Realtors say local market's booming

NOVI - Everyone knows the housing market has recovered from the recessionary doldrums, but how are things going in Novi?

'Fabulous,'' said Conrad Jakubowski, president of Rymal Symes Realty. 'The first quarter of 1985 was the

best quarter we've ever had at our Novi office," he reported. "Better even than 1978 and 1979 which were peak years in the housing market. "We're up 33.7 percent over last

year's figures.' Carol Mason, president of Carol Mason Realty, issued a similar

"The volume is great," she said. "Our office recorded 168 calls and walk-ins last month alone. Normally, we have 65-68 calls or walk-ins per

cited the quality and reputation of the Novi Community School District as one of the chief reasons for the demand for housing in Novi.

And both reported that the supply of single-family homes is beginning to run short.

"There's an insufficient supply of properties on the market which tells me that prices are about to jump," said Jakubowski. "It's a simple rule of supply and demand. Right now we have more buyers than we do sellers."

Mason also referred to the scarcity of available listings and said people in Novi who already have singlefamily homes are afraid to sell out of fear they will be unable to find

another. "The problem," she said, "is that there's an insufficient supply of single family homes in the 'over-\$100,000' price range. There are a couple of upper-range homes on the market in Meadowbrook Lake and one or two in Whispering Meadows, but for the most part there are very few homes available in the price

range over \$100,000. "What we're finding is a lot of people with homes in the \$70,000 to

\$80,000 range who would like to move up into a larger, more expensive house, but are unwilling to do so because they won't be able to find what they're looking for."

These are people, she said, who have children in school and would like them to remain in the Novi schools. "They're building additions onto their existing homes instead of running the risk of selling and being unable to find something in the higher price range and be forced to pull their children out of the Novi

As an example of the demand for single-family homes in Novi, Mason said she recently sold a home in the Meadowbrook Glens subdivision within a matter of hours. "We put it on the market on a Sunday morning and it was sold that afternoon," she reported.

Woman in Nov. shot, wounded by ex-husband

NOVI - A man is dead and a woman is in serious condition at Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak as a result of a suicide/attempted homicide in the Chateau Estates Mobile Home Park Friday, April 12.

Dead is Michael Leonard Gurney, 38, of Detroit Boulevard in West Bloomfield.

According to police reports, Gurney fatally shot himself with a sawed-off shotgun after shooting his ex-wife, Patricia Ann Gurney, 33, outside her residence on Lamier in the mobile home park off Thirteen Mile. She was listed in serious condition at Beaumont Hospital on Monday, according to a hospital spokesperson.

The double shooting occurred at approximately 6 p.m.

Police received the report of a shooting incident on Lamier shortly after 6 p.m. When they arrived on the scene, two subjects were seen lying

on the grass outside one of the mobile homes.

The male, later identified as Gurney, had a bullet hole in the neck. police said. The sawed-off shotgun was found lying beside his body.

The second subject, later identified as Patricia Gurney, was lying face down on the grass and had several wounds on her upper back and shoulders, according to reports.

Police said the male appeared to be dead, but the female verbally requested assistance.

Both were transported by ambulance to Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills where Gurney was pronounced dead at 6:22 p.m. Patricia Gurney was treated and transferred to Beaumont Hospital because of the severity of her wounds, according to

Budget surplus forces trimming

NOVI — Surplus funds in the city's budget have grown so large an extra effort is being made to trim them back this year.

City Manager Edward Kriewall's proposed 1985-86 budget includes an appropriation of \$800,000 from the ci-

ty's \$1.2 million fund balance. At city council's Wednesday, April 10 budget study session, Finance Director Les Gibson said the large

appropriation is meant to draw down the budget surplus. "I think we've got to get that thing down - and I think this budget's going to do it," Gibson told the council.

"It's good to have a fund balance. But it can get to the point where your credibility is questioned." The growth in the fund balance has

been unintentional, Gibson explained this week. It was caused by unexpected increases in state shared revenue, interest earnings and building permits.

For several years state shared revenues were coming in lower than projected, Gibson explained. For example, in 1981-82, the city expected \$1 million from the state but ended up receiving about \$900,000. In 1982-83 the city projected it would receive \$950,000, but the year-end actual was only \$870,000.

As a result of these shortfalls, the city began to budget amounts lower than what the state projected it would have available in shared revenues.

But then the trend reversed. In

1983-84, the city budgeted state revenues of \$985,000; they came in at \$1.022 million. Last year \$1 mill was budgeted. The city now expects 1984-85 state revenues to reach \$1.185 million by the end of the fiscal year in

The expected surplus of 1984-85 state revenues is coupled with an unanticipated increase in building permits over the past year.

Building activity is one of the most difficult items in the budget to project, Gibson noted. Last year income from building permits exceeded the budget estimate by more than

These unexpected increases in state revenues, building permits and other scattered revenue items such as interest earnings have foiled yearly attempts to reduce the fund

"It's a weird cycle. We've been attempting to bring it down every year. but our attempts haven't been drawing it down nearly as much as expected," Gibson noted.

However, this year's allocation of more than half the fund balance to the general fund should bring the desired result, he added. The appropriation will leave an estimated \$500,000 in the fund balance for next year.

When he presented the 1985-86 budget, Kriewall noted the city's "healthy" fund balance, along with continued growth in property values, enabled the city to keep pace with inflation and new staffing needs without a tax increase this year.

Librarian gets top Novi post

NOVI — After six years as public services librarian at Novi Public Library, Brenda Burrell has taken the helm of the Ten Mile facility as newly-appointed administrator. Burrell, who has been serving as interim administrator since the resignation of former library head Dianne Bish in February, was chosen for the post by the library board

from a field of 16 applicants which included several library directors and branch heads. Paul Black, president of the library board, said Burrell was one of four finalists for the post.

at its April 6 meeting. Burrell was selected for the position

"Brenda had a lot of in-house experience and she knew the library," Black said of the board's selection. "She also has a great deal of talent which we are obviously aware of. "We felt no one stood out over her."

Burrell, who has been with the library since 1979, said her new appointment comes at "a critical time for libraries" with many facing funding woes coupled with greater patron demand for additional services.

Though Burrell noted that Novi's funding has remained stable, she said "keeping up with the public" is among the many goals she's established for herself as administrator. "This is a very challenging community," Burrell said. "We're at a point where we have to decide what the next

She pointed out that the library is in a "stage of transition" as it prepares to embark on a new technological

Burrell said the library currently has the hardware for its automated circulation system and also is looking into automated data bases as a means of providing up-to-theminute information to patrons.

She said it is possible that with advanced technology, library landmarks such as the card catalog, index. reference files, etc. could become obsolete. "We also would like to make computer technology more

possible to circulate computer software. In addition to servicing patrons, Burrell said computer technology also will be utilized by librarians in such areas as circulation, reference, cataloging, etc.

As We See It

Business owners deserve concern

It's simply a map of concepts and ideas, but it's causing quite a stir in Novi these days.

The "Town Center Conceptual Plan' will be presented at a joint meeting of city council and the planning board Monday, April 29. However, the plan already has been reviewed in detail by the Town Center Steering Committee. In addition, most council members ment have at least glanced at the map, which incorporates various ideas for development in the four quadrants of the Grand River Avenue/Novi Road intersection.

With this exposure, rumors concerning the contents of the plan have filtered through the Novi business community. The map and its "conceptual ideas" for future development in the Town Center is causing a ruckus among area business people, because many of their establishments are conspicuously missing from the map.

One representative from the Steering Committee and, therefore, has had the opportunity to review the plan. This representative. Tom Marcus of Marcus Glass, himself expressed concern over how his fellow business owners might react to the map, which shows walkways, "cottage industries". museums and smal retail stores in place of some ex-

Such malcontent may be typical to some degree within any community gearing up for change and growth. But it is unnecessarily heightened when rumors are allowed to replace accurate information, and city officials, in their enthusiasm to see the community grow, appear insensitive to the frustrations and concerns of those

Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers specifically stated the map is not a "working plan," but a "conceptual plan." It illustrates what the Town Center might look like in 15 or 20 years if the city encourages certain kinds of develop-

Specific ideas are suggested for the type of business the city might try to attract in each of the four quadrants. But even if the plan is unanimously adopted, there are no guarantees developers will show up with plans for each of the types of businesses shown on the map.

The plan was very carefully drawn to include many of the types of businesses now existing in the Town Center. It allows the diversity of activity that now exists, but. in some instances, suggests Center already have discarded the relocating businesses to create a more unified character within each of the four quadrants.

The "Goat Farm Case," as oldtimers know, is one of the classics in Novi planning history. In the early 1970s, a developer came forward with plans to construct a bowling alley and a bar on a lot near the Ten MilehNovi Road intersection.

The bowling alley, argued the developer, was a much-needed recreational facility in Novi and would occupy the front portion of the parcel. The bar, he said, was merely an afterthought — an auxiliary use, a place for bowlers to go for a beer and a burger after bowling three games.

The developer made his plea for rezoning at a joint meeting of the Novi Planning Board and City Council in the Novi Community Building. Planners voted 9-0 to recommend denial of the rezoning request; the council voted 7-0 to grant the rezoning ... ostensibly due to the need for additional recreational facilities.

With the rezoning in hand, the developer proceeded to build the help Novi attain its goal of being a har. The bowling alley has never materialized.

Within this life of irregular and interrupted plans, however, one activity appears to have become fixed. Stable. Consistent.





Each week the 20ninute monologue focuses on some small happening in Lake Woebegone. 



Law eases regulations on small business

Small businesses, hard pressed by the time and and 50-249 fulltime employees. expense required to comply with numerous regulations, should begin to feel some relief as a result of Michigan's Regulatory Flexibility Act which became effective March 29.

Signed into law in December of 1984, the legislation (Public Act 273) requires all state agencies to consider the impact which any new regulations will have on small businesses before establishing those

The public act defines a small business as an independently owned and operated firm which employs 250 or fewer persons full-time or which has annual gross sales of less than \$6 million. According to John Galles, executive director of the Small Business Association of Michigan

(SBAM), the Regulatory Flexibility Act will be very helpful to the more than 153,000 small firms throughout the state which typically experience financial difficulties attempting to comply with a variety of state regulations. In many cases, small businesses must shoulder

the same burdens as their larger competitors but with far fewer resources, Galles said. According to the law, all state agencies must submit a statement which assesses the economic impact of proposed rules on small businesses. If the statement shows that there will be a disproportionate impact on small businesses, the department must modify the rule to lessen the impact.

To facilitate flexibility, the law establishes a tier system, classifying small businesses in categories of 0-9 fulltime employees, 10-49 fulltime employees

In addition, any existing rules that are brought to the attention of the Michigan Business Ombudsman because of disproportionate impact on small business must also undergo a small business

economic impact statemen Barbara McLeod, acting director of Business Policy and Communication for the Michigan Department of Commerce, said that the regulatory flexibility legislation is in keeping with Governor James Blanchard's goal to open up access to departments of state government and to accomplish the regulatory goals at a lower cost to small

She noted that Public Act 273 is not intended to slow down the rule-making process. "Considering the economic impact of new rules to small business before putting them in place can actually speed up the process," she said. "Things tend to move faster if the homework is done ahead of time." Additionally, the legislation is not intended to allow small businesses to be totally exempt from all

small businesses while remaining within the necessary guidelines. A recent study of federal regulations, completed by Jack Faucett Associates, an economic consulting firm in Chevy Chase, Maryland, found that the relative burden of regulation is greater for small

compliance cost-per-employee in mid-size firms wae estimated to be 1.35 times that of larger firms. The cost for small firms was estimated to be 2.83 times that of large firms.

Due to passage of the federal Regulatory Flexibility Act in 1980, federal aagencies are now required to ensure that proposed and existing rules do not unnecessarily inhibit small businesses' ability "What regulatory flexibility legislation says is,

'Let's find a more reasonable, less costly way of calling on small business to comply with regulations." said Juanita Liesse Pierman, regional advocate of the U.S. Small Business Administration. Michigan is one of 24 states which have passed regulatory flexibility legislation. The concept originally was introduced at the 1981 Michigan Conference on Small Business, where regulatory flexibility was identified as the fourth highest priority of concerns among small business people throughout

A key goal of regulatory flexibility legislation at both the state and federal level is regulatory planning. Small businesses are to have an impact on agency rule-making at every stage.



Culinary art & the cookbook

By MICHELE M. FECHT

While one can be certain that the culinary delights brought forth from the kitchen of Doug and Elizabeth Campbell are the creations of the two renowned chefs, the inspiration for their acclaimed gourmet dishes most likely can be found stacked in a ceiling-high bookcase behind

Aside from each other, the owners/chefs of Elizabeths in Northville admit their most trusted kitchen companions are the oft-handled cookbooks housed in their backyard

Their more than 450-volume collection on various foods and wines is the result of years of scrounging antique shows and shops as well as bookstores and libraries, Doug

While they have always used the contemporary works of chefs such as Julia Child and James Beard for reference materials, Doug says their expanding collection also includes several antique cookbooks (many dating back to the late 18th century), as well as regional, historical and

art books on food and wine. "We tend to buy only things we can use," Doug says, noting their tastes lean toward "French and some American regional.

"We're not so much into the housekeeping books," he explains, adding that many of the early cookbooks (particularly American) were as much housekeeping manuals Among such American classics is "Dr. Chase's Recipes

or Information for Everybody," a basic survival book for the 19th century housekeeper. Published in Ann Arbor in 1865, Chase's book sold more than a million copies and was the book most frequently carried across the prairies by pioneer families — along with the Bible. Doug notes their food and wine library contains many

books purchased on travels to Europe and the east coast. However, he says more than 80 percent of their collection was purchased from the Ann Arbor basement library of book dealer Janice Longone. The Campbells discovered Longone's voluminous col-

lection when they opened their restaurant six years ago. Elizabeth notes that Longone's antiquarian bookshop known as The Food and Wine Library, is the largest collection of food and wine books currently in circulation with more than 10,000 volumes of old, rare and out-of-print materials devoted to the field of cookery, wine, gastronomy, travel and the like

Doug notes that Longone's collection is a virtual mecca for culinary arts enthusiasts. He admits that despite their best efforts, he and Elizabeth often times spend the better part of a weekend in search of rare and unusual books from Longone's stacks. Among the many treasurers purchased by the Camp-

bells is a volume of Gauguin menus containing original drawings by the Impressionist artist. Doug notes that the book is one of only 50 in existence and contains painted sketches done by Gauguin during the

An alcoholic, Gauguin painted menus for various restaurants and pubs in return for food and liquor, Doug

He adds that some 450 Gauguin menus were acquired for the books with each volume containing nine separate

Other interesting finds picked up in Ann Arbor include an 18th century Elizabethan recipe collection published by Though printed in Old English, the Campbells used Warner's 1791 cookbook as well as Hannah Glasse's "The

Art of Cookery" published in 1841 as reference when they hosted the Ann Arbor Food and Wine Society's Shakespearean dinner four years ago.

Doug notes that the 31 guests attending the dinner wore Shakespearean attire, ate with a single knife in true Elizabethan style and dined on such delicacies as bread

and butter pudding (see recipe below) and other English Elizabeth says that in using a centuries-old cookbook for

reference, one cannot follow the recipe verbatim. (In the

case of Old English, one can hardly even translate it.) Doug notes that they favor cookbooks written between the periods of 1860 and 1920 Among the late 19th and turn-of-the-century works housFarmer's Boston Cooking-School Cookbook. There also is a host of regional materials such as early

Creole cookbooks, Suzanne Lavy Gruver's "Cape Cod Cookbook" and several Mennonite and Shaker books which Elizabeth favors. Scanning the shelves, Elizabeth points to her mainstays

 the two volumes of "Mastering the Art of French Cooking." Julia Child collaborated with Simone Beck and Louisette Bertholle on the first volume published in 1961 and then worked exclusively with Beck on the second volume published in 1970.

The worn and stained copies belonging to Elizabeth Campbell are evidence of their constant use. "I learned to cook with these books," Elizabeth ex

plains, noting that Child "tried every recipe about 100 times each before putting them into the book. "Everything you would want to know is in these two volumes," she says, adding that they are cross referenced

to assist even the most experienced chef-"Ma Gastronomie," an account written by Fernand Point, rates among Doug's favorites. "I used to read it about every six months," Doug notes,

adding that Point trained all the great chefs of Europe Noting that the book contains many amusing anecdotes about Point's life and the culinary field in Europe during the early 20th century, Doug says he finds it's "something

we can relate to - it's stimulating." The Campbells note that cookbooks are as much an historical reference as an instruction guide for chefs. Doug points out that nouvelle cuisine, a catchall phrase describing a cooking movement which gained popularity in France in the mid-60's, actually had its roots in the ear-

"I have at least three cookbooks which date to the turnof-the-century which refer to nouvelle cuisine," he

Doug notes that "probably the most famous cookbook written in the English language" is Glasse's "The Art of Cookery". The title of the book actually is "The Art of Cookery Made Plain and Easy; (Which Far Exceeds Any

Thing of the Kind Ever Yet Published). In addition to the lengthy title, another somewha unusual feature of the 1841 publication is that Glasse omitted her name only acknowledging that the book was writ-

The Campbells point out that American cookbooks authored by women underwent dramatic changes in relation to the roles women played in society. Doug notes that one can almost chronicle the women's movement by studying period cookbooks.

For instance, the 1893 publication "Beverages and Sandwiches for Your Husband's Friends," by "One Who Knows" and the 1850 recipe book "The Improved Housewife" by "A Married Lady" obviously would not

rate as 1980s bestsellers. Elizabeth notes that while their kitchen normally housed about 50 cookbooks, they became more serious collectors as their tastes began to diversify.

Since opening their quaint 48-seat dining room at the bend of Northville's Wares Square, the Campbells say they find it necessary to keep up with culinary trends and experiment with a variety of recipes.

Though their cuisine is primarily French, Doug notes that they may add a Creole dish or an English dessert When not in their kitchen at 227 Hutton, they most likely

depending on what's available at the market. are on a "buying trip." Longtime antique collectors, the Campbells say they occassionaly find old cookbooks at antique shows - most notably the Ann Arbor Antiques

However, if their book search proves futile, they can always purchase an addition to their apothecary jar collection, or buy an another copper mold or pan, an old cooking utensil, an antique cookie cutter, a vintage wine label. a hand-painted menu . .

Olde but goode recipes

The following is a sample of recipes selected by Doug and Elizabeth Campbell from their cookbook collection. They've been tried many times over in the kitchen at Elizabeth's and highlight a wide-range of culinary tastes spanning more than a century. The recipes are in their original form as written by

BREAD & BUTTER PUDDING (From the "Art of Cookery" by Han-

nah Glasse, circa 1841). Get a Penny-Loaf and cut it into thin slices of Bread and Butter, as you do for

That structure, too, was disassembled piece by piece and reconstructed behind the Coombs home.

"We reduced the size roughly by


half." Ted said. "A lot of the wood was badly rotted and could not have been used. We didn't want to put any new lumber in it. It's now about 12-by-12, but it was originally 12-by-18.

The milk house is now Ted's woodworking shop. On the walls inside, there are displayed some of the original milk records, which also trace the lineage of the cows producing the milk.



For 10 years Charlene Kull and her family have been working on the restoration of the old Westphal-Seim farmhouse, and only now is she getting to the interior designing that she enjoys. "We are finally getting to the little decorating details that if you had told me it would take 10 years to get to, I probably would not have moved in," she

The family would have loved to start on the interior right away, she says, but practical matters, such as installing a septic field and a furnace, had to be

Still, the detailed work for the interior has begun on the Italianate farmhouse that sits atop a steep hill on Brighton Road about a mile west of Brighton. The house was built in 1875 by August Westphal, a German immigrant who came with his parents to Genoa township in 1844.

The house is a two-story structure topped with a small third-story room called a belvedere. Many people mistake the belvedere for a watchtower since it has so many windows, but the real purpose for the structure is ventilation, Kull says. In the summer the windows can be opened to allow air to circulate and keep

The home is equipped with two front doors - one leading into the living room and the other into the parlor. This was so that unexpected guests could be led directly into the parlor to be entertained without exposing the the rest of the house if it wasn't in order, Kull says.

Apply mulch in the spring just as the soil warms and before weeds start. Spread 2-4 inches of mulch over the bed, leaving some space open around the base of each rose. Replace the mulch as it deteriorates during the year. Healthy, vigorous roses are less susceptible to pest problems. Other means of preventing pests are: buying top-quality plants, choosing diseaseresistant varieties, watering in the morn-





The first thing a visitor to the Michaels' house in Brighton is likely to note is the large indoor swimming pool that lies just beyond the entryway. And that is just what should be noticed.
