Hospital opposition grows

... Novicesidents from across the city are banding together in an effort to prevent Providence Hospital from constructing a new health care facility on residentially-zoned

property near Novi High School. Named the "Concerned Citizens of Novi" (CCN), the group began as a coalition of about 20 families in the Yorkshire Place subdivision. After two organizational meetings, the group's membership has grown to about 50 families who live in at least seven other nearby subdivi-

CCN Administrator Rick Szymke said group members oppose the type of land use that a medical facility would generate on

Szymke: 'A hospital is a very useful and productive part of the community, but it is not a productive part in a residential neighborhood.'

residentially-zoned land. Szymke is quick to point out, however, that his group does not oppose construction of another medical facility in the city, provided it would not be located on the site Providence officials have in mind on the southwest corner of the Ten Mile/Taft Road intersection.

"The need for a hospital will be determined by the State of Michigan," Szymke said: "(But) a hospital would be a great benefit to the Novi area.

"Our major concern is not so much that there is not another

favor of the concept of a hospital in Novi. But we do not feel it should be in a residential neighborhood.

Szymke said the CCN was formed within two days after hospital officials last month announced plans to develop a medical campus facility on a 70-acre parcel at the Ten Mile/Taft Road location.

CCN members have two major objections to the proposed location: safety and traffic, according to

Because the facility is being proposed across from Novi High School, Szymke said it would pose a serious health hazard to students as well as residents of nearby subdivi-



Tax Tribunal cases up . affecting school funds

suffer losses of at least \$115 million, according to a study of the cases pending before the Michigan Tax Tribunal. The study, conducted by the Michigan Tax Information Council, examined 768 of 1,435 pending appeals to determine what type of property is being appealed and the possible losses to local governments and school

Potential losses to Michigan municipalities could be over \$10 million if the Tribunal rules in favor of the appealing taxpayers. Counties face possible losses of over \$6 million and townships nearly \$1 million.

The big losers, however, would be school districts not receiving aid under the State School Aid Formula. These "out-of-formula" schools could lose over \$43 million in revenues which would not be replaced by state aid. Many districts' losses would not be enough to move them into the "in-formula" category. Per-pupil expenditures would decrease dramatically unless local millage increases are approved.

Losses to school districts in-formula schools could be offset by increased state aid monies. This would, however, deplete state funds or make more state appropriations for education necessary.

Meanwhile, Oakland is seeking Supreme Court approval to test a system of videotaping courtroom procedures - a method which would do away with stenographers, audio recordings and transcripts. If fully implemented, the system night allow broadcasters to piggyback on the court's recording, removing the necessity for having commercial TV station cameras in a cour-

The Supreme Court's press office announced recently that Oakland and four other counties — Grand Traverse, Ingham, Marquette and Wexford - will be permitted to allow cameras and tape recorders as pilot programs "to work out the procedural details necessary for implementing the use of electronic equipment by the news media in all state courts next year."

February. On Aug. 26, Chief Justice Dorothy Comstock Riley announced the high court is amending its rules on a one-year experimental basis beginning next Feb. 1 to allow judges to permit news cameras and recording equipment in the state's

There are many exceptions. A judge may say no. News organizations must ask permission a month prior to a trial. A witness may refuse the news organization permission to record his or her courtroom testimony, even though court testimony is legally a matter of public record.

Oakland, meanwhile is asking the high court for stenographers and audio tapes to make official records of all court proceedings.

After speaking with Novi City Council Member Edward Leininger, Szymke said improvements and/or expansion of Taft Road and Ten Mile are not in the works. The basis for CCN's objection, however, would be

"The land here has all been zoned for residential use," Szymke said. "That is in the Master Plan, and it has been that way for years and years

"A hospital is a very useful and productive part of the community, but it is not a productive part in a residential neighborhood," Szymke added.

CCN members are currently in the process of launching a petition drive to show the city council exactly how many residents are opposed to the project. But Szymke said the intent of his group is not just to protect the backyards of residents in the area of the proposed site. Instead, its purpose is to find an alter-

nate location for a new medical facility. "There are a couple members in our group who . develop factories, and we are going to look — hopefully * with some of the people on the planning commission at some of the alternative sites. Hopefully, we will pre-

Szymke added that CCN is working in conjunction

with directives provided by the city council "We are working with the people on the city council. We are not working against the city council. As they

advise us, that is what we are going to do." Three council members have indicated that they cannot support the medical facility in the location in which it is currently proposed, according to Szymke. He also said almost every other council member has

expressed reservations about the plans "I have talked to some of the people and they all seem to have reservations. (Council members) said (they are) in the fact-finding stage right now. Now is the time to voice objections, to show concern and to express some other alternatives, and that is what we in-

Szymke said the CCN will have regular meetings, probably on a bi-weekly schedule. The group's next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, Sept. 22. He also

said new members are welcomed to join. Although its efforts are currently devoted to dealing with the Providence Hospital plan, Szymke said he hopes the CCN will outlive the Providence issue and continue to provide citizen input to city government.

"It is a good, strong, viable group," Szymke said. "We are trying to keep the zealots out. We are trying to keep it very responsible . . . and there are a lot of issues in the City of Novi. The (long-term) intention of the group, if this is successful, is we would like to use (the CCN) as a sounding block for the city by having a lot of different representation from around the city. "The (city's government) gets a very good represen-

tation of what the commercial people want in the city,

but I think they need more input from residents. We

are just trying to help," Szymke said. "We are just looking at things that really need to be addressed. Novi is a good place, and we are just trying

Grand River action rectifies problems

River corridor were rezoned to light industrial by unanimous vote of the Novi City Council last Monday. The council acted wisely in finally determining the future of a portion of the important western entrance to the ci-

The decision has not been an easy one. Discussions on the zoning along Grand River have gone on more than four years, both on the planning commission level, council and in recent months by the West Grand River Landowners Group affected property owners.

During their decision at last Monday's council meeting, council members referred to the time it has taken the council to arrive at a decision. All agreed it had not been a simple task to determine what was the best zoning to use along Grand River. On Monday night the council determined that five parcels would be rezoned to light industrial use, in keeping with the majority of the surrounding land use.

The light industrial designation was a good one. Although many people have referred to the fact that Novi has one of the highest percentages of light industrial zoning available in Oakland County, cutting back on the I-1 zoning at this particular point would not have made for good planning.

The Landowners Group had suggested a plan which would have incorporated several different zoning designations in the area — and a large portion of B-3, general commercial zoning. The council and commission should be applauded for allowing the group to present its plan, for trying to reach a compromise, and then for moving ahead with what they believed to be the best land use for the area.

Additional commercial down Grand River Avenue would not have been a wise planning decision considering the amount of commercial already available in the Town Center area and the city's goal of centralizing its commercial building.

Brandon Rogers, the city planning consultant, and Judith Johnson, chairperson of the planning commis-

Development

sion, both made good points at the council meeting. Rogers referred to the large woodlands and wetlands area behind the parcels zoned for light industrial use. These parcels front land that is master planned for eventual residential use.

Rogers said the woodlands and wetlands areas could be used as a natural barrier for the residential development. That suggestion is a good one, and one that should be followed by the planning commission. Instead of erecting berms and replanting valuable trees at some point in the future, residents will have the value of keeping natural resources as a buffer to the light in-

What makes light industrial zoning an appropriate change for this area is the new I-1 ordinance. Restrictions, including the need for special land use permits and hearings, are built into the ordinance for land that abuts residential zoning. The council and planning commission have made this ordinance a usable one when confronted with an area already master planned and

We encourage the planning commission to look into possible planned unit development (PUD) projects for the light industrial area. Planned, larger developments instead of small individual buildings will reduce curb cuts on Grand River, an already tough road for drivers making entrances and exits.

In addition, we encourage the planning commission and council to move ahead with plans to rezone the north side of Grand River to office zoning. Planners and residents can agree that offices provide both necessary tax revenue and the least use of public services. The freeway frontage afforded by this area is also a valuable asset that should be maximized by office zoning.

High cost for green lawns



outside the house this morning and went in search of the source. Across the street there was a large truck with a hose attached. A man wearing a mask over his face was spraying chemicals on the lawns. The chemicals really stunk, but then so did the exhaust from the truck, so I did the logical thing — I closed my door and went back to reading

Then, what usually happens when I sit down and get nfortable and open the newspaper, happened. The dog wanted out. She has that inbred instinct all dogs have that enables them to disturb you just at the point when you're most comfortable. It's one of the most endearing parts about owning a pet.

So I got up, put on my shoes and prepared to let the dog out. But then I remembered. The grass around my house had been sprayed a few weeks earlier and the company responsible had seen to it that we were warned. The notice said something innocuous like — keep all pets and children off the grass for a few days until the chemical has a chance to get deeper into the ground. For a good three days after the lawn was sprayed I could smell the chemicals whenever I walked on the grass. I made sure that I carried Lizzie (my dog) to safe turf for the first two days, but on the third day the door opened and out bounced the dog so I gave up. I figured the worst of the toxic had dissipated.

That was the first time I paid attention to the spraying issue. I guess I was more alert that time because my dog had been pretty sick immediately prior to the spraying and the vet said it could have been some sort of toxic in her system. The vet had mentioned grass spraying and I had called the company for a list of the ingredients. The company was more than nice. They supplied the ingredients and said that really, the stuff was safe unless ingested in large quantities over years.

They issued warnings because it is a chemical and could potentially cause some side effects immediately after it is sprayed. When I read the ingredients to the vet, she agreed. It wasn't the cause of Lizzie's illness.

Despite that reassurance, I don't like the spraying. understand that in the quest for perfect lawns, chemical fertilizers are probably the highest form of the art. I just think we've added yet another toxic to our environment and this one was added for a pretty shabby reason — to make your lawn greener.

Beautiful carpet-like lawns surrounding plush suburban homes are the stuff dreams are made of, I know. I'm not advocating a return to the wild. I don't agree that grass should be allowed to grow, to flower and to burn at will — but isn't there some other way we can compromise on this? I know that if you have a neighbor with crummy grass and if you work hard on your own lawn it can be irritating to see the other guy's dandelions blowing across your carefully cultivated. green — but after all it's just grass.

Somewhere along the line we've lost our perspective. I was talking to a man who lives on Walled Lake. He said he knows people who own lakefront lots who have their lawns sprayed to encourage grass growth. The spray, naturally, runs off into the lake, like everything else. These people then get all upset over the amount of weeds that grow in the lake and want to, spray weed-killer in the lake to stop the growth encouraged by the lawn spray.

In the east when summer is at its hottest they often. face a water shortage. People are asked not to water their lawns. The year I lived in the east a lot of people cheated because they couldn't stand to have a brown

As I walked the dog this morning I thought about it: There are a lot of ways we've polluted the world and much of it was done with the betterment of life in mind. But greener lawns? Somehow the end just doesn't justify the means.

ave you noticed? Autumn has definitely arriv-The roses of summer are gone, and even the hardiest of fall flowers are beginning to fade. While crimson apples hang heavily on the trees and pumpkins are turning golden on the vine, it won't be long before the last of the harvest is in and another growing

Is it time to put away the hoe and rake, and hang up your gardening gloves? Well, not quite yet. This year's garden may be finished, but experienced gardeners say your garden chores are not yet done.

Mary Bauer, master gardener and volunteer with the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service, says a little extra effort now will pay dividends if you want less work next spring and greater yields through next sum-

"Small gardens, well-planned and well-kept, will yield more than a large over-grown garden," she says, adding that fall clean-up is the first step toward a productive garden next season.

Begin planning for next year by reviewing this year's garden. With paper and pencil in hand, walk around your garden. Take notes. Which plants did well? Which varieties were most productive? Were insects a problem? Did disease attack your plants in mid-season?. Use your notes to plan ahead. A change in plant selec-

tion, location or cultivation may be needed.

If a favorite plant seems to need more pampering than you can afford to give it again next year, try a new variegreen thumb to other, more responsive plants While walking around your garden, sketch plant locations. Home gardeners can benefit from using the farmers' practice of crop rotation. Bu changing the location of plant families in your garden, you can minimize depletion of nutrients from the soil and improve contro

Tomatoes, peppers, egg plants and potatoes are in the same plant family. Brussel sprouts, broccoli, cabbage and cauliflower belong to another. Additionally, plan to relocate plants when soil-or-light conditions or watering-or-spacing could be improved by

"One of the most common problems in the spring is soggy soil," says Bauer. "But it's a problem you can prevent with a little work in the fall."

Bauer suggests that now is an excellent time to construct raised beds, roto-till the garden and add needed sand, clay or peat to the soil.

Raised beds drain faster and dry earlier. They are often used to grow seedlings for transplanting or early salad crops and other cool weather plants like peas, broccoli and cabbage. Ground level soil is easily compacted while thawing in the spring by garden equipment and foot traffic, which delays planting.

Roto-tilling in the fall, especially if the soil is left in large clumps over the winter, can help rid the garden of unwanted pests. Disease spores and insect eggs are exposed by roto-tilling to the effects of sun, air and freezing temperatures throughout the winter which can reduce

Alternating freezing and thawing temperatures are effective in breaking up hard clay soils. Ground roto-tilled in the fall will be much easier to work in the spring.

While plants are still gowing, and some will continue to grow into early November, use old bedspreads, sheets of plastic or layers of newspaper to insulate them when freezing temperatures are expected.

After all crops are harvested, clear out all vegetation and fallen fruit. Decaying plants left on the soil's surface provide a protected environment for insects and disease spores. Burn, bag or bury (at a depth of more than 12 inches), any plant debris. The trimmings from healthy, insect-free plants can be added to a compost pile to be



Most woody ornamentals, both evergreens and deciduous plants, can be planted this fall, according to Curt Peterson, Extension horticulture specialist at Michigan State University.

Evergreens, both the broadleaf and narrowleaf types, should always be purchased as balledand-burlapped (B&B), balled-andpotted (B&P) or container-grown plants. Deciduous plants may be purchased in all of those ways, as well as dormant and, in the spring, bare-root - i.e., with no soil on the

An advantage of buying bareroot plants is that you can handle a plant with a much larger root system (and may therefore be able to plant a much larger plant) if it doesn't have a ball of soil around its roots, Peterson said. The keys to success with fallplanted ornamentals are to plant

them properly and protect them Balled plants need a hole 50 perto sun and wind need to be shielded to prevent damage to foliage.

hole should be just deep enough to put the plant at the same depth at which it had been growing. If there's a container around the root ball, remove it before setting the plant in the center of the hole with the burlap still around it. Cut all twine or wire supports, then

peel the burlap off the top and sides

of the soil ball and drop it into the bottom of the hole. Trying to pull it out may injure plant roots, Peterson explained. Replace subsoil removed from the hole, firming with the finger, then water. When the water has drained away, add the top soil.

root system should retain the shape of the container but not be tightly matted or pot-bound, with Before planting, separate the root system from the growing medium by grasping the roots and gently pulling them apart into a flattened and more natural shape. Set the plant in the center of a hole 50 percent bigger than the root mass and water to remove some of the potting mix from the root system. Then add subsoil, gently working it around the roots and firming it with your fingers. Water the subtextured mineral soil, over the top of the potting mix — it can prevent water from entering the root ball. Peterson advises against the common practice of firming the soil around new plants with your feet. This tends to pack the soil, driving out the air and closing the openings between soil particles that would admit the oxygen and

injury may be critical to their survival, Peterson said. Newlyplanted trees may need staking to prevent wind damage, and evergreens exposed to drying sun prevent damage to foliage. Trees with smooth-barked trunks need to be wrapped to prevent sunscald and keep bark from splitting as it warms and cools. Trunks shaded by small twigs, however, don't
