Fortune smiles on Novi

It started out as a practical joke and before she knew it, Novi resident Anna Lisa Loisel was standing beside Pat Sajak as a contestant on "Wheel of Fortune."

Loiselle's husband, Michael, volunteered her to audition for the popular game show when he found out they were going to be in Los Angeles on business last March, she said.

During the audition, potential contestants, including Loiselle, were given a test consisting of various puzzles, she said. The test had to be completed in five minutes.

After passing the test, Loiselle and a group of others played the word puzzle game in a classroom-type session.

"When we were done playing the game, we had to tell everyone about ourselves to make sure we had the right personality for television," Loiselle said.

The list of potential candidates was then narrowed down to five people, with Loiselle among the finalists, and those who were selected were asked to return the following day to play the game again.

Loiselle returned home from the trip not knowing if and when she would be chosen to appear on the show. Shortly afterward, she was notified by mail that she would be a "Wheel of Fortune" contestant.

"I was asked to choose three months in order of preference that I'd like to appear," she said.

The particular show featuring Loiselle was taped on Jan. 11. She and her husband flew back out to California for the taping.

"It's all at your own expense, which most people aren't aware of, so we decided to make a vacation out of it," Loiselle said.

Loiselle's husband and parents sat in the studio audience, providing her with her own cheering section.

"Playing the game there is not at all what it's like at home," she commented. "When you're watching it on television, it's always your turn, but when you're playing it as a con-

Woman killed by car

A 22-year-old Novi woman was struck by a car and killed early Monday morning on Grand River Avenue (M102), about a half mile west of Drake Road in Farmington Hills.

Deborah Jean-Fay Commander apparently was walking along the right side of the road at about 2:40 a.m. Monday when a car traveling eastbound on Grand River hit her from behind and fled the scene, according to police.

Sgt. Ray Cranston of the Farmington Hills Police Department said officers received a call at about 2:45 a.m. Monday informing them that a pedestrian was lying in the east-bound lane of Grand River Avenue.

Upon arriving at the scene, paramedics contacted Botsford General Hospital, in Farmington Hills, by direct line and after several minutes of communication, she was pronounced dead at the site, Cranston said.

Police have no suspects in the accident and are asking for input from anyone who may have witnessed the accident.

"Right now we're treating this as a hit and run fatality," Cranston said. "At this time we're particularly interested in information and we're asking that anyone driving eastbound on Grand River Monday at about 2:45 a.m. who may have seen a pedestrian walking along the highway to contact the Farmington Hills Police Department."

Wixom man held in deputy slaying

A Wayne County Sheriff's deputy, Russell Francis Dickson, 36, of Livonia, was found dead in Wixom last Sunday, Feb. 7.

Wixom resident, Henry L. Johnson Jr., 58, was arrested at his home later that same day. Johnson was arraigned on charges of open murder and possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony in 52nd District Court on Monday, Feb. 8.

According to a statement released by the Wixom police department, Dickson was found by Wixom police officer James Osborne at approximately 5:58 a.m. Osborne had been dispatched to the area of Twelve Mile Road, east of Napier in the City of Wixom, on a call of an injury accident.

Osborne found Dickson lying face down in the roadway at the scene. A check by the officer and medical technicians at the scene determined that Dickson was deceased. The police report noted an initial report of massive injuries to the head area.

A check for identification found

that the man, Dickson, was employed by the Wayne County Sheriff's department as a deputy.

The crime lab division of the Northville State Police was dispatched to the area. An investigator from the Oakland County Medical Examiner's office took charge of the victim for transport and autopsy.

An autopsy Monday showed that Dickson had died of multiple gunshot wounds to the head, according to the Oakland County Medical Examiner's office.

Johnson, who stood mute during his arraignment, was ordered held without bond. Johnson operates a wood selling business out of his home on Grand River in Wixom. According to Wixom Police Sgt. Richard Howe, police have no motive for the killing but are still investigating the matter. Wixom police have not released information revealing how they came to arrest Johnson.

Evidence compiled by the Forensic Science's Division of the Criminal Laboratory revealed that the homicide did not occur at the location that the body was discovered. Police have no motive in the killing at this time. The case

is still under investigation. Johnson will face a pre-trial hearing on Feb. 19 at 8:30 a.m. in 52nd District Court in Walled Lake.

Dickson was off-duty at the time of the incident. He was a 13-year veteran of the department who had recently been transferred to road

patrol. In 1981 Dickson received the medal of valor, one of the Wayne County Sheriff Department's highest honors, after being shot.

Armed robber sought

The Novi Police Department is seeking a black man in his mid-20s for stealing a car from a Farmington Hills man at gunpoint on Feb. 4 in a parking lot at Twelve Oaks Mall.

The armed robbery occurred about 8:50 p.m. in the mall's Lord & Taylor parking lot when the suspect allegedly approached a 39-year-old Farmington Hills man and his daughter with a sawed-off shotgun and ordered them to get out of a 1987 black four-door Mercedes while leaving the keys inside, police said.

After ordering the man and his daughter out of the car, the suspect got into the Mercedes and drove

away, according to police reports. The man and his daughter were not hurt in the incident and no attempt was made to take his wallet or personal items.

The suspect is described as a black male in his mid-20s with medium dark skin, about 5-feet 7-inches to 5-feet 10-inches tall, weighing about 150 pounds, with a light mustache and a rough complexion. Police composite drawings indicate the suspect has long, messy straight black hair that is worn combed back. The man was wearing a knee-length gray coat at the time of the robbery, according to witnesses.

Police records state that the

suspect concealed the sawed-off shotgun under his coat and exposed it to the victims when speaking to them. The shotgun apparently has a shiny barrel and may be made of nickel.

A dirty mid-size gray car in poor condition, possibly a 1975 General Motors model, may have been involved in the robbery, police said. The suspicious car was parked directly behind the Mercedes at the time of the incident.

The stolen Mercedes, valued at \$35,000, was recovered by Detroit police on Feb. 7.

School debate heats up again

The conflict over who rightly oversees the planning and construction of school buildings in Novi is once again appearing on agendas all over the city.

The differences in opinions also are causing heated discussions between planning commissioners, city council members and members of the school district. Meanwhile, construction work on the school district's new maintenance/warehouse building continues.

An apparent communication lapse between the Novi Planning Commission and the Novi Community School District over construction of the facility was noted by planning commissioners during their Feb. 3 meeting.

Commissioner Kathleen McLallen pointed out that the building was already three-quarters built but that she was not aware of any permits that have been issued to the school district by the planning commission or city officials.

She said the planning commission's concerns about reviewing the building's construction process were supposedly going to be addressed by representatives of the school district in a letter, but the commission had not yet received such a document.

McLallen said construction of any building within Novi required conformance to city ordinances and regulations and asked the school district to defend its position about why it hasn't approached the planning commission.

Kureth: 'I hope there's still a chance to rectify this situation.'

Commissioner Charles Kureth said because the building is as far into construction as it is — with site plans just now coming into the city — it seems as though the school board has established its stance. Nevertheless, he noted the school district is still required to abide by city building standards.

"I hope there's still a chance to rectify this situation," Kureth said.

Actual construction of the school maintenance warehouse facility began in November. The building is on school district property at Eleven Mile and Taft Road.

The debate about construction of the facility originated over proper jurisdiction for school district building plans. The district maintained it was not bound by a city review while city and planning commission officials argued the district should follow the process established for all construction in the city.

The issue appeared to be resolved when the school district and city council accepted a "Memorandum of Understanding" concerning construction of the warehouse facility.

City water supply to serve schools

Existing and soon-to-be constructed buildings on Novi Community School District's 36-acre parcel of land eventually will be served by the city's water system.

The Novi Board of Education unanimously agreed to pursue plans to hook into the city water system at its Feb. 4 meeting.

Assistant Superintendent William Barr told board members he had already conducted preliminary discussions with Novi planning officials about the district's intentions.

As proposed, the city water system would accommodate the district's new elementary building, its new administration facility, its new maintenance warehouse building and the Novi Woods, Novi Meadows and Novi Middle schools.

Superintendent Robert Piwko said the district will have its own service-type water line although it will be owned by the city. The district will have to provide easements so the water line can be run through school property and fire hydrants are expected to be located nearby.

Barr explained the city water line serving the school buildings would be picked up at the Yorkshire subdivi-

sion and run northwest onto school district property.

As long as the district has its own well system, Piwko said it's not obligated to use the city water system, although doing so could save the district \$75,000 to \$80,000.

If the district decided not to use city water, it would cost \$65,000 to \$70,000 to install a pump and water softener at the new elementary building, Barr told the board. An additional \$7,500 to \$10,000 would be needed to supply water to the new administration facility when it is completed, he estimated.

Although it will cost the district about \$60,000 to hook into the city water system, savings would be felt in softening water.

Piwko and Barr told board members they needed to make a decision about whether or not to use city water because of all the construction going on within the district now. They said the initial hook-up costs could be absorbed in the district's \$8.25 million bond issue or taken out of the general fund.

Board member Stephen Hitchcock said it would be well worth it for the district to have city water just for fighting fires.

Board member Joan Daley agreed.

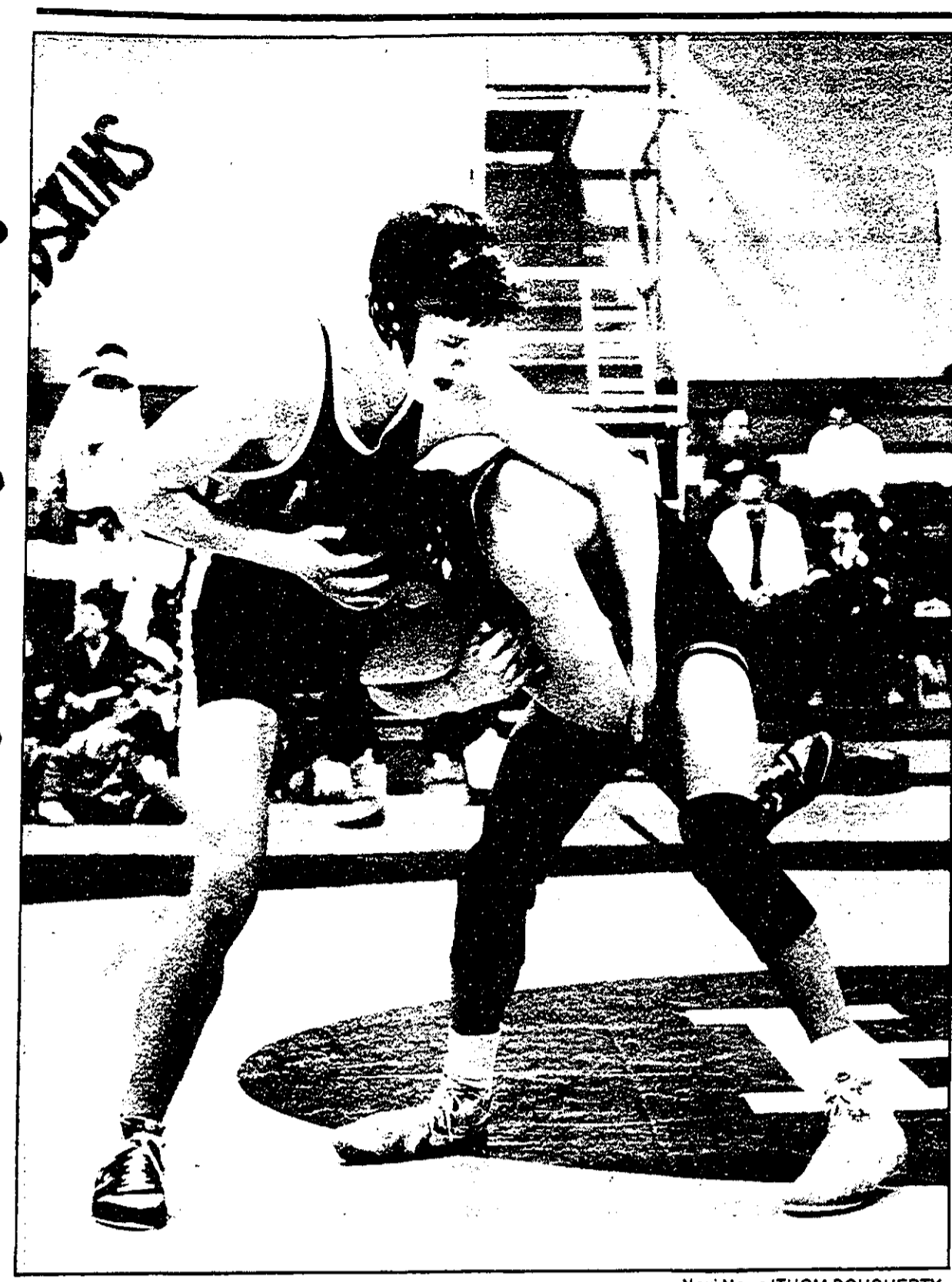

School reviewed in report

A special discussion session among Novi Board of Education members, school staff and interested residents is being planned to talk about a report issued by the North Central Association evaluation team after visiting the high school.

Novi High School Principal Robert Youngberg presented board members with copies of the report at their Feb. 4 meeting. The written evaluation was based on a three-day November 1986.

The 69-page report outlines strengths and weaknesses in the school, community, curriculum, staff and individual classes. A list of recommendations also is included in the report.

Youngberg told the board he and his staff have reviewed the report in detail and have addressed potential problems.

He noted that several of the committee's recommendations contradicted each other and some of them don't apply because they are already in practice at the school.

Superintendent Robert Piwko agreed there were some philosophical differences contained in the study.

Board member Stephen Hitchcock commented that he'd like to have time to study the document and suggested the board meet to discuss it, perhaps in a Saturday session.

Copies of the report are available to the public and may be picked up at Novi High School.

Schools, city debate over building inspection method

Continued from 1
School board members accepted the "understanding" at their Dec. 3 meeting and city council members voted to accept it at their Dec. 5 meeting.
The memo was ratified after school board president Robert Schram, Superintendent Robert Piwko, Mayor Pro-Tem Edward Leininger and City Manager Edward Kriewall met to discuss questions raised by the city council over safety issues at the warehouse facility.
During the meeting of the four officials, the board agreed to submit site plans for the building and to indicate on the plans the location of two underground gasoline storage tanks on the grounds.
Planning commissioners at their Feb. 3 meeting, noted that they have not been contacted by school district officials regarding the facility. They also said they have not been made aware of and when any site plans have been submitted for the maintenance building.

Projects spur debate

Hoyer: 'There was a simple solution to this. The school district could have done what the city did in building the civic center building.'
The unresolved issue of who is responsible for overseeing the Novi Community School District's construction projects has turned into a four-month saga of back-and-forth discussion and finger pointing between the two city bodies and the Novi School Board.
During the Feb. 8 city council meeting the discussion over the school district's maintenance/warehouse facility again ended with some members of the council finding the "informal agreement process" sufficient to solve the problem, and others less than happy with the procedure. Planning Commissioner Kathleen McLallen also expressed displeasure with the method.

Skiers glide into class

If it's early on a below-zero February Saturday morning, chances are most people will snuggle further down into the blankets and give serious thought to staying in bed all day.

But then they haven't discovered cross country skiing.

If they had, then those same slugs might have joined 20 of their neighbors out at Maybury Park in Northville for the Novi Parks and Recreation Department's Cross Country Ski Clinic.

On Feb. 6, a hardy band of beginning skiers braved the icy temperatures for almost two hours of introductory instruction in the

Nordic skiing technique. Their guide was recreation teacher Patty Smith. Smith met the class at the warming/concession/ski rental house inside Maybury State Park. She helped the class find skis to fit and gave a brief rundown on the proper clothing to wear skiing. Best bets? Easy-fitting layers of wool and cotton on the inside and a wind-resistant shell of some kind on the outside.

Outside, students put on skis and got the feel of the free-heel bindings of cross country skis. Many in the class had been regular downhill or Alpine skiers and were used to the tighter fit of those bindings. One of the biggest mistakes first-time skiers make, Smith told the class, is not using the bending motion of the foot and staying too stiff on the skis. Bent knees and relaxed bodies are a must, she said.

The group set off on a trial run through groomed trails in the park. The first real test came in the form of a modest hill leading to the playground area at Maybury. Despite a few spills, all were grinning when they gathered at the bottom for more pointers from Smith.

The group learned two methods for going up hill, and one for going down. Smith spoke about turning styles and skating methods while helping each student adjust his/her form.

Donna Nawrot of Northville runs the concession stand and ski rental at the park. She had a fire going by the time the class returned to the building. Nawrot is a longtime cross country skier who used to teach classes herself. "Anybody can learn to ski and can have fun doing it almost immediately," she said.

Wendy and Gordy Swirls of Novi said it was their first time on cross country skis and that they found the whole thing "kind of fun." All members of the class agreed the exercise was great and that they didn't feel the cold while they were moving.

Chuck and Terry Maple of Novi said they were trying cross country skiing because there wasn't enough downhill skiing available. "I'm willing to give it a try," Chuck said.

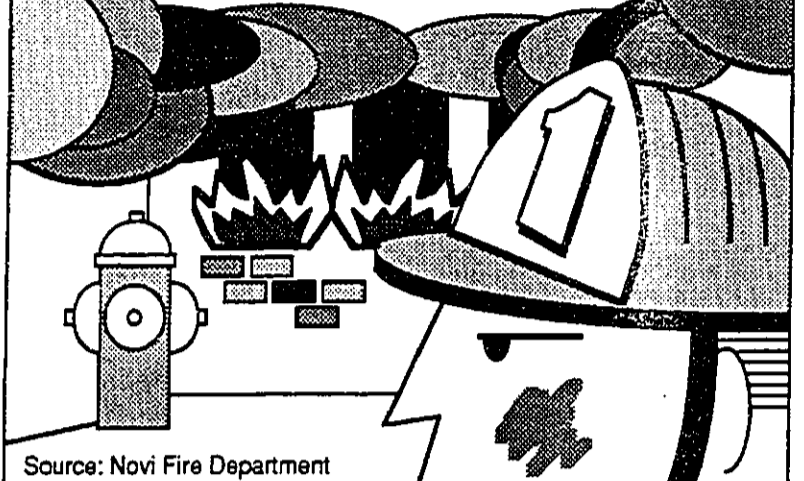

Incidents of fire rose by 35 percent during 1987 in Novi, according to end-of-the-year statistics released recently by the fire department.

Overall there were 960 fire incidents in the city, up from a total of 617 in 1986. Out of those 960 incidents, 80 of them involved residential houses. Only 73 houses were involved in fire incidents in all of 1986.

The main change in fire incidents was a significant rise in the number of fire emergency and rescue runs undertaken by the Novi department. The department answered a total of 177 fire emergency runs in 1987, up from a total of 142 emergency fire runs in 1986.

The department was authorized to begin a First Responder Emergency Response program in July of 1987 by the Novi City Council. During a recent city council meeting, Chief Arthur Lenaghan updated the council on the first six months of the program.

The First Responder program calls for a simultaneous dispatch during life threatening emergencies, of fire, police and ambulance units. The program was a recommendation of the city's Fire and Police Needs citizen committee.

Lenaghan said the department had found the program to be efficient and that the citizen's of Novi were receiving "upgraded service" because of the institution of the program.

The fire chief said that all members of the department are certified in advanced first aid and CPR and that 15 members of the department have been licensed as Emergency Medical Technicians following extensive training hours.

The department is also involved in a continuing education program with Novi's ambulance service, Community EMS, Lenaghan noted.

The main change in fire incidents was a significant rise in the number of fire emergency and rescue runs undertaken by the Novi department.

Since July the department has responded to 155 first responder incidents, Lenaghan said. The department averages 25 incidents per month with an average response time of 8.1 minutes. Lenaghan reported, with that the fire chief said that the police

department had no problems with the program and that "the general feeling was they were pleased with the program, it allows patrol personnel to be freed up from the scene."

There were 18 rescue runs in all of 1986, Lenaghan reported, with that figure rising to 238 for all of 1987.

Despite the additional runs taken by the department on both fire calls and on rescue jobs the department payroll total did not increase at all significantly. In 1986 the department payroll totaled \$135,117 and in 1987 the figure was \$135,498.

Lenaghan said several factors helped keep down the cost of the additional runs. He said the department's active fire prevention program helped by keeping the severity of incidents down and by not having the 3-4 hour runs that the department had in the past.

Lenaghan did note that while the department responded to 960 incidents involving either fires, false alarms or emergency responses, the department had over 1,700 runs for all service calls.

Board okays debate trip

Ten Novi debaters will enter the merry town of judge shops and horse-drawn carriages in May, when they travel to Mackinac Island to compete in the annual Lilac Festival tournament.

Novi Board of Education authorized the trip for the high school debate team at its Feb. 4 meeting, with the understanding that students will be expected to pay their own expenses for food and lodging. Each student will pay about \$135, which covers everything but two lunches.

The debaters plan to stay at the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island

from May 20 to the 22nd. The team has attended the tournament four times previously.

The board also agreed to pay expenses for the debate judge and coach, as well as mileage for two of the cars that will make the trip.

Board member Raymond Byers suggested the board pay for all of the participating student's costs because he said the trip is no different than those taken by school athletic teams.

Superintendent Robert Piwko pointed out that the Lilac Festival tournament only helps prepare the debate team for competition and is not an actual district event.

"For example, we would not pay for a group of basketball players going to camp for training," Piwko said.

If the debate team competes in district finals, it would be legitimate for the board to offset the student's costs, he added.

"Given that, we shouldn't pay for the coach and judge to go," Byers said.

The trip was approved 5-1, with Byers opposing it. The Lilac Festival tournament is the first debate tournament of the 1988-89 debate topic.

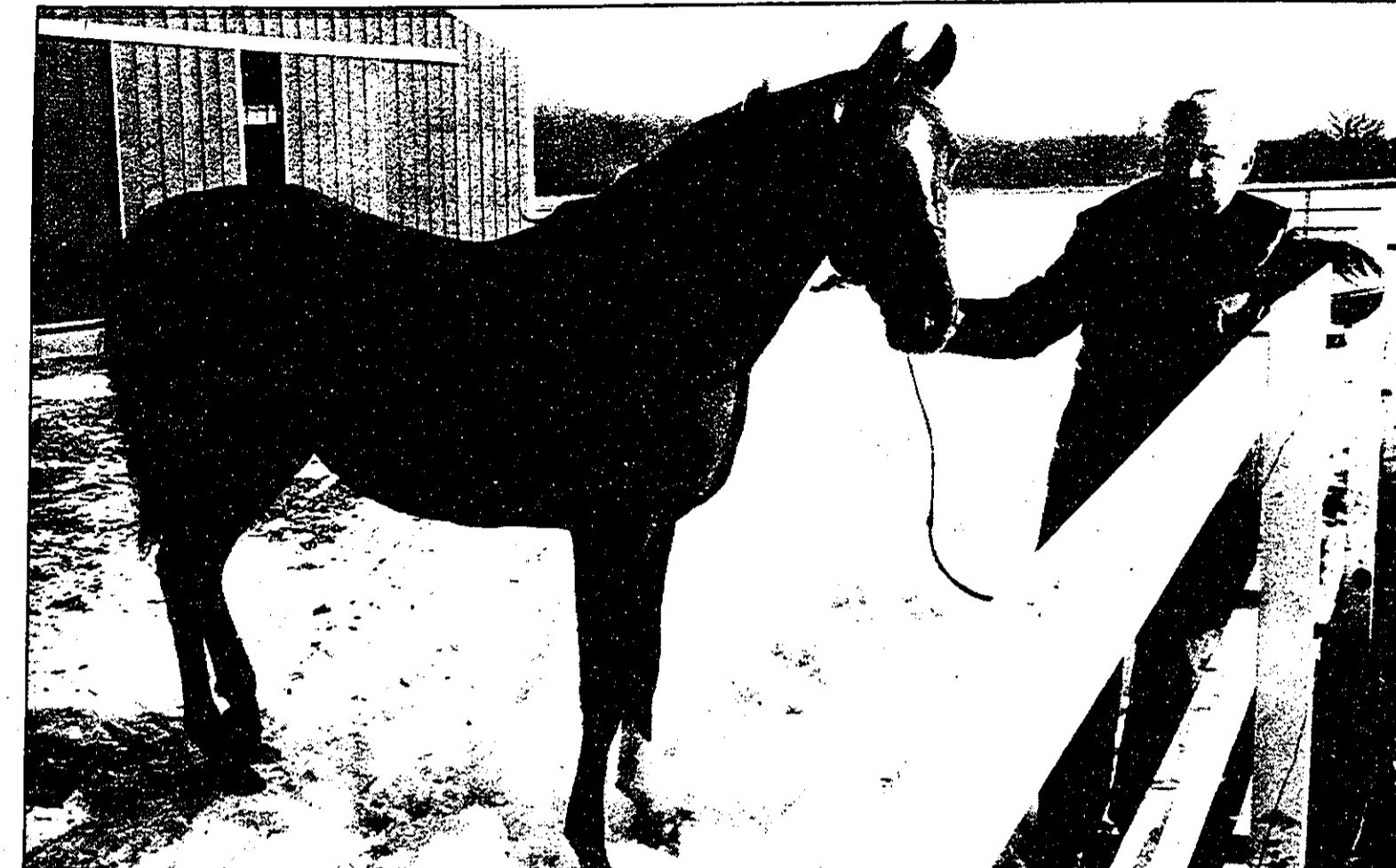
Autry prefers the Egyptian line. "Physically, the Egyptian horse is of finer bone and has a nicer head than the other bloodlines, but it's a matter of preference."



Whether accompanied by a candlelit dinner, a dozen red or pink roses, a heart-shaped box of chocolates or a passionate kiss, receiving a valentine always generates a feeling of genuine love.

Several longtime Northville and Novi sweethearts shared their recollections about Valentine's Day and noted how the romantic occasion has changed for them over the years.

John and Clare Genittis, of Northville, will always remember their first Valentine's Day together because on that day 41 years ago, they became engaged.

"I was making homemade noodles and he came up to me with a ring and surprised me completely," Clare remembers. "We were married five years later — I'd do it over again in a minute with the same man."

"We love it — my husband always remembers to bring me a box of candy or something for Valentine's Day," she said. "It's a special day because it comes from the heart."

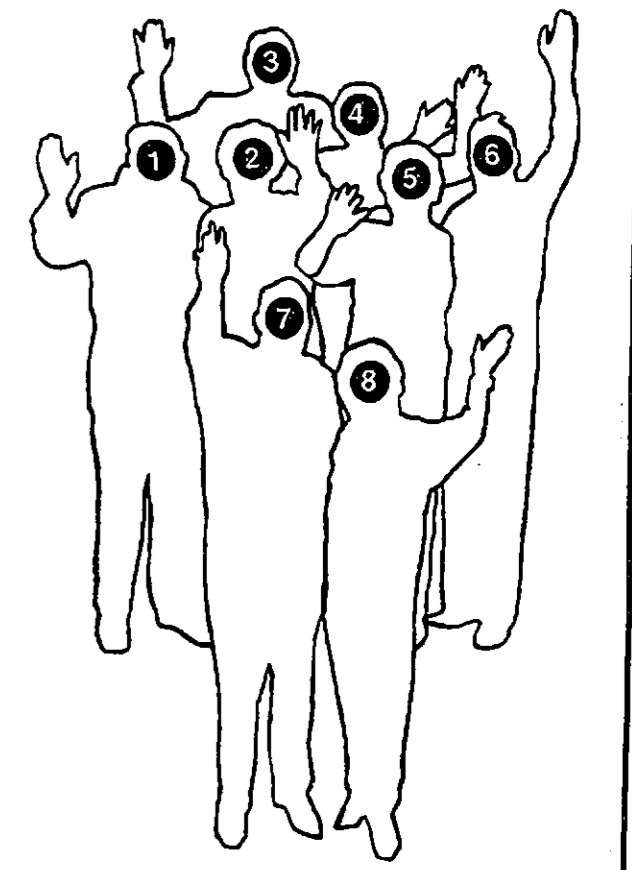
Likewise, Gustaf said her grandchildren always remember her with small Valentine's Day gifts, too.

Drugs a potential home hazard

Becker: 'There are no heroes or villains here. A series of events conspire to get this stuff into kids. Everybody means well.'

Many mothers keep home medicine chests well-stocked for treating their children, but often use the drugs ineffectively and sometimes dangerously, according to a University of Michigan researcher.

"There are no heroes or villains here. A series of events conspire to get this stuff into kids. Everybody means well," said Marshall H. Becker, professor and associate dean at the U-M School of Public Health.

"There is a tremendous need to educate mothers about which over-the-counter medicines are useful for what symptoms and about which over-the-counter medications not to use," Becker said.

Mothers also need to be alerted to the potential danger of saving prescription drugs for reuse after they have expired, he said. Tetracycline, for example, is a commonly prescribed antibiotic that can be toxic if used beyond its shelf life.

In one study, Becker and colleagues interviewed 500 mothers about the kinds of drugs they stocked and which ones they gave to their children.

All 500 mothers reported medicating their children, 79 percent said they would medicate their

children for fever without consulting a doctor. Fifty percent of the mothers kept seven or more categories of drugs on hand for their children, with one or more drugs per category.

The study concluded with a panel of six pediatricians reviewing data from the interviews and scoring the mothers on their choices of drugs and how effectively the drugs were used.

Overall ratings were low to moderate. The mothers got fairly high marks for use of pain-killers and low marks for use of vitamins.

"Vitamins are the perfect example of an abused over-the-counter drug," Becker said.

Mothers who give their children several vitamin pills a day are at risk of similar side effects.

The pediatric panel found that the mothers often picked relatively useless over-the-counter medications to treat upset stomachs and skin rashes, but made moderately wiser choices when treating their children for headaches or runny noses.

Mothers attempting to treat upset stomachs and diarrhea often caused more harm than good.

Becker noted that some mothers give laxatives to their children every day in hope that the medication will prevent constipation. Others give their children one or two aspirin tablets daily to prevent headaches.

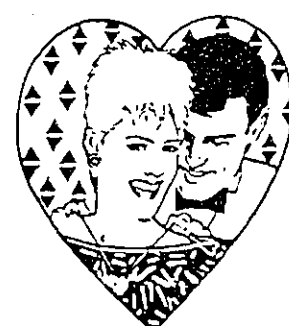
Neither practice is necessary, and both can cause health problems, he said.

The pediatric panel gave overall lower ratings to mothers of lower socio-economic status. The panel members did not know the socio-economic status of mothers they rated, and based their scoring decisions solely on the mothers' actions.

"There is clear evidence from our work that the greater problems are with children of lower socio-

economic status," Becker said. "Vitamins are the perfect example of an abused over-the-counter drug," Becker said.

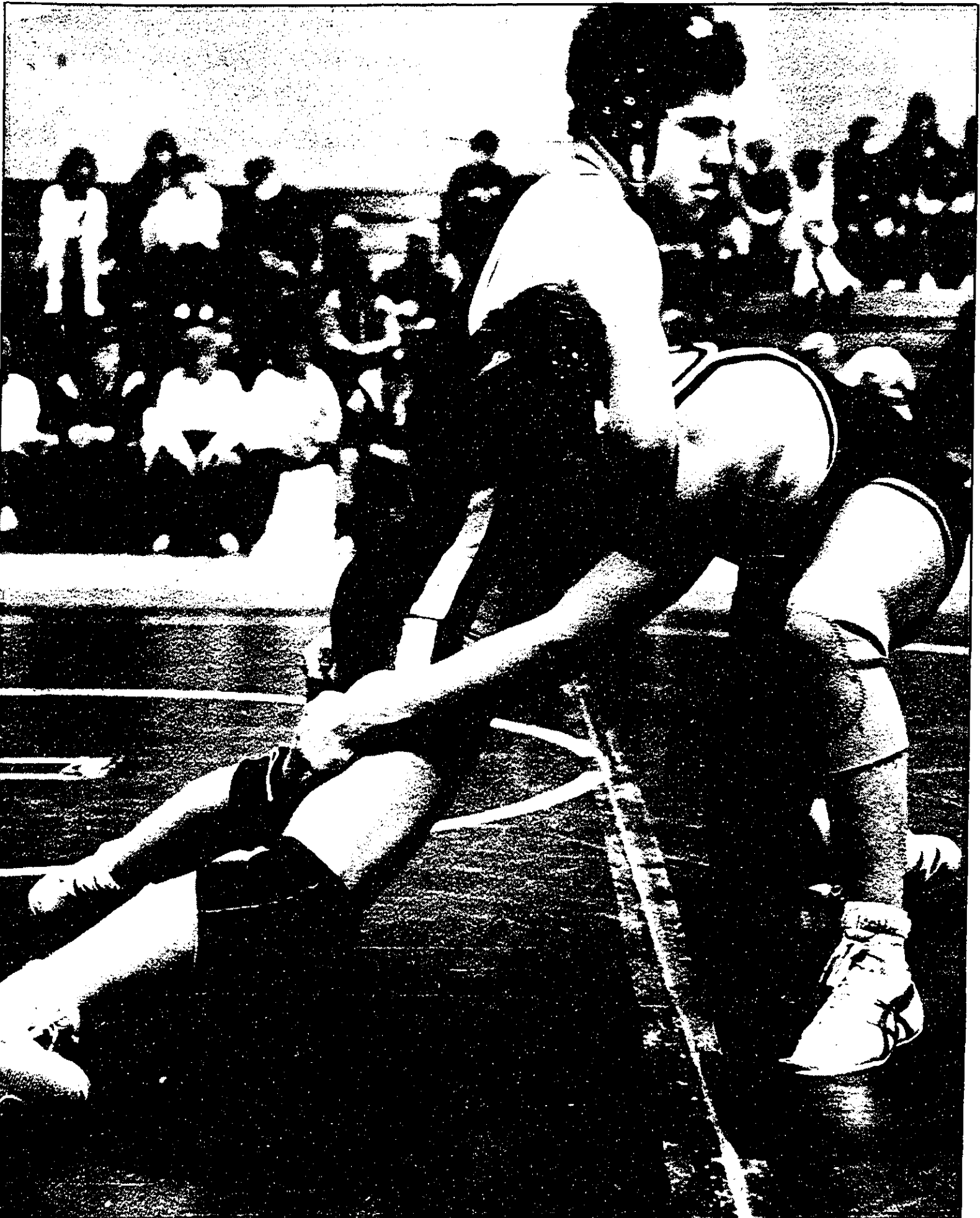

Wrestlers nip Eagles, grab 1st KVC title

With a slim 2½ point edge over Lakeland at the Kensington Valley Conference Championships on Feb. 6, the Novi wrestlers captured the 1987-88 KVC title. It marked the first and only time the Wildcats have reigned as a team in the KVC since joining the conference in 1980.

The state's fifth-ranked team among Class A schools needed wins in the final two bouts of tournament action last Saturday in Howell to top Lakeland for the title, and junior Ed Price responded by coming up with the biggest win of his career in the 185-pound consolation finals. Senior Bret Keir then pinned his opponent in the finals of the 195 weight classification to give the Wildcats 17.5 points. Lakeland finished second with 17.0 points, Milford was third (12.4) followed by Howell (9.5), South Lyon (7.8), Brighton (7.4) and Hartland (7.2).

"I'm extremely happy," Novi Coach Tom Fritz said. "It was close all the way down the line but every one of the kids in our line-up scored points for us and that's what makes us a good team."

"The KVC title is not our number one goal, but it definitely is a goal. Our number one goal is to do well in the state tournament."

The 'Cats used superior team strength to edge a Lakeland team that Fritz dubbed "possessed." Novi placed (top four) wrestlers in 11 of the 13 weight classifications and scored team points in all 13. There were many key wins and points registered en route to the victory including individual titles for Keir, Ron Fritz (167) and Matt Brinker (155) — but none was more important than Price's stunning performance at 185.

"Eddie is a 167-pounder who wrestles wherever we can get him in, which isn't often because Fritz and Brinker," Fritz pointed out. "I called upon him to go at 185 and he did an outstanding job. It was beautiful."

Novi trailed the Eagles with just two bouts remaining in the meet, and a quick tally by Fritz showed that the Wildcats had to have two wins in order to overtake Lakeland and secure the title. In the consolation finals at 185, Price held on for a close 10-9 win over Howell's Graydon Kirkland to grab third place honors and then Keir completed the comeback by pinning Blake Flood of Brighton in 4:52 in the 198-pound finals.

"I'd lost his match and if Bret (Keir) would have pinned his opponent at 185, we would have still lost by a half-point," Fritz explained. "If Price wins and Keir gets a decision, we win by a half-point, and if Price wins and Keir pins, we win by two and a half. Obviously, that's exactly what happened."

For Keir, the win over Flood was his third pin of the tournament in three tries. He accounted for 24 Novi team points.

"I told Keir he had to have a pin in the finals for us to beat Lakeland, and even though it wasn't exactly true he did it anyway," Fritz said. "The wins by Price and Keir were very important, but I don't want them to distract from the rest of our team's performance. Everybody scored points, so that made it successful for us as a team. Lakeland wrestled extremely well — they wrestled

'Cats bury Lions in final meet

The Novi wrestlers wrapped up the regular season of the Kensington Valley Conference in impressive fashion by obliterating South Lyon 59-6 on Feb. 4. For the Wildcats, it was a successful tune-up before the KVC Championships, and it came at the expense of the outmanned Lions.

"South Lyon had a terrible day," Novi Coach Tom Fritz said. "We used a weaker line-up because Scott Brown was out with the flu, and we still won 12 of 13 bouts."

Novi railroaded South Lyon by registering seven pins en route to the lopsided win and ended the regular season portion of the 1987-88 schedule with a perfect 6-0 mark in the KVC (13-1 overall).

Freshman Brian Paquette (98) started the 'Cats off on an optimistic note by pinning the Lion's Mike

Bulldogs edge Novi cagers at the buzzer again, 54-52

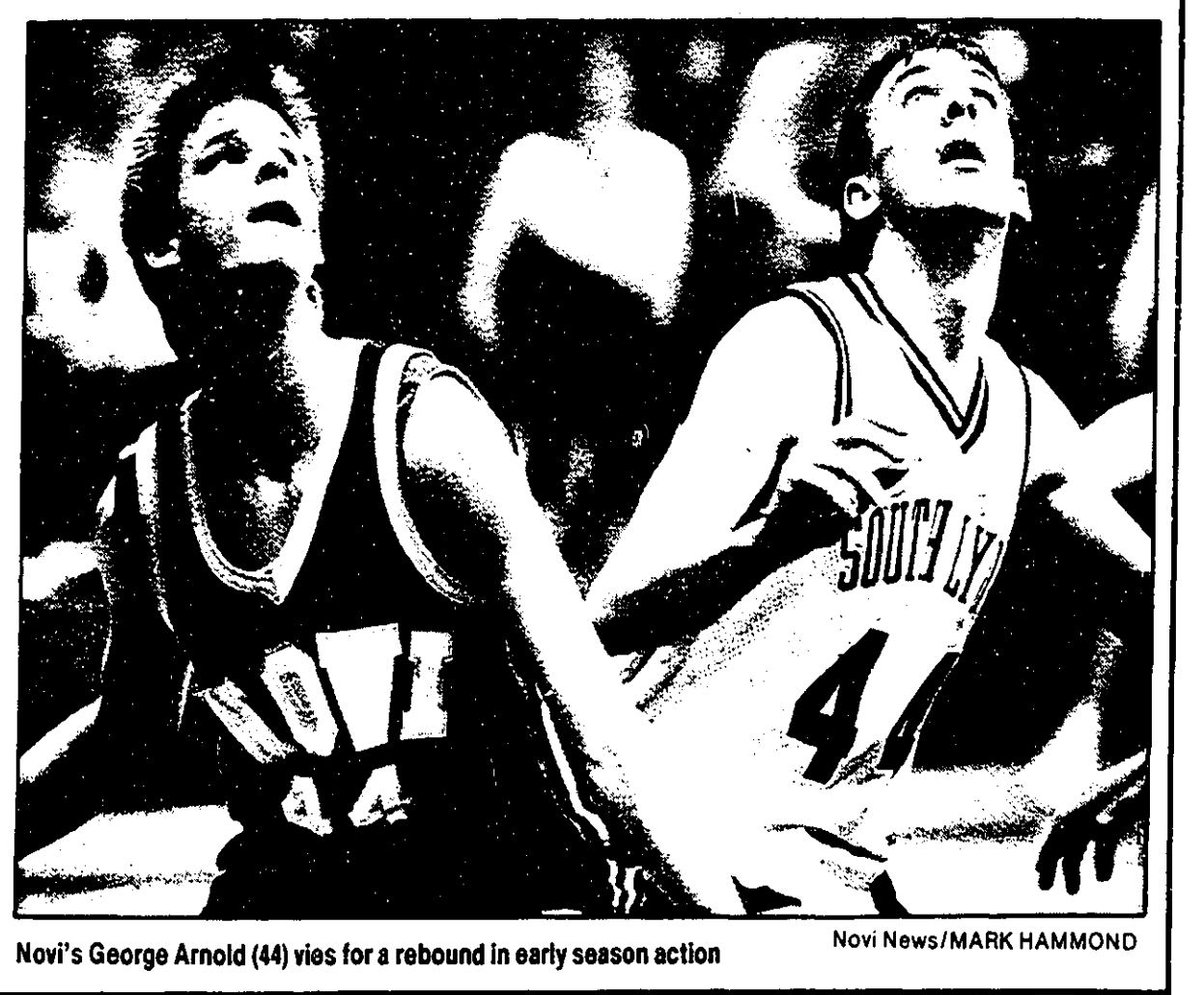

Records fall for Novi swimmers

School records, pool records and state qualifying times were falling fast and furious last week for the Novi swim team — and that's good news both for the team and coach Larry Teahan.

The Wildcats took their fourth and fifth straight dual meets by edging Plymouth Canton 94-78 on Feb. 2 and trouncing Brighton 103-69 on Feb. 4. The victories raised Novi's season record to 7-2 overall.

The Wildcats also competed in the Oakland County Championships on Feb. 6 and came away with several titles. As expected, junior Jon Cohen was the standout of the meet with two individual titles.

Cohen, regarded as the top individual swimmer in the state, took first-place honors in the 200-yard IM (1:55.53) and the 500 freestyle (4:34.36) — and his times were the state's fastest in the two events this season. Cohen also swam the lead-off leg of Novi's winning 400 freestyle relay team that also featured Steve Cohen, Rudy Speerschneider and Steve Warthman (3:20.43). The team's effort in the event was good for a new school record.

Teahan was unavailable for comment on the Oakland County results.

For the Canton meet, Teahan was out of town due to a death in the family, so assistant Rick Anderson took

over. Anderson snurted the Wildcat line-up a bit and things worked out rather nicely as Novi registered wins in nine of the 11 races, and added several key second and third place finishes.

"I give all the credit to Rick," Teahan said. "He got the kids ready and his line-up was really instrumental in the win. We needed a lot of firsts because Canton has such a big team, but we also needed some seconds and thirds and we got them, too."

Jon Cohen, Steve Cohen and Warthman were the stars of the meet for Novi as each of them posted two victories in individual events. Jon set a new school and Canton pool record with a 54.39 effort in the 100 butterfly and then came back to notch another first in the 100 backstroke (58.87). His younger brother was a two-time winner in the 200 IM (2:08.12) and the 500 freestyle (4:55.24), while Warthman notched firsts in the 50 (23.40) and 100 (50.94) freestyle races.

Warthman was also a member of the winning 200 medley relay team, along with Bob Bates, Matt Lorenz and Josh Matta (1:48.13), while the Cohen brothers teamed with Speerschneider and Steve Strausberg for a victory in the 400 freestyle relay (3:33.53). The other Novi swimmers who came in from the top of town were Steve Cohen (1:55.03), Joe Jablonski set a new school

record in diving with a point total of 224.30, but had to settle for second place to Canton's Brad Flowers (249.5). The rest of the Novi seconds came from Lorenz in the 100 butterfly (58.00), Speerschneider in the 500 freestyle (4:59.17) and Bates in the 100 breaststroke (1:07.54).

Matta made it 1-2-3 in the 500 freestyle with a third place finish (5:22.22). He was joined by Strausberg (54.67 in the 100 freestyle) and Dave Suchyta (1:09.11 in the 100 breaststroke) as the only other 'Cats to take third-place honors.

"The 500 freestyle was our best event — we outscored them 18-3," Teahan said, "but we also gained a lot of points in the butterfly and the breaststroke. We went 1-2 in the butterfly and then went 2-3-4 in the breaststroke to outscore them even though Canton took first place."

The unofficial Kensington Valley Conference swimming title was on the line against Brighton two days later and for the third straight season, Teahan's team prevailed. Novi used superior depth to topple the Bulldogs, but the team's seven first-place finishes didn't hurt either.

"It gives us our third straight KVC championship and we are very proud of that," Teahan said. "We had some great swims against Brighton. Jon and Steve Cohen both had the kind of outing most swimmers only dream about. While Jon was streaking to a record-setting pace in two
