City postpones action on rezoning issue

The controversy surrounding plans to develop an industrial subdivision immediately west of the Meadowbrook Lake subdivision will continue awhile longer.

The Novi City Council voted 5-2 Monday (Nov. 3) to table consideration of a request to rezone the 49-acre parcel from its current I-1 (light industrial) classification to an R-4 (single-family residential) designation.

Purpose of the delay? To give a special subcommittee composed of Meadowbrook Lake residents, the property owners and city officials an opportunity to work out an amendment to the I-1 zoning district that would make the light industrial classification more acceptable to abutting property owners.

The tabling action was opposed by Council Members Nancy Covert and Arlen Schroeder.

Covert maintained that council's refusal to act on the rezoning re-

quest put the Meadowbrook Lake residents in a "Catch 22" situation.

"When we say we won't rezone it for residential use, we're putting these residents in the position of having to work out the best compromise possible for themselves," she charged. "I have a problem with that."

Schroeder opposed the motion to table action on the rezoning request on the grounds that he believed the proposed single-family classification should be approved.

"If I were living in one of those

houses over there (abutting the proposed industrial subdivision), I would look at this (proposed industrial subdivision) exactly as they're looking at it," he said. "If an industrial subdivision were proposed next to my neighborhood, my neighbors would be furious, too."

At issue is a proposal to develop a 25-lot industrial subdivision on a 49-acre parcel on the north side of Nine Mile. The parcel lies between the Meadowbrook Lake subdivision on the east and the C&O railroad tracks on the west.

Meadowbrook Lake residents are opposed to having industrial development immediately adjacent to their homes and have suggested that the property be rezoned to a residential classification, noting that a residential designation is proposed on the city's master plan for land use development.

Although the Novi Planning Commission had already recommended tentative preliminary plat approval for the industrial subdivision, the city council asked the commission to consider rezoning the property to

the residential classification due to the potentially adverse impact on a residential subdivision.

Both the planning commission and Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers have advised the council that the light industrial classification should be retained.

The council's decision to table consideration of the rezoning request came on the recommendation of Rogers who said he is working with a special subcommittee that

Voters reject charter change

Novi voters have rejected a proposed charter amendment that would change the way in which the city's mayor is elected.

Specifically, voters turned down the proposal by a margin of 3,220 to 1,971.

As a result, the citizens of Novi will continue to elect someone to serve as mayor every other year. The next mayoral election is slated for November 1987.

The proposed charter amendment called for the city council to elect one of its own members to serve as mayor for a two-year term. Under terms of the proposal, the general public would elect seven city council members, who in turn would select one of their own members to serve a two-year term as mayor.

Results rolled in slowly during Tuesday's general election.

In fact, Novi City Clerk Geraldine Stipp reported that not one of the city's 10 precincts had reported results as late as 10 p.m. — approximately the same time that Republican William Lucas was conceding victory in the gubernatorial race to incumbent Democrat James Blanchard.

In other races, Novi voters:
□ Backed William Broomfield's bid for re-election to his 18th District seat in the U.S. Congress. Broomfield received 4,441 votes to 1,883 for Democratic challenger Gary Kohut.

□ Gave Republican Frank Brock a narrow 3,350 to 3,217 edge over Democratic incumbent Jack Faxon

in the race for the 15th District seat in the State Senate.

□ Endorsed Willis Bullard's bid for re-election to the 60th District seat in the State House of Representatives. Bullard received 4,128 votes while Democratic challenger Marshall Spinner received 2,000 votes.

□ Gave Republican incumbent John Calandro a vote of support in his bid to win re-election to the 24th District seat on the Oakland County Board of Commissioners. Calandro received 4,086 votes, while Democrat Leo Foley was named on 2,022 ballots.

The vote totals are unofficial and represent only the Novi portion of the overall districts.

Some 7,201 of Novi's 17,705 registered voters showed up at the polls — a voter turnout of approximately 41 percent.

In Novi, voter rejection of the proposed charter amendment culminates a process which began after the November 1985 mayoral race in which current Mayor Patricia Karevich unseated former Mayor Robert Schmid.

Proponents of the charter proposal argued that having the mayor elected by the city council would, in effect, put the city in the same position as school boards throughout the state.

The proposed charter amendment was strongly opposed by two former mayors of the city — Schmid, who served from 1981-85, and Robert Daley, who served from 1973-75.

Tougher standards proposed to protect trees

When there's an "oops" at his appliance store, Ollie Fretter has an "oops" sale.

When a developer in Novi has an "oops" involving the restrictions of the city's Woodlands Protection Ordinance, City Council Member Edward Leininger believes there also should be an "oops" sale.

But instead of cutting prices, Leininger would like to double the fine for either intentional or unintentional removal of protected trees.

"We've had an incident in the city

just recently where some trees were removed 'by accident,'" said Leininger, referring to property adjacent to the Meadowbrook Glens subdivision.

"It's too easy for the fellows driving these machines to get too close to these trees and nick them enough to effectively destroy them," he said.

"There's an 'oops' here and an 'oops' there, and pretty soon you have a lot fewer trees than you thought you were getting. In case of an 'oops,' we should have some sort of double indemnity clause in the ordinance," maintained the council member.

Leininger made his comments during a review of proposed amendments to the Woodlands Protection at the Nov. 3 city council meeting.

Although the council did not add an "oops" clause as recommended by Leininger, it did grant consensus approval for the proposed amendments to be set for public hearing in order to add them to the ordinance.

Ernest Aruffo, chairman of the Woodlands Implementation Committee, told council that the committee has held 15 sessions to attempt to eliminate the loopholes in the existing Woodlands Ordinance. "Our committee has looked at a lot of hypothetical situations and

we've also take a lot of field trips to review actual conditions," said Aruffo. "I think we've finally got it (Woodlands Ordinance) in the condition you wanted it to be in when it was first adopted."

Aruffo also noted that the committee has received considerable citizen input. "It's remarkable the interest people have in preserving our woods... particularly when they hear the wood cutter at work next to their property," observed Aruffo.

The committee has proposed a total of 10 amendments to the Woodlands Ordinance. Those proposed amendments include:

□ Historic/Specimen Trees: The amendment provides procedures and criteria for designating historic and specimen trees.

□ No Tree Affidavit: The ordinance has been amended slightly to change the phrase "no tree verification" to "no tree affidavit."

□ Forest Management Use Permits: The proposal has been added to require a Forest Management Use Permit for professional forestry work.

□ Emergency Actions: The amendment provides an exception for emergency actions to protect public health or safety, or to prevent damage to property. Replace-

ment trees may be required when the tree damages exceed that necessitated by the emergency situation.

□ Use Permit Applications: Proposed are a number of changes relative to the information that must be provided with a use permit application site plan. One section has been revised to clarify the manner of noting tree locations on the site plan. Another section has been revised to indicate that permanent protection of remaining trees may be required. Another section requires that utilities be depicted on

The memorial contains more than 58,000 names of men and women who died, or are missing in action, in the Vietnam War.

The memorial will be on view from 2-9 p.m. Tuesday-Friday, Nov. 11-14, noon to 9 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 15, and noon to 5 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 16.

No admission will be charged.

Suspects nabbed on B&E charges

Two suspects in a breaking-and-entering case managed to elude a police barricade and then raced away from pursuing officers in a high-speed chase through rural Washtenaw County only to be arrested later that same day in Detroit's sixth precinct.

Facing charges are Timothy Tatum, 18, of Novi and Paul Puckett, 17, of Walled Lake. Both men were arraigned before a magistrate in Washtenaw County on charges of "breaking and entering of an occupied building with intent to commit larceny therein". Bail was set at \$2,000 cash or surety bond with 10 percent permitted.

Tatum posted bond and was released Wednesday, Oct. 29, while Puckett posted bond and was released Thursday, Oct. 30.

Pretrial examinations have been scheduled for both suspects. Police Chief Lee BeGole called the apprehension of the two suspects an outstanding example of police work.

The case began at approximately 10:15 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 27, when Novi Police Detective Ralph Fluhart received a telephone call from a friend who lives in Lyon Township.

includes representatives of both the proposed developers and homeowners to develop an amendment to the I-1 zoning ordinance.

"Our joint committee has been working on this for some time and it's our feeling that the I-1 district can be adopted to make it more acceptable," said Rogers.
"With one or two more working sessions, I believe we can amend the I-1 district to make it acceptable to both Meadowbrook Lake and the developers."

ments to the ordinance will provide for three tiers of uses in the industrial district. He said one tier of uses (research facilities, for example) would be permitted anywhere within the I-1 district. A second tier (warehousing and assembly halls) would be prohibited immediately adjacent to abutting residential. And a third tier (manufacturing operations) would be permitted even further away from abutting residential.

"We have agreements on a lot of issues, but there's still some disagreement on which uses are permitted in each tier," said Rogers. "Mr. Bowman thinks I've put too many uses in the 'no-no' district."

Areas of agreement include a reduction of maximum building heights from 40 to 25 feet and a prohibition on loading docks on exterior rear walls that face residential districts.

Although Covert and Schroeder favored the request to rezone the property to a residential classification, the rest of the council members indicated that they believed the property should retain its light industrial classification.

Mayor Patricia Karevich noted that approval of the rezoning would resolve the concerns of the Meadowbrook Lake residents, but would merely shift the problem of residential abutting industrial uses to the west.

"If we did rezone it, the people who would live in these new houses would be living next to the industrial uses which already exist on the west side of the railroad tracks," she said. "We'd merely be shifting the problem."

"If we are able to amend the I-1 zoning classification to make it more compatible with abutting residential uses, we'll be taking steps to address this problem which exists in 32 additional locations throughout the community," she added.

Council Member Ronald Watson expressed similar sentiments. "The direction to repair the I-1 district so that it can co-exist adjacent to residential is the proper way to go," he said. "I think it's possible to find residential-friendly uses in an I-1 district that will be compatible with abutting residential subdivisions."

The ultimate motion to table consideration of the zoning request to work on an amendment to the I-1 zoning classification was criticized by Covert who called it "a step backwards."

Covert's criticism prompted a strong rebuttal from Council Member Hugh Crawford. "It's certainly not a step backwards to permit a committee of citizens, developers and city officials to continue work toward a positive conclusion to their mutual concerns," he said.

QUESTION: How is hypertension (high blood pressure) diagnosed and can it be treated without the use of medication?

ANSWER: Although high blood pressure is easy to diagnose it often goes undiagnosed for years unless found in a routine blood pressure reading or physical examination. Hypertension seldom gives warning signs or symptoms.

Blood pressure can be lowered in a number of ways. If your pressure is only slightly high, lifestyle changes may be enough to bring it within the normal range; you may not need any medication.

The following are some self-help tips in the prevention and treatment of hypertension.

1. Lose weight if necessary.
2. No smoking.
3. Decrease salt in your diet.
4. Decrease fat in your diet.
5. Restrict alcohol consumption.
6. Restrict caffeine.
7. Get regular exercise.
8. Get regular medical check-ups.

If your blood pressure is not adequately controlled after reasonable efforts with life style changes, there should be no hesitation in proceeding directly to drug therapy.

Area Briefs

NEW HOME CONSTRUCTION is setting a record in West Bloomfield. The 979 residential permits issued in the first nine months of this year already exceed the 958 issued during all of 1985.

Township Building Director Russell Crites attributed the jump to construction of multiple housing units. Some 633 of the 979 permits issued were for multiple housing units.

AN INCREASE IN BURGLARIES is being reported in West Bloomfield Township for the first eight months of 1986. Crime reports show that burglaries are up 50 percent over the comparable period last year.

NO LEGAL OPPOSITION TO A TIFA DISTRICT for downtown Farmington will be initiated by the Farmington Public Schools. Although school officials did not offer a vote of confidence for establishment of the Downtown Development Authority (DDA), they voted a motion to initiate legal action against the City of Farmington's DDA on a 5-2 vote.

IMPROVED SECURITY FOR STUDENTS is needed in Southfield high schools to help prevent attacks on students which have surfaced again in recent weeks.

The man told Fluhart he had just received a call from his wife about a suspicious incident at their home.

"His wife told him that a young man had just come up to their door and asked directions to Johns Road," said Fluhart. "The woman was suspicious about the request, but managed to slammer out an answer and then watched the young man get back into the car with another individual."

"She came up with a very good description of the suspects and the vehicle they were driving, including the license plate number."

Fluhart said he has been investigating for quite some time a series of breaking-and-enterings which have a similar modus operandi in the north end of Novi and has developed a prime suspect and a good description of the suspect's car, including the license plate number.

"When the man mentioned the license plate number of the car that stopped by his house that morning, it set off an alarm in my head," said Fluhart. "I know my suspect's license plate number by heart, and the number of the car at the Lyon Township home was the same one

discovered the suspects had broken into the rear of the house and removed a large quantity of personal property from the interior."

"In light of the situation, we decided to attempt to make apprehension in our unmarked surveillance vehicles," said Fluhart.

As soon as the suspects left the residence, Fluhart radioed ahead to Officer Al Rasmussen who pulled his car across the road ahead of the suspects' vehicle to establish a roadblock.

"We were converging on the area from all directions, but the suspects spun around the roadblock, almost hitting Rasmussen in the process, and proceeded ahead at a high rate of speed," said Fluhart.

"The suspects were driving what appeared to be a high-powered Chevrolet Camaro, and all we had was our small-engine surveillance vehicles," Fluhart continued.

"It wasn't much of a contest. We managed to maintain sight of them for maybe two miles, but they were pulling steadily away from us and we lost sight of them on Napier Road and broke off the chase between 1 and 2 p.m."

Northville firm expands in new direction

Reef Mfg. breaks ground with calibration company

Northville manufacturer, inventor and community benefactor Jan Reef died a year and a half ago, but the company he founded, Reef Manufacturing, continues to grow.
On Nov. 1, Reef's widow Nelly was on hand for the ribbon-cutting ceremony marking the grand opening of the Reef Calibration Service. The new service is a stab at diversifying the already successful and highly respected gauge manufacturing business.
Reef's daughter Marge Cinader, one of the major supporters behind the expansion along with plant manager Mike Bishop, said her father would have been very supportive of the new service and that's one of the reasons the company has pursued the idea.
"He would have just loved it," she said. "He was in the inventing end of the business and never even mentioned anything about calibration, but if he were here today, he'd be in glory over all this."
Jan Reef, a native of the Netherlands, launched the Northville business in 1941, and ever since the company has manufactured the Reef gauge. The gauge is designed to measure the accuracy of materials used and manufactured by numerous industries, including the automotive and aircraft industries.

"The new calibration service is separate from the gauges, but it's all related," Cinader reported. "We just wanted to diversify and add to the gauging."
According to Bishop, who is in charge of the new service, the calibration can measure the accuracy of materials to the millionth of an inch. It has much more sophisticated measurement capabilities than the gauges.
"We plan to do dimensional calibration," Bishop explained. "It's the same field as the gauges, but a different area."
Bishop was certified in the Navy as a calibration specialist, and it was through coaxing from him that the board of directors at Reef decided to take his suggestion and expand the business.
"I was a laboratory technician in the Navy and, when I got out, I tried to find a job in the calibration area but the jobs were few and far between. I knew we had space in the warehouse and so I began talking with Marge (Cinader) about the possibilities. Before I knew it, it has materialized."
Cinader pointed out that an area of the existing warehouse wasn't being used, so it has been converted into a laboratory to handle the new service. As a result, no addition to the existing and aircraft industries.

Employee 'leasing' a new alternative for small businesses

Many small employers in Michigan, particularly in the southeast, have discovered an alternative to hiring a worker.

These business owners are turning to "employee leasing" to satisfy their human resources needs. Like most sound business practices, employee leasing is based on a simple concept—contract labor.

Michigan's employee leasing boom is the result of a seemingly endless barrage of non-productive, frequently governmentally-initiated regulations and paperwork. By contracting with an employee leasing company, small business owners shelter themselves from this barrage.

The way it works seems so simple it is hard to believe that nobody thought of it sooner. A small employer simply transfers his contract employees to the leasing company of his choice, then instantly leases them back. Now all the liabilities of being an employer rest with the leasing company.

"The concept of employee leasing is so simple that people have difficulty comprehending that it's legal," said Gregory Parker, president of Southfield's Amstaff, Inc. "Of course, it is legal, and many large

companies have used similar arrangements extensively over the past quarter century. As a matter of fact, the federal government is currently the largest leaser of workers in the country."

"Aside from the administrative problems that leasing can eliminate," Parker continued, "small companies also can access significantly better benefits for their workers. Since the leasing company purchases benefits on a much larger scale, the per capita cost is significantly reduced."

Parker said Amstaff, Inc., currently provides medical, dental, life, vision and \$3 prescription cards to its workers. In addition, everyone is eligible to participate in a 401-k salary reduction pension plan and direct deposit of pay. 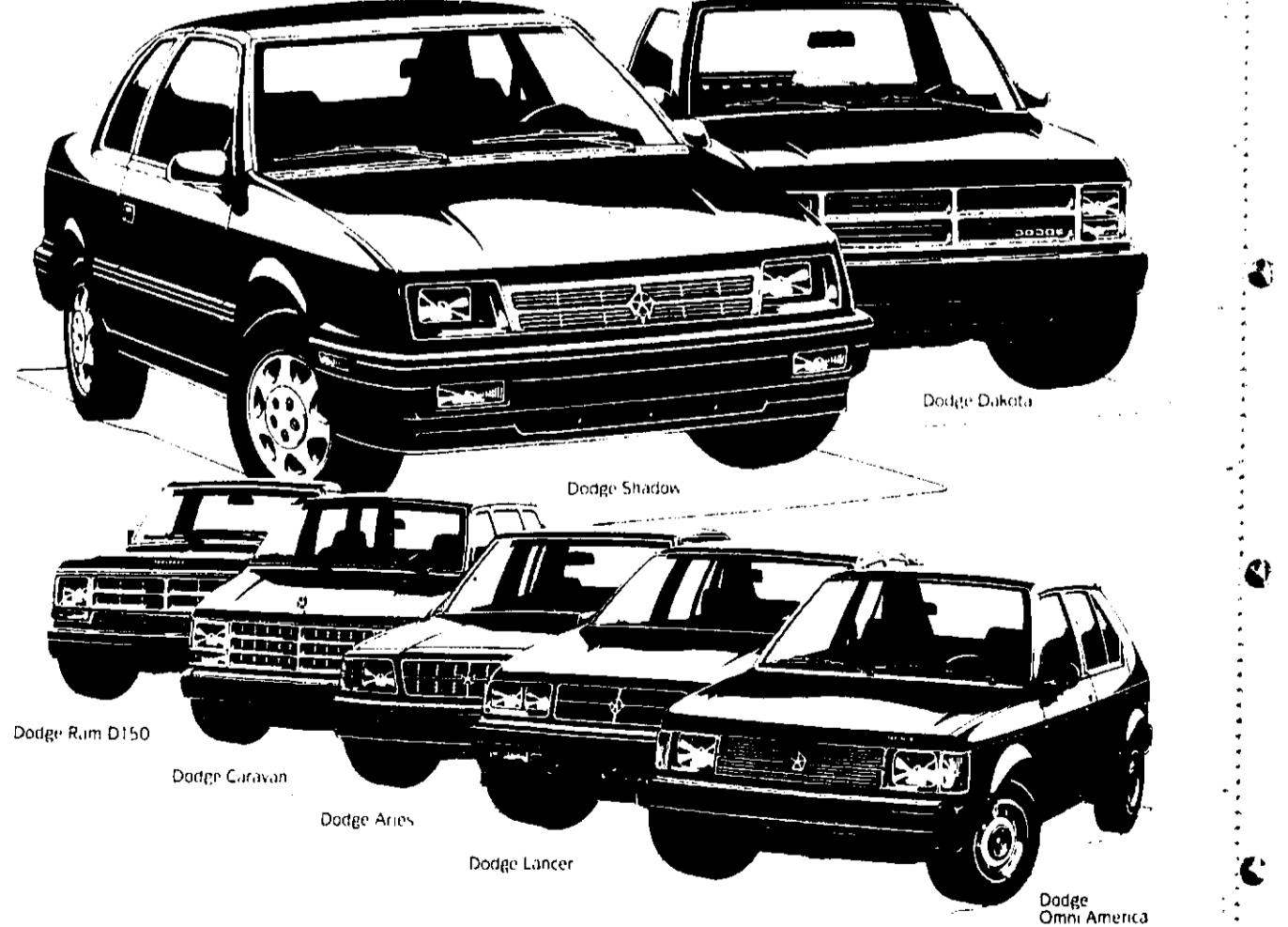

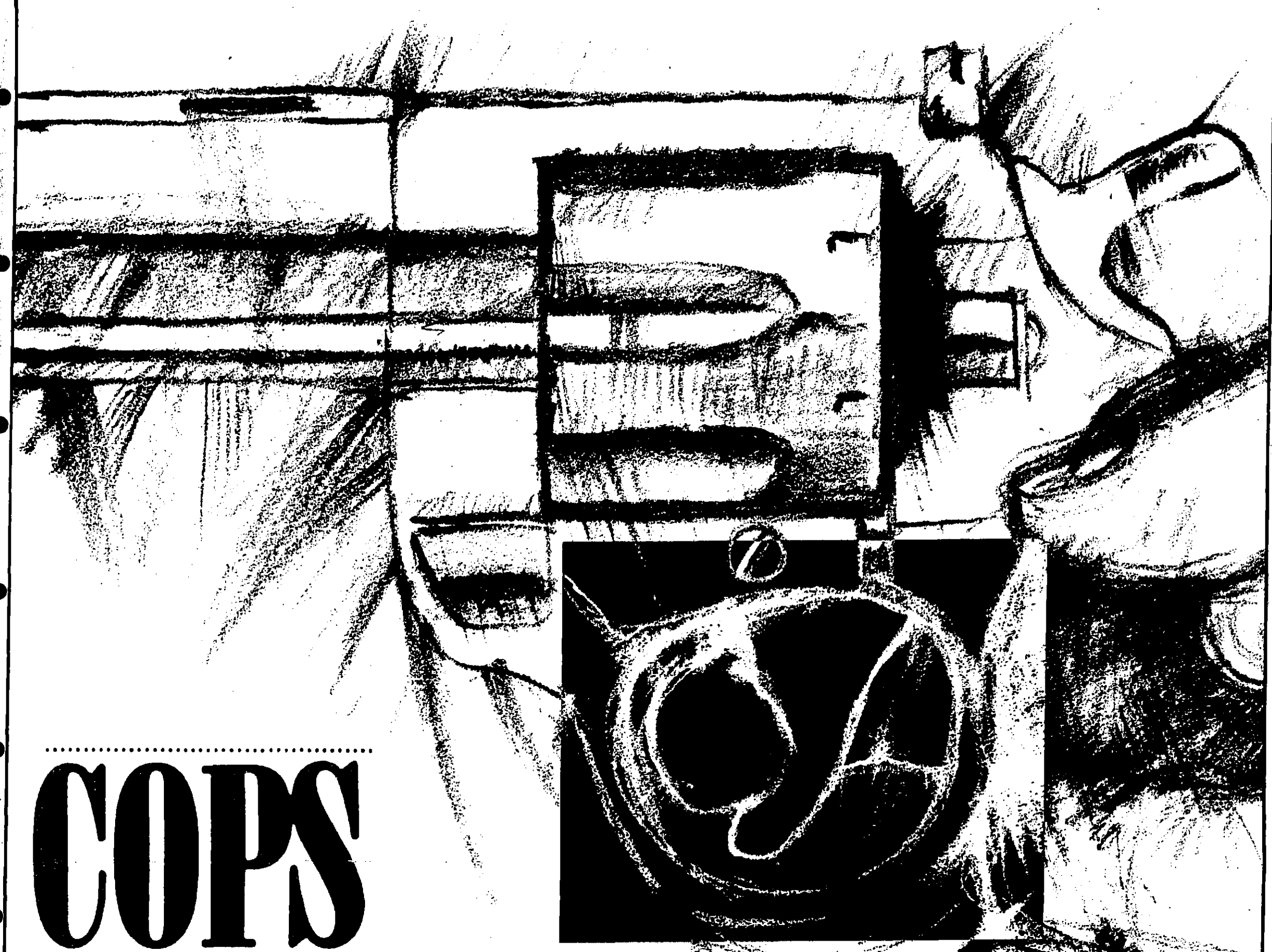

COPS & GUNS

Revolver is a necessary but seldom-used tool of the trade

"You're a big man when you've got that gun."

It's a phrase police officers don't hear very often . . . and hear too often.

"It sort of gets under your skin when somebody says something like that," commented one local police officer recently. "It's like they're challenging you."

"They don't understand the role of a gun in police work. They don't understand that the last thing a cop wants to do is have to take that gun out of its holster."

"Some people have the impression police are gun happy . . . that they get a kick out of carrying that gun around on their hips all day. But that's simply not the case. In fact, the opposite is true."

"The basic rule is that you only take the gun out of its holster to protect your own life or to protect somebody else's life."

"Plus, whenever you take the gun out of the holster, you're prepared to use it. It's sort of a last resort."

How often do local law enforcement officers use their guns? Have they ever been shot at? What is the role of the gun in police work?

We decided to ask four local police officers those questions and others. Officers were selected at random from the Novi, Northville and Northville Township police departments as well as the Michigan State Police Post in Northville. No effort was made to seek out officers who may have been involved in shooting incidents at one time or another during their careers.

The following story is comprised of the answers we received when we asked cops to talk about their guns:

LT. ROBERT STARNES
Novi Police Department

Bob Starnes has been an officer with the Novi Police Department more than 20 years. He currently serves as commander of the road patrol.

"Honestly, I don't recall any of our officers . . . wait, I have to retract a little of that. We use our guns when responding to B&E alarms or B&Es in progress. We'll use them for that. But as far as pointing them at somebody, it's strictly taboo."

"The only time our officers use their guns is at the (shooting) range, and even there it's strictly, strictly supervised."

"I just don't recall a time that any of our officers have ever used their guns in the line of . . . No, there was an incident several years ago. Remember the hold-up at the bank on Novi Road near 'Twelve Oaks'? The robber was holding the bank manager hostage. Several officers responded to the call — McGregor, Jelly, and Jelly had his opportunity to fire off a shot and he took it."

"As soon as he fired, the robber threw his gun to the ground and gave up. Released the manager. He apparently didn't expect the officer to shoot."

"That was a case where it was totally justified. Bank robbery. Federal offense. Citizen held captive. Clear shot."

"There was a big embankment behind the robber and the hostage. The only place the bullet could have gone was into the embankment. The one shot the officer took was sufficient to do the job and end the crisis. I'm sure he (the robber) heard the bullet going by him."

"We would never even consider shooting a gun if the bullet might hit a bystander. We don't even fire warning shots. Whenever your shot your gun, the bullet has to go somewhere. If you shoot a round into the air, it's going to come down some place. Even when you shoot at the ground, there's a chance the bullet could hit a rock and ricochet."

"T.V. hypes things up so much. In a one-hour T.V. show, it seems like Don Johnson fires off several hundred rounds. Many officers go through their entire careers without ever firing a shot in the line of duty . . . many without ever taking the gun out of their holsters."

"There's absolutely no horseplay with a gun. Never. You'll never see an officer practicing quick draws. As the commanding officer, if I walk into the squad room and see horseplay with a gun, the officer will be immediately suspended. Guns are dangerous."

"You have to understand police. A gun is nothing more to a police officer than a hammer is to a carpenter. It's a tool of the trade. It's like building a house, you can't do your job without it. At the end of the day, he puts his gun away just like the carpenter puts away his hammer."

"I personally have had my gun out of its holster only once in the line of duty. A few years ago we had a call about some kids . . . not kids, people in their early 20s . . . trying to cash in some money at the Novi Road Big Boy. And they had a gun. I was in a one-man unit and drove over behind the restaurant — and there they were. There was a guy standing there with a gun."

"Obviously, my first thought was to disarm him. I pulled my gun out for a grand total of maybe five seconds. Just long enough to get his gun. Then mine went right back in the holster."

"That's the safest place for it."

SGT. GARY CALLENDER
Northville Police Department

Gary Callender has been an officer with the Northville Police Department for 12 years.

"I've drawn my gun on many occasions. I think all our officers have because you don't know what type of situation you are going to get into, especially on bank alarms or B&Es in progress. Certain instances it's only intelligent to pull the weapon prior to going in, but I've never shot at anyone."

"I've only been shot at once. The call came in to back up Novi police. There was a mental patient with a gun in the woods. I was walking on the railroad tracks on Novi Road, just north of Eight Mile, and the guy took a shot at me. It whizzed by my head. He popped up and threw the gun down so there was obviously no need to neutralize him."

"There wasn't a whole lot I could do to him because his story was that he was shooting at a rabbit and the bullet ricocheted off the creek by my head."

"That was the only time, but once is enough. I spent 13 months in Vietnam so I know what a round sounds like when it goes by your head."

"Sometimes pointing the gun at somebody is an absolute necessity, but we never have it in a cocked position. We train this so there are no accidental misfires. I won't point it at anyone unless I have reason to use lethal force."

"I am a firearms range instructor, and I think work at the range is great. We do night-fire, we do day-fire, we do on-duty, off-duty, shotgun, rifle — whatever weapons we have in this department we train each officer."

"To our department and most others, warning shots are prohibited. The problem with it is if you shoot a warning shot up in the air it has to come down somewhere and, with policemen's luck, it's going to wind up in somebody's head."

"About one percent of what you see on T.V. is maybe true. The best T.V. show was probably Barney Miller. Contrary to popular belief, it's not all glamor. We go on some really ugly rounds like accident runs, death runs, things like that. On T.V., they are involved in a shooting and back on the streets in 10 minutes. In reality, when you shoot at somebody and hit them, you are automatically, without any questions, suspended. They have to have a full investigation before you are cleared."

"One of the craziest shows I ever saw was Adam 12 — they were involved in two or three shootings, a couple of breaking and enterings in progress and an armed robbery, all in a half-hour. But if televi-

sion actually showed what police work is like, you'd be bored. Nobody would watch it."

"Having a gun is a necessity due to the fact I don't know if the 'bad guy' got one. If I knew they didn't have one, I wouldn't wear one."

SGT. JOHN SHERMAN
Northville Township Police

Sgt. John Sherman has been an officer with the Northville Township police department for 10 1/2 years. He currently is in charge of firearm training for the department, officer-in-charge of the special operations team (SOT) and coordinator of the reserve officers training program.

"It would be extremely regrettable if a police officer killed someone with his weapon, but when an officer pulls his firearm, he is doing nothing more than taking the final step toward stopping an aggressive action."

"I have never shot anyone, but I have pulled my firearm — a department-issued Smith and Wesson Model 65 — on a number of occasions."

they do it right, somebody should get freed up — it was Joe (Miskovich)." Novi took advantage of a fumbled punt just before the half to score the game's first points, and added the second touchdown to take a 12-0 lead early in the third quarter after a poor Northville punt gave them good field position. The Mustangs scored the final points after a long drive midway through the fourth quarter. It all set the stage for the final-second heroics.

"It was probably our best game," Schumacher said. "I was extremely pleased with the way the kids played, but we just couldn't finish it off. Our players are extremely disappointed because they honestly felt they could win the ball game — it was very heartbreaking."

The first quarter went according to plans with Novi moving the ball offensively and stopping Novi cold on defense. But the Cats hurt themselves with penalties and mistakes, and the Mustangs held on. "During that span we sort of got lulled to sleep," Osborne said. "Then all of the sudden things got turned around and the longer the game went on, the more confident they got."

Northville put together a 66-yard drive in the second quarter, with the aid of a roughing the kicker call against Novi. With a first and goal at the 14, Mustang quarterback Scott Stevens tossed an interception to Neil Garry in the end zone. Ironically, it was Garry who was flagged for the roughing penalty that kept the drive alive.

With time running out in the half, Novi got a big break and capitalized. Matt Hubert fumbled a Wildcat punt and Jason Korte pounced on the loose ball at the Northville 43 with less than two minutes remaining. On fourth down, Novi quarterback Jeff Tanderys hit Scott Wladishkin with a clutch 27-yard pass that moved the ball to the 16 with 21 seconds left. Tanderys then connected to flanker Brian Schram on the next play for the T.D.

"We knew when (Novi) gets in close, they like to go to Schram because he has good height and jumping ability," Schumacher said. "I'm convinced we had it defended very well, he was double-teamed and just made a nice play."

Mike McGuffin's point-after attempt was blocked by Jeff Hamilton

and the half ended at 6-0.

Novi scored again in the third quarter after a high snap led to a 17-yard Mustang punt and gave the Wildcats the ball on the Northville 36. Randy Parker snared a 20-yard pass from Tanderys on a third down play and tight end Bill Yankowski caught the touchdown pass over the middle from 13 yards out. Again, the quick Novi strike ended on a sour note as the two-point conversion attempt failed.

The Mustang scoring drive started at their own 25 and was kept alive by a pass interference penalty against the Wildcats. With just less than seven minutes left in the game, Sylvestre bolted into the end zone untouched on a 10-yard quarterback bootleg, then kicked the extra point to narrow the gap to 12-7.

The Northville defense held Novi in check down the stretch and gave the offense possession two more times. With 1:41 left on the clock, the Mustangs started at their own 25 and drove down the field.

Wildcat defender Matt Kamish dropped a potential game-ending interception early in the drive. And Sylvestre kept the drive alive with three clutch pass completions. On fourth-and-11 at the 42, he hit Mike Yard for 30 yards down to the Novi 28. On the next play, Greg Kozler caught a 16-yard sideline pass moving it down to the 12 with 40 seconds left. Hubert then grabbed the third throw, eluded a couple of tacklers and was upended by Wildcat defensive back Dave Senkbell just two yards from victory. "He was upset about the dropped

punt and tried everything humanly possible to score the winning touchdown," Schumacher said about Hubert. "I give the kid a lot of credit."

After an incomplete pass that stopped the clock, Miskovich sacked Sylvestre to end the game.

"Northville had a great night," Osborne said. "To their credit, after we had them 12-0, they never quit. Their defense shut us down and played very well. (Mustang linebacker) Tony Briningstool is an exceptional player."

Mustang runner Mike Yard over-shadowed Novi's 1,000-yard rusher Joel Finzel by gaining 77 yards in 19 carries. Finzel was held below 100 yards for only the second time this season with 61 yards on 23 carries.

Hansen reflects on back-to-back KVC net titles

Looking back, Jim Hansen is very proud of his team's two consecutive Kensington Valley Conference (KVC) titles.

The coach of the Novi Wildcat tennis team is hard-pressed, however, to put one ahead of the other. But Hansen readily admits it's the type of dilemma he doesn't mind facing.

So far, in nearly one and a third seasons of league play, Hansen stands head and shoulders above his Wildcat coaching counterparts with two KVC titles. The only other coach with a title is football coach John Osborne.

"I'm happy for both teams," he said. "This one (1986) had only four players who had a full year of varsity tennis experience — the other six came from the J.V.'s and did an excellent job. We weren't the favorites like we were last season. A year ago (1985), we were expected to win, but sometimes it's very hard to get the first one."

Although it's not a contest between coaches, Hansen's success is an indication of how rarely two KVC championships come along. As any coach will admit, two in a row is very difficult.

Novi's 8-3 overall record and 7-2 league mark for the season are very impressive, but Hansen believed the team was capable of turning out wins like that.

"It's an excellent record, but I thought heading in that we had a chance to do well," he said. "The whole season came down to a win over Milford in a dual meet and finishing first in the KVC Meet. Everybody hit when they had to hit, and we somehow managed to slip by Milford and win (the KVC title)."

Singles players Judy Piotrowicz, Laura Maloney and Kathy Belor were all instrumental in the successful season, especially when tournament time rolled around. Piotrowicz had a fine 10-2 mark against league opponents at second singles and then finished second at second singles in the KVC Meet. For the last two years, the

junior has a combined record of 25-7, a pretty high winning percentage.

"Judy played well for us, but I was counting on her," Hansen said. "She was very consistent and generally a sure bet to help us score points."

Maloney (8-4 mark in KVC) and Belor (7-6) didn't have as impressive numbers, but both peaked at the end of the season to provide some key wins in the drive for the title.

"They both played their best at the end of the year and if it wasn't for either one's efforts, we couldn't have won the title," Hansen pointed out.

The top doubles team of Michele Benoit and Sandy Bragg were without a doubt the league's top team. They grabbed the KVC title at first doubles, went undefeated in league play (11-0) and were the perennial top seed.

"They were one of the best doubles teams in the KVC that I've seen in my three years as coach," Hansen said. The second doubles squad of Kim Dasher and Lisa

Latham were also among the KVC elite and proved it in the league championships. In three sets they upended Milford's top-seeded duo to grab the Wildcats' second flight title. Dasher was 12-0 against KVC opponents and Latham, slowed by injuries much of the campaign, was 6-0.

"Kim had three different partners because of Lisa's injuries and she blended well with all of them," Hansen noted.

Perhaps the biggest surprise was the play of Angel Ianni and Michelle Marckwardt at third doubles. Up until the end of the regular season, these two were rotated in every other meet with Renee Lindow and Lisa Kramer, but came on full time in post season play and staged two key upsets.

"We had a great year because all the players seemed to rise to the occasion when the pressure was really on," Hansen said.
