## Jolly on top in judges race

staff writer Local attorney Terence Jolly appears to have taken the top spot in the 52nd District Court primary race Tuesday night, outdistancing

The two will now face off in the Nov. 8 general election.

MacKenzie by several hundred

With several precincts still not in early Wednesday, Jolly appears to have taken the top spot. Latest figures available before The Novi News deadline Wednesday show Jolly with 3,300 votes and MacKenzie in second place with 3.084. Challengers Michael Reeds, Emery Jacques, and Peter Abbo finished in the next three spots respectively, well out of the race.

Reeds had the third spot with 1.955, Jacques took fourth at 1,435, and Abbo was a distant fifth with

"It was just excellent," Jolly said. "Wer're very happy . . . we'll be getting ready for November." MacKenzie said he was "very

"We got very generous turnout," MacKenzie said. He predicted November's general election would

Jolly won Novi by a wide margin 1,091 to 555. But MacKenzie made strong showings in Milford, White Lake Township and Commerce Township to help balance the final

MacKenzie won Milford (429-296), took White Lake (519-493), then captured Commerce with a 577-403 advantage.

MacKenzie also posted wins in South Lyon (138-63), Walled Lake (112-97), Rose Township (92-82) and Lyon Township (175-163).


MacKenzie said he was slightly disappointed by the Novi results,

which showed him losing his home community almost two to one.

"It's a Republican primary where the issue was made of me being a Democrat," MacKenzie said. "I think that will die down as we move closer to November . . . and people take a look at my record as a judge."

Jacques took third in Novi with 275 votes, followed by Reeds with 191 and Abbo with 148.

## Female officer sues city, chief

Novi's second-ever female police officer has sued the city and Police Chief Lee BeGole, alleging several counts of sexual discrimination.

Police Officer Karen L. Koester, who joined the force in 1981, filed suit Wednesday, July 27, in Oakland County Circuit Court. She is seeking at least \$40,000 in damages after an alleged conflict over maternity

Koester has alleged that police officials ordered her to take an unpaid leave of absence during her pregnancy, leaving her without medical coverage and income.

Koester also has accused BeGole of refusing to allow her to take lightduty assignments or a demotion during the term of her pregnancy.

Police and city officials would not comment on the suit. City Attorney David Fried said he had not seen the lawsuit and could not comment.

Koester's attorney, Jamil-Akhtar, said Novi officials broke state laws and violated her rights.

"It's a totally stupid lawsuit, something that definitely could have been prevented," Akhtar said. "She was willing to take a demotion to stay . . . instead they let her go and hired temporary people off the

According to documents filed in the Circuit Court last week, Koester has alleged that she was "summarily ordered to take a leave of absence" after informing police officials of her pregnancy.

They came in search of jobs. Well-paying jobs - perhaps as

much as \$40,000 per year. What they got was lots of trouble. About 70 prospective workers packed the International Iron Workers Union building parking lot last week between Wedneday and Friday. Some pitched tents, others just laid out, waiting for 8:30 a.m. Monday when applications could be

turned in to union officials. . Nearby residents saw it as no nore than Novi's own "tent city, with applicants camping out without showers or restroom facilities - in an effort to be first in

Residents complained that the applicants were causing a disturbance, using nearby woods as a restroom area, while filling up the few small garbage cans that had been placed in the parking lot.

Novi Building Department officials broke up the campout Friday afternoon.

The Iron Workers hall is located off of Trans X drive, between Ten Mile and Grand River, behind an industrial strip that fronts the eastern side of Novi Road. The facility's parking lot is separated from the Meadowbrook Glens subdivision by a line of woods that is 20 to 30 feet

Building Department Director Earl Bailey said the Iron Workers local was cited for an ordinance violation Friday, but the citation was dismissed Monday after the crowd broke up without incident. Bailey said the Monday sign-up went basically without incident.

Bailey said the local was cited for an unathorized use in an industrial zone.

## Sha Na Na talks go to attorneys

The 10 members of the Michigan '50s Festival Board of Directors decided last week to transfer ed. negotiations for a second Sha Na Na concert to the hands of their attorneys.

Connie Mallett, president of the '50s Festival Board of Directors and executive director of the Novi Chamber of Commerce, said Sha Na Na's production company -Grenier and Moore Productions Inc. of Madison Heights - indicated that they are unwilling to work with the board to satisfy concert ticketholders, prompting the legal action.

Grenier and Moore Productions Inc. has maintained that a second concert cannot be arranged without an additional \$5,000 in expenses, a move the '50s Festival Board cannot afford to make, according to

Wednesday) it was decided we should not go further in debt," Mallett said Tuesday afternoon.

Mallett projected that the board will incur a shortfall of about \$4,500 to \$5,500 from this year's '50s

"It was the board's opinion that the shortfall would be made up with either a mid-year fund-raiser or in next year's festival," Mallett add-

building inspector when Winifred M. Dobek was hired full-time by the City of Novi in 1981. But anyone who sold her short was in for trouble. "She was a real stickler for good

workmanship and good construction," said Novi Building Inspector Earl Bailey, recalling the time she was sent out to inspect the work of steel-workers during construction of the Sheraton Oaks Hotel.

"Some of the riggers started giving her a bad time, telling her how they were going to do things. But Winnie set them straight real quick. She told them she was the inspector and they were going to do things her way. They learned real fast that you better do things the way she wanted them done."

"That was Winnie. She set everybody straight real fast."

Mrs. Dobek died Saturday, July 30, when a tractor she was using to mow the lawn of her Twelve Mile home rolled over on top of her.

Witnesses told police she was mowing the side of an embankment in front of her home on the north side of Twelve Mile, opposite the West Oaks II shopping center, when the vehicle rolled over, trapping her underneath.

Two passer-bys stopped and pulled the tractor off her, police said. The accident occurred at approximately 3:25 p.m. She was transported by ambulance to Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills, where she was pronounced dead shortly after being admitted at 4:08 p.m.

The daughter of John V. and Edith I. (Merrill) Johnson, she was born in Jackson, Michigan, on May 5, 1924, and was 64 at the time of her

#### Date set for signal at city intersection

The earliest a traffic signal could be installed at the dangerous Ten Mile/Beck Road intersection is Oct. . And the actual installation of the light is not likely to occur until some time after that, according to John Joy, public information officer with the Oakland County Road Commis-

"That particular intersection has met the criteria for installation of a traffic light and it's proposed in our 1989 budget, but we haven't yet set priorities for installation of lights across the county," said Joy Tuesday

Novi City Manager Edward Kriewall called for the Road Commission to step up the date for the installation of a signal at the Ten Mile/Beck Road intersection after an accident which occurred Tuesday,







### Novi voters pick election winners

Novi voters picked winners almost this fall. across the board in the August 2 In other races: primary, joining in on large landgenerally went onto victories

A total of 2,429 ballots were cast in Novi - 11 percent of the electorate. Totals were still "unofficial" by press time Wednesday. Here is a look at some of the major

52nd District Court: Novi voters chose challenger Terence Jolly over appointed incumbent Judge Brian MacKenzie by almost a 2-1 margin. District Court area, which includes countywide. much of western Oakland County. As MacKenzie will square off again in the November election.

Prosecutor: Novi voters tabbed

Thompson got 904 votes in Novi, outdistancing County Commissioner Jack McDonald (332), Jeffrey Leib (180) and State Sen. Richard Fessler (141). Countywide, Thompson garnered over 50 percent of the vote, sealing the victory and the right to face Democratic nominee Barry Kraemer this fall.

Kraemer, going unopposed, collected 385 votes on the Democratic

U.S. Senate:: Novi voters backed East Lansing builder Jim Dunn over Troy industrialist Robert Huber by a 780-602 margin. Dunn sealed a GOP nomination statewide and will challenge U.S. Senator Donald Riegle in the general election. Riegle, going unopposed, received

598 votes in Novi. Drain Commissioner: Novi voters supported incumbent George Kuhn in his GOP challenge with William Eckstein. Kuhn beat Eckstein 894-250 in Novi and won by a similar fashion in all of Oakland County.

Kuhn now goes against Democratic ominee Douglas Kuthy, who received 379 votes in Novi going unopposed. Clerk/Register of Deeds: Novi Philip Marcuse by a 265-149 margin in the Democratic primary. Triviax won countywide and will square off against incumbent Clerk Lynn Allen

County Commissioner John. slides and supporting candidates who Calandro (R-Novi) and State, Representative Willis Bullard (R--Milford) advanced without GOP op-. position. Calandro received 1,171

## Cluster option creates widespread controversy

It's a controversy that has silently crept through Oakland County, leaving most local officials in a quandry or in a state of frank disagreement

about what to do. It's the cluster option, and controversies over it have followed rapid development in neighboring communities, almost as a barometer of

Novi City Council Member Hugh Crawford recently called for a moratorium on cluster option approvals in Novi until the ordinance can be reworked and "tightened up." Similar moratorium requests have

been entertained in a number of Oakland County communities. West Bloomfield Township, earlier this year, banned use of the cluster option temporarily and put into place a tough new series of restrictions on future applications of the law.







## Odd-even watering system remains in effect for Novi

Despite increased rainfall in southwestern Michigan, Novi's mandatory odd-even watering ban is still in ef-

Rainfall monitoring stations at the Detroit Metropolitan Airport registered 2.43 inches of rain for July, up from slightly under one inch total in June. City officials said they will keep the odd-even system

"It's going pretty well at this point," Department of Public Services Director Robert Shaw said. "We haven't seen any pressure problems in the city since the pressure drop last month."

Shaw said the pressure drop that hit Novi last month may have been the fault of a faulty pump in the Detroit system, besides a rapid loss of water in Detroit reser-

City Manager Edward Kriewall, who was on vacation this week, said at a council meeting last week that city officials have been reluctant to completely lift the ban, since it might cause a rush to use water in the city. He said the ban would probably be relieved over time as the water situation grandually improves.

And a test conducted the wrong way can produce misleading results, she added. causing some people to make risky decisions concerning

Results from pregnancy tests, which are increasingly popular among teen-agers, may come up negative, but that does not mean the woman is not pregnant. "A woman might actually be pregnant but might not have produced a readable hormone level yet," Collins said.

Self-administered occult blood tests, which became popular following President Reagan's surgery for colon cancer, can be helpful, but consumers should remember that the results can have several meanings.

"A person who tests positive may automatically assume the worst." Collins said. "But they won't know, unless someone tells them, that hemorrhoids or eating too much red meat also can cause blood in the stool. On the other hand, negative results may give a false sense

a self-testing kit for the first time - should consult a pharmacist before using it. She also notes that pharmacists should learn as much as possible to prepare themselves to field questions, especially as the tests

become more popular. "We need to start sensitizing pharmacists to the fact that they should know as much as possible about the kits if they plan to sell them," Collins said.

"They're the ones who can save consumers frustration and money on wasted tests by explaining how these kits should be used. Pharmacists should help consumers select a kit, tell them how to best identify the results and their implications, and provide the names of physicians







The atmosphere at Chili's is friendly and relaxed, thanks in large part to a casual-butclassy decor. Dress ranges from jeans and polo shirts to full business suits, and neither end of the spectrum looks out of place. The restaurant is noisy enough to be entertaining and homey, but not so much that it becomes tough to talk.

The staff does more for the atmosphere than anything else. We were there at a busy dinner time, but everyone working there was smiling and courteous. Service was quick and efficient, even when the restaurant completely filled up.

Chili's has a nice selection of bottled beer and wine, as well as the expected margaritas. Nothing especially outstanding about that, but the place gets high marks for offering to call and pay for - a taxi if there is no sober driver in a party. This service is announced on a blackboard at the pay phones. The restaurant offers some interesting

choices for appetizers, but we went for the classic plate of nachos. They were excellent, probably spicy enough to satisfy anyone but not so hot that the average diner can't enjoy. Dinner entrees range from \$4 sandwiches to

\$10 ribs, but we chose middle-of-the-line dinners. (A report from a colleague says the ribs I had a Chili's specialty called southwestern shrimp, served on a bed of rice. The shrimp was

terrific and came in a generous portion. My friend decided on chicken fajitas and said they were delicious. The fajitas are served with business even in this restaurant-rich area. onions and a side warmer of soft tortilla shells.

As anyone knows who regularly passes by, this happens pretty regularly. Although this situation is hardly ideal — and has captured the attention of city officials

 it's at least workable for the time being. But again, that's a very minor point when the experience is taken as a whole. Overall, Chili's is a fine restaurant for all kinds of different occasions, and ought to continue its land-office

PPROACHING the 18 homes of 1988 Homearama ---Summer, down a winding culde-sac in Autumn Ridge subdivision in West Bloomfield, many trends and innovations in home building are apparent.

With an average price tag of over \$350,000, the builders, architects, interior designers and landscapers had budget room to incorporate the latest and greatest features available.

It is apparent that white has become a very popular exterior color, as seen on seven of the homes. The "Saturn" model by C & O Construction & Investment Co. of Farmington Hills combines white brick and whitepainted horizontal cedar siding and shows an arresting triple-offset design in incorporating a triple garage into the attractive front elevation.

Walking into the basement of the "Saturn," the visitor will find that the walls have 20 different planes, in order to support the intricate, free-form architectural design.

Multiplaned and peaked roof lines are becoming more prevalent. The front view of "The Sheffield" by

Dakota Building Co. of West Bloomfield shows five separate roof levels, and the "Tri-Star" by Northbrook Asociates of Rochester Hills show six peaks.

**INSULATION HAS BEEN around** for a long time. Now comes "outsultation," a new exterior finishing system on walls of "The Biscayne" by L.K. Development Co. of West Bloomfield. Touted as maintenancefree, it consists of a troweled-on acrylic finish over insulation blocks.

With the size of lots in Autumn Ridge, there is plenty of room for inviting courtyards as preambles to the house's main entrance. Rembrandt Construction Inc. of Detroit effectively uses a large, brick-walled courtyard to carry out the French colonial theme of its "Windsor" model.

Around back, the deck's the thing, these days. Benivegna Building Co. Inc. of Farmington Hills and Roux & Associates of Northville have stretched a deck the entire length of the rear elevation of their "Arlington Il" model. It is accessible through window walls from the great room,

dining room and kitchen/dining nook.

It's also apparent from a stroll through 1988 HOMEARAMA ---Summer that lots of windows and huge windows are more "in" than ever. Walking up to Detroit Edison's "Bright Idea Home," the "Menlo Park" model by Burdge Inc. of W. Bloomfield, the visitor is impressed by a huge, 20-foot-by-22-foot entrance window wall composed of 18 large square panes, around the two towering 10-foot-by-4-foot glasspaneled entrance doors.

**HUGE WINDOWS MELD into sheer** glass walls in the aptly named "Looking Glass" model by Koch Development of Bloomfield Township.

Nine-foot-high glass walls in the multistepped-out design of the rear walls open up huge vistas of the treed area behind the home.

Not every home in Homearama is trendy. The colonial "Fairhill" model by Bonadeo Builders of Plymouth is staunchly traditional and exhibits fine workmanship and detail. Painstakingly done brick and stone lintels top all of the windows in the front elevation of the solid brick exterior.

The houses will be open to the public from Aug. 4 through Aug. 28, in the new Autumn Ridge subdivision on Orchard Lake Road just north of Walnut Lake Road.






