

Derailed Road closed as train slips off tracks

Four cars from a Chesapeake and Ohio train derailed Monday afternoon at the Novi Road crossing between Grand River and Ten Mile. The derailment caused the road to be closed for approximately four

No one was injured, although a C&O truck was damaged when it was struck by a derailed car. The cars were full of stone, which was being used by a C&O work crew to Road, just after 2 p.m. Monday. resurface the track's bedding.

According to C&O official Harry Rodman, work crews apparently left the bottom of several of the stone-hauling cars open, spilling

stop ... he tried to stop, but you don't stop a train right now," said one worker at the scene, who asked not to be identified. He said the engine had been pushing the cars at a very slow speed when the derail-

ment occurred - probably under five miles per hour. One of the cars slid off the tracks

west of Novi road, pushed into the side of a C&O truck and came to rest against the vehicle's left side.

Rodman said the cars were righted by a 60-ton crane which was brought to the scene just after 3 p.m. Monday. Police closed Novi Road between Ten Mile and Grand River, reopened it partially at about 4 p.m., then opened both lanes just after 6 p.m.

Rodman said the Monday derailment caused no rail damage.

The work crews go through and add rock to the surface of the railway beds once every several years as part of routine maintenance. This work crew had been resurfacing the track between Milford and Romulus.

City receives census funds

That appears to be the word from state officials, after Governor James Blanchard last week signed a supplemental budget bill which should put more than an additional

Novi earned the funds from conducting a mid-decade census last year, although the funds were held up by a Blanchard veto and the ensuing political wrangling.

Blanchard signed the legislation Wednesday, Aug. 3. It restored \$3.7 million worth of mid-decade census monies to 38 of Michigan's rapidly growing communities. The supplemental appropriations bill also handled another \$2.4 million of state

1988 fiscal year, which ends in October 1988.

Novi's share of the mid-decade census pie is \$346,096 — the third highest total in the state.

"We're very happy to finally see it," said Mayor Matthew Quinn. "We got great support from our representatives in getting it back."

State Representative Willis "Bill" Bullard (R-Milford) had led attempts to have the funds restored after the Blanchard veto last year. He was out of town and unavailable for comment this week.

State Department of Management and Budget Director Shelby Solomon, in an interview this week, said Blanchard's veto was brought about because of a tight budget.

Officials to eye plans for funds

Now that the city's mid-decade census monies appear to be on the way, city officials are pondering the most important question of all -

what to do with it. Governor James Blanchard signed a supplemental budget bill last week, restoring \$3.7 million in funding to 38 Michigan communities. Those communities had undertaken mid-decade census counts in an effort to show increased population and qualify for the additional state shared revenues.

His veto late last year stripped the funds from the 1987-88 budget.

Novi is slated to receive \$346,096 - money which wasn't earmarked for anything in the Novi budget since city officials weren't optimistric about ever seeing it.

City officials did, however, set aside several priority items this past spring during budget talks and appear to be willing to discuss those items further.

They include:

□ Spending a portion of the money on a sidewalk connection program throughout the city; ☐ Using the funds for parkland

acqusition; ☐ Using some of the funds for improvements to the Civic Center. Mayor Matthew Quinn said the

council would probably discuss what to do with the additional revenue within the next several weeks. The checks - in "lump sum" - should be forthcoming within four weeks, according to State Management and Budget Department officials.

"The sidewalk program and parkland acquition seems to be what most council members favored when we discussed it," Quinn said.

Council Member Edward Leininger said he supported finishing up several Civic Center projects, such as underground sprinkling, an information system for the atrium or a marquis for the front of the Civic Center. Leininger said parkland acqusition was "a good possibility."

"That's a good possibility, but I'm not sure what we can get for \$300,000," Leininger said. "We might be able to make a down payment or cover a portion of what we want to get."

Council Member Nancy Covert said she thought the issue needed more discussion at the council table. She said she supports parkland or open space acqusition with the funds, but is hoping for further citizen input.

"However, this delay has caused me to lose several financing opportunities and it is unclear at this moment how readily available acceptable financing will be over the next 90 to 120 days," he continued. Eldridge attended the planning

commission's Aug. 3 meeting and was prepared to address the commission, but was not asked to do so.

The one-year extension of final site plan approval was quickly, quietly and unanimously approved by planners in a 7-0 vote. Commis-

sion Chairperson Charles Kureth and Commissioner Rico Digirolamo were absent.

The Landing project has been plagued by delays several times since it was proposed. Eldridge first received final site plan approval for the shoreline project on Aug. 26, 1987. Shortly afterward on Aug. 31, 1987 — a development agreement with the city was approved by the Novi City Council.

Answers sought at Ten Mile/Beck


Novi officials have scheduled a meeting with Oakland County Road Commission (OCRC) representatives to discuss speeding up signalization for the Ten Mile/Beck Road intersection.

The instersection has been the scene of at least three major traffic accidents in the last several weeks and dozens this year. A four-way signal has been slated to be installed at the corner within the OCRC budget, but installation will not until occur until October of this year at the earliest when their fiscal

Novi City Manager Edward Kriewall said the city has been exploring several alternatives about what to do with the corner in the meantime, including paying for the signal with city funds and getting reimbursement from the OCRC later. City officials are also exploring placing stop signs or warning signs in the area in cooperation with the road co mission, until the signal can be put in.

Kriewall said the major problem is getting utility hookups to the area quickly enough to get the light put

'Shed ordinance' receives minor revisions by council

Novi's "Shed Ordinance" will get a few minor revisions this week, but it appears as if the proposal could become law within a month.

The Novi Planning Commission, one week ago, called for a major rewrite of the ordinance proposal and a reconvening of the subcommittee that worked out the details of the proposal. But the city council Monday night opted to skip that step and implement the or-

Council Member Martha Hoyer, who served on the subcommittee, said most of the planning commission's questions were discussed thoroughly during deliberations of the ordinance proposal.

"Had we been invited to the planning commission meeting, we could have answered most of the ques-During a July 20 public hearing on the ordinance pro-

posal, the planning commission reported back eight

trouble spots and recommended against passage of the measure by a 7-0 vote. Planning Commission Vice-Chair Judith Johnson said

she had no reaction to the city council action Monday "The chairperson of the committee (Hoyer) seemed to

feel that all of our concerns were addressed," she said. The Shed Ordinance would regulate lakefront lots on Walled Lake, laying down a strict new set of re-

quirements for sheds and boatwells on lake lots, besides' banning storage of certain materials, like wood. The ordinance also lays down requirements for off-season. storage of boats.

The ordinance was requested by city building officials, who sought an enforceable law. Currently, no structures, are allowed on lakefront lots, although that provision isnearly impossible to enforce. Some of the sheds on the Walled Lake lakefront have fallen into disrepair, while others are scattered with debris and stored materials

that have been there for many years. Council members resolved several points that had been raised by the planning commission last week. The council opted to allow one shed on each lakefront lot, or a shed for each home on lots that may be jointly owned. That means if a single homeowner has acquired two lake lots, the owner would still be allowed just one

shed on Walled Lake's frontage. The council also tacked on an amendment limiting the ordinance to lakes over 600 acres in size. That has the net effect of making this ordinance apply only to Walled Lake residents, since the other lakes in the city -Shawood Lake and Meadowbrook Lake - are much smaller. Planners had complained that the ordinance would be implemented citywide, although no effort had been made to study the ordinance's impact on the other

The on-again, off-again saga of mid-decade census fund payments appears to be on-again. Gov. James Blanchard last week signed a supplemental appropriations bill which restored the mid-decade funds.

Thirty-eight Michigan communities had undertaken mid-decade counts in 1986 and 1987 in an effort to show increases in population and, in \$3.7 million at stake. turn, qualify for higher levels of state-shared revenue. The program was designed to up the amount of stateshared revenue available for communities which may grow rapidly between the usual 10-year census

The 38 communities met all the requirements and qualified for \$3.7 million in additional funding. Novi was to get over \$340,000. But Blanchard, in an unprecedented move, last year vetoed the funds out of the 1987-88 budget, claiming the money just wasn't there.

McCarthy is not a big-time blue-chipper. There were no scholarship tenders from any of the Big 10 or Pac 8 schools. But her aggressiveness and abilities in both basketball and softball received considerable attention from the somewhat smaller colleges and universities not only in Michigan but in several other Midwestern

"I got offers from Adrian, Albion, Augustana (Ill.), Lakeland (Wisc.) College and Ball State," reported Mc-Carthy recently while sitting in the kitchen of her

parents' home in the Cedar Springs subdivision. "The recruiting was flattering in a way, but it also got to be pretty bad at times, too," she continued. "Sometimes, I'd get calls from as many as four different coaches the same night. After awhile, it got to the point where you just had to say, 'Hey, I've got homework to do

"Some coaches would call every night." McCarthy was a four-year letter-winner in both basketball and softball during her prep career, and managed to attract the attention of collegiate coaches despite playing on teams which never did particularly

"My freshman year we were 18-3 in basketball, but after that it was pretty much downhill," she admitted. "We got over .500 a couple of times in softball, but never really had what you could call an outstanding season . .

we didn't have championship teams." Still, McCarthy showed plenty of ability in both sports. She was chosen to the All-Kensington Valley Conference basketball team as a sophomore, junior and senior. And was was a second-team All-KVC selection as both a junior and senior - a snub which some contend demonstrates that a lot of KVC coaches don't know what

they're talking about. "To think that we've had one of the best catchers in the county in Lisa McCarthy for four years and she never once made it to the first team - it's ludicrous," scoffed Softball Coach John Peace recently.

There's also a possibility that collegiate coaches were attacted by McCarthy's considerable leadership abilities. She was class president during all four years of high school as well as president of the local chapter of

Students Against Drunk Driving. She also was elected 1987 homecoming queen at Novi High School. And she also graduated cum laude.

A relatively short 5'3" tall, McCarthy says that point guard is really the only position she's suited for. Beyond that, however, she relishes the leadership role - bringing the ball up the floor, beating the press and runn-

"Because that's where all the action is," responds Mc-Carthy, surprised that anyone would want to play any other position. "You're involved in every single play. You run the team from behind the plate . . . you tell people where to go, you learn the hitters on the other teams. you can tell your pitcher where to pitch, watch the coaches on the other teams so you can steal their

McCarthy believes she has an opportunity to continue her leadership role for the Alma College Scots next year. "Coach G (Alma's womens basketball coach Charlie Goffnet) has told me he needs a good point guard," she ..

She also likes the fact that Alma has a winning program. In fact, Goffnet claims Alma is the dominant women's basketball team in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) and points with. pride to the fact his team has captured five titles during the 10 years the MIAA has awarded championships.

"Yes, I guess you could say that I like to run things," McCarthy admitted. "And I'd like nothing better than to." be the starting point guard at Alma College next year."
