## Mohawk Line to be site of 'Expo Center'

Plans to convert the vacant Mohawk Liquor building in Novi's Town Center area to a regional conference facility are "gaining steam," according to City Manager Ed Kriewall.

Ownership of the massive building, with some 343,000 square feet — one-quarter the size of Twelve Oaks Mali — belongs to the Adell family. Kriewali said the family's representative. Frank Adell, has been "very excited" about the possibility of creating the "Novi Expo Center" during talks with city officials and business people.

Kriewall unveiled the idea for the center in a joint meeting of the City Council and Planning Commission Wednesday night. The facility could "It's a re-use of an existing building. Hopefully, what we end up with is an expo center and secondary

A ticket to ride - from Novi to Detroit or vice-versa - will cost \$1.50, starting today.

The Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transportation (SMARI) is revving up Route 300 its first-ever bus run to Novi, beginning at Seven Mile and Grand River Avenue and ending up at Twelve Oaks Mall, with stops along the way at destinations such as downtown Farmington, Botsford General Hospital, Novi Town Center and West Oaks.

in September, SMART hopes to bring a shuttle to Novi to link in with the bus service.

Though some transferring would be necessary, a Novi resident can in theory reach downtown Detroit or Detroit Metropolitan Airport by tem is to bring employees out to their surburban jobs, said John Sajovec, SMART's director of service development and communications. "Primarily, the main motivation

is to bring people working in the Novi area in from Detroit and Redford. We hope people in Novi will eventually take advantage of the scheduling and the routing," Sajovec said.

"One of the reasons we put it in, is we got a lot of requests from people working in Sears and Hudson's, the big stores."

The Twelve Oaks bus stop is at a northwest mall entrance between Hudson's and Sears. Other stops along the line are positioned at about every other block.







## **City reviews planner candidates**

The Novi Planning Commission will have at least one new face when it next meets, as city council is expected to appoint three planners tonight.

Candidates for the three openings were interviewed by the city council Wednesday night. The seats of commissioners Tim Gliberg, Judy Johnson and Harry Avagian are open for reappointment.

Both Gilberg and Johnson reapplied for the commission. Avagian, who is facing charges of credit card fraud in district court, didn't file to retain his seat.

The appointments will be made in time for the commission's meeting on Wednesday night. Each term will last three years. "I am familiar with the issues and the area," said candidate Robert Taub, a Detroit attorney, in his interview with the council. "I like Novi. It has a certain rural or country flavor."

The six-year resident said he sees Novi heading toward more residential growth in the next few years. He said he would like to preserve the natural aspects of the city while "being realistic about growth."

Lodia Richards Jr., a city resident for nearly three years, told council members that growth should be controlled. He said it shouldn't "outstrip" development of utilities.

"We don't want growth for growth's sake, but (grwoth) that is smartly planned." Richards said, adding "I believe the city of Novi is a well-planned community."

Richards is an engineer with General Motors. He said he would approach each new development with an "open mind."

John Kirkish, a longtime member of the Novi Construction Board of Appeals, was interviewed by the council. It was unclear at the conclusion of the interview, however, whether Kirkish wished to be considered for a commission seat. "Because of the time constraints, I don't think

I could do a proper job," he said. Michael Freeman, a self-employed 44-year-

old who is also running for city council, had one goal in mind in applying for the commission. "I want to serve the city," he said. "I want to

participate in my new city. I see a new and emerging city and I want to be a part of it."

Freeman, a resident for one year, described planning as a basic city function. He said traffic is a problem in the city that has many concerned.

CITY OF NOVI NOTICE OF PROVISIONS OF THE NOXIOUS WEED AND **REFUSE ORDINANCE** 

TO: All owners, occupants or possessors of subdivided lands or lots: NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 21-20 of the Novi Code, all noxious weeds, or other weeds, grass, brush or deleterious, unhealthy growths exceeding a height of twelve (12) inches, or any refuse or debris growing, standing or lying upon any property in the City of Novi, shall be cut down, destroyed or removed as the case may be, at least twice in each year, once during the last half of the month of May and again during the last half of July of each year and more often ar

may be necessary. We don't see that a finger of blame needs to be pointed here. Nor can we conclude that the city council or the city administration is attempting to be "secretive." We do, however, think that the problem shows the need for some additional attention to cablecasts on the part of the city.

Samoulian said MetroVision is working on converting the "feed" to fiber optics, which should not only make it less susceptible to failure in a storm but should also improve the quality of the cablecast. And that should address one



## Eleanor & Ray Heald/Wine Krug Winery is Valley's oldest

While the wine consumer remains infatuated with wine offerings from "new" wineries, you should remember there is nothing more important on the label than the brand name. Quality, established wineries will not risk their reputation on an inferior product. One such winery is Charles Krug - Napa Valley's oldest winery. In 1849, the first year of the California Gold Rush. Charles Krug fled to America from his native Prussia not to pan for gold but to flee a repressive regime unwill-

ing to cope with idealists. Like so many after him, Krug was enthralled with the natural blessings of Napa Valley's climate and terrain and caught the wine bug. He moved to Napa in 1860 and began planting vincyards in 1861, completing construction of a stone winery in 1868.

Just in case Krug's contemporaries hadn't noticed his achievements, the long arm of fate reached out one night in 1874 when a cellar worker inserted a sulfur candle (used for barrel sterilization) into a fuming brandy barrel. An explosion and subsequent fire destroyed the winery. Local historical records report that before the embers were safely out, Krug was ordering lumber for the rebuilding project.

. Krug died in 1892, leaving his ranch and winery to his daughters, but not without being recognized as an influential figure in the wine industry and the first person to establish a winery in the Napa Valley.

The Charles Krug Winery produced wine until Prohibition began in 1919. In 1943, the winery was purchased by Cesare Mondavi, an Italian immigrant who came to the United States in 1906 and prospered as a grape wholesaler in the Lodi area.

Today, Cesare's sons Peter and Robert are both influential figures in the California wine industry. Peter and his two sons Marc and Peter Jr. are involved with running the Charles Krug Winery while Robert and his family supervise the day-to-day operations at the Robert Mondavi Winery.

"Winemaking owes as much to tradition and the human element as to equipment and technology," said Peter Mondavi Sr. "My sons who have taken their places with me at the Charles Krug Winery help me to maintain that balance."

## Reducing use starts in the supermarket

There's plenty of talk about recycling in this area as communities begin to make it mandatory.

Wayne County and Oakland County have both required communities to begin curbside recycling as part of their solid waste scenarios. But now that that step is assured, it would be prudent to start looking ahead to the next step in reducing solid

"Reduce your use" is the latest rallying cry from the green camp. In other words, if you stop wasteful products from coming into your home in the first place, you don't have to worry about whether to landfill

It starts when you go to the supermark et. The goal is to reduce the amount of packaging in your groceries, and take other steps to reduce the overall waste stream.

Michigan State University's Coopera tive Extension Service has released a guidebook to environmental awareness in the home, called "The Green Pages." Even Escoffier felt the lure of the grill

st people read novels, I read cookbooka. Friends talk about the latest top 10 on The New York Times book list, I rave about the newest culinary publication I just purchased. My friends and family think this is peculiar behavior. I tend to disagree. There is so much to be learned from ournals of any type, Because I am a chef by profession, a food scientist out of necessity and extol food in general, what better

pastime than to read about foodstuffs? A current project is reading "The Com plete Guide To The Art Of Modern Cookery ranslated from French. The author is considered to be the grandfather of classical cooking - Auguste Escoffier. The book was written in 1907.

Escoffier's belief lives today: the basic fundamentals of cooking do not change. Science and social trends force us to update and modernize traditional methods but the rudimentary principals always remain the same.

I don't recommend that you run off to the bookstore and purchase this manual as it is a guide only and does not go into the minute details of preparation. If, however, you are a history buff and have sound cooking knowledge, it could be a great addition to your bookshelf.

those who practice the art of cookery whether they be the professional chef or manager, the housewife or the gourmet. As a guide, it should be read and studied and eferred to constantly; a book kept somewhere in the kitchen and not relegated to the library shelf to gather dust.

the roasting over an open fire. It is the most primitive method of cooking. As prehisoric man's desire to eat finer edibles grew, the idea was born to prepare food over heat. The need for preserving foods for long periods was eliminated, the food tasted better and harmful parasites were killed in the process.

Along with cooking came the spit made

from various woods which imparted their flavors to the meat. Smoking then became prominent, then cooking with utensils and so on. Experience rendered conclusions, and cookery advancements were on their way - and still are today.

The fuel best for grilling is charcoal. Smoke produced by other materials may cause a bitter, unpleasant taste in the food. Ventilation is very important in all instances. The amount of fuel used is dependent on the amount and sizes of food. It is critical to layer the charcoal pyramid-style until the fire takes hold and the coals are glowing. A natural draft is

When ready to cook, spread the coals out evenly to the size required for the food to be grilled. It is also vital to have the metal grill in place and hot before adding food thus eliminating sticking to the rods.

Different foods require different grilling procedures. When grilling red meats consider the size. Big items require a hot fire to quickly brown and sear the exterior. The better the quality of meat the more the ex-

While it is imperative to "seize" red meats, the opposite is true for white meats. The heat should be medium. Hot enough to cook through and to give a golden color. Brushing with a liquid is advised for the same reason as given above. The juices should run clear when the meat is cooked Fish, large or small are grilled over a moderate heat; they should be brushed with butter or oil first and through the remainder of cooking. Cooked fish is flaky and pulls away from the bone easily.



## Degradable packaging not a cure

When it comes to the environment doing your part by buying blodegrad-ables may do more harm than good if we don't look at the total solid waste picture A new study released by the Experi Panel on Food Safety and Nutrition of the Institute of Food Technologists states that biodegradable packaging may help in a small way with the litter problems in the streets and oceans, but the blog problems of solid waste are better served by what scientists call an "integrated approach."

"There is no quick solution," said Dr Robert A. Uebersax, of the department o food science and human nutrition o Michigan State University and IFT Reg ional Communicator for Michigan "Packaging choices based solely or biodegradability ignore the primary purposes of packaging, which are to protect our foods and minimize public health

The study, published by IFT --25,000-member scientific society explained that if biodegradability required on packaging, some products would need additional layers of packaging to protect foods or satisfy strength requirements. Thus the amount o material requiring disposal (that may or may not degrade) in a landfill would ge

A bag made of biodegradable plastic must be thicker and heavier than conventional bags, the study concluded. Biodegradability also complicates

recycling, and may add to landfill dispos al of packaging, according to the study The IFT report recommended a multifaceted approach to the total solid waste problem, combining and improving methods of reducing materials prior to or during manufacturing (source reduc-tion), recycling (including composting), incineration, and landfills.

As a final rote from Escoffier, "Cooking evolves - as society itself does . . . without ever ceasing to be an art." Go forth and be
