## Mall may expand — someday

Is Twelve Oaks Mall expanding in

1990? Maybe. Maybe not — yet. Mall General Manager Phil Morosco and Novi City Manager Edward Kriewall emphatically deny reports that the building of a Saks Fifth Avenue, 50 new stores and a 4,000-car parking deck is imminent at the shopping center. The story appeared Monday in Crain's Detroit Business, but rumours were already circulating in Novi last week about a possible expansion of the mall, which is owned by the Taubman Company of Bloomfield

"We're aware that they're looking to expand the mall and that they nothing is finalized at this point. He

have been negotiating with several companies, including Nordstrom's and Saks. If they do bring an expansion in there, a parking deck would be regarded by the city as a practical matter they will need," Kriewall said Tuesday.

"We've heard the same names mentioned for the last ten years. It's not new . . . I met with them (Taubman representatives) yesterday, and they claimed there is not a signed deal with anybody."

Christopher Tennyson, Taubman's vice president for corporate affairs, confirmed that the company's planners are approaching major department stores and are considering adding, "many" smaller shops to the mall, but that

said the company had not reached agreements with either Saks or Nordstrom's, but that the expansion plans are "market-driven."

"It's not pending. We're shooting for this year. We'd like to get this in front of the city this year," Tennyson said.

"We're very excited about expanding Twelve Oaks."

A spokesperson for Saks Fifth Avenue's corporate headquarters in New York City denied that any negotiations were taking place or that a contract had been signed to open a third store in Detroit. The upscale retailer currently has shops at Somerset Mall in Troy and at Fairlane Town Center in Dearborn.


The Taubman Company has not yet approached the city's planning

concepts committee, Kriewall said, often a first step for developers interested in Novi. No site plans have been submitted by Taubman to the city's planning department.

Morosco said Tuesday that the company has been looking at different plans for the center but nothing has been firmed up.

"In the mayor's "State of the City" address (on Jan. 16), he talked about the possibility of Twelve Oaks and the Town Center expanding. That's a possibility which if it happens in the next year or 1999, who knows?" Morosco said last week in discussing rumors of an extension to the mall.

#### Frantz won't coach Novi baseball team

A scheduling problem that Novi school administrators say they can't resolve will prevent highly successful Novi High School Coach Gar Frantz from continuing his post at the helm of the Wildcat baseball program, the Novi News has learn-

Frantz, 35, who's been saddled with scheduling conflicts for years, has confirmed the head coach position for Novi varsity baseball has been posted and he is out of the picture after five years on the job.

'They posted the job, so it means I'm out," Frantz said, "If I ever want to get it back, I can't say much

- I'll just have to live with it. I don't want to burn any bridges."

Novi Athletic Director John Fundukian also confirmed the move, and said the scheduling issue is the only reason for the decision.

"As it was explained to me, the options in scheduling just weren't there," he said. "(Frantz) is obligated to be at Novi Meadows until 3:40 p.m. two days a week and at Village Oaks until 3:10 p.m. one day a week. With that teaching schedule, it's impossible for him to continue as coach.

"Gar Frantz is an outstanding coach and physical-education instructor. It's extremely unfortunate

# State dumps hospital plan

The state yesterday announced it denied a certificate of need for a 200-bed Providence Hospital satellite in Novi, but hospital officials vowed to "aggressively" ap-

peal the decision. Providence President Brian Connolly said that a request for a hearing will be filed within the next two weeks, while the company pursues a reconsideration from the health department. "If the reconsideration is not successful, we will then proceed to the courts," he said.

The hospital must have the stateissued certificate of need to proceed with its plans to build in Novi.

The non-profit hospital, owned by the Roman Catholic Daughters of Charity, received verbal notifica-tion yesterday (Wednesday) of the decision by the state Department of Public Health.

Southfield-based Providence recently purchased the property for the hospital - the Westbrooke Golf Course at Grand River Avenue and Beck roads. The facility would shift about half of the hospital's existing beds in Southfield to Novi, to serve this community and its neighbors.

Connolly said that from the beginning he has been aware that building the hospital is a long-term project, but that the population explosion in the Novi area will simply make it a matter of time before the health department approves the hospital's certificate-of-need ap-

"The residents of those areas themselves have given us an overwhelming vote of support. More than 4,000 of them have signed petitions and written letters to the Michigan Department of Public Health and to legislators on our behalf," Connolly said.

The state issues a certificate of need based on the geographical accessibility of a proposed facility and on whether it would satisfy an unmet need for a hospital within the area. In October 1989, the state attorney general's office ruled that a certificate could not be issued in a region with an oversupply of hospital beds.

The public-health department staff makes a recommendation on the certificate, but the final decision comes from Chief of Health Facilities Walter Wheeler and Director of Public Health Raj Weiner. If Providence's appeal is denied, the hospital has the option of taking its case to circuit court.

At the request of several other hospitals and organizations, the state held a public hearing on Providence's application on Oct. 26 the first such hearing on a certificate-of-need request. Several hospitals with their own expansion plans and companies such as General Motors, Chrysler and Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Michigan testified against Providence.

Support for the hospital has come from cities such as Novi Southfield, Wixom and Northville.

# Mayor seeks court in Novi

Mayor Matthew Quinn has begun preliminary negotiations to move the first division of the 52nd District Court from Walled Lake to the Novi Town Center area.

"The current court building in Walled Lake is overcrowded there just isn't enough space or parking to handle the increasing

number of court cases," Quinn said. "With the increased number of jury trials, the court building is bulging at the seams." he added.

"It is my proposal to move the court — or at least a portion of the court - to Novi's Town Center area, and this should happen some

time in the near future," he said. Quinn and 52nd District Court Judge Brian MacKenzie said that Qakland County would have the

final say on the proposal. Quinn explained that the new

building would be significantly larger and alleviate the overcrowding problem. "With all the growth in Novi, I

feel that it is the appropriate place for a new court building, and the move should happen within the next

Novi is the largest city serviced by the district court and has the legal right to house the facilities, Quinn said.

The district court serves the cities of Novi, South Lyon, Walled Lake and Wixom. In addition, it services Commerce, Highland, Lyon, Milford, Novi, Rose and White Lake townships.

The mayor indicated that he has already spoken with the three judges assigned to the first division of the 52nd District Court regarding his proposal.

"They have said that they would be in favor of the move," he said, but MacKenzie disagreed.

· MacKenzie, the presiding judge at the Walled Lake branch of the 52nd District Court, confirmed that he has been contacted by Quinn, as have the other two judges.

But he added that he and his fellow judges have no say in the matter and will not take a political stand on the proposed move.

MacKenzie, however, did verify that the largest municipality within a given court district has the legal right to house the facilities and that Novi is that municipality.

The MX train, according to the EIS, will operate much like commercial freight trains. "Though it will not be exactly like other trains," the statement read, "a Peacekeeper system train will most closely resemble a freight train in makeup and operation, so freight-train accident data has been used to estimate the Peacekeeper rail accident rate."

The eight-car trains themselves California. Air Force officials refuse will not be exactly like ordinary to speculate on the number of such freight trains. While the average trips that would be conducted each freight car is 51 feet long, according year.



"At (the first) hearing," she said, "there were many resolutions from the Oscoda City Council, the township manager, different clubs and organizations, and most of them were in favor of this new thing happening at Wurtsmith. So I felt very discouraged about that as I was driving home from Oscoda, because there were very few voices, at that first draft meeting, lifted up against the missile. Mostly it was just the enthusiasm about this chunk of money coming into the community. "I find it very sad and tragic that a

community has to depend on something like a monstrous missile for jobs," she said.

Riebling gave her own testimony against the proposal at both hearings, though she was nearly prevented from testifying at the second hearing. "At the second meeting," she recalled, "they said that people should only address the environmental issue, that they weren't here to hear anything about the weapon itself.

#### POTENTIAL IMPACT CONTINUED FROM 8

An analysis of head-on and rearend collisions involving the Peacekeeper and commercial trains found that the system could withstand head-on collisions of up to 60 miles per hour and rear-end collisions of up to 45 miles per hour.

"In the highly improbable instance of a side collision with the missile launch car (MLC)," the statement continued, "sufficient forces might be present to create a potential for ignition or explosion of missile propellants."

The Air Force has estimated that about 1 in 1,000 rail accidents would result in a fire or explosion, and calls the chance of an accident involving the missiles or radioactive warheads "extremely remote."

The MX missile is a 71-foot long, 195,000-pound four-stage missile. The first three stages are fueled by solid propellants including aluminum powder and ammonium perchlorate. The fourth stage contains the liquid propellants monomethylhydrazine (MMH) and nitrogen tetroxide. Overall, the Peacekeeper missile

system carries approximately 168,000 pounds of solid propellants, equivalent to the explosive power of 202,000 pounds of TNT.

## Temple for Novi

## Artist Dave Barr designs sculpture to symbolize city

He calls it the "Temple of the

Roman Numeral VI." The model represents a seemingly random group of 20-foot-high painted steel columns rooted in concrete. From most viewpoints, it will appear to be a simple, stately structure, reminiscent of classical Greek or Roman architecture.

But when you move to a certain vantage point, you'll get a surprise. 20-foot-high letters.

Designer David Barr, a Novi resident since 1978, conceived the piece Fairlane Mall, Barr produces two New Guinea. and the temple concept, before he decided on the final design.

## Cynicism runs two ways

after awhile. A few weeks of icy stares. A couple dozen never-answered phone messages. You feel neglected. Tossed-over. Hurt.

When you do reach him he's curt. No time for chit-chat. No banter about the weather Just the facts, ma'am, his tone

I'm not talking about a lovers' quarrel. I'm talking about mutual paranoia, distrust and general cynicism on the part of newspapers and public officials.

Now the cynicism, and even the distrust, I can live with. A good reporter has a healthy dose of both. It helps us ask questions even after the answers appear to have been presented. We don't take what one person says as gospel truth. We're paid to ask someone else. The other side. Maybe even another person . . . and

Likewise, I've seen my quotes get turned around in print before. If that happens once, you tend to be a little gun-shy. If it happens twice, you tend to be a little wary. People who speak to reporters should be wary. They have a right to expect that what they say will be

reported accurately and in the proper context. They should not, however, expect us to write "what they meant to say."

Which brings me back to mutual paranoia. When the press begins to suspect that the people it covers are constantly "hatching plots," it can be a problem. When public officials believe that the local press "is out to get them," it can be a problem.

For the most part here in Novi both the press and public officials are lucky. We know that the people who work in Novi really care about the city. We know because we've talked to them, over and over again. But like any good official, most of them would prefer that everything be presented in the best possible light. Sometimes that's the only light there is — and everyone is happy. Writing stories that show people to be true, moral and happy is a nice way to make a living. But it isn't real life all of the time.

The people who work in Novi should know that we aren't sitting around the newsroom looking for ways to make them look bad. We only do that on Thursdays. Just kidding. We don't go looking for fights - but we sure don't walk away from them.


So lets bury the hatchet. I want to start fresh. Clean slate. New dawn. No paranoia on either side.



same thing, and their library is still flourishing today. Northville's first library began in 1888 as a men's reading room at the YMCA. In May of that year, a group known as the Northville Circulating Library Association was

organized, but a year later both the YMCA's reading room and the Circulating Library Association had been dissolved. The Ladies Library Association was organized in February, 1889, celebrating its creation with a benefit performance at the Northville Opera House. This society event

At that time, one needed to join the library as a member in order to enjoy its books and its services. Library membership, which amounted to about 50 cents per year per person, included 89 ladies of the community at its inception, and books were stored in the former Young Men's Hall.

was just the first of many such affairs to help

out the fledgling library.

A promotional booklet on Northville published in 1892 proudly claimed that the library "is lighted by electricity, is furnished with a fine piano, antique fire place, easy stitution. chairs and everything necessary for the convenience and comfort of its members."

The library now owned over 1,200 volumes, and membership had grown to 150. Jennie Babbitt was the sole librarian.

By 1894, The Northville Record wrote with pride about the venture:

"The library is certainly alive and booming," it bragged. "A stranger coming into the library Saturday evening would wish no better testimonial to Northville's enterprise and enlightenment than the throng of people so pleasantly and warmly greeting and talking with each other . . . 150 books were drawn last week and eighteen new members joined . . .'

By now the library was housed in the former New School Church on Main Street, a building dating from 1845 which had already served a number of purposes, including the Young Men's Hall. This building, which housed the library until 1963, may still be seen today on the grounds of Northville's Mill Race Historical Village.

Mary Lapham, donor of the library's original 250 books, was named chair, and later president, of the Ladies Library Association. She purchased the former Young Men's Hall in 1899 for the library. When she left that year to study medicine at The University of Michigan, Northville's library was left without a leader. To replace the driving force that was Mary Lapham, a governing board of 12 trustees was chosen to

The 20th century brought many changes to the community's library. In 1926 the library was authorized to recieve township funds, and thereby became a free public in-

During these tumultuous times, plans for a new library began to appear on architects' drawing boards. Though nothing has come of these prospective designs to date, hope is in the air.

The 1990s ushers in yet another phase of the library's existence. With five professional librarians currently on staff, 39,000 volumes in stock and a circulation up to 800 books checked out daily, the library remains an important and well-respected fixture in the community.

Barbara Louie is the local history librarian at the Novi Public Library. She is working on two books of history, one about Novi and one about Northville.

## Grocer opens retail outlet in Northville

Premium cuts of beef, exotic fruits, and a wide variety of fresh vegetables are some of the many tempting food items found at Mancuso's Quality Market.

Jim Mancuso, owner of the market, believes that his customers deserve only the highest quality pro-

"Many people assume that a higher quality product will cost more money, but that's not always the case," Mancuso said. "Many of the items in my market are less expensive than a lot of the grocery stores in the area.'

Since opening his market in November, 1989, he has received only positive feedback from his customers.

"I've had many customers comment on the freshness of the produce and the high quality meats," he said. Mancuso feels that his market has

one of the most unique meat cases in the area. All of the meats are cut into restaurant size portions and are

ordered from restaurant suppliers. He sells Booth's Amish Chickens, which are raised all naturally, and

are shipped to his market only one day after they have been James Duguay and Ralf Caswell,

both chefs by profession, work

behind the meat cases. They prepare such gourmet specialties as red pepper peanut chicken breasts and dijon herb pork roast, which only need to be cooked at home by the customer.

Duguay and Caswell make a variety of salads and homemade soups which are all made at the market. They also prepare daily gourmet luncheon specials.

"We can make just about anything that a customer wants," Mancuso said. "I had a woman who came into the market and wanted 42 sage chicken breasts for a party that she was giving. The two chefs prepared the chicken for her, and all she had to do was put the chicken in the oven when she got home," he said.

Mancuso also carries some unusual produce including brocoflower. The vegetable is a mix between cauliflower and broccoli and looks like a light green head of cauliflower. He is also the only supplier in Michigan to sell Ben & Jerry's Ice Cream.

In a few months, he plans to start selling beer, wine and possibly liquor at his market.

Prior to opening his market, Mancuso worked as a wholesaler for 10 years, servicing restaurants and hotels. He still works as a wholesaler out of his market. One of his largest accounts is the Palace in Auburn



## Business deductions bear watching

Suppose you're a sales manager for a software development com pany It's been a while since you spoke with Jack, one of your good customers, so you invite him to lunch as a way of keeping in touch. There's no specific business to discuss, but you want to be sure Jack keeps your company in mind

Enjoy your meal with Jack, but you may not be able to deduct it. According to the Michigan Association of CPAs, you may deduct a business meal only if it was "directly related to" or "associated with" the active conduct of our trade or

The primary test of this rule is whether you discussed business during, directly before, or directly after a meal. Once you satisfy these requirements, you may deduct up to 80 percent of the cost of the food, beverage, tax and tip provided that these expenses were not "lavish or extravagant under the cir-

Let's look at another scenario, Imagine your company has a new program you think Jack's human resources department could use. You arrange a lunch date with Jack to discuss the new program's capabilities. This time, you can write off 80 precent of the lunch. And the cost of the transportation to the restaurant may be fully deductible as

Remember, if your meal and entertainment expenses are not reimbursed by your company, they must be added to your other "miscellaneous itemized expenses" which are deductible only to the extent that they exceed 2 percent of adjusted gross in-

The 80 percent rule must also be applied to "single sum expenditures." For example, if your hotel includes breakfast in your room charge, it is up to you to allocate a portion of the room charge for food. You would then be eligible to deduct 80 percent of the cost of breakfast and 100 percent of the cost of the room. The 80 percent limitation also applies when you dine out alone on a business trip. When you are away from home on a business trip, some of the expenses that are deductible include hotel and lodging expenses, meal costs, baggage handling and business telephone calls.

In most cases, when you travel strictly on business, your write-offs are clear-cut. But when you mix business with pleasure, the picture gets blurred. Transportation to and from a destination is deductible only if the trip is primarily related to your business. But suppose you take a trip for personal reasons and, once at your destination, you take time out of your vacation to see a customer. If the normal requirements for a deduction, 80 percent of the cost of the meal s deductible; the cost of the transportaton between your hotel and the location of the business meal

If the primary reason for your trip is business, but you extend your stay for personal rest and relaxation, the cost of the transportation to and from the venue is still deductible. But you may only deduct lodging, meals, and other related meal expenses for the business part of the trip. There are special rules for foreign travel, even where the travel is primarily for business. Essentially, if you are traveling for one week or less, or if less than 25 percent of the travel is non-business, the deduction should be allowable. Incidentally, you may not deduct the travel expenses of a spouse who accompanies you on a business trip unless you can prove that the spouse's presence served a bona fide business purpose.

The rules for deducting entertainment costs parallel those for business meals. If you take a client to a baseball game, you need not spend

## Firewood facts

## What type of wood will burn the best?

By Jim Wood

Whether you bought your first wood stove last fall, or just decided the ornamental sireplace should be less ornamental and more functional, you've learned that buying sirewood can be a pain or pleasure.

Sure, it's easy to call someone and say, "This is Joseph Shmoe-bring me another load of wood by Tuesday, would you?" and be done with it.

But you could be burning anything, paying too much, paying too often and just asking for a chimney

Experienced firewood dealers like Mike Merians and John Mills, both in the Howell area, keep their customers happy by selling good wood and giving good advice about it.

Not everyone buys wood, of course. If you are fortunate enough to have your own woodlot, the labor of

cutting and stacking is your own and you can leave your wallet home.

On the other hand, if you burn only what comes out of your own woods, your choice of wood types may be limited.

Most of us are in the position of the person standing in front of a long wall of stacked wood, wondering what to say when the man comes. He was told to order two cords, but what's a cord? Buy hardwood, but how does he

tell hardwood from softwood-and what difference does it make? And for heaven's sake, don't buy any green

First thing he should do is find out whether he's buying wood by the standard cord or the face cord. There's a big difference.

A full, or standard, cord is a an eight-foot long stack of four-foot logs piled four feet high. Or 128 cubic feet of wood. Cut into smaller pieces, say won't sell it to you. Nor will Mike Mer-

16 inches in length to fit stoves and fireplaces better, the volume will be less. The pieces fit together more

closely and you've lost the sawdust. Anyway, most sellers will offer only face cords: a stack eight feet long and four feet high, but the width can be anything. If cut to 12-inch length, it's a quarter of a standard cord; if 16 inches, it's one third. The 16-to-18-inch log is what you'll find around here most of time.

Typically, it's the seller who buys the full cords, by the semi-trailer, then cuts them to face cord length for

sale to the public. John Mills, whose place is on Oak Grove Road just north of M-59, sells about 230 cords a year, all by Christmas. Next year's load has already arrived and he's hard at work cutting it to size. But don't ask him for it now, it's green-just been cut-and he

"I wouldn't sell it," said Merians. "Darn stuff won't burn. Oh, you can get a real hot fire with it, once it starts, but that hot smoke just cools going up the chimney and cakes the inside of it with creosote."

The creosote can catch fire eventually and the chimney fires that result burn houses down every year in this

Anyone who has ever had a chimney fire remembers it vividly: a terrifying banshee-like scream and roar as air is sucked by the fire up through the narrow passage. Outside, fire is often seen shooting up into the air from the top of the chimney.

"The biggest way people get ripped off is being sold green wood," said





The germ is the heart of the wheat kernel, and the part that would CER-

Minate and sprout, if planted. Wheat germ comes in two forms: raw or toasted. The raw version is higher in nutrients but can taste bitter. Toasted wheat germ may be slightly less nutritious, but it has a great nutty flavor and a longer shelf life than the raw form.

Because it is a natural source of oils, which deteriorate rapidly at room temperature, wheat germ should always be stored in the refingerator or freezer, in an air-tight

Once in awhile you have to put guilt aside and selfishly pamper yourself. After all, who deserves it more than you?

In the stress and strain of everyday life, it's important to take a moment aside from your busy schedule to pamper yourself. The good it does to your mental health alone is worth it.

Today's full-service salons provide you with the perfect opportunity to escape from your daily routine to a place where you are the most important person.

to a place where you are the most important person. Full-service salons offer a variety of professional beauty services, allowing you to totally pamper yourself from head-to-toe.

"Some of our clients come here for individual services such as body massages or facials, but many of them choose to come for the entire day," said Suzzane Kelly, manager of Bloomie's Face and Body, a full-service salon in Farmington Hills. "Basically, we try to create a relaxing atmosphere. Most treatments are done for the mental feeling that is gotten out of it—for the pampering effect and the relaxation that comes along with it."

If you want to spoil yourself rotten, treat yourself to a day at the salon.

Most full-service salons sell packages which offer a combination of professional services. A client may can come in for a manicure, a facial and a massage,

At Bloomies, you can enjoy a luxurious candlelight whirlpool complete with champagne and cheese before you indulge in a soothing hour of body massage. Or maybe you'd prefer a revitalizing European facial and a hot oil manicure.

According to Kelly, one of most popular services are facials.

A professional facial consists of three basic steps: cleansing, toning and moisturizing.

The skin is massaged to improve the blood circulation and then the face is cleansed, explained estheticianist Betty Waggoner of The Cutting Room salon, located in the Brighton Mall. "Different cleansors are used for your skin's particular needs," she said. The face is then steamed to soften the oils under

the skin and an exfoliating cream is applied. The exfoilant removes debris and trapped oils from the face. At this point of the treatment, if the client desires, blackheads are extracted from the skin and then a mask is applied. The mask draws impurities out of

the skin and tightens the pores.

After the mask is cleansed off, a high frequency treatment may be performed. "It's very calming to the skin and soothing to the muscles" Waggoner said. "It

has a germicidal action and is great for blemishes."

The final step of the facial involves spraying the

face with a toner to restore the skin's pH balance and smoothing a protective moisturizer onto the face.

Deep-cleansing facials typically cost \$25 to \$45

"People who get facials on a regular basis (once a month) have much softer skin and lines are so much more reduced," Waggoner said. "It adds a lot more suppleness and elasticity to the skin."

At Bloomie's, body massages are almost as popular as facials. A good massage can be marvelously relaxing, and it leaves you feeling soothed and

pampered.

Body massages generally cost \$35-\$50 an hour.

To relax aching muscles and relieve tension, enjoy the luxurious comfort of a whirlpool. Jet-propelled waves will massage every inch of your body, washing away the frustrations of the day. Saunas are also very relaxing to the muscles.

If you're looking for a more inexpensive way to pamper yourself, take a leisurely bath. There are several things you can do to make your bath more beneficial to your skin as well as relaxing.

For more comfort, use a bath pillow to support

your neck. These are sold in bath shops, pharmacies and department stores. And to make your bath less dehydrating, add bath oil to the water.

When you are finished with your bath, apply a body oil or lotion to your skin (this will seal in the moisture), wrap yourself in a warm robe and lie down for 20 minutes.

If you can't take advantage of a steam room (or sauna), treat yourself to a facial sauna at home. Pour boiling water into a medium-sized bowl, lean over the water close enough to feel the steam, and place a towel over your head. Do this for 3-5 minutes and then rinse your face with cool water.

If you can't afford a professional body scrub, buy a friction mitt or loofah (the inside of a dried gourd) and exfoliate your skin at home. Wet your skin and apply the loofah in a circular, massaging motion. Use a pumice stone on rough areas such as knees, elbows and feet.

To give your hands a polished look, get a professional manicure. A well-trained manicurist will shape your nails, trim your cuticles and soak your fingertips in hot oil or cream before applying two to three coats of nail polish. Manicures are typically

\$10-\$15.

Some salons offer paraffin treatments for the hands as well. Your hands are placed in a sheet of plastic wrap and massaged with an emollient cream or lotion.

Hot, melted paraffin is then brushed on and your hands are wrapped in plastic and covered with towels to retain the heat. About 15 minutes later, the paraffin is peeled away and your hands are left feeling incredibly soft and smooth. Paraffin treatments cost

about \$15.

For head-to-toe grooming, give your feet a rest and have a pedicure. The procedure is almost exactly the same as a manicure except that the whole foot is soaked in warm water treated with a softening solution. Pedicures are a little more expensive, approximately \$27.

For a finishing touch, get your hair styled or have an expert apply your makeup. The makeup artist will help you find the products and colors that are right for you, and will show you how to use the products correctly. Makeup applications are often complimentary with your first facial.

Gift certificates are available at most salons if you want to surprise someone else with a day of pampering.

Before you make an appointment for any beauty service, make sure you know how much it will cost ahead of time and approximately how long it will take.







## Digital audio tapes make slow debut

By NEIL GEOGHEGAN

It stands for "digital audio tape" and it's the latest in a long line of technical breakthroughs that have invaded the music business. Some believe that DAT will someday dethrone the standard audio cassette tape just the way the compact disc has pushed the vinyl record toward extinction, while others see it as nothing more than a novelty.

The DAT tape itself can hold two hours of music and looks very much like a miniature video cassette, complete with a hinged lid that snaps up when the cassette is inserted into a DAT machine. The big draw is that the tape can make high-quality digital copies without drawbacks like dard cassettes.

According to Ginna Beckett, director of public relations for the Detroit Zoological Society, the animals have a natural tendency to move around to keep warm during

winter months. The most active winter animals are the polar bears. In the summer, especially on hot days, polar bears tend to lie around on the rocks and show off their sleeping abilities. In the winter, they actively

chase each other and play. One big winter surprise is the camel, usually thought of as a desert animal, which is perfectly happy to be outdoors in cold

"This is the perfect time to go to the zoo," Beckett said. "The animals are a lot of fun, and on a fairly warm winter day most of them will be outside."

On colder winter days, however, most of the animals will be found inside. Each of the exhibits have indoor areas where the animals (and people) can find shelter.

"But if temperatures get up around 50, the giraffe will probably go Beckett explained that many concession stands close for the

the restaurant scene in the near-west suburbs has found a nicba with the locals. This new restaurant, easily found thanks to the bright neon trim on the outside of the building, has more than just good ambiance and

food going for it. The Cooker's location could not be more accessible. Diners can find the restaurant on Seven Mile Road, immediately west of the popular I-275 expressway, just a stone's throw from Haggerty Road. The restaurant is on the south side of Seven Mile Road nestled into the office plaza.

Pub-like and informal

Once inside, the local need for nice dining establishments is evident. The Cooker is busy these days during the dinner hour — and the cocktail and lunch crowd is not far behind. But those that drop by unannounced should take heart. There is plenty of seating at the bar where drinks are generous and the wait staff attentive. The restaurant hosts a few booths around the bar area which are seated on a first-come, first-served basis. The entire

menu is available at these booths as well as in the dining area. The atmosphere is pub-like and informal, with tables and booths scattered around a fair sized area.


Diners should come prepared for good grill fare. Regional American specialties are the entree favorites, although this reviewer was disappointed not to be able to try the Cooker house specialty

Advertised as a tender half chicken marinated in a fresh lime, garlic. white wine, and honey marinade and then grilled — this sounded like a little pièce of heaven. But due to the special marinade, the restaurant made an admirable choice to take it off the menu once its popularity had reached the sell-out phase. Our waitress told us that because it must marinate for such a long time once one batch is gone for the day - it's gone. Hopefully the management will soon get a handle on expected crowd sizes

and have plenty of portions ready. There are several other chicken grill items on the menu, as well as smokehouse ribs, homestyle meatloal. Yankee potroast and plenty of fish items. The New York grille was tasty and the Alaskan Whitelish got two thumbs up from nearby tasters.
