# These roads lead to controversy

### East Lake Drive closure fires up neighbors' ire

Everyone who wanted to have their say about the controversial 90-day closing of East Lake Drive had their minute at the microphone at Monday's City Council meeting.

Then, they were told by Mayor Matthew Quinn that the ban on non-residential traffic on the road between Thirteen Mile and Fourteen Mile would remain unchanged, at least until the city reviews a 30-day report on the shutdown.

But hope for a solution was held out to trafficbeleaguered residents of Howell's Walled Lake Subdivision, who say vehicles avoiding East Lake since the closing have come careening down Wainwright and Linhart streets. Quinn asked Director of Public Services Anthony Nowicki to investigate the situation and offer solutions at the Oct. 28 council meeting.

\*Council was aware it (closing East Lake) would have significant impact on surrounding communities and surrounding subdivisions and also pass-through traffic," Quinn said.

### Road surfacing in Town Center miffs Tim Pope

The proposed surfacing of a downtown segment of Eleven Mile Road led to the resurfacing Monday of an

Council Member Tim Pope said despite private dis-

cussions urging him to trust the city administration, he could not support the \$527,000 segment of the city's \$18.8 million, voter-approved road bonding program.

"The message to residents is the very first road that we're going to pave with the bonding is to service a shopping center . . . It sends the wrong signal to residents," Pope explained.

### State: crowded court creates security hazard

A state-produced management study of the 52nd District Court recommends division one, which serves Novi, relocate because of "inadequate" facilities.

The report, which was prepared by the state court administrative office, was released late last week. It outlines management practices at the district court's four divisions and makes suggestions to "improve operational efficiency and plan for future needs."

Among other recommendations, the report states Walled Lake's 52-1 District Court should be relocated. A host of reasons are cited for the suggested move. Because of a space shortage, it states, clerical staff can't efficiently process cases. Misfilings and delays in

ocating records result, the rep Overcrowding in the court's hallway, which is sometimes double fire code standards, reduces privacy for hearings or conferences. The situation presents an ex-

treme security hazard," the report states. According to 52-1 Presiding Judge Harold Bulgarelli, the report strengthens what the court has been telling county officials for some time. The judge added that it would tell officials that "we weren't exaggerating."

"It shows that we need help," he said. "And we need it

Bulgarelli echoed many of the report's conclusions about conditions at the court. He said the bottom line is that services have been affected.

"I'm starting to see little things (mistakes)," Bulgarelli said, "that I didn't see before."

According to statistics from the report, the number of cases filed with the Walled Lake court accounts for the work overflow.

For the entire 52nd District Court, an average of 14,517 cases were filed per judge in 1990. That compares to an average of just more than 12,000 statewide.

The 52-1 court had an average filing of 16,900 per judge in 1990. The result, Bulgarelli said, has been overflowing files, high noise levels and long workdays

for judges and staff. "It's just mass confusion," he said.

Bulgarelli said the court needs six new clerks to help process the high case filings. The report makes no recommendations on staffing, but offers this warning.

"It is logical to assume . . . that errors in execution, untimely processing of cases and receipts and poor

### Canup shows 'can do' spirit

Diana Canup believes in doing her homework.

The couple's son Brent, 25, resides in Milford with his wife and infant

Canup's father, well-known Novi community activist Leo Harrawood, came here in 1944. She was born on Novi Road in a house which once stood on the site of Twelve Oaks

She has found the changes in the city astounding - but not totally unexpected.

"As I was growing up, my father used to say this town is going to grow and grow and become out-standing," Canup said.

"I want the community to develop so I can stay here the rest of my life and my children can stay here. I want it to stay as a family-oriented community."

She's done her best to help keep it that way. Vice Chair Canup's been on the parks and recreation commission for 14 years. Before that, she was a volunteer for the

### Police investigate car theft scam

Novi Police reported on Oct. 14 two more cases of fraud involving insurance claims on cars reported stolen in Novi.

The first case involved a woman who reported her 1989 Mitsubishi pickup truck stolen from the Vic Tanny parking lot on Sept. 17. Novi Detective Ron Roy reported Oct. 8 that he

was contacted by a Lansing detective who was investigating an anonymous tip that the vehicle was at a factory in Lansing, and that the owner intended to "do an insurance job" because it had transmission problems.

Lansing Police located the suspect at the factory, who furned out to be the husband of the woman who reported the truck stolen. They reported that the suspect "vanished" when the detective who was questioning him left the room for a moment.

Less than one hour after Lansing Police questioned the man, the insurance company processing the claim on the truck received a call from the woman who reported it stolen, saying the truck had been found.

Novi Detective Ron Roy reported Oct. 8 that he was contacted by a Lansing detective who was investigating an anonymous tip that the vehicle was at a factory in Lansing, and that the owner intended to "do an insurance job" because it had transmission problems.

After questioning by Novi Police, the couple confessed to filling a fraudulent police report and insurance claim, Roy reported.

A warrant was issued last week for the husband, but an arraignment will not take place until he returns from an out-of-town business trip,

A second case involved a 1987 BMW reported stolen from Twelve Oaks Mall Sept. 17 by Shaw Tim Ng of Novi and discovered in flames Sept. 18 in New York City.

Protection of elderly: The state Legislature recently enacted laws to further protect the safety and well being of any aged person placed under guardianship by the probate courts of Michigan.

The new law requires that within a year after the guardianship is established and every three years thereafter, a person independent of the family or the nursing home where the aged adult is living, will go out and meet with the person and make a written recommendation to the Probate Judge, in order to determine if further action should be taken for one person's protection.



Legislators are members of a separate political class whose main career purpose is to seek and hold elective office.

When members of a separate class are allowed to set their own pay and define their own perks, what do you expect they'll do? Take a vow of poverty? The excesses of our rulers (regardless of political party)

are beginning to loom up enough so that even they are be-"We have to stop taking care of ourselves at a time when

we're cutting everything else in sight," says Paul Hillegonds, GOP leader in the House. "If we don't do it ourselves, we're going to have artificial limits." On reflection, it seems to me that term limitation will

have little effect on this problem, other than making sure that nobody stays in office long enough to learn how to do

I prefer to focus on the "full time" nature of many political jobs. If the Legislature could be made into a part-time body - meeting, say, two months of the year instead of the present nine - we might get somewhere. At least it would be a lot tougher for legislators to pretend they have a fulltime job as a member of a separate political class.



### Lawyers are poor listeners

Members of the Michigan Trial Lawyers Association, who represent injured plaintiffs, talk to defense lawyers to persuade them to settle for big sums. They talk to expert witnesses, to draw out opinions favorable to their clients. They talk to judges about procedures. And they talk to juries --- especially to juries --- about the pain and suffering their clients endured. When they win a big one, they hire a PR consultant who

arranges for them to talk to the media. They talk, via comnercials, to late-night television audiences. Talk, talk, talk. But they're poor listeners. Once again there's a move in Lansing to curb the number of medical liability cases that go to trial, the multimillion-dollar payouts, and the fees attorneys get. I say "once again" because it happened in 1985, with in-

different results. The cap on P & S payouts didn't apply to many cases, and the 33 percent fees went unchanged. As I listened to the medical people, I got the impression that a big payout is only one concern, and not necessarily the biggest. The medical people are saying it's the constant hassle, hassle, hassle of lawsuits that are doing them in. Being on the defense end of a lawsuit, even when you win, takes an enormous amount of psychic energy out of a person, whatever the line of work. I've seen it among nonmedical people. It affects defendants' complexions, their self-confidence, their conversations. My hunch is that it also trims years off their lives.

Vice President Dan Quayle ruffled feathers recently when he told the American Bar Association that the United States, with 5 percent of the world's population, has 70 percent of the world's lawyers. Quayle implied we're sapping our own economic growth by suing each other for the

existing economic pie. Marketing Resource Group, Inc., floated Quayle's numbers past 800 Michigan voters on behalf of the hospital association. Results:

■ 73 percent agreed that "America just doesn't need 70 percent of the world's lawyers." # 73 percent agree that "the high cost of lawsuits is mak-

ing America less competitive in the world economy." But the only problem MTLA can spot is "soaring profits" for companies that sell medical liability insurance. ### Term-limit proposal finds limitless support

By TIM RICHARD Staff Writer

Glenn Steil is confident voters will see the proposal to Limit Politicians Terms on Michigan's 1992 ballot.

"Any place we solicit" is producing signatures. "Our biggest problem is the line of people signing," said Steil, president of Compatico, a Kentwood office furniture parts firm and chief fund-raiser.

Metro Detroit suburbs, the Grand Rapids, Muskegon and the Flint-Saginaw-Lansing triangle are producing the most initiative signatures. he said.

The group has a Royal Oak headquarters at 3309 Rochester Road. but co-director Tim Purdy was unavailable to talk about the southeastem Michigan effort. Volunteers can obtain petitions to circulate by call-

ing toll-free 1-800-272-1011.
"What Congress is doing now is playing into our hands," said Steil, referring to the flap over bounced congressional checks and Congress' role in the savings and loan crisis.

The conservative group needs nearly 257,000 signatures to put its proposed amendment to the state constitution on the ballot.

As of last week, Stell said they had raised "closer to 200,000. We have until the end of November. We're going to try for 400,000. We don't want these politicians trying to throw it

"We're adding about 18,000 a week, he said.

If it gets on the ballot and is approved by voters, the amendment would limit:

- U.S. senators to two six-year terms in a 24-year period.
- U.S. representatives to three twoyear terms in a 12-year period. Michigan's governor and three other top executives to two four-year
- State senators to two four-year

State representatives to three twoyear terms.

State and national polls show the plan as at least 2-1 support among all voter groups. Nationally, term limitation ranks as the biggest wave since the anti-tax movement of the late

Steil was elated that the California Supreme Court last week voted 6-1 to

uphold that state's similar proposal. Voters passed it in 1990, but politicians from both parties challenged it in court. The losers said they'll appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court.

\*Sixteen states are working on it.

Three have passed it. Others are voting on it. It's going to be on the ballot in Washington (state), and Speaker

Tom Foley's in trouble," Steil said. "It has to be passed state by state. They (Congress) will never pass it themselves. They can't get two-thirds vote to send it (a U.S. constitutional amendment) around to all the

Polls show two-thirds of congressmen oppose term limitation.

A spokesman for Michigan's U.S. Sen. Carl Levin said the proposal "doesn't make sense" because it would "let the power flow back to Texas or Massachusetts."

Those two states have virtually dominated the speaker's chair in the U.S. House for nearly 40 years. Committee chairs are awarded by seniority, so states which keep sending the same members back for 20 or more years are rewarded with more power.

Michigan's Democratic delegation would be a loser under the term-limitation amendment. Rep. William D. Ford of Taylor (14 terms) heads the Education and Labor Committee. Rep. John Dingell (18 terms) of Trenton heads both the Energy and Commerce and the Oversight and Investi-

gations subcommittees. Rep. David Bonior (eight terms) of Mt. Clemens is the House whip (No.3 rank). Sen. Donald Riegle (three terms) chairs the Banking Committee.

Republicans hold good ranking minority member slots. If the GOP were to win the House, Rep. William Broomsield (18 terms) would chair the House Foreign Affairs Committee. Rep. Carl Pursell (eight terms) of Plymouth would chair an Appropriations subcommittee.







# Novi's own rockers go national

The Novi-based Oriental Spas may spend most of their time in the Detroit area, especially at the Overture Records recording studio on Beck Road, but they are better known on the east coast.

The Spas - Jade Scott, Mary Stuart-Santos, Laura Santodonato, Chris Stuba and Kian Smith - have already recorded two albums and have garnered some rave reviews in The Metro Times and the Detroit Free Press, but a major portion of Detroit-area rock fans haven't even heard of them.

Only recently has WRIF-FM begun to play selections from the band's 1988 album "Street Lines."

Too bad, because the Spas offer an exhilarating, hard-rocking sound for fans who believe in everything that rock and roll is all about. It's something they call "Spa-style."

Think of what Led Zeppelin was doing — a hard driving funky sound — and that's kind of what we are," said Smith, the

"We're pretty much hard rock with a funk edge."
"Played on power tools," added Stuba, who admits to a habit of breaking his guitars.

But they're not clones of Led Zeppelin, or of any other band. You can try, but you can't find any other band to compare them to. It's hard to even say they're a cross between the sound of two or three other bands.

You just have to listen to them to discover that The Spas are unique, largely because of the sound that results from three vocalists - Scott, Stuart-Santos and Santodonato - instead of one.

"It tends to be kind of reckless abandon," Stuart-Santos said of their style. And, although the group writes most of their own songs, the covers they do perform are also individualized in their

Musical tastes among the individual members range from the Red Hot Chili Peppers to Chick Corea to Pavarotti to Aerosmith. The group formed when the three vocalists, who happened to be

working in the same studio, decided they would be stronger together. The trio recorded their first album, which was self-titled, from a collection of what they had been working on individually. Stuba joined them in January, 1988 and Smith Joined in April, 1990 after auditioning with about 100 other drummers.

How about that name?

Scott says it's because the group loves controversy. "I always loved oriental spas and the ideas of the sensual ex-

perience and allure of them," he said. But a large reason for the name was because, at the time the group formed, oriental spas in the Detroit area were being pick-

eted and boarded up.

Now, Stuart-Santos said, their name has developed into a description of the "sensual feel" of their show, which she said involves much more than just sound.

"When you see the show there's a lot going on," Smith said. "We construct the show so there are high and low points, using the best lighting (for each). Our music has a wide range of interest other than just the (sound)."

They've been together as Oriental Spas for about five years now, and were surprised on a recent tour to discover how popular they'd become in other cities.

They discovered it when, during a tour to promote "Street Lines," they played in a bar in Boston and found the audience singing along with their original songs, already knowing the words. "When the mass majority of fans started singing, that was just

a great feeling," Stuba recalled. The Spas list approximately 370 radio stations across the country that are playing songs from "Street Lines." Most of them are

"The college market is pretty responsive to individual labels," Scott said.

Scott explained that fame and money is not the main reason they are together. Instead, he said, they perform because it is in their hearts, and because they love the excitement of creating their best sounds.

"That, to me, is what music is about," he said. "Getting that excited about what you are doing . . . getting that one little thing (just right) that gives you shivers down your spine."

After two years of volunteering behind the scenes, Wagner said, "I thought, I could have a match! Why don't 1?"



The bridge that joins this island to the mainland near Club Med is at the opposite end from the bridge that connects it to Cancun City 12 miles away. The traveler's task is to pick a hotel from the several dozen beautiful

properties that line the beach. The Cancun Puerta Al Sol Hotel Suites and Spa is the most luxurious of the island's three all-inclusive hotels, which offer meals and beverages with the price of the room. You can take 40 of your friends into the outdoor whirlpool or learn to dive in the above-ground diving tank if you get tired of sizzling away on the very lightly populated beach. ## Novi gridders surprise Hartland, 35-7

### 'Cats still in KVC title chase

Novi football coach John Osborne appropriately described his Hartland managed just six first team's encounter with Hartland on downs and 136 yard of total offense. Oct. 18 as: "two teams going in different directions."

During the Wildcats' surprising 35-7 wipeout of the Eagles, Novi was headed into the end zone over and over again, while Hartland was headed toward its worst defeat in years. The triumph elevates the 'Cats to 4-1 in the Kensington Vallev Conference (4-3 overall), and now puts the team in position to grab a share of the KVC title.

A win over undefeated South Lyon tomorrow (Oct. 25) — the third ranked team in Class A - would secure Novi's fifth conference championship in the last six years. The Lions (7-0 overall, 5-0 in the KVC) have already guaranteed themselves no worse than a share of the title - the program's first under coach Bob Scheloske.

The kids are feeling good about themselves and they are confident," Osborne admitted. "They are ready

for the challenge." The Wildcats were certainly ready for the Eagles, who entered the game at 4-2 and were coming of a heartbreaking 14-11 loss to South Lyon after leading most of the game. Novi, on the other hand, was fresh on the heels of its biggest road win of the campaign - a 20-18 come-from-behind win at Howell.

"The win last week over Howell was a great boost to us." Osborne said. "We knew we had a chance to beat Hartland, but I was surprised it was so lopsided. (Hartland) did not appear to be on their game, but at the same time we're improving and gaining in confidence. "Our defense was just outstand-

ing and played their best game of

the KVC's third most potent offense (21.2 points per outing), but the Wildcat defenders shut them down. Novi, on the other hand, rolled up 387 yards as five different players

scored touchdowns. The 'Cats opened a 14-0 halftime advantage, but Osborne and his staff left the field disappointed because the offense failed to score any points in the second quarter despite three prime opportunities.

Novi took the ball 50 yards in eight plays on its first possession to take a 7-0 lead, and it was tailback Matt Kobe who rambled 16 yards for the touchdown. The Wildcats then added to the lead thanks to two key plays, back-to-back, from junior speedster Randy Naumann: a recovered fumble and a 50-yard

In the second quarter, Matt Butler intercepted a pass and Pat Whitehead recovered a fumble, and both turnovers gave Novi the ball deep in Eagle territory. But the Wildcat offense wound up turning the ball over on downs both times Also in the quarter, a 45-yard run by Kobe set up a field goal try, but

Butler's kick was wide. "We certainly weren't comfortable, after blowing all those chances." Osborne said. Novi quickly made up for it after

taking the kickoff to start the second half. Tailback Jeff VanDoren capped an 80-yard drive with an electrifying 62-yard scoring gallop, making it 21-0. A 10-play, 77-yard scoring march on the Wildcats' next possession upped the lead again. The scoring play was a nine-yard pass from Ryan McCarthy to Mike Borashko.







### Doctors offer wisdom about teeth

By SUZANNE HOLLYER

When wisdom teeth are sitting painlessly below the gums, dentists and often patients have trouble justifying removal of the pesky third

"There's something to be said for that old adage: If it isn't broke don't fix it," said oral and maxillofacial surgeon Dr. Mark Azzopardi, who added that many patients and dentists postpone wisdom tooth removal because of the cost of surgery and a fear

Others argue tooth extraction is more painful for older patients. This cost in additional pain and suffering caused by waiting makes early removal of wisdom teeth preferred, said Dr. David Bloom, an oral and maxillofacial surgeon that works with Azzopardí.

Bloom has his own adage to back up the theory: "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure."

Azzopardi and Bloom, supported by the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, believe early removal of problematic third molars is often the best choice. Bloom and Azzopardi are partners at Oakland Oral Surgery in Novi where they have seen impacted wisdom teeth ignored until they become disfiguring tumors or cysts.

But that is an extreme case, they said. More often the impacted teeth found in older patients are extracted when they eventually begin to cause pain as a result of infection or decay.

Impacted teeth, defined as those teeth that cannot or will not erupt into normal positions, usually require treatment eventually, Bloom said. Waiting only makes the surgery more complicated.

For example, impacted teeth may be close to or in contact with nerves that supply sensation to the gums. lips, chin, cheeks and tongue.

The roots of teeth grow and get closer to these nerves causing the incidence of post-surgery numbness to

increase with age. ferent between 17 and 25," Bloom said.

A 1985 study published in the Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery found numbness occurs 6.5 times more often among patients over 24 years old than amoung patients 23 years old and younger.

A fear of pain involved in wisdom tooth removal often keeps patients away from the oral surgeon. But Bloom said the average patient has "a couple uncomfortable days.

"The modern oral surgeon is trained in pain control," he said. Economics can play a part in a pa-

tient's determining whether or not to have a wisdom tooth extracted. "If you say you're getting insur-

ance in six months, then we might say to wait. Nothing is likely to happen in six months," he said.



# Jumbo loans become more commonplace

So, you think your home mortgage payments are high?

Consider the commitment just concluded by John Meador, who obtained financing for his new two-story. Cape Cod home. His new mortgage loan balance is \$675,000. His monthly principal and interest payments will be about \$5,200.

Large mortgage loans of this type are called "jumbo loans" by lenders. These are loans of more than \$191.250, the maximum amount for individual loans that can be sold by lenders to the secondary market. For this reason, interest rates are usually a bit higher for these loans, and still higher for "superjumbo loans"—those over \$600,000.

Meador, who moved to California from New York City in 1979, considers his new home mortgage loan to be exceptionally good, despite the mind-boggling (to most of us) payments of more than \$5,000 each month.

It's a 30-year loan with a fixed interest rate for the first five years of 9.75 percent. It will then have an adjustable rate for the remainder of the loan term.

"These jumbo mortgage loans were quite rare until recently,"

said Allan Stone, senior vice president of loan administration at a major bank. "We've been processing quite a few of them, with new language and the standard of the standard

loan amounts up to \$1 million."


Stone noted that Interest rates on jumbo loans have been significantly higher than lower loan amounts (conforming loans). But recently, rates have dropped below the 10 percent level for both 15-and 30-year mortgage loans, he said

For old-timers like this writer, jumbo loans for a personal residence are hard to comprehend. Our first home—a comfortable new two-bedroom residence — was financed with an FHA loan. Our monthly payments, including principal, interest, taxes and insurance, came to \$75. Regretfully, those days are probably gone for-

Today, in most metropolitan areas, jumbo mortgage loans are becoming common, according to Jim Gilcrest, executive vice president of American Residential Mortgage Corp. However, he noted that fewer lenders now offer jumbos due to the collapse of the savings and loan industry and the volatility of the banking system.

"In-depth verification of asset information and more documentation on credit worthiness are



Open spaces and art enliven this Northville home

But if they had needed any other reasons to move into this particular house, there are plenty of those as well.

Tucked away at the rear of Northville Township's Quail Ridge development, the Ord home boasts the biggest lot in the subdivision and park land behind it. The front yard is small and the back "yard" undeveloped, remaining wooded and blending into the park. The overall effect inside the house is almost one of isolation, since most of the home's windows look out onto the woods. It's an odd sensation, not much more than a stone's throw away from a busy stretch of Eight Mile Road.



Triple sliding-glass doors in the family room and master suite brighten both rooms and provide access to a long deck.




Still more storage area is available in the utility room and the garage. The utility room features a built-in ironing board and counter
