NOVI — Opposition to the 12-story height allowance in the proposed convention center ordinance snagged approval of the measure this week.

However, in an effort to accommodate a prospective convention center development, city council requested the ordinance be redrafted.

Throughout Monday's meeting, Mayor Robert Schmid registered fierce opposition to the convention district ordinance.

The intent of the convention district ordinance was to provide an overall master plan for a convention center.

"We would like to see something progress favorably," said Sheraton Oaks General Manager Gerald Abel after more than three hours of debate.

Housing boom hits classrooms

NOVI — The Novi Community School District could find itself with nearly 300 new students within the next two years in housing and apartment construction.

The committee, comprised of 20 Novi residents and chaired by Assistant Superintendent William Barr, was formed in February to determine what affect the increasing number of apartment complexes and condominiums would have on school enrollment.

The Novi Board of Education charged the committee with gathering information for determining school enrollment projections.

Barr said enrollment trends over a five-year period are difficult to project due to community growth and uncertainty of the economic climate.

The performance, which begins at 7:30 p.m. at the Fuerst Auditorium, Novi High School, marks the group's 10th anniversary.

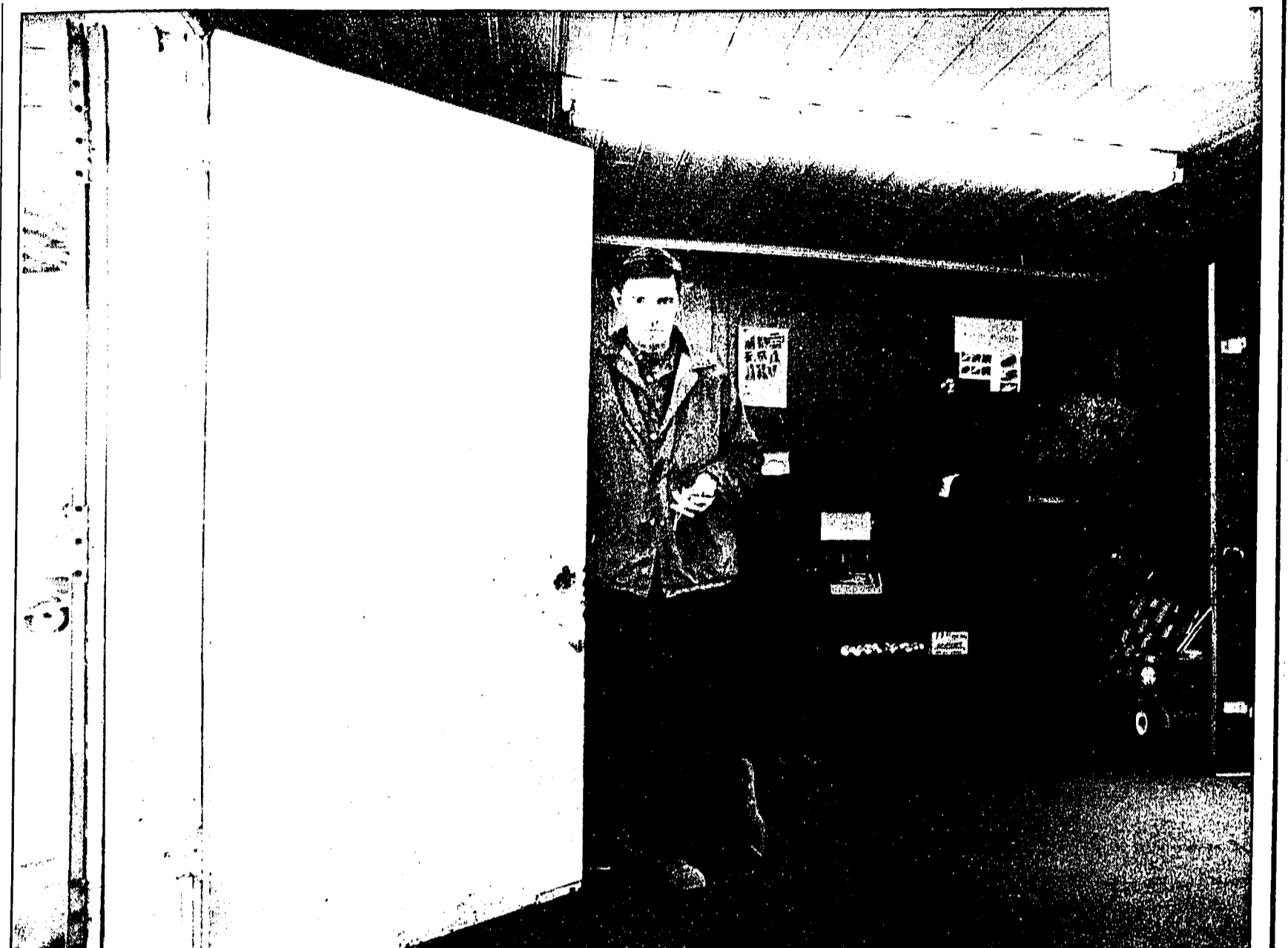
In honor of Mother's Day, there will be gifts for mothers who attend the concert, as well as gifts for children.

Thefts turn golf range into 'war zone'

NOVI — Jim Sliger is angry. The owner of Sliger's Driving Range at 39725 Grand River has been robbed 24 times over the past 10 years and he's mad.

The latest break-in at the driving range occurred during the night of May 23. Sliger and his co-owner, John Mallory, closed up shop Wednesday at 9:30 p.m. and discovered the break-in when they arrived for work Thursday morning.

"It was the 24th time the driving range has been victimized by thieves since Sliger bought it in 1971. And the seventh time since September 1, 1984.

"It's really pathetic," says Sliger. "All my windows are boarded up, and it's the same way next door at the VFW Hall. They don't care what they break into. Go next door and you'll find windows

boarded up. They even have bars on some of their windows. Can you believe that? Bars on the windows."

"This is supposed to be a nice suburban community... a place where it's safe to operate a business."

"I'm getting so I expect to find a break-in when I get to work in the morning. When I walk in the front door, I almost expect to find the back door busted open."

"I'm sure, Sliger says his problems stem back to the construction of the Old Orchard Condominiums.

"It's a sign of the times, I suppose. More people, more crime. I've been here since 1971, and we never had a problem until they built those con-

Landowner fumes over building ban

NOVI — Leo Harrarwood says it's easy for city officials to shut strip development in Novi, to say they don't want Grand River to be another Telegraph Road.

It's easy because they aren't paying taxes on the property, he notes. But Harrarwood is. In fact, he has been paying property taxes on parcels at Novi Road and Grand River Avenue since 1949.

He owns five acres, and he says the yearly taxes, including city and county, run about \$23,000 a year.

The 65-year-old bought the northeast corner of Novi Road and Grand River when it was a little two-pump, wooden gas station. He later built a new station with a small diner attached. Then in 1969 he leased the station to Standard Oil, which recently signed a new 20-year lease on the property.

His property is part of a "dream" to make each corner a special focal point for the downtown.

Harrarwood says this plan should have its designer laughing all the way to the bank. "There's no way you can have a pedestrian downtown when you've only got three months of summer!"

City officials want to make the downtown something "special," but such plans are unrealistic, he insists.

# Mayor blasts 12-stories

NOVI — Mayor Robert Schmid told city officials this week he has been the city's most vocal proponent of having a convention center in Novi. "Nevertheless, he has been subjected to 'uncalled-for pressure' from the community and 'harrassment' from the Novi News for his opposition to the proposed convention center district, he said.

Reiterating his position, Schmid told the council Monday he does not want "another Southfield, another metropolitan blacktop area."

"If I thought you could hold the 12 stories (to the proposed convention center site), I'd be for this. But I have no doubt that the Marriott, or whatever, will come in across the street and want 12 stories.

"I cannot apologize for anyone in this community for believing in something and believing it's the best thing for Novi in the long run," he said in support of council members Arlen Schroeder and Ronald Watson, who joined him in opposing the convention district proposal Monday.

"People who moved here liked what they saw — that's why they moved here. With a low profile, (Novi) will have a better chance of withstanding time."

Schmid said he has seen "absolutely no positive signs of anyone's intention to build a convention center at any time in Novi." Railing against Sheraton Oaks General Manager Gerald Abel, Schmid added: "I have a problem with you telling this group of people that without 12 stories in your hotel, the convention center will not go."

When Abel responded that 12 stories are needed to accommodate the convention center, Schmid labeled the reply rhetoric. "The facts simply aren't out there," he said. "We're going about this backwards. We're getting a convention center before we've got a convention."

Schmid noted the council reaffirmed its commitment to a low-rise community last year when it limited building height in the Town Center District to five stories. "Low rise has not come light nor easy for this city," he commented.

Despite this, community members and city officials seem to have embraced the notion of a 12-story addition to the Sheraton.

"You've turned people around without any facts! This city has turned tide because someone came in and said they needed 12 stories — without one fact — and everyone jumped on the bandwagon."

The mayor sharply criticized The News for touting Trammel Crow as possible developers of the convention center before any plans have been submitted. "You've got Trammel Crow leaving town before they've even been here!"

Despite his opposition to the proposed ordinance, Schmid invited Abel to convince him of the necessity for 12 stories in the convention district.

# Guernsey begins expansion

NOVI — Construction of a 5,140-square-foot addition to Guernsey Dairy was expected to begin this week.

The addition will double the seating capacity of the restaurant and allow for the expansion and updating of kitchen facilities. In addition, the retail sales and ice cream dipping areas will be enlarged.

Manager Marty McGuire said the restaurant and ice cream parlor will not be closed at any time during the construction. The addition will be completed before any renovation begins on the current building.

"The whole thing will be constructed before we make the conversion to the addition," he explained. "The project is expected to take approximately three months."

The addition includes seating for 96 patrons. Guernsey's restaurant currently seats 48. What is now the restaurant will be used entirely for retail sales once remodeling is complete.

The project includes a new entrance, along with a facelift for the front exterior, McGuire noted. In addition, the parking lot will be enlarged.

"But we're saving the big tree. That's Novi's landmark," he said.

Although no definite calculations have been made for new employees, McGuire said he anticipates doubling the restaurant staff to accommodate the addition.

Cost of the project has been estimated at \$548,000.

# Cameras missing after break-in

## Area Blotters

Novi A quantity of video equipment, including two Toshiba video cameras, were stolen from Movieland at 26109 in the Roman Plaza during the early morning hours of April 27.

Responding to an open alarm at 3:58 a.m., officers discovered the front door of the building unlocked. They entered the building, but found no signs of damage.

Officers then contacted the owner of the local Movieland outlet, who came to the store and supplied a list of stolen equipment. No dollar value was placed on the stolen property.

Fifteen camp shirts were reported stolen from a display table in front of The Gap at Twelve Oaks Mall on April 25.

The assistant store manager, a Union Lake woman, told police the shirts were stolen from the display table by unknown individuals sometime between 2:45 and 3:45 p.m.

The shirts were of assorted sizes and valued at \$240.

A 1983 Oldsmobile Cutlass Brougham stolen from the drive of a Woolsey Street resident was later recovered by Detroit police.

The man told police the car was stolen from the parking lot north of his condominium on April 26 between 12:15 and 8:15 a.m. Detroit police telephoned Novi dispatch on April 28 to report that the stolen car had been recovered.

More than \$10,000 worth of equipment was reported stolen from a pole barn behind an unoccupied residence on Wixom Road.

The owner of the barn told police that unknown individuals broke into the barn by twisting open the eye-bolt lock between April 21 and 30.

Once inside, the responsible parties removed thousands of dollars worth of tools through a rear door, according to police. Stolen property included an air compressor and a GE private company base station.

An estimated \$990 worth of building materials were reported stolen from an office under construction at 45009 Pontiac Trail.

The complainant told police that unknown individuals gained entry to the office by kicking their way through a wall of a common wall in an adjacent office.

Stolen property included 18 bundles of insulation valued at \$300, 85 sheets of drywall valued at \$605 and one box of drywall screws with a value of \$65.

A car owned by a Wixom man was damaged by vandals while it was parked in the Green Lot at Twelve Oaks Mall on April 28.

The man told police he parked the car at 1 p.m. and returned 30 minutes later to discover five large dents in the hood and another dent on the left front fender. Damage to the 1985 Dodge Daytona was estimated at \$100.

An Ann Arbor woman reported the theft of a Fox radar detector from her 1985 Honda Prelude while it was parked in the Yellow Lot at Twelve Oaks on April 29.

The woman told police unknown individuals broke the driver's side window sometime between 1:45 and 11:30 p.m. and removed the radar detector. Stolen property was valued at \$100, while damage to the automobile was pegged at an additional \$75.

A resident on Paramount Street told police that thieves broke into his home while he was at work and stole an AM-FM portable stereo cassette recorder as well as a photo album.

The man said he left home on April 29 at 3 p.m. and discovered the break-in upon returning shortly after midnight.

An employee told police he saw a man run out of the store carrying the radar detector under his arm. The owner and the employee chased the man into the Olde Orchard Condominiums, where they lost sight of him, according to reports.

The Whistle radar detector was valued at \$105.

The suspect was described as a white male in his early 20s, approximately 5'9" tall and weighing 160 pounds. He also had frizzy blond hair, witnesses told police.

River) could have good solid businesses all the way to Lansing." Such "strip development" would provide a good tax base, he maintains.

A number of businesses, including White Castle, Burger King and Goodyear, have been interested in his proposal. But they all were snaggled by pending Town Center plans, Harrawood notes.

At last week's joint meeting of the planning board and city council, Harrawood claimed there hasn't been any property sold in the Town Center for about two years. "Where you get the basis to raise taxes I don't know," he commented.

Harrawood and several others have become exasperated with the assessments on their Town Center parcels, claiming they are inflated due to the city's "dream" plans for the future. The property should be assessed on the basis of what it is worth right now, several told the council last week.

And according to Harrawood, the Town Center property will never be worth anything that is now, no matter how the area develops.

But no one is listening to him, the

## As We See It Rationality a must in 12-story debate

It is doubtful any Monday night network offerings were more exciting than the Novi City Council's debate of the proposed convention center district.

Most of the action-packed dialogue was supplied by Mayor Robert Schmid, who at various times attacked Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers, Sheraton Oaks General Manager Gerald Abel and The Novi News. The source of his ire with The News was an editorial in the May 1 edition which, he said, contained lies and was a disservice to the people of Novi.

Although willing to accept criticism of our editorial positions, we're less tolerant of the mayor's discourteous treatment of municipal consultants and members of the business community.

Schmid's propensity for invective serves neither himself nor the city well, which is unfortunate because he has valid arguments and philosophies to expound. More restraint would make those arguments easier to hear.

After debating the convention center proposal Monday, the council neither passed nor rejected the amendment, but referred it to its planning and legal counsels for revision. The new draft is expected back in two weeks.

Council members Edward Leininger, Martha Hoyer and Patricia Karevich supported the amendment, while Ronald Watson, Arlen Schroeder and Schmid expressed opposition. Council Member Guy Smith did not comment.

While there appeared to be unanimous support for a convention center in Novi, the proposed 12-story expansion of the Sheraton Oaks presented a major stumbling block. Specifically, opponents of the 125-foot building height allowance in the convention district questioned the city's ability to construct buildings with more than five stories to the Regional Center Area — an area including Twelve Oaks Mall and Section 15 on the west side of Novi Road, between 1-96 and Twelve Mile.

We appreciate both concerns, but also find them insufficient for rejecting the convention center amendment.

We continue to believe that an architecturally-distinguished 12-story building of 125 feet would present a far preferable image of the city than either of the water towers which contain company logos and currently serve as Novi's "skyline" on I-96.

Further, the visual impact of a

## Don't underestimate readers

If someone were to ask me (and someone did recently) what I thought Novi and Northville readers liked to see in their local weekly newspapers, I would respond, "More features. More people-oriented stories and more sports. Maybe more consumer news."

I may not be all wrong, but I also may not be entirely correct, either. I have learned. A poll was conducted among newspaper journalists recently, and many of them responded as I did.

When asked what they thought the top of the list. People-oriented stories were what the journalists thought their readers' second-most popular item in the newspaper would be. Less than three out of every 10 journalists interviewed felt readers have more interest in news than in features.

The researchers then asked newspaper readers themselves what interested them most in their local newspapers. Much to the surprise of journalists, the newspaper readers polled put national and environmental news at the top of their list. Although sports and features certainly didn't fall at the bottom, they did run second to more substantive news coverage. In fact, many of the readers polled said they would like to see more in-depth coverage of timely issues in their local newspapers.

Dr. Charles Atkins of Michigan State University presented these findings, which were gathered as part of a newspaper readership project for the American Society of Newspaper Editors, at a journalism conference in Grand Rapids last month. His report was a stinging indictment for newspaper journalists. We just don't know our readers very well, he said.

I hate to admit it, but I think he might be right. I talked with 150 residents of Novi last weekend. None of them were city officials. None of them were prominent business people. None of them were officers in popular civic groups like the Jaycees, Rotary Club, Lions or Goodfellows. They weren't union presidents or negotiators, property developers or coaches for high school sports teams.

In short, they weren't the people we usually go to as sources for stories. Quite frankly, these folks surprised me. They were more informed, more opinionated and more willing to share their opinions than I anticipated. In the process of gathering 150 responses, I only had about a dozen people curtly dismiss my request for a few moments of their time.

The only major proposal received so far in the Town Center Area involves a cut-price shopping center.

Something is needed to reverse the trend. The convention center is that "something," and if it's necessary to permit a 12-story building on the north side of I-96, so be it.

Council Members Hoyer and Watson deserve credit for salvaging Monday's discussion of the convention center amendment and providing positive direction for further discussion. Time is important. And so is rational, logical discussion of the issues.

# Housing boom may overcrowd Novi classrooms

students currently living in apartments and condominiums and the number of students in single family homes in both developed and still developing subdivisions.

Barr said information was supplied to the committee by the City of Novi Building Department, City Manager Edward Kriewall, builders within Novi and managers of apartments and condominiums.

In studying the number of public school students currently residing in 10 of Novi's apartment/condominium complexes — from Village Wood with 24 units to Country Place with 300 units — the committee determined there are only 2 students per condominium or apartment unit.

"That number surprised me, personally," Barr told the board. "I thought it would be higher than that."

He noted the same study was done with single family homes in both the old and new subdivisions.

The committee's findings indicate that the school district receives approximately 743 students per developed subdivision. The eight

developed subdivisions include Echo Valley, Meadowbrook Glens, Meadowbrook Lakes, Novi Heights, Orchard Hills, Pioneer Meadows, Village Oaks and Meadowbrook 1, 2 and 3.

In the "still developing subdivisions" the school district receives approximately 724 students. Those subdivisions include Carriage Hill, Cedar Springs, Charrington Green, Jamesstown, Orchard Ridge, Simmons Orchard, Turtle Creek and Whispering Meadows.

An average of 774 students per single family residence was determined for all subdivisions.

Barr noted that if all 2,000 multiples were built as projected, the

school district "can figure on about 400 kids."

"The same is true for house building," he said.

Based on his study, the committee projected that the district will gain approximately 90 new students in 1985-86 from newly constructed residences and 176 new students in 1986-87 from the proposed apartment construction.

The assistant superintendent noted that the projected 266 new students will be spread over the 13 grades. He noted that in past years, enrollment growth has been experienced only in four or five grades.

Barr mentioned that while the enrollment increase will be affected by the completion of the housing

units, he said approximately 117 homes are expected to be built by October.

He further noted that "all builders I talked to said about one-third of the buyers are coming from other places in Novi."

Barr explained that at the onset of the committee's study, building permits had not been issued for the five proposed apartment/condominium complexes with unit capacity totaling 2,000.

However, since the study got underway, groundbreaking have occurred at two of the five complexes and the remainder are expected to begin construction in late spring or early summer.

Barr pointed out that one of the committee's concerns is that almost "all new subdivisions, apartments and condominiums currently planned to be built would send children to Novi Woods."

"It's not a particular problem in any attendance area right now," Barr noted. "However, by September it could be a problem at Novi Woods."

The assistant superintendent

pointed out that if the proposed housing construction continues as indicated in the committee's report, Novi Woods will be "boiling at the seams."

According to the committee's enrollment projections, Novi Woods will be near capacity or may possibly exceed capacity in September. The building, which can house 485 students, is expected to reach 475 on a straight line projection for 1985-86 and 502 on a survival method projection.

The remainder of the district's six buildings are far enough below capacity to house additional students for years to come.

Several parents attending Thursday's board meeting voiced concern about a potential "overcrowding" problem at Novi Woods.

Superintendent Robert Pwko said the district has alleviated any overcrowding at the elementary school by moving students to other buildings.

"We have students who should be attending Novi Woods but are attending another school because their grade level has reached capacity," Pwko noted.

However, one member of the committee said she was concerned that elementary students moving into the Novi Woods attendance area may not be able to go to the same school as other children in their neighborhood because of the capacity problem.

Board President Robert Schram said the charge of the committee was not to find solutions, only to identify potential concerns.

"We did not want to tie in solution to this," Schram said. "One might faint the other."

In concluding its findings, the committee recommended the board pay special attention to the situation at Novi Woods and suggested the board identify the number of preschoolers in the community in order for future committees to make more accurate projections.

The committee also stated that "before any major development can take place in Novi, the sewer capacity problem must be resolved."

The board and administration lauded committee members for their work and noted that the study will be used as a guideline in determining future district needs.

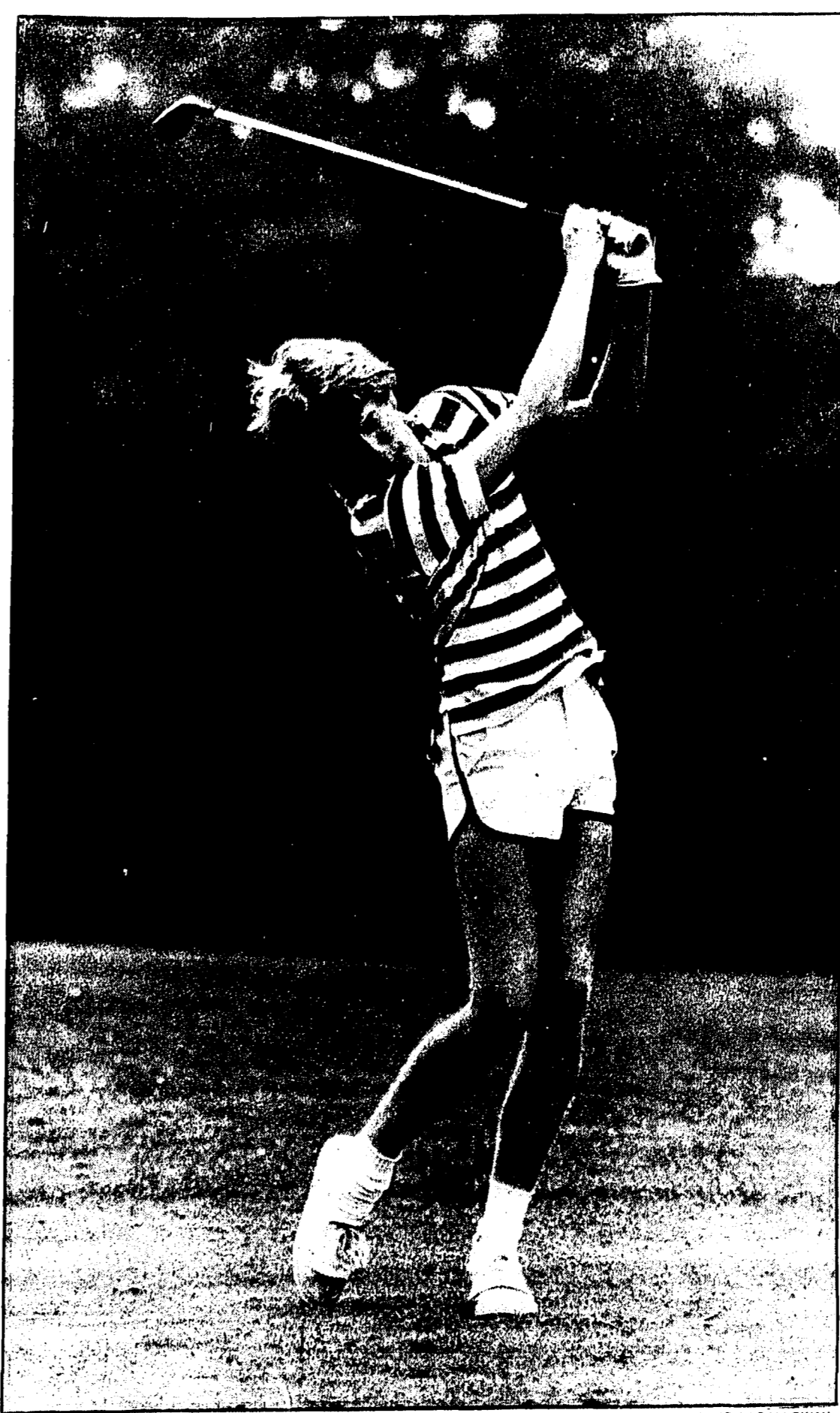

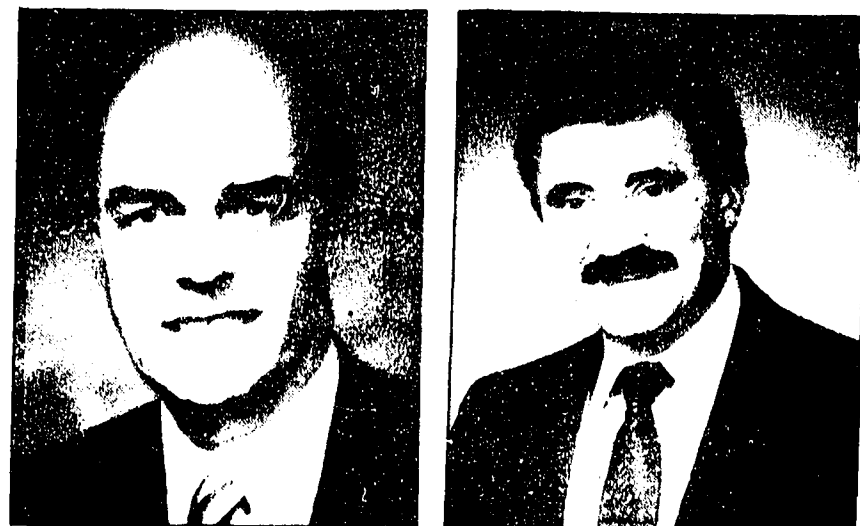

# Futurist foresees new employment trends

"Blindness to trends and their inevitable changes is hazardous to your job and health," according to futurist David E. Smith.

Smith, the co-ordinator for the World Future Society in Southeastern Michigan, spoke recently at "Jobs of the Future" at a Schoolcraft College Career Day.

In addition to many new exotic jobs, Smith foresees changes brought about by the effects of an aging population, the increase in youth employment and the de-industrialization of America.

As co-ordinator of the non-profit scientific and education organization, Smith said, "Futurists are not mystics. Futurists study trends to enable them to make reasonable guesses."

Smith named three noteworthy trends:

- The aging of America. As the baby boomers reach their 30s and 40s, they begin to experience frustration in the workplace because of greater competition for upper echelon jobs. The retirement of high-ranking executives eases this competition slightly, but puts added strain on the Social Security system.
- The decrease in unemployment among youth, a positive trend. "I've seen more opportunities for young people in terms of beginning jobs this summer than I have seen in over a decade," he said. "And I expect that to continue."
- De-industrialization, a trend that

worries a large number of people who fear it will create an unresolvable loss of jobs. But Smith found a "silver lining in this ominous cloud's lining."

The jobs that are being eliminated are largely the simplest and most competitive, he said. With this comes a de-emphasis on strength opening doors for many, women and the handicapped in particular.

The shift to a global economy, from a practice of isolationism, will affect the jobs of the future, Smith said.

By the year 2000, the Third World nations will be manufacturing as much as 30 percent of the world's goods. They have the workforce and can produce basic goods for less."

Already, Smith pointed out, such large industrial countries as Japan and Germany are using their advanced

technology to shift to other means of employing their vast populations.

American industry has picked up on this idea. Employers are willing to train workers not only for additional specific job skills, but with general education that will be beneficial if there is a need for a career change — "employment protection, rather than job protection," he said.

This advanced training will not necessarily consist of formal classes, he said. Conferences provide a great deal of education and allow professionals to meet and share ideas. Conferences which last several days can take the guise of a working vacation, adding to workers' morale.

Conferences also provide workers an opportunity to make connections with other individuals in their field.

In addition to changing work patterns, Smith also foresees the rise of several "exotic" careers — artificial intelligence programmers. "Someone must program the machinery, undersea hotel management, underwater archaeologist (75 percent of the Earth is water and the oceans are mankind's final frontier), hazardous waste management technician, industrial robotics production technicians, genetic engineers (to devise new methods of providing food and materials for a fast-growing population), electronic communications (programmers, developers, marketers service and repairmen), health and fitness.

Nevertheless, Smith stressed that there will still be a need for more traditional types of employment — nursing, food service and janitors.

# Golfing business enjoys more popularity

In previous springs, this would be the time when men and women would bag up their bowling balls and dig through their closets for either a baseball glove or tennis racket. However, these days it seems that more and more people are beginning to pull golf clubs from those cluttered storage compartments.

"The increased popularity of golf has resulted in a major boom for the golf industry, which credits its improving economy for its good fortune."

"Money has always been one of the main drawbacks in golf. While baseball, softball and tennis players can do their thing for practically no cost — whatever, golfers have to dish out the bucks.

"First of all there's a required set of golf clubs, which can range anywhere from \$100 to \$1,000. And then there's the experts, an adequate set costs between \$250 and \$350.

"Then there are golf balls, which are approximately \$1.75 each, and various other equipment which is necessary to

be successful. And let's not forget green fees, which range from \$4 to \$10 for nine holes, and \$6 to \$25 for 18 holes.

"What all of this adds up to is a rather large expense. Nonetheless, the interest in golf is beginning to outweigh the drawback, and people now are willing to pay some money for the entertainment.

"A lot of it has to do with how the PGA (Professional Golfers Association) has promoted junior golf and women's golf," said Kurt Foley, club pro at the Dunham Hills Golf & Country Club in Milford.

"Before, the majority of people who played golf were older men. Go out on a course now, though, and you'll see just as many high school kids and women as anybody else out there."

"The economy hasn't hurt either," Foley continued. "For a while, people just couldn't afford to play golf. It's getting better, though, and hopefully the economy will continue to improve."

Carol Jacobs from the Highland Hills Golf Club also says the golf industry has taken off, but she has a different outlook on the economy.

"The economy just isn't as good as it once was, so instead of packing up and going north for the weekend, people are heading out to the golf courses," she commented. "Whether it's for a vacation or changes, again really don't matter because once people start playing golf, they get hooked."

Similar to the increase in bowling popularity over the last 10 years, the golf people who are benefitting most from the boom are manufacturers and proprietors.

"Golf is a socializing sport, but it also plays a role as a frustrating and sometimes embarrassing when one is not competent. As a result, golfers are purchasing top-notch equipment and playing as many rounds as possible to improve their games."

"I've noticed a change in the attitude of golfers," Foley said. "They definitely want the equipment which is going to help their game. They're interested in anything that may lower their scores."

Several new golf courses in the area have opened over the last two years, another sign of the boom. Courses in South Lyon, Northville, Novi and Milford all have reported increased business.

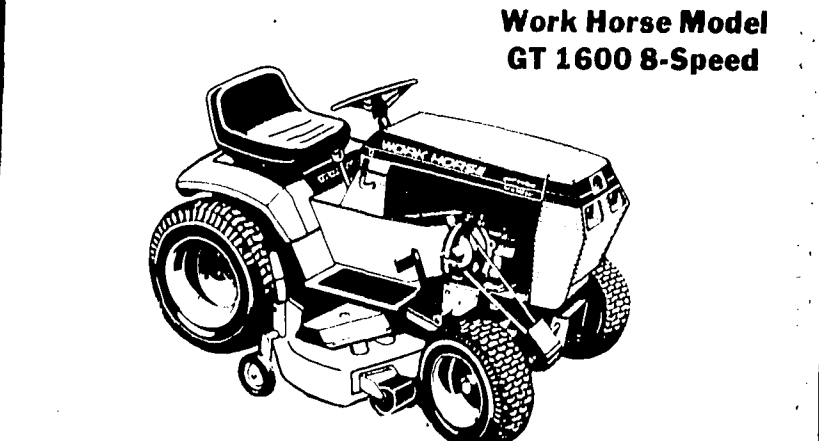
"It's almost a way of life for me in the summer," said Mike Murphy, a golfer from Northville. "I started playing about three years ago and I love it. I used to play baseball and basketball in high school, but this is my game now."

Foley added that once a golf course opens, it's a rarity to see it close. "I can't remember the last time a golf course went under," he said.

As for future trends, Foley foresees several of the public courses striving to improve their quality.

"Private courses and some of the public courses are very different right now," Foley said. "So if anyone really wants quality conditions, they almost have to join a club. I feel down the line, though, people will be able to play almost any public course and get that quality they're looking for."

# Wildcat girls race to third place at Milan Relays

NOVI — Sophomore sprinter Patti Lenaghan shaved Novi High School's 100 meter dash record down to 13.0 seconds Saturday with her third-place finish at the Milan Relays.

Lenaghan's effort led the Wildcats to a third-place team finish at the four-team meet, as Novi collected 84 points — just eight shy of runner-up South Lyon and 35 short of champ Milan's 119. Novi placed in every event at the meet, although the Wildcats collected only one first: Sherry Lawton's gutsy 5-2 in the high jump.

"Sherry's just now starting to come back from her knee injury," Novi Coach Chris Ceresa pointed out. "You need to be aggressive in the high jump, and because of her knee she's had to be kind of tentative. But she looked real good Saturday. She was jumping into the wind and she almost did it."

Novi's 4x400 meter relay team

place 48.4 (at the shoulder of South Lyon star MaryFran Peterlin). Bonkowski a third-place 51.1 and Amy Rodgers a fifth-place 52.6.

place Kelli Rolfe turned in a personal best of 12:53.1 to take second in the mile. Kris Huotari was close behind for a third-place 12:56.1.

Taking thirds for the Wildcats were Onfrey in the 100 meter hurdles (17.63), Leslie Helling in the 800 (2:37.4, a personal best), Rolfe in the 1,600 (5:53.8), and Novi's 4x100, 4x200 and 4x800 relay teams.

In the 4x100, it was Lenaghan, Carol Isham, Bonkowski and Onfrey in 53.8; in the 4x200, it was Clark, Isham, Kristy Yodzevics and Bonkowski in 1:57.1; and in the 4x800, it was Huotari, Andrea DiCola, Park and Helling in 10:38.0.

Before fouling by less than a half-inch on a 15-0 leap, Yodzevics recorded a 14-6 in long jump for a fourth place. Lenaghan's 28.4 was fourth in the 200, and Clark's personal best of 63.4 in the 400 was fifth.

The Wildcats popped Lakeland 72-56 on Tuesday, winning the 4x440 yard and 4x880 relays, taking individual firsts from Huotari in the mile (6:04.3), Clark

in the 440 (64.9), Onfrey in the 330 hurdles (50.2) and getting 1-2-3 sweeps in long jump from Yodzevics (14-10), Rodgers (14-9) and Denal D'Ambrosio (14-8), and the two-mile from Rolfe (13:20), Huotari (13:29) and Maureen Devlin (13:34).

Taking seconds were Vossie in shot (29-0), Melissa Welke in discus (79-1), Lawton in high jump (4-8), Onfrey in the 110 yard hurdles (17.8), Lenaghan in the 100 (12.1) and Park in the 800 (2:43.5).

Placing third were Onfrey in high jump (4-4), Bonkowski in 330 hurdles (54.5), Lenaghan in the 220 (29.4), DiCola in the 800 (6:05.3), Clark, Becky Prost, Park and Bonkowski teamed for a 4:30.9 to win the 4x400 relay, and Huotari, Park, Helling and Prost won the 4x800 in 10:42.4.

The Wildcats ran impressively against Hartland on Thursday, but lost a 4:30.9 to win the 4x400 relay, and 74-54, falling to 1-3 in the Kennington Valley Conference (4-4 overall).

Taking seconds were Yodzevics in long jump (14-6), Bonkowski in 300 hurdles (52.6), Helling in the 800 (2:40.0) and Clark in the 400 (66.44). D'Ambrosio was third in the 400 in 76.33, Rodgers in the 300 hurdles (55.1), Vossie in shot (28-11½) and Lawton in high jump (4-8).
