# No relief ahead for local drivers

If there is one issue in Novi that is guaranteed to raise the ire of local residents, it is traffic.

As the community grows, key intersections like Nine Mile/Haggerty Road. Ten Mile/Meadowbrook Road and Eight Mile/Haggerty are becoming increasingly congested, increasingly hazardous.

Concerns over traffic have stalled or completely halted more than a half-dozen development plans in Novi over the past six months. Among

 A Mobil Oil gas station, car wash and convenience store at Grand River/Haggerty;

 A Marathon Oil service station at Eight Mile/Haggerty; • A shopping center on Haggerty, just south of the Grand River intersection: and.

• An industrial development off Novi Road near Ten Mile.

In addition, the city put a halt to all development along on Grand River Avenue this spring while Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers studied ways to help prevent future traffic problems along that thoroughfare. The resultant zoning requires larger lots in some areas and discourages multiple driveways on and off Grand

While planning officials scrutinized growing traffic problems along the city's business corridor, residents in the Nine Mile/Haggerty area bemoaned escalating traffic along Novi's condo corridor. In particular, concerns were raised over construction of 825 new apartment units sandwiched between Lakewoode Park

condominiums and Crosswinds West condominiums.

Traveling south one mile, the August opening of Northville's Meijer Thrifty Acres and the Novi Hilton - both at Eight Mile and Haggerty met everyone's worst traffic expectations. While Novi Police have not yet noticed an increase in traffic ac-

# Subdivision well water is safe, city tests show

from a residential well in Novi Heights subdivision were "all clear," City Manager - Edward Kreiwall reported this week.

Results reported earlier this month from two initial tests on wells in Pioneer Meadows and Echo Valley revealed a trace of diethyl phthalate ester, a chemical on the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Priority Pollutant list. The amount detected was far below the EPA level of "acceptable daily intake.'

Kriewall noted the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has requested that these two wells be retested. "There is still some concern the sampling process may have been faulty," he told the council Monday.

"(The state), in conjunction with the city, is going to retest the first two wells," he explained.

A second set of water tests conducted on wells in Pioneer Meadows and Echo Valley, but from different acquifers (underground water supplies) than the first two, showed "no

signs of diethyl phthalate — and they apparently are clear in all other respects," Kriewall reported.

The water testing was initiated by Kriewall and the city's consulting engineers, JCK and Associates, after a local resident presented research suggesting a frequent occurrence of serious illness in the three subdivisions. Officials have no indication at this time that any link exists between the illnesses reported and the well water in the area.

Susan Nayh, an environmental consultant for JCK, said she has received about a dozen telephone calls from residents since the water testing was publicized two weeks

Basically the people (who telephoned) were just curious about the water in general. Not many asked about the chemical (diethyl

phthalate)," she noted. "Many wanted to know how to go about it if they wanted to have their water tested," she added. Those who inquire are provided a well water testing fact sheet printed by the East Michigan Environmental Action Council (EMEAC), Nayh noted.

The city has reported its findings from the first two water tests to the Oakland County and state health departments. In addition, Nayh has related the city's water testing activity to several different divisions of

The city has not been notified by either of the health agencies that the level of diethyl phthalate discovered in the two wells is dangerous or that any cautions should be issued about drinking the water.

However, Kriewall noted Monday that several commercial filtration companies have come forward with products that are able to reduce the level of diethyl phthalate in the water. These filters cost about \$250-\$300, he added.

EPA research on the toxic effects of diethyl phthalate show it can induce birth defects in rats if they are injected with high doses of the chemical. Although little information is available on the chemical's possible affect on humans, it is not considered a carcinogen. Its most common use is in cosmetics as a perfume

# Murder-suicide suspected

Two people were found dead in a residence at the Village Wood Place Townhouse Apartments Friday in

what police are calling a homicide/suicide. Dead are Timothy Quinn, 33, and his wife Deborah Ann Quinn, 32. According to police reports, the bodies were found in the townhouse off Haggerty Road shortly after noon last Friday, August 16.

The body of Mrs. Quinn, a Registered Nurse, was found on the staircase, while her husband's body was found in an upstairs bedroom. Mr. Quinn was employed at Selfridge

Police said Mrs. Quinn had suffered a blow to the head, apparently from a length of pipe found near her body, and a knife wound in the chest. Mr. Quinn apparently died from a gun shot wound to his head. A small caliber rifle was found in the bedroom, according to reports. Novi Police Captain Richard Faulkner said the in-

vestigation has not yet been completed, but police are 99 percent sure it was a homicide/suicide. "We're waiting for official results from the Michigan State Police crime lab, so we can be 100 percent sure," he said. Faulkner said police have learned that Mr. Quinn plac-

ed a phone call to his mother in Youngstown, Ohio, the morning of the incident and told her he had terminal cancer. When he hung up before giving her a chance to respond, the mother contacted a brother in Youngstown who, in turn, called a relative in the Novi area.

When the relative was unable to elicit a response at the Quinn residence, he contacted Novi police who entered the home and found the bodies.

# Qualic decision delayed

City council postponed action on the Quazite Corporation Monday after complaints from a nearby resident persuaded the officials to order additional noise tests on the site.

Mary Wikman of 26220 Taft Road reported a constant "whirring" all day and throughout the night coming from the Grand River Avenue industrial operation. Although not loud. the constant annoyance "is destroying our lifestyle," she told the coun-

Assistant City Manager Craig Klaver noted noise tests have been taken on the property repeatedly "without once finding any levels exceeding the allowable limits.

But Wikman's reports persuaded Council Member Edward Leininger that a visit to the site is warranted before the operation is given the city's final stamp of approval. Other council members agreed additional noise tests were needed, particularly during the unloading of gravel on the

The city has been reviewing the Quazite operation since May when the corporation applied for a permit from the Michigan Water Resources Commission to store chemicals underground.

"It seems clear that due to the Water Resources Commission permit process and the resulting public debate, we have subjected this company to a scrutiny that far exceeds our normal review process," Klaver

Quazite has agreed to comply with each of the city's recommendations to ensure protection of the environment, he reported. As a result, Council Member Patricia Karevich suggested Quazite probably would be "one of the safer businesses in the ci-

But as the environmental concerns were being resolved, a second problem developed for the Quazite Corporation. For the past four to six weeks, city council has debated whether Quazite is a "light" industrial operation or a "heavy" industrial operation.

These discussions, which have taken place in closed sessions because communication from the city attorney was involved, were based on Quazite's use of toxic chemicals in its manufacturing process.

The firm makes industrial concrete floor bricks. The operation requires on-site storage and use of such chemicals as polyester resin and methylene chloride. Because it is highly flammable, the Fire Code requires large quantities of polyester resin to be stored underground.

Some council members apparently believed that the presence of toxic chemicals makes Quazite a heavy industrial operation. However, Klaver noted in his report Monday: "It does not appear that our standard planning review process focuses on the nature of the chemicals used in a

The list includes such mundane items as driving northbound in the southbound lanes of I-275 at 100 miles per hour, jumping out of airplanes, piloting a barrel over Niagra Falls, and reading Joseph Sobran when my sense of humor is at low ebb. The new addition is the most fearsome risk of all - hosting a birthday party/backyard barbecue for a three-year-

It was more than two weeks ago now, so my pulse has returned to normal and the wounds are starting to heal, but the simple act of reflection is enough to quicken my hearbeat and make the scabs itch. I might have stayed out of psychoanalysis had the guest list not rapidly expanded in the last three days before the big event. Fortunately, they didn't all show up. If they had, I calculated that there was one square foot of backyard allocated to each guest. If it rained, I planned to call the police to disperse an ugly mob.

The guest-of-honor's mother had to go to work that weekend, so it fell to her obedient servant to dash about on Saturday, birthday-boy-to-be in tow, making preparations for the big event scheduled late Sunday. Certain things are beyond contemplation, though, so the nine-month-old (who will never have such a party) was deposited with the sitter.

Five, count them, five trips to various grocery stores, but cher shops, produce markets and liquor stores later, wonderboy and I dragged our numbed limbs into the house long enough to drink Kool-Aid and contemplate the vicious nature of Saturday shoppers. special writer Exactly three months ago, on May 21, I found myself literally up to the neck in warm water and waiting for more than 1,000 shock waves to start pounding through my body. I looked up at the life preserver someone had hung over the bath with a "Swim at Your Own Risk" sign attached.

The attempt at humor helped relieve my tension. This was not your everyday kind of bathtub. It had cost about \$2 million and was designed to deliver powerful acoustic shock waves to the "bather" at the rate of about one per second. If I were fortunate, an hour's treatment would pulverize the large stone lodged in my only kidney. In January, my urologist, Dr. Virinder Bhardwaj at Oak

Creek Medical Center in Livonia, had shown me the stone on an X-ray. "That kidney is your lifeline," he said, "and to protect it the stone has to come out of there. You don't have another kidney to rely on so we mustn't wait too long." I had already experienced episodes with high fevers and extreme weakness in the previous weeks and written them off as flu. They were, in fact, the result of an infection caus-

Small tasks were beginning to seem large burdens Christmas had loomed ahead like a chore instead of a joy. I had not even had the energy to bake cookies, and decorating the tree had left me exhausted.

There were two methods, the doctor told me, for remov ing the stone. One was open surgery during which the stone would be lifted out in one piece. It was major surgery with about two weeks in the hospital and a long, eight-week recuperation. The other was percutaneous removal, whereby the stone would be broken with shock waves sent through a tube inserted into my kidney through my side. The later method was less traumatic but still a major procedure and, if it caused bleeding in the kidney, I would have to have open surgery anyway.

I knew that kidneys were occasionally lost in such surgery, and I did not have a second one as a back up. The possibility, however remote, of having to rely on dialysis for the rest of my life or the need for a transplant was

The doctor understood my reluctance for surgery on that only kidney and encouraged me to investigate a new nrethod of removing kidney stone which was only just beng approved for use by the F.D.A. He warned me that it was not yet available in Michigan

nor covered by most health insurance plans.

He sent me for a second opinion to Dr. Joseph Cerny, chairman of urology at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, who already had sent several patients for the new treatment to Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis The treatment is called Extracorporeal Shock Wave Lithotripsy. Extracorporeal means outside the body and

lithotripsy means stone pulverizing. The patient is placed in a bathtub-like device, and acoustic waves are generated underwater by a "spark plug" electrode. Ignition of the electrode generates a spark which vaporizes a small amount of water. This causes a pressure wave to pass through the water and biological tissue to the stone. Multiple ignitions aimed at the stone result in its pulverization but do not damage the surrounding tissue. The gravel resulting from the stone is passed,

usually painlessly, in the urine. Dr. Cerny told me the method had been developed in West Germany by Dornier, an aerospace manufacturer, with the cooperation of urologists from the University of Munich. He said the treatment is to medicine what the Wright brothers'

first flight was to aviation. "It's the most striking advance in the treatment of kidney stone disease ever, a stupendous advance for the preserva-

tion of kidney function.' Unfortunately, it is not for everyone. There are height and weight limits and certain medical conditions that make the procedure unwise. Adults as old as 85 and children as young as three have been treated successfully, however. Fortunately, I met the medical criteria, and my health insurance plan agreed to cover the cost. It would be less than Ann Chowdhury finishes up her story

open surgery - \$4,600 as opposed to \$6,200. The waiting list, however, was a long one. I was taking intibiotics to keep infection at bay, and the stone was pretty incomfortable at times. If it moved, or complications arose, I realized I would have to go ahead with surgery, but I decided to try to wait it out.

Often I would wake up at night, conscious of a nagging, tender spot in my side. It was a bit like living with a time Finally the long wait was over, and I lay strapped to an

operating platform which had been lowered into the bath with an overhead crane. My arms were strapped alongside my head, and my body was numb from my underarms to The medical team positioned me so that the energy of the

shock waves would be concentrated on the stone. Dr. James Lingeman, a Methodist Hospital urologist and one of the first doctors to go to Germany to learn the new

procedure, was now in charge of my case. He instructed me to breathe shallowly and not to try to speak or move as the shocks were delivered. The doctors, he said, could see the stone on a screen because of the two X-ray monitors in place over my abdomen. They would monitor the progress of the stone as the shocks proceeded. There was a bright flash under my right side and a loud bang. Then the shocks started to come in quick succession. like a jack hammer. It didn't hurt. All I could feel was a slight sensation in my side like someone flicking.

From time to time the shocks were stopped, and I was repositioned in the bath. "It's breaking up," I heard someone say and tried to remain relaxed despite a surge of relief. I tried counting the shocks but was lightheaded with valium and could not keep

count for long. It was well into the hundreds. Then it started to get uncomfortable as the anesthetic began to wear off. The shocks started to feel more like a punch in the stomach than a gentle flick in the side. Dr. Lingeman, who kept watching me closely, noticed me whince, and the shocks stopped immediately until more anesthetic took effect.

The discomfort was never such that I regretted not having gone the more usual route and asking for a general anesthetic. I enjoyed visualizing the stone breaking up more with every shock. It was like being a conscious participant in my own return to health. I couldn't help thinking what the alternatives would have been had the stone only been found a few weeks earlier, before this method was

About 45 minutes and a total of 1,000 shocks later Dr. Lingeman said, "It's all broken up now. Just 200 more for good measure.

I tried counting them off in 50s and the feeling of relief as hey came to an end was euphoric. The whole medical team shared my happiness as though they were all enjoying being part of a procedure that is revolutionizing the treatment of one of the most painful

"I am going to write about this when I get home," I told them as they lifted me out of the bath.

"Just be sure to spell our names right," one of them quip-

Most of the next day was spent wandering around the hospital corridors, glass of water in hand, following my instructions to walk and drink a lot to help the gravel pass. Other patients were doing the same, and we compared notes and marveled at the new procedure that had enabled

The only evidence of the shock waves were a few slight bruises across my back and abdomen - nothing compared with the scars that would have resulted from surgery. Next morning Dr. Lingeman released me from the hospital. I was free to travel back to Northville. No more antibiotics, no more waking up at night wondering about that nagging tenderness in my side.

After a good night's sleep at home I went to work energetically digging my garden, trying to make up for this

I thought as I worked of what Dr. Lingeman had said. "The inventors of the lithotripter deserve the Nobel prize. I was a brilliant idea and brillantly executed. It is as easy to use as pushing a button. It is less painful, costs less shortens the hospital stay and has fewer complications.' To me it is nothing short of a miracle.
