

# . Sewer slows development

The DNR has determined that Novi's available sewer capacity is fast diminishing, and the city administration and consulting engineers are now telling potential developers that it is very likely no sewer taps will be available for projects just beginning the planning process.

City Manager Edward Kriewall told council members during the March 14 meeting that the DNR had told him projects which had "gone quite

a way in their engineering" would most likely be accommodated with taps.

The issue came up as the council discussed approvals for four new single-family subdivisions in the city. Council Member Nancy Covert asked Kriewall if the necessary sewer taps would be available for the projects.

"The DNR is very troubled with our capacity," Kriewall said. "We have given instructions to our engineers to warn all projects, especially those in the early stages. Things may take another turn in April if and when a grant is awarded for the Super Sewer project," Kriewall said.

Kriewall said that projects receiving final approvals, such as the Briarwood subdivision project and the Pine Hollow subdivision project, would probably receive taps because of the amount of engineering already expended.

But he warned the two projects which received tentative preliminary plat approval — the Jamestown Green No. 3 subdivision and the Devonshire Downs subdivision — that taps may not be available.

"Sewer permits for any new projects are going to be hard to get," he said.

## Council stops condemnation

Novi City Council members turned down a proposition to condemn a tract of land in the Town Center area during the March 14 council meeting.

The council voted 5-2 not to seek bids for the condemnation of the property occupied by the Sugden Company, a non-conforming heavy industrial use. The property is located south of I-96, east of Novi Road and east of the Town Center project.

The Sugden Company currently operates a construction firm from the site which is zone I-1 (light industrial). The light industrial zoning designation does not permit outside storage areas. The land was changed to I-1 zoning from a previous zoning of I-2 (heavy industrial) which does permit outside storage of materials.

The Sugden Company has been in the city for over 20 years and orignally conformed under the I-2 zoning. The company became a legal, non-conforming use when the council rezoned the property to the light industrial classification.

City administration officials suggested the condemnation proceedings after failing to reach an agreement with the owners of the property concerning the outside storage matter. The Sugden property is adjacent to the Trammell Crow Company's recently-built LakePointe Office Center.

Because the Sugden Company is a legal non-conforming use in the area, the courts have upheld the company's right to store a vast

number of parts, machinery and tools outside the building. City Attorney David Fried noted during the December public hearing on the proposed condemnation that the courts had deemed the materials tools of the construction trade and beld that they were allowable by

Although the council turned down the bid to have the condemnation proceedings continue, most members agreed that the property is an eyesore. The majority of the council said they felt that condemning the land to achieve the goal of cleaning up the area was a misuse of the power of condemnation granted public officials by the legislature.

Wherein lies the public good?" Council Member Martha Hoyer asked. A governmental body can excercise eminent domain condemnations for the good of the public.

'We are sending a message to all non-conforming uses ... most of which have been created by the council through the rezoning process . . . which includes most of the Grand River corridor, that if the parcel adjacent is purchased and developed and the new developer finds that particular use unsightly the city will move to interceed for condemnation and resale," Hoyer

City Manager Edward Kriewall had suggested a process whereby the city would receive bids from developers interested in the Sugden property. The winning bidder would pay all costs of the condemnation

# Questions rise over payments

How much back-up material should the city administration provide the Novi City Council concerning claims and account payments made to consultants and the

numerous transfers made from

funds and accounts? The question surfaced during the closing moments of the March 14 council meeting when Council Member Nancy Covert pulled an item from the council's consent

agenda. The consent agenda normally contains matters which require little or no discussion by the council and are approved as a whole, rather than item by item. A council member has the right to pull an item from the package and have it decided by a separate vote follow-

ing further discussion. Covert pulled an item concerning a fund transfer from the Parks and Recreation fund. She said she had received no back-up documentation explaining what the money was used for and where the transfer was coming from and what it was going toward.

Council Member Hugh Crawford asked Covert why she had waited until the council convened to ask for the information. He said questions

concerning financial matters such a phone call to the financial director or the city manager.

Then if you still have questions you can bring them up to the whole council," Crawford said. He said it was inappropriate to waste the entire council's time on questions which needed to be answered by the administration.

Covert had raised the issue of documentation for all claims and accounts during the March 7 meeting. At that meeting she pulled a consent agenda item referring to. a bill due by the city's consulting engineering firm, JCK and Associates. At that time she had requested more information on what exactly the bill referred to and what particular fund the monies were being appropriated from to cover it.

Covert said the engineering firm did come back with the appropriate information in an itemized synop-

"On the list of expenditures and the funds paying for certain services it has come to my attention that the documentation is often scanty or not clear," Covert said in an interview following the council meeting.

#### City blood drive looks for donors

It's time to give again. Novi City Clerk Gerry Stipp

wants everybody in the community to become a lifesaver by contributing to the city's blood drive. The Novi Community Blood Drive

will be held this Friday, March 18, from 1-7 p.m. at the Holy Family Catholic Church located at 24505 Meadowbrook Road.

Stipp, perennial organizer of the blood drive, wants everyone in the community to participate. Stipp makes the twice-a-year project a personal goal. This is the ninth year Novi has been participating with the Red Cross on the project.

Last fall's drive netted the Red Cross Blood Banks 103 pints from the 28,000 Novi residents, and Stipp would like to better that number with this drive. That included 14 first-time donors, according to

She said she is looking for everyone who participated in the spring to return for the fall drive, as well as new recruits.

She noted that the small town of Mancelona, Michigan, with a population of 3,000 gets 120 people to its blood drive - and the town sponsors eight drives per year. Novi has a spring and fall drive.

Appointments are not necessary, but Stipp urged anyone planning to give blood to call her weekdays at 347-0460 or weekends and evenings at 624-2708.

"It does help the Red Cross in figuring out how many nurses will be needed to staff the blood drive," Stipp said, explaining why participants should call ahead. "Even if you are not sure of the time, give me a call so I can include you in the total," she added.

The Red Cross blood supply has suffered sharp declines in recent months and the service organization urges everyone to participate. New sterilized needles are used for each donor and are then discarded. There is no risk of infection at any time during the process, the Red Cross said.

Novi continues to boom and the best indication of that growth comes with the continued building of subdivi-

sions for eager home buyers. Four single-family subdivisions faced scrutiny by the council at the March 14 meeting, and four single-family subdivisions came away with approvals for various stages of the planning process.

D Briarwood Subdivision: This 73 family subdivision located on the north side of Ten Mile just east of Beck Road received final preliminary plat approval by unanimous vote of the council.

Briarwood is one-third of the larger Residential Unit Development project called Green Orchard Meadows, planned for the Ten Mile/Beck Road area. All the lots are 10,000 square feet in area and have an 80-foot minimum width. The parcel is zoned R-4. Four of the 73 lots back up to Ten Mile and no access to that road will be allowed from those lots. The homes will sell in the \$170,000-\$195,000 range.

☐ Pine Hollow Subdivision: Final preliminary plat approval was granted by the council to this six lot, 3.49 acre subdivision. The new subdivision is located on the west side of Meadowbrook Road between Eight and Nine Mile adjacent to the Country Place Condominiums.

All lots will have at least 18,000 square feet of area and 110 foot lot minimum widths.

Access to this small subdivision will be through Onaway Court, an extension of Onaway Drive in the Country Place Condominium development. The Country Place Condominium Association agreed to the use of the street, Brandon Rogers, planning consultant, noted. He said Planning Commissioner Ernest Aruffo, a Country Place resident, had worked with the association on the

"This will be a quiet, secluded little subdivision," Council approved the final preliminary plat of the six

The plans for this subdivision have been before the planning commission and the city council on numerous occasions in an effort to straighten out woodlands, wetlands and collector road systems. Rogers said that

the problems lay in designing a conventional R-4 subdivision (the most dense single family zoning designation in the city) and still preserving the wetland and

The developer is currently on his third woodlands application, Rogers noted, and commended the work that had been done to stay out of the woodlands and wetlands. The council had received a letter from Ray and Rob Mitzel concerning the encroachment of roads into the sensitive areas on this plat. Rogers said he would take the letter under advisement. "The bulk of the woodlands, or a substantial amount have been preserv-

ed," he said. The developer added a meandering woodchip walkway through the woodland areas in an effort to meet citizen concerns about access to the woodlands, it

The tentative preliminary plat was approved in a 6-1 vote by the council. Council Member Nancy Covert voted against the approval. "I recognize the economic feasibility issues fac-The zoning for the subdivision is R-4 and lots will be at ed by all developers," Covert said. "But having been involved with development of the Woodlands Ordinance and the Woodlands Implementation Committee I'm concerned that we are not preserving the woodlands, we're preserving individual trees. We're saving lots for the developer but not the woodlands and for that reason I am going to protest by voting no."

☐ Devonshire Downs: This 129 lot, R-4 zoned subdivision received tentative preliminary plat approval. The subdivision is a 49 acre area located on the north side of Ten Mile between Taft and Beck roads.

An R-4 zoning designation allows up to 3.3 units/acre. The Devonshire Downs subdivision will have 2.62 units/acre, according to Rogers. The density computations are aided by the reservation of a large section of the land for a wetlands area.

On the plat the wetlands is referred to as a "park." Council Member Martha Hoyer asked if the area were indeed dry enough during parts of the year to be used as a park. Clif Seiber, engineer on the project, said the land was in effect a wetlands area and not a park. Hoyer asked that when the plat is shown in the sales office it be labelled wetlands so as not to mislead potential

A few of the lots will back up to Ten Mile, and Council Member Joseph 'foth expressed concern that the residents will construct different fences which will ruin the look of the subdivision from Ten Mile.

"You end up seeing their rear ends and some of these rear ends look pretty bad," Toth said. The developer said fence specifications would be included in the development's Covenants and Restrictions.

# City vacates 'never-used' street

The City of Novi has vacated Gilbert Street. The street is located in the Lakewoods Subdivision on the north side of the city. It lies south of South Lake Drive between Buffington and Henning streets in Novi's Section 3.

Developer and land owner Kenneth Singer, who owns several lots fronting Gilbert Street, petitioned the council to vacate the street. Singer said the street, only 30 feet in width, had never been opened and lies 150 feet north of the existing horse-shoe turn leading from the streets of Buffington and

City council members held a public hearing on the proposed vacation at the March 7 meeting.

hearing was Singer's neighboring land owner who spoke against the vacation. The opposing owner said he had recently signed a purchase agreement for a house located adjacent to Gilbert Street.

He noted that if Gilbert were closed and returned to the adjoining property owners, he would be forced to move the house's current driveway to a point directly in front of the house. He said the move would lead to a decrease in the value of the

The closing would add approximately 15 feet of frontage to that house, an asset which would outweigh the cost of moving the driveway, Singer

City Manager Edward Kriewall said the administration recommended adoption of the vacation for the street. He suggested that city engineers go out and do sketches of the area and the driveway situation for review by council at the next meeting. "It (vacating the street) makes all kinds of sense. The street was never put through and there is a cross street 150 feet away,







PONTIAC — Oakland County residents may be paying an additional vehicle registration fee of \$25 per vehicle if the Oakland County Board of Road Commissions has its

The Road Board has expressed unanimous support for collecting a \$25 fee for all vehicles registered in Oakland

The fee, if levied, would generate an estimated \$18.6 million for road improvements in the county, according to Road Board Chairman Fred D. Houghten

The action comes in response to legislation approved by the Michigan Legislature in December 1987. The legislation authorizes County Boards of Commissioners

vehicle registration fee of up to \$25 on motor vehicles registered to an owner residing in Oakland County. The fee would terminate 10 years from its inception.







The cluster housing option is available in single-family residential zoning districts. Density levels correspond to those prescribed in conventional single-family districts, but units may be "clustered" by reducing sideyard setbacks in order to leave portions of the overall parcel

In Novi, the cluster option is used to permit the preservation or trees, woodlands and other natural amenities. Farmington Hills residents oppose the cluster option on the grounds it is too similar to multiple-family residential development in a city they consider already to be over-developed.

# Providing summary will dispel concern

The issue of how much information is too much information appears to have surfaced at the Novi City Council meeting last Monday. Council Member Nancy Covert asked the city administration to provide more detailed summaries as part of the claims and accounts lists given to the

This is an issue that calls out for reasoned minds and careful evaluation of the matter at hand. If only the surface issues are examined, the matter could well be blown out of proportion and both sides could suffer damage.

Covert said she does not think the council receives enough information to understand fully what accounts are being billed for what services. She has asked for a brief summary to back up any warrants so the information is readily at hand. Sounds

Council Member Hugh Crawford chastised Covert for taking up the council's time with her concerns during the last meeting. Crawford said the questions could have been answered by a phone call to the finance director.

While Crawford is probably correct in saying the matter could have been cleared up with a few phone calls, council members should not be dissuaded from bringing matters up during public meetings of the coun-

If a member of the council has a question or is uncertain about city administration procedures, bringing them up before the entire council is certainly not out of line. Openness is not to be feared. Although it is tempting to go along with any suggestion that would cut the length of council meetings, banning questions for inplace to start.

While it is nice to know that Covert has voiced her concern over being unsure of what she was signing when it came to the warrant list, it is rather troubling that she waited three years to ask the question.

Government

would be for all sides to take the best parts of the suggestions presented at the meeting. Covert should feel free to ask questions, both inside and outside of the council chamber. If indeed, the transactions are so cumbersome that they cannot be easily put in a packet for her, than a trip to city hall to get answers may be in order.

Likewise, she should continue to air her concerns before the council. not for the publicity such concerns may draw, but for the general opening and sharing of ideas among the council and the public.

If the city administration can manage to find an efficient means of providing brief summaries of expenses and their accounts, it can only help the council procedure. While City Manager Edward Kriewall may be correct in saying that other cities do not even bring the matters before council - that is not the point. While no hint of mishandling has been made, by giving the council all the information that is expediently possible, the city can rest easily in the knowledge that not only are the books open to the public - but the information is accessible and understandable for the people who were voted to oversee the running of

The possibilities boggle the imagination. Close your eyes and you can almost envision vintage '57 Chevies cruising up and down Grand River — just like the good ol' days.



# Learning a lesson the hard way



anyone with even a wee bit of Irish blood, it's St. Patrick's Day and a timefor celebrating. For of a rear-end collision that has left me with a still unrepaired car and a headache.

There's also a lesson that I think others can learn from in my "incident." I'm calling it that because I'm well aware that to police departments who regularly have to deal with major accidents this is very minor.

However, to me the damage to my first new car in five years was far from minor. (My previous two cars, lasting four and five years, respectively, were traded in without a dent.) The incident occurred on Beck Road as I stopped at Twelve Mile before turning left to access the I-96. A pickup truck had been following me closely along Beck where I had my new "toy," the speed control mechanism, on because it is too easy to ex-

I do not know whether the young man was unaware that Twelve Mile is not a yield situation but a stop, (which the officer who took the report was aware of.) At any rate, I stopped as there were two eastbound vehicles approaching and another coming westbound on Twelve Mile. > I called the rental office, told them the problem and suggested they call the humane society. They told me the humane society won't come out to pick up strays and I'd have to take it down myself. I told them that this

cat was a stray, and that it would probably be unwise to get too close to it for fear of being stratched or bitten.

I then suggested animal control and they said they'd try. By the next morning, the cat had disappeared and nobody really knows if it ran away or if animal control took it away. Either way, it wasn't a very good situation for the poor cat.







#### Supermarket chains faced with personnel shortages in future

Recent contract settlements and the continuing decline of chain grocery stores in the Detroit metropolitian area may result in personnel shortages in the future, according to Ray Schorejs, Division Director for Supermarket and Sales for Roth Young of Detroit.

Roth Young, whose Michigan office is in Southfield, is the country's largest personnel agency recruiting for supermarkets

"This industry used to be very attractive," said Schorejs. "Good potential for higher wages and promotions, and a good benefit package attracted a lot of people to the grocery industry, but that just isn't the case

According to Schorejs, working for a grocery store has become very unattractive because wages at entry level positions have decreased and benefit packages are no onger as complete as they used to be. And, for the individual looking for advancement, the oppportunities

"In the 1970s we had over 400 chain stores in the fivecounty area," he said. "Today, there are only about 190 chain stores and that means a lot less management positions available and much less room for advancement." A recent wage and salary survey conducted by Roth Young Personnel Service, Inc., a coast-to-coast recruitment leader in food, retail, hospitality and health, shows 'that salary levels in the grocery industry are remaining pretty stagnant or decreasing.

"Starting salaries for many hourly positions are lower than they were in the 1970s," said Schorejs. "A meat wrapper used to hire in at about \$7.75 an hour and could expect to work his or her way up to meat manager in two or three years. Today, that person starts at \$4.40 to 5.50 an hour and it takes much longer to work up to that ".higher salary level." And because of the decreased number of positions,

Schorejs added, many people won't have the opportunity to advance. With the decrease of the larger chain stores, the in-

dependents have grown in number over the past few years, but they still can't offer the salary levels found at the bigger chains and their numbers aren't enough to Emake a real difference. "The wages at the independents are substantially

Log homes are made from kits. Each log home company markets various

floor designs and building methods. The Ruizes chose a Rocky Mountain Log Home. According to Carlos, not one green tree was used to make the logs for the house. "Not one live tree was cut down," he said. All the lumber came from dead wood, due to fire or ougs eating the bark off of a tree," he

What makes dead wood so important to a log home is that the wood is completely dried out before it is used for construction. A log which is not totally dry will twist after construction as the

moisture leaves The logs are stacked and spiked with 12 inch spikes every three feet. There is some settling due to the enormous weight of the logs, but no twisting, Carlos said. Each log is attached to the one beneath it with a compound made

of five ingredients plus an insulating foam and a metal sheath that fits in a groove drilled into the logs.

"This house is permanent," Susan said. "It's a fantasy of mine to have a house that I could pass down to my children — that would be there for my grandchildren.

The outside landscaping will take advantage of the beauty of the trees, both agreed. No traditional front lawn for this house, Carlos said. What little grass they plant will snake along the







Novi's 400-yard freestyle relay squad didn't just break a school record last weekend at the MHSAA Class A State Swim Meet, they destroyed it. The team — featuring Jon Cohen, Steve Cohen, Rudy Speerschneider and Steve Warthman - were seeded 11th heading into the preliminaries on the basis of their school-record 3:20.53 two weeks earlier. Jon Cohen started the event with a 47.89 split in the first 100 yards (a new school record), Steve followed with a career-best 49.80 in the second leg, Speerschneider followed with his personal best (49.04) and Warthman anchored it with his career best (47.83). The team's combined time of 3:14.56 cut nearly six seconds off the old record and was the fifth fastest in the state. # Floral arrangements lend romance, charm

Flowers can give your wedding day the perfect touch but any planning needs to start with the bride's bouquet and go from there

Elegant, charming, but above all romantic, flowers are an important element in any wedding. But with hundreds of flowers to choose from, and with the multitude of possible combinations, making a decision may at first seem overwhelming.



Florists emphasize that while it is not necessary to have the flowers be the same color as the gowns, it is important the colors do not clash. Many times they will recommend complementary colors, such as pink flowers with blue

Flowers for the rest of the wedding party should continue the theme established by the bridal party bouquets. Wedding cake is probably the centerpiece of the reception, and shouldn't be taken lightly. A professional baker can make a cake in any flavor you like, whether it be nut, fruit or German chocolate. Allow about six weeks advance

to order a good one. Bakers also charge by the person and depending on the type of batter, whether the cake contains nuts, size of the cakes and type of decoration, it can run an average of \$95 or more for 100 people. That doesn't include a decorative foun-

tain, which is another \$50 more, at least. The next consideration after food is entertainment. A live band is always nice, if you know one you like. Most are unionized and can be found through a musicians referral service or the Federation of

Musicians in Ann Arbor. A live band usually charges anywhere from \$500 to \$1,000 and up, so a less expensive choice might be a disc jockey. DJs also have the advantage when it comes to choosing the particular music you wish to

Stax-O-Wax, which claims to be the oldest in the business and advertises 'from the wild to the mild," charges an average of \$350 for a wedding reception and requires about four to six months' ad-

vance notice. For an additional fee, the Brightonbased service also offers an optional light show with mirror ball, fog and bubble

Home Show in 1962. The show has been well received and supported in the Metropolitan Detroit area, generating millions of dol-

lars of business each year. The Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, BASM, is one of the first such associations in the United States. It was founded in 1926 as the Builders Association of Metropolitan Detroit (BAMD), but the area designation was eventually changed to

describe more accurately the portion of the state served.

THE ASSOCIATION WAS orginally conceived to be the voice of both the home buyer and the home builders. It has, indeed, served that function with distinction, and is today one of the most prestigious builder groups in America.

This Detroit based body was a major participant in the organizing of the National Association of Home Builders in the early 1940s and was, on its own, responsible for the formation of the Michigan Association of Home Builders later in the decade.

Past BASM presidents Harry Durbin and Rodney Lockwood both served as presidents of the national organization.

BASM's record of accomplishments in promoting the political, economic, and social environment conducive to the construction, sales and rental of good housing is long and impressive.

## Flowers tricked into thinking it's spring

This year more than 3,000 pots of flowers and 500 Michigan grown trees and shrubs are being forced to bloom by tricking them into thinking it's

Spring. This elaborate and highly technical con-job is done so the plants and trees are ready to make their debut at the 70th Annual Builders Home, Flower and Furniture Show, March 19-27, at Cobo Hall.

Fooling Mother Nature is no small feat and it's done under the supervision of James C. Scott, landscape architect, who designs and oversees construction of the many gardens seen at the Builders Show.

Scott has supervised this project for 26 years and he lovingly describes how the flower and trees are forced to bloom early.

"In the fall, Carl Krause of Auburn Oaks Nursery picks the stock with the best buds. The buds are allowed to stay dormant until February, then we wake them up early," he said. "Flowers and plants are taken from

darkly shaded rooms where they've lain dormant, and placed in green houses with lots of sunlight or artificial light if the weather is overcast." "Each day landscapers turn up the heat a little in the greenhouses, so it's just like spring, sunny and warmer every day, so naturally the flowers

• The florist who takes your flowers-by-wire order needs the complete address of the person who is going to receive the flowers or plants, including the zip code and telephone number.



various sizes. closest to the actual number is given \$20,000 by the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, sponsors of the show.


