Agencies move to settle storm aftermath

PSC to examine what Edison did with its money

In the wake of the devastating July 7 storm, the chairman of the Public Service Commission (PSC) said Monday in Livonia that enabling legislation may be sought to give the state's regulatory arm more muscle in governing utility maintenance programs.

Under the provisions of a 1909 Michigan law on

health and safety issues, the PSC has stepped in to look at the issues surrounding electrical services provided by Detroit Edison and Consumers Power. The threemember PSC, appointed by the state legislature, al-

ready has the mandate to set utility rates.

"It is possible two months before the storm we didn't have any authority, but with the statute of 1909 we may have the authority to move ahead to take steps that we couldn't have done before the storm," said commission chairperson Steven Fetter.

"It's a gray area because no commission has stepped in to demand maintenance levels . . . It's hard to say what we have the power to do. It is a novel concept. We would have to go to the legislature to ask for help. "Over the last five to ten years, it's clear both Con-

sumers Power and Detroit Edison cut back expendi-

tures to keep themselves out of bankruptcy.'

how much of - the information will be made public. To the boy's father Francis Schneider, this is just one



"I wanted to express my frustration that the city has not let us know what happened and how it happened. Ive called them and I'm getting the cold shoulder. I don't understand it. I really don't. I just haven't been able to

get anywhere," he said Tuesday. They told me that from a legal standpoint they weren't sure they were going to release the facts. What about the moral standpoint and the fact of my son who's still in intensive care? They're not cooperating at all."

The city's insurance carrier. Risk Management Authority, has hired an outside investigator to look in to the incident. The boy was injured July 8 while attending day camp at the park. Somehow, he came into contact with a 13,200 volt power line wrenched to the ground by the July 7 thunderstorm.

65,000 rock 'n roll in for '50s fest

It's Novi's party and nobody was

Or if they were, it was all the way to the bank - with any luck.

The receipts are still being tallied for the Fourth Annual Michigan '50s Festival, but the prospects are good. Last year's fest drew in \$25,000 in profits.

"It was a good festival. It was bigger and better than ever. We won't know until a couple of weeks how it did financially," said Novi City Manager Edward Kriewall.

The festival should be in the black. . . Last year, the bills were still drifting in until October."

It was a real blast, Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Connie Mallett agreed.

In 1990, an estimated 40,000 to 50,000 people turned out for the event. This year, as many as 50,000 to 65,000 may have made the

Entertainment costs were high -about \$7,500 for the six bands at Friday's Sock Hop Express and another \$14,000 for the entertainment tent, Mallett said. On top of that, the festival headliners -Danny and the Juniors and Rocky and the Rollers took home \$10,000.

The turnout for the Sock Hop Express appeared to be a little disappointing-about 1,600 to 1,700 jitterbuggers bought tickets, 200 fewer than last year.

But the addition of two hotels to create a six-hotel circuit may have contributed to this, Kriewall said: There might have been a little too much extra space we had to fill. I think we had a somewhat leaner crowd for that reason."

A crowd of about 3,000 lined up at the Novi Town Center parking lot the national anthem of the 1950s -

"Rock and Roll is Here to Stay." "People were lining up at 7:30 p.m. By 9 or 9:30, they were being told it might take 45 minutes before they could get in to get a spot," Mal-

And the rockets red glare over Twelve Oaks Mall - billed as "Great Balls of Fire" - was a real "killer."

"Twelve Oaks is to be commended to bring the fireworks with out the big crowds to the festival. They may consider making it an annual event. There were colors in those fireworks I've never seen before. I bet they spent \$15,000 to \$20,000 just for the actual costs of the fireworks," Mallett said.

Cruisin' Grand River had 1,000 hot rods wowing the crowds - about 30 percent more than last year. "It wasn't until ten to nine that

the last cars got in. It was real re-

But what can't be enumerated is the good will the event brings to Novi each year, he and Mallett

"We've got such a large crew of people to help us. The involvement of all the civic groups is really important in this thing. I really think that's what makes it a great event," Kriewall said.

The city, local businesses and residents really pulled together on this one, according to Mallett.

People and many of the vendors are real complimentary about Novi. People are very, very nice and friendly and people seem to enjoy themselves. I was very pleased and amazed at the number of people who turned out," she said.

"I think everyone should pat themselves on the backs."

Area man gunned down in Detroit

A 33-year-old Novi man was fatally shot while driving on Detroit's west side early Sunday morning.

The victim, David Vaughn, apparently left the Michigan Fifties Festival in Novi Saturday night to drive a friend home. He was driving on Blackstone on Detroit's

west side at approximately 3 a.m. when he stopped at the intersection of Blackstone and Details of the events leading to Vaughn's

death are sketchy. Detroit Police Officer John Leavens said

Vaughn and his friend, a 32-year-old Redford man, had a verbal dispute with an unidentified man at the intersection.

The cause of the dispute as well as what was

said is unclear.

Leavens said the unidentified man then pulled a gun and fired several shots, striking Vaughn in the face and in his right side.

Vaughn's friend was not injured. The man escaped in an older model, full size

Vaughn was transported to Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills, where emergency room personnel were unable to save him, according to Botsford Community Relations Director Mary Jo

Detroit Police are withholding names of witnesses, as well as any further description of the suspect, stating that the case is still under investigation.

Members of Vaughn's family are declining comment at this time.

Novi resident Carol Mason said Vaughn, a Novi High School graduate, once lived across the

street from her with his brothers Thomas and Gale. She said his mother died last December.

Vaughn lived with his wife, Kathy, and their three children Vanessa, Tiffany and David in their home on Marlson in Novi.

They just had a baby boy," Mason said. "It's so sad . . . he was so young."

Mason said Vaughn, who was self-employed as a tool and die maker, was "a nice person who did everything himself. He bought his company himself, and bought his house himself."

Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. today at Heeney-Sundouist Funeral Home in Farmington with Father Jerome Slowinski of Novi Holy Family Church officiating. Burial is at Holy Sepulchre cemetery.

For another, city attorneys have expressed concern that the release of information might impede a criminal investigation or the investigation of employee misconduct.







Novi Youth Assistance offers companionship

When Maureen Osiecki heard in 1987 that the Youth Assistance Program was being set up in parts of Wayne County, she inquired about it, took the offered training, and then went to work to start it in Northville.

She contacted the township and city governments for money and the school district for office space. She helped form a seven-person Advisory Council, of which she was elected chair, and then they hired a director - Mary Ellen King.

"We're the governing body," Osiecki said — three representatives each from the township and the city and one from the school system.

What does the program do? It provides trained and matched volunteer adult companionship - "We call the person a companion rather than a counselor," she said - for children ages 6 to 16 who have been referred as needing that sort of person. Children are referred by township police, city police, schools, and parents. "Our goal this year," Osiecki said,

"is to reach as many children as are reaching out in the Northvile area" children who have personal problems, who have adjustment difficulty, or who have done something

Besides getting support money from the township and the city. Osiecki said, they have money donated to them, and they raise money at the Victorian Festival by

selling cans of pop.

Also, "I do P.R. for the program,"

Osiecki said. "Any meeting I go to—if the subject of children comes up - I talk because, as she put it, "If we have our children, we have our future."

The Advisory Coucil meets monthly, except in July, at 8:30 a.m. on the first Tuesday of the month at Cooke School. Anyone who wants to know more about Northville Youth Assistance is welcome to attend.

After the Cadillacs, "I was looking around for another car and I found this 1938 Packard — just the body - in Missouri. Then I found a 1938 Super 8 coupe and 1 used that as a parts car.

The body he found in Missouri was "in fairly good shape, but it needed to be refinished," he said.

Three or four months later I came across another parts car in Hemmings, Indiana. After a few years everyone was asking me for parts because I had so many."

In addition to the 1941 and 1935 Cadillacs and the 1938 Packard, Nienaltowski has also restored a 1939 Cadillac limousine, a 1955 Cadillac Coupe de Ville, a 1954 Packard and a 1947 Cadillac. He has traveled as far as California to find the cars or parts he needs.



Detroit Edison's Lightning Location system can detect sever weather in advance and warn golfers

Detection system aids the PGA

Association brings a tournament to the Detroit area, players such as Lee Trevino and Jack Nicklaus are secure in knowing that any electrical storms will be detected far enough in advance by Detroit Edison to keep them out of harm's wav.

The Senior Players Championship in Dearborn this summer was a unique assignment for the Detroit Edison's Lightning Location and Protection system, which was developed 10 years ago to track potential weather problems affecting the utility's southeastern Michigan service area.

The vulnerability of players and their fans to fast-moving weather is real. The lightning-caused death of a spectator recently at the Hazeltine National Golf Club in Chaska, Minn., highlights the importance of the equipment.

"It's the best system we have," said Henry Hughes, executive director of tournament services for the PGA tour. *Lightning is one of our major safety concerns and Detroit Edison's system gives us the most advanced warning and the most sophisticated look at the weather, it's a real saicguard for the players and

The system also provides a safeguard for Detroit Edison equipment. the primary reason it was developed. Detroit Edison has used the system, which provides lightning information from a 100-mile radius of three antenna stations, since March 1981.



With no similar shading outside the formal dining room, if this side of the home faces west, some kind of curtains or blinds will be needed to diffuse the afternoon light from the double glass doors that open onto the deck. The rest of the day, the light will be appreciated.

Best and most dramatically lit of all is the large family room. In addition to two big double windows, skylights set high in the vaulted ceiling positively shower the room with natural light. Because it's sure to be the most popular room in the house, cutting the lighting bill here will result from the substantial sources of light.

The master suite includes two closets: an oversize walk-in and a smaller one. lined with cedar, which provides some protection from moths for blankets and clothing made of wool. The suite also has two vanities, one inside the water closet and another outside. Across the house, the bathroom, small but serviceable, is located just inside the front door.

An alcove in the back of the two-car garage provides extra storage space, and a workbench is tucked in a nook just outside the ample utility room.

Reverse mortgages come to the rescue

Nellie and Alfred Miller recently faced an important point of decision. Both approaching age 80, they didn't have enough retirement income to meet their financial responsibilities.

They had one thing going for them - a substantial equity in their home. But this didn't solve their immediate problem of paying monthly bills. And one of the biggest payments was on a second trust deed loan on their home in the amount of \$300 per month.

They considered selling the house and moving to a small rental unit or retirement residence. But they really didn't want to do that.

"We've lived in this house since 1964 and have great neighbors," said Alfred

"It would break our hearts to move away. I can't go and lift the hood of my car or work in the yard without a neighbor rushing over to offer help. That's just the kind of people they are. We don't ever want to leave this neighborhood."

After much study and discussion, the couple decided to take a reverse mortgage on their home. By entering into a reverse mortgage agreement, the couple's second trust deed loan was immediately paid off (no more payments). They also receive a monthly check from the

mortgage company, Providential Home Income Plan.

Their financial problem was solved. And the added tax-free income will continue as long as one of the Millers lives or as long as they continue to own and reside in their home.

"We were almost at the poverty level financially," said Miller, who retired in 1974 from a position as purchasing agent for a major firm. "Now we can' relax and enjoy ourselves. And we can stay in our home."

Reverse mortgages are becoming an increasingly popular option for some seniors over age 62. These plans are basically a mortgage loan secured by home equity. The loan is paid to the borrower in monthly payments, which usually continue for the life of the borrower.

The loan with accrued interest is normally paid off when the estate is settled. In some cases, the mortgage company also receives all or a portion of the appreciated value of the home. With this arrangement, the borrower receives larger monthly payments.

A reverse mortgage is clearly not the best option for all senior homeowners. For example, if a retired couple want to pass along the largest possible estate to their kids (heirs), they probably would not want to tie up their home equity with a reverse mortgage contract. But for many couples, like the Millers, it works

Providential Home Income Plan is now the country's largest provider of reverse mortgages.

"We now have about a thousand reverse mortgages on our books, and inquiries from seniors continue to increase in volume," said William Texido, president of PHIP. To date, the total value of homes

owned by seniors who have expressed interest in the Providential plan has reached about \$3.6 billion, according to Texido. The company has made 11,000 individual proposals to applying seniors after checking their qualification status. About a thousand loans have been closed.

One currently available type of reverse mortgage is insured by the Federal Housing Administration. Nearly 10,000 FHA-approved lenders were recently authorized to make FHA-insured reverse mortgage loans.

A year ago, I interviewed a 66year-old woman (a widow) who had just contracted for a reverse mortgage on her home. I'll always remember one of her comments when discussing plans for her extra monthly income.

"Now I can take those flying lessons I've been thinking about for decades," she said. "Finally I have the time and finances to do it."

g. Why are more home sellers providing warranty coverage when selling their home?

A. The sale of home protection plans (warranty coverage) on resale homes is indeed increasing. Two key reasons are (I) to enhance the salability of the property, and (2) to minimize potential aftersale lawsuits and other problems.

"Increasing numbers of home sellers and real estate brokers are providing buyers with warranties as a shield against complaints and lawsuits," said Phil Branson, president of the Home Warranty Association of California and president of First American Home Buyers Protection, based in Van Nuys, Calif.

A recent survey by the Gallup organization also determined that an increasing number of homeowners and agents believe having a home warranty helps avoid after-sale problems.

Q. What are prospects for first time

home buyers in coming months? A. Affordable mortgage rates will continue to bring more home buyers into the market, particularly first-time buyers. This will bring the sales pace of previously owned homes to the highest level in nearly 18 months, predicts the
