'83 legal-ese tangle forces millage vote

A conflicting provision in the wording of a 1983 ballot proposal will send Novi voters to the polls March 24 to decide the fate of a 13-mill renewal of the school district's operating millage.

Novi School Superintendent Robert Piwko told school board members last Thursday that in reviewing the language of the '83 ballot proposal, school officials noted there was a conflict in reference to the period of time the renewal would be effective.

While the proposition stated the renewal would be effective for a "three year period," it also specifically outlined "the years 1983 to 1986."

Piwko noted that after reviewing the proposition approved by voters in 1983, school officials determined the millage was renewed for a three-year period from 1983 through 1985 with the millage expiring last

"From a legal standpoint we could go one more year on the tax collection," Piwko said. However, he noted the district is "dealing with intent and not

The (school) board has always been credible

with its positions and statements," Piwko noted. "Our interpretation is that the millage has expired."

The March 24 election will coincide with Schoolcraft College's special millage election, allowing the college and school district to share election

Schoolcraft College (which serves a portion of the Novi district) is seeking an additional half-mill from voters to help defer rising costs and offset an anticipated budget shortfall of nearly \$700,000 to next year's program.

Although the board established a date for the district's special election at its meeting last week, school officials postponed setting the millage rate until the January 16 school board meeting.

"It is our opinion at this time that we will not have to ask for an increase beyond the 13 mills," Piwko told board members, adding that Assistant Superintendent William Barr will be looking at salary projections for the coming school year to better determine the district's needs.

Council keeps right to OK key site plans

Big-scale developers will have yet another hurdle to clear in obtaining approval for projects in Novi's Town Center, following action by the City Council Monday.

week, the council backed Mayor Patricia Karevich's preference that council have final say on approving site plans for projects over five acres in the Town Center.

The issue of whether the board or council authorize final plan approval appeared to be a nonissue until the January 6 council meeting. At the meeting, Karevich suggested the ultimate decision on major Town Center projects should belong to the council instead of the board, as had been specified in a 12-page ordinance amendment spelling out design and use guidelines in the Town Center area at Novi Road and Grand River (see related story).

The mayor said she proposed the council's final approval measure to keep the elected body informed of planning events with a major impact on the community. She noted that without the change, the cursory project plan presentation the Trammell Crow Company made in December for a 50-acre development in the Town Center's northeast quadrant would be the last time council could review it. At that time, Trammell Crow had not even specified what businesses would operate in

job," Karevich maintained. "We just need to stay informed of what's going on ... We're talking about maybe one or two projects; we're not talking about many. I think the council should be held responsible for these kinds of major projects. If it is to have a major impact on the community, we should have control over it."

Although the issue had not been debated among members of the Town Center Steering Committee, council members agreed Karevich's idea had merit, and sent it to the board for consideration on

BB gur... shatters 28 windshields

The BB-gun vandals have struck again, smashing the windows out of at least 28 automobiles parked along streets in Novi subdivisions during the night of January 3-4.

The outbreak of smashed windows in Novi was the first since the windows of some 81 automobiles were broken out during the night of October 27-28.

But this time, the vandals traveled beyond Novi city limits and left a trail of broken windows up and down Haggerty Road from Novi and Farmington Hills on the north to Plymouth and Canton townships

Plymouth Township police reported 48 incidents of broken windows, while Canton Township police reported an additional 24 incidents. Total damage in the two townships was estimated at \$5,000.

Several other communities, including Farmington Hills, Northville Township and the cities of Plymouth and Northville, experienced similar vandalism during the night of January 3-4, according to Plymouth Township Deputy Chief Chip Snider.

Damaged automobiles in Novi were reported in the Turtle Creek and Whispering Meadows subdivisions, the Country Place and Crosswinds West Condominiums and the Novi Ridge Apartments.

According to police officials, all the windows were broken by a BB or pellet gun. Police also believe that juveniles are responsible for the damage, and one aw enforcement official suggested the responsible parties reside in Novi or Farmington Hills.

"The common denominator seemed to be Haggerty Road," said Deputy Chief Snider of Plymouth Township. "They seem to be working one-half mile either side of Haggerty from Farmington Hills to Canton. They're hitting every thing on the street.

"I think it's some frustrated juveniles out for a good time," Snider added. "We have reason to believe they started in the north, which leads us to believe they're from Novi or Farmington Hills."

The apparent modus operandi in all the incidents. according to Novi Police Captain Richard Faulkner. is for a group of two or more juveniles armed with BB or pellet guns to drive down subdivision streets, shooting out the windows of cars parked on or near

After the October outbreak, Faulkner indicated that police were investigating several suspects, but the Novi police captain said Monday that none of those leads had panned out to the point where war-

rants could be obtained.
"We need some help," said Faulkner. "We need to catch them in the act or else have some assistance from the public. One of the best weapons we have at this point is public awareness that this type of vandalism is taking place.

"If people are aware of what's going on, they are more likely to observe something that might be helpful to us in apprehending the responsible par-ties. What we need is for somebody to catch a license number or a good description of the car and then contact us immediately."

Any information regarding the vandalism can be reported to Novi police by calling 348-7100.

In the meantime, Faulkner advised residents to take precautions against similar outbreaks of vandalism by using garages when possible or pulling their automobiles as far away from the street as

District for convention center 'on'

Anyone who wants to build a convention center in Novi now has a place to do it.

The Novi City Council unamimously agreed Monday to create the new zoning district, which contains the new Raphael's restaurant, the Novi Sheraton Oaks hotel and property extending from Novi Road to the C&O Railroad just north of I-696.

The new convention center zoning was needed for developers to proceed with plans for a hotel-trade center project with site plans expected to debut in the upcoming few weeks. A Trammell Crow Company subsidiary, the Dallas Market Center Company, along with Pico Industries, owners of the Sheraton Oaks,

are expected to present site plans for their project within the next few weeks.

Preliminary plans already revealed to city officials contain a two-part rade center tentatively called the Midwest Expo Center and the Midwest Fashion Center, together with an expansion of the Sheraton Oaks. Gerald Abel, agent for developers, has said an eight-story addition to the hotel appears likely to accommodate out-of-town visitors to the trade

According to Novi Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers, the 39-acre site Abel introduced fulfills the standards of the convention center guidelines officials established last

"The C (convention) district was designed to fit this type of site," Rogers reported to council members. "The site has a strategic location, good vehicular access, the presence of a highquality, full-service hotel and related accommodate a multi-purpose, regionallyoriented convention/hotel center which can create jobs and tax base."

The rezoning and subsequent submittal of site plans had been expected for months, but the difficulties of acquiring the property parcels necessary for the project proved a dif-doesn't even exist in it." ficult one for developers.





Council approves plat plan

Novi's dwindling supply of lots for single-family homes should be fortified soon, as developers of Dunbarton Pines subdivision last week obtained final preliminary plat approval for the second and third phases of their subdivision's construction from Novi City

Council. The second and third phases of Dunbarton Pines will be constructed on 72 acres of land immediately north of the existing Dunbarton Pines subdivision on the northeast corner of Nine Mile and Taft Road. Combined, the next two phases plann

"You mean you're actually going to charge \$7 for registration and \$1 per week just for the right to stand on your scale? What's wrong? Don't people have scales at home any more?

"I weigh myself at home every morning and it doesn't cost me a cent. I didn't even have to pay a registration fee. I just get up, walk into the bathroom, step on the scale and there it is my weight. What makes you think people are going to pay all that money to do the same thing they can do absolutely free at

If Clara was put off by my skepticism, she didn't let on. In fact, she assured me the program was very worthwhile and would help a lot of people. People will stick to their diets better if they have somebody else checking their weight every week.

"We'll see what you have to say when we have 40 people lined up to weigh-in every Thursday." she said.

But I have a better idea . . . the Phil Jerome Weekly Weigh Program. Registration fee is just \$6 and I'll only charge 75 cents for the right to climb up on the scale at my house. Just send those checks and money orders to yours truly, care of this sta-



Seventy-two percent of the calcium in the American food supply comes from the milk group of foods. The vegetable group provides 10 per cent of the calcium, mostly the leafy

greens such collard, kale, mustard reens and turnip greens. The meat group provides nine per-

cent, particularly canned salmon and sardines provided the bones are eaten. The grain group provides about four percent of the calcium though it comes mainly from the milk and baking powder used to prepare foods. The remaining five percent is from

Bedor wasn't around to see the Novi team stumble through a three win season a year ago, but she was determined not to let it happen again. The way things are going for the Wildcats so far this season, there is little chance of a repeat. After two regular season dual meets, Novi has vet to lose and is quickly approaching ast year's win total.

Last Thursday (January 9) the Wildcats defeated Milford 15-4, 15-11 in the Kensington Valley Conference opener for both squads, raising their record to 2-0 overall.
