Campbell to serve 9-20 years

PONTIAC — Former Novi City Council Member Louie Campbell has been sentenced to serve from nine to 20 years in Jackson Southern Michigan Prison after pleading guilty to two counts of first degree criminal sexual conduct. The sentence was handed down July 2 by Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Steven N. Andrews. The terms are to be served concurrently. The sentencing apparently brings an end to a case that stems back to 1979 when Novi police obtained six felony warrants for the arrest of Campbell from the 52nd District Court on April 30. The warrants charged the former council member with two counts of statutory rape, two counts of first degree criminal sexual conduct and two counts of second degree criminal sexual conduct. Names of the victims and the specific nature of the charges have been withheld throughout the proceedings. Although warrants were obtained, Campbell was not apprehended until July 1984. Campbell apparently became aware of the investigation in 1979 and left town after learning of the impending charges. Police in 1979 were able to trace Campbell to Jackson where he abandoned his company car and mailed the keys to his employer. He then took a bus to Toledo, where police lost track of him. Campbell remained at large until July 1984 when he was recognized from outstanding fugitive warrants by a Louisiana State trooper while he was attempting to renew his drivers license in Louisiana. The former Novi council member subsequently was lodged in the Rapier Parish Jail in Alexandria while extradition proceedings were initiated. Campbell decided to drop opposition to extradition to stand charges in Michigan in September 1984. He was arraigned on the six felony charges before 52nd District Court Judge Harold Bulgarelli on September 24, 1984. Campbell remained lodged in the Oakland County Jail on a \$22,000 cash bond until he appeared to stand trial before Judge Andrews on April 26, 1985. Four of the six counts were dismissed and Campbell pled guilty to two counts of first degree criminal sexual conduct. Campbell served on the Novi City Council from 1969 to 1975 when he ran for mayor but was defeated by Gilbert Henderson.

Residents protest plan for storing chemicals

Department of Natural Resources (DNR) staff this week explained why they feel certain the 12,000-gallon underground storage tank proposed for installation at the Quazite Corporation is environmentally safe. But residents living near Quazite's Grand River Avenue plant said they'd rather have the company leave town than be granted approval to install the new tank. "We don't want this... We've got well water. We don't want to look at our kids and wonder if they're going to get cancer or leukemia or something," commented Novi Heights resident Tony Ochab. Approximately 50 residents, many from Novi Heights subdivision, attended the informational public meeting Monday. DNR staff and representatives from Quazite were present to address questions and concerns. The residents expressed doubt over the DNR's ability to monitor chemical storage at Quazite after learning the Grand River plant has been using an underground storage tank since February without the DNR's knowledge. Scott Ross, a staff member in the permits section of the DNR's Groundwater Quality Division, admitted Quazite's current use of an 8,000-gallon underground storage tank is "technically" illegal. The tank was installed seven months ago in complete compliance with city fire regulations. However, the firm does not have a state permit for the tank. Richard Hammit, Quazite's vice president of manufacturing, said the company didn't obtain a permit because they thought permits only were required for tanks of 10,000 gallons or more. When company officials discovered they were not in compliance, they applied to the Water Resources Commission (WRC) for the proper permit, he explained. The Quazite Corporation, 4527 Grand River, manufactures polymer concrete bricks used in industrial floors. Among the most hazardous chemicals used in the manufacturing process is styrene, a known carcinogen on the DNR's "critical" chemical list. The flammability and toxicity of the other chemicals used on the site are comparable to gasoline or fuel oil. Polyester resin is stored in the underground tank, while the styrene is stored in 55-gallon drums. Polyester resin, the ingredient that makes polymer bricks three times stronger than a regular concrete brick, also is widely used in the fiberglass industry, particularly for boats and campers. The company intended to continue storing polyester resin in its 8,000-gallon underground tank, but notice of its permit application for the tank was filed last week. *Continued on 6*

Bone-yard II: Eating American

"Eating ethnic" has become something of an American pastime. Thefad started maybe 20 years ago with the proliferation of Chinese restaurants across the countryside. And once entrepreneurs discovered that Americans were not only willing to sample more-or-less foreign cuisines but actually enjoyed ethnic dining, the flood gates were opened. Italian restaurants and Mexican restaurants were soon to follow and enjoyed wide-spread acceptance. And in the case of Mexican restaurants at least, the fast-food variety — Taco Bell — and chain variety — Chi-Chi's — were soon to follow. However, there currently appears to be a new interest among the general public in a different type of ethnic cuisine — the American variety. To date, the renewed interest in "Eating American" seems to have found its most widespread acceptance in the proliferation of "rib shacks" — restaurants which specialize in that fine American food of barbecued spare ribs.

The Tunnel Barbeque in Windsor is similarly informal — lightly-grooved tables, paper placemats, Formica tables, bottles of ketchup on the table. But the Tunnel Barbeque manages to work it into a somewhat charming ambience, which doesn't work at Bone-yard II. On the positive side of the ledger, Bone-yard II does have its attributes. Featured on the menu, obviously, are the barbecued spare ribs. A whole slab \$11.25 comes with English fried potatoes, cole slaw and garlic bread. Also available are a whole slab for one (\$9.95) and a half slab (\$7.25). Other selections include barbecued or broasted chicken, seafood (jumbo butterfly shrimp for \$6.75, fish and chips for \$3.55, breaded scallops for \$4.95) and steaks (New York strip steak at \$8.80 and either pork or beef shish-ke-bob). In addition there are tempting combinations of all the above — ribs and chicken, shrimp and chicken, ribs and shrimp, or ribs, chicken and shrimp — each for \$7.75. And in all honesty, the food is really pretty good. On a recent visit, my companion and I selected the barbecued ribs for two. The serving of colelaw which accompanied the dinner was more than ample, and there also were plenty of ribs and potatoes, as well as a respectably-sized, tasty chunk of garlic bread. The potatoes were quite good. As were the ribs, barbecued in Bone-yard II's own nicely-seasoned sauce. Our only complaint with the food itself was that the ribs served at our table were not particularly "meaty." Diners should be apprised that Bone-yard II does not accept credit cards and does not yet have a liquor license. With a few adjustments, we could rate Bone-yard II somewhat higher. Less crowded conditions in the dining room were a good starting place.

From 'concepts' to design, Town Center work proceeds

City council financed one more step in the planning of Novi's Town Center last week. "It's impossible to go from concept to engineering. This is an interim phase," said Community Development Director James Wahl, explaining the need for a "design and development plan" for the Town Center. "The city is on the threshold of over a quarter of a billion dollars in development in the Town Center over the next couple of years," noted Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers. The design and development plan will help the city take a leadership role in that development, he suggested. The second phase of design planning is expected to cost \$40,000. Council agreed last week to allocate the funds from the 1985-86 planning budget, which includes \$50,000 for Town Center planning. The Town Center District, an area of more than 150 acres surrounding the Novi Road/Grand River intersection, is designed to promote development of a pedestrian-oriented "downtown." The district boundaries and temporary standards for landscaping, street furniture and other special Town Center improvements were established by the council in February 1984. The first phase in design planning was a "concept plan" completed in April. This plan included a map showing the potential for development within each of the district's four quadrants. "Current involvement of the Trammell Crow Company and the initiation of their planning work makes city action on this matter even more important," Wahl noted prior to the council's unanimous approval of the project. In addition to the forthcoming Trammell Crow proposal for much of the northeast quadrant, other pending projects in the Town Center include: • A Bob Evans restaurant at the I-96 exit ramp, just north of the Big Boy; • A delicatessen proposed by Vic Casius, owner of the Big Boy, for property adjacent to the Big Boy; • Expansion of the Roman Plaza shopping center; • Remodeling of "Dave's Hamburgers" on the northwest corner of Novi Road and Grand River; • Expansion of Kim's Gardens Chinese Restaurant in the northeast quadrant; • A 95-unit senior citizens housing

The first test of Novi's new charter provision on primary elections may be only one ballot away. As of early this week, only three candidates had filed to run for mayor this fall — one short of the number needed for a primary election, according to a city charter amendment adopted by Novi voters one year ago. Prior to revision the charter required a primary whenever the number of candidates was twice the number to be elected. The charter as amended last August requires a primary whenever the number of candidates is more than three times the number of vacancies. Therefore, a fourth mayoral candidate is needed before the charter would require a primary to reduce the number of candidates to two. *Continued on 10*

Purse snatched near local A & P

THE NOVI OAKS SPORTS CENTER has received a permanent sanction from the Novi Planning Board to operate a driving range and batting cages.

The sports center is located in a light industrial district on Twelve Mile, east of the Beck Road intersection. Two years ago the planning board approved the center as a temporary special use. The board's action last week allows the owners to continue operating the center indefinitely.

However, the approval is conditioned on owners Dominic and Louie Mancinelli receiving a variance on a setback requirement. The zoning ordinance requires such facilities to be 500 feet from any residential property. Although it currently is not used for residential, the property directly across the street from the sports center is zoned for residential use.

Co-owner Dominic Mancinelli said he wants to continue operating the sports center until utilities are extended to the property, thereby permitting industrial development of the site.

FREE SUMMER CONCERTS presented by Novi Parks and Recreation will continue later this month with the American Scene Band.

The warehouse/office buildings range in size from 16,360 square feet to 20,200 square feet. Curran originally proposed three smaller mini-warehouse buildings as part of the project. However, the mini-warehouses did not meet necessary setback requirements and were eliminated from Curran's second set of plans.

Survey: voters split on funding issue

LANSING — By a narrow margin, Michigan residents oppose a plan to reduce local property taxes by raising the state sales tax, according to a new poll.

The survey also showed that Michiganans gave their public schools better grades than other Americans gave theirs.

The survey of Michigan attitudes toward the public schools was done by Ned Hubbell, director of the Michigan Board of Education's Project Outreach. Telephone interviews of 801 Michigan residents 18 and older were conducted April 16-22. The margin of error is 3.5 percent.

Barbara Dumouchelle, vice president of the State Board of Education, said the poll shows that Michigan residents oppose by 51-43 percent, with 6 percent undecided, a proposal to reduce school property taxes by one-half by increasing the state sales tax from 4 cents to 6

cents per dollar.

Such a constitutional amendment was proposed in the Michigan Legislature, which would require a two-thirds vote to place it on the ballot.

"Citizen attitudes on this question will very likely change in the months ahead as the public learns more about the proposal," said Dumouchelle.

"Overall, the State Board of Education is pleased with the results of this survey because they demonstrate a strong support for education among Michigan residents."

Dumouchelle added that the State Board of Education also is "very pleased" that more people feel Michigan's public schools are getting better and fewer say that they are getting worse.

In Michigan, 50 percent of those interviewed gave their public schools an A or B in the 4th annual Michigan education poll conducted by the State Board of Education. In the 1984 nationwide

Red Wings pick 1985 Novi grad in fourth round

O.K., crossword buffs. What's a six-letter word for hockey netminder that starts with the letter G? No, not G-O-A-L-I-E. G-O-W-N-S. As in Mark Gowans, an 18-year-old goalie from the hockey hotbed—Novi, Michigan.

Last month the Detroit Red Wings selected Gowans in the fourth round of the National Hockey League draft—the only goalie to be picked up, and one of three Michigan natives the pro franchise chose.

"I'd had some talks with Washington (Capitals), but (former Red Wing goalie) Jimmy Rutherford told me not to be surprised if I didn't go to Washington, that I might wind up in Detroit after all," the soft-spoken Gowans said Monday.

"I'm happy about getting picked by the Wings. So far, I've been really fortunate to play for teams that come from this area. But don't get the idea the '85 Novi High School graduate is ordering his Red Wing uniform just yet.

play immediately, like Steve Yzerman and Lane Lambert did for us a couple years ago."

Before picking Gowans in the fourth round of the draft, Dwellano selected forward Brent Fedyk and defenseman Jeff Sharples and Steve Chasson in the first three rounds.

Gowans was the 71st overall pick in the draft. According to Red Wing scouting reports, he's a "standup goalie with good reflexes and excellent concentration."

A slender 6-0, 160-pounder, he's far from having the stereotypical chunky physical build of a goaltender. He's also far from possessing the typical goaltender's hypertensive temperament.

That's a somewhat underwhelming statistic. But then, the Spitfires were a somewhat underwhelming team, going 13-18-3 for the season. "I was facing 40 to 50 shots a game. The average is about 30," Gowans explained. "This one game we lost 7-0 to St. Joe. Marie last November there were 72 shots on me. Actually, it was one of the best games I've ever had."

One of the NHL goalkeepers he admired in those years was Montreal's big Ken Dryden. "I always liked the way he seemed to be so loose and relaxed in goal, and I sort of picked up on that," Gowans said. He also lists former Red Wing goalkeepers Rutherford and Eddie Giacomin as favorites of his not-so-long-ago youth.

The groupup Gowans, now on the brink of a pro career, will undergo several key tests in the next three months. This month, he will travel to Louisiana for skating sessions with other 1985 U.S. Olympic Hockey Team candidates, then hit training camp with the Spitfires in August and with the Red Wings in September.

The Wings have a year to decide whether to offer Gowans a contract, and preseason camps are when he'll get a good going-over. "The first months are supposed to be the hardest," he acknowledged. But Gowans expects to be ready. He is on schedule with his prescribed summer training regimen, and he is on the ice eight hours a day as a youth goalie instructor for Compuware at the firm's Oak Park ice arena.

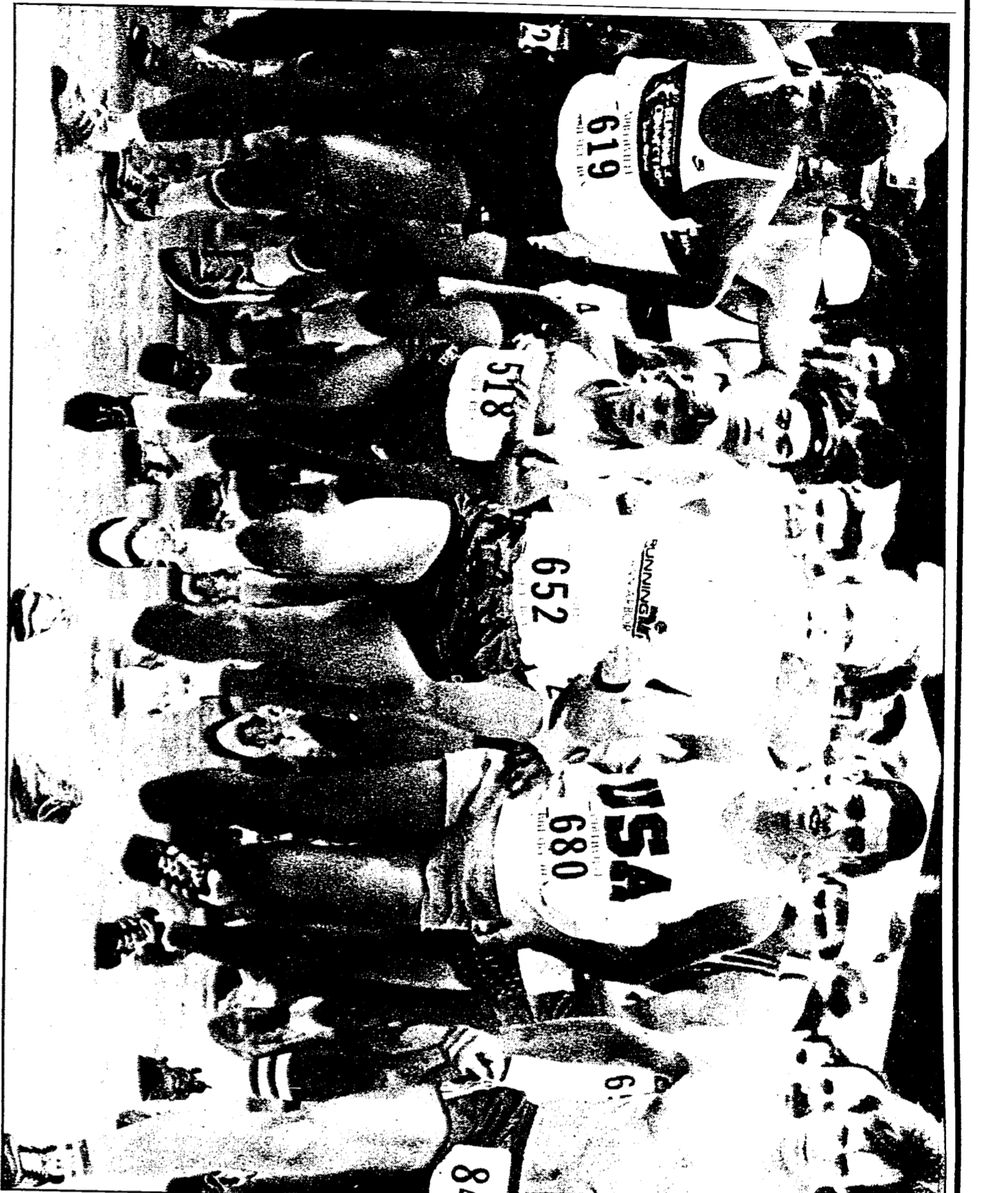

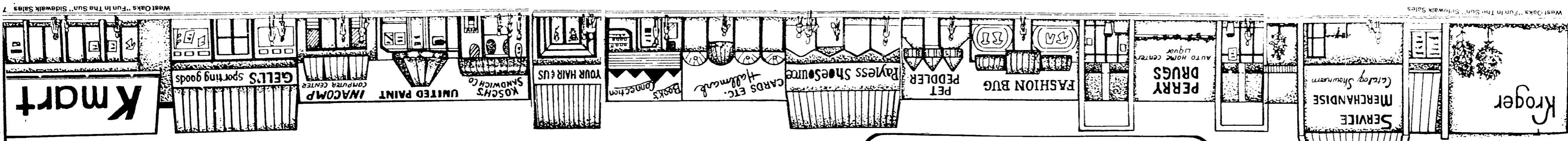

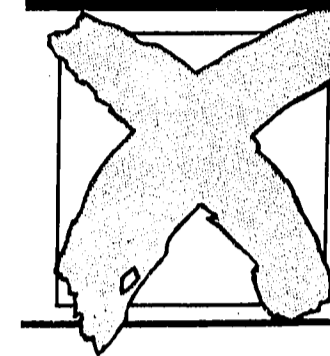
