Council rezones Ten Mile/Beck parcel

Residents in the mostly rural western half of the city might not have to travel far to buy groceries in the near future... but whether or not they're very happy about seeing a new shopping mall go up appears to be a different story.

The Novi City Council voted Monday to approve a rezoning request for the rural Ten Mile/Beck Road area which could pave the way for a convenience shopping center — which could include a grocery store, gas station and restaurant — to be built at the northeast corner of the intersection.

The rezoning, enacted by a 4-2 vote, affirms an Oct. 5 Planning Commission recommendation for approval of the rezoning request. It also conforms to the city's master plan. Several past master plans have called for a 10-acre commercial site to be located at the corner, though only about three acres had been zoned commercial.

The rezoning request faced stiff resident opposition, with most opponents arguing that the shopping areas should go in the already heavily commercialized center of the city, rather than the rural "west end."

Residents argued that the center wouldn't match the character of the western half of the city. Additionally,

they maintained that the proposed shopping center could create a "domino effect," which could lead other rural lands go the way of commercial development. (See related story.)

City officials said the rezoning allows them to plan ahead and provide a shopping area for an estimated 28,000 future residents in the southwestern section of the city. City planning consultants said a shopping center at the Ten Mile/Beck Road intersection could prevent new residents from traveling across town to visit convenience shopping centers east of Novi Road.

Opponents reacted strongly after the rezoning was approved by the council Monday night.

Former Mayor Robert Schmid called the rezoning a "mistake."

"This center is going to attract people from Lyon Township, from Northville, from Wixom, Walled Lake — it's going to draw people from an eight or 10 mile area," Schmid said. "There was a lot of talk about the impact on the east side of the city, but what about the west side?"

"Why don't we plan for the people who are already here?" he said.

"I think it's a major mistake and it doesn't benefit the residents one bit," said Laura Lorenzo, a sometimes outspoken critic of city development policies. "I haven't seen anybody come forward and say they want more shopping

centers. I hear plenty of people come forward and say they've had enough."

Developers of the project are hoping to attract a major grocery chain to the area, but needed the rezoning and more than three acres to achieve that objective.

"These things do not occur overnight, there's a great deal of commitment involved," said Architect Al Tuomaala. "Should everything go ideally, we're two years away from opening our first center."

"Two or three years down the road, at the rate of present growth, the need will be there," he said.

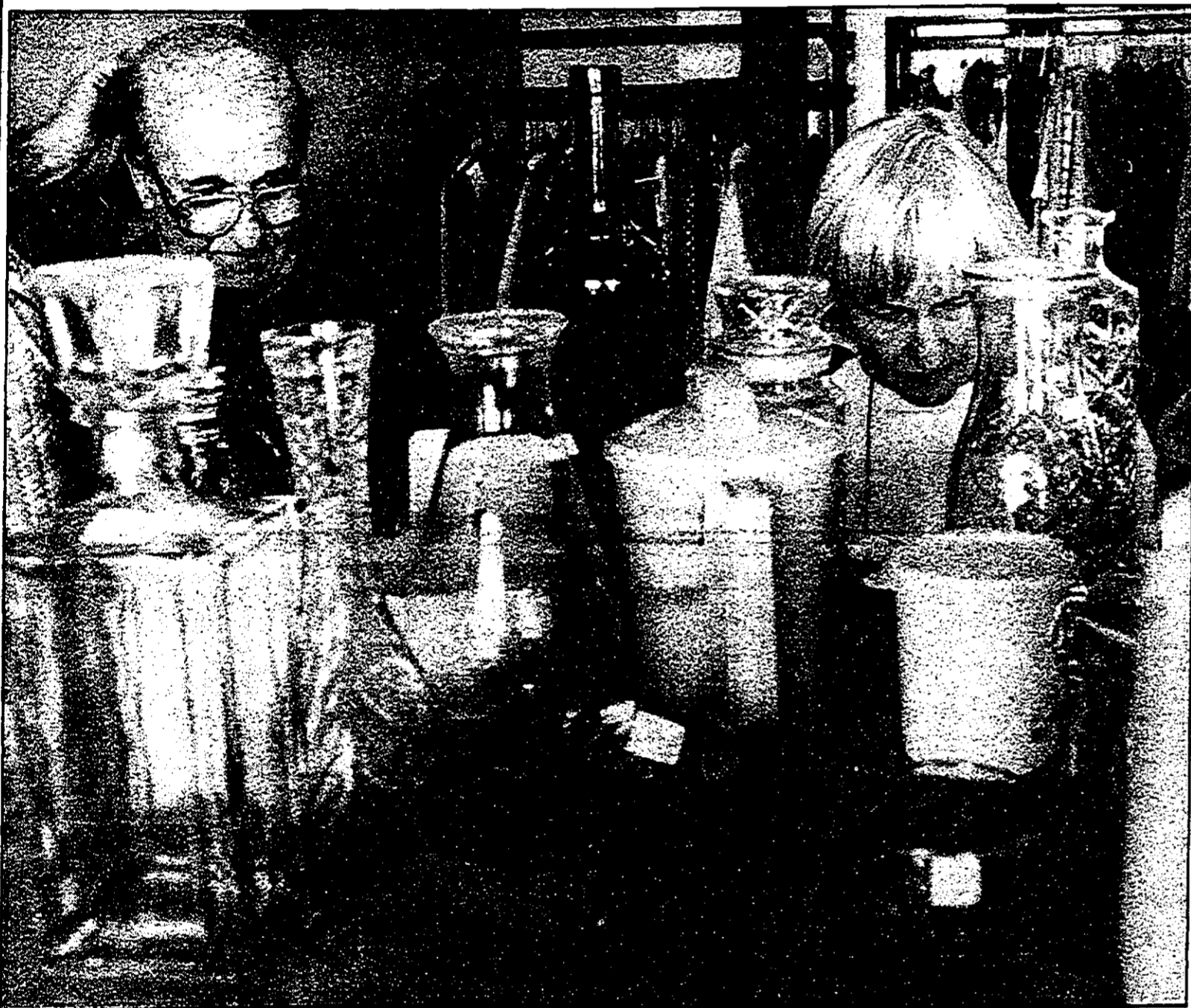
Tuomaala said the development would have a "residential" character.

Several council members called the rezoning a "tough call."

"It's best to get it in now before that area is developed... you're not going to slip it in at a later date," Councilman Joseph Toth said.

Councilman Edward Leininger said the store in that area could help to reduce traffic flow throughout the city.

Voting in favor of the rezoning were Mayor Matthew Quinn, Council Member Martha Hoyer, Leininger and Toth. Dissenting ballots were cast by Council Members Hugh Crawford and Nancy Covert. Council Member Ronald Watson was ill and didn't attend the meeting.

Residents react to rezoning in rural 'west end'

The list of opponents was impressive enough.

They included a former mayor, a former council member and the city's persistent environmental critic. But they weren't enough to defeat a rezoning request for a proposed shopping center on a 10-acre parcel on the northeast corner of the Ten Mile/Beck Road intersection.

The council listened to opposition from several residents Monday night, including former Mayor Robert Schmid and former Councilman James Shaw before approving the rezoning by a 4-2 vote.

The vote clears the way for development of a major convenience-type shopping center on the site. What type of grocery outlet would come to the corner hasn't yet been determined.

The area had been planned as a shopping center in several city

master plans. Schmid, Shaw and Novi resident Laura Lorenzo (the environmental critic) argued that the stores ought to be located in the commercial area in the center of the city, keeping such developments out of the rural "west end."

"How many people have come before this council and said 'I want a shopping center at Ten Mile and Beck Road?'" Schmid asked.

"The citizens are pretty knowledgeable... why can't they come forward and say they want a shopping center?"

"I thought we had developed a policy of concentrating our commercial development (in the center of town)," said Shaw.

Lorenzo also questioned the rezoning.

"When you purchase a home in a

Report rates risky city intersections

What's the most dangerous intersection in the City of Novi?

The answer depends on how you define "dangerous."

But if you guessed that the Grand River/Novi Road intersection is the place where the most accidents occur, you win a worry-free trip by hot air balloon from southern Novi to Twelve Oaks Mall.

Statistics showing that the Grand River/Novi Road intersection has the highest frequency of accidents in the city is included in a massive report distributed by the Traffic Improvement Association (TIA) of Oakland County to the Novi Police Department.

Titled "Multiple-Year Intersection/Accident Comparative Analysis," the report is several inches thick and contains just about everything you could want to know

about traffic accidents within the city.

The job of wading through the huge pile of paperwork belongs to Novi Police Detective Ralph Fluhart, who serves as the city's Traffic Staff Officer in addition to his responsibilities with the Detective Bureau.

"I'm going to be doing a lot of reading in the immediate future," remarked Fluhart, pointing to the statistical analysis spread out on a desk in a conference room of Novi police headquarters recently.

Statistics indicating the frequency of accidents is only one portion of the overall report. Another section rates the city's intersections in terms of the severity of accidents.

"There's an important difference," said Fluhart. "You may have an intersection where there are a lot of accidents, but most of them are minor fender-benders.

Office complex wins approval

Commuters entering Novi's western boundary are likely to see some construction activity in the near future as Phase One of Westbrooke Place gets off the ground.

Joseph Gerak and Gloria Gelsstein, developers of the office-hotel complex at the Grand River/Beck Road intersection, received unanimous preliminary site plan approval for the first phase of their development from city planners at their Oct. 5 meeting.

There's a slight hitch in the plans, though. Before construction can begin, Gerak must receive approval from the Zoning Board of Appeals for a variance on required parking spaces. Some 688 parking spaces are required in the first phase of the development, but Gerak indicated he would like to provide only 578 spaces at this time. The remaining spaces will be added in later phases, he said.

The Westbrooke Place complex consists of a 135-room hotel and 92,451 square feet of office space on

a 13-acre site on the north side of Grand River Avenue, west of Beck Road. The development is proposed on the site of what was formerly the Bob-O-Link Golf Course.

Five phases are planned for construction of the complex. Gerak said he anticipated locating a Ramada business hotel on the site.

Gerak's overall conceptual plan encompasses over 67 acres of land near the I-96/Beck Road interchange.

Gerak told the Novi Planning Commission he has contacted the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) to request additional land in the southwest quadrant of I-96 and Beck Road for anticipated improvements to the interchange. He said he has not received any input from the MDOT yet.

City Traffic Consultant Rod Arroyo explained that improvements for the interchange are not listed on the state's 10-year priority list.

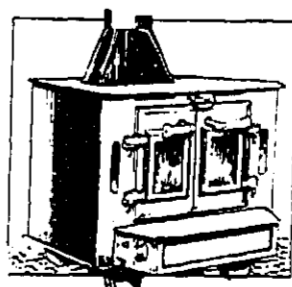
The first phase of the project, however, isn't expected to be impacted by the interchange. Phase One includes construction of a five-story hotel and a three-story office building.

Novi officials make late push on road fee issue

Novi officials are pushing hard for passage of the county's proposed \$25 vehicle registration fee, but are not overly optimistic about the measure's chances for success.

The city council passed a resolution Monday night endorsing the vehicle registration fee question, which will appear on the general election ballot Nov. 8.

If voters approve the ballot issue, it would tack on an additional \$25 fee to most vehicle registrations, with the funds earmarked specifically for roads in Oakland County.

The proposal has given dismal chances of success, with polls indicating that as many as 70 percent of Oakland County's voters won't support it.

Novi City Manager Edward Kriewall said the issue isn't likely to go away, even if voters turn it down in the Nov. 8 election.

"Sometimes, proposals like this have to be put out there once or twice before people understand what's at stake," Kriewall said. "The first time around, you have more people who are definitely opposed to it."

"I think it's a good proposal," he said. "I hope it passes."

The registration fee boost would raise approximately \$550,000 per year in the City of Novi — about \$20 million countywide. Michigan Department of Transportation estimates place 820,000 cars in

Oakland County, second only to Wayne County (1.4 million) in the State of Michigan.

Currently the Oakland County Road Commission receives most of its funding from state gasoline taxes, which are collected in Lansing and distributed to counties on a complex formula. Legislators have long argued that the funding formula is unfair to Oakland County, but have been unable to get it changed to reflect the amount of automobiles and road miles being traveled here.

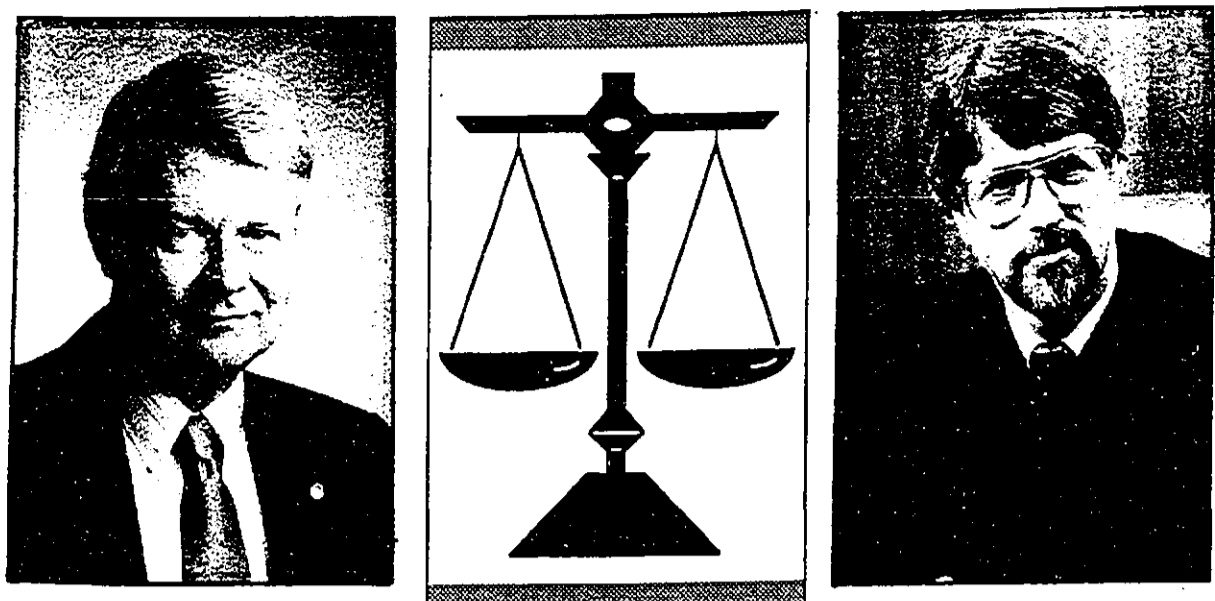
The Road Commission altered the way it approached the question several months ago. Communities are now allowed to do all of the priority setting, rather than the complex road commission-municipality split that had existed previously. It now allows local municipalities to prioritize the areas where the money should be spent.

Kriewall said the city would likely face tough funding alternatives in the future if the question were to fail. Novi is looking at raising a substantial amount of money for the widening of major city streets, like Twelve Mile. If a state economic development grant goes through, the city would need to raise funds for a local match. Currently, city officials are anticipating those funds will come from the \$25 vehicle registration fee.

Mayor Matthew Quinn urged support as well.

"It's a positive approach and something that is necessary," Quinn said of the proposed vehicle registration fee. Quinn also said the impact on businesses will be greater, especially larger firms with fleets of trucks, which will need to register at the higher rates.

Council Member Nancy Covert voted against the council resolution. "I feel it's just another add-on tax and I can't support it," she said.



Q: What should be the role of partisan politics in judicial races?

TERRY JOLLY

Partisan politics play a role in the selection and nomination of Michigan Supreme Court Justices. I have been endorsed by the Oakland County Republican Party. My opponent has not been endorsed. The ability to be identified and endorsed by a major political party is an asset to any judicial candidate.

Historically, the parties have endorsed judicial candidates. In this district court race the Republican Party has endorsed me. The Democratic party has appointed my opponent. I am frequently asked by citizens if I am endorsed by the Republican party and I answer yes.

In addition, I am endorsed by numerous local Republican officials due to my more moderate to conservative legal viewpoints. Partisan politics has always played a role in judicial races. My opponent received his April 1988 appointment by the governor due to his Democratic Party activities. Without Democratic partisan politics, my opponent would not have received the governor's appointment in April of 1988. It's partisan politics that will partially determine the outcome of this race.

The public must decide if my community involvement is more important than partisan politics. Seventeen years of community involvement in the Lions, Rotary, Jaycees and Chamber of Commerce should be more important. Serving the School District as a Novi School Board Trustee, current Novi Educational Foundation President, and on numerous School Needs Committees should be the deciding factor rather than partisan politics.

Four years as an Assistant United States Attorney prosecuting and convicting drug pushers at the Federal level and 20 years as a successful trial attorney is more important than partisan politics. Endorsements that consider a lawyer's ability, such as the Women's Lawyers Association of Michigan, should be given great weight before citizens cast their votes. And I am proud of my endorsement by the Women's Lawyer Association of Michigan.

BRIAN MacKENZIE

In judicial elections, we vote for the person, not a political party. That's good. A good judge is non-partisan and impartial, and a partisan candidate simply can't be an impartial judge.

Partisan appeals — partisan divisions — promises to special interest groups, and mud-slinging to defeat an opponent seem commonplace in today's politics. But politics can't be allowed to intrude into elections for judges, if we hope justice will result. A judge can't be beholden to a political party and be a good judge. A judge can't play politics, and play fair.

How can you choose a judge without party labels? You've got to learn more about the candidates for judge. That's good too. And the best way to determine the kind of judge a candidate will be is to find out what kind of lawyer he or she has been.

I'm proud to have served as an attorney for the public. I've prosecuted accused criminals — exclusively — as an attorney. In 13 years as assistant attorney general and assistant prosecutor, my job has been to protect the community and to serve justice. That's the only type of lawyer I've ever wanted to be. An attorney — and a judge — who works for the community.

Ask those who know the work of a judge the best — attorneys, of course — and law enforcement officers, who are involved in the court every day. I'm glad to have been endorsed by nine important law enforcement organizations and officials — the Police Officers Association of Michigan, Sheriff John Nichols and others.

Judicial campaigns ask a lot from voters. We must learn a lot and choose well. The stakes are high. But the alternative — where parties and politicians intrude — can't promote justice, and can't serve us at all. When it's "just politics," it just isn't justice.

Voting: Changes by 1992

The 1988 presidential election is still almost three weeks away, but the state elections division is already thinking about 1992.

Regardless of who they vote for this fall, voters will be given cards asking them to declare a party preference of the state's 1992 presidential primary.

Cards are being printed, elections officials said, and will be distributed to all state polling places.

"This is a first step," said Chris Thomas, director of the state elections division. "But we're going to have access to a large number of voters over the next four years, and we'd like to have them participate in the primary."

Voters can also declare a party preference at any Michigan Secretary of State office or by sending a signed letter to their local clerk's office.

last day to register for the primary is Feb. 17, 1992. Voters won't be eligible to vote in the primary unless they declare a party preference.

The presidential primary — the first in Michigan in 20 years — will be held March 17, 1992.

In another change, voters who register for this fall's election have been asked to provide their driver's license number as well as name and address.

The new policy, mandated by state law, is designed to help the state election division create countywide voter files.

Voter files are currently maintained solely by individual cities and townships. The large number of files makes it difficult for election inspectors to check whether a voter is registered in more than one community. Countywide files, they believe, will prove more effective in tracking voters.

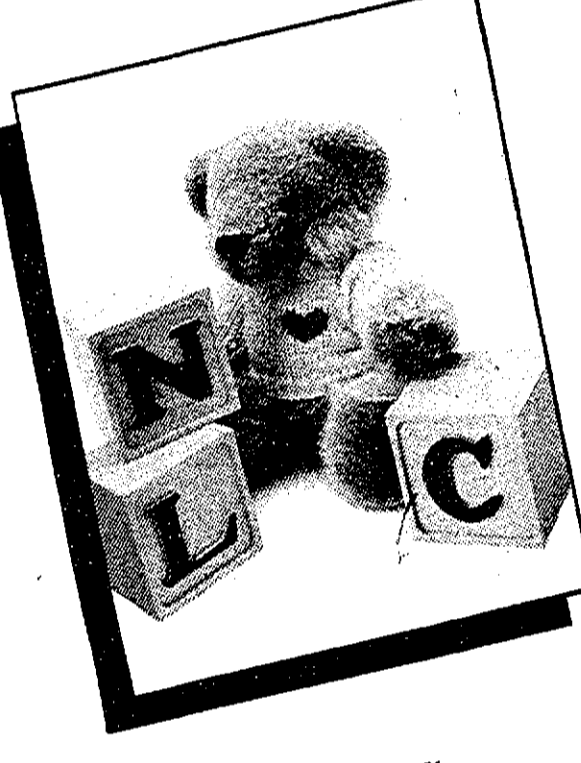

Planners OK subdivision plat

Novi planners recently took action to conform with the state's Subdivision Control Act by approving a plat titled Heritage Acres.

Novi Planning Commission voted 7-1 to recommend approval of the 50-acre preliminary plat located on the south side of Grand River Avenue, east of Taft Road, to the Novi City Council.

Commissioner Kathleen McLellan opposed the action while Commissioner Gary Phillips abstained from the vote, stating that he wasn't comfortable with the decision because he didn't fully understand what the commission was trying to accomplish.

The Heritage Acres plat consists of 19 lots, most of which are already developed. It encompasses three zoning designations — R-1 (light industrial), R-4 (single family residential) and R-A (residential agriculture).

The proposed plat was recommended by the city after it was discovered that more than four parcels of property — the maximum amount allowable by state plat laws — were owned by Pete Romanow. He apparently acquired parcels of the land over a long period of time.

Romanow eventually sold some of the plats to other property owners, but a plat was required to correct the violation.

"I am doing this because I was directed to do so by the city," Romanow told the planning commission. "It's just putting some lines on a piece of paper — I have no plans to develop any buildings."

City Planning Consultant Brandon Rogers explained the plat was designed to accommodate existing buildings and parking lots. He said the plat brings the property into legitimacy.

The only construction proposed is the addition of sidewalks along from

Players will soon see new Michigan Lottery terminals being installed at their favorite retailer locations. The following talks about this change.

Q: Why is a change being made?

County rejects efforts to cut tax rate millage

PONTIAC — Despite a still-booming economy, Oakland County officials are approaching 1989 tax increases, leveling the same 4.64 mill tax rate as in 1988.

The Board of Commissioners passed the rate 16-9 last week, rejecting two reduction attempts by lame duck commissioners James Doyon (D-Madison Heights) and James Lanni (R-Royal Oak).

"We found new expenses. We have a different jail. We have a solid waste program," said finance committee chairman G. William Caddell (R-Walled Lake).

That summed up the reasons Oakland will use the entire 13 percent increase in its property tax base. That increase — a combination of higher valuations and new construction — will boost property tax revenue \$10 million to \$36.7 million.

The owner of a house with a market value of \$100,000, assessed at \$50,000, will pay \$16 for county government next year, for county parks, 0.23 mill or \$11.50; and for Huron-Clinton Metroparks, 0.24 mill or \$12.

Seven Democrats were joined by two lame-duck Republicans, Lanni and Robert Page (R-Birmingham) in opposing the rate. The minority preferred Doyon's proposed cuts to 4.4 and 4.5 mills.

"Give the taxpayers a break," said Doyon, who has been notorious for opposing unnecessary taxes. But today I join forces with the executive and join the big spenders," King said.

"This county is going to have a surplus. The county executive has a tax-and-spend philosophy. A number of services are becoming historic — and some hysteric," said Doyon.

Lanni, who lost his primary in August, said the 4.5 rate "would be something we could live with... If we collect the taxes, we seem to spend it."

In other business, the board of commissioners:

- ☐ Voted 18-3 to upgrade the \$24,500-a-year job of law clerk, filled by law students, to circuit court research attorney, with base pay of \$30,305 and three step increases to a top of nearly \$35,000.
- ☐ Personnel committee chairman John Calandro (R-Novi) opposed the change, saying lawyers will want to make it a career and predicting the 14 circuit judges will be back in future years for more money and steps. Court Administrator Judy Cunningham said Oakland must compete in the market for better law school graduates, adding that too many candidates with "C" grades are applying for the positions.
- ☐ Added three dispatchers to the Sheriff's Department in preparation for the E-911 emergency telephone system due to be in effect in mid-November. Sheriff John Nichols anticipates a drastic increase in calls, at least in the first six months.
- ☐ Under E-911 a person can call the number from any point in Oakland County and be routed to the proper police, fire or ambulance agency.

College reports record enrollment

Enrollments in community colleges usually follow unemployment figures — up in bad times, down in good times.

But not this year. Oakland Community College (OCC) officials have reported their "best headcount in five years and best credit hour total likewise."

OCC spokesman George Cartsonis said the enrollment of 27,892 was up 2.4 percent over the fall semester of 1987.

Credit hours totalled 196,516 — an increase of 3.5 percent.

The average classload was 7.1 credit hours, up 0.1 hours from last year and well ahead of the 1985 total of 6.6 hours.

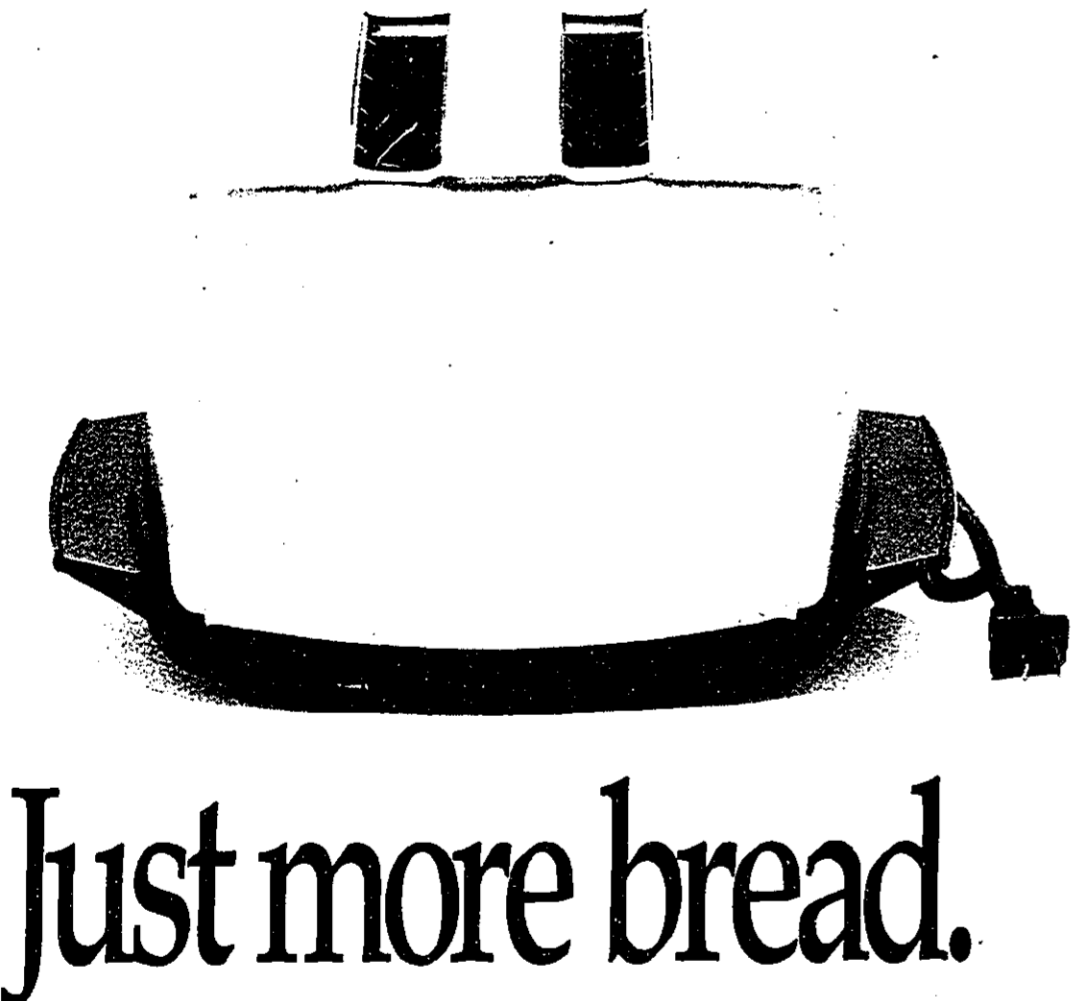
"We saw this coming," said Cartsonis. "We think the message is out that the community college is here. We have a whole menu of offerings," he said about increased marketing efforts.

"The counter-cyclical trend (high enrollment in bad economy) may be broken in the information age. Education may be a permanent part of our careers," he added.

Here's a breakdown of enrollment activity at the four OCC campuses:

- ☐ Southeast (Royal Oak and Southfield): Up 2.1 percent in headcount and 1.9 percent in credit hours.
- ☐ Auburn Hills: Down 0.2 percent in headcount, but up 3.8 percent in credit hours.
- ☐ Orchard Ridge has the highest average credit hours (8.0 hours) because it has more traditional, daytime, younger students," said Cartsonis.
- ☐ Meanwhile, the overall economy is continuing to show improvement. The Purchasing Managers Association of Detroit reported increasing number of orders and higher business confidence in August. Nationally, business investment — a predictor of confidence — is up for the next year or so.

Hazardous appeals must be monitored

The City of Novi has indeed taken a bold new step by enacting the new Hazardous Materials Ordinance — steps which are worthy of applause. Novi is now taking the responsibility for programs the state has been all too willing to shirk over time.

But we believe some problems could surface with the handling of this ordinance. It ought to be carefully studied in the next year or so.

For one, with all due respect to the volunteers who stepped forward to serve, we disagree with the content of the Hazardous Materials Appeals Board.

This body is designed to rule on disputes between the fire department, which enforces the ordinance, and individual businesses, which will have to live up to it. Why then are Novi businesspeople sitting on this board, especially businesspeople whose companies deal heavily in hazardous chemicals?

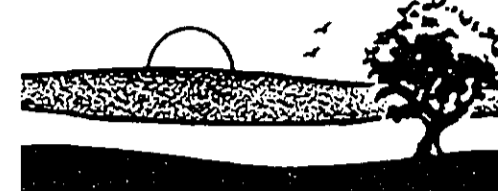
For instance, there's Fred Scott, who was appointed along with four other members Monday. Scott is vice-president of Steelcrete Corp. of Novi. On his application form, Scott said Steelcrete receives, handles, stores and transports hazardous materials on a day-to-day basis.

In his interview before the council, Scott admitted that he might have to excuse himself from some votes because of potential conflicts of interest that may arise — possibly ruling against a competitor or for a client. He said he wasn't sure whether or not his own company might appear before the appeals board one day, seeking relief from some of the ordinance's provisions.

Another board member, Mitchell Berger, is employed by Chem-Trend, a Howell-based chemical firm.

Understand that Steelcrete, Scott and Berger are not being questioned here. Steelcrete is a responsible Novi business with high standards. They practice good corporate citizenship. Scott's integrity, too, is crystal clear. Berger appears to be level-headed and sound in his knowledge of the ordinance.

But as we have said before — unpopularly — the appearance of impropriety is the key. What's going to

happen when Berger or Scott have to rule on a case involving competitors or clients? We would expect them to abstain from voting.

All of this could have been completely avoided if the city council would have just appointed residents who have few ties to the business community.

The problem with this ordinance lies at the feet of the city council, which handled it in a beanbag fashion. They adopted it, then amended it a couple of weeks later.

They agreed to supply the board professional consultants but there wasn't adequate discussion, no focus, on how this board would actually function day-to-day. With the consultants in place, why did applicants need to have qualifications in the chemical industry?

With the addition of input from professional consultants, we view this board no differently than the zoning board of appeals, planning commission or city council — a group of concerned lay people who take into account the best possible advice, then make decisions.

We can't fathom the rush to seat businesspeople, especially businesspeople who handle these hazardous chemicals on a day-to-day basis. And it says they can step out of their role as chemical handlers and objectively interpret the ordinance, then what's the difference? Why did we need businesspeople/chemical handlers in the first place?

Lay people, with professional consultation, could cast the same votes.

We'll be watching the deliberations of this new board closely. It behooves the city council to do the same.

Justified allocation

And while we're on the subject of the new Hazardous Materials Ordinance, a few comments regarding the Novi City Council's allocation of mid-decade census funds are appropriate.

The mid-decade census funds, you may recall, are the mini-windfall of \$948,000 received by the city from the state for conducting a head-count two years ago.

After discussing several possible uses for the funds, the city council decided Monday to spend \$188,000 for parkland acquisition and another \$100,000 for sidewalks/bike paths, leaving a balance of \$58,000 yet to be allocated.

One of the proposals which was not funded was a request from the fire department for some \$38,000 to purchase a data processing system to accommodate the increased workload brought on by the responsibility for monitoring the Hazardous Materials Ordinance. To be accurate, the request was not rejected; it was merely placed on "administrative hold," providing some hope that funds to pur-

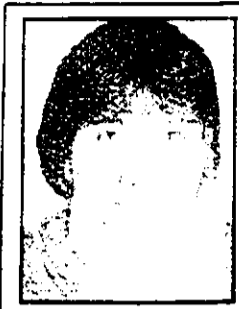
chase the system will be provided in the future.

As we said before, the city is to be commended for adopting a Hazardous Materials Ordinance. One of the reasons city officials believed such an ordinance was in order is the fact that the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) simply does not have the manpower to monitor and enforce existing environmental laws. As a consequence, the laws might as well not even exist in all too many instances.

Novi officials must make certain they do not create the same situation. It's great to have a Hazardous Materials Ordinance, but it's worthless without enforcement. The data processing system requested by the fire department would help enable the fire department to enforce the new ordinance so that it will accomplish what it is intended to accomplish.

Allocation of the \$38,000 for the system would help demonstrate that the city and city council are committed to having an ordinance which protects the community and the citizenry.

Day care can't be ignored

In the mornings I see her walking quickly toward the lighted house. She is always hurrying, carrying a blanket-wrapped bundle close to her breast. She is dressed in heels and hose and balances a diaper bag and briefcase. I don't know her name. I'm just the figure walking a dog every morning who nods and says "Good morning." She has no time for idle chatter.

Twice now I've walked the same route at night, around 6:30, and seen the same woman walking slowly home, the bundle now a wide-awake child who sucks his hand and stares about. Mother and child are coming home.

When people talk about day care, as so many are doing nowadays, it tends to get emotional. Some would like to keep it on a fact-only basis. The talk around town and around the state is about home day care businesses. Should they be allowed in residential areas? How should they be regulated? How can we make sure they are properly run and licensed? All good, unemotional questions that deserve factual answers.

But the problem is we are talking about parents and children and the issue gets very emotional, very fast. Day care is here to stay. Home day care has been here forever and will stay here. Say what you will, do what you want, but I know mothers, fathers and kids, and they will circumvent the best intentioned laws to make a tough situation work for them.

Remember the old TV shows where single parents dealt with the job of raising children? Uncle Bill was responsible for Judy, Buffy and Sissy but he had the implacable Mr. French who lived in, worked night and day and never took time off. In "My Three Sons," good old Uncle Charlie slaved away at the laundry and cooking while Steve, the dad, smoked his pipe and went to work. These people never worked overtime or had to go in on

Saturdays to finish a project. It's a dream world.

I was a nanny for a time in my life. If you're a writer your working life takes on many forms. I've discovered. Although I do not speak seven foreign languages or have a degree in child psychology, I found that I was in great demand for child sitting. Working couples are desperate for day-help with their children. They don't even mind a nanny who comes with her dog and reads Sports Illustrated to their six-week-old.

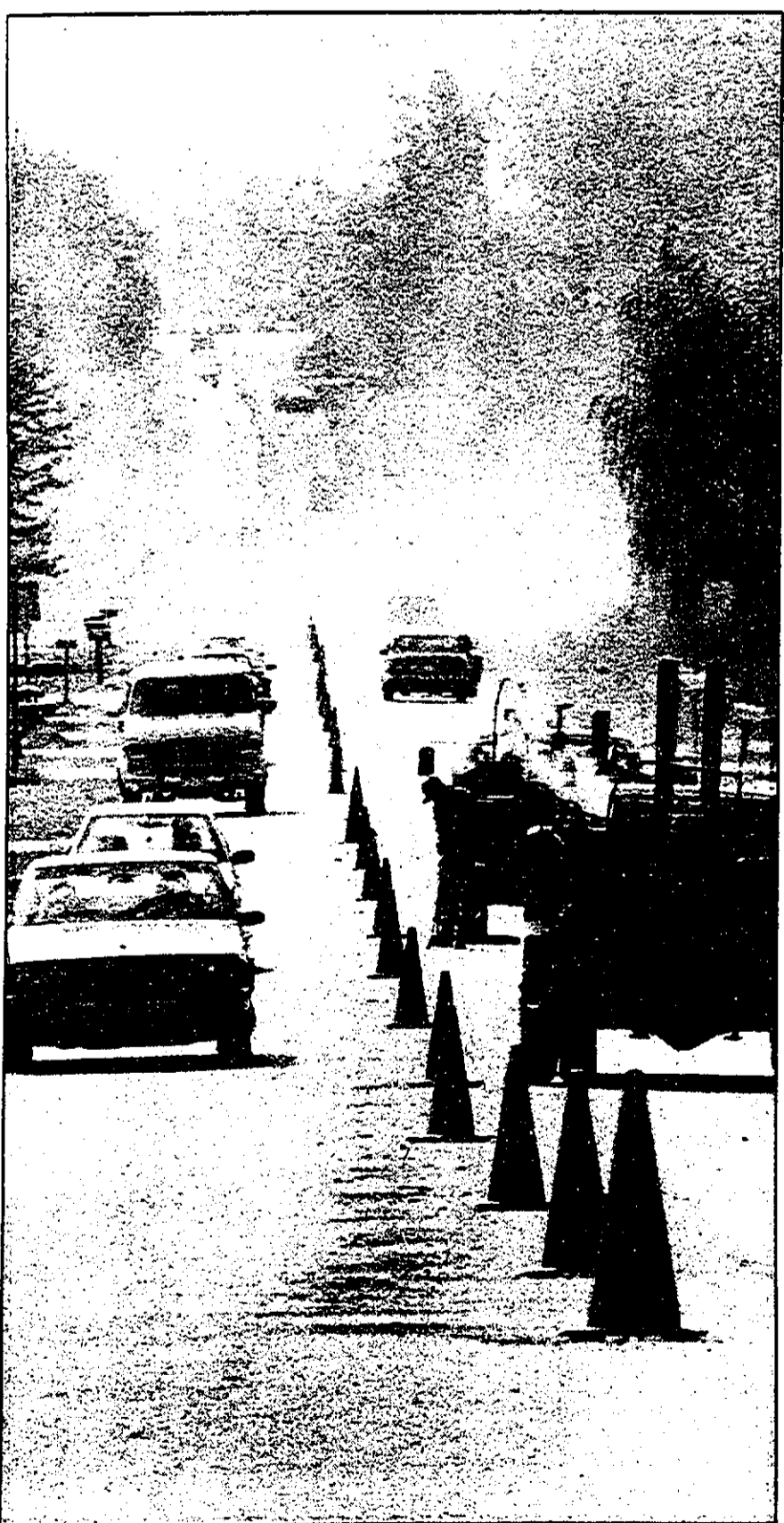
A friend of mine recently had a baby. Her maternity leave is only for the first six weeks after the baby's birth. She needed to find a place that would care for her infant. A woman around the block from her home takes care of four other neighbor children in addition to her own toddler. Barb was talking to her over the fence one day and they struck a deal. The baby is in a home she can trust, close to her own home which is ideal for Barb and Mike and means more time is spent with the baby and less in transport.

Last winter I did a feature article on day care in Novi. One interview still sticks in my mind. It was a cold evening about 6, and the lights of the cars could be seen on the walls of the day care center as the parents pulled into the parking lot to pick up their children. A small, young woman came in, obviously tired from work, and picked up a tiny child. I spoke with her about her search for daycare and she brought out a very serious facet to the daycare situation. A great many of the users are single parents with one income and no chance to stay at home with the children. One of their biggest problems is finding good, affordable day care for infants. And finding the time to go look at places isn't easy either — bosses don't give time off to employees to go find day care facilities.

Day care is a subject that cannot be divorced from the emotional side of the issue. I see too many women's faces when I think about the need for it. The \$25 road fee is in big trouble, the \$660 million environmental bond stands a chance, the \$140 million parks and rec question is a tossup, and Proposal "A" will pass without a hitch.

Nobody even knows the crime victim compensation question is on the ballot.

That's what I say to people who've been asking about these issues over the last few months — thinking us reporter-types do a slightly better handle on public pulse than the average Joe. Hah. Nothing could be further from the truth.

These are ballot questions that have pretty much been handled in a void, and it's tough to elicit strong feelings, or even passing interest from a lot of folk, except for "A," of course, which seeks to end tax funding for abortion. A has been the topic of hot debate.

People aren't talking about these things

in bowling alleys, bars, etc. so it's tough to get a feel for that "pulse." The bigshots I run into during the business day all have too much of a vested interest in this stuff. They're all jockeying for position — want good press, etc.

It's dangerous when this happens. John/Joanna Q. Public is still the variable. I'm not really sure what's going on in his/her head.

But on the gut level, it looks like people aren't going to fall for this \$25 road fee, no matter how much sense it makes. There's no faith in the people who handle roads and an overwhelming feeling that we're paying enough already, even though, in reality, we've just begun to pay ... and pay, for roads.

This one will be back again and again — be prepared. And the Road Commission will have a reason to hold drivers hostage if it fails just once, and that's unfortunate.

"You should've approved the registration fee," they'll say, as you show them the gnarly pieces of your new Oldsmobile's front end.

The environmental bond issue stands a chance, too. How can you argue with clean-

ing up toxic sites? Sure, vote against it. It's like voting against puppies or vegetable soup. It's like picking a fight with Fred Rogers.

Too bad we can't get the people who caused all the problems in the first place to help us out a little with cleanup, but, eh, what do you want for \$660 million?

People are a little bit leery of parks and rec stuff, even though the local communities will get a lot of the loot if the \$160 million bond issue passes. Parks and rec money tends to become a discretionary pork barrel fund for legislators.

Proposal "A" is the toughest one of all. You can say it's a choice between providing \$300 for an abortion or \$5,000 for childbirth and hospitalization for a poor woman, or tens of thousands of dollars in welfare payments to unwanted children of these destitute women. But that also seems to be a fairly barbaric way of looking at this thing if you think life begins at conception. There is no comparative cost issue if you believe life begins at conception — the life's the life.

Good luck John and Joanna. Sort it out, punch the tickets. Throw the experts a curve Nov. 8.

"On the other hand, there may be an intersection where you don't have many accidents, but the accidents you do have tend to result in serious injuries.

"The thing that I have to do now is study these statistics and prepare recommendations on where we should concentrate our traffic safety efforts."

In some instances, Fluhart said it may be possible to reduce traffic accidents through increased enforcement of a particular intersection. In other instances, additional signage or even complete re-engineering may be required to reduce or eliminate hazards.

"If there's a shortcoming in the statistics, it's that they tend to be somewhat dated. Specifically, the report contains year-end statistics for the 1985, 1986 and 1987 calendar years.

The problem with using dated statistics in a rapidly developing city like Novi is demonstrated by reports on the Ten Mile/Beck Road intersection.

In terms of accident frequency, the Ten/Beck intersection rates 17th on the list. There were only four accidents at the intersection in 1985 and

nine in 1986. The accident frequency rose dramatically in 1987, however, after Beck Road was paved between Eight and Ten Mile.

After registering just 13 accidents in 1985 and 1986, Novi police recorded 23 accidents at the Ten/Beck intersection in 1987 — an increase of 475 percent between 1986 and '87.

The accident frequency continued to rise at such a rate during 1988 that city and county officials were able to have a traffic signal installed at the intersection last month.

"I can only guess at what's going to happen at that intersection (Ten/Beck) in the future," noted Fluhart. "It's possible that the frequency rate will increase, but it's also possible that the signal will greatly reduce the hazard. It's just something we're going to have to chart on our own."

Despite the fact that the statistics

are dated, Fluhart remains optimistic about the process.

"Hopefully, we'll be able to develop a plan of action for reducing accidents in the city," Fluhart commented.

The following is a list of the 10 most dangerous intersections in the city according to the TIA Statistical Analysis:

1. GRAND RIVER/NOVI ROAD: 35 accidents in 1985, 35 in 1986 and 49 in 1987 for a total of 119 accidents during the three-year period. The increase in frequency from 1985 to 1987 was 40 percent.
2. TEN MILE/NOVI: 37 accidents in 1985, 39 in 1986 and 27 in 1987 for a total of 103 accidents during the three-year period. The frequency of accidents at the intersection fell 27 percent from 1985 to 1987.
3. TWELVE MILE/NOVI: 33 accidents in 1985, 28 in 1986 and 35 in 1987 for a total of 96 accidents during

the three-year period. There was a 6.05 percent increase from 1985 to 1987.

4. TEN MILE/HAGGERTY: 29 accidents in 1985, 30 in 1986 and 28 in 1987 for a total of 87 accidents over the three-year period. Accident frequency dropped 3.45 percent between 1985 and 1987.

5. NINE MILE/HAGGERTY: 24 accidents in 1985, 27 in 1986 and 22 in 1987 for a total of 73 accidents. The frequency rate dropped 8.33 percent from 1985 to '87.

6. I-96 EXIT/NOVI ROAD: 27 accidents in 1985, 24 in 1986 and 22 in 1987 for a total of 73 accidents in three years. There was a 23.63 percent decline in accidents from 1985 to '87.

7. FOURTEEN MILE/HAGGERTY: 18 accidents in 1985, 26 in 1986 and 23 in 1987 for a total of 67 accidents.

8. TEN MILE/MEADOWBROOK: 20 accidents in 1985, 22 in 1986 and 22 in '87 for a total of 64 accidents. There was a 10 percent increase between 1985 and '87.

9. TWELVE MILE/HAGGERTY: 20 accidents in 1985, 22 in 1986 and 21 in 1987 for a total of 63 accidents. There was a five percent increase from 1985 to '87.

10. TWELVE MILE/BECK: 13 in 1985, 21 in 1986 and 28 in 1987 for a total of 62 accidents. The frequency rate rose 115 percent from 1985 to 1987.

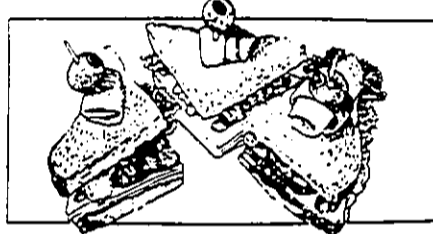

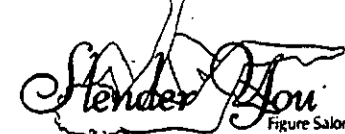

Rolling in the dough Broadway Bagel opens in Northville

He started making bagels the same year the 1968 Tigers won the world series and hasn't stopped since.

Mark Nicosia has made bagels his life and, even though he isn't exactly rolling in the dough, he has been pretty successful.

Nicosia is the owner/operator of Broadway Bagel, a company which has come a long way since it's humble beginnings.

"We got started four years ago in a little shop on Ten Mile in Farmington Hills. It's been a long, hard road," said Nicosia, who was raised in the projects in Detroit.

In an attempt to capitalize on his bagel-making wizardry, Nicosia opened branch stores in Plymouth, Birmingham and Trappers Alley. All the stores except for the one in Birmingham have since closed due to lack of business.

"There's tough competition in this town," Nicosia said.

Because of the large-scale popularity of his bagels in Birmingham, however, Nicosia has opened up a large wholesale manufacturing plant in Northville.

Broadway Bagel now sells bagels to a number of large corporations including Elias Brothers' Big Boy, Great Scott supermarkets, Best Bakery, Beaumont Hospital and many catering services.

"We'd have to be the number one wholesaler in Michigan besides Lenexa," Nicosia said.

Because business is booming, Nicosia is currently exploring different ways of freezing bagels. He noted that most of his customers demand fresh bagels every morning at 7 a.m. - which is an impossibility. So, finding a method of freezing the bagels is a necessity.

In an attempt to stay one step ahead of the competition, Broadway Bagel offers 14 different varieties of bagels including whole wheat, plain, pumpernickel, raisin and salt.

Nicosia is also the culinary genius behind the now popular oat bran bagel. The bagel was developed in answer to the rising popularity of bran and an increasingly health-conscious food market. Bran muffins are an old stand-by, so why not bran bagels?

After two months of experimenting with different recipes the oat bran bagel was perfected. Now the moment of truth, every inventor's hardest critic - the public. Would they like it?

"The answer was a resounding 'yes.'" Great Scott supermarkets have 90 day exclusive selling rights on the circular cholesterol killers, and they are selling like hotcakes.

According to Nicosia, Broadway Bagel is working two shifts seven days a week to keep up with orders. "People are hot after them," he said.

In an attempt to stay one step ahead of the competition, Broadway Bagel offers 14 different varieties of bagels including whole wheat, plain,

pumpernickel, raisin and salt. "We're always trying something new and different," Nicosia said.

So what's the secret behind his rags to riches success? Hard work and a good product, said Nicosia. Broadway Bagel samples are delivered to every prospective customer and, according to Nicosia, approximately 90 percent of the response is positive. Director of Sales Rich Rychcik is also always "on the road," ensuring greater profits month after month.

But, Broadway Bagel would be just another alteration without all the "little" people who clean the machinery, sweep the floors and knead the dough.

"I couldn't do it without all my employees," Nicosia said.

Nicosia works seven days a week and is the company's chief job trainer, mechanic and all-around bagel expert. He enjoys his work and likes to be at the factory as often as possible.

"I go on vacation and I get nervous," he said.

Hello, I'm not Darth Vader

It's 5 a.m. in Anytown, U.S.A. The silence of the early morning erupts into a deafening roar. Wisps of smoke tinge the pitch black night air. Brilliant flames shoot skyward.

A small child is startled from a deep sleep. He sits up in bed, confused and frightened by thickening smoke. His senses become muddled—he's frozen with uncertainty.

Suddenly the door of his bedroom is kicked open by a strange man dressed from head to toe in foreign-looking gear. The man wears a mask, full-length boots, a helmet, gloves and a dark coat.

He approaches the boy, his heavy, raspy breathing filling the room. The boy bolts beneath the bed and crawls as far away from the creature-like man as he can get.

The man shines a flashlight illuminated through the smoke. The child suppresses a scream.

"I'm here to help you," the man says through the mask, which oddly distorts the tone of his voice.

"Please come to me, I'm going to save you."

Immobilized by sheer terror, the child huddles himself into a ball and cries.

"I'm going to help you," the man repeats. "Give me your hand."

Smoke thickens. The heat intensifies.

The boy in this fictitious account is experiencing what firefighters refer to as the "Darth Vader Syndrome."

Because firefighters wear heavy masks, boots, gloves and other equipment when entering a burning

structure, children falsely associate them with the evil science fiction characters to which they've been introduced through movies and television.

"The Darth Vader Syndrome came out with sci-fi films," explains Guy Balok, a firefighter and paramedic with the Northville Township Fire Department.

"Imagine a five-year-old's reaction when we enter the room during a fire... we're on all fours because it's safest closest to the ground... our talk is muffled because we're wearing masks and breathing heavily... and our flashlights look like light sabers."

Most kids think as soon as the light beam hits them, they'll die instantly because of what they see in the movies," Balok says. "So they're likely to hide under the bed so far that we can't reach them."

Balok is committed to wiping out the Darth Vader Syndrome. He frequently travels to elementary schools and educational facilities to teach brief fire education classes.

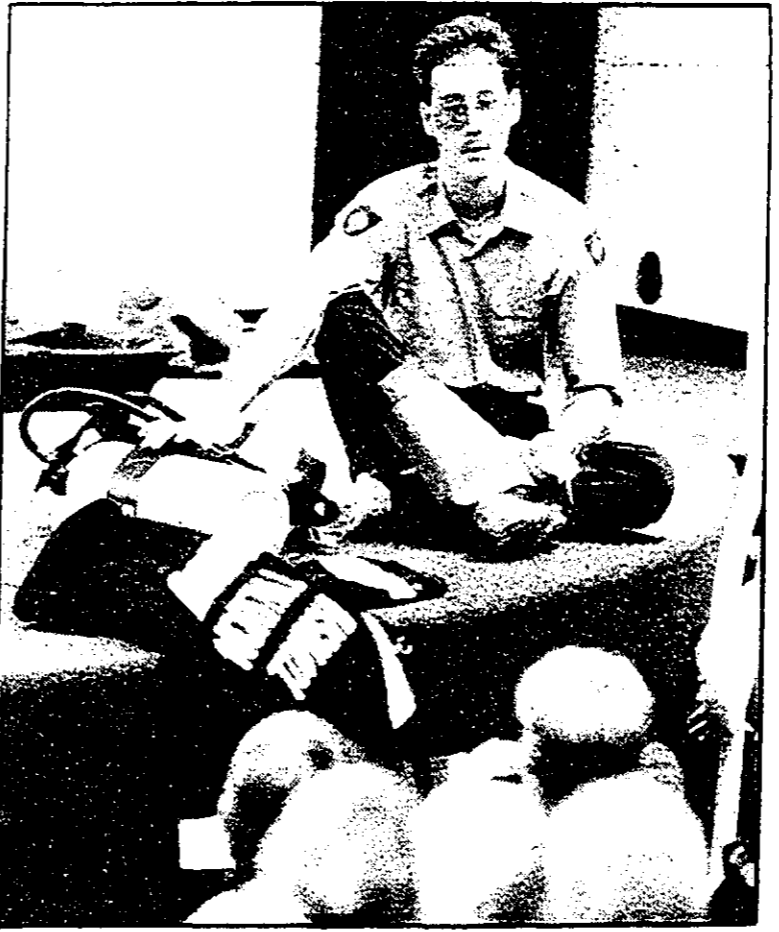
While visiting with local children, he dons the firefighting gear and speaks to them through the mask, enabling them to become familiar with his presence. If he's dealing with preschool-age children, he sometimes outfits the teacher to prove to the kids that the equipment is truly safe.

At the same time, children are encouraged to touch the gloves, coat, boots and flashlight to acquaint them with the equipment.

"Our main goal is to teach kids not to be afraid of us," Balok remarks.

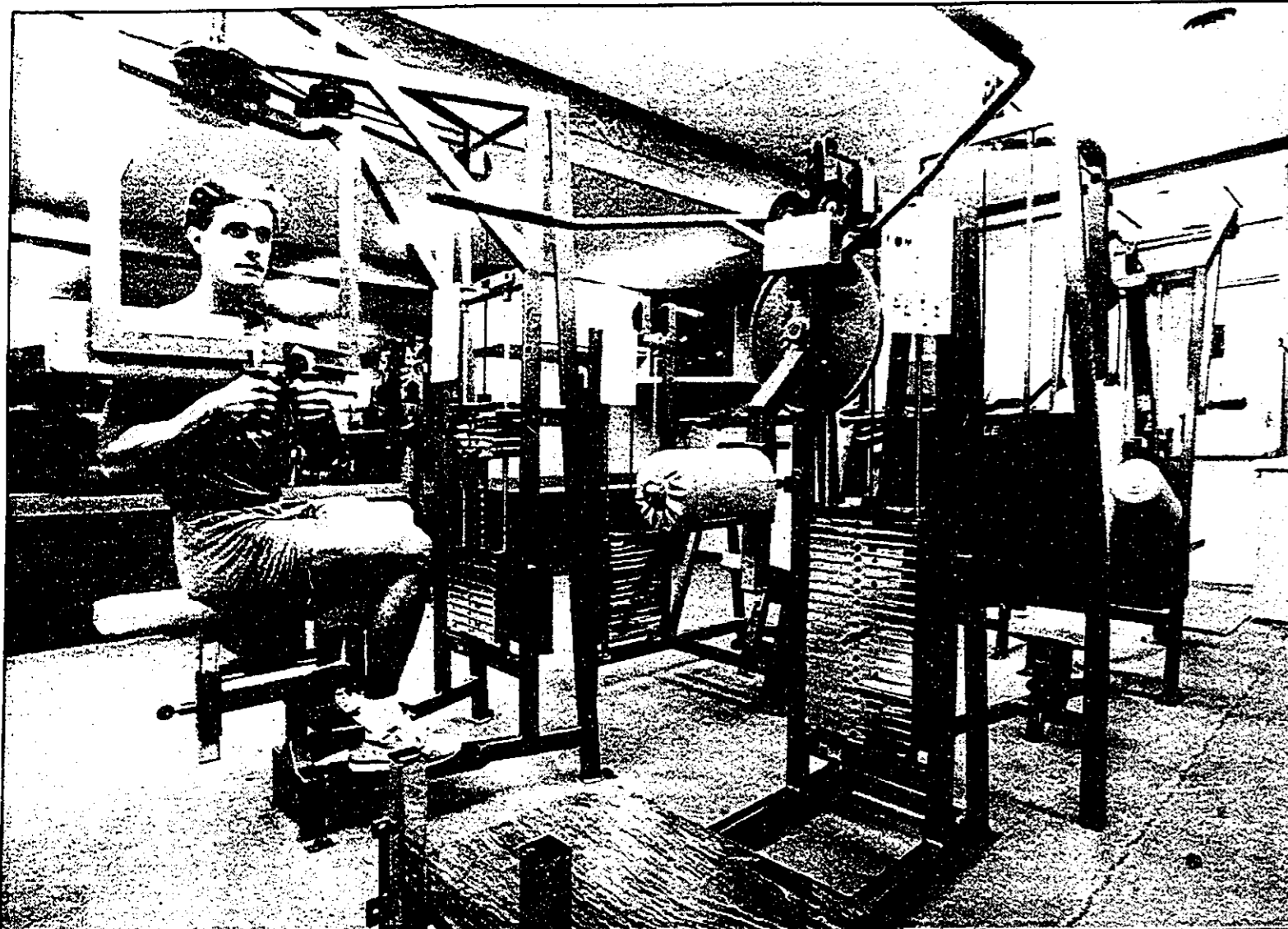

Fire safety tips

- Local firefighters offer several tips to prepare families for safely escaping their house in case of a fire.
- Families are encouraged to devise two routes they can follow to evacuate quickly from all rooms, to sleep with bedroom doors closed and to install smoke detectors.
- If fire strikes, the following tips are suggested:
1. Try to stay calm.
 2. Warn everyone at home. Yell "FIRE!"
 3. If you encounter smoke, crawl on your hands and knees to stay low. It's safer near the ground where there is less smoke.
 4. Feel the door. If it is hot do not open it. Go to another exit.
 5. Leave only with the clothes you are wearing.
 6. Don't stop to pick up anything.
 7. Have a spot to meet outside. Count everyone.
 8. Never go back inside a burning building.
 9. Call the local fire department.
- Firefighters encourage families to design a fire escape plan for their home and to discuss the plan with all family members. The escape plan should include all exits (doors and windows) for each room in the house, including the attic and the basement.

Sports medicine . . . on wheels

The accomplishments and strides made by modern medicine can sometimes boggie the mind.

Facilities outfitted with state-of-the-art testing, screening and rehabilitation equipment for the athletes of today are commonplace. That's one of the reasons why recovery periods following injuries seem to be dropping all the time. What took months to heal now takes weeks, and most of the credit goes to more advanced equipment and treatment methods.

But if you think you've seen or heard everything, think again. Now there is a sports medicine facility with all the features and equipment of many respected hospitals and it's on wheels!

It's Henry Ford Hospital's Athletic Mobile Unit — the world's largest mobile sports medicine facility — and it's being featured all over the Metropolitan Detroit area this fall.

The 68-foot tractor/trailer which houses the facility is the size of a standard ranch home. The unit provided on-site evaluation, screening, conditioning and rehabilitation services and caters to professional, collegiate, high school and even recreational athletes. What makes the whole situation so unique is that it can and will travel to selected events all across the state.

The unit was unveiled at the Henry Ford Medical Center in West Bloomfield on Oct. 6, and is now being featured on a regular basis Monday through Thursday at the West Bloomfield Medical Center.

"We're excited about having the athletic mobile unit located at our

medical center," said Linda Messina, administrative director of the Henry Ford West Bloomfield Center. "We maintain a close relationship with community members in our area, and we know how many local athletes it will help."

The unit is equipped with 10 Cybex-Eagle fitness systems (variable resistance weight machines), a Cybex 340 (computerized extremity testing and rehabilitation system) and three ergometric (cardiovascular fitness training) cycles. In all, 14 state-of-the-art exercise units which can service up to 600 patients a month are provided.

"Because the unit will be on-site at a number of sporting events, the kids are allowed to use the equipment," Bagday said. "At the professional events, it's there mostly for exposure purposes."

Fitness Tips

Diet's crucial for healthy lifestyle

With heart disease being America's number one killer and cancer not far behind, scientists have become increasingly aware of the role of diet in the prevention of such diseases.

Most scientists, physicians and dietitians are recommending a diet low in fat and high in complex carbohydrates and fiber as a preventive measure for coronary artery disease and cancer.

More specifically, they are advocating a diet in which no more than 30 percent of the calories come from fat.

But what does that translate to in terms of our own diets? For example, if you consume 2,000 calories in a

typical day, 30 percent would be about 600 calories of fat (or 66 grams).

In addition to a reduction in total fat intake, the type of fat you eat must also be taken into account. Saturated fats are the culprits in coronary artery disease. Saturated fats from animals can be seen visibly as the solid fat on meat and bacon, or as butter and milkfat.

Saturated fats from plant sources (coconut, coconut oil, palm and palm kernel oil, cocoa butter and hydrogenated vegetable shortening) are usually hidden in processed foods as one of many ingredients and can be detected only by reading labels.

One of the easiest ways to reduce the fat in one's diet is to begin to follow a stepwise process — making a few small changes at a time. For example, first eliminate fried foods,

then cream sauces and gravies along with high-fat luncheon meats.

The next step could be to switch to low-fat or skim milk dairy products. After all the obvious sources of fat are eliminated, a close look at other foods eaten for "hidden" fats (sweet rolls, snack crackers and other treats) will take care of the remaining fats.

This may leave many people with the feeling, "What's left that I can eat?" The answer is complex carbohydrates.

Contrary to popular opinion, starches (bread, potatoes, pasta, etc.) are not high in calories. However, the fats we put on them can turn them into high-calorie, high-fat disasters by adding the butter and sour cream on potatoes, cream cheese on bagels and rich sauces on pasta.

Complex carbohydrates by

themselves (fruits, vegetables and whole grains) are excellent sources of vitamins, minerals and fiber.

Fiber is the part of plants we can't digest, but still it takes up space in our stomach, giving us a full feeling without contributing calories. A high-fiber, high complex carbohydrate diet is thought to reduce risk of colon and other cancers as well as risk factors associated with coronary artery disease.

So go ahead and enjoy your bread and potatoes — but watch that fat!
