## orney disputes city stand on oil well

#### ents' counsel tells hire new law firm

By JAN JEFFRES Staff Writer

An attorney working as a volunteer consultant for Echo Valley Estates Subdivision in their stand against the Southern Michigan Oil Company's (SOMOCO) oil drilling plans, slashed legal advice re-ndered by City Attorney David Fried and suggested that the city should retain a "major law firm" specializing in the field of zoning.

James Harrington, a resident of Whispering Meadows Subdivision who also has a law practice in Novi, wrote in a bound document given to the city council that was he absolutely dismayed by the legal opinions on the issue furnished by the city attorney, which he charac-terized as shallow advice and superficial research.

The council Oct. 15 tabled until Wednesday SOMOCO's request for a variance to place an oil well in residentially-zoned land west of Echo Valley, the fourth time the issue has been held up. A closed, executive session has also been scheduled for tonight to discuss Fried's earlier-submitted opinion on the request.

The entire proceedings has carried the environment of a court of law to the city council meetings. SOMOCO has hired a court reporter to attend the hearings and the



## Officials suspect arson in barn fire

Two confused geese, Lady and Qracker, peristently stand sentinel in the charred remnants of their home not far from Twelve Oaks Mall.

Like the three goats they shared quarters with, the geese have been off their feed and water since a 52-year-old barn on Twelve Mile Road fell prey to arsonists on Oct 9. The incident is one of three suspicious fires on Twelve Mile Road this month, all under investigation by the Oakland County Sheriff's Department's arson unit. The Novi Fire Department saved two torched vacant houses on Oct. 5 and 15.

Around 1 a.m. Oct. 9, farm owner Deborah Bundoff dialed the Novi Police Department to report trespassers when the dispatcher told her a fire had been called in on her 11-acre property. On a night of violent rain, Bundoff was watching television when she saw flashlights shining in her windows.

"I was on the phone to complain about the prowlers. That's how I found out about the fire,

from the lady on the phone. She told me it seemed like it was my house that was on fire. As I came out the side door, I saw the fire," Bundoff said, adding that a fire truck was racing up the

long, unpaved driveway. Her nearby house was spared, but the uninsured barn and chicken coop were destroyed, along with supplies, feed, and two adjacent black walnut trees. As many as 16 setting hens were lost the night of the fire, but a few may have escaped the barn.

Firefighters found the three goats huddled in a birthing pen within the structure and the geese in a corner shrinking from the flames. Ten chickens were safe in a second coop.

"I basically think at this point from talking with her (Bundoff) and everybody else - there was no electricity in the barn - it almost can be assured, it was definitely an intentionally set fire," said Sgt. Robert Gohl of the sheriff's department's arson unit.

Now, Bundoff is faced with the gritty job of cleaning up the burnt debris, as well as the expense of rebuilding. An additional complication is that her property was rezoned to an office district in 1989. Because her barn was a nonconforming use, she cannot set a new structure up on the same spot, but must push it another 250 feet further back from the road - and her

Worst of all, she must live with the fear that the arsonists could return. Bundoff said she has been plagued with trespassers roaming her property, including the two prowlers with flashlights she saw on her land one night in September. She does not look forward to Devil's Night.

"It's not as if it were a populated neighborhood where the kids would do something. A lot of the homes around here are being boarded up. I don't care to have to live in this kind of situation. It's unfortunate," Bundoff said, "Did you ever have somebody knock on your window in the middle of the night? There's not a whole lot you can do except hope they don't come in. This used to be a really nice neighborhood."



Retention is educator jargon for preventing a student from advancing to the next grade level.

Jun, it seems, was reading at a third-grade level and had learned the multiplication tables, but her teacher thought she was too immature for the

"Jun can be very headstrong and impatient," Steve Myers said. But he and his wife did not feel that impatience was cause for holding their daughter back a grade.

The Myers' daughter Jun was advanced after discussions between them, the principal and the teacher. Today Jun is a successful fourth grader. Steve Myers does not want to avenge his daughter's near retention. but he would like the district to have a look at their retention policy.

### **Hunters** must help prevent gamy game

With the fall hunting season right around the corner, many households will be the recipients of deer, elk, bear and a host of smaller game.

If you find yourself in possession of a piece of venison or perhaps a brace of quail, even a mallard duck, don't panic. Cooking wild game is as simple as preparing beef, pork or poultry.

The problem facing most game cooks is that they must correct the mistakes made

Far more meat is ruined in the field than will ever be ruined in the kitchen. If hunters had to buy beef and pork in the same condition as the game they kill, we would be a nation of vegetarians. While most hunters are men - with women entering the field this year in record numbers - a basic knowledge of cooking, even more in meat preparation, should be tantamount before entering the

Ask any hunter what makes a good steak and he or she usually answers.

Too often, venison is "aged" by improper care in the field. But it is also by far the most mistreated by hunters who fall to remove the hide in time or who do a poor tob dressing the carcass. The result is soured meat, a condition

most hunters wrongfully explain by saying the meat has a "gamy taste." In truth, the meat is not gamy, it is spoiled. If a cook comes upon meat that has been treated improperly to begin with, there are few things short of massive doses of spices, marinades and herbs that

will disguise the flavor. Let's take a closer look at venison. A venison steak or chop can be cooked like beefsteak. It can be broiled, barbecued or pan-fried. It is best medium rare.

Venison is not necessarily tough. It can be tough if cut against the grain. It also can be tough if all the moisture is cooked

Venison is by far the most healthful red meat you can eat. It is low in cholesterol, has mostly lean, fat-free tissue and, of course, has no chemical additives that ranchers usually administer to cattle sheep and pigs.

The meat itself is not marbled the way

All visible fat should be trimmed from venison because it is generally tallowy and unpalatable. A ventson roast or haunch can be roasted with strips of bacon laid over the top to compensate for lack of fat and marbling. Game birds such as quail, dove or

duck, like big game, are best when properly cared for in the field. This means dressing and plucking as soon as possible. Improper drainage of blood and lack of plucking coupled with a too-soon toss into a plastic unbreath-



As for cooking with pumpkins, the sweet flesh makes great dessert fixings. It goes great in casseroles, too, or alone with outter, salt and pepper as a side dish. Here are some guidelines provided by the Cooperative Extension Service at Michigan State University:

TO BUY: Select a pumpkin that is heavy for its size. The rind should be smooth and free from spots and discolorations. Very arge pumpkins often have stringy, course flesh, and are less sweet. Pumpkins will keep two to three months if stored at 50 to

TO PŘEPARE: Halve the pumpkin and remove the seeds and stringy portion. Save the seeds for toasting.

To cook in water, cut the halves in small pieces and pare off the skin. Add pumpkin to a small amount of boiling water and cover. Simmer gently for 25-30 minutes or until tender. Drain well and put through a sieve or blender.

To bake, cut the pumpkin into halves or quarters and remove the seeds. Place cutside down in a shallow pan and bake in a 350-degree oven for one hour, or until the pumpkin becomes tender and begins to fall apart. When cool, scrape pulp from the shell and put through a sieve or blender. The strained pumpkin is now ready for

use in your dishes, or to be frozen for later use. To make one 9-inch pie, use 1 1/2 to 2

TO FREEZE: Cool and pack into airtight container, leaving 1/2 -inch of head space. Seal and freeze.

#### Burgundy area short but sweet

Burgundy is not France's largest wine region, but it is its most fabled. The legendary aspects may cloud our view of the region's relatively small wine production.

The region's premium acreage, the Cote d'Or, is 30 miles long. Annual wine production is about one-tenth that of

Burgundy's major white wine is produced from chardonnay, while the reds

are made from pinot noir.

Just over 200 years ago, the French Revolution wrought the single most important transfiguration on Burgundy's vineyards. The vineyards were confiscated from church and monastery ownership and put to piecemeal auction. Today, the system of small ownership prevails. The great vineyards remain intact as appellations, but they are divided among multiple

Cote d'Or wines are classified as grand cru, premier cru and village wines. The quantity of grand cru Burgundy wines cannot possibly satisfy world demand for the wines from this region. In recent years, prices of Burgundy wines have escalated in double-digit percentages

annually. Burgundy's system of labeling the region's wines is dependent on geography. If you are not familiar with this geography. the easiest way to select good wines is by the name of the producer or the shipper. Below, we discuss several reputable producers and recommend a wine from each.

Maison Louis Jadot was founded in 1859 by the man whose name it bears. Two succeeding generations of Jadots built the company reputation. In 1962, when Louis Auguste Jadot died, survived only by his wife, she appointed Andre Gagey as managing director.

The winery is in the heart of Beaune. where technical director Jacques Lardiere oversees three cellars, one of which dates back to 1477. In contrast, the most recent cellar, completed in 1986, is ultra

In 1880, Joseph Drouhin bought the business rights of a wine firm founded in 1756 and bestowed his name on the enterprise. Today, Robert Drouhin, thirdgeneration family member, leads the Burgundy house standing at the center of circle of the ancient Roman fortifications. John Mongeard represents the eighth

generation of his family to produce wines at Domaine Mongeard-Mugneret in the Cote de Nuits. He is a distinguished proprietor, producing barely 10,000 cases annually of outstanding wines from a host of appellations in which his family owns small vineyard parcels.

"When a proprietor works his own land, there is a conscientiousness that cannot be achieved by hiring people as the large negotiants are forced to do." Mongeard said. "I'm not saying that all small producers in Burgundy make top wines. Hard work and dedication are complementary to the knowledge of the vineyards and how to make the wines."

His production of pinot noir makes traditional use of one and two-year-old barrels except for the Richebourg, where 100 percent new-barrel toasty oak enriches the fruit components of the wine. "This wine is always powerful and round," Mongeard said. "The fruit can support the tannin of young wood. The terroir is the difference in quality for Richebourg." At Domaine Louis Trapet, Jean Trapet is the fifth generation to direct this presti-

Until the end of the 1940s, Louis Frapet sold his harvest in barrels to the local Burgundy trade. In the early 1950s. the Domaine began bottling small quantities. For the last decade and a half, the entire production of 7,500 cases has been Domaine bottled and 50 percent is exported. The portion remaining in France is coveted by Michelin three-star restaurants. frapet's young Chambertin appellation wines. They develop a complex, concentrated, extracted character as they mature, yet they finish delicate, elegant and
