Interests clash over plan for industrial/office park

The first of several deadlines arrives this week for Manufacturers Industrial Subdivision, a proposed 49acre office/industrial park plat bitterly opposed by Novi residents who are its potential neighbors.

The city planning commission has been advised it must render a decision on whether to approve Manufacturers' preliminary plat by Saturday in order to fulfill a city ordinance guaranteeing developers a prompt review process. A meeting is scheduled tonight

Under the proposed plat, the 25-acre development would occupy property between Meadowbrook Lakes subdivision to the east and the C&O Railroad to the west. Ever since the plat's introduction in August, it has generated criticism from Meadowbrook Lakes residents generated traffic levels and its visual disrupuse as residential, although a 1984 hearing on rezoning tion make it an unsuitable neighbor for the subdivision's

Different (super)market for a different market

NORTHVILLE — Although Shopping Center Market is well known in Oakland County, it has yet to put in an appearance in Wayne County. That will change, however, when the firm opens its doors in the city at the site that formerly housed Chatham on Center Street in Nor-

A visit to Shopping Center Market is like a visit to a gourmet food store, without the price markups and with "I think you could call us an 'oh my gosh' store," grins

Sidney Hiller, the president and founder of the food chain. "We have some products on our shelves that people have only read about or heard their parents talk And the store also has a lot of those items. Take

mayonnaise or salad dressing, for instance. Some stores carry three or four brands, at Shopping Center Market in West Bloomfield there are 14. Or cheeses. At the deli counter, there are 30 different varieties of bulk cheeses and another 100 types of processed, chopped, minced and sliced varieties.

As for ethnic foods, those are available too, without having to go to specialty stores. "We really have no intention of rapidly expanding like some of the chains have done," says Hiller, who started his four-store (soon to be five-store) chain from a small

And although he is 73. Hiller still spends hours working

"We're a family-oriented business and the customers are our family," he says. He isn't necessarily blowing smoke, either. It is not unusual for a confused-looking shopper to find directions from a clerk, without having

In addition to the regular grocery stock, Shopping Center Markets, including the soon-to-open store in Northville, carry an enormous supply of pastas, including spinich, whole wheat and tomato varieties. In the produce department, three varieties of egg

plants, three colors of peppers - green, red and black share space with mini vegetables which mingle with exotic tamarillos from New Zealand, star fruit and prickly pears. There also are fresh spices, like garlic, dill etc. But Hiller's pride and joy is the deli department. There, he fusses over three types of potato salad, pasta salads, artichoke salads, hummous and taboulee as if he personally made each one.

He says he tastes everything and when he finds a particularly pleasing taste, the deli employees adapt it as

While Hiller, who lives in Franklin, says he aims to provide a variety of products for most ethnic tastes, he admits he also is diet conscious and the Shopping Center Markets stock a full line of low sodium, low calorie products. There's even no-sugar jams and jellies vying for space among the imported and domestic products.

Meats are displayed "butcher" style, without prepackaging, although there are prepared foods such as chicken and beef kabobs and stuffed poultry. And Hiller is especially proud of offering fresh turkeys and turkey parts throughout the year. "I think Northville is going to like what we offer."

And he's optimistic that he will build the same type of reputation here as he has done at the other stores. "It's not unusual for someone to shop here on a quarterly basis - to bring their shopping list for the season and load up three or four shopping carts. Then they go back from wherever they came from until the

In other words, it's all right not to know anything about football. But for those times when you feel a need to impress someone, or at least be able to fake a reasonably profound knowledge of The Game, we'll help you out by answering your questions. You there, ma'am, with the booster club but-

Is there any sure-fire expressions I can use that will make me look like I understand the

Yes. Kaine has noted that one can dazzle neighboring fans by jumping up on any running play (that is, a play on which nobody kicks or throws the ball) by saying: "Did you see that pulling guard?" There is always a pulling guard. If it's a long pass play, say: "Whoait's the home run ball." This will show you know home runs don't really happen in football. If someone says, "I thought there weren't any

home runs in football," the correct response is to roll your eyes. If the play is a punt, say, don't shout: "What a punt." It won't matter if it's a good or bad punt. If someone on your team kicks a field goal — successfully — you may say: "He got all of that one." If he misses, it's cool to frown and say: "Mighta gotta bad hold."

Are there any expressions I should avoid?

Yes. Do not use the word "grid," "gridiron, "red dog," or "100 percent." The terms "grid" and gridiron" now are used only to make newspaper headlines fit. "Red dog" already has been expunged from most 20th century football glosaries, as has use of the term "100 percent" to describe a team's optimum level of effort. Nowadays, a good game is at least 110 percent, and an exceptional game 200 percent. Call it football inflation.

How bonds can affect financial planning

HOULD YOU invest in corporate bonds or municipal bonds? Before you decide, says the Michigan Association of CPAs, you should understand how this kind of investment will affect your tax and total financial situation.

A bond is an I.O.U. from a corporation or municipality. Bonds are issued to raise capital to build plants, buy machinery and maintain a business. If you lend your money to a corporation by buying its bonds, the corporation promises to pay you back with inter-

Typically bonds are sold in \$1,000 units. So, if you buy a \$1,000 bond, and it pays a 10 percent annual interest, you receive \$100 a year until the bond matures. Interest is usually paid out twice a year. At maturity, you receive the \$1,000 original investment — also called the face value.

BONDS PROVIDE a relatively secure return on your investment. However, inflation and changes in interest rates can make your investment less attractive. Here's how: After investing in a \$1,000 bond that pays 10 percent interest, the interest rates on other investments may rise. If new bonds are

Conversely, your bond may become more valuable if interest rates fall below the 10 percent rate of return. The bond you paid \$1,000 for will be worth more on this "secondary" market where bonds are traded - when inter-

The interplay between interest rates and bond prices is measured by the bond's current yield. To find the current yield, divide a bond's annual interest rate by its current price. For example, take a bond issued at \$1,000 and paying 15 percent interest. Say interest rates rise, making the bond's 15 percent rate less attractive and forcing down the price of the bond should you want to sell it.

Then, if the bond's price slips to \$950 on the secondary market, you would compute the current yield by dividing the annual \$150 interest payment by the current market value of \$950. In this case, the current yield would be 15.8 percent. As you can see, when prevailing interest rates rise, the



THE RATE OF RETURN on a bond is not the only factor to consider when you are looking for the right bond to buy. Bonds are rated by independent financial services, such as Standard and Poor's and Moody's. The rating indicates the bond issuer's capacity to pay investors interest and repay the principal when the bond matures. Generally, the higher rated bonds pay less in interest because the risk of default is lower. You will find that a bond rated AAA offers a yield two or three percentage points lower than those rated BBB, because AAA is

One type of bond, which has been issued with increasing frequency in recent years, is the municipal bond. These bonds are issued by state and local governments or their agencies, not corporations. Interest on municipal bonds is exempt from state and local income taxes in the areas in which they are issued. Because these bonds are tax-exempt, a municipality can offer an interest rate that is lower than that of a corporate bond.

The lower interest rate may be offset by receiving interest income that is tax-free. Your effective yield depends on your tax bracket. If you are in the 44 percent tax bracket, the yield on a 10 percent tax-exempt investment is equivalent to a taxable yield of 17.86 percent. A rule of thumb is that those in the 40 percent or higher tax bracket should be able to benefit by investing in a municipal bond rather than a corporate bond.

HROUGHOUT THE PAST few decades, there have been major tax changes nearly every year.

Well, it's about that time again. This year's revision promotes a very interesting twist. It successfully utilizes scare tactics on the tax-paying consumer. The initial result being the consumer is now more willing to pay

SO IS THIS new law for better or for worse? The answer, I believe, is not simply the few thousand in taxes each taxpayer will save or lose. Rather, the benefit will be based upon how the total

For starters, we have seen that as a result of tax law uncertainty during the past six months, new real estate construction has actually come to a halt; a major cause of our present stagnant

With the decreased tax benefits and other governmental subsidies afforded to investors, there is less incentive for investors to absorb the extra risks associated with new real estate construc-

Even if investors will be in a lower tax bracket and have more discretionary funds available to invest, they will seek investments which will generate more income and less tax benefits. Unfortunately, the early years of a new development will not generate the cash flow necessary to make it economically viable.

SINCE THERE WILL be less new developments, existing developments will command additional value. As a result, rental income will naturally increase, especially with tenants having more money at their disposal. Personally, I am strongly recommending that my clients participate in existing, income-producing real estate and not new construction.

Simply lowering taxes would further erode productivity by discouraging savings and investment. Without incentives to take securities like bonds, instead of riskier equity type investments having generally lower cash flow.


Likewise, with the main consumer shelter being the interest deduction for home mortgages, it would be a disaster if the average consumer couple refinanced their number one nest egg to the hilt just for the tax incentive. just for the deduction.



If you think you'd enjoy the risk associated with playing the stock market, you're not alone. Before you decide to join the ranks of the bulls or the bears, says the Michigan Association of CPAs, be sure you have a clear financial goal for the future. You should also understand the tax implications of investing in the stock market.

If some hard information persuades you that an industry is expanding, you may want to look into other companies in that same indus-One way to compare companies is by

looking at their price/earnings ratios.

The "P/E," which is listed in most newspapers with stock tables, tells you the price of a share of stock divided by earnings per share. For example, a stock selling for \$50 a share a earning \$5 per share is said to a P/E of 10. Stocks with lower P/Es generate higher long-term results.
