Car thieves make Novi a top expressway stop

Last week's early morning raid on several suspected car thieves in the Park Place Apartments in Northville brought renewed attention to a fast-growing problem in the Novi area — auto theft.

"Overall, car theft is one of the hardest crimes to solve," noted Captain Richard Faulkner of the Novi Police Department. Some 186 cars were stolen in Novi during 1986, according to the Michigan State Uniformed Crime Report. In 1981 Novi reported 101 cars stolen —

an increase of 84 percent in five years.

Faulkner acknowledged that the city has some distinctive features which create a climate for car thieves — specifically the mall area and the easy access to major freeways. Faulkner added that the problem is really a southeastern Michigan problem, not any individual city's.

"We are the shopping center for the auto thief," Faulkner said.

The Novi Police Department has not been able to adequately combat the rising car theft rate, Faulkner said, because of the nature of the

crime. "People crime — crimes against people not against property — have to be our number one priority," Faulkner said. The luxury of specializing in particular non-personal crimes is not available for the Novi Police Department, he said.

With auto theft, "You almost have to catch them in the act of stealing it (the car), or catch them on the street driving it," he said.

That takes more manpower than Novi currently has, and takes coordination between the cities in southeastern Michigan. Identifying the suspected car thieves after they

are caught can be a nightmare, according to Faulkner. A computerized system for all cities would make identification faster and easier, he said.

To help combat auto thefts in Novi, the police department applied for a grant from the Automobile Theft Prevention Authority (ATPA) last January. The authority uses money donated by the insurance companies of Michigan to aid in auto theft programs around the state. Novi did not receive a grant.

The ATPA is taking applications for another series of grants, and,

according to Captain Faulkner, the Novi Police have learned from their last attempt. This time the department has applied for a grant for a consortium of five Oakland County Police Units — in the hope of bettering their chances.

Southfield, Farmington, Farmington Hills and the Oakland County Sheriffs Department have joined Novi in the Southwest Oakland County Anti-Auto Theft Plan. The majority of the departments that received grants in the last funding were consortiums, Faulkner noted.

Southfield had 2,786 stolen cars in 1986. That city is second only to

Boston in the nation for the city with the most stolen cars per capita. Farmington had 58 stolen cars in 1986, and Farmington Hills lost 445. The Oakland County Sheriffs Department was added to the consortium because next to the Michigan State Police only the Sheriffs department has county-wide jurisdiction, Faulkner said.

The group's projected budget is \$302,502. A police officer from each of the five departments would be assigned to the Auto Theft consortium if the grant is approved.

Traffic stops at Novi Road

It isn't exactly Lodge-ability, but it may be the closest thing to it in Novi.

Novi Road will be closed at the C&O railroad tracks between Ten Mile and Grand River from Sept. 28 to Oct. 9.

The C&O railroad will close the railroad crossing on Monday, Sept. 28 to late Friday, Oct. 2, to install a new rubberized crossing. The rubberized crossing smooths driver's rides across the railroad tracks.

The Oakland County Road Commission will have the same crossing closed from Friday, Oct. 2, to Friday, Oct. 9. The road commission will be blending in new asphalt ap-

proaches to the crossing.

The crossing will be open for local traffic, City Manager Edward Kriewall said. Local traffic is defined as those cars needing access to effected businesses on Novi Road between the railroad crossing and Grand River Avenue. Through traffic will not be allowed, Kriewall said, and drivers are asked to find an alternate north-south roadway for the duration of the construction period.

The intersection will be closed for up to 12 consecutive days by the work. Weather will play an important role in how soon the work is completed.

Board seeks end to school dispute

The Novi Board of Education has suggested to the Novi City Council that the two bodies create a committee to discuss a disagreement between city and school officials over who holds authority for approving school district building plans.

The Novi Planning Commission recently ordered the school district to comply with city requirements for approving plans for any new construction or face an order to stop work on all projects. The school board's first public consideration of

the issue came at its meeting last Thursday, Sept. 17.

The school administration has said that authority for approving plans for school buildings rests with state officials. Historically, Novi school buildings have not gone through the city approval process.

City's largest project gets nod

Sandstone — the single largest residential community development to be proposed in the City of Novi — received unanimous general area plan approval from the Novi Planning Commission Sept. 16.

The project, which would increase the city's population as much as 15 percent upon completion, is the first development project to be proposed under the city's new Planned Unit Development (PUD) ordinance.

Sandstone is to be constructed in

The project includes 1,493 single-family attached and detached condominium units, along with 245,000 square feet of commercial and office space.

Section 11, a one-square mile section of land from Novi to Meadowbrook roads between Twelve and Thirteen Mile.

The project includes 1,493 single-family attached and detached con-

dominium units, along with 245,000 square feet of commercial and office space, numerous swimming pools, tennis courts and club houses, and a nine-hole golf course. It is estimated that as many as 3,400

people will reside in the community at the project's completion.

Last week's planning commission action was a formal approval of the Sandstone conceptual plans. Each phase of every part of the develop-

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Neighbor witnesses burglary

Police narrowly missed apprehending a man burglarizing a home on Forest Park in the Echo Valley subdivision during an incident which occurred Sept. 19.

Police Beat

Police were summoned to the scene at 11:49 p.m. by a neighbor who said she heard a noise outside her garage and looked out in time to see a man walking down her neighbor's driveway, place something into a van parked on the street, get inside and drive away.

After contacting police, the woman went next door to her neighbor's house where it was discovered the thief had removed a Schwinn ladies' bicycle valued at \$200, a Murray boy's bicycle valued at \$100, a K mart circular saw valued at \$30 and an electric air pump valued at \$25.

Responding officers searched the subdivision but were unable to catch sight of the van.

ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT valued at \$2,350 was stolen from a residence on Grand River during a break-in that occurred during the night of Sept. 18-19.

The complainant said he arrived home at 10:30 a.m. on Sept. 19 to discover that unknown individuals had broken in by reaching through a broken window and unlocking the front door.

Controversial chairs: When the Novi City Council and Planning Commission met in joint session on Monday, September 21, the planning commission was treated to a look at the council at work.

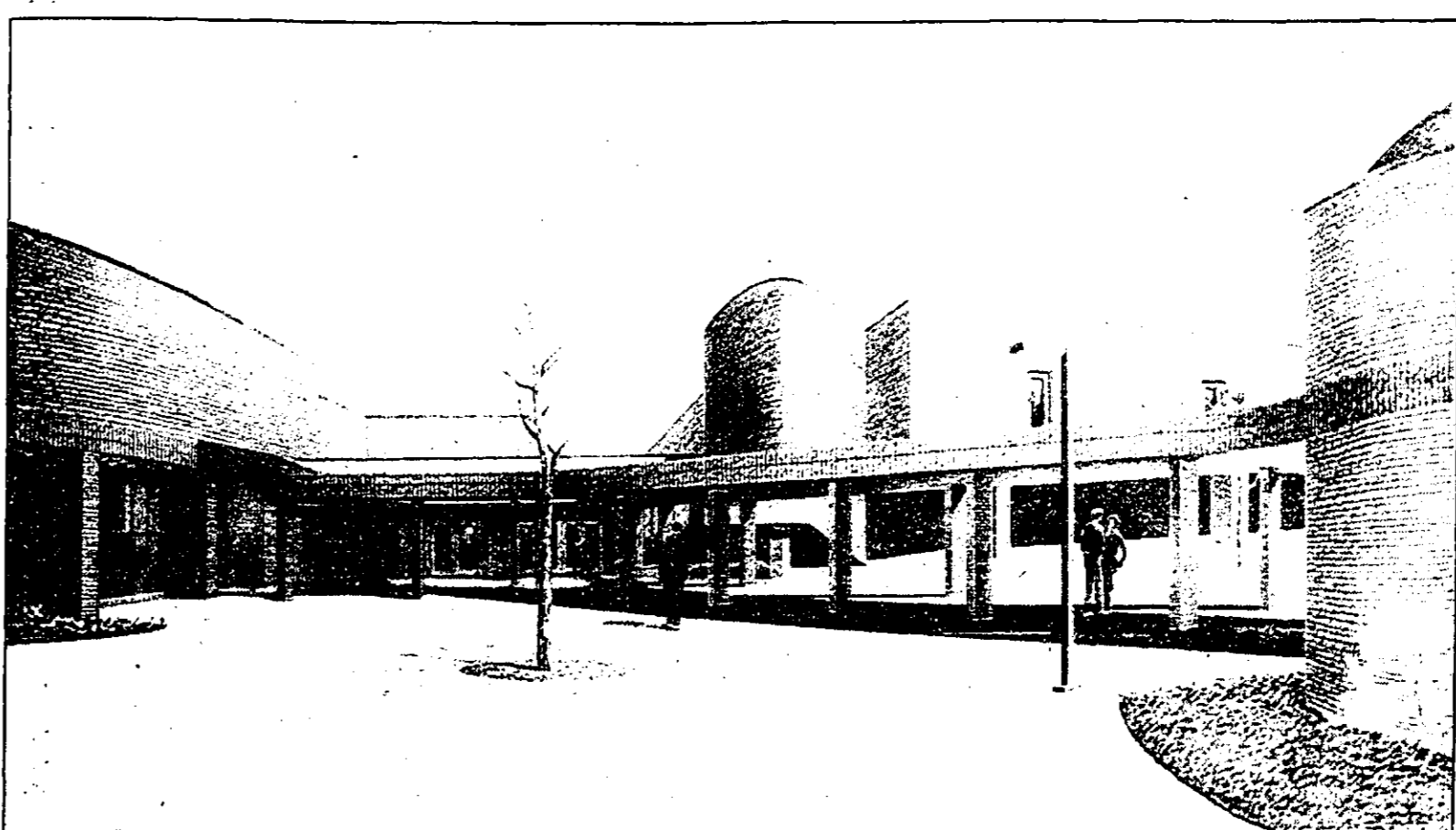

Board plans vote on walkway

The Novi school board got its first look at a possible design for a walkway between the high school and commons building last week, but stopped short of voting on whether the walkway will be built.

Students and school officials have talked about a high school walkway for years, and a final decision may come next week. The school board is

scheduled to vote at its meeting Thursday, Oct. 1, on whether to build the walkway and also when.

Students have appeared before the board in the past to request an enclosed walkway, saying that the trip between the two buildings during bad weather can be cold and dangerous.

The new drawing by architect Al Riebe shows an open-air walkway with a covered area 21 feet wide. He said it was designed to harmonize with the architecture of both buildings.

Riebe estimated his design would cost \$101,000 to build. Completely enclosing the walkway would cost an additional \$85,000.

Tajal Shah, the student representative to the school board, said the design as proposed looked attractive, but would still be cold. She suggested that if the walkway is built, it be done during the summer so construction noise wouldn't interfere with classes and students wouldn't interfere with the workers.

The board considered voting on the issue last week, but that proposal died on a 3-3 vote.

'Upper El' name is Novi Meadows

The Novi Community School District's fifth and sixth grade building, which has a history of more name changes than Cher, formally became Novi Meadows School at last week's school board meeting.

The school, which has spent a year officially as Novi Upper Elementary, has also been known by the names Middle School North, North Middle School, and North Upper Elementary. The Upper Elementary name was adopted last year for a one-year trial.

The new name came from a committee — chaired by Board Member Sharon Pelchat — which originally recommended Novi Meadows Intermediate. Several board members, however, said that the word intermediate suggested the building is a middle school, when it is not. A separate building for fifth and sixth grades is an unusual arrangement in Michigan schools.

Superintendent Robert Pwiko said if the word intermediate was included in the name, the district would constantly have to define it. "Everyone has a different concep-

tion of what it means," he said. The name Novi Meadows School passed the board on a 5-1 vote with Schram dissenting. "Don't put me on a committee any more," Pelchat joked after the vote.

Novi Meadows Principal Joseph Imrick said of the change: "I think it's nice. I hope it takes away some of the controversy over the name that has existed."

Imrick said that once student council officers are elected at the school, the council will probably plan an inauguration ceremony for the name and maybe a student logo contest.

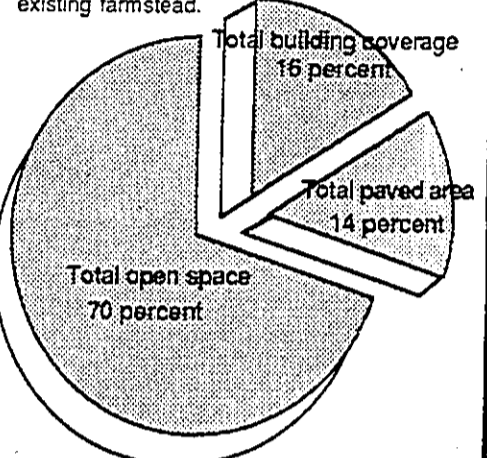

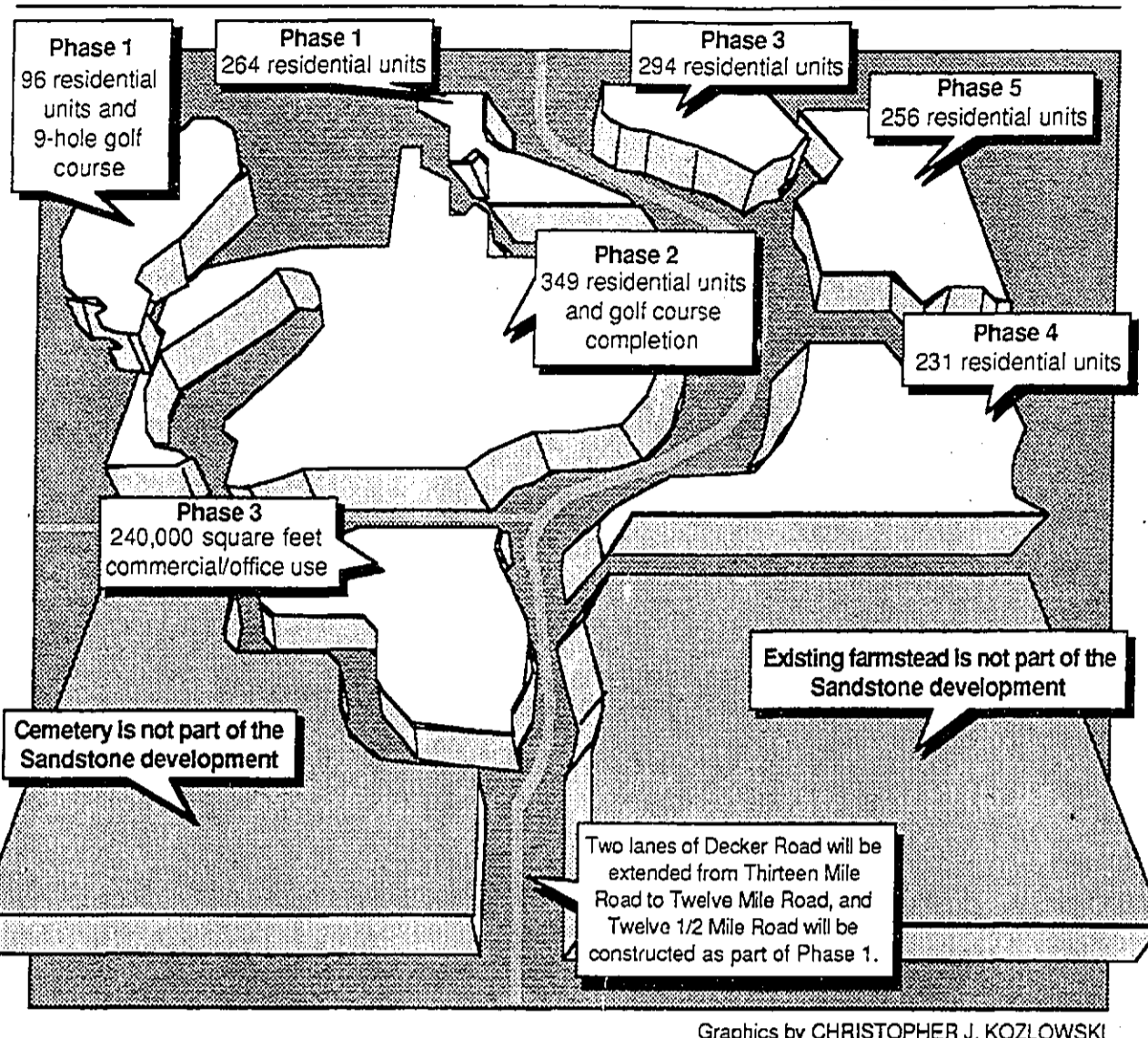

Section 11 community plan is largest residential project in Novi's history

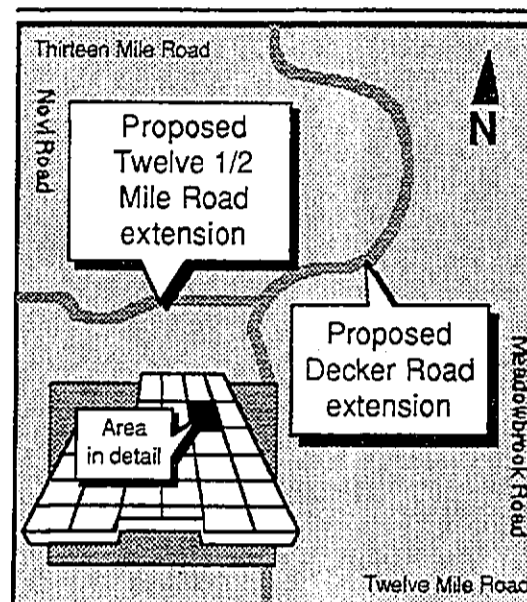
PROPOSED CONSTRUCTION PHASING PLAN

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Planning continues for school building projects

While officials of the Novi City Council and Novi Board of Education try to resolve their disagreement about authority over new construction, planning continues for the district's four major building projects.

Financial picture good for building

A preliminary budget for the four building projects financed by the Novi Community School District's \$6.25 million bond issue concludes that the projects are all "in good shape" financially.

School (formerly Novi Upper Elementary). The new building would house maintenance facilities and provide warehouse space.

At last week's meeting, the board approved working drawings of the buildings, subject to resolving any objections the city may raise to the site plan, submitted last week.

The school board is scheduled to consider schematic drawings of the administration building at its Oct. 15 meeting. Construction is planned for April to August, 1988.

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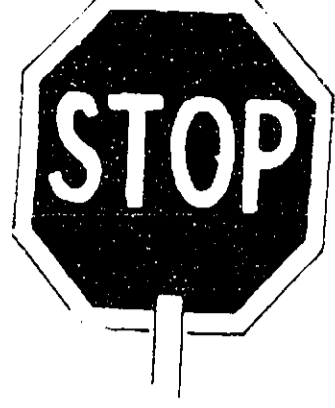

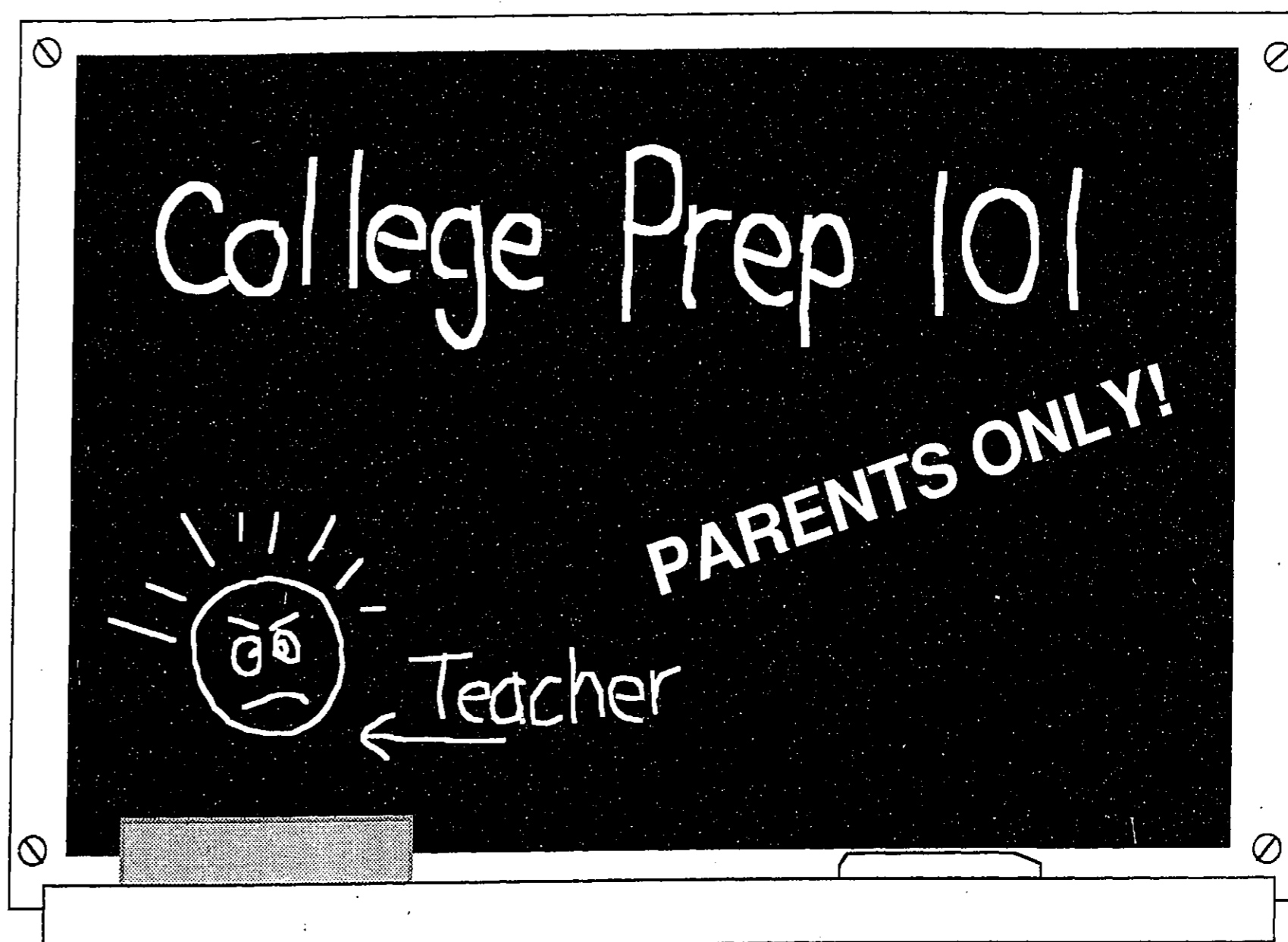

Parents learn ABCs of academic advising

Students are not the only ones returning to classrooms this fall. Parents are heading back to class to learn how to be better academic counselors in an effort to make their children even better students.

"Managing the Transition from High School to College to Careers" is the title of a new seminar being offered by the Novi Community Education Department, scheduled to take place Sept. 29.

Although it sounds like a class for high school seniors, the class is actually aimed at parents who wish to more closely guide their children's academic career.

The class is being taught by First Semester, Inc., a Farmington Hills-based private counseling firm. As more and more high school academic counselors become overburdened with too many students to advise on a wide variety of topics, private consulting firms are becoming more popular with students who are preparing for their educational futures.

"Some of our studies show that high school counselors are very, very busy with 300-400 students," said William Hall, president of First Semester. "In addition to academic planning and scheduling changes, they have substance abuses, pregnancies and suicides to deal with. So they do not have the amount of time that we think is appropriate to help youngsters make some intelligent decisions about life and help them get into the right colleges."

Hall said the college selection process poses difficulties for parents as well as for students. "It is a confusing time for parents, too," he said.

"The purpose of next week's seminar is to share with parents some of the issues and concerns that parents should be thinking about. (It is) an opportunity for parents to understand the steps they should be taking

assessment, college planning (selection, application procedures, etc.), standardized testing and financial aid.

Out of 3,000 educational institutions that may be available to an individual student, Hall said First Semester seminars provide insight into the key ingredients for deciding which institution would be the best to choose.

The standardized testing seminar offers an explanation of what kinds of tests students should expect to take, how the tests work, and how to most effectively take them for the best results.

"It is not just cramming and tricks and short-term drills," Hall said.

Probably the topic that interests most parents is how to finance a college education, especially as annual tuition rates soar high enough to compete with purchase prices for a new car. At a time when more and more financial aid programs are being decreased annually, paying for college is a primary concern.

Hall estimates that about 20 percent of the students who last year received Guaranteed Student Loans to attend the University of Michigan will not receive financial aid this year because of the 1988 Tax Act.

There is hope, Hall said, but it will take planning.

"There are ways to position yourself to make college a lot more affordable than what we think a lot of parents know," Hall said.

"College can be more affordable if you take a look at it a little earlier on and start planning for it."

In addition to next week's Novi session, First Semester will also be conducting parent-oriented sessions Oct. 6 in West Bloomfield, Oct. 13 in Birmingham and Oct. 14 in Dearborn. The fee for attending the Novi seminar is \$4 per family. For more information contact Novi Community Education at 348-1200.

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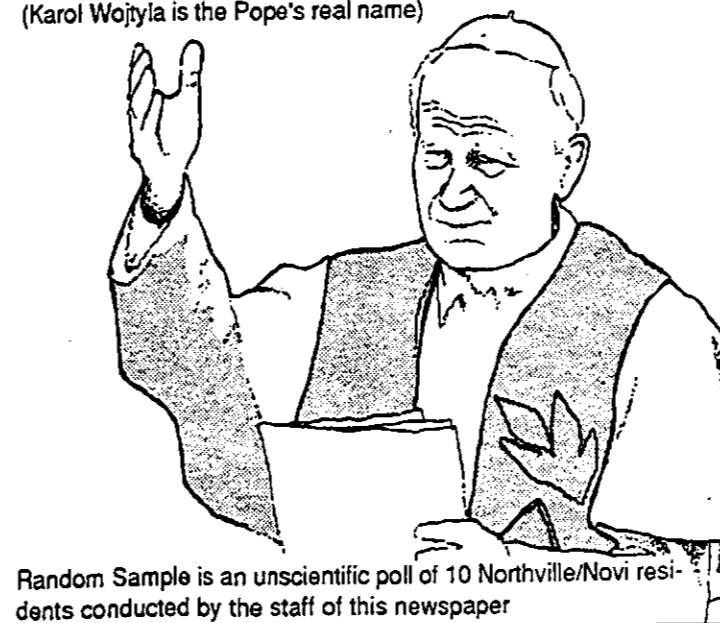

Sexual devotion leads to bigger weddings

If an unmarried couple has been living together for some time, isn't it silly for them to have a big wedding?

Not at all, according to University of Michigan sociologist Martin Whyte.

"Elaborate weddings help stress the differences between cohabitation and marriage — two stages that may seem to be alike but are actually two fundamentally different states," said Whyte.

"Weddings symbolize the bride and groom's promise to give up their liberal premarital sexual options for marital fidelity. That is one major reason why there are so many big weddings now."

Whyte's conclusion are based on data that covers 60 years of dating and mating habits in metropolitan Detroit. To collect the data, he and his students interviewed 459 women. Sixty-six were married between 1924 and 1944. Another 180 were post-World War II brides between 1945 and 1964, and 209 wed between 1965 and 1984.

Whyte found some major changes in premarital sexual

behavior, but he also discovered some surprising continuities in attitudes about marriage and adherence to tradition.

"A significant change," Whyte said, "was the rise in cohabitation and premarital pregnancy. Forty percent of the recent brides had chabited before marriage, but not one of the women in the pre-war generation had done so. Also, 27 percent of the brides in the recent generation were pregnant when they marched down the aisle, compared with just 11 percent of the

ceremonious than their mothers' or grandmothers."

For example, he said, nearly three-fourths of the recent brides were married in a church or synagogue compared to just two-thirds of their grandmothers' generation. And 82 percent of the women in all three generations said they had been married by a minister, priest or rabbi.

Guest lists have been getting longer, too. The average number of guests invited to receptions has tripled from 50 to 150 since the pre-war generation. "Part of this is due to increased prosperity," Whyte said, "but the public statement is a very important factor."

Wedding showers are also in fashion. More than two-thirds of the recent brides had showers compared with 57 percent of the post-World War II brides and 39 percent of the pre-war brides.

Honeymoons, however, have been optional. In the past, about half the brides went back to work immediately after the wedding, and 40 percent of the recent brides still do.

Wildcat cagers suffer three straight defeats

Coach Debbie Harris wants it known that her Wildcat basketball team has been playing very well lately even though it has not been winning.

Following a nice season-opening win at North Farmington, the Novi cagers have now dropped three in a row. All three games have been against quality opponents and all three defeats have been quite close — by a combined total of just 18 points.

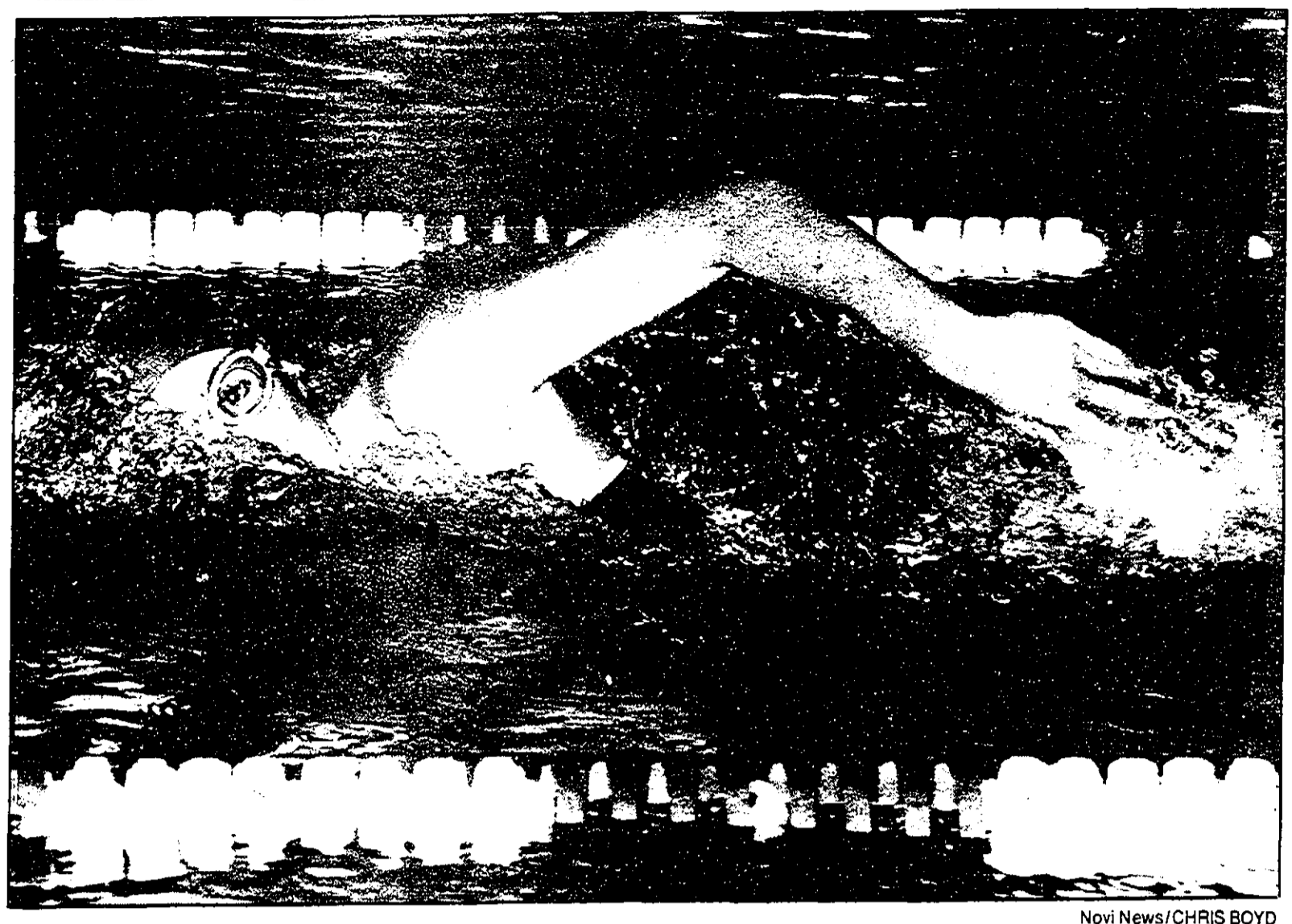

The two disqualifications, the result of stricter MHSAA false-start rules, were particularly costly to the 'Cats because they happened to a pair of Novi's best performers in two of their better events. Christie Duthie was banished for an early start in the 100-yard butterfly and Chris Marker was caught in the same situation in the 500 freestyle race.

The junior also grabbed a win in the 100 backstroke (1:04:29).

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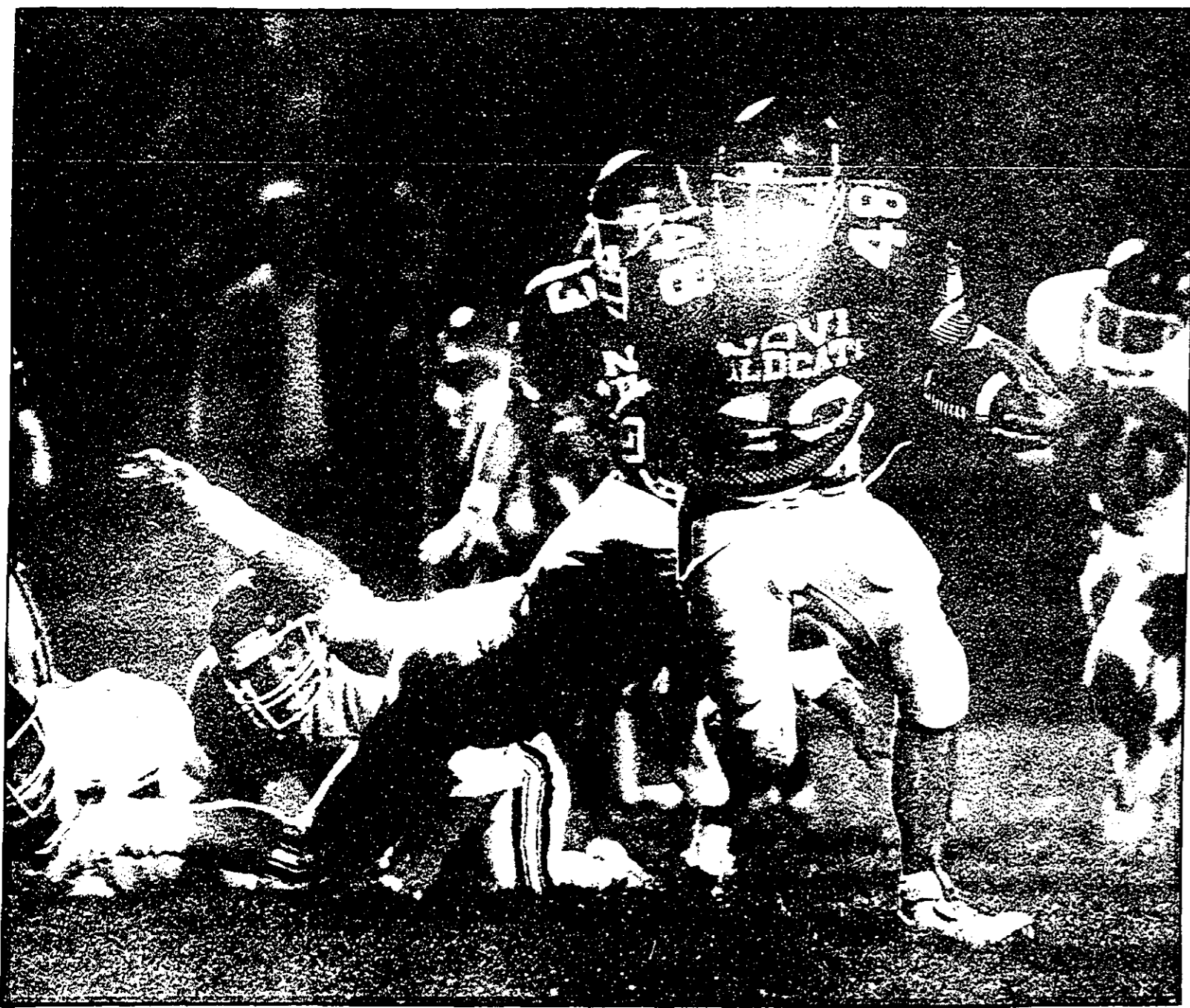

The second quarter wasn't any better, but this time the Novi mistakes had no impact on the score. With less than five minutes left in the half, Schram connected on a 27-yard sideline pass to receiver George Arnold. Following a parade of penalties by both teams, Wladischkin cut back on an off-tackle run, outspurred the entire defense and scored his second T.D. of the day from 25 yards out. McGuffin's kick was good and the Wildcats took a 14-0 lead into the locker room.

"I thought the score right before halftime was very important to our team," Osborne said. "It gave us a little breathing room and momentum."

Novi put together a 75-yard drive to open the second half, although it, too, was marred with flags. The big play in the drive was a 28-yard pass from Schram to fullback Neil Garry that moved the ball inside the Dragon 10. On a key fourth down play at the Lake Orion three-yard line, Osborne elected to go for the touchdown, and Wladischkin dove in for the six points. The conversion made it 21-0.

The 'Cats only other score came midway through the third quarter when cornerback Jason Korte picked off a Dragon pass and returned it inside the Lake Orion 19. When the drive stalled, McGuffin was perfect on a 30-yard field goal.

"Mike's worked real hard and has added strength in his leg," Osborne pointed out. "That is the key with him. He's done an excellent job for us, especially on his kickoffs."

With a 24-0 lead, Novi began to make wholesale substitutions on offense and defense, but still had several scoring opportunities. With

about 10 minutes left, the 'Cats moved inside the Lake Orion 10 before fumbling it away. And with time running out, the offense moved inside the Dragon 15 before turning it over on downs.

"I was actually surprised how easy we handled them," Osborne said. "They are on the other side of the county and I don't know too much about them. I do know they are a big school, but we've got a fine football team. I'm impressed with our defense, and our kicking game is solid."

Wladischkin was the offensive star of the game with 79 yards on 11 carries and the three touchdowns. Defensively, middle linebacker Bret Keir had perhaps his best outing of the season with eight solo stops and two assists. Dave Skown (four solos, five assists) and Marc Passino (four solos, four assists) also had good outings.

"Bret Keir was outstanding," Osborne said. "The thing about our defense is that we force teams to make perfect plays, and when you need perfection to beat someone, the odds are not in your favor."

The win was also sweet revenge for last year's 14-7 loss to Lake Orion at the Silverdome. It was Novi's only loss in '86, and the team dedicated the victory to former star runner Joel Finzel, who was tragically killed last summer.

"Some things were said before the game about Joel and I think the kids used it as incentive to win," Osborne said.

The 'Cats get back into the rigors of the Kensington Valley Conference tomorrow (Friday, Sept. 25) as they travel to Milford to take on the Redskins.

New rules to benefit deer hunt

Michigan firearm deer hunters will benefit from liberalized hunting regulations this fall, as the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) launches programs aimed at providing new opportunities for hunters and solving crop and silviculture problems.

The new hunting opportunities include:

- A limited bonus deer option,
- More hunters choice licenses available.

- Expanded areas open for hunters choice.
- More landowner limited hunting areas.

- An extended season in Menominee County (in the Upper Peninsula) and
- The availability of leftover hunters choice licenses.

Again this fall, hunters will be permitted to purchase a second buck license after the Sept. 24 deadline for hunters choice license applications.

In the Upper Peninsula zone, a different bonus feature is offered. In units 215 and 414, hunters with hunters choice licenses must present an antlerless deer to a DNR Field Office in order to obtain an additional kill tag, valid for either a buck or antlerless deer. Unit 215 hunters will report to the city of Stephenson; Unit 414 to the city of Norway.

This year, an additional 38,190 hunters choice licenses will be issued statewide, which allow hunters to take either a buck or a doe.

Along with the additional hunters choice licenses, expanded areas have been opened to hunters. There are 140 units open for antlerless hunting, an increase of 17 percent compared to last year. Those units are listed in the 1987 hunters choice license application guide available at all license dealer locations and DNR offices.

Unit 215 (in the Upper Peninsula) will have an extended Dec. 1-15 firearm deer season for those with hunters choice licenses. That means any Unit 215 hunters choice license holder may hunt from November 15 to December 15 in Unit 215.

In units where high crop and silviculture damage is being experienced, hunters may obtain unclaimed hunters choice license by appearing at designated DNR offices. Those units and offices are Unit 215 (beginning Nov. 15 at the Stephenson Field Office/906-753-6317); Units 137, 138 and 156 (beginning Nov. 1 at the Plainwell District Office/616-855-6851); Units 147, 150 and 151 (beginning Nov. 1 at the Jackson District Office/517-784-3188); and Unit 36 (beginning Nov. 1 at the Grand Rapids District Office/616-456-5071).

The limited bonus deer option allows hunters who possess a regular hunter choice or landowner limited license to take an additional antlerless deer in specified deer harvest units.

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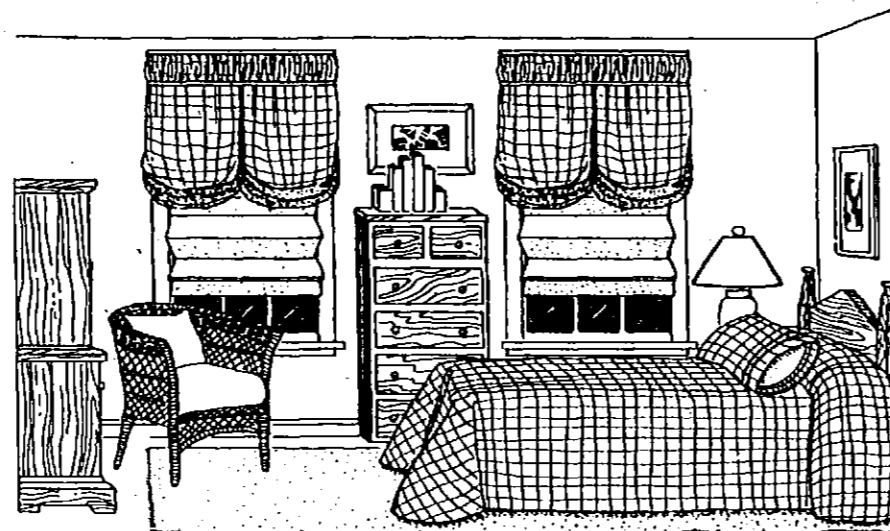
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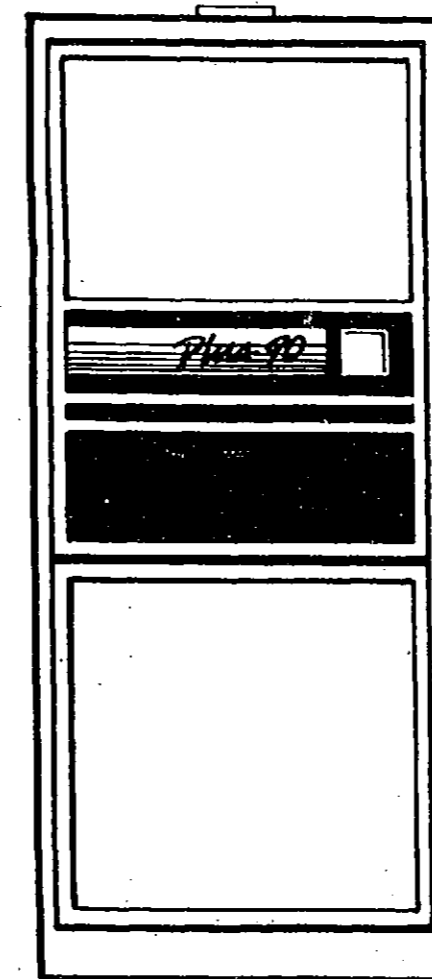
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Autumnfest '87 offers fun for all ages

Phelps Hines, chairman for the art market, emphasizes that this is completely a fine arts show, without crafts.

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
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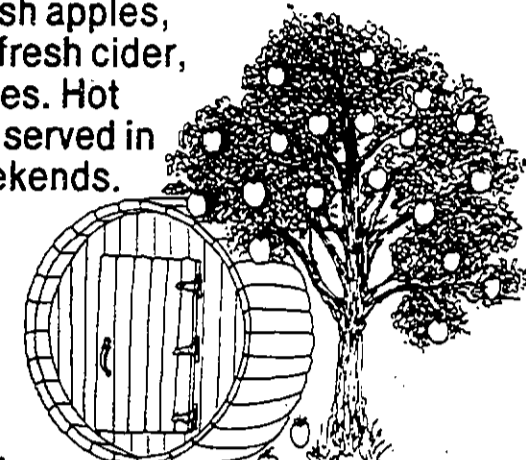
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Arts commission sponsors juried market as new Autumnfest feature this weekend

She offers "how to" information to improve techniques.

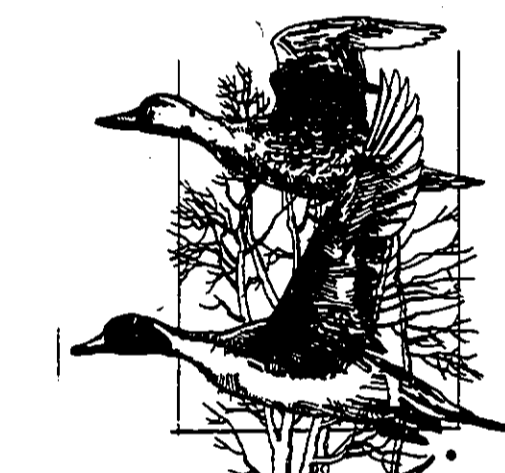
Recreation center to hold Autumnfest open house

Recreation commissioners and the staff will be on hand to discuss future plans for recreation in Northville.

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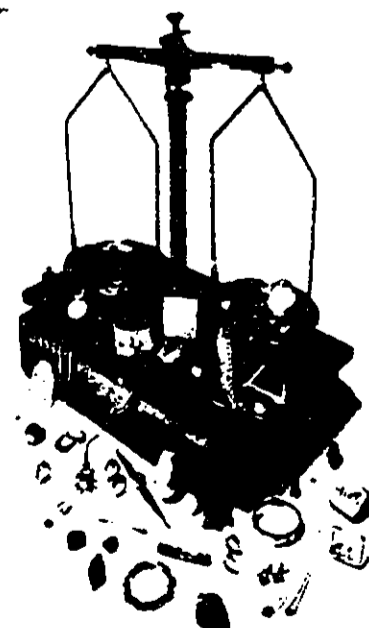

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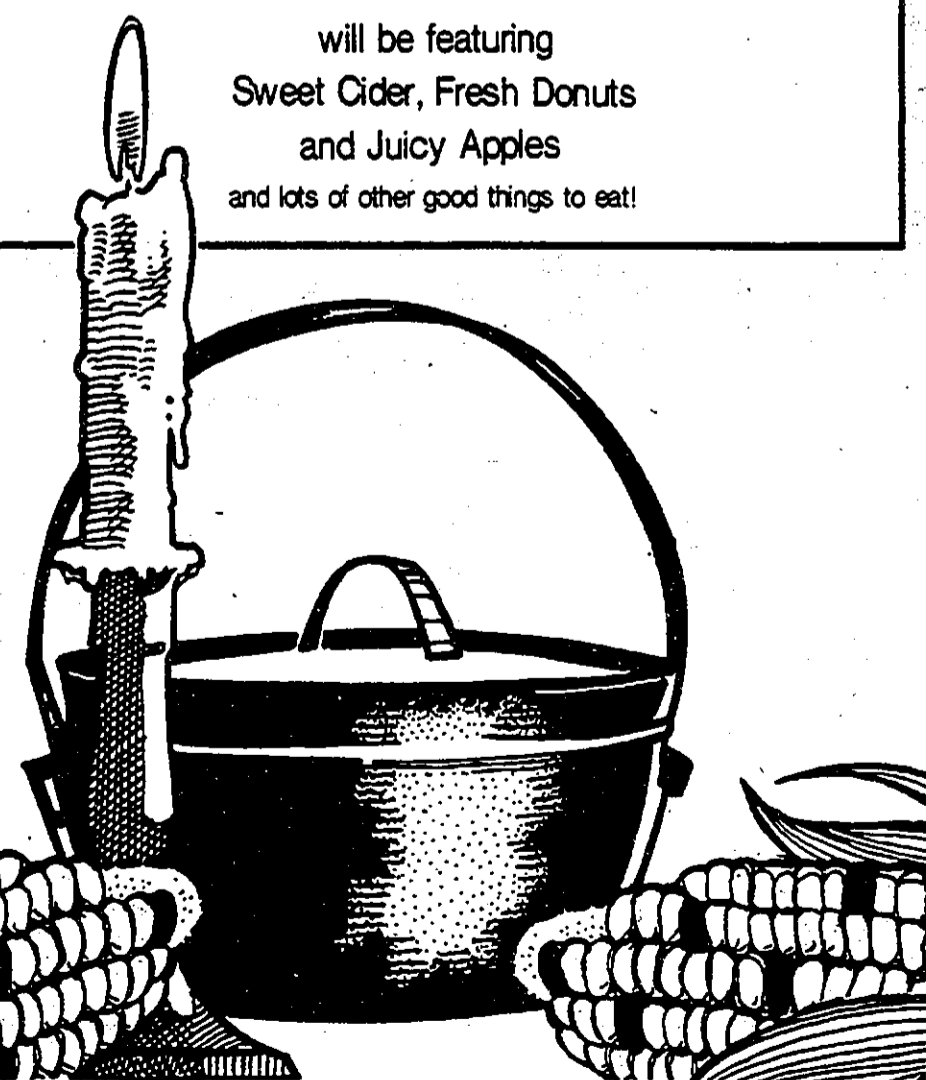

open daily from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.

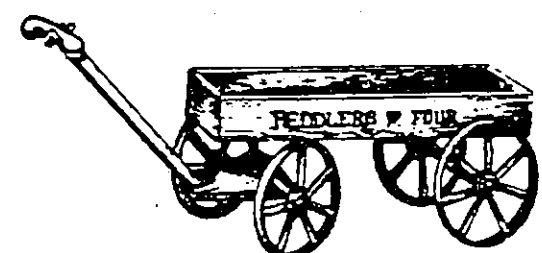
In addition to cider and donuts visitors may purchase caramel apples, hot dogs and kielbasa on the weekends.
