60,000 by year 2010 in Novi?

In 1910, people living in Novi could count on recognizing one another. That's because in 1910 there were 1,226 people living here. In 1987 you may have trouble recognizing your neighbor. There are 28,000 people who call Novi home today, and, according to one set of predictions, there will be 69,000 people in Novi by the year 2010.

That, at any rate, is the prediction of City Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers who released a "Population Study and Forecast Report" to the planning commission at its April 1 session. Rogers had been working on the study for four months in conjunction with an update of the city's Master Plan.

Except for a decrease in growth rate during the 1960s, Rogers found that there has been an increasing rate of growth in Novi every decade. "Having a strong tax base, good schools and a progressive civic image, the City of Novi can expect to have further population growth," Rogers noted in his report. The expected increases are due, Rogers said, to the city's strategic location, available developable land, utilities and proximity to jobs and shopping.

The report indicated the city is nearly one-third developed. "Most housing is found in the southeast quadrant of the city with emerging new subdivisions in the west central part. Older housing surrounds Walled Lake homes in many instances converted from resort summer use. The city's five mobile home parks are generally at the edges of the city," according to the report.

Rogers found that approximately 52 percent of the city's population

stabbing victim leaves police with questions

Police have a lot of unanswered questions about an apparent stabbing victim found at the Speedway gas station at the corner of Ten Mile and Novi Road shortly before 10 p.m. on Wednesday, April 1.

The victim — Jackie Ray Bennett, 40, of Canton — was transported by ambulance for treatment of the stabbing wounds to Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills. He was admitted in critical condition and underwent surgery for the wounds.

Hospital personnel said Tuesday that Bennett's condition is currently listed as "stable."

In the meantime, police are having a tough time piecing together the events that led to Bennett's arrival at the Ten Mile/Novi Road intersection with multiple knife wounds in his chest late Wednesday night.

Sgt. Richard Howe of the Wixom Police Department is heading up the investigation because Bennett initially reported that the stabbing occurred in Wixom.

"We really don't know too much at this point," said Howe. "About the only information we have to go on is what the victim has told us. The problem is that he has given us conflicting information."

"At one time he said he was stabbed in Wixom and on another occasion he said he was abducted in Wixom and taken to Novi where the stabbing occurred."

"Until his condition improves, we're not going to be able to gain a great deal of information," said Howe. "At this point we don't know if it was a Wixom crime or a Novi crime."

The case began when two residents observed Bennett outside his car at the Ten Mile/Novi Road Speedway station at 9:48 p.m. on April 1.

Novi police were summoned to the scene to investigate what appeared to be a personal-injury accident, but discovered that Bennett had been stabbed in the chest upon their arrival.

Responding officers found Bennett lying on the hood of his car, a 1979 Ford Thunderbird, and bleeding heavily from the chest. The car was found facing west and resting against a traffic sign on the southeast corner of the intersection. The vehicle was still in drive, according to police.

Bennett initially told officers he had been stabbed at the Wixom Bar, but later said the stabbing occurred at the Wixom Food Market and he was trying to get away from the people who wanted his money, according to reports.

Novi police said Bennett was employed in the trim department at the Ford Motor Company's Wixom Assembly Plant. They contacted the plant where supervisors reported that Bennett had left for a break at approximately 9 p.m. and never returned.

Census says 28,000 live in Novi

It's not just your imagination. There are a lot more people living in Novi, and the preliminary mid-decade census figures prove it.

There are slightly over 28,000 people living in Novi, according to City Clerk Geraldine Slipp, who coordinated the census. That's a 22 percent increase over the 22,528 people counted in the 1980 census.

The rise in population will mean as much as an additional \$300,000 a year to the city through the state shared revenue fund, reported Finance Director Les Gibson. The money will go into the city's general fund and can be used for most city services, including, police, fire and administration.

The state has indicated the new figure will be put into the revenue sharing formula this July, but a check will not be sent to the city for the additional money until July 1988. "We are anticipating it, though," Gibson said. "We have put it in the budget process." He noted it will be a welcome addition to the city's coffers.

The mid-decade census was undertaken to prove to the state that Novi's population had increased by at least 15 percent from the 1980 census. A budget amendment for \$25,000 was approved for the project. "It was well worth the expense," Slipp noted.

The figures are preliminary, due to the state requirement that "checkers" verify information at 40 addresses in each district. In addition, Pat Loder, the chief enumerator for the project, will check voter registration and assessment roles to make sure every address has been counted.

In addition to an increase in state revenue, Novi stands to gain some additional liquor licenses. The number of licenses each community receives is based on the formula of one license for every 1,500 people. A special census was held in 1984 at which time 24,273 people were counted. The new licenses will be issued on the approximately 3,727 people who have been added since that time.

Marchak takes on board incumbents

Former teacher and active school volunteer Sally Marchak will challenge school board incumbents Michael Meyer and Stephen Hitchcock in their bids for re-election to the Novi Board of Education in the annual school election June 8.

Only three petitions were returned to the superintendent's office by the 4 p.m. Monday filing deadline. Candidates have until 4 p.m. today to withdraw from the race.

Marchak, an Echo Valley resident, is a member of the Novi Woods PTO curriculum council and the Novi Upper Elementary PTO gifted and talented committee.

"The mother of three school-age children, she also serves as a liaison between the administration and parents of gifted and talented students."

"I've been very involved in all kinds of activities in Novi," said the 12-year Novi resident. "I feel I know a lot about Novi."

"Though she was not a member of the citizens' task force on school facilities, Marchak has attended the board meetings, workshops and the public hearing regarding the district's facilities."

She voiced concern about the district's six-project bond issue proposal, noting that the addition of an administration building could discourage voters from approving the package.

"The basic reason it was presented has gone awry," she said of the facilities task force report calling for more classrooms.

Incumbent Michael Meyer, seeking his second four-year term to the board, said last month that he believes he has "more to offer the Novi School District."

He noted that his four years on the board "have been years of high achievement for the schools in Novi"

Dean and Julie Rotterdam run separate businesses out of the same shop in Milford

Pizzaz combines jewelry, fashion

Family businesses have been commonplace throughout history — one family, one business.

But in today's society, jeweler Dean Rotterdam and his wife, Julie, a fashion retailer, find that one family can run two separate businesses and do it all under one roof.

When Dean's highly successful Pizzaz jewelry store outgrew its original 5,000 square-foot shop at the Village Center Mall in downtown Milford, Julie decided it was time to relocate her Farmington Hills-based Painted Egos boutique as well.

She thought Milford would be a good location, especially after the enormous response she received during her participation as a merchant in Milford's 1986 summer sidewalk sale.

As a result, the two businesses moved down the street to the new Allen's Center, but did not technically merge.

"We share the rent," quipped Julie of their new 20,000 square-foot quarters. She adds that everything in the store is kept separate — from the accounting books to the selling space on the floor.

"People sometimes get confused when they come in to buy a ring, then

see a pair of shoes they like as well and find out they have to write two separate checks," said Dean.

The Livonia couple, who have been married 2 1/2 years, did all the major interior construction themselves, aside from some electrical wiring. For four months they labored, sometimes working until 1 or 2 a.m.

"Basically, we built it from scratch," recalled Dean.

The store's contemporary look of rounded display cases and cool lavender color schemes reflects Julie's fondness for art deco. "Julie designed it all. She has great taste," Dean said.

Decorating was completed by Dec. 1, 1986, and the new combined location opened in grand style with a black-tie and champagne celebration for nearly 300 guests.

Both Pizzaz and Painted Egos are discount operations which offer 20-60 percent off retail prices daily on all merchandise, as well as special sales.

Pizzaz offers loose diamonds and gems at low rates and sells gold chain by weight.

Tornado!

Education's key when storm hits

Kaufman said this time of year is conducive for tornadoes because of extreme contrasts in weather conditions. He cited last week's stormy, sunny, warm and cold weather as an obvious example. "This time of year the contrast is tremendous," he said. Atmospheric conditions required for the formation of tornadoes are basically the same as those for severe thunderstorms — namely, great vertical instability of air near the ground, high humidity and the horizontal convergence of winds at low levels followed by uplift in the storm. Both thunderstorms and tornadoes are associated with tropical air that moves north or northeast into central North America and clashes with cooler, drier air moving from the north. By being aware of how a tornado is formed and what to look out for, Kaufman said people would be better able to prepare themselves for emergencies. After realizing the potential for a tornado exists, Kaufman said more people need to be aware of the significance of two NWS alerts: tornado watches and tornado warnings. Tornado watches, generally issued to a county-wide region, inform the public that conditions are ripe for the formation

Education, knowing how to react, and communication, knowing when to react, are the keys to surviving one of nature's most devastating and deadly assaults, according to a National Weather Service (NWS) expert. The month of April is the start of tornado season in the United States as most twisters each year occur between April and July. As Michigan sits on the border of "Tornado Alley," it is especially important for state residents to be prepared in case disaster strikes, according to Mary Kaufman, deputy meteorologist at Detroit Metropolitan Airport. According to State Police statistics, 230 Michigan residents have been killed by tornadoes since 1950 — ranking Michigan third in the U.S. in tornado-caused fatalities. According to Kaufman, fewer lives would be lost if people better knew how to react to tornado emergencies. "People must know what to do when they are alerted of danger," Kaufman said. "They have to take it seriously." "The first thing to know, anytime, is what are you going to do if you are notified of danger. (For instance), if you live in a mobile home, do you know where to go?" "Knowing what is going on and what to do about it is what is all about," he added.

Local groups set emergency plans
The best way to survive the devastating effects of a tornado is to be prepared. And two local organizations are doing their best to make sure they are ready in case of an emergency. The Novi Community School District recently received a new comprehensive disaster program for each of its educational facilities, and members of the Northville Township Police Department are engaged in on-going consultation with State Police to prepare themselves during times of emergency. According to John Swallow, director of special services for the Novi schools, the district last month received a comprehensive plan, which outlines emergency procedures for each building in the district. Just in time for the start of tornado season, Swallow said the 40-page plan details emergency plans for the first time in one comprehensive form. Swallow said the new emergency action plan outlines procedures for practice drills, identifies emergency shelter areas in each of the district's buildings, and lists the responsibility of all school personnel during times of emergency. Although the plan offers no significant changes over existing disaster preparedness policies, Swallow said this is the first time a comprehensive guide has been created for the entire district. "I do not think there has been tremendous (policy) change," Swallow said. "I think really it is just an identification and substantiation of what we have always been doing. "Prior to this time we had individual plans at each building, whereas currently we are organized to the point where if somebody calls (with emergency questions) we can answer their questions more specifically. "We have got everybody included in our drills from school custodians in terms of job responsibilities and assigned duties during emergency situations.

Northville Township police Lt. Gary Batloff said he and Reserve Officer James Schrot are working with state officials to prepare police officers in handling disaster situations. Batloff said the primary responsibility of police during a tornado sighting is to track the movement of the funnel cloud and communicate warnings via the National Weather Service (NWS). In addition, in the event that the tornado causes great damage or personal injuries, he said the police help to coordinate medical assistance and secure damaged property. In order to escape harm, Batloff said community residents should be alert for hazardous weather conditions and take tornado watches and warnings seriously. He said it would be a good idea for residents to consider purchasing radio scanners to monitor NWS weather alerts and always to be conscious of an emergency plan of action.

Dispelling myths about tornadoes
State and local experts believe the best way to survive tornado disasters is to be well informed and prepared. The following are facts characteristic of most tornadoes:
□ Tornadoes can occur anytime of the day or night and in almost any month of the year. Most tornadoes occur between April and July and commonly occur in the late afternoon and evening hours from 3-7 p.m.
□ The greatest frequency of tornadoes occurs during temperatures between 70-75 degrees with relative high humidities.
□ Tornadoes develop from dark thunderstorm-like clouds, and research has shown that many occur toward the end of the cloud.
□ A tornado watch is issued whenever weather conditions exist for severe weather to develop.
□ A tornado warning is issued by the National Weather Service whenever a tornado has been sighted or strongly indicated by radar.
□ Even under ideal notification conditions, a tornado may be on the ground for seven minutes before commercial radio or TV could begin to warn the population.
□ Because of limitations agencies have in alerting the public, State Police officials urge all residents to know the danger signs of tornado weather. County governments across the state offer training sessions for residents interested in becoming tornado spotters.
□ Oakland County's program, called Skywarn, consists of one free two-hour training session. The classes are offered every year during the month of March. For information concerning the program contact the county's Emergency Management Services office at 658-3300.

Tornadoes begin when colder air is trapped over warm, moist air. As the warm air rises and the cold sinks, an "overturn" is started and an updraft created, pulling more air into the storm.

...with the right wind movement, the air inside the storm starts to spiral in a counter-clockwise motion, pulling more air from the surface and pushing it upward...

...and a tornado is born.

Tornadoes can fill the air with dust and generate enough force to splinter houses and throw automobiles through the air.

Air moves counter-clockwise

Tornadoes generally travel in a northeasterly direction

Some tornadoes have cut paths 26 miles long but most, 60%, are usually on the ground for just 10 minutes and travel five miles.

Tornado Safety
At home, go to basement or lowest floor and seek shelter under sturdy furniture or in small room
If in the open, go to a sturdy building or lie flat in a ditch or depression and hold onto to something, if possible
In car, get out and go to a basement, or a ditch or ravine away from the car

Ladycats anticipate good year

First-year softball Coach John Peace is impressed with the squad he inherited from former Coach Jim Tinsley.

Tinsley, who coached the Novi softballers for eight seasons, decided to leave his post because "I just got tired of it."

And Peace, who coached the Wildcat golf team last fall, took over a young, but experienced team. Tinsley left behind an extremely talented junior class of ballplayers, some good athletes and a program that had problems winning with consistency (5-16 overall, 3-9 in the KVC) a year ago.

"It's very difficult to predict how good we can be because I've seen very little of the team outside because of the weather," Peace reported. "But I am impressed because we have some good athletes who have varsity experience."

If the departed Lance Parish was the "big wheel" for the Detroit Tigers the past decade, junior catcher Lisa McCarthy is Novi's counterpart. Last season, McCarthy

led the 'Cats in homers, steals and on-base percentage and had the team's second highest batting average. In addition, she may be the area's finest defensive catcher with a rifle arm and the ability to keep everything in front of her.

"Lisa has a great deal of athletic ability so we are considering using her at other spots in addition to catching," Peace said. "She has a nice arm so we may use her to pitch some."

If and when McCarthy pitches, Peace will look to junior Mary Marcus behind the plate. Marcus, up from the junior varsity ranks, has looked good in the early workouts, and Peace feels confident he can go with her if necessary.

"Lisa is by far our best catcher but if we move her I don't think we will lose too much if we bring Mary in," Peace said.

Heading up the pitching staff is junior Jill Sobkow, the top returning hurler. Sobkow's no-hitter in '86 was one of the highlights of the season, and Peace is looking for a solid season from her. The other two pitchers slated for action this season are a pair of juniors — Jodie Nagel

and Brenda Thal. Both have moved up from the J.V. and have looked good so far.

"I don't think we will have to count on just Jill (Sobkow)," Peace said. "With Nagel, Thal and possibly McCarthy, we should be O.K. as long as they throw strikes. If we do that, we will be very competitive."

Novi's infield looks solid with returnees like Sandy Maloney and Laura Case. Maloney, one of the few seniors on the squad, will again hold down the first base position. She was one of the area's best defensive players, but slumped at the plate last year. Peace said Case has a good glove and quickness and will play at shortstop.

Transfer student Angel Ianni will start at second base, and Marcus will be the regular at third when she isn't pitching. The top substitute for the infield is another exchange student, Kiaja Niemi from Finland.

Senior Laura Maloney is back for duty in the outfield following a fine season a year ago when she sported Novi's top batting average. The other two outfield positions will probably be handled by sophomore Nicki Costen and junior Jennifer Nameth,

who are the top candidates. Costen bats left-handed and is the fastest player on the team. Peace thinks she has the potential to be a star in the next few years.

"Most of these players were baptized into the varsity game last year and now they are a year better," Peace said. "I think last year's experience will help them, but I think it will take about half the season before they completely learn my system."

"We're not up to the level of South Lyon or Brighton yet, but I expect us to be very competitive against everybody. If we can get the pitchers to throw strikes, we will be."

With teams like South Lyon, Brighton and Hartland in the KVC, it will be very difficult for the Wildcats to break into the top three, but Peace thinks a first division berth is a good goal to shoot for.

"We are looking for about a fourth place finish in the league; that's what I want," said Peace. "We want to do something this season, but at the same time, we're building for the future. We have a lot of good quality juniors, so maybe next year we can contend for the league crown."

Jeff Jeffress, Andy Fitzpatrick and Schram placed second in the mile relay (3:45.27).

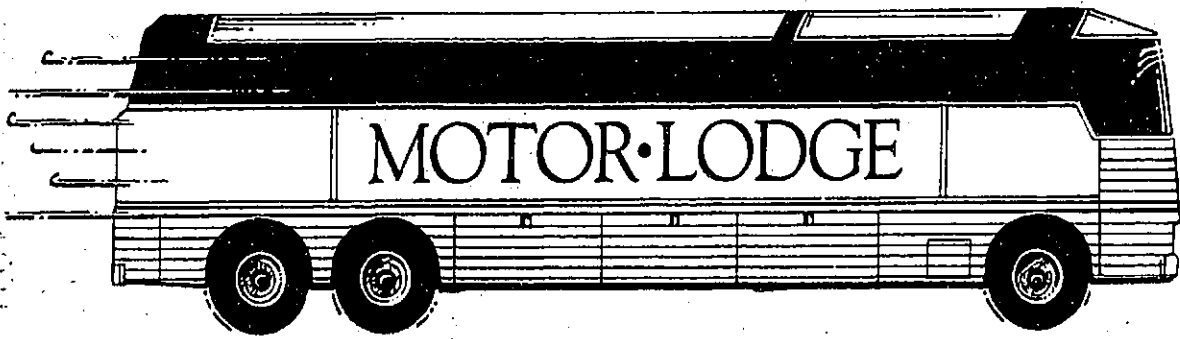
