Dallas Market Center officials say they will not proceed with plans for a convention/trade center in Novi without a Tax Increment Financing Authority. The TIFA Act inging in another \$22.4 million over has come under criticism from a 10-year period because of land apschool officials because for a preciation. period of time, usually 10-15 years, it freezes assessments at current levels. Taxpayers within the TIFA district continue to pay all taxes and tax increases — but tax revenues above the frozen level are "captured" by a TIFA authority to pay for capital improvements (roads and sewer and water lines) within the district. At the end of the designated time period, the TIFA authority is abolished and all taxes are distributed according to the millage rates established by taxing one thing, under the contract that authorities (schools, city, etc.).

If the school board files suit against the city for endorsing creation of a TIFA, financial institutions would not purchase the TIFAcreated bonds — at least not until the litigation has been completed.

The only basis for litigation appears to be that land in the proposed TIFA district is increasing in value and not decreasing.

City Assessor John Merrifield says the proposed 245-acre TIFA district is decreasing in value even though the property parcels on which the convention center is to be built are slightly increasing in value. If Merrifield is correct, it would appear there's little chance a lawsuit against the city on the assessment issue would be successful. But the process of determining that in the courts could take a long time — long enough to chase a convention center out of Novi.

Dallas Market Center epresentatives have set forth valid reasons as to why creation of a TIFA will benefit Novi - both the city and the schools.

We have been wary of the guarded, hurry-up-and-wait progress Trammell Crow has exhibited in introducing its various projects. So we were surprised to see Dallas Market Center representatives provide a clear and logical explanation of what benefits the Novi community will receive as a result of the convention center development.

These benefits are both shortterm and long-term. In the short run, approval of TIFA would not only permit, but require the Tram-mell Crow subsidiary to help build an extensive network of roads in the city's regional commercial center — this year.

These road improvements would reduce traffic strain on Twelve Mile and on Novi Road by allowing quick freeway access to West Oaks I and II, and to the expo/fashion center. They also would give commuters another way to get to and from the highway without encountering Twelve Oaks Mall traffic on Novi Road and Twelve Mile.

Put simply, after the Dallas Market Center pays off the \$4.1 million bond for public improvements, about \$39 million will be coming in for schools, police and fire by 1996. According to what Merrifield calls conservative projections, the \$4.1 million will be made up within six years.

And there are more incentives than prospective tax revenues. For led to federal financing of the ramp construction at Novi Road and I-96, the city specified that a convention center would be developed on a site adjacent to the ramp. If the convention center doesn't fly, the City of Novi will have to reimburse Un-

Then there is Section 15 itself The centralized regional industrial center has been in the planning stages for more than five years. Its development would give the city a centralized commercial district disruptive to surrounding residential areas. Causing the project to fall through would turn back the clock for the city, limit its appeal to new industries and force the city to settle for second-rate commercial

If officials are concerned about whether this TIFA will establish a precedent in the community, we note a statement by Merrifield that the property contained in this TIFA district is the only significant com-mercial property declining in value in Novi. In other words, TIFA backing here would be a one-shot. Nothing else in the city could qualify anyway.

So why are school officials opposed to the proposed TIFA district? It's basically a matter of not being willing to defer additional tax revenues during the period the TIFA is in effect. The proposed convention center will not create any additional expenses for the school district; nor will it deprive the district of any revenues which it currently receives.

The fear here is that without a TIFA there will be no convention center ... an amenity which reasonably can be expected to stimulate additional development of the nature that will generate high tax revenues (i.e. professional office, hotels). Moreover, the capital improvements needed to open Section 15 property for additional development will be further

School officials have legitimate concerns about creation of a TIFA district. In this instance, however, opposition to TIFA will harm not only the city but also the schools. Basically, the board is being asked to sacrifice a nickle today to make a dime tomorrow.

Love, the feeling that makes the world go round, has been the inspiration of artists since time im-

In a light hearted, tongue-in-cheek presentation of "Heart in Art," Detroit Institute of Art docent Joyce Moore translated the many love-inspired works housed in the DIA collection in a slide presentation last Friday at Northville Woman's Club.

Her translation offered a tempting invitation to revisit the Institute and inspect the originals. She asked her audience to imagine each painting or sculpture on the front of a valentine card, and, after telling them a little about the artist, subject and style, suggested an appropriate message to in-

"I hope none of you have any ripe fruit or vegetables in your pocketbooks," she joked. Her first slide, an example of the love of a father for his son, was the bronze sculpture, Return of the Prodigal Son, by the 17th century Italian artist Antonio Montauti.

father coming down the house steps to greet his repentant son, returning in rags after squandering

It was, Moore said, one of the 12 bronze figures on biblical themes ordered from the Medici workshops in Florence.

She pointed out the fine detail possible on the bronze which would not have been attainable on wood or stone, a tear on the father's cheek and holes in his son's clothes. "It is typical baroque Florentine bronze of the

finest quality, because they were acknowledged to be the best workers in the medium," she said.

For the accompanying message she suggested, "I don't know why I love like I do. I just do!" From the biblical theme she moved to myth and

legend and the painting by Peter Paul Rubens – Briseis being given back to Achilles. The painting illustrates a story of the Trojan

wars when King Agamemnon claimed, among war prizes from captured cities, the beautiful slave girl Because Achilles loved Briseis, the king agreed to return her realizing he could not have won the

war without Achilles' help. In the painting, Achilles is rushing forward with his arms open wide to greet Brisels who has just ar-

Other figures surround the lovers on the harbor, reating a lively, vivid scene.

Moore explained that Briseis resembled the artist's second wife, and the painting (done on panel) was intended as a sketch for tapestry for his new father-in-law who was a tapestry merchant.

"A better painter could not be chosen to paint a love scene than Peter Paul Rubens because he really did a lot of loving," Moore said. "He loved life, he loved to paint, he loved his wife, his children, his home and his fellow citizens and he was loved by them, too."

For the message to go with the painting she chose, "Valentine, you take the prize!" Another of Moore's choices for the valentine theme was the painting of Pygmalion and Galatea by French artist Louis Lagrence, 1724-1805.

The story, from Greek mythology, which inspired the painting, told of how Pygmalion, king of Cyprus, carved a statue of Galatea. It was so beautiful he fell in love with it. He prayed to the

goddess of love to bring her to life. His prayer was answered and the painting shows

him next to the statue as it turns from marble into warm, pink flesh. However, one foot still was cold

"This is probably awful," Moore noted, "but the message to go in this valentine card is, 'Valentine, A statue of Aphrodite by Pierre Auguste Renoir was another of Moore's choices. Aphrodite was in Greek mythology, the Olympian goddess of love,

Her naked figure is represented by Renoir at the end of the 19th century, with a solidity and volume

not typical of other artists' works at the time, but in keeping with his earlier paintings of the female figure.

Moore explained Renoir turned to sculpture

when his rheumatic hands could no longer manipulate a brush. In her outstretched hand, Aphrodite grasps the golden apple of discord, awarded to her by Paris when she offered him Helen, the fairest of women. The message Moore chose for the card depicting

Aphrodite was, "Valentine, you are the apple of my

For a change of pace, a hanging Chinese scroll complete with calligraphy and painting was chosen It was made about 1500 and was, Moore said, the

work of two friends who she imagines to be sitting in a garden drinking wine. They decided to send a card to a friend, who, though getting along in years, has no male heirs.

One of the friends does the calligraphy, a verse titled, "Ode to a Pomegranate," a pomegranate being a symbol of fecundity.

They wish their friend the blessing of a male heir, and add a painting which represents a branch with pomegranates and buds of a special type of melon which ripens in the fall.

For this card, which is pregnant with meaning, Moore chose the message, "This bud's for you."
Pieter Bruegal's painting, The Wedding Dance,
was another of Moore's choices. The Flemish painter lived from 1525-1569 and his unique, easily recognizable style depicts the everyday life around him at a time when most artists were staying with

The Wedding Dance depicts more than 100 joyful people dancing and celebrating a marriage. It's a lively, colorful paining, typical of the artist. According to Moore, it was painted on wood, and the thin paint allows the under drawing to show through, giving a good feel to Bruegal's technique.

Moore's message? "Valentine, may I have this dance?" The Nut Gatherers is one of the Detroit Institute of Art's best loved paintings, so it too was chosen since it illustrates a friendship between two young

girls which probably will last a lifetime. It was painted by William Bougereau and shows the two friends relaxing after a nut gathering exhibition, engrossed in conversation.

Moore said she chose the type of message to go with it that school friends would write in each other's autograph books: "Yours till the U.S. drinks Canada Dry."
