August 5 primary: Two races rate trip to polls

Novi voters will go to the polls in the state primary election next Tuesday, August 5. But they won't have a great many choices

o make. In fact, there are only two contested races on the primary ballot.

The race that has generated the most interest, of course, is the race for the gubernatorial nomination on the Republican side of the ticket. The other race on the primary ballot sees five candidates for a single vacancy on the Oakland County Circuit

Polls will open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. Novi City Clerk Geraldine Stipp is uncertain as to how many of the city's 17,064 registered voters will show up at the polls.

As in all primary elections in Michigan,

voters must decide whether to vote Republican or Democratic. Election rules do not permit split ballots in the primary.

Gov. James Blanchard faces token opposition from Henry Wilson for the Democratic nomination for governor, but the real race is in the Republican primary where Dick Chrysler, Colleen Engler, William Lucas and Dan Murphy are battling it out for the right to challenge Blanchard in the November general election.

With no real races on the Democratic side of the ticket. Novi voters, who have traditionally gone Republican, are expected to continue their GOP leanings.

The only other decision awaiting voters in the August primary is a non-partisan race

for a single vacancy on the Oakland County Circuit Court. Jessica Cooper, Martin Krohner, Lawrence Ternan, Joan Young and William Zlem are the five candidates to replace Frederick Ziem, who is retiring. William Ziem is the son of the retiring judge.

Voters will vote for one of the five judicial candidates in the August primary with the top two vote-getters advancing to the November general election.

All other positions on the primary ballot are uncontested.

In Michigan's 18th U.S. Congressional district, Gary Kohut is unopposed for the Democratic nomination and William Broomfield is unopposed for the Republican

Jack Faxon is unopposed on the Democratic 25299 Taft Road side of the ticket; Frank Brock is unopposed for the Republican nomination.

In the 60th State House of Representatives district, Marshall Spinner is the lone Democratic candidate and Willis Bullard, Jr., is the lone Republican candidate.

And in the 24th Oakland County Commis- River sion district. Leo Foley is unopposed for the Democratic bid and John Calandro stands Willowbrook Drive alone on the Republican side of the ticket.

Governor vows traffic solution

Call it a campaign promise, but a welcome one — Governor James Blanchard announced Monday he is taking steps to implement a remedy for Haggerty Road's traffic problems "as soon as possible."

Blanchard announced his commitment to an interchange at 1-96 and Haggerty Road and road widening following a helicopter tour of the Haggerty Road/I-96/I-275 region. Noting extensive economic growth here and his familiarity with the area (besides being from Pleasant Ridge, Blanchard's mother once lived in Southfield and now resides in South Lyon), the governor called the northwest suburbs "one of the nottest develor ment areas in the country.

"Traffic is a problem, but it's a nice kind of problem," Blanchard told a group of business and government representatives and media at the Henry Ford Medical Center in West Bloomfield. "It means there's growth, there are jobs being created. Other parts of the state would like to have the problems you

"But this kind of incredible traffic congestion is becoming a danger to the quality of life, and indeed, to the safety of the residents. We have to manage growth; that's why government provides these ser-

Asked to comment on claims by officials at various levels of government that insufficient funds were deferring road improvement programs, Blanchard responded: "Fortunately the State of Michigan is fiscally solvent right now. It ought to be able to provide the dollars needed for these improvements.

"We don't want to provide a plan we can't implement . . . Hopefully we can do this to the savings of the taxpayer, not the detriment."

What Davis hadn't counted on in in planning the robbery was that Terry Runyan, 32, would be working nearby.

Runyan, who lives in Gaithersburg, Maryland, told police he was working on the remodeling of a store near Meyer's Treasure Chest when he saw a black male being chased by the store manager, who was yelling for

Runyan checked to see if the suspect was carrying a gun or a knife, and, when he saw none, stopped the would-be thief with an 'open-field tackle.'

When our officers arrived on the scene, they observed a black male being held down by several white males," reported Novi Police Detective Ralph Fluhart.

When they asked what happened, they found out that Runyon had tackled the suspect as he was fleeing the store.

Stoplight at 13 Mile ahead

Hang in there, drivers in northern Novi - a traffic tha Hoyer remarked last week. signal at Thirteen Mile and Novi Road is on the way, probably within the next two months.

When roadwork completed earlier this year realigned East Lake Drive, South Lake Drive, Thirteen Mile and Novi Road just south of Walled Lake, residents in the area found themselves more inconvenienced than aided by the road improvements.

Complaints about the re-routings are as many as the turn directions. Drivers exiting East Lake Drive onto Thirteen Mile, exiting South Lake Drive onto either Novi Road or Thirteen Mile, rounding the curve at Thirteen Mile and Novi Road, and turning into the streets from major roads have experienced long waits, nearmiss accidents and sight-distance problems, especially

during peak traffic periods. "We're going to have a tragedy there very soon if something's not done," Novi City Council Member Mar-

The Oakland County Road Commission agrees: construction of a traffic light at the intersection is planned to take place within the next two months, pending negotiations with Detroit Edison.

"The work in the county's piled up a lot, and it takes them a while to get Edison off their duff," said Edward Smiadek, Novi's traffic engineer. Smiadek said the city would pay the cost of installing a new traffic signal and then share the cost of maintenance with Oakland Coun-

Smiadek said to his knowledge there had been no major accidents resulting from the new road configuration. "I've been checking the accident reports the police give me, but there doesn't seem to be a prodigious number of accidents there. The biggest complaint seems to be getting onto Thirteen Mile from





The number of building permits issued from January 1 to June 30 this year actually declined from the number issued during the same sixmonth time period last year. Some 243 permits were issued at the midpoint of 1985, compared to 182 this year.

The biggest decline came in apartment buildings, which dropped from 55 (828 units) January-June last year to four buildings (56 units) over the first part of '86. Recently-approved site plans likely will send this year's total skyrocketing by year's end, however.

But district judges have a way of becoming circuit court judges, and they advance to the State Supreme Court or appelate courts and tend to move up the ladder until maybe, just maybe, they may become a U.S. judge.

The federal judges have an awful lot of power given them by the Constitution and the rules of the courts. In many ways, their decisions carry more weight than presidential policies or the laws enacted by the Con-

Yet, everyone pays attention to the gubernatorial, congressional and presidential candidates. Not many people seem to care who is elected to the bench. It seems even the political parties fall down on the

job. True, the court races are ostensibly non-partisian, yet in most instances each of the political parties seems to have its favorite judicial son or daughter.

Perhaps, like a potential amendment to the Constitution or a Cabinet appointment, it would be beneficial to require a two-thirds majority to approve an appointment to the federal bench. Perhaps it would behoove the State of Michigan to have its Supreme Court justices appointed, rather than elected, and require a two-thirds majority of the State Senate for con-

And perhaps, like all good citizens, it would be helpful if we all spent a little more time examining just who is running for judge. So that instead of relying on name recognition when we cast ballots for judge, we can vote with the knowledge that we are voting for the person who best represents our legal system.

"In terms of our organizational policy we recognize in some areas that human needs take precedence over animal needs," she said, "but that doesn't negate the fact that we think the use has to be justified and the

animal has to be humanely treated." But progress does not come easily. While many of the ways in which we use animals may seem blatantly cruel, in almost every instance there seems to be a "human conse-

Medical research a top issue

One such area is the use of animals in medical research. Every year, 17 to 22 million animals, some bought from local pounds, are used for research. When the experiments are completed on them, they are put to sleep.

The Humane Society's answer to that type of argument is that while it may be true right now, we should not stop searching for alter-That's already happened in some instances, she said.

"Veterinary schools used to have to practically kill animals to show how to resuscitate it," she said. Now, many schools use a mechanical dog which exactly replicates the process—and not at the cost of an animal's

Dr. Mark Evans, senior scientist with the American Medical Association, agrees that there may be ways to cut down on use of animals in research, but since most people would prefer that research continue to be done on how to cure human illness, it is doubtful that the practice will ever be stopped com-

"In many cases, animals will always be an important part, I'd almost say an indispensable part, of research," he said. But he agrees with the humane society

philosophy that alternatives should be sought

out and used whenever possible. And since research budgets are on the increase while the use of animals is decreasing, he feels that the scientific community is on the right track. One technique already in use is computer modeling, which may be used in cardiovascular research, for example. "But you still have to check it in an animal," he said. "The advantage to the computer would be, it

cuts down on the number of animals used." Sometimes cell cultures or organ or tissue cultures can be used in place of animals, he said, but again, often the results must finally be checked in a live animal.

Research animals are used in three basic categories. Evans said: basic modeling research, such as heart disease; testing; and







Our prehistoric predecessors, the dinosaurs, have reappeared in Michigan and are taking over the Impression Five Museum in Lans-

The six lifelike animated creatures are monstrous enough, standing 6 to 10 feet with lengths of up to 37 feet. With the help of robotics, the dinosaurs can move their eyes and head, breathe, growl and take steps forward and back.

The dinosaur exhibit, produced by Dynamation, a subsidiary of Disney, is appearing for the first time in Michigan at the Lansing museum. The creatures will be on display through Sept. 21. The museum is open Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Thursday, 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturday, 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday, noon to 5 p.m. Admission for adults is \$3, children, \$2.50.

"The exhibit is nothing like you've ever seen before," said an Impression Five spokesperson. "It can be kind of frightening because they are so lifelike, especially the Stegosaurus, whose whole body moves."

The Impression Five Museum is located on Museum Drive, off Michigan Avenue, between Grand and Cedar three blocks east of the

Capitol. Other science museums are also having special exhibits and dinosaur attractions.

Cranbrook in Bloomfield Hills is hosting their own dinosaur display focusing on demonstrations, lectures and exhibits all related to this prehistoric creature.

Featuring something different every day, the exhibit continues through Aug. 3, Tuesday through Sunday, 1 to 5 p.m. Admission is \$1.50 for adults, \$1 for children.

On the last day of the program, Cranbrook will host a celebration in honor of the 120 millionth birthday of the Stegosaurus dinosaur.

The Cranbrook Science Museum is located on Lone Pine Road, between Bloomfield and Telegraph.

Another science museum to consider visiting is Hands On in Ann Arbor. Everything in this participatory museum can be touched or manipulated.

Located in an old fire house, the exhibits in this museum explore various subjects in the environment. On the first floor, the subject is you. Designed to be an opportunity to learn about yourself, exhibits include machines to measure heart rate, grip strength and reaction time. There also is a chance to try your hand on computers.
