(council sends back office project

Plans for the development of an office complex on a 90-acre site at the corner of Twelve Mile and Meadowbrook roads came to a halt Monday when city council sent a proposal for a rezoning of the land back to the planning commission for further study

The Trammell Crow Company, developers of the Town Center project, had petitioned the council for a zoning change from RC (regional center) and RA (residential agricultural) to an OSC, office, service, commercial area.

Developer Craig Manske told council that Trammell Crow considers the office project the perfect complement to the Twelve Oaks

The proposed office complex would have five story buildings circling the 32-acre lake on the site. Two access roads would be built out to Meadowbrook Road, which would carry traffic from the mall and the office center, relieving congestion on Twelve Mile, Manske

Council members agreed that office development was the most appropriate use for the land, providing a buffer from the high density commercial area to proposed residential development north of

Twelve Mile. Council member Martha Hoyer expressed concern over the use of five story buildings east of Meadowbrook Road, as well as the gerrymandered approach to rezoning. The land Trammell Crow is petitioning for rezoning abuts residential property that is not a part of this petition.

Manske told the council it was his understanding that since he could not ask for a rezoning of land he did not own, the planning commission recommended to council the rezoning process be started on the other parcels to bring them into conformity.

The council voted 4-3 to send the issue back to the planning commission with the council's comments. Planning commission members were charged with bringing the proposal back with complete information regarding Master Plan zoning proposals for the surrounding

Tank's tree

Novi pine tree goes to Lansing

There weren't many trees on the property when Louis and Alice Tank moved onto their small farm on

Nine Mile some 35 years ago. Today, the Tank's farm is filled with many fine

specimens of trees. And one of them has been selected by the State of Michigan to stand in the courtyard of the \$43 million state library complex currently under construction in Lansing.

The Tank's 45-foot Michigan white pine was moved from its home on Nine Mile and transported to Lansing last week. The tree was placed in the "Courtyard of the Counties" during ceremonies on Monday.

According to Paul Scharette, a public information officer in the Michigan Secretary of State's office, plans call for the white pine to be located in the courtyard adjacent to the three buildings which are currently under construction.

"We wanted a white pine because that's the official state tree, and we assigned the task of finding it to Edwin E. Irish who owns a nursery service in Warren.

Irish found the Tank's tree through the help of John Brugeman, who also resides on Nine Mile. Brugeman was aware of the trees on the Tank property and informed Irish that the couple owned several magnificent trees, including the white pine that was being

Although the state offered to purchase the tree, the Tanks donated it to the state for use in the Courtyard of the Counties.

The Tanks were particularly proud to have one of their trees selected because they planted virtually all the trees on their property shortly after moving to

"It was just cornfields when we moved out here,"

recalled Mrs. Tank. "We went up to the Cottage Gardens Nursery in Lansing and purchased a lot of seedlings which we planted all over the property.

"My husband and I along with our children have planted more than 2,000 trees on this property. You'd never guess there was a time when there weren't any trees here if you were to see it today."

Mrs. Tank also reported that her husband had at one time considered starting a nursery business. Because of his interest in trees, the process of moving the tree from Novi to Lansing was particularly interesting to

Workers began the process of preparing the tree for

the move almost four weeks ago. "They (the state) would call up every morning and said we could expect to see workers out here during the day," sald Mrs. Tank.

"After they got the root-ball dug out, they encased the whole thing in concrete so it would be able to withstand the trip to Lansing."

The root-ball was some 13-feet in diameter. Needless to say, a crane had to be used to lift the cementencased root-ball and tree from the Tank farm onto the truck that carried it to Lansing.

The tree was placed in its current home during ceremonies in Lansing on Monday. The Tank's daughter and granddaughter were in attendance, but the people who planted the white pine 35 years ago were unable to attend.

"They offered to send a car for us, but we don't get around as well as we used to," said Mrs. Tank. "Lou had a stroke and I had eye surgery recently, so we just weren't able to make it.''

State officials did send the Tanks a videotape of the tree-planting ceremonies in Lansing, however.

"It's very gratifying," said Mrs. Tank. "We think it's wonderful that they would want one of our trees.'

Crimes up 21 percent in Novi

Serious crime in Novi is up 21.7 percent through the first nine months of the year, according to statistics released by the Novi Police Department.

The largest statistical increase is in aggravated assaults which rose 42.1 percent through the first nine months of '986 compared with the same period last year. Some 27 aggravated assaults have been reported so far this year as opposed to the 19 incidents recorded during the comparable 1985 period.

The single largest numerical increase, however, was in the area of larcenies which increased 26.2 percent. There were 1,031 larceny reports through September of this year - some 214 more than the 817 incidents logged during the first nine months of 1985.

Crime statistics are logged under two categories — Part I and Part II incidents.

Part I crimes are more serious in nature, including homicide, criminal sexual conduct, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary. larceny, motor vehicle theft and ar-

Part II crimes include forgery, fraud, embezzlement, vandalism, weapons law violations, prostitution/vice, gambling, narcotics, drunk driving, disorderly conduct and vagrancy.

Although larcenies are the most prevalent Part I crime in Novi,

New grant for project approved

In response to the increase of criminal activity throughout the city, a crime prevention officer will be added to the Novi Police Department by Jan. 1.

The Novi City Council approved a crime prevention grant at its Dec. 15 meeting. The grant will cover 50 percent of the total \$50,000 cost of the program.

Assistant City Manager Craig Klaver called the grant "probably the most important grant we've received over the years."

The crime prevention officer position is a specialized one, with the officer given that permanent position, rather than a rotating assignment. The officer will be responsible for coordinating programs with members of the community.

Klaver told the council that community interest in the program was readily apparent after over 150 people attended a crime prevention meeting last week.

Eight current officers have applied for the position and will undergo written and oral testing this week. Klaver told the council that everything will be done to see that the crime prevention officer, and a replacement officer for the department, will be hired by Jan. 1.

Captain Richard Faulkner of the Novi Police Department said, "A crime prevention program is very essential for every police department now. We must take a proactive rather than a reactive stance against crime."

Faulkner outlined the goals of the new position:

☐ To improve police/community relations through informing and educating the citizens of crime problems and their responsibilities in relation to these problems.

☐ To organize citizen groups to become involved and participate in local crime prevention projects.

☐ To reduce the incidence of burgiary and other related crime through citizen participation with the formation of such programs as Neighborhood Watch.

☐ To establish a program for citizens to assist police in the apprehension and prosecution of criminals by becoming the eyes and ears of the police department.

Faulkner said that the project will target burglary, larceny, auto theft, robbery and rape as crimes that citizen involvement and awareness can prevent.

"This was one of the most difficult projects I've ever been involved in." City Manager Edward Kriewall said

The battle began in 1979 when city planners realized that a road system would be needed on the west side of Novi Road if development was ever to take place. Because the land was prime frontage directly across from Twelve Oaks and next to the freeway, development of the parcels was inevitable.

The city declared the land a special assessment district and designed a roadway network to enclose the assemblage of parcels into a larger development.

The first burdle planners faced was a civil suit filed against the special assessment district. The suit eventually went all the way to the State Supreme Court before the city shifted gears and redesigned the area last year. The suit was subsequently dropped.

A search then began for funding of the \$1.453 million project. Some \$400,000 from a county grant and a Job's Bill grant paid for half of the cost of the new ramp. County Commissioner John Colandro is credited y Kriewall for obtaining much of the grant money.

Kriewall also traveled to Washington to obtain a design waiver from the Federal Highway for construction of the special

"This road system is almost critical to the movement of traffic n that area," Kriewall said. "It won't be as noticeable this year, but next year it will be the key to getting traffic back in there. In addition to the road construc-

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES DECREASED 23 PERCENT in the City of Farnington during the first nine months of 1986, but vandalism rose 56 percent

and drug violations nearly doubled. Public safety officials attributed the reduction in neighborhood burglaries to the city's three-year-old Neighborhood Watch program, which now has more than 50 percent participation from city residents.

The higher vandalism figures are due to several incidents in the city during 1986 when 30 to 40 vehicle windows were shattered with BB guns or slingshots. A similar spree of vandalism occurred in Novi at the same time

THE CLUSTER HOUSING CONCEPT, under attack from West Bloomfield Township residents, is being defended by the township's planners, who pioneered single-family cluster housing in the early 1970s.

Homeowners recently jammed a planning commission meeting to object to a cluster housing development proposed on a 69-acre site. Homeowners said they believed the clusters would lower their property values and result n increased need for township services.

Township Planning Director Thomas Bird(responded that clusters have greater or comparable (market) value than conventionally platted subdivi-

Township Assessor Robert Brandmier reported no detrimental effects on housing values due to the use of the cluster option. "When they put in a cluster, they're creating their own environment with landscaping and the use of amenities appealing to the purchaser," said Brandmier. He added that many cluster homes are worth \$225,000 and more.

STUDENTS FROM PRIVATE SCHOOLS are transferring into the Birm-Ingham Public School District at approximately twice the rate that students are leaving to enroll in private or parochial schools.

According to figures released by the Birmingham Public School District, some 229 students returned to public schools and 98 transferred out this year. Birmingham Superintendent Roger Garvelink said he hopes the trend means the quality of Birmingham's entire school program is getting better. Officials from non-public schools suggest other factors may figure in the trend. Those factors include higher tuitions at non-public schools, tougheracademic standards in private schools which make it harder to meet college; entrance requirements and improved public relations.

That "master plans are not written in concrete" is a cliche.

Unfortunately, the phrase is often over-used, or misused, to suit the special interests of the individual asking that master plans be revised.

Still, the phrase is a valid one because master plans, regardless of how well they are devised, must be flexible documents in order to accommodate any number of changes that may occur over time.

Novi's City Council currently is confronted with a proposal to amend its master plan which appears to be worthy of sperious consideration.

The Trammell Crow Company has asked the council to deviate from its master plan to permit development of a major office complex on a 90-acre parcel in Section 14 — the one-square mile of land which already includes Twelve Oaks Mall and the Woodland Medical Center. The office complex is proposed to be developed near the southwest corner of the Twelve Mile/Meadowbrook Road intersection.

A preliminary development proposal calls for the proposed office buildings to be situated around a 32acre lake — better than one-third of the overall 90-acre parcel.

A deviation from the master plan will be required for the development to take place, however, because the property currently is proposed on the master plan for multiple-family

Although the council has sent Trammell Crow's rezoning request back to the planning commission for further consideration, the majority of the council members appear receptive to deviating from the master plan to permit the project.

Council's apparent receptiveness is based on several considerations.
