Expo Center gets no taxes, council says

The City Council threw their moral support Monday behind the Novi Expo Center, but wanted it made clear they weren't throwing the taxpayers' money along with it.

The convention center is now underway at the former Mohawk Liquor Building, sandwiched between the Big Boy restaurant on Novi Road and the freeway.

City Manager Edward Kriewall and Community Development Director James Wahl are part of a six-month-old Expo Center ad hoc committee.

Schools look at extra activities

The Novi High School Color Guard, computers and Campbell's soup labels all have something in common.

A committee formed Oct. 3 by the Novi school board will examine the role the school district should play in regulating fund-raising and other activities of school-related

A long-standing practice of the school district has been to prohibit any activities that would encourage commercial activity on the part of parents or students. Parent groups,

collect labels from Campbell's products to exchange for school eauipment.

The annual event would be in direct countradiction to the policy except that soup labels have been collected for so long they are "grandfathered in," said acting Superintendent William Barr.

The practice of prohibiting commercial activity was called into question by parents who wanted to participate in grocery store promotions. Two grocery store chains are offering computers to groups that collect cash register receipts.

City has initiated most rezonings

By SCOTT DANIEL Staff Writer

Of the 30 rezonings approved since Novi's Master Plan was adopted in January 1988, more than half have been initiated by the city, according to clerk's office records.

A majority of the changes, 18, came west of Taft Road in Novi's less-developed western half. Not surprisingly, 11 of those were residential rezonings.

Novi Planning Consultant Bran-don Rogers explained that the city initiated rezonings were needed to implement the Master Plan. Records butress his statement, showing that 13 of 17 city startedchanges were approved in 1988 and

1989. Rogers said the overall number of rezonings aren't a large number for a developing community like

cards. Toth said he is also active with the Citizens for Veteran's Memorial Facility. An eight-year Marine veteran. Toth said a city memorial would help residents to remember soldiers sacrifices from all of Ameri-

ca's conflicts. "I'm am really sorry about the lack of sensitivity with the Vietnam veterans," he said. The memorial will act as a central meeting spot and show people what has been done in differnt conflicts."

The candidate's involvement with other activities has been limited by his committment to council matters. Toth said he sometime spends as much as 20 to 30 hours a week on council business.

"I enjoy it," he commented. "I get a kick out of working on things."

One of the things Toth has worked hard on in his five years with the council is the city's budget. A proclaimed "Budget Terrorist," he makes no bones about about streamlining city expeditures.

"I go through the budget with a fine-tooth comb," Toth said. "My goal is to make sure money is well spent. I don't want to see money wasted."

The city has improved over the last three years in cutting fat, he said. But, Toth added, more work needs to be done.

"Some departments are better than others," he said.





An eccentric old man sits in a darkened room, swinging a gold watch on a chain in front of a subject's eyes.

"You are getting verrrrrrryyyyy sleeeeeeeeepyyyyyyyy. he intones.

The subject goes into a bizarre trance. "You are a duck," the old man

The subject flaps his arms and quacks.

That's the image most people associate with hypnosis. And that makes hypnotherapist Gayle Blyshak angry.

"Misconceptions about hypnosis prevent people from trying it, and that's too bad because it can be such a helpful tool," she said.

Blyshak has helped thousands of area people to quit smoking, lose weight, improve study habits, reduce stress, improve athletic skills and more through her hypnosis

She is owner/director of Positive

This is how most people picture hypnosis. In reality, it's totally different. Training your computer

Hypnotherapist clears up misconceptions

Achievements Hypnosis Center in Northville. A former psychology and sociology student, she is a graduate of the American Academy of

Hypnosis. In addition to her work at her clinic, she also teaches a class called *Self-hypnosis: How to take control of your life" at Schoolcraft College.

There are so many misconceptions," she said. "I've even had people say to me, 'I don't want to look in your eyes' because they think they

will become hypnotized." However, hypnosis is simply a state where the body and conscious mind are in a relaxed, natural state while the subconscious mind remains awake and receptive to positive suggestion, Blyshak explained. It is not mind control, and the person being hypnotized is always in control. A person under hypnosis will never do anything he or she would not normally do.

"Hypnosis cannot make you do anything you do not have the want, desire and motivaion to do," she

Blyshak explained that the mind has two parts - subconscious and conscious - and hypnosis works with the subconscious.

"The subconscious part of the mind works exactly like a compu-

ter," she said. "It controls the physical body; it's

where habits are formed; every-

thing we don't think about is controlled by the subconscious mind."

Blyshak said the subconscious intakes and records information through senses and life experiences. "Once it's programmed it's there for life, and the programming is reinforced by repetition."

Blyshak said the subconscious mind, unlike the conscious mind, is not affected by morals or religious beliefs, but simply works as a computer.

with the subconscious, to reprogram the subconscious mind, she said. "The current theory is that 90 percent of the mind is unconscious. so the computer has a very strong impact on our behavior."

"The goal in hypnosis is to work

Blyshak explained that, when we are awake, the conscious mind is always elevated, while the subconscious keeps working at the same time, doing everything it's programmed to do.

When a person is sleeping or in any other form of relaxed state, such as hypnosis, the subconscious becomes elevated and is then more open to suggestions and change.

Blyshak is strongly against stage shows where hypnosis is used to entertain, and, although she has been asked, she refuses to do them. That's why there's such a big mis-

What the Oversbys do in the program runs like this:

In Focus: Hope Ray opens cartons of food which have been delivered from Oakland County Offices. Each one contains quantities of one item like dry milk, dry eggs, cereal, and peanut butter. Then, following instructions from the manager of the Senior Center, Ray fills individual cartons with identical assortments of

Meanwhile, Dorothy sits and punches cards of people coming in, and she said. "I talk with the people get to know them."

If a person needs help, Ray carries the carton out.


The Commodities program is also supplementary food, but it is surplus food provided by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. You get five or six items," Ray said, "like cheese, canned pork or beef," whatever happens to be available.

Each time it's a full afternoon's job because there are as many as 40 people to prepare for, check in, and load for Focus: Hope, and there are 75 or more for Commodities.

Why do the Oversbys do it? "It's something that needs to be done," Dorothy said, "and I'm happy when I'm helping out."



Then he told them they had an urge to do the hula, and he played music and they began to dance. But one man suddenly just stopped, and was no longer hypnotized. Dancing the hula was something he normally just would not do, so he wouldn't do it under hypnosis, either.*

Blyshak said people usually come to her for help after other methods consicous mind, you can control fall. By the time people come to me, it's usually a last resort," she said. *Because people are generally afraid of hypnosis.

"What we fear is what we don't understand," she said. "The biggest misconceptions are that you lose control, that the hypnotist can make you do things you don't want to do, or that you don't hear, see or are

under hypnosis. People might actually hear their heart beating," she said. "Under hypnosis, a person is always totally aware of everything and can hear everything."

Although some hypnotists, especially those who do stage shows, will tell the subject not to remember anything, and the person may not remember afterwards, it is only because the subconscious mind agreed that it was unimportant enough to not remember, she explained. Usually the person will remember the hypnosis at a later date, if asked. Blyshak said hypnosis can be helpful in changing behavior such as smoking or overeating only if the person wants to make the change.

"If they don't want to make the change, I can't make them do it." she Another misconception about hypnosis is that only people with weak minds can be hypnotized.

"People with strong, determined minds are the best," she said. "A person has to want to do it. Hypnosis doesn't control minds."

The key to success in real estate is changing

It's tough to make a good living selling homes. Thousands of people each year make a concerted effort to carve out a successful career in this highly competitive field. But nearly 80 percent of fledgling sales associates abandon their dream of making big money in real estate after a year or so of non-productive effort.

However, outstanding success stories can be told in markets throughout the country. Consider the case of Lori Jolicoeur, divorced a few years ago from her insurance executive husband.


Jolicoeur faced a major problem. With 12 children and eight grandchildren, she needed to generate a sizable income on her own. The solution to the problem at hand was, of course, to sell real estate. She was determined to make it work. And she did—in a big way.

In 1990, this 59-year-old mother and grandmother sold several million dollars in residential and commercial properties. Racking up 18 sate transactions during the year, she was named top listing agent, top selling agent, and top overall producer within the multi-office organization in which she worked as a sales associate.

The American Rose exhibits charm and class

It has got traditional charm. It has got contemporary class. And it has got all of the features most popular with modern home buyers. It's the American Rose.

With only the two bedrooms and a bathroom upstairs, this medium-size home is equally well adapted to a family with older children or empty nesters who wish to have space to accommodate grandchildren and to entertain without feeling cramped. Built over a full basement, the possibilities for expanding storage and living spaces are practically endless.

Stepping into the high vaulted entryway, the first impression is one of vastness. This area, and the formal living room, are both vaulted to the second floor. In fact, the landing at the top of the curving stairway overlooks the living room.

Another area that gives the impression of spaciousness is the kitchen, and the area is also delightfully bright, with both a garden window and a bay window. Whole families of cooks can work together in this area without bumping elbows or getting ingredients mixed up. The upper of the double oven in the nook has microwave capabilities and, in addition to the pantry, there are also plenty of cupboards.

This design makes excellent use of oddly shaped spaces. A hutch is tucked into an angle in the dining room, a fireplace in another in the family room and a small, angled half-bath is conveniently close to everything.





"The most popular gift basket is one called 'Sweet Tooth,' Lennie


