

Plans unveiled for Twelve Mile

Residents near Twelve Mile Road got a chance to see detailed road widening plans last week, and, predictably, they weren't happy about them.

Plans call for the roadway to be expanded to six and four lanes between Haggerty Road and a spot just west of Novi Road. Twelve Mile is currently a two-lane highway, which is highly congested during most times of the day.

About 26 acres of property on either side of Twelve Mile will have to be acquired to make room for road expansion to six lanes.

City officials said they will attempt to negotiate purchases, secure gifts or seek condemnation of the property to obtain rights-ofway for the new road.

The cost of acquisition will be about \$2.6 million, according to engineering consultant Joe Kapelczak of JCK and Associates. Total project cost will be over \$8 million. The new roadway would be completed in five to seven years, according to plans now on the table. Residents got a detailed look at the plans Thursday night at the



another snag. Originally promised for Labor Day, it now appears that the fourway traffic signal won't be installed until Sept. 30 at the very earliest, according to the variety of agencies and people now dealing with the

Road commission officials say they are ready to deliver the equipment to the troubled corner, but won't do so until power is made available by Detroit Edsion. Edison officials say ongoing rapid development and a series of summer storms have put them behind schedule in Oakland County. "We're flooded," said Edsion

spokesman Marty Bufalini. "We're doing the best we can to keep up." The Oakland County Road Com-





Novi school officials have been consulting with the Grosse Pointe School District testing director concerning The Novi school board discussed

the district's testing program at its meeting last Thursday. Superintendent Robert Piwko pointed out that classes which prepare students for the ACT and SAT tests often improve test scores. These classes commonly review testtaking techniques as well as basic

English and math skills. "There is an emphasis on these tests and we must pass that information on to our students." Piwko told

school board members. High school counselors also are recommending that students do not have their scores sent directly to a

college before they take the entrance then expected, the students are free

to take the test again. "This enables the student to choose the better of their performances,"

Piwko commented. It was acknowledged that the time

of year in which the tests are offered quite often influences final scores. During discussion, board members talked about possibly adding national criterion and referenced tests that would show how Novi compares to

However, since all standardized board during the 1988-89 school year. test scores are grouped by schools with similar curriculums, it was thought that such results may be duplicated by tests already administered district-wide.

Several school board members asked that the ACT composite scores the ACT and SAT college entrance be made available to them for study. "We would like to see statistics generated on the testing for instruction purposes," Board Member Robert Schram said.



Traffic signal delay detracts from effort

to commend the City of Novi and the Oakland County Road Commission (OCRC) for apparently having worked out a plan to install a traffic signal at the dangerous Ten Mile/Beck Road intersection by Labor Day.

In case you haven't noticed, Labor Day has come and passed . . and there's still no traffic signal at the Ten Mile/Beck Road location — a fact which quite obviously has tempered our impulse to pass out commendations for a job well done.

As traffic volume on both Ten Mile and Beck Road continues to grow, there has been a corresponding increase in the number of accidents at the intersection. The need for a traffic signal had been acknowledged by the OCRC which had targetted the intersection for signalization during the 1988-89 fiscal year.

The problems were that the number of accidents at Ten Mile/Beck Road were increasing at a much faster rate than anticipated and the OCRC's '88-89 fiscal year does not begin until Oct. 1, 1988. Consequently, it appeared earlier this summer that there was no chance a signal would be installed prior to Oct. 1 and the installation more likely would not occur until early in 1989.


Festival provides entertainment

Paella is one of Spain's most wonderful, peasant dishes. Yet the American version of paella is one of those things you feel like you're supposed to be impressed with but almost never are. Why? Because the paella served in most American restaurants is all "flash", with none of the 'substance" which makes real paella so great. "American pa ella" - a fancy expensive crown of seafood sitting on a flavorless bed of yellow Uncle Ben's rice is absolutely NOT what paella is all about.

The two most important parts of a true paella are the rice and the saffron. To make a real paella, and more importantly a good paella, you have to use real, short grain Spanish rice, and real top quality saffron. If you substitute Uncle Ben's rice and either a low grade saffron (which more than likely isn't saffron but marigold or turmeric) you can add all the fancy ingredients you want, but he end result will be NOT be paella. What you will have is "boiled yellow rice with seafood."

There are hundreds of paella recipes in Spain today - everyone has their version of the "best". The original paella came from the area around Valencia (not surprisingly, Spain's major rice growing area) and to its two primary ingredients - rice and saffron were added only snails, eels, and green beans. Today "Paella Valenciana" adds chicken and green peas to the original version and drops the eels. There are also vegetable paellas, seafood paellas, rabbit paellas...the list is endless. But as writer Peter Feibleman puts it, "...the true answer to what really goes into a Levantine paella is usually rice, saffron, and whatever happens to be fresh and cheap at the market".

The bottom line on Paella: Start with real Spanish rice and the finest saffron, add just about anything else that's good and follow any basic recipe for paella (see Penelope Casas' Food and Wines of Spain), and you can make a truly delicious paella right at home.

"Like many great

dishes, paella is a poor

man's food that has become the rich man's treat.".....'It is said that if you ask 100 average male Spaniards what really goes into a paella 🏻 🍣 you will get 100 different answers; but if you ask 100 Levantines, you will get 300 answers, each man giving one for himelf, one for his grandmother and one for his wife." Peter Feibleman

'Liquid Salad' Gazpacho, as it is made in Spain, is certainly one of the best cold soups you'll find anywhere in the world. But the gazpacho that most Americans know - made up of big chunks

of vegetables - neither looks nor tastes like gazpacho in Spain. Like paella, there are hundreds of versions of gazpacho. But the basic origi nal Andalusian recipe calls for little more than ripe tomatoes. white bread, olive oil, wine vinegar and garlic, all of which are pureed into a beautifully, smooth red liquid. Some recipes call for the addition of cucumbers or peppers, and garnishes range from croutons to all sorts of diced vegetables. But no matter what's in it gazpacho is always smooth textured. Served very cold it's the perfect starter for a summer meal.
