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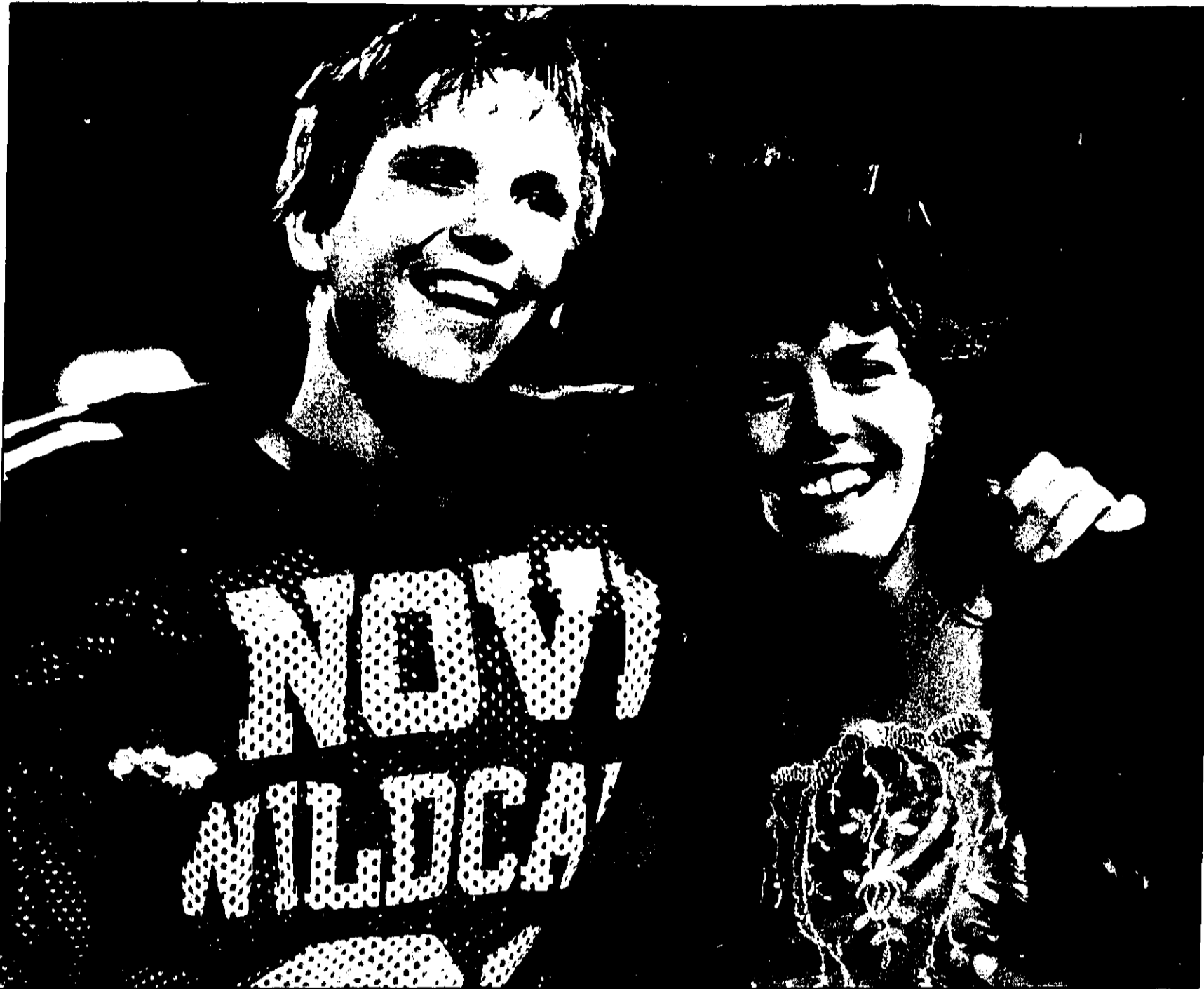

## Paths are part of millage issue

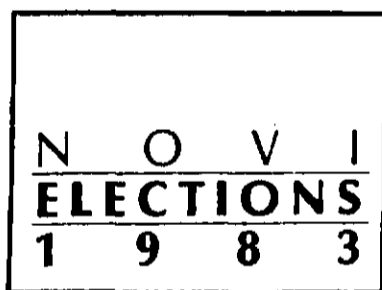
A system of paths connecting Novi's most heavily populated areas with educational, commercial and recreational facilities throughout the community is one aspect of a ballot issue to come before voters November 8.

Two questions placed on the ballot would provide funds to acquire property, develop parks and construct bike-pedestrian pathways, as well as provide money to operate and maintain the facilities.

The first question for voters' consideration is a \$4.3 million bond issue.

The bond issue would provide:

- \$1.3 million to finance construction of 18 miles of bike-pedestrian paths;
- \$985,000 for acquisition of six parks;
- \$900,000 to develop five existing



parks and six new parks; and, • \$200,000 to cover the Parks and Recreation department's share of a city maintenance facility.

A charter amendment, which is the second part of the proposal, would allow the city to levy .25 mills to operate and maintain new parks and pathways. The millage would generate approximately \$105,000 annually.

The program would provide for all the city's ultimate parkland needs and nearly half of the 40 miles of pathways called for in the parks and recreation master plan.

Purchasing parkland, developing parks, and building pathways and the maintenance facility, along with providing the money to operate the new facilities have been identified by a citizen's committee as the top priority in the implementation of Novi's parks and recreation master plan.

Novi Parks and Recreation Director Thomas O'Branovic said that as the committee set its priorities it looked for areas of the master plan which will have a beneficial affect on the most people.

"The committee looked at bike-pedestrian paths as a high priority, because there's not a safe means of bik-

ing, walking and jogging within the city," explained O'Branovic. "You either have to use the street or the road shoulder."

He noted youngsters on bicycles have been struck by automobiles and senior citizens do not have a safe way to walk from their homes to local shopping centers.

"The committee took those 40 miles (in the master plan) and developed priorities for construction," O'Branovic said.

"Our goal was to make a useful connection of all the paths. We didn't want to put paths where they wouldn't link or have continuity," O'Branovic said.

The plan that emerged provides a north-south route along Meadowbrook and Decker roads. The east-south route

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## Center's proper location studied

NOVI — Citizens studying the city's need for a new community center and city hall will be visiting municipal complexes throughout the metropolitan area in order to determine the proper location for such a building.

Several representatives on the nine member citizen's committee suggested last week that the proposed community center and city offices be located in the Town Center area (at Grand River and Novi roads) rather than on Ten Mile with other municipal facilities.

Ultimately, the group decided it would study city halls located in central business districts along with those in municipal complexes such as those being developed on Ten Mile.

Visits to Troy, Southfield, Madison Heights, Oak Park, Livonia and Woodhaven are planned.

The group, which met for the first time last week, has been given up to 18 months to develop plans for a community center and prepare plans for its financing and construction.

The committee was formed in

response to requests from the Library Board because the library is expanding faster than anticipated and is anxious to move into the portion of its building now occupied by city offices. Community members also have expressed a need for a community center to replace the antiquated building on Novi Road.

In its organizational meeting, Chairperson Father Leslie Harding told the group he foresees the building as the last major capital improvement for the city — a building which should be "the hub for the totality of government."

The group also learned a citizen's committee studied the development of a community center and presented the issue as a ballot proposal four years ago. The question appeared with two other millage proposals and was defeated. That proposal was for a community center and did not include city offices.

"This is more complex," Harding said. "We had an easier goal then."

As the group set about establishing priorities, Secretary Rose Crain asked

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## Schools call for early bargaining

NOVI — Marching bands and hot-air balloons will be featured when the Novi High School Band Boosters host a "Bands and Balloon Festival" this Saturday at Novi High School and Power Park.

## Novi police officer brings Meghan into the world

Meghan McDonald's birth won't go down in any obstetric journals, but to the police officer who delivered her it was something of a miracle.

The six pound, 12 ounce baby girl made an earlier than expected arrival into the world Tuesday, October 4. She was born on the family room floor of her parent's home on Gilbar in Meadowbrook Glens. And Novi Police Officer Ken Meier was there to assist.

Judy McDonald had her first labor pains just one hour before the baby was born. Since her previous labor lasted 19 hours she and her husband believed there was plenty of time to pack her bag and leave for the hospital.

"I got home for lunch at quarter to two. We started timing the contractions and they started coming more and more regularly," reports the father, Brian McDonald.

Brian tried to get his wife into the car to take her to the hospital, but she had begun to deliver and could not move. She reclined on the couch in the family room, while her husband called for assistance.

When Meier was dispatched on a call of a woman having labor pains his first thoughts were: 'I hope the ambulance gets there.'

But he beat the paramedics to the scene.

He was met by Brian McDonald and led to the family room.

"I took a reassuring role, telling them the ambulance was right behind me," Meier says. "Mrs. McDonald kept saying, 'my baby's going to come.'"

Meier put everyone to work, sending Brian and his mother-in-law, Gerry McGhan, to get towels and other things needed for the delivery.

Then Meier and the woman's husband moved her to the floor and calling on his experience when his wife delivered their baby, Meier guided the McDonald's baby and delivered it.

"I told her to keep her knees up and things like that. We were lucky everything went the way it was supposed to," Meier says.

"I was so happy when the baby started crying. We knew it was okay then," Meier says. "It was such a good feeling to be there. It was almost like being part of the family."

"It brought back memories of when our baby was born," Meier added.

The baby was born just minutes after Meier had arrived. Soon the ambulance appeared on the scene and mother and baby were transported to St. Mary's Hospital.

Neighbors gathered outside the McDonald's home congratulated the new mother on the safe delivery.

Mother and baby are now both home, joining father and six-year old sister Melissa.

Looking back on the incident, the

# Trustee supports driving standards

NOVI - Teachers who flunked drivers' education students received a vote of support from Trustee Gilbert Henderson at the October 6 school board meeting. Henderson made the comments in response to a report that showed drivers' education certificates were issued to 12 students who "were unsuccessful in meeting driving and classroom requirements." The statistic speaks highly of staff and tells the community that students who obtain certificates are safe, qualified drivers, said Henderson. "I know how much heat can be applied by parents and students to issue driving certificates," he added. "This tells me that our teachers are doing a competent job of developing drivers who are fit to be on the road." A total of 210 students were enrolled in drivers' education last summer with 188 completion certificates being issued. Ten students were dropped for attendance problems and 12 failed to meet driving and classroom requirements.

# 'Mud Lake' may snag developer's condo plans

WALLED LAKE - Known as "Mud Lake", the highly vegetated swamp in the southwest corner of the Foster Farm property was probably as much a thorn in the side of past farmers as it has been for potential developers. But what was disfavorably dubbed "Mud Lake" by past land owners is, to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR), a rare type of wetland, possibly worth preserving. Walled Lake developer Roy Mercer met with DNR officials in Lansing last month to discuss the environmental concerns surrounding his plans to construct 25 five-story condominiums on the Pontiac Trail farm property. "We would be very restrictive on development around the Mud Lake area," said Chuck Wolverton of the DNR's Wetland Protection Unit after reviewing Mercer's plans. "Michigan has a lot of open water (lakes), but not nearly as much vegetated wetland," Wolverton explained. An area such as Mud Lake could be a habitat for a host of wildlife, including ducks, geese, wading birds, shore birds, furred animals such as muskrats and fish, he noted. In order to build in the area, Mercer will have to obtain a permit from the Wetlands Protection Unit, Wolverton said. After the developer applies for a permit, DNR officials conduct an on-site inspection to determine what kind of wildlife actually exists in the area and how the proposed development will affect that wildlife. "We'll look at what he wants to do in the area and the necessity and feasibility of the project. We may tell the developer there are certain areas he can't develop," Wolverton explained. Mercer's plans call for developing the swampy area into a more aesthetically pleasing area surrounded by a park-like area for residents of the condominiums. Wolverton said he could not speculate on the feasibility of these plans without inspecting the site. The Lansing meeting was arranged after Wolverine Lake Village officials requested an environmental study of Mercer's proposed development. In addition to DNR officials, the Oakland County Drain Office, Walled Lake and Wolverine Lake Village were represented at last month's session in Lansing. Village officials are particularly concerned with the project's possible impact on the Greenway Drain, which runs across the front of the Foster Farm property and empties into Wolverine Lake. "He does propose a retention facility and plans to control the amount and quality of water flowing into the Greenway Drain. At this point in time we are pleased with what he has proposed," said William Klockow of the Oakland County drain office after the meeting in Lansing. Wolverine Lake Village Administrator John Bercholdt said he

thought the meeting was productive, but village officials are waiting on an environmental assessment of the project before determining whether or not it will adversely affect the drain. Suzanne Elms of the DNR water management division said information shared by the officials attending the meeting was beneficial, especially for a project that has been surrounded by some local controversy. "It was a courtesy - a chance to get everybody together to get an overall feel for what he plans to do," she said.

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# Annual Reyes Run planned Saturday

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# Officials consider franchise approval

WALLED LAKE - The West Oakland Cable Authority monthly meeting has been cancelled until November as local communities consider the proposed franchise agreement and regulatory ordinance. "We are pretty much on-line taking the documents to boards and councils. There have been no major concerns raised or complaints," said Authority Chairman J. Michael Dorman. "That is amazing considering we were dealing with such a large number of groups." The authority consists of nine member communities including the cities of Walled Lake and Wixom, Commerce, Milford, Lyon, Highland and White Lake townships, Milford and Wolverine Lake villages. The communities organized to obtain the best cable services by offering a high population block. Four communities required voter approval of franchises, which will appear on the Tuesday, November 8, ballot. The October authority meeting was cancelled since no action could be considered until after the election. During the franchise negotiations with Greater Media Cablevision, the communities obtained a 14 percent reduction in the basic service fee. To obtain basic cable service with 32-channels, residents will pay \$6.95. "The 14 percent overall reduction was a trade-off for dropping a discount for senior citizens and the handicapped," Dorman commented. "That discount was to have been ten percent. The 14 percent reduction is greater and easier to administer." With the basic service, residents will be able to purchase premium channels such as the Home Theatre Network and Walt Disney for an additional \$8.95. The 62-channel tier will cost residents \$9.95 with optional channels such as Home Box Office, Showtime and Cinemax. Dorman said the second tier premium channels were reduced from \$9.95 to \$8.50 with the exception of Home Box Office. Discounts are available when multiple premium channels are ordered. As part of the franchise agreement Greater Media will provide \$50,000 for school use through a regional production center. Access studios are proposed for Walled Lake Western and Lakeland high schools with ten production units and one van unit. The major school districts also are allocated \$25,000 for character generators.

## Energy Saving

### Conference aim to assist community energy savings

With fall comes cooler weather and a sound that causes many a homeowner to flinch — that of the furnace kicking into operation.

The costs associated with that sound are not, of course, limited to homeowners. According to the Energy Administration of the Michigan Department of Commerce, for most communities, school districts and businesses, energy costs are the second largest budget cost following only wages and fringe benefits.

That's why the Energy Administration has stated its second annual Community Energy Management Conference October 27 and 28 in Battle Creek. The cost of energy, most of it imported, has enormous effects on the state economy and the conference will focus on methods to conserve and plan energy usage more efficiently.

The Energy Administration reports that Michigan depends upon on imported energy for 95 percent of all energy needs, exporting billions of dollars each year to buy imported oil, natural gas and coal.

More than 10 cents of every dollar in Michigan's economy is exported to other states and foreign countries to import energy, compared to only

two cents in the early 1970s. According to the Department of Commerce, this drain on our economy causes investment capital, jobs and the multiplier spending effect to shift away from Michigan and to the fuel exporting states and countries.

The conference is designed to assist community leaders in coming to grips with energy issues and to provide information to assist in the formation of local energy programs.

Keynote speakers are Martin Klepper, author of several books about innovative financing techniques for energy projects and David Morris, director of the Washington, D.C.-based Institute for Local Self-Reliance and author of "Self-Reliant Cities."

There will be more than 20 workshops covering community resources, financing options, facility and vehicle fleet management, local energy policy issues, and renewable energy resources. Conference fee of \$60 includes luncheon both days. ## Insulate at no interest

Consumers Power Company is encouraging its gas space-heating customers to look into a special loan program that could save them money every winter for years.

The loans are available to residential customers whose homes now have 2.5 inches or less of ceiling insulation, according to Jim Macintosh, metro region general manager for Consumers Power.

"The loan interest rate is zero, and customer can take up to five years to repay the loan for the materials. In either case, Consumers Power will handle all the paperwork and pay the contractor or materials supplier directly."

The company will also send out a representative to inspect the completed work.

Participating customers have up to five years to repay the loan through monthly installments included with their energy bills. The monthly installment for do-it-yourselfers has been averaging \$5 since the program was initiated while the payment for contractor-installed work has averaged \$8.

Macintosh said the company's records show that the amount of money saved each month by the added insulation is usually greater than the monthly installment to repay the loan.

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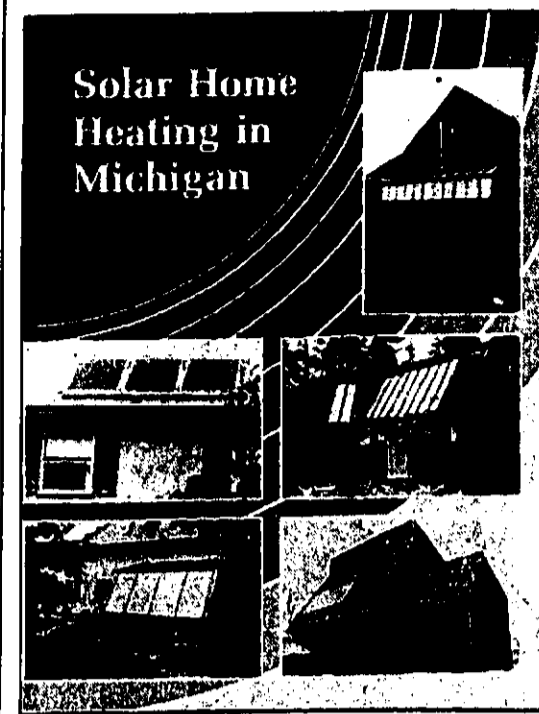
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## Booklet helps solar shoppers

Despite our northern latitude, more than 10,000 Michigan residents have discovered that solar energy systems work well in this state, providing much of the home's space or water heating requirements while reducing the need for costly fossil fuels.

In 1981, Michigan ranked fifth among all states in the number of solar heating installations, behind only California, Florida, Arizona and Colorado.

To assist Michigan residents interested in solar heating, the Energy Administration of the Department of Commerce publishes "Solar Home Heating in Michigan," a 24-page booklet presenting the fundamentals of the system for new and existing homes. It describes a variety of systems for space and household water heating and shows examples of solar homes and installations in Michigan.

The booklet also helps in determining the initial costs of a solar system, the size necessary to meet

heating needs and the potential savings to be expected.

"Many people mistakenly believe that Michigan's cloudy climate makes solar systems uneconomical," said Joann Neuhoff, director of the Energy Administration. "Actually, solar systems in Michigan pay for themselves more quickly than those in sunnier climates because of our greater need for heating."

She added that solar heating has several advantages, including being safe, dependable and easy to do. Federal and state tax incentives further reduce the cost of installing solar systems. Shown here are solar panels being installed on a Milford ranch home which will help its owners cut heating costs during the winter.

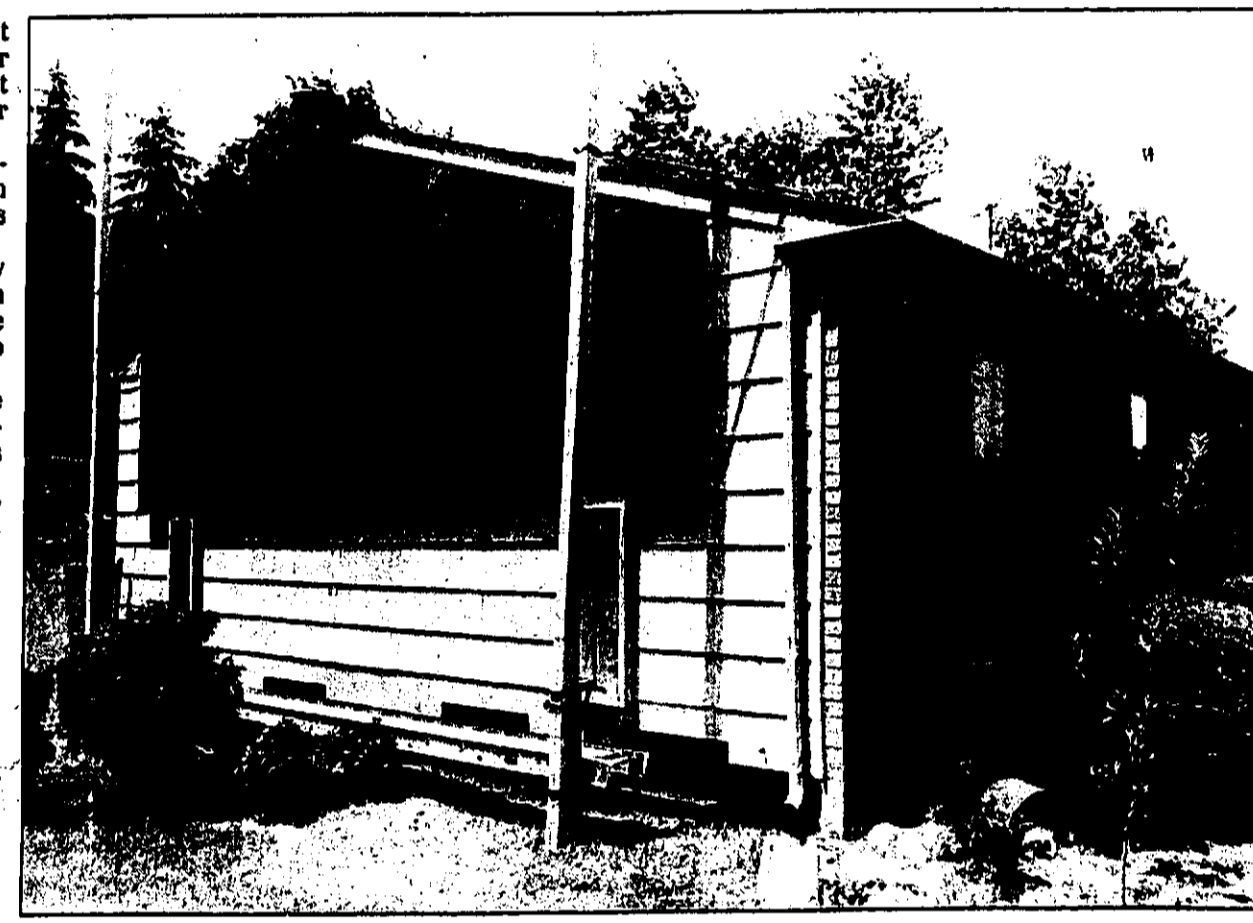
Goodenough emphasizes that now is an excellent time to retrofit homes with solar collectors or wall panels like these, either for space heating or to heat water.

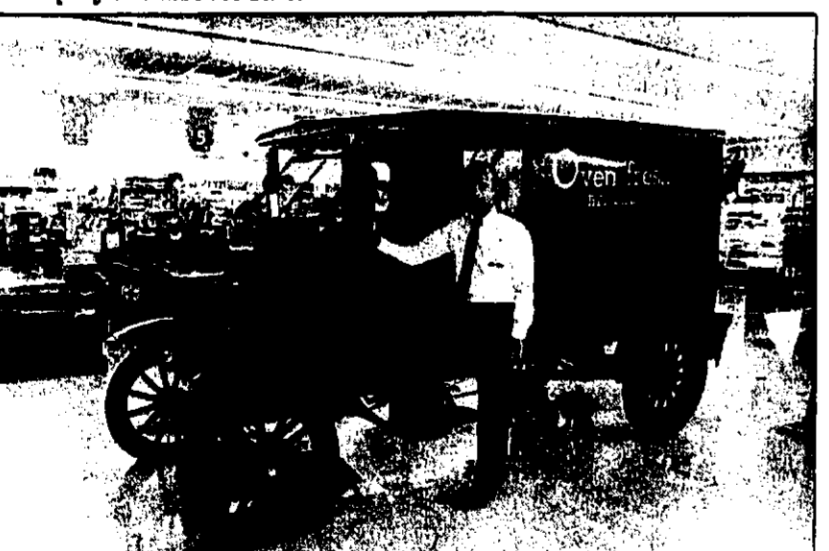

Ex-Cell-O aiming for an up year

E. Paul Casey, president and chief executive officer of Ex-Cell-O Corporation announced third quarter sales, net earnings and net earnings per share below those of the same 1982 period.

"We are pleased, however, that 1983 is developing into a stronger year than originally anticipated, reflecting the continued strengthening of most segments of the economy," Casey said.

"We continue to expect earnings per share for the year to be above the \$2.25 earned in 1982," he added. While third quarter statistics were below 1982 levels, nine-month per share earnings were still ahead of the year-ago figures.

For the three months ending August 31, net earnings per share were \$7.79 compared to \$8.84 in the third quarter of 1982, a six percent decline. Sales were \$22.9 million, seven percent below 1982's \$25.2 million, while net earnings were \$11.2 million, nine percent below the 1982 figure of \$12.3 million.

For the nine month period ending August 31, net earnings per share were up five percent from 1982, at \$22.67. Sales were \$70.5 million, 10 percent below 1982's \$78.7 million tallied in 1982. Net earnings were \$37.9 million as compared to \$38.1 million a year earlier.

Casey said sharp improvement was seen in the firm's automotive components segment in the third quarter as car production continued at a fairly high rate.

"The Aerospace and Ordnance segments remain strong and the performance of the Specialty Products segment has improved significantly," he said. "The Industrial Equipment segment is operating at a loss reflecting the depressed conditions in the Machine Tool Industry. We have not yet seen an upturn in orders as capital goods spending continues at low levels."

## Lakeland bruises Novi 28-7, big plays mar homecoming

Everybody was in the spirit for Novi's Homecoming last Friday. The Novi crowd looked like East Lansing before last Saturday's MSU vs. U-M game.

Fans painted their faces green and white, the packed, noisy stands were green and white, the floats (the sophomores won), bands and halftime performers were decked in green and white.

And the Novi football team was black and blue. Lakeland rumbled ungracefully over the Wildcats' 28-7.

This year's contest showed a lot of new faces — the Eagles and the Wildcats had extensive replacements to make after graduation skimmed off much of the cream from their '82 teams, which played to a 7-0 Lakeland victory last year.

The difference seemed to be that Lakeland's new faces are higher off the ground. 1-3 record or not, the Eagles are a big football team and they enjoyed an edge in line play throughout the game — but most of all, the Eagles got the big plays.

The first one was a third-down interception on Novi's first possession that gave the Eagles the ball at the Novi 28. A quick slant-in pass to Eagle receiver Carl Maro two plays later, and it was 6-0 Lakeland.

After a Novi drive fizzled at the Lakeland 28, Eagle quarterback Mike Harper reared back on second down

and fired a stratospheric 79-yard TD bomb to wide receiver Dan Baenziger, who blew past the Novi secondary and snagged the pass on a dead run. Big play number two.

"We'd scouted Lakeland before and we didn't expect Baenziger to have that kind of speed," Novi coach John Osborne said grimly. Lakeland added a two-point conversion and before the end of the first quarter, Novi found itself down 14-0.

The Wildcats gamely put together their only scoring drive of the game after the kickoff, marching 69 yards on 13 plays and converting a Todd Crutchfield-to-Tim Ford 3-yard TD pass. Kern Stahr's extra point made the score 14-7, and Novi appeared to be back in the game.

Then Lakeland came up with big play number three, courtesy of Baenziger once more — an 85-yard kickoff return down the right sideline. Without yielding one first down, Novi was behind 21-7 at the half.

"We got in trouble early," Osborne said, "and we just didn't seem to have much."

Forced into a passing game, Crutchfield wound up being chased in the backfield throughout much of the second half, while Lakeland's present secondary shut off the bomb option. The senior quarterback unleashed four interceptions, finishing the game 13 of 28 for 99 yards.

Wasted was a superior effort by tight

end Dave Whitehead, who caught five passes for 45 yards, all of them in first; Steve Korte was Novi's leading ground-gainer, but didn't get far — on 16 carries, Korte picked up 70 yards. Korte also caught four passes for 17 yards, while Ford received two for 17 yards and Eric Balk one for 22.

Lakeland got its final score on one more big play — a 39-yarder to Baenziger in the third quarter that again

caught the secondary by surprise: It was the final big strike from Harper, who finished the game six of 12 for 171 yards passing.

The big play quotient was particularly evident in several areas, since Novi was unable to convert some of its statistical advantages into points — Novi picked up 10 first downs to Lakeland's four, and 110 yards rushing to Lakeland's 94.

## Warriors add two to winning streak
