# ovidence eyeing land near school

Citing a need for increased health care services in Novi, Providence Hospital officials have revealed plans to develop "a full-service health care facility" on the southwest corner of the Ten Mile/Taft Road intersection.

Robert Kelly, vice president of planning for Providence Hospital, said Monday that the hospital owns a 70-acre parcel at the Ten Mile/Taft Road intersection and would like to develop it into medical campus-type facility.

The information was released at a meeting attended by Novi City Council and Planning Commission members at the hospital's headquarters in Southfield.

Providence Hospital currently operates an ambulatory care center at the Ten Mile/Haggerty Road intersection in Novi as well as other ambulatory care centers in South Lyon, Brighton and Milford.

The 70-acre site would be con-

siderably larger than the Ten Mile/Haggerty Road site which contains approximately 20 acres. Providence's Southfield facility is located on a 22-acre parcel.

Hospital officials cited population growth and a need for increased health care services as the reasons for seeking to develop a medical campus in Novi.

We have experienced major growth at our Novi facility since it opened and anticipate additional growth in the future," said Michael Cervenak of the Providence Hospital staff.

"We currently have almost 20,000 visits to the emergency room per year at the Novi facility, making it the busiest of all our ambulatory care facilities," added Cervenak.

# Somoco well hits oil target

In the old days, when an oil company hit a successful well, it was fairly obvious to the surrounding community. A "gusher" would blanket the sky and the yells of the

roughnecks would pierce the air. Those days are long gone, and oil companies now alert the public of a successful find with the words "We are very pleased." At least that's what Michael Harris of the Somoco Oil Company said of his successful drilling for oil in Section 17 of Novi.

The oil well, located on the grounds of the Corvo Iron Works on the east side of Wixom Road, just north of Eleven Mile, is in its second test phase, Harris said. The company did hit oil with its well, Harris said, and is conducting the tests to determine how much and what type of equipment is necessary to begin production at the well site.

Harris received permission from the DNR and the city to conduct the second five-day test. The company is testing at the 200 barrels per day legal limit for an oil well.

The well is producing approximately 40,000 cubic feet of natural gas as a by-product of the oil. "That is a fairly low gas rate for an oil well," Harris said. Legally, Somoco could produce up to 200,000 cubic feet of natural gas in addition to the mediate area are very pleased." 200 barrels of oil, according to Har-



#### Novi hosts march

"Where have all the flowers gone,

long time ago . . . ' Drivers along Meadowbrook Road between Eight and Ten Mile on Wednesday, Aug. 5, might have felt as if they had stepped back in

time. A band of 30-40 marchers walked along the road, carrying banners and an American flag. As cars passed they held up two fingers in the classic '60s peace sign. Drivers

returned the salute, smiling.
Although the 1987 Michigan Peace March might have been a more common sight 15 years ago, the subject of the march — "Global Nuclear Disarmament" - is a

distinctly '80s one. The Michigan Peace March began in Sault Ste. Marie on May 31 and ended last Sunday, Aug. 9 in Detroit. The march went through 17 cities, and marchers traveled over

700 miles. Actual participants in the march varied from city to city, with people joining for a day's walk - or a week. Organizers said the purpose of the march was to bring the arms race and the bid for disarmament closer to the people.

The march traveled from Plymouth through Northville to

Novi. Marchers walked across Meadowbrook Road to Holy Family Church where they camped for the

According to Michele Salinas, 24, a student nurse from Grand Rapids. one of the goals of the march was to start peace organizations in the communities through which they passed. Salinas said separate regional marches are taking place this year in Florida, New York, New England and across Europe. "This is the beginning of a larger movement; it's like a snowball rolling. This is an excellent way to get the message across," Salinas said.

Overall, Salinas said the marchers were welcomed in most of the towns through which they passed. People were "curious" about them. Salinas said, but most were willing to hear their views and talk about their ideas.

The only "shaky" reception the marchers received, according to Salinas, was in Plymouth.

The marchers spent Aug. 4 in Plymouth, where a peace pole was planted. The pole is a simple plastic symbol with "May Peace Prevail on Earth" written in four languages.



#### Faxon bill reduces insurance

Legislation to reduce high medical liability insurance costs and stem the growing flow of Michigan doctors to other states, has been introduced in the Senate by State Sen. Jack Faxon (D-Farmington Hills).

Faxon's bill would create a state Physicians' Liability Association, or medical liability insurance pool, that would provide doctors with affordable insurance covering all amounts beyond the first \$200,000 of a liability claim. Private insurers would continue to provide coverage for the initial \$200,000.

"Despite passage last year of legislation attempting to limit medical malpractice liability, insurance premium costs for doctors have not gone down," said Faxon, who represents Novi and the Oakland County portion of Northville. "This is because the cost of liability insurance beyond the first \$200,000 of coverage is still extremely high, with specialists devastated by this the

Faxon said a state medical liability insurance pool, which he previously tried to establish, is the only answer to the problem. The liability association he has proposed would be a contributory group. It would include all Michigan doctors, who would make payments to the group based on their actual, annualized liability payouts.

"By including all doctors, this legislation would amortize the cost or medical liability insurance to an insignificant amount, compared to what is currently being paid out," Faxon said. "We have to protect doctors so they can stay in business and we can continue to have medical services available to us."

At the same time, he said, lawmakers have to protect those who may be severely injured through medical malpractice. With "catastrophic" malpractice injuries virtually always leading to damages in excess of \$200,000, a means must exist to provide some kind of relief to the injured parties, Faxon said.







According to Berta Bernard Lambert Jr., the group's bibliographer, there are 60,000 peace poles in the world today, matching the approximate number of nuclear

supplies for dinner. The marchers were accompanied by a large support group consisting of vans carrying personal supplies, tents and food. A trailer housed the 'kitchen' and a truck pulled a trailer of four portable Steven and Rebecca Kanner, brother and sister, had

been with the march since the beginning. Sitting beneath a tree in front of their tents, the two said the march had done much to establish local peace groups and set up strong networks of contacts.

The hardest part of the whole march for Rebecca, was "the planning. "The logistics were pure aggravation," ; she said. "Walking is my favorite part. Having a goal walking for nuclear disarmament, living together and

She said the marchers felt no "superiority" over those who had not joined the march. "I'm not just marching for myself, but for all of those who can't," she said. Stephen participated in the Great American Peace March and said the Michigan march "differed only in

"People are paying me to do a specific job for them," he said. "It is by far the most honest work I have ever

"We seem to be experiencing a consciousness explosion - the birth of a star at this moment in time," Markham said explaining the peace movement's growth. He joined the New England Peace March immediately after the Detroit finish of the Michigan

The march existed on contributions and fund raising efforts such as the sale of T-shirts and bumper stickers. Marchers were asked to contribute at the beginning of the march, but no one was turned away for lack of money, organizers said.

Corinne Carey, a Grand Rapids grandmother, marched for her grandchildren. Carey started in Sault St. Marie and walked the entire distance.

She has three grandchildren and said she preferred to be actively doing something for peace. "There are no guarantees in a nuclear age; we have to do the best we can do," she said as she set up her tent behind Holy

Carey is a retired teacher who left her husband at home when she joined the march. "It is my retirement project. My husband is supportive . . . from a distance,"

Carey said the words of another peace marcher had stuck with her throughout the march. "The earth spinning around uninhabited is intolerable."



A 17 percent population increase has occurred in Farmington Hills since the last U.S. Census in 1980.

The results of a special census conducted under the guidance of Patricia Loder, a former deputy clerk for the City of Novi, show that Farmington Hills' population has grown 17 percent from 58,056 in 1980 to 68,020 in 1987. The couple said they teach no more than one student at a time between the hours of 3 and 7 p.m. Monday through Friday. 





# Novi girl sets sights high in astronaut bid

Jennifer Marshall is only 15 years old, but already she has set her career goals and recently took a big step toward achieving them. "I want to be a pilot . . . a space shuttle pilot," she

said. Ultimately, she would like to become one of

NASA's elite corps of astronauts. She is undaunted by the fact that, to date, all NASA space shuttle pilots have had previous training as military test pilots. Although she would prefer a nonmilitary alternative, her plans, therefore, include pursuing an appointment to the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Nor is Marshall deterred by the fact that test pilot training is considered combat preparation and closed to women in the military. She is entering her junior year at Novi High School, so application to NASA is still more than five years away.

"Perhaps, that will change by the time I get there," she said hopefully. In the meantime, she is getting

This past March, Marshall was a member of the first class of high school students to go through the one-week, simulated astronaut-training program offered at the new NASA Space Academy in Huntsville, Alabama. The academy is a hands-on, opportunity for high-

school aged students to learn first-hand about the rigors of astronaut training. It is an addition to NASA's Hunt-Solille facility which also includes Space Camp, a less demanding program for younger children. At the same site NASA also offers a variety of programs for adults. At the Space Academy, Marshall met students from across the United States as well as several foreign countries including Japan and Finland. They were grouped in teams upon arrival and presented with a set of strict rules for conduct and a very rigid schedule that governed their lives the rest of the week. "It was a very military environment,'' noted Marshall.

A typical day began at 0530 hours (5:30 a.m.) with astronaut conditioning — calisthenics, followed by breakfast, classes and hours of lectures on all aspects of the shuttle. Activities were scheduled well into the night. Some of the more determined students, Marshall said, worked with flashlights long after lights out at 2200 hours (10 p.m.) Marshall said she was happy to get whatever sleep she could because the schedule was so demanding. Each team was named and given a mission to accomplish. Pathfinder was one of two missions to which Marshall was assigned. She discovered that team assignments were based on testing designed to see just Iwho had "the right stuff.

Each mission had a commander, a pilot and crew, mission specialists and a ground crew. Job assignments were based on testing that identified cadet strengths and

On one mission Marshall was mission specialist No. 1 with the assigned task of using the Remote Manipulation System — the "arm" so familiar to those who follow the real NASA shuttle flights. It was the same task assigned to astronaut Sally Ride on her first shuttle flight. Marshall pulled ground crew duty on her other mis-

sion. Throughout the week cadets had ample opportunity for hands-on experience with NASA equipment. The missions required extensive knowledge of NASA ability to identify problems and develop solutions for hem based on the information provided in the many

Above all, a successful mission required team effort. Marshall is familiar with the importance of team effort - she plays tennis and softball at Novi High School. Team effort requires individual excellence and, at the same time, a subordination of the individual to the team. Her experience in sports helped her be a NASA team

Some of the cadets, as bright and as eager as they were, found team effort the one challenge they couldn't

Although Marshall said it was easy to recognize those who had "the right stuff" — students who she felt were certain to be future candidates for NASA programs, she was hard-pressed to define what the "right stuff" really is. It wasn't that they were more intelligent, all the cadets appeared to be brighter than average. And it wasn't that they were more interested or motivated than other cadets, the Space Academy is an expensive and grueling experience for all.

The only exceptions Marshall noted were a cadet who broke out in chicken pox the first day and a high school dropout from Detroit who won his trip to Huntsville through a video store promotion of the movie "Space Camp." The first was sent home, and the second seemed out of his element the whole week.

Perhaps the Detroit youth, as did Marshall and many other cadets, thought NASA's Space Academy was going to be like the popular movie "Space Camp" which was filmed at the Huntsville site. Marshall had prepared herself for the academy by seeing the film repeatedly before she went. The first thing she learned when she got there was that the Space Academy and "Space Camp"

The cadets toured real NASA facilities, some off-limits to the general public because of the secret nature of their activities. They spent time in a pool, not to swim, but to practice skills needed in the neutral bouyancy of outer space. They learned an endless list of acronyms for equipment used in astronaut training. Although mission flights, maneuvering, dockings and landings, were simulated, the equipment the cadets used was authentic the same used by real astronauts.

The training was so intense and the comaraderie so great that when mistakes were made or successes achieved during the simulated missions, the despair and the joy of the cadets on Marshall's team were just as real as the equipment they were using.

One of team efforts that gave Marshall a sense of accomplishment was the challenge given each team to design a space station and build a model of it to be reviewed by NASA engineers. Designing a space station is a project that is currently receiving top NASA priority, requiring all the resources NASA can muster. The design and model developed by Marshall's team was accepted by the engineers for further consideration by

Since returning from the Space Academy, Marshall has shared her experiences with elementary and middle school students, impressing them with her exploits. She was welcomed back with an honorary membership in Novi's Young Astronaut's Club, which is sponsored by Middle School teacher Kathy Scullen. Marshall, in turn, has been impressed by the level of

the students' interest and the questions they have asked.







Sure, it's good news, but overai the current price rise today, yesterday and last week is due to actions in the Persian Gulf and that is a very volatile situation." Harris said. "One day the price is \$22 a barrel, the next its \$22.50 and then back to \$21 - that doesn't help Somoco, or anyone else," Harris said.

A more stabilized price for oil would be better for Somoco. Harris said, allowing the company to make long range plans for drilling in the

"There's a lot of lag time in the oil business," Harris said. He noted the company must first conduct geological and geophysical tests, then obtain leases from property owners, and get the appropriate permits prior to any drilling work begin-

Somoco has no immediate intentions of pursuing other drilling sites in Novi, Harris said. The potential site next to the Echo Valley subdivision, south of Ten Mile between Taft and Beck roads, has "not really progressed to that point," Harris said. Some residents of the subdivision had expressed concern over the possible oil well site. Harris said the residents may have "jumped the gun" a bit as the company is "not that far along. First we'd have to get oil and gas leases before even going to the city for a permit," he said. "It is an area of interest, but it may not be workable. We have no plans to go



ahead with it at this time."

Providence officials are talking in terms of a three-phase development which can be adjusted on the basis of need and developing trends in the field of medical services. Paul Williams, an architect with the Minneapolis-based firm of Hammel, Green & Abrahamson, Inc., said preliminary plans call for the first phase to contain additional medical office space.

The second phase would include another medical office building and outpatient diagnostic and treatment services. Phase Three would include expansion of outpatient services with a potential for an inpatient facility if the need develops.





As the developer, Garon obviously has a vested interest in completion of the Sandstone project. But, according to Wahl, the city is anxiously anticipating the success of the project he said is the most crucial residential development in the northern portion of the city.

"We really feel like this is a critical project for the community," said Wahl. "This is a first for the city in terms of large-scale suburban planning and development. It is more than just a standard subdivision plat.

Wahl said there has been relatively little residential development in the northern portion of the city during the last 40 years. He said Sandstone could serve as a model for development in that region. "This is a very important project,

## Planners set public hearing date for Sandstone

The Sandstone Planned Unit Development (PUD) project will enter its third year in the making in October, but developers of the 334-acre residential complex hope they will be well underway in phasing in the project's first stage by then.

Novi planning commissioners last week set a Sept. 9 special meeting/public hearing date for the project to discuss the development in detail.

The project encompasses nearly all of the city's Section 11 — the area from Novi to Meadowbrook roads between Twelve and Thirteen Mile (just north of Twelve

Sandstone includes 1,493 dwelling units, ranging from single family detatched homes to condominiums, and 24 acres of man-made lakes as well as numerous club houses, swimming pools, tennis courts and a nine-hole golf course. Given today's housing market conditions, homes in the Sandstone development are estimated to cost between \$80,000 and \$350,000, depending upon the type of dwelling and its location in the project. According to City Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers, the project has a total density of 5.07 dwelling units per

# Day care concerns will need attention

As the City of Novi continues to grow residentially and commercialy, elected and appointed officials are faced with zoning and planning questions of increasingly complex social significance.

The planning process in the city, always an important tool for regulating and encouraging superior development, is taking on added im-

Last week the Novi Planning Commission faced a zoning decision involving a day care center. The commission in a 5-4 vote approved a special land use permit for the First

Impressions Day Care Center. First Impressions had requested the permit to allow the center to operate in an existing home south of Thirteen Mile, west of Haggerty Road. The permit allows a commer-

cial use in an area zoned residential. The planning commission decision was a narrow one. Several commissioners expressed concern over the safety of the children in a center so close to major roads. Neighbors spoke out during the public hearing about detrimental noise from the

play of 37 children. Whether a day care center, which is an allowable special permit use in a residentially-zoned area, is an appropriate use — is a tough question. Novi planning commissioners looking at that one particular instance, decided the issue based on the facts for that school, that neighborhood, and that corner of the city. ## Maligned sport of polo gains new advocates

It's described by many as a sport for the rich

It's described by those who play as being stereotyped by ignorance. Whatever the case, polo appears to be standing on solid ground. The game has been around more than 2,000 years, surviving two world wars, consistent changes in lifestyles and countless verbal at-

contributing to polo's longevity. The Detroit Polo Club, founded in 1961 in Union Lake, moved to its present facility at 2770 N. Milford

Road in Milford 15 years ago. The facility includes three outdoor fields on 33 acres, a fenced arena, stalls and paddocks for approximately 100 horses, and a lubhouse for members.

Polo matches are played almost every Sunday at 2 p.m. from Memorial Day through the end of September. The Mid-States Polo Circuit draws teams from Michigan, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Kentucky and Canada. The DPC is owned by a sixmember group, which includes Novi resident Merle Jenkins and

Highland's Ron Walker. Jenkins, who serves as president. had a great deal to do with the birth of the DPC. He started riding and playing polo in high school, and has carried the interest for nearly 40

'Polo is a tremendously rewarding sport. It really sets you free," said the 55-year-old lawyer. "After a good polo match, you come off the field with a real high . . . a sense of

"I'm no longer a boy either, but I can still play because the horse serves as your legs. It's a great feeling. There's also a union between the rider and horse that you don't get in other sports."

Jenkins is captain of the Detroit Blues, one of three teams that play out of the DPC. The others are Lone Tree Farm and Birmingham. The Blues are struggling this

season, but have earned national recognition in past years for their efforts in eight, 12 and 16-goal tour-Like most polo players, Jenkins

wants to promote the sport. He's tired of hearing that it's a game only for the wealthy. "There are rich people who play

the game and there are poor people who play the game." he commented. "True, you have to put some money into it, but how much depends on the individual.
