

Oil officials refute drilling claim

SOMOCO Oil won't be ready to move on their two proposed drilling sites near the Echo Valley subdivision until April or May and is "many months" - possibly over a year - from actually sinking a well, a company official said Mon-

SOMOCO Vice President Michael Harris said his firm plans an informational meeting with residents this spring, but has no immediate drilling plans — refuting claims cess gases. Most working wells are made last week by an Echo Valley required to burn off those gases, homeowner in a subdivision newsletter.

The Olney, Illinois-based company first contacted Echo Valley landowners in 1984, making bids to mineral royalties.

But that proposal has drawn only a lukewarm response, with residents questioning the environmental impact of the drilling, especially with the burn-off of ex-

In the Dec. 7 newsletter, Brennan wrote "SOMOCO has applied to the State of Michigan for a permit to drill their next well to the west of

Echo Valley . . . " The newsletter further read: "It would appear that the city's decision to approve this next well will be made in the near future. I would recommend to everyone who has an interest in it one way or another to keep abreast of city hall activity

But Harris said no permit application has been made - either to

'He's jumping the gun quite a bit," Harris said. "We have not applied to the DNR and we have not

applied to the city."

DNR officials said they could find no record of a SOMOCO application for a new well in Novi.

Well drillers are required to get a DNR permit in addition to obtaining mineral leases from landowners within an 80-acre area of the site they wish to drill. They are also required to receive permits from municipalities which have welldrilling ordinances on the books. Novi has such an ordinance in

SOMOCO operates several local oil wells - one next to the Corvo Iron Works, near Wixom and Eleven Mile, one in Lyon Township,

and several in Northville. "We would like to ask all of the interested parties to visit the Novi site (this spring)," Harris said. "We would like to ask all those property owners who are interested in it to be there."

Planners nix provision for dealership

Car dealerships are not wanted in

That message rang out loud and clear from the Novi Planning Commmision last week. But it will be city council members who have the final say, when they either heed or disregard the planners' recommendation at the next council meeting.

"Read our lips" was the phrase Commissioner Judy Johnson used to describe the outcome of last Wednesday's planning commission meeting. She made the comment after saying this was the third time the council had asked commissioners to vote on a zoning ordinance amendment that would allow a car dealership to be developed on the southwest corner of the Grand River-Meadowbrook Road intersection.

The measure, for which a representative of the Joe Dwyer auto dealership lobbied, was unanimously defeated. The Dwyer dealership has been seeking to move from its current Detroit location to the site for one-and-a-half

After the vote, Commission Chairman Charles Kureth asked aloud why council had referred the matter to them again and called it a "waste of time." He added, "The planning commission hasn't changed its mind - we made a strong statement the first time."

During a break - and after her "read our lips" comment -Johnson speculated the council would pass the measure anyway just to get developers and others who would profit from the dealership "off their backs."

In a telephone interview Tuesday Mayor Matthew Quinn refuted that statement, saying "we take heat from all sides." He said he didn't know how council will vote on the matter at the Monday, Dec. 19,

However, City Manager Edward Kriewall said, "I think it's going to be a close decision either way.

Quinn said the reason the matter was given to the commission again was because council members had felt the language on the proposed

Council attends Boston seminar

Novi City Council members say they brought back with them impor-tant lessons about how other cities deal with their problems, after a five-day National League of Cities seminar in Boston last week.

All seven city council members, City Manager Edward Kriewall, and City Clerk Geraldine Stipp went to the session, which was attended by approximately 8,000 city officials from across the nation.

The trip cost \$10,080, and was paid for with city funds, according to Novi Public Information Director Cindy Stewart. City Attorney David Fried and Engineering Consultant Joe Kapelczak of JCK Associates attended the event at their own expense, she said.

Mayor Matthew Quinn called the trip "an extremely worthwhile

"I found out that we are very far advanced in terms of planning," Quinn said. "We are much more advanced than most cities our size, or cities in the 40,000 to 50,000 range."

Quinn gave a presentation at the convention on managing growth with an effective master plan - a presentation that apparently received rave reviews. He said 10 cities requested copies of Novi's woodlands and wetlands ordinances, and several others requested documentation of the expansive Town Center ordinance.
"I think the one I hosted fit in

pretty well . . . with all the work we had done on our master plan," Quinn said. "I think they were impressed in how we control and shape our development."

Quinn said he stressed futureoriented, hands-on planning in the presentation, which was attended by a large group of the seminar's participants.

Even Council Member Nancy Covert — often on the opposite side of issues with Quinn — credited the mayor for a good performance.

"He did a fine job," Covert said. "He was a fine representative of

Other council members attended sessions ranging from long range goal-setting to computer technology to dealing with solid waste.

"We got a chance to see what they (other cities) have done when they got in trouble, and what they did to get out of it," said Council Member Edward Leininger. "It was extremely enlightening."

Leininger said an example of a city that experienced a sudden "talent drain," where a high number of elected officials were turned out in one election, was examined. Problems associated with declining population bases, few school-aged children, and declining property values were also iden-

Mohawk faces sale



Mohawk Liqueur of Novi will be sold to a Florida-based group in January, company officials said last week.

McKesson Corp., the Novi firm's parent company, announced Thursday (Dec. 8) that it had agreed to sell most of Mohawk's assets to a joint-venture group headed by Mar-shall Berkowitz of North Miami, Florida.

Berkowitz declined to give the value of the deal. He said he "wasn't sure" if the sale means the Novi plant will close.

A proposed ordinance which would require firewood to be stored at least 12 inches above the ground at all times was tabled by the Novi City Council at its Monday, Dec.

The ordinance was requested by Novi Ordinance Enforcement officials to combat small animal and rodent infestation near Walled Lake, according to City Manager Edward Kriewall. Kriewall said firewood stored on the ground's surface ncreases the risk that animals will burrow in and set up

□ Christmas trees should be fresh and green with needles that are flexible. Needles usually will not fall from a fresh tree with a strong scent. When you get it home, cut off the bottom inch off the trunk and place it in water. Make sure your tree stand has a reservoir for water and check the water level daily. Trees absorb from two pints to a

gallon of water per day. As long as the tree keeps

When erecting the tree, make sure it is well supported and is away from fireplaces or other heat sources such as heating ducts, radiators, television sets or holiday candles.

Decorations on the tree should be fire retardant and should be of a material that doesn't break easily or have sharp edges. Tinsel or artificial icicles should be of a non-leaded material;

If you have a metallic tree, do not place electric

lights on it; damaged insulation in lights could charge the entire tree with electricity. ☐ Holiday lighting should be checked for frayed or bare wires, loose connections or broken or cracked sockets. Use only lighting sets and other electrical decorations that carry the Underwriters

Fasten outdoor lights securely to a wall or tree to avoid wind damage. Never use indoor lights out-

The fireplace should be an area where special care is taken during the holiday season. Make sure the flue is open before starting a fire. Use a fireplace screen to keep sparks and embers.

Don't open gifts next to a fireplace and remove all wrappings from the room as quickly as possible. Don't burn wrappings in the fireplace; they can ignite suddenly and flare.

Use care with "fire salts" which produce colored flames when thrown on a wood fire. Keep. them away from young children who might think they are edible. Also make sure that matches and lighters are out of a child's reach.

Don't burn old Christmas trees in the fireplace. Keep a fire extinguisher handy.



'Sorry state of affairs:' That's how Farmington Hills Police Chief William Dwyer is describing the results of the fourth and latest liquor law crackdown. As a result of the investigation, 20 of 36 restaurants and bars in Farmington Hills have been cited for selling to minors.

Dwyer said he was surprised that more than half of the city's Class C licensed establishmens were cited in the Nov. 18 undercover operation. He expected improved results in light of the department's undercover investigations in the past, publicity about the crackdowns and a seminar for licensees last year.

Arrests in the schools: Officials in Southfield-Lathrup High School are seeking approval of a plan that would give school security guards

the authority to make arrests. The district has asked the city to deputize the three security specialists currently employed in the high school.

A total of five new employees have been added to the fire department this year, bringing the total number of fulltime fire department employees to nine.





Critics often make good contributions

The Novi Board of Education should learn a lesson from the Novi City Council on the subject of dissent.

The reference is to the manner in which the school board acted to prevent a resident, parent and sometimes-critic of board policy from serving on a citizens committee to review textbooks and curriculum.

Although she had been selected by two different parent-teacher organizations to represent them on the committee, the resident, Sally Marchak, was denied an appointment because some board members apparently felt she was too "negative."

Although any elected body has a right to decide who it does or does not want to advise them on any given topic, a preferable plan of action is to assimilate the alleged dissenters into the system by giving them a voice . . . an opportunity to provide input into an area in which they have previously expressed interest.

It is to the credit of the City of Novi that it has practiced such a system for years. It also has been to the advantage of the city.

A happy family Couple adopts three children

Norma Jean Sass watches with obvious delight as her children rummage through a pile of toys on the kit-

Her face takes on an expression of complete adoration when she speaks about her three children - Kara, 6, and four-year-olds Andrew and Kendra. Occasionally they look up from their activities to return her adoring

"They're neat kids ... I enjoy them so much," Sass remarks. "It's hard to imagine life without children."

Sass, however, did experience life without children, although the lifestyle was temporary. Upon learning that she couldn't hav children of her own, she and her husband, David, decided to adopt.

The Novi couple contacted an adoption agency and attended informational meetings to learn about the process. A home study was conducted, and the Sass' were required to complete "mounds of paperwork." Eventualy they chose to adopt foreign children. Kara and Kendra were born in Bangladesh, while Andrew was born in India. The children are not biologically related.

"Children wer important to us, not color or race." Sass explains. When the preliminary work was finished, the prospective parents received a photograph of their child, marking the beginning of the "bonding process" between the parents and the adoptive child.

Next came long periods of waiting - 18 months after beginning the adoption process, the Sass' were able to bring Kara home. It was virtually the same for their next two children - they waited 10 months for Kendra and 22 months for Andrew.

State offers haven for skiiers

A few years ago, Rand McNally gave Detroit the title "Ski Capital of

No, nobody moved the Rockies ... or the Alleghanies, for that matter. It's just that Detroit has the good fortune of being situated in a state with nearly 50 downhill ski resorts and thousands of miles of cross-country

ski trails at almost 200 parks, resorts, quiet areas and wilderness sites. In Michigan, the ski hills rise from 100 to 600 feet above the rolling upper Great Lakes countryside. Here, long quiet trails wind

through the nearly 19 million acres o forest that blanket most of the northern Lower Peninsula nd 90 percent of the Upper Peninsula. It also is here that the winter winds, roaring out of Saskatchewan.

Manitoba and Ontario, pick up warmth and moisture as they pass over the relatively warmer waters of the Great Lakes and deposit snow on the hills of Michigan. Most winters, the snow is heavy

and consistent on the downside of Lakes Michigan and Superior. In the Copper Country of the Upper Peninsula, annual snowfalls measuring 200 inches deep, or more, are not uncom-

operators know the capriciousness of Great Lakes winters. Long ago they stopped relying on the wind and a prayer for good snow - particularly at either end of the winter season. Michigan resorts pioneered the use of snow-making equipment in the 1950s, and today some 35 Michigan

The underdogs from Novi advanced to the final four of the Class A tourney, stunning just about everybody along the way, before falling by a point to a team that would go on to win the state championship very easily the next week.

NOVI 20, WALLED LAKE WESTERN 7: The 'Cats opened the season on shaky ground with a less-than-convincing win over a Warrior squad that would go on to win just twice in '88.

Novi scored twice in the opening quarter but also gave up a long scoring drive to Western, and the score remained 14-7 until the final minutes of play. The Warriors drove down inside the Wildcat 10 with three minutes remaining, but a clutch defensive stand ended the threat. Then, with only 10 seconds left, punter Scott Wladischkin took the

snap and retreated into the end zone in an attempt to run out the clock. As time expired, Wladischkin headed up field, broke a few tackles and went 100 yards for the final score. He ended up rushing for 118 yards on 12 carries . . . and he did it on a very sore ankle.

NOVI 14, FENTON 7: The 'Cats went to 2-0 on Sept. 9 with a thrilling ictory over a fine Fenton squad.

And most of the credit went to junior speedster Craig Berry who destroyed the Tigers with two electrifying touchdowns in the second half. The first was a 39-yard pass/run combination from quarterback Ken Kendrian, and the second was an 83-yard punt return for the game-winner, which broke a 7-7 deadlock with less than two minutes

Novi trailed 15-0 at the half and managed just one first down. But in the second half, Wladischkin reeled off a pair of 50-yard-plus runs, setting up one touchdown and scoring another. Two successful two-point conversions completed the shocker.

Novi had to play the game without two-way starter and leading tackler Darin Johnson, who had an injured hip, but still managed to outduel a Trojan front line that averged 6-foot-3 and 240-pounds. Wladischkin ran for 182 yards on 23 attempts.







"HOMEMADE" STYLE TOMATO SOUP (a meal primarily for singles)

I don't know how many generations of my family this recipe has been passed down from, but I'll do my best in relating this "secret" recipe taught to me by my very own mother.

Tomato Water Salt Pepper

Maybe some preservatives

Go to the store, buy a can of tomato soup. This will require some decision making on your part as most stores usually carry several brands. I prefer Campbell's, because they have a neat label.

After you get home, open up the can using a can opener. The next part requires some brain work on the part of the cook (or shall I say chef?) as you will need a pan which is neither too small, and cannot hold the amount of soup being prepared, or one which is too large, which will only

Pour the soup into the pan (scraping all chunky clam chowder that doesn't need a leftover bits out of the can and into the pan) and heat at a medium temperature.

If you are in a big hurry, feel free to turn the heat all the way up. Now, I hope you saved the empty can, because now you have to fill it up with

water. Tap water will do nicely, and I've never noticed a difference between using hot or cold water. It's all your own choice! This is then poured with all ingredients into the pot. Hint: use less water for a thicker soup, and conversely more for a 'soupier'' soup.

Stir occasionally and taste every once in a while to tell if it's warm enough. If you have the heat on full, as above, you'll probably want to do a good deal more stirring (unless you enjoy scraping burned and blackened tomatoes off your pot). By now you should have a feast fit for a

king and for a time-saving tip, when it comes times to do the dishes, just do as I do and eat right out of the pot. Add salt and pepper to taste, and you've got a regular smorgasbord. If you're serving to guests, don't tell them it's store-bought, ind they'll never guess!

By the by, I wouldn't recommend eating out of a pot if you do have guests, you'll just have to wash more dishes this time. If you liked this, I also have a recipe for minutes at 400 degrees. oatmeal which requires only boiling water (believe it or not!). There's even one for
