complaints," Berchtold said. "It's a position that involves a whole host of things, and that too is kind of fun."
The Wolverine Lake resident has found a few frustrations in his new community, but they haven't been "overbearing."
"There are always a few frustrations. The biggest (frustration) is not being able to solve every problem or complaint. I like to get out and meet the residents who might have a complaint and get firsthand information. It helps to solve those problems that do arise."
Although Berchtold compares Wolverine Lake with his previous community of Harbor Beach, there is a difference.

Novi racer gets more notoriety

The nationwide appeal of the Novi Special, the Indianapolis racer named for parts built in Novi, is being demonstrated continuously as various magazines feature the car in articles and orders come in for Novi Special paraphernalia, according to Novi City Manager Edward Kriewald.
In the latest bit of attention focused on the car, Circle Track magazine featured museum "65 Novi" as the "classic car" for May.
The May 23 edition of Sports Illustrated also featured an advertisement calling the Novi and driver Lou Welch as the forerunners of high-tech mechanical minds and machines.
Auto Week has had two stories on the Novi, one telling the history of the car and a second regarding the city's efforts to restore the racer.
As a result of the publicity, the city is beginning to receive orders for Novi Special T-shirts and other wares. The city already has received two orders for T-shirts from out-of-towners.
Peter Skony of Chicago recently Novl obtained the car after more than a year of negotiations between Kriewald and Granatelli, who agreed to sell the car for \$35,000. The car does not yet have an engine or a drive train. Granatelli has offered to sell those parts to the city for an additional \$160,000.
The initial purchase of the racer was made possible by the Novi Special Development Corporation (EDC). Funds to purchase the car came from an administrative fee charged to developers who take advantage of tax-free financing offered through the EDC. No tax dollars went into the purchase.

Village council okays new dispatching post

The Wolverine Lake Village Council has passed a resolution establishing the position of senior dispatcher for the village's police department.

Fourth festivities help bring community spirit

The height of summertime merry-making - the Fourth of July.

Georgine Hayes, a member of the Walled Lake Chamber of Commerce Action Committee, said the committee is still soliciting interested businesses or groups who would like to set up a booth in the beach area. The Walled Lake Big Boy plans to sell hot dogs and several local artists have planned craft booths, she said.
"We do it for fun and for the community spirit," said Hayes.
Several streets will be closed from 7 p.m. July 3, including East Walled Lake Drive between the intersection of Pontiac Trail and Fourteen Mile; Liberty Street between Pontiac Trail and East Walled Lake Drive; and Market Street at the Pontiac Trail intersection.
Pre-fireworks activities also will include the Jaycees-sponsored raft races. The frolicking will begin at about 5 p.m., again from the Mercer Beach area. Registration for the competition costs 50 cents.
A 6.2-mile run concludes the holiday weekend beginning at Mercer Beach at 10 a.m. Monday, July 4. The trek around the lake, sponsored by the Walled Lake Jaycees, is expected to attract about 200 runners.
The race will conclude around noon in front of the Woodstone store.

Fireworks



July 4th: Safety 1st

Fourth of July celebrations are fast approaching, leading to a boom in fireworks sales.

In an effort to clear up the annual confusion over which types of fireworks are legal and which are not, Michigan State Police recently offered some precautions, suggestions and definitions to help make the holiday both legal and safe.

Local police officials report they already have confiscated a large amount of illegal fireworks this season.

Normally, most Department of Transportation (DOT) Class C labeled fireworks are approved for use by consumers. But consumers should be aware that not all "DOT Class C" labeled fireworks are legal in Michigan. The only firework devices that can be sold at retail and used by the general public are the following:

Toy paper caps, wire sparklers (size 1/4 or less), filter sparklers, toy snakes, toy smoke devices, toy trick noise makers, cone fountains and cylinder fountains. They cannot contain more than 25 of a grain of explosives per cap.

Devices other than those noted above are illegal for sale or use unless proper permits are obtained from the local governing body.

Fireworks that send a projectile into the air, spin, twirl or emit an audible signal (excluding the paper caps and trick noise makers mentioned above) also are illegal.

Local jurisdictions should be contacted to determine if there are more

There will be activities throughout the afternoon, including horse shoe tournaments, children's games, volleyball, free pony rides and a magician. Civic groups also will sell refreshments.

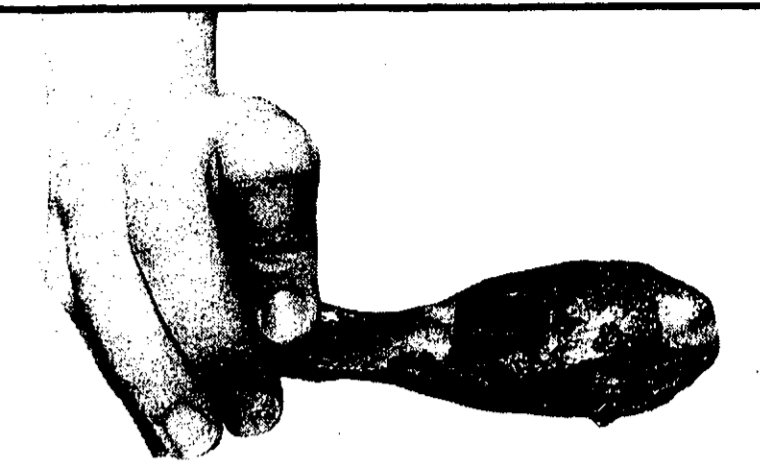

Some cool snacks for one hot time

The Fourth of July means picnic time in most American homes. Families and friends gather to celebrate in a variety of ways, but everyone always looks forward to a good food—and lots of it.

For the host and hostess who don't want to spend their weekend in the kitchen, the menu should be simple. What could be easier than a chicken barbecue, complete with spinach salad, rice pilaf, zucchini casserole, store-bought loaves of heated French bread and cheesecake topped with strawberries?

Here are some kitchen-tested recipes that are bound to please all your guests—and give you time to join in on the fun.

CHICKEN BARBECUE SAUCE

- One-half cup oil
- One cup cider vinegar
- Two and one-half teaspoons salt
- One and one-half teaspoon poultry seasoning
- One-quarter teaspoon pepper
- One beaten egg

Boil all ingredients except egg for two minutes. Let mixture cool, then add beaten egg. Heat all together. Brush on chicken and broil/grill 45 minutes to one hour.

IRENE'S BARBECUE SAUCE

- One cup catsup
- Three-quarters cup water
- One-quarter cup dark molasses
- Two Tablespoons butter or margarine
- Two Tablespoons vinegar
- One small onion, chopped
- One teaspoon salt (may be omitted)
- Two Tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- One-quarter teaspoon pepper
- Two teaspoons dry mustard
- One teaspoon paprika
- Two dashes bottled hot pepper sauce
- One teaspoon chili powder

Combine ingredients in saucepan. Bring to a boil and simmer 20 minutes. Brush chicken with salad oil. Season if desired. Broil chicken, bone side down, over slow coals about 25 minutes. Turn, broil another 20 minutes, basting with sauce. Broil 15 minutes longer or until tender, basting with sauce as desired. Leftover sauce can be stored in the refrigerator or frozen.
